Pfeiffer played in 21 games and 11 matches for Marquette in her junior season. She recorded 27 digs on the year, on her way to averaging 1.29 digs per game. She set a season best with seven digs against South Dakota State (Sept. 18). She had five digs against Western Kentucky (Sept. 4), and five digs against Loyola (Ill.) (Sept. 18).

2003 (Sophomore at Washington (Mo.))

Pfeiffer played in 30 matches, helping Washington (Mo.) to a Division III national championship. She averaged 2.35 kills per game and hit 25.4 percent. She averaged 1.52 digs per game in her second season.

2002 (Freshman at Washington (Mo.))

Pfeiffer was a member of the Washington (Mo.) volleyball team, a Division III NCAA volleyball powerhouse.

Prior to Marquette

Pfeiffer was a three-year letterwinner for Dave Scher at Pius XI in Milwaukee. She helped the Lady Popes win back-to-back conference titles in 2000 and 2001 in addition to a third-place finish at the state championships in 1999. She was an all-conference selection in 2000 and 2001, earning second-team all-state honors in 2001. She was also a successful club volleyball player, earning All-America status in the club division of the national championships. She lettered in track and was a member of the state champion 4x400-meter relay team her junior years and took second in the 300-meter hurdles. She was also a two-time letterwinner in basketball.

2004 (Junior)

Midway through her sophomore season, Mueller moved from the back row to outside hitter and into the starting lineup and shined. Through the first 12 matches of the season, Mueller had only 20 kills, but matched that total in her first two appearances as outside hitter, logging 10 against DePaul (Oct. 8) and 10 against USF (Oct. 15). She continued her stellar play on the outside, smashing 14 kills against UAB (Oct. 15) and 10 against Houston (Oct. 22). After a pair of eight kill matches, she finished the season with six matches of at least 10 kills in the last eight. She posted a season-best 16 kills against Cincinnati (Nov. 22) in the C-USA Semifinals. She recorded eight double-doubles, having 14 matches with 10 or more digs. She had a season best 19 digs in her first match as outside hitter against DePaul (Oct. 8).

2003 (Sophomore)

Mueller was a bright spot on the front row early before spending the bulk of her season as the Libero. She had 17 double-figure dig matches. Five of her first seven matches resulted in double-figure digs. She combined for three double-doubles, including one of two 20-20 matches. She shot out of the gate early with 11 kills and eight digs in her collegiate debut against Texas A&M (Aug. 29) and blossomed against Duke (Aug. 30). It was against the Blue Devils where she had her 22-kill, 21-dig match. The 22 kills are a career best. She hit 31.4 percent against Pittsburgh, having 13 kills and 12 digs. After a nine-kill performance against Gonzaga (Sept. 19), she only had 18 attacks the rest of the year. Two matches after being moved to Libero full time, she played stellar floor defense against Montana State (Sept. 20), logging a career-best 27 digs. She also recorded dig totals of 19 against Cincinnati (Oct. 3) and 23 against Tulane (Oct. 17). She finished the season with 343 digs, second best on the team, and 3.09 digs per game, third best on the squad.

Prior to Marquette

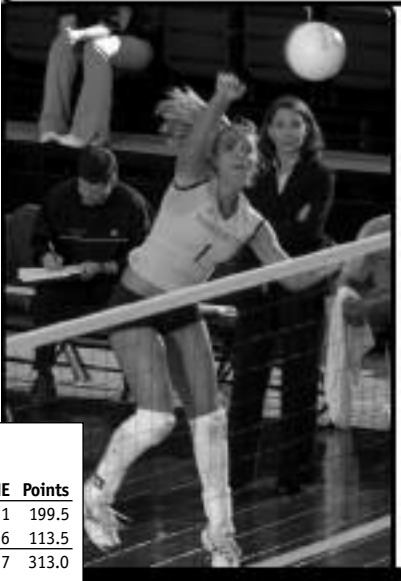
Mueller earned four letters in volleyball at Hartford Union High School where she was coached by Terry Wick. A Fourth-Team All-State honoree as selected by the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel her senior year, Mueller was a three-time selection to both conference and county teams during her volleyball career. She concluded her prep career as the school's all-time leader in attacks (1,337) and digs (1,306) while claiming the no. 2 spot in service aces (125). She finished with the top-four seasonal marks in attacks at Hartford and three of the top-four efforts in digs. She played club volleyball for the Milwaukee Sting and captured All-America recognition after helping that team to a second-place finish in the U-17 open division during the 2002 AAU tournament. Mueller served as her club team's captain for two years. Additionally, she lettered four times in basketball and was selected as the Wisconsin Little Ten Conference Player of the Year in 2002-03. She earned all-county honors on three occasions.

2003 (Freshman)

Wallace saw action in 12 matches (31 games) in her freshman season. She made her collegiate debut recording a kill against Montana State (Sept. 20). Even with limited action, she had a 15.2 percent attack percentage and logged four blocks on the season.

Prior to Marquette

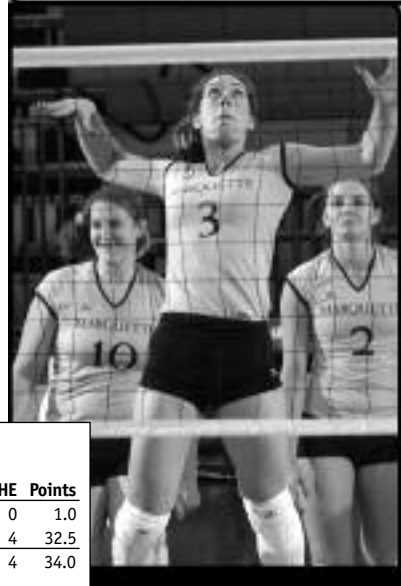

2003 (Redshirt Freshman)

Brown proved to be a dominant net defender for Marquette in her first full season of competition. She was second on the team with 98 blocks and set a school-match record with 12 assisted blocks against Houston (Oct. 22). Seniors Propel 2004 Team to New Heights

The Marquette volleyball team made tremendous strides in 2004. The 2004 senior class — Sarah Vernon, Erica Heisser and Erin Freer — proved to be the role models for hard work, intensity and determination that led the squad to one of the best records in school history.

The 2004 Marquette volleyball squad went 22-7, recording more wins than any other team since 1985 and recording more wins as an NCAA Division I team than any other in Marquette history. The 75.8 winning percentage was better than any other team in Marquette history, with the lone exclusion of the 1985 team. Marquette finished in a tie for second in the Conference USA standings, its best conference finish ever, and advanced to the C-USA title match for the first time in school history.

"I am so proud of the work this team and our program has made over the last three seasons," head coach Pati Rolf said. "It comes down to hard work and leadership. The seniors and teams we have had these past three years have lead Marquette into a position of dominance in the conference and we are excited about the future."

Individually, standards were set that highlighted the season. Senior Libero Erin Freer became Marquette's career record holder for digs, smashing the previous total. Her 1,450 career digs beat the old record, held by Keelyn Krill, by 216. She had 411 digs, the fifth best single season total in school history and was a consistent and solid defender during 2004 and her career.

"Erin Freer set the standard for defense," Rolf said. "She is one of the most beautiful defenders I have ever witnessed in this program and beyond. We will miss her talent, work ethic and personality."

Senior setter Sarah Vernon became Marquette's sixth all-time career assists performer with 1,854. Her 1,215 assists in 2004 was good for sixth on the Marquette single season ledger. Vernon was also instrumental in the offensive efforts, leading the team with a 31.2 attack per-

centage, the fourth best single season attack percentage in school history. Vernon's offensive efforts earned her a spot as second team All-Conference USA. Vernon's 24.4 career attack percentage is fifth on the Marquette all-time list.

"Sarah went beyond anything that was out there for setters in terms of attacking and setting. She racked up numbers never before recorded by a first year starter," Rolf added. "I just wish we had the opportunity to have her with us one more year. Her potential is unbelievable, her leadership and steady personality added to the power of the senior class."

Senior Erica Heisser led the team in blocks with a 1.15 per game average. She was accurate as well, hitting 28.3 percent on the season, the seventh best single season total in Marquette history. Heisser hit 24.0 percent for her career and places just behind Vernon all-time at Marquette in sixth place.

"Erica is an individual I am so proud of, she has had to play middle due to some early losses of players over the years and she took the position and made it into something to be very proud of," Rolf said. "From my first year with her to now she has become a dominant offensive force on this team and by years end was coming into her own. Her performance in the conference tournament was fantastic."

Junior outside hitter Theresa Coughlin continued her impressive play from her sophomore season. A preseason all-Conference USA selection, Coughlin led the team with 396 kills, the eighth best single season total at Marquette. She earned second team All-Conference USA as a result. With her solid success over three seasons, Coughlin finished her junior season in second in career kills at Marquette, just seven away from the top spot, held by Chris Curtin with 1,280.

Freshman Kimberley Todd was a big reason Marquette was successful in 2004. The outside hitter from Osahwa, Ont., was third on the team in kills with 293 and earned a spot on the Conference USA All-Freshman team.

Redshirt freshman Jenn Brown showed her domination at the net. She was second on the team with 98 blocks and set a single-match Marquette record with 12 assisted blocks against Houston.

Sophomore Jamie Mueller became a valuable outside hitter after making the transition from defensive specialist early in the season. Mueller was a consistent attacker and a solid defender, chalking up 168 kills and 284 digs on the year.

Junior Caitie O'Brien was solid as a defensive specialist amassing 240 digs and 19 aces on the season.

"We are impressed with the work the younger players did during the 2004 season and the winning tradition and pride that is being established by past seniors," Rolf added. "Now we have to move to the next level and establish it faster and sooner. With the experience we have gained this year and the schedule we have for next year it is within our reach. I like what I am seeing out of this '05 class and team, now it is time to work in the off season and develop some intensity and maturity for this next season."

The rest of the Marquette rotation learned from the valuable experience of being successful. Four times, Marquette owned three-match or longer win streaks and won 13-of-14 matches heading into the Conference USA Tournament Championship match. Six times, Marquette student-athletes were named Player-of-the-Week by Conference USA. Vernon led the charge with four selections during the season.

Marquette set the tone for 2004 in the non-conference season. Racing out to a 10-3 out-of-league mark, the Golden Eagles were primed for a run in its C-USA schedule. After a pair of setbacks started the C-USA slate, Marquette rattled off 10-of-11 in C-USA play to finish 10-3 on the year and tie for second, the highest finish in school history. That set the stage for the run to the league's title match.

"We had a tremendous run in the conference after gaining valuable experience the first weekend of play versus Louisville and Cincinnati, after that the players stepped it up and fought back and that is what made the difference," Rolf continued. "We have tremendous fighters here, yes it is about hard work and discipline, but these women need to learn how to fight for the things that they want and that are important to them and this group is learning how to do that."

Fan support for Marquette volleyball increased as well. Marquette set its top two attendance marks during the season. For the home contest against Louisville, 733 fans packed "The Al" and 824 showed up for the regular season finale against Southern Miss.

"Something I am very proud of is the support we are getting at our games, from faculty, staff and students. We also have tremendous support from our youth, our kids' clinics brought in over 400 children ages 4-13 and is something we will continue to expand," Rolf said. "We appreciate the support from our donors and community members who recognize the hard work and dedication it takes to be a Marquette Volleyball Student Athlete. We will continue to expand our fan and donor base by showing them some of the finest female student athletes in the country."

In all, the 2004 season proved to be one of success and accolades that fans of Marquette volleyball will soon not forget.

2004 (Senior)

Erin Freer etched her name in the Marquette record books, finishing her career as Marquette's all-time-digs leader, with 1,405. That smashed the old mark of 1,234 set by Keelyn Krill. Freer finished the 2004 season as Marquette's digs leader with 411 (4.11 per game). That was the seventh best total in Conference USA. She returned to the back row as a Libero after a strong junior campaign as an outside hitter.

Freer recorded double figure digs in 24 of Marquette's 29 matches. She had 52 matches in her career of 10 or more digs. She led the team in digs 21 times on the season.

She topped the 20 dig mark on four occasions, digging a season best 26 balls against Connecticut (Sept. 24). She also had 25 digs at Charlotte (Nov. 12) and had a pair of 20 dig matches against Saint Louis (Oct. 30) and Tulane (Nov. 5). She had 5.0 digs per game in the Saint Louis and Tulane matches. From Oct. 30 to Nov. 12, she averaged 5.5 digs per game over four matches.

2003 (Junior)

Moving from libero to outside hitter, Freer seemed to make the transition with little problem. With 349 kills on the season, she was fourth on the team. She was second on the team at 2.98 kills per game. She increased her career kills total four-fold having less than 100 kills prior to the season. She started the season on the back row, having just three attacks in the first four matches, but she quickly hit her stride after the transition.

In her fifth match as an outside, she logged 11 kills against 23rd-ranked Missouri (Sept. 13). That started a seven match streak of double figures in kills. She set a career best with 21 kills against Gonzaga (Sept. 19), a mark she would tie three times.

She also landed 21 attacks against Tulane (Oct. 17) and Memphis (Oct. 24). She just missed the 20-kill mark with 19 at Cincinnati (Oct. 3) and with 19 against USF (Nov. 8). The Memphis match might have been the best all-around match of the season for Freer. In addition to her 21 kills, she had a season best 30.4 attack percentage and also logged 20 digs. It was one of just two 20-20 matches for Marquette in 2003.

Her defensive abilities showed during the year as she averaged 3.65 digs per game, the top total on the team and the fourth best in Conference USA. With 427 digs on the season, she had the third best mark in school history. She had a career best 33 digs against Duke (Aug. 30) while serving as a back row player. That total was three short of the school record. She had 23 matches with double figure digs, including six with 20 or more. She had 26 digs against Southern Miss (Nov. 22) in the C-USA Tournament and had 23 against Montana State (Sept. 20).

2002 (Sophomore)

Freer found a niche with the newly instituted Libero position as a sophomore. She played in 106 games while seeing action in all 29 matches. Primarily a defender, Freer finished first on the team with 362 digs and her mark of 3.42 digs per game tied her for fifth place on the school's all-time single-season chart.



Freer chalked up 19 matches of double-figure digs including a career-high 27 against Valparaiso (Sept. 6), the best total by a Marquette player in 2002. She came through with a big effort against DePaul (Nov. 15) with 11 attacks, a 29.0 hitting percentage (11-2--31) and nine digs. She followed that effort with a career-best 12 attacks, a season-high three service aces and a match-high tying 15 digs against in Marquette's opening round win over Tulane in the C-USA Tournament (Nov. 22). She registered nine attacks and paced all players with 20 digs in the Southern Miss (Oct. 18) contest and led all players with 13 digs in the Louisville (Oct. 4) match. Academically, Freer was a member of the C-USA Commissioner's Honor recognizing a GPA of 3.00 or better.

2001 (Freshman)

Freer turned in a solid rookie season for the Golden Eagles. She played in 91 games over 28 matches and tied for the no. 3 spot on the team in digs (2.25 dpg). She recorded 10 matches of double-figure digs and came up with a season-high seven kills, posting a 53.8 hitting percentage vs. Memphis (Oct. 26). She also recorded a season-high five blocks against Southern Miss (Oct. 20). Freer also chalked up 10 digs and four service aces in a three-game sweep of East Carolina (Oct. 5).

A four-time letterwinner in volleyball at Lakeshore High School, Freer garnered all-state acclaim in her junior and senior seasons. She helped her team in a no. 2 ranking in the state of Michigan her senior year. She also earned four letters playing basketball and a pair in softball. She played club volleyball for Dead Frog (2000) and for Dunes (2001).

2004 (Senior)

Erica Heisser had an outstanding season as a senior. She led the team in blocks per game at 1.15, a total that was good for eighth in Conference USA. She led Marquette to a 2.61 blocks per game total, the third best in Conference USA. Heisser was second on the team in attack percentage, hitting 28.3 percent, the eighth best total in Marquette's single season history. Heisser also finished second on the team in kills with 339.

Heisser recorded double figures in kills in 23 of 26 matches. She set a career best with 20 kills against Rutgers (Sept. 11) and topped that with 21 against East Carolina (Nov. 13). Prior to the East Carolina contest, she had 18 kills against Charlotte, finishing the week with a 4.9 kills per game average. She hit 40.0 percent in those two matches and had six blocks as she earned Conference USA Player-of-the-Week honors.

Heisser topped 15 kills six total times on the year, including a 17 kill match against Connecticut (Sept. 24). While she may not have always led the team in kills, she was one of the most accurate on the team, hitting over 30.0 percent seven times. She had a season best 50.0 attack percentage, smashing 15 kills with two errors on 26 attacks against Tulane (Nov. 21) in the quarterfinals of the Conference USA Tournament.

She also had five or more blocks 10 different times during the year, led by a nine block effort against Memphis (Oct. 29). She had 14 kills in that contest.

Heisser was president of the Student Athlete Advisory Council during her senior season and a member of the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll. She was given the Cura Personalis award at the end of the 2004-05 school year by Marquette University. She was named assistant coach in July 2005.

2003 (Junior)

As a junior, Heisser made an impact on the Marquette volleyball program. Having played just 23 games prior to her third season, Heisser was somewhat inexperienced, but performed up to the task. She played in 116 of 117 possible games for the Golden Eagles. After opening the season with a five kill outing against Texas A&M (Aug. 29), she wasted little time in establishing a career best for kills that would stand for most of the season. She landed 17 strikes against Duke (Aug. 30), combining that with six blocks for her second-straight six block performance, setting a standard that would lead her to a team best 106 blocks on the year. She averaged 0.91 blocks per game. The six block mark would be a total she would have two more times — against Ohio (Sept. 13) and Wis.-Milwaukee (Sept. 24) — before establishing a career high. She had seven assisted blocks against 18th-ranked Louisville (Oct. 4) to set a mark she would again reach at TCU (Nov. 1).

While her defensive numbers were impressive, she had a solid offensive season in 2003. She had 12 double figure kill outings on the year. She was third on the team with 2.35 kills per game and was one-tenth of a percentage point away from the team lead in attack percentage at 25.8. She topped the 30.0 percent mark 10 times on the year, including a season best 52.4 percent outing against Ohio (Sept. 13). She had 12 kills in 21 attempts, with just



one error. She also recorded six blocks in the outing. Against Saint Louis (Oct. 25), she hit 43.5 percent with 12 kills, two errors and 23 attempts. She had one other outing with a 40.0 or better attack percentage, hitting 40.0 percent against Charlotte (Oct. 10).

Heisser also continued to be at her best academically, earning her third spot on the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

2002 (Sophomore)

Heisser earned her first varsity letter after seeing time in 23 games over 10 matches. She made her collegiate debut against Wyoming (Aug. 31) and had a solid outing with five attacks, six digs, two aces and four blocks. She had five kills against Western Illinois (Oct. 12). She earned her second straight spot on the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

2001 (Freshman)

Heisser did not see any action in her first season of collegiate volleyball. She did earn a spot on the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll for having a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Prior to Marquette

Heisser comes to the Marquette program from Forest Hills Central where she earned four letters in volleyball. She landed first-team honors on state, area, region and conference teams and was named team MVP. Selected by the Detroit Free Press as a Scholar-Athlete, she was also chosen as the Conference Scholar-Athlete of the Year as a senior. She was picked as her high school's Female Athlete of the Year Award winner and helped her team to a No. 2 ranking in the state of Michigan. A two-time letterwinner in basketball, Heisser played club volleyball for the Kentwood Volleyball Club and the Grand Rapids Pride.

2004 (Senior)

Sarah Vernon proved to be a dominating offensive threat and a distributor in her senior season. She earned Conference USA Second-Team honors and was named C-USA Setter-of-the-Week four times as a senior.

Vernon finished her career with 1,854 assists, the sixth best career total in Marquette history. Her final season numbers of 1,215 put her sixth in Marquette single season history. Combining her accuracy of setting with accuracy of attacking, she helped Marquette to a C-USA best 15.21 assists per game total (24th in the NCAAs) and a 16.62 kills per game mark, second best in Conference USA (21st in the NCAAs).

But it was also her attacking that made her a multi-faceted threat. She had a 1.14 kills per game average and led the team with a 31.2 attack percentage, the 10th best total in Conference USA. That number is also the fourth-best single-season total in Marquette history.

She proved her versatility by recording her second career triple double in a five-game win over Saint Louis (Oct. 30). In that match, she set a career best with 70 assists. She also had 12 kills and 16 digs. She recorded five-other kill/assist double-doubles and had six dig/assist double-doubles to give her 12 double-doubles on the season.

Five times during the season, Vernon had an attack percentage of over 50.0 percent to go along with double figures in assists. She had her most accurate match against UAB (Oct. 16), where she landed six of eight kills for a 75.0 percent attacking average to go along with 37 assists.

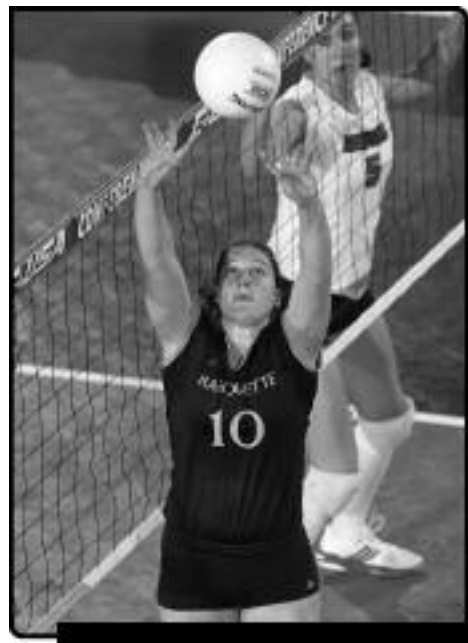
2003 (Junior)

A versatile performer, Vernon was listed specifically at setter as a junior but had an impact far greater than that of a distributor. Serving as the back-up setter to one of Marquette's most prolific setters, Gemma Greer, Vernon found playing time in multiple ways. She had her moments as Marquette's no. 1 setter, filling in for Greer when she was injured, but she saw plenty of action as a floor defender and a front-line attacker.

While her role at setter was limited, it was not without success. She had five matches with double figures in assists, three of which were 56 assists or better. She set a career high with 59 assists in a five-game match against Wis.-Milwaukee (Sept. 24). Perhaps her best match of the year, Vernon had a rare triple-double, blasting 11 kills and coming up with 12 digs. She also assisted on three blocks in that contest.

Vernon's other two 50+ assist totals came in back-to-back matches. She had 57 dishes against Houston (Oct. 31) and followed that up with 56 assists against TCU (Nov. 1). While her season total of 2.45 assists per game was diluted due to playing most of the rest of her time at other positions, she had a gaudy 11.30 assists per game over that two-match span.

She saw time as an attacker as well, recording a 15.4 hitting percentage on the year. Her best match as an attacker came against Wis.-Milwaukee. She also had 19 attacks against Houston and TCU due to her role as full time setter in those contests.



2002 (Sophomore)

Vernon saw action in 27 matches and in a total of 78 games en route to her second letter. She was second on the club with 188 assists (2.19 apg). She recorded a season-best 24 assists and chipped in four attacks, four digs and four block assists against IPFW (Sept. 21). Vernon finished with a career-high 15 digs against UAB (Nov. 8). That was one of seven matches with double-figure digs. She helped Marquette with six attacks, 12 digs and four blocks against Tulane (Nov. 22) in the C-USA Tournament. She established a career best with 10 attacks against Houston (Nov. 2). Vernon finished with 14 digs, six attacks and four blocks at Saint Louis (Oct. 25). She was a member of the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll recognizing a GPA of 3.00 or better.

2001 (Freshman)

Vernon earned a letter in her freshman year after playing in 28 games over the course of 15 matches. She had a fine all-around match in the season finale against Tennessee (Nov. 23) with 29 assists, five attacks, seven digs and three blocks. She recorded season-bests with 45 assists and nine digs against Charlotte (Nov. 2). Academically, she was a member of the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Prior to Marquette

Vernon had an outstanding prep and club career that saw her claim many individual honors. She earned four letters at Cherry Creek High School and served as the team captain her junior and senior seasons. She helped her team to a record of 26-5 and a no. 2 ranking in the state her final year and was an all-state selection in 2000, earning honorable mention recognition her junior year. Vernon was named team MVP in 1999 and 2000 and was a member of the state championship teams in 1997 and 1998.

MILWAUKEE — Marquette wasted little time in picking up its first victory of the season, a 3-0 triumph over North Dakota State. Marquette wins its season opening match for the second time in three seasons. North Dakota State falls to 0-2 with the loss.

Marquette cruised to a game one victory behind the offense of junior outside hitter Theresa Coughlin. She had four kills of her match high 11 in the opening game. North Dakota State kept the game close early, but Marquette went on a 9-2 run midway through the game to put it out of reach, eventually winning 30-16.

Senior libero Erin Freer was the star of game two. In that game, she brought her game totals for digs to six, making her the third player in school history to reach that mark. She finished the contest with eight digs, giving her 1,002 for her career. Marquette was faced with its toughest test of the night by North Dakota State, winning the second game, 30-23.

"It means a lot to Erin Freer," head coach Pati Rolf said. "She's worked her way up through a lot of hard times. It shows the team how far we've come, improving so much to allow an opportunity for a player like this to reach this pinnacle."

The Golden Eagles faced little challenge early in the third game to put the match out of reach. Marquette started off the game on another 10-2 run, fuelled by a pair of kills by senior outside hitter Erica Heisser. Marquette won the decisive game, 30-18.

Senior setter Sarah Vernon had a solid match, recording Marquette's first double-double of the season with 27 assists and 15 digs. Sheila Parrish led the way for North Dakota State with seven kills.

"I talked in the locker room in between games two and three about focusing," Rolf said. "We had to serve tough and good things will come. We did that and things started to fall our way in game three."

MILWAUKEE — Marquette claimed game one against Western Kentucky, but the Hilltoppers rebounded to win three straight and earn a 3-1 victory over the Golden Eagles. Western Kentucky wins the Marquette Challenge with a 3-0 record. Marquette falls to 2-1 with the loss.

The Golden Eagles shot out of the gate, cruising to a 30-20 win in game one. Marquette had a 13.2 attack percentage for the game, its highest of the four games. Marquette's defense held the Hilltoppers to a .2-1 attack percentage in the first game. Marquette's net defense was the

key to the game one win, forcing the Hilltoppers 13 errors, three of which came on Marquette blocks. Senior outside hitter Erica Heisser took part in all three of those blocks. She had four for the night.

Western Kentucky rebounded to a nine-point win in the second game, hitting 41.4 percent for the game. Lindsey Broerman had four of her team high 13 kills in the game, which WKU won 30-21.

"We caught them by surprise," head coach Pati Rolf said. "We had the momentum in the first game, but I don't think we worked as hard in the other games."

Marquette battled in game three, but came up short, losing 30-27. Western Kentucky won the final game, 30-26, to claim the match. Errors cost Marquette many points in the final two games. The Golden Eagles had 34 attack errors and 11 service errors for the match.

"Western Kentucky got into a groove after the first game and had our number," head coach Pati Rolf said. "They didn't make a lot of mistakes and we did. I told the team that if we play against a good team with the same kind of mistakes we've been making, it would be difficult for us."

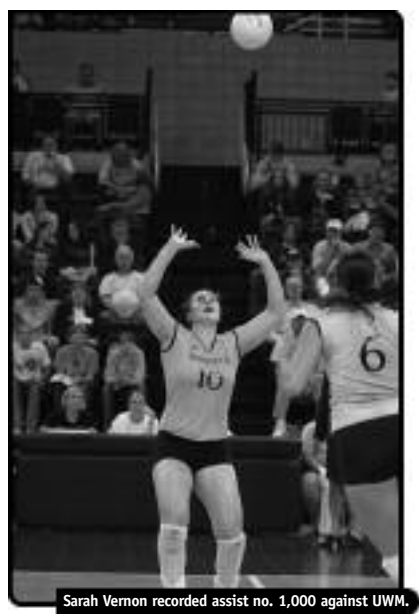

Like its match last night, Marquette dropped the first game, but rebounded to win three straight to take the match. East Carolina hit 41.9 percent in the first game to take the game victory. Kelley Wernert led the way for East Carolina with 13 kills.

"It was unreal," said head coach Pati Rolf. "The three seniors brought their game to a new level. They've been playing well, but I don't think I've seen them play this well."

Marquette dominated at the net, hitting 33.9 percent and didn't hit below 30.0 percent in any game. Marquette had no fewer than 17 kills in each of the three games and had less than six errors in each frame.

The Golden Eagles out-killed Tulane 53-32 and out-blocked the Green Wave 9.5-5.0. Marquette also owned advantage in digs, 49-46.

"We had tremendous discipline on defense and blocking," Rolf said. "We took another step forward tonight."

Marquette led most of the night. The Golden Eagles trailed in game one 21-20, but found itself behind only one other time at 1-0 in the third game. After trailing 21-20 in that first game, Marquette went on a 7-0 run to take a commanding six point lead and eventually won the game.

The second game was even until 7-7. Marquette pulled away a bit to lead 21-18, where it begin its domination. The Golden Eagles scored 39 of the next 53 points and held Tulane to just one more point in the second game.

In the third game, Marquette had little trouble racing out to a 9-1 lead and by as many as 18, cruising to the easy win.

Junior outside hitter Theresa Coughlin led Marquette with a double-double of 18 kills and 16 digs. Sophomore outside hitter Jamie Mueller added 16 kills. Freshman outside hitter Kimberley Todd and senior middle blocker Erica Heisser each landed 10 kills.

"We took it to a new level of play, even from last night," head coach Pati Rolf said. "We keep improving. Everybody has brought their best game at the same time. This was a total team effort."

Marquette (22-6) jumped out to a 2-0 lead after taking game one in convincing fashion by 15 points. Marquette started strong, logging 16 kills and a 29.4 attack percentage in the first frame. The Bearcats kept the game close, tying twice at 20-20 and 23-23, but Marquette never trailed in the final frame. Marquette closed out the game on a 10-5 run, fuelled by three kills from Coughlin to claim the match.

Marquette won the match despite DuPont having 22 kills. The Golden Eagles silenced some of the Cincinnati attack with 17.5 blocks, led by eight from freshman middle blocker Jenn Brown.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Marquette was competitive in its first Conference USA title match, but couldn't upset 20th-ranked Louisville as the Golden Eagles lost to the tournament's top seed, 3-0 (30-24, 30-22, 30-24).

With a strong final game, junior outside hitter Theresa Coughlin recorded 14 kills to lead Marquette. Freshman outside hitter Kimberley Todd had 12 kills and sophomore outside hitter Jamie Mueller landed 11. Louisville was led by Lena Ustymenko with 15 kills and hit 39.4 percent. Jennifer Hoffman finished with 11 kills and seven blocks to pace Louisville on the defensive side.

"It was a heck of a game," head coach Pati Rolf said. "Louisville's a powerful team and we played our hearts out. Against Louisville, you have to come with all six players and we were a little short tonight. But I'm proud of what we've done and these seniors have played incredible all year."

After Louisville built a 10-point lead in game one, Marquette (22-7) rallied to cut the lead to five. Marquette didn't score consecutive points until the 19-12 mark. However, the Golden Eagles' 5-1 rally brought the game close at 24-19 with a kill by Muller, who led the team with four kills in the first game. However, the Cardinals were able to close out the game on one of two kills by Yartseva in the game. Ustymenko was the balance of offense for Louisville (27-2) with five kills. Todd and Vernon also added four kills in the game for Marquette.

While the beginning of the first game wasn't close, Marquette kept game two tight. The Golden Eagles didn't trail by more than two points until 14-11 when Ustymenko killed a lengthy rally. Mueller and senior middle blocker Erica Heisser quickly responded to stifle any momentum Louisville had with kills combined with an error by Louisville brought the score level again at 14.

The game remained close throughout with 10 ties. However, a 5-0 run by Louisville gave the Cardinals a 24-19 advantage and they would use that to close out the game. Ustymenko was key to the rally for Louisville with six kills in the second game. One of three blocks by Hoffman in the game closed out the frame, 30-22, Mueller and Vernon again had four kills for Marquette.

"You can't make mistakes against Louisville," Rolf said. "We kept it tight, which is what we hoped to do. We played disciplined, but they took advantage of any mistakes."

Coughlin started the third game strong, recording a pair of kills to lead Marquette to a four-point lead, its largest in the match. She came alive in the third game, recording a team-high seven kills. Louisville went on a 4-0 run to earn the first of 10 ties in the game at 10-10. An Ustymenko ace gave Louisville its first lead at 12-11, but the game continued to remain close.

Back-to-back kills by Heisser gave Marquette a 17-15 lead, but Louisville wouldn't let Marquette's lead last, tying the two points later. A block by Stephanie

Marsh and a block by Bing Sun and Hoffman combined with a kill from Marsh gave Louisville a four-point lead at 23-19, and from there, it would close out the match. Marsh had three of her four blocks in the final game.

Louisville's accuracy was key to the win. The Cardinals hit 37.2 percent in the second game and 48.6 percent in the final game, on the way to hitting 38.2 percent for the match. Marquette stayed competitive in the second game with 16 kills and a match high 22.5 attack percentage.

Louisville out-killed Marquette 58 to 53 as the Golden Eagles kept that number close thanks to 22 kills in the third game. Marquette struggled with the powerful Louisville offense, as it didn't record a block through two games and only had one for the match.

"We struggled with the block tonight," Rolf added. "Louisville's the type of team that can hit over the top of the block. But this tournament was a step forward for us. We have a lot of young players and it was a good learning experience for them to be in this situation."

Coughlin and Vernon were named to the all-tournament team, along with Hoffman and Ustymenko of Louisville. Memphis' Heather Watts and Cincinnati's Julie DuPont were also named all-tournament. Ustymenko was named tournament MVP.

"It was great that the two were named all-tournament," Rolf said. "What Coughlin and the three seniors — Saran Vernon, Erin Freer and Erica Heisser — have accomplished with this team has made me very proud."

With the win, Louisville extends its match win streak to 19 and its game win streak to 54. The Cardinals also claim the automatic bid from Conference USA, while Marquette will await a possible at-large selection to the NCAA Tournament, which will be named on Sunday, Nov. 28.

"I'm proud of getting to the final," Rolf said. "We did some good things this year and played a good schedule. But we have to remember that there are some good teams out there that played good volleyball."
