### Marquette Resumes Conference Play

The Marquette women's soccer team jumps back into BIG EAST play this week for a Thursday-Sunday tilt on the road and at home. The Golden Eagles travel to Providence Thursday, Sept. 25, at 3 p.m. CT, and return to host Connecticut on Sunday, Sept. 28 at 1 p.m.

### A Closer Look at the Golden Eagles

The Golden Eagles are coming off an undefeated weekend where it won at USF in overtime, 1-0, and tied Pepperdine, 0-0. Sophomore Ashley Bares scored her first goal of the season and the Golden Eagles' lone goal of the weekend in the 99th minute at USF. She is the sixth Golden Eagle to score thus far. Overall, Marquette has out-shot its foes 163-54, with 65 of those attempts being on goal. The Golden Eagles average 18.11 shots per game, a mark that ranks second in the BIG EAST.

### Scouting Providence

Providence has found early success in non-conference play with a 5-2-0 overall mark, but dropped its conference opener to Connecticut, 1-0. Junior Tara Ricciardi, freshman Courtney Collins, and junior Jill Camburn have each totaled six points on three goals apiece. Netminder Jill Schott has started six of the team's seven games in goal, posting two shutouts while boasting a .893 save percentage and 0.51 goals against average. Marquette is 3-0-0 all-time against Friars, including a 2-0 mark at Glay Field.

### A Sneak Peak at Connecticut

The Huskies (3-5-1), who began the season ranked as high as No. 11 in the nation, are struggling to find the back of the net as they have scored just five goals heading into this weekend's matches. Connecticut has been outscored by its opponents, 12-5, and has been held scoreless four times. The Huskies' three wins of the season came against Hofstra (1-0), Yale (2-1) and Providence (1-0), while three of their five losses were to top-11 teams.

Annie Yi leads the team with four points off two goals. Elise Fugowski has three points on a goal and an assist, and Erin Clark and Cory Bildstein have two points apiece. Preseason BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Year Stephanie Labbe has seen nearly 650 minutes in net, limiting opponents to a 1.39 goals against average and holding a save percentage of .773. Connecticut hosts USF prior to coming to Milwaukee.

Marquette is 1-2-0 all-time against Connecticut. Last season the Huskies snapped MU's school record 10-game unbeaten streak in Storrs, sending the Golden Eagles back to Milwaukee with a 5-0 defeat. Marquette last defeated Connecticut, 1-0, during the 2006 season in the two teams' last meeting at Valley Fields.

### "Quoting" Coach Roeders

"Our sole focus is on BIG EAST play," said head coach Markus Roeders. "We learned from having a split weekend this past week at USF and then at home versus Pepperdine, which should help prepare for our matches on Thursday and Sunday. Considering our non-conference schedule, our squad should be well prepared for the upcoming games. We keep improving and defensively this group is doing a fantastic job. The offense is creating chances, but we

## Kulla Named BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week

Redshirt freshman Natalie Kulla earned BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week honors on Sept. 22 following a pair of shutouts in which she totaled seven saves and helped the Golden Eagles go 1-0-1. The freshman recorded 208:24 minutes of scoreless play in net last week, including four saves in an overtime win at USF on Sept. 19. Kulla also blanked Pepperdine for 110:00 and totaled five saves, including a pivotal stop in the first overtime from Pepperdine's leading scorer. Along with the 83:29 scoreless minutes she registered at Auburn (Sept. 14), Kulla pushed her scoreless streak in net to 292:53.

## Cusick Honor Roll x3

Senior defender Shannon Cusick was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll Sept. 22 for the third time this season. Cusick played all 208-plus minutes last weekend and was integral to limiting USF and Pepperdine to 16 total shots. Against USF, the Golden Eagles' stifling defense allowed just six shots, two of which were on goal. Against Pepperdine, Cusick controlled MU's defense when Pepperdine was awarded five corner kicks in a 20-minute block of time in the second half, and allowed just three shots total in overtime.

## Last Time Out

The Golden Eagles went undefeated last weekend as they won at USF in overtime their BIG EAST Conference Opener and returned home to play Pepperdine to a 0-0 draw after 110 minutes of play. Sophomore Ashley Bares scored Marquette's lone goal of the weekend.

## Let's Take Shots

Regardless of the number of goals the Golden Eagles have scored this season, one thing that is not lacking is the amount of scoring opportunities they have created. Marquette has out-shot its foes 163-70 putting 65 of those attempts on goal. Against Samford, MU put a season high 16 shots on target. The Golden Eagles average 18.11 shots per game.

## Cusick Named to BIG EAST Honor Roll, Again

For the second consecutive week senior Shannon Cusick was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll (for the week of Sept. 8-14)

announced by league officials on Sept. 8. Cusick played an integral role in Marquette's 1-1 week, where despite out-shooting No. 24 Wis.-Milwaukee 15-5, the Golden Eagles dropped a 1-0 decision to the Panthers to mark MU's first loss of the season.

The Golden Eagles rebounded from that loss with a 1-0 overtime win against No. 26 BYU Saturday evening at Valley Fields. Cusick was a critical defensive presence in MU's overtime win over BYU where the Cougars took 12 shots, the most Marquette has allowed in a single game all season, but helped hold BYU's leading scorer and MAC Herman Award candidate Katie Larkin to just one shot for the match.

## Better Late than Never

Marquette has had a way of keeping the game interesting as all six of its goals scored this season have come after the 69th minute. Four of MU goals have come in the 90th minute, or in overtime. The Golden Eagles are 3-0-1 in overtime games.

## Cusick Rakes 'Em In

Following back-to-back victories over Ohio State and Samford, Marquette women's soccer senior defender Shannon Cusick was named the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week and to the BIG EAST Honor Roll for the week of Sept. 1. It was Cusick's first duo of weekly honors of the season.

The senior defender played an integral part of MU's stifling backline that allowed just five total shots over two games last weekend. For her efforts, Cusick was named to the Milwaukee Cup All-Tournament Team.

## All-Tournament Team

Following its runner-up honors in the Milwaukee Cup, despite finishing 2-0, three Golden Eagles were named to the all-tournament team. Senior defender Shannon Cusick, junior goal keeper Chelsey Turner and sophomore midfielder Lauren Acree each were named to the all-tournament team.
