Marquette Opens Conference Play

The Marquette women's soccer team looks to return to its winning ways this weekend as it splits a pair of matches on the road and at home. The Golden Eagles will first travel to Tampa, Fla., for their BIG EAST Conference opener at USF Friday, Sept. 19, before returning to the friendly confines of Valley Fields to host Pepperdine on Sunday. Game times are set for 6:30 p.m. CT and 2:15 p.m., respectively. The match against Pepperdine is the second of a Marquette soccer doubleheader as the men's team will play No. 5 St. John's at 12:05 p.m.

A Closer Look at the Golden Eagles

The Golden Eagles are coming off a pair of 1-0 loss against South Carolina and at Auburn last weekend. Despite not being able to find the back of the net, the Golden Eagles owned a 30-24 shots advantage for the two games. Overall, Marquette has out-shot its foes 126-54, with 51 of those attempts being on goal. The Golden Eagles average 18.0 shots per game a mark that ranks fourth in the BIG EAST. In goal, junior Chelsey Turner and red-shirt freshman Natalie Kulla continue to split time. Turner has played 315 minutes in net and has registered six saves, while Kulla has made 10 saves in 343:33 minutes in net.

Scouting USF

The Bulls (3-1-2) enter Friday's match on the heels of a 3-2 double overtime win over Illinois State Sunday after tying Stetson, 1-1, on Sept. 11. Members of the Bulls' 18-member freshmen class provided the scoring punch in the two games as freshmen Gina Pacheco and Noelle Pineiro accounted for a goal each. Classmate Chelsea Klotz added two against Illinois State including the game-winner in the 102nd minute. Klotz leads the team with six points.

A Sneak Peak at Pepperdine

It will be the first ever meeting between the Golden Eagles and the Waves (3-3-1) of the West Coast Conference, who won back-to-back games last weekend. Pepperdine defeated then-No. 23 Tennessee, 2-0, and Washington State, 1-0. The Waves fired off 30 shots over their last two games including 18 against Washington State, and average 15.6 shots per game.

Senior Amanda Rupp has scored four goals over the last five matches and leads the Waves with nine points. She was named to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week and Soccer America's Team of the Week after her performance against Tennessee and Washington State in which she tallied a goal against the Lady Vols and provided the game-tying assist against the Cougars. Reigning WCC Player of the Week goalkeeper Lacy Heck is 2-1 on the season with a 0.44 goals against average.

Pepperdine will play at Wisconsin on Friday before heading to Valley Fields.

Last Time Out

Marquette dropped both of its contests at the Auburn Tournament last weekend. The Golden Eagles fell 1-0 to both South Carolina and Auburn.

The Golden Eagles overcame a lackluster performance against South Carolina where MU let in the lone goal of the game in the 87th minute, to virtually dominate every statistical category except the score against Auburn. The Golden Eagles outshot the Tigers 17-12 including a 10-5 shots on goal advantage.

Let's Take Shots

Regardless of the number of goals the Golden Eagles have scored this season, one thing that is not lacking is the amount of scoring opportunities they have created. Marquette has out-shot its foes 126-54, putting 51 of those attempts on goal. Against Samford, MU put a season high 16 shots on target. The Golden Eagles average 18.0 shots per game.

Home Sweet Home

Protecting their home pitch is something the Golden Eagles do not take lightly, and it shows as Marquette is an impressive 105-30-8 all-time at Valley Fields.

Cusick Named to BIG EAST Honor Roll, Again

For the second consecutive week senior Shannon Cusick was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll (for the week of Sept. 8-14) announced by league officials on Sept. 8. Cusick played an integral role in Marquette's 1-1 week, where despite out-shooting No. 24 Wis.-Milwaukee 15-5, the Golden Eagles dropped a 1-0 decision to the Panthers to mark MU's first loss of the season.

The Golden Eagles rebounded from that loss with a 1-0 overtime win against No. 26 BYU Saturday evening at Valley Fields. Cusick was a critical defensive presence in MU's overtime win over BYU where the Cougars took 12 shots, the most Marquette has allowed in a single game all season, but helped hold BYU's leading scorer and MAC Herman Award candidate Katie Larkin to just one shot for the match.

Better Late than Never

Marquette has had a way of keeping the game interesting as all six of its goals scored this season have come after the 69th minute. Three MU goals have come in the 90th minute, or in overtime.

Cusick Rakes 'Em In

Following back-to-back victories over Ohio State and Samford, Marquette women's soccer senior defender Shannon Cusick was named the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week and to the BIG EAST Honor Roll for the week of Sept. 1. It was Cusick's first duo of weekly honors of the season.

The senior defender played an integral part of MU's stifling backline that allowed just five total shots over two games last weekend. For her efforts, Cusick was named to the Milwaukee Cup All-Tournament Team.

All-Tournament Team

Following its runner-up honors in the Milwaukee Cup, despite finishing 2-0, three Golden Eagles were named to the all-tournament team. Senior defender Shannon Cusick, junior goal keeper Chelsey Turner and sophomore midfielder Lauren Acree each were named to the all-tournament team.

TV Time

For the second straight season Time Warner Sports Channel 32 will broadcast Marquette men's and women's soccer and volleyball matches. Time Warner Sports will produce two women's soccer matches against Wis.-Milwaukee (Sept. 3) and Pittsburgh (Oct. 26).

MU Picked Third in the BIG EAST

The Marquette women's soccer team was selected to finish third in the American Division in the 2008 BIG EAST preseason women's soccer poll announced by conference officials. The votes were cast by the league's 16 head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own team or players.

Notre Dame and West Virginia were tabbed as the favorites as the Irish received all 15 first-place votes and were picked to win the National Division, while the Mountaineers received nine first-place votes and were picked to win the America Division. Both programs also won their respective divisions last year.

The Golden Eagles, who finished the 2007 season 12-4-4, picked up 90 points - the fifth highest overall point total behind Notre Dame, West Virginia, Connecticut and Louisville. Marquette finished third last season in the American Division with a 5-3-3 conference mark.
