NE-10 Tournament Home Field Advantage in the Balance

With a victory tonight, coupled with a Le Moyne loss Saturday (at home vs. No. 2 Franklin Pierce), UMass Lowell will ascend to third place and earn the No. 3 seed for the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament. The NE-10 Quarterfinal is slated to begin Tuesday, Nov. 1.

Franklin Pierce (11-0-1 NE-10, 15-0-1 overall) and Southern New Hampshire (10-2 NE-10, 14-2 overall) have solidified the Nos. 1 and 2 seeds.

Among the many scenarios that could play out this weekend includes Stonehill overtaking UMass Lowell for the No. 4 seed. Stonehill currently sits in sixth place and, with a win tonight and a Bentley loss this afternoon, would slide into fourth place.

Following Tuesday night's 1-0 overtime win against Dominican, the River Hawks are back in the win column after a 3-1 loss to Southern New Hampshire and a 1-0 overtime loss at Southern Connecticut last week.

The win over Dominican marked UMass Lowell's seventh overtime match of the season (the River Hawks are 4-3 in extra time).

Stonehill, winner of three straight and four of its last five, has a 13-12-2 edge in the all-time series and has gone unbeaten against the River Hawks in the last three meetings (2-0-1). The Skyhawks have won the last two: 4-0 last year and 2-1 in 2009, both in Easton.
