### Marquette Hits the Road for Auburn

The Marquette women's soccer team hits the road for the first time this season as it heads to Auburn, Ala., to play in the Auburn Tournament. There, the Golden Eagles will square off against a pair of NCAA Tournament participants from a season ago in South Carolina on Friday, Sept. 12 at 4:30 p.m. CT and Auburn on Sunday at 1:30 p.m. CT

### A Closer Look at the Golden Eagles

The Golden Eagles (4-1-0) are looking to build on their 1-0 overtime win against BYU at Valley Fields Saturday. Sophomore Rosie Malone-Povolny netted her first goal of the season, second of her career, which was the game winner against the Cougars in the 99th minute. Marquette has had no trouble creating opportunities as it has out shot its foes, 96-30, but has only converted six of those chances into goals. However, Roeders is content with knowing anyone on the field is capable of scoring for MU as five different Golden Eagles have tallied goals already this season.

### Scouting South Carolina

The Golden Eagles will look to hand South Carolina (4-0-1) its first loss of the season Thursday when they meet. The Gamecocks defeated East Carolina (1-0), Boston University (1-0), Furman (2-0), Clemson (1-0), and tied UNC-Willilmington (0-0). Junior midfielder Lindsey Small was named to the Soccer America National Team of the Week following her performance in the Carolina's Cup last weekend where she scored the game-winning goal over Clemson to help claim the tournament championship. She leads Carolina with four points on two goals. Teammates, Kim Miller, Kayla Grimsley, and Samantha Diaz-Matosa follow with one goal each. Goalkeeper Mollie Patton has 15 saves on the season and has a .938 saves percentage. She is the only goal keeper to see action so far this season.

### A Sneak Peak at Auburn

Auburn (2-3-1) opened the season with back-to-back victories over Grambling State (9-0) and UAB (1-0) but have since not won a game, dropping to Missouri (1-0), Kansas (2-1) and Stanford (3-0). In their last time out, Auburn tied then No. 5 Virginia, 1-1. Nine different Tigers have scored goals this season with Gabi Rivera leading the way with six points on two goals and two assists. In goal, Allison Whitworth has played over 500 minutes in net and has recorded a 1.25 goals against average and one shutout for the season. Auburn will play No. 7 Florida State on Friday prior to its match with the Golden Eagles.

a 1-0 decision to the Panthers to mark MU's first loss of the season.

The Golden Eagles rebounded from that loss with a 1-0 overtime win against No. 26 BYU Saturday evening at Valley Fields. Cusick was a critical defensive presence in MU's overtime win over BYU where the Cougars took 12 shots, the most Marquette has allowed in a single game all season, but helped hold BYU's leading scorer and MAC Herman Award candidate Katie Larkin to just one shot for the match.

### Last Time Out

The Marquette Golden Eagles (4-1) pulled together to tally a 1-0 overtime victory against the Brigham Young Cougars (3-3) Saturday night at Valley Fields.

The two teams were virtually even in almost every statistical category throughout the game until sophomore forward Rosie Malone-Povolny hit a game winning shot in the 99th minute of play, securing the victory for the Golden Eagles.

Kelly Wepking initiated the downfield drive moving the ball forward to Danelle Martens. Martens crossed the ball from the left wing to the center of the box, drawing the BYU goal-keeper from the net, allowing Malone-Povolny to finish for the game winner.

The Golden Eagles overcame a lackluster start where BYU launched five shots, one on goal, in the first half. Senior defender Shannon Cusick made a crucial save inside the box during a BYU possession that drew freshman goal keeper Natalie Kulla from the net during the third minute of play.

### Let's Take Shots

Regardless of the number of goals the Golden Eagles have scored this season, one thing that is not lacking is the amount of scoring opportunities they have created. Marquette has out shot its foes 96-30, with 37 of those being on goal. Against Samford, MU put a season high 16 shots on target.

### Better Late than Never

Marquette has had a way of keeping the game interesting as all six of its goals scored this season have come after the 69th minute. Three MU goals have come in the 90th minute, or in overtime.

### Cusick Rakes 'Em In

Following back-to-back victories over Ohio State and Samford, Marquette women's soccer senior defender Shannon Cusick was named the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week and to the BIG EAST Honor Roll for the week of Sept. 1. It was Cusick's first duo of

weekly honors of the season.

The senior defender played an integral part of MU's stifling backline that allowed just five total shots over two games last weekend. For her efforts, Cusick was named to the Milwaukee Cup All-Tournament Team.

### In the Ranks

Despite the win over BYU, the Golden Eagles dropped form the nationally rankings. Last week Soccer America tabbed Marquette No. 25 in its latest weekly poll, and it received votes in the NSCAA poll. Last week's ranking marks the third consecutive season the Golden Eagles are among the nation's top-30 teams.

### All-Tournament Team

Following its runner-up honors in the Milwaukee Cup, despite finishing 2-0, three Golden Eagles were named to the all-tournament team. Senior defender Shannon Cusick, junior goal keeper Chelsey Turner and sophomore midfielder Lauren Acree each were named to the all-tournament team.

### TV Time

For the second straight season Time Warner Sports Channel 32 will broadcast Marquette men's and women's soccer and volleyball matches. Time Warner Sports will produce two women's soccer matches against Wis.-Milwaukee (Sept. 3) and Pittsburgh (Oct. 26).

### Home Sweet Home

Protecting their home pitch is something the Golden Eagles do not take lightly, and it shows as Marquette is an impressive 105-30-8 all-time at Valley Fields.

### MU Picked Third in the BIG EAST

The Marquette women's soccer team was selected to finish third in the American Division in the 2008 BIG EAST preseason women's soccer poll announced by conference officials. The votes were cast by the league's 16 head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own team or players.

Notre Dame and West Virginia were tabbed as the favorites as the Irish received all 15 first-place votes and were picked to win the National Division, while the Mountaineers received nine first-place votes and were picked to win the America Division. Both programs also won their respective divisions last year.

The Golden Eagles, who finished the 2007 season 12-4-4, picked up 90 points - the fifth highest overall point total behind Notre Dame, West Virginia, Connecticut and Louisville. Marquette finished third last season in the American Division with a 5-3-3 con-

### Kelly Selected to Preseason All-BIG EAST Team

Senior defender Katie Kelly, a third team All-BIG EAST selection from a season ago, was selected to the All-BIG EAST Preseason Team. Kelly returns to Marquette for her final season to help lead Marquette's defensive contingent. She was a key component of MU's stifling backline that recorded a program record 12 shutouts and didn't allow a goal through nine of the Golden Eagles' first 10 games of the 2007 season. She has also been Marquette's secret weapon on offense each of the last three seasons, as she stands third on MU's all-time assists list with 22. Last season she ranked third in the league with nine assists, a mark that is the third best single-season total in program history.
