2011 Outlook: Experience and Depth

Rebuilding years...they happen. And in UMass Lowell's case, they lead to better seasons.

The last time UMass Lowell missed out on the NCAA Tournament before last year was in 2008, which ended a streak of three years in the NCAAAs. The year after, the River Hawks fielded arguably its best team in school history.

Head coach Elie Monteiro, entering his 10th year, is looking for a similar outcome. UMass Lowell took its knocks last year, but finished a respectable 8-8-2 (8-7-0 in the Northeast-10 Conference) and advanced to the NE-10 Tournament for the seventh straight year.

"I felt we had a couple games where we let ourselves down, a couple of rookie mistakes here and there, some instances where we didn't take all the chances we created," Monteiro said. "In any season, we can expect to have one or two games where not everything is clicking.

"This year we need to find a way to fight through those low moments," he added. "The experience the kids gained last year will help with that."

Perhaps what ailed UMass Lowell last year was youth: the River Hawks graduated eight starters from the 2009 team, including two All-Americans.

The River Hawks were in every match. Six of their eight losses were by one goal, including three in overtime. In all, UMass Lowell played to extra time six times, including its 1-1 deadlock with Merrimack in the NE-10 Tournament, which the Warriors prevailed in penalty kicks.

"I think the depth is better this year, for

sure," Monteiro noted. "We've seen in the preseason friendlies that we can go deeper on the bench and rely on people to do the job for us."

Seven starters and 16 veterans return, including two-thirds of last year's scoring. Graduated, however, are three of the better players in the program's history in forward **Brianne Bozzella** (a team-high seven goals and four assists), midfielder **Ella Merullo** and defender **Michelle LaMar** – each a staple on their lines.

Additionally, freshman goalkeeper **Micaela Butlin**, named to the NE-10 All-Rookie Team, opted to transfer.

They are significant losses. But Monteiro has recruited well and has the program at a level at which getting into the NCAA Tournament is an expectation every year.

Defensively, the River Hawks were traditionally in tact: they ranked fourth among NE-10 leaders in goals against average with a clip of 1.07 per 90 minutes.

Monteiro expects a stalwart back four, led by senior **Hannah Merullo**, an All-Northeast-10 Conference Second Team standout, and junior **Taylor Hartmann**. Also back is sophomore **Sarah Raye**, who gave the River Hawks a bit of offense with three goals last season.

"Obviously Hannah is our leader back there," said Monteiro. "She's accepted the responsibility and she's doing really well with it. She organizes the rest of the backs very well."

Contending for the fourth starting spot will be senior **Jackie Zani**, who has given reliable minutes off the bench for three years and could slip right in. Monteiro can also tab

junior **Casey Schulze** or sophomore **Margaret McSpirtt**.

New to the lineup is freshman **Brittany Kackowski**, who, at 5-foot-8, brings size to the back. Kackowski was an all-conference standout at Torrington H.S.

Senior **Maddy Bissailon** and junior **Amy Cramer** could emerge among the most creative tandems in the NE-10. As Cramer enjoyed getting forward last year (two goals in UMass Lowell's final three matches), Bissailon remained back, but through her career has proved deadly from distance.

"Maddy is someone whose technique and feel for the game keeps us clicking," Monteiro said. "I think we're able to do some different things because of her flexibility and the way she sees the game. She is definitely a calming influence. She helps players in other positions to see things."

Likely to start on the right side is junior **Gia O'Connor** who played in all but one match last year. Speedy junior **Jenna Costa**, who came into her own on the left side last year, will also return after starting all 18 matches a year ago.

Monteiro can also call upon senior **Kaitlyn Hurd**, who featured in seven matches in 2010. Senior **Erin Fleury**, who emerged as a defensive staple in the middle as a sophomore, will redshirt the year due to an injury.

Freshman **Courtney Stefano** will battle for minutes following a high school career which saw her earn all-state and all conference honors all three years at Montville H.S.

Alongside Bozzella last season, junior **Keanna Santos** found her touch and helped give the River Hawks a solid one-two punch

up front. With six goals and four assists, Santos looks to emerge as one of the top markswomen in the Conference.

Juniors

Colleen Soper and **Julia Donigian** have patiently bided their time and could slip in up front. Soper made 11 appearances last season while Donigian featured in 12 games.

Monteiro can also turn to a pair of impressive freshmen in **Brittany Russo** and **Haley Benson**, both off memorable high school careers. Russo compiled 101 goals and 38

assists and was a four-time

Northeast Conference all-star.

Benson was the Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a junior and senior at Winthrop H.S.

"Keanna had a great year last year," said Monteiro. "She's going to hit the ground running. She's playing with more belief and confidence. We also feel we've brought in some players who are also going to be effective."

The River Hawks will also be virtually new at goalkeeper with redshirt sophomore **Jill Carlson**, an injury redshirt last year, and freshman **Jane Hatzikonstantis**, fresh off a stellar career at Central Catholic H.S.

Prior to coming to UMass Lowell, Carlson was a four-year starter at Lexington H.S. where she was named the Middlesex League Goalkeeper of the Year. Hatzikonstantis was a three-year starter at Central Catholic, which she backstopped to three Merrimack Valley Conference championships while earning MVC all-star status as a senior.

The Coaching Staff

Head Coach Elie Monteiro



Elie Monteiro enters his tenth year as head coach of the women's soccer team and has steadily maintained the program within the upper echelon of the Northeast-10 Conference and East Region.

The River Hawks (12-5-4 overall, 10-3-2 in the NE-10 in 2009) enter 2010 fresh off a stellar year which saw them rewrite the record book and earn their fourth NCAA Tournament invitation in five years. The year followed a 2008 campaign in which UMass Lowell went 8-5-5 (6-3-5 NE-10) and advanced to the semifinal of the NE-10 Tournament.

In 2007, UMass Lowell went 11-9-1 (6-7-1 NE-10) with its third straight NCAA Tournament appearance, in which the River Hawks suffered a 1-0 setback to Merrimack in the first round. The season followed a 2006 campaign which saw UML go 10-5-4 (10-3-1 NE-10) and come within a penalty shootout of displacing Franklin Pierce in the NCAA Tournament New England Region first round.

In 2005, Monteiro guided the River Hawks to a 12-7-1 clip (9-4-1 NE-10) and their first-ever appearance in the NAAs. The season saw the fall of many school records, including victories (12), fewest goals allowed (17) and shutouts (nine) in a season. Over the last five seasons, Monteiro has compiled a 54-36-11 clip.

Prior to becoming UMass Lowell's head coach, Monteiro served as an assistant coach with the UMass Lowell men's and women's teams for two years and spent three years as an assistant coach at Franklin Pierce. While with the UMass Lowell men's program, Monteiro helped the River Hawks to a 23-15-3 clip (.561) and consecutive postseason appearances.

At Franklin Pierce, Monteiro helped the Ravens to NCAA Division II championships in 1997 and 1999, as well as the NCAA Tournament semifinals in 1998. He helped FPU to an astounding three-year record of 62-2-0 (.969) which included three undefeated seasons in the New England Collegiate Conference.

After graduating from Southern New Hampshire University (then New Hampshire College) in 1997, Monteiro enjoyed a six-year professional career as a starting defender with the Phantoms of New Hampshire of the United Soccer Leagues (USL). He helped the Phantoms to a six-year clip of 102-60-6 (.607), which included an appearance in the USL national semifinal in 1997 and the USL championship match in 1998. He was named to the USL All-Tournament Team both years.

In 2001, Monteiro received his 'C' coaching license from the United States Soccer Federation (USSF). He also served as head coach of the Lady Phantoms of New Hampshire of the USL W2 League from 2003-05.

Monteiro was a two-year standout for the SNHU men's soccer team and helped the Penmen to a two-year clip of 30-6-2 and an appearance in the 1995 NCAA Tournament. He received his degree in sports management.

Previously, Monteiro was a two-year player at Massasoit Community College where he earned All-New England Region honors as a senior and led the Warriors to the NJCAA Tournament semifinals. En route, Monteiro was named the defensive most valuable player of the New England Regional championship.

Born in Dakar, Senegal, Monteiro was raised in Brockton, MA. He currently lives in Manchester, NH, with his wife, Claudine, and their daughter, Isabella Rose (7) and son, Sebastian (5).

The Coaching Staff



Glenn Christofori

A native of Arlington, Mass., Glenn Christofori enters his fourth year at UMass Lowell and brings over 30 years of experience at all levels.

Collegiately, he was a men's assistant coach at UMass Amherst from 1980-82, where he received his masters degree in education and moved on to Harvard in 1986 where he assisted the men's team which advanced to the NCAA Tournament semifinal. He also spent two years as the women's head coach at Mount Ida (1999, 2000) and Emerson College (1997, 1998).

Among Christofori's high school coaching highlights was a two-year undefeated streak at his alma mater Arlington H.S. which resulted in a pair of Greater Boston League titles. He also enjoyed stints at Rindge & Latin (boys), Belmont H.S. (girls) and Groton-Dunstable, where he helped the 2007 girls to a 10-2-6 clip and the No. 4 ranking in Central Mass.

In the professional ranks, Christofori also served as a scout with the San Jose Earthquakes in 1982, when they vaulted George Best; and for the New England Revolution in 1998 under head coach Walter Zenga.

Christofori received his 'A' license in 1992 and has been U.S. Soccer Regional ODP coach since, training the likes of Freddy Adu and Michael Bradley.

Christofori lives in Nashua, N.H.

Eric Sigman



A native of Acton, Mass., Eric Sigman returns to the coaching staff for his eighth year and will continue as the goalkeepers' coach.

A four-year goalkeeper at the University of Vermont (1996-99), Sigman helped the Catamounts to a 31-20-4 record over his final three years. Among the highlights was a 12-5-2 clip in 1997 – up from a 5-12-2 clip a year prior – which saw UVM place third in the America East Conference.

A graduate of Acton-Boxborough H.S., Sigman was a three-year starting goalkeeper and earned Dual County League all-star honors as a senior. He led A-B to consecutive second-place finishes in 1995 and 1996 and topped the Dual County League in shutouts in 1996.

During the offseason, Sigman played for the Bandits Soccer Club from 1992-99 and helped it advance to the state finals three times. He also served as a goalkeeping instructor for the Bandits from 1995-99.

Sigman earned his law degree from Suffolk University in May of 2005 and is currently a general practitioner in Medford, Mass., where he resides with his wife Lisa and daughter Eilison (1).



Katelyn Campopiano

Following a stellar playing career at UMass Lowell, Katelyn Campopiano moved to the sidelines and enters her fourth year of administrative duties in addition to assisting in matches

and practice.

A four-year starter, Campopiano helped transform the River Hawk defense, with which she helped establish school records for shutouts (nine in 2005 and 2007) and goals against average (0.85 in 2006) in a season.

UMass Lowell's goals allowed (19) and goals against average (1.11) in Campopiano's tenure at the time was the lowest of any four-year period in the program's history. She

started a possible of 75 of UML's 80 matches from 2004-07.

Campopiano was the recipient of many honors in her career, particularly as a senior, earning NSCAA New England Region and Northeast-10 Conference first team status.

A liberal arts major, Campopiano was also a standout academically, maintaining a 3.69 in liberal arts and earning such distinction as NE-10 All-Academic First Team (2006, 2007) and *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District (2007).

A native of Chelmsford, Mass., Campopiano was a Merrimack Valley Conference all-star at Chelmsford H.S. which captured MVC titles in 2000 and 2001.

Campopiano lives in Lowell, MA.
