2011 Outlook: Relentless

Following a perfect season is an imperfect situation, knowing that everyone is looking to knock off the defending National Champions. Despite the pressure, the UMass Lowell field hockey team is ready to take on the challenge the only way it knows how: with a relentless attitude.

Coach **Shannon Hlebichuk** knows that their games will be circled on every opponent's schedule, but it speaks to both last season's performance and the level of excellence UMass Lowell field hockey has reached.

"We've built a culture that wants to win a championship," said Hlebichuk. "Whether it's a Northeast-10 regular season championship, Northeast-10 Tournament Championship or a National Championship—it's always our goal. You choose to come to UMass Lowell because you want a championship."

The 2010 River Hawks completed that goal in style, racing to a sterling 24-0 record while outscoring opponents 119-8.

UMass Lowell won the NE-10 regular season crown with a 10-0 conference mark, and then defeated Stonehill for the NE-10 Tournament Championship. Obtaining their final goal, the River Hawks topped Stonehill and Shippensburg in the NCAA Tournament to claim the program's second ever National Championship.

Standing in UMass Lowell's path this season is the graduation of seven seniors from that record-setting squad: **Lizzy Ales, Amy Carbon, Liz Day, Katie Enaire, Jaime Hadley, Kate Hickey and Sammy Macy**. Among those seven, Day, Enaire, Hadley and Macy were named All-Americans in 2010.

Despite the losses, the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) selected UMass Lowell first in the Kookaburra Preseason Poll. The vote of confidence was echoed by the NE-10 coaches, who also selected the River Hawks to repeat as conference champions in their annual preseason

poll.

"It's based on last year's finish, which was fantastic and we're honored by the respect they've given us," added Hlebichuk.

"It's the first time we've been voted number one in preseason and it's a tremendous honor."

The biggest challenge facing UMass Lowell is its staggering losses on the offensive side of the field, graduating 234 points and 86 goals, well over 70% of each category's 2010 totals.

Stepping up to the challenge is an ensemble cast comprised of junior

Emily Painten, sophomores **Janelle DeCamillis**,

Melissa Effertz, Ali Ferraro and Rachel McCarthy.

"Those are five forwards that are all able to make their runs, they're relentless and they can play defense," said Hlebichuk. "That kind of complete package isn't something we've always had in the past."

That group combined to score 23 goals last season, led by McCarthy's 11—the most among all returning players.

Each player has impressed coach Hlebichuk on a variety of fronts. Ferraro and Effertz made terrific progress despite missing the spring to play softball at UMass Lowell, DeCamillis has cemented herself in the rotation after joining the program as a walk-on and Painten's unassuming attitude and scoring prowess are welcome traits on the forward line.

Perhaps the most important member of the forward line is McCarthy. The only rookie to reach double-digit points in a veteran-laced lineup, McCarthy managed to finish fourth in scoring with 32 total points.

"Rachel is a very gifted field hockey player," said Hlebichuk of McCarthy. "She creates, sees the field very well and can finish. We're getting her to play better defense on that forward line so she's an all around player. We expect big things from Rachel and the great news is she's only a sopho-

more--she has a lot of potential left even though she's already one of our best players."

The mindset approaching UMass Lowell's midfield in 2011 is to play as a cohesive unit. The River Hawks will call on a mix of five players to complete the job: seniors **Abby Auld** and **Annie Hansbury**, junior **Vanessa Kent** and freshmen **Chelsea Chronopoulos** and **Bianca Jones**.

The midfielders bring a wealth of experience and athleticism to the table, but have the tall task of replacing Day.

"Liz was involved in every play on the field and did it as such a high level, she was unmatched," said Hlebichuk. "No question in my mind that she was the best all-around player I've ever had."

According to Hlebichuk, the key is to not have one player try to replace her production, but for the midfielders to work as a unit that can collectively replicate her impact on the turf.

That task is well in reach with the talented senior leaders Auld and Hansbury at the helm. The River Hawks consider Auld an unsung player for her work at left-mid last season--her creativity and deceptive skill set makes her a versatile weapon. Likewise, Hansbury is terrific on offense and possess great field vision that will serve UMass Lowell well this season.

While no area of the field was unaffected from senior graduation, the River Hawk defense may be the best equipped for the challenge. UMass Lowell retains the core of its defense with senior **Kayla Littig**, juniors **Chelsea Gillies** and **Sarah Wilcox**, and sophomore **Kayla MacDonald** all returning.

"To lose 75% of the scoring is tough, but to bring back, in my mind, 90% of the defense--I think we're going to be OK," said Hlebichuk. "Especially with goalkeeper Melanie Hopkins in the mix."

Gillies makes her return to the field after suffering a torn ACL midway through

2010 and has impressed the coaching staff with her determined approach to the game.

Gillies' high school teammate at Chelmsford, MacDonald, will also see a lot of time after earning a spot on the NE-10 All-Rookie Team last season. MacDonald is a smart defender who has "come into her own" during preseason according to Hlebichuk.

Overshadowed by the River Hawks' high-powered offense last season, Littig and Wilcox will look to have breakout seasons as the backbone of the defense.

"We have, in my opinion, two of the best defenders I've ever seen in this league -- never mind on my team -- that are underrated and undervalued," Hlebichuk said of Littig and Wilcox. "We're known for our scoring, but if someone were to purely watch the game they would be amazed by Sarah and Kayla's ability on the field."

Not to be forgotten is goalkeeper Melanie Hopkins, who is arguably the most important individual on the defense. Coming off of an All-American season in which she totaled 17 shutouts and allowed eight goals in the entire season, Hopkins will likely face more traffic at the net.

"Mel thrives under pressure, she puts it on herself, and she wants to do the job. It's been that way since high school when she started all four years there," added Hlebichuk.

With all of the changes in personnel, UMass Lowell appears to have a large challenge ahead of it. The coaching staff feels the success of the River Hawks will boil down to work ethic and that's something woven into the fabric of this team's mentality.

"We'll need to re-defend and work harder than we've had to at times in the past because it came so naturally," said Hlebichuk. "What makes this team so dangerous athletically is that their work ethic is relentless and that's going to make us very difficult to defend."

The Coaching Staff

After nine years as head coach at UMass Lowell, Shannon Hlebichuk has little left to accomplish: NCAA Championships in 2005 and 2010; Six Northeast-10 Conference Tournament titles (2003-07; 2010); and eight consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, six of which in the championship game.

With a sterling record of 162-42 (.794), awards have been plentiful in Hlebichuk's nine seasons for her and her players. She was named the Division II Coach of the Year by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) in 2003, 2005, 2007 and 2010; the NE-10 Coach of the Year in seven of her nine seasons; and NFHCA Division II North Coach of the Year five times.

She has also guided her players to NE-10 All-Conference honors 47 times and All-American status 35 times – including six in the 2010 season.

UMass Lowell is coming off a perfect 24-0 year in 2010, which saw it capture the Conference regular season and tournament titles as well as the NCAA Championship, the River Hawks' second title in six years.

Eight of Hlebichuk's players were named to the NE-10 All-Conference teams while six were honored as All-Americans. Senior Liz Day was named NE-10 Player of the Year, NE-10 Tournament Most Outstanding Player, and to the NCAA All-Tournament Team, while senior Sammy Macy earned the prestigious Honda Award for Division II Female Student-Athlete of the Year.

Named head coach in December of 2001, Hlebichuk led the River Hawks to a 9-9 clip in 2002 and to the NE-10 Tournament – its first-ever postseason bid. Just one year later, UMass Lowell went 15-8, captured the NE-10 Tournament and advanced to the NCAA title match where it fell to Bloomsburg University (4-1).

The 2003 NCAA championship game was the first of six championship game appearances in eight years, coupled with semifinal showings in 2004 and 2006. On the eve of the 2003 NE-10 Tournament championship, Hlebichuk became the third field hockey player inducted into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Outside of coaching, Hlebichuk served on the NFHCA Hall of Fame Committee from 2008-10 and was formerly Northeast Region chair of the NCAA Division II Field Hockey Committee and the NFHCA Division II All-American Committee. She also served two years on the NFHCA North-South All-Star Game Committee and was named head coach of the North Region squad in 2004 and 2005.

During the summer, Hlebichuk is the director of the Northeast Field Hockey Camp at The Governor's Academy in Newbury, MA, which trains more than 150 players.

Over the span of her career (1994-98), Hlebichuk amassed 33 goals and 29 assists (formerly a school record), pitting her eighth on UML's all-time scoring list. She was an integral player in helping the River Hawks to a 15-4 record in 1997, up from a 5-15 clip the year prior.

A two-year captain, Hlebichuk was twice named to the NFHCA All-America team and was named the 1997-98 NCAA Woman of the Year for the state of Massachusetts.

Hlebichuk's field hockey prowess carried over to the classroom as she earned a spot on the NFHCA National Academic Squad three times. She was also named a GTE Academic All-American and was co-chair of UML's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

Upon graduation in 1998, Hlebichuk earned her master's degree in higher education at Arizona State in 2000.

Hlebichuk and her husband Corey reside in Nashua, NH, with their daughter Liv (8).

Kerry Dudley

A 1998 graduate of UMass Lowell, Kerry Dudley begins her 10th year as the goalkeepers coach.

Over her first four seasons, Dudley played

an integral role in helping UMass Lowell reduce its goals against average from 1.91 in 2001 down to then a school-record 0.99 in 2006. UMass Lowell shattered that mark in 2010 with a paltry eight goals against, making for a 0.33 GAA and 17 shutouts.

During her tenure, Dudley has trained and developed several outstanding goalkeepers, including two-time All-American and 2010 UMass Lowell Athletic Hall of Fame inductee Patrice Mendoza (2000-03); 2004 Northeast-10 Conference Co-Goalkeeper of the Year Nicole Staiti; and 2010 All-American/NE-10 Goalkeeper of the Year Melanie Hopkins.

Dudley remains active in the sport aside from her alma mater, having served as the head goalkeepers coach for the U.S. Field Hockey Association (USFHA) Futures Program. She is currently the head goalkeepers coach for the North East Elite Field Hockey Club and the director of goalkeeping at Northeast Field Hockey Camp.

Dudley was a four-year goalkeeper at UMass Lowell from 1993-96, and also served as a student assistant coach in 1997. She earned her master's degree in education at Salem State College in May '06, and is a physical education teacher at the Marsh Grammar School in Methuen, Mass.

She lives in Haverhill, Mass.



Sammy Macy

Following a sterling career from 2007-10, Sammy Macy enters her first year as a member of the UMass Lowell field hockey staff.

A three-time All-American by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA), Macy helped UMass Lowell post a four-year record of 81-14 (.853) which included the 2010 NCAA Championship and four appearances in the NCAA title game. Additionally, the River Hawks captured three Northeast-10 Conference regular season championships (2007, 2008, 2010) and two tournament crowns (2007, 2010).

Along the way, Macy was a three-time NE-10 First Team All-Conference standout, including the Player of the Year in 2009. UMass Lowell's all-time leading scorer, Macy compiled 91 goals and 38 assists (220 points), which ranks second all-time in NCAA Division II.

As a senior, Macy was the catalyst with a school-record 30 goals and 14 assists en route to a 24-0 season (10-0 in the NE-10). Perhaps most impressive, Macy battled back from two anterior cruciate ligament tears over her career, emerging a stronger player each year.

In June, Macy was presented the 2010-11 Honda/Collegiate Women Sports Award for Division II Female Athlete of the Year. In February, Macy is expected to join the Labrador Hockey Club in Queensland, Australia.

A criminal justice major, Macy graduated with a 3.12 cumulative average. She lives in Tewksbury, Mass.

A native of Windham, N.H. and 2010 graduate of Boston College, Chelsey Feole enters her second year on the UMass Lowell field

hockey coaching staff.

While at BC, Feole was a two-time All-American forward (First Team in 2009 and Second Team in 2008). As a senior, she was named to both the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) all-star team as well as the ACC All-Academic Team in each of her final three seasons. As a senior, she was also named to the ECAC Division I First Team and ACC All-Tournament Team.

She graduated from the Heights with school records for most goals (26) and points (64) in a single season and earned the Athletic Director's Award for Academic Achievement.

Aside from her accomplishments at BC, Feole played for the U21 Junior National Squad in 2008 and 2009.

Along with assisting UMass Lowell, Feole is the director of North East Elite Field Hockey in North Andover, Mass., at which she trains more than 100 players ranging between eight and 18 years old.

She lives in Windham, N.H.
