2011 Outlook: 'Consistency in the little things'

Christian Figueroa has been a part of the UMass Lowell men's soccer program's greatest ever teams.

He was a second year assistant coach in 2008 when the River Hawks reached the NCAA Tournament quarterfinal where they suffered an agonizing 0-1 defeat at Dowling with a minute left in double overtime.

Figueroa was a freshman in 2003 when UMass Lowell reached the NCAA quarterfinal the first time, where it suffered a 0-2 loss at Dowling. In 2004, he helped guide UMass Lowell to the NE-10 Tournament championship.

The first-year head coach makes it clear that he wants the program back to that level.

"I think we need to work on our consistency in the little things that have helped us reach those marks in the past," said Figueroa.

UMass Lowell still has three players – Matheus Candido, Asley Barrios and Alex Sindoni – who were freshmen of the 2008 team which captured a share of the Northeast-10 Conference regular season, won the NCAA Tournament New England Region and got to the NCAA quarterfinal.

The last two seasons – in which the River Hawks went a combined 7-23-2 (5-19-2 in the NE-10) – were painful. But if UMass Lowell can display the resolve it did over the last four games last season, in which it defeated Merrimack (2-0) and Saint Rose (2-1), drew with Southern Connecticut (1-1) and lost at New Haven (3-1) – reclaiming its place among the top echelon within the next few years is not a far-fetched goal.

"We definitely got better," Figueroa said. "We improved as the year went on. We used to get results through restarts, which I felt we started to do at the end of last year. That is definitely one of the things I want

us to be consistent with this season, among other things."

Candido, alongside juniors Bruno Bonicontró and Ryan McLeod and sophomore **Kyle Garvan**, give the River Hawks a solid foundation in the midfield.

The River Hawks also have several impact transfers who could see action immediately in sophomore **Dan Galvin**, who made seven appearances as a freshman at Central Connecticut in 2009; junior **Ryan Cronin**, who appeared in 28 matches in two years at American International College; and junior

Ryan Singh, who compiled seven goals and seven assists in two years at Becker College.

Freshmen **Felipe Fagundes**, a Merrimack Valley Conference all-star at Lowell H.S. and New England Revolution Academy product, has shown flashes of promise in the preseason, while freshman **Eric DeSantis**, an all-conference standout at Woburn H.S., is available after an injury redshirt year.

Figueroa can also tab first-year sophomore **Luiny Ascencio**, a former player at North Andover H.S.

"I think our midfield could be our biggest strength," Figueroa said. "I think we've got plenty of maturity there. They understand the game and what we're trying to do here and are able to command the team around them."

UMass Lowell scored only three times in its first nine matches a year ago, en route to only 13 goals for the year. The graduation of Stephen Potcner, who had a team-high five goals a year ago, will hurt but Figueroa believes the River Hawks will have the tools for a pungent attack.

Back are forwards **Mohammed Saeed**, who chipped in two goals last year, and speedy sophomore **Gideon Gyasi**, who started 14 of 16 matches. Figueroa can

also tab senior Bruno Almeida, who featured six times in 2010, and **Adilson Lima**, who played in eight matches as a reserve.

Scoring could also come from freshman **Homero Morais**, who comes in following a highly successful career at Somerville H.S. where he scored 98 goals and was named the Greater Boston League Player of the Year three straight years.

"I think our scoring will improve this year based on our combination of personnel," said Figueroa. "We have guys who can add a different dynamic to our offense from several positions."

UMass Lowell surrendered 1.94 goals per match, but the back four improved significantly as the season progressed. Behind Barrios and sophomore **Neil Lavanchy**, that figure is expected to drop.

A specialist on free kicks, Barrios can also add a bit of offense from the back evidenced by his one goal (off a free kick in the 3-2 loss to Bentley) and three assists. Lavanchy, who has a knack for getting forward, assisted on two goals a year ago.

Also bolstering the defense are sophomores **Ross Marchand**, who appeared in 12 matches last year (six starts); and **Vinicius Linces**, who is back after a season's absence.

Junior **James Costello**, limited to three appearances last year due to an injury, is fully fit while junior **Michael Ntori** will contend for a starting spot.

Freshman **Juan Moreira** is another newcomer who has widely impressed in the preseason and, at 6 feet, 2 inches, brings immediate size to the back. Junior **Collins Appau**, who saw action in 26 games at Franklin Pierce the last two seasons, is also an option.

Natural lefty **Beau Theriault**, a junior,

gives Figueroa an immediate option on the left side.

"We have a lot of options in the back," Figueroa noted. "Both Asley and Neil bring back some experience from a group last year that improved as the year went on. Neil is a defender capable of joining the attack while Asley is dangerous on set pieces."

Sophomores **Chris Maierle** and **Connor Askins** are the likely candidates to start in

goal. Maierle started the first five matches last year before sustaining an injury,

which gave way to Askins, who went the rest of the way and improved remarkably.

Also in the mix is junior **Steven Azarito**, who comes in following a five-year stint in the U.S. Navy, preceded by two years playing at Mohawk Valley Community College. Senior **Toby Frost**, who played one season at Moravian (Pa.) College, will assist the goalkeepers in training and will be ready if called upon.

"I think both Chris and Connor give us a great chance to win games," Figueroa said. "Steve has improved since his arrival and will push Chris and Connor for minutes."

UMass Lowell opens the season Thursday at No. 4 Dowling, the first of four straight matches away from home against some of the best in the country. After Dowling, the River Hawks visit Merrimack on Sept. 7; Bridgeport Sept. 10 and No. 6 Franklin Pierce on Sept. 13.

"I think those are going to be very tough games to have to play coming out of the gate," Figueroa noted. "But these games will serve as a good gauge as to where we will need to be to get back to the NCAA Tournament."

The Coaching Staff

Over the last four matches of the 2010 season, Figueroa led the River Hawks to a 2-1-1 clip, which included impressive victories over Merrimack (2-0) and Saint Rose (2-1) as well as a 1-1 deadlock with NCAA Tournament entry Southern Connecticut.

Figueroa spent four seasons with previous head coaches Bryan Scales and Ted Priestly following an honor-filled career from 2003-06.

One of the programs best-ever midfielders, he helped the River Hawks to a 47-17-14 record (.603), two NCAA Tournaments - including the quarterfinal round in 2003 - and two Northeast-10 Conference Tournament championships. Along the way, Figueroa was the 2003 NE-10 Freshman of the Year and went on to earn all-conference honors and NSCAA All-Northeast Region status three times, culminating with first team honors in 2005 and 2006.

A two-year captain, Figueroa was one of 25 Division I, II and III players invited to tryout for the New England Revolution in February of 2007. He currently ranks 17th on UML's all-time scoring list with 12 goals and 14 assists (38 points).

Outside of UMass Lowell's season, Figueroa is an active coach in the club circuit. Alongside former UMass Lowell assistant Marc Connolly, Figueroa helped lead the FC Stars U-18 boys team to the Massachusetts State Cup U-17 championship in 2009 and 2010, which included a trip to the Region 1 (Northeast) championship game.

A graduate of North Andover H.S., Figueroa was a Cape Ann League all-star as well as an MIAA All-State and All-Eastern Mass standout. A three-year starter, he led the Scarlet Knights to the Cape Ann League championship in 2000 and 2002 and the MIAA Division II North final in 2001.

A native of North Andover, Mass., Figueroa lives in Lowell, MA.

A standout player from 2006-08, Jamie Wangia enters his first full season with the UMass Lowell men's soccer team after

joining the coaching staff midway through the 2010 season.

Wangia will have a hand in every facet of the program, including recruiting, practice and tactical management, as well as offseason training.

A 6-foot-2 attacking midfielder, Wangia helped lead UMass Lowell to a 32-12-14 record over three years which included NCAA Tournament bids in 2007 and 2008. He enjoyed his best year as a senior in which he compiled eight goals and six assists and helped lead the River Hawks to a 13-4-4 record (9-1-3 in the Northeast-10 Conference) and a share of the NE-10 regular season title.

UMass Lowell went on capture the NCAA East Region title with victories over Molloy (3-2) and host Southern New Hampshire (2-1) before suffering an overtime loss at Dowling in the NCAA Quarter-final.

As a junior, Wangia compiled six goals and three assists (15 points) in helping guide UMass Lowell a 12-4-4 record and a 10-2-1 showing in the NE-10 (second). The River Hawks drew with Southern Connecticut, 1-1, thanks to a goal by Wangia, and advanced on penalty kicks before falling to NCAA Champion Franklin Pierce in the second round.

Wangia graduated in 2009 with a degree in business administration. He was among 25 NCAA Division I, II and III New England-based players to earn an invitation to a closed tryout with the New England Revolution.

In addition to coaching, he works in UMass Lowell's Office of Business Affairs. He is currently studying for his MBA.

A native of Thika, Kenya, Wangia lives in Lowell, Mass.

Benn Eaton



A 2006 graduate of the University, Benn Eaton joins the UMass Lowell staff for his third season and will work exclusively with the goalkeepers.

A three-year goalkeeper for the River Hawks, Eaton enjoyed his best season as a senior when he appeared in six matches (311 minutes), helping UMass Lowell to a 10-5-4 clip and the NE-10 Tournament semifinal round.

A graduate of Woburn H.S., Eaton was a four-year player at Woburn H.S. and led the Tanners to the state championship as a junior. He was also named a Middlesex League all-star and helped guide WHS to League titles and consecutive undefeated season as a junior and senior.

Eaton graduated with a degree in fine arts/graphic design in 2006. He lives in Woburn, Mass.
