### TERPS HEAD SOUTH FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK TO FACE GOLDEN KNIGHTS

- The Maryland Terrapins travel to Orlando, Fla., for its first three-game series of the season. The Terps face the University of Central Florida Golden Knights, who enter the weekend with a 2-3 record.
- Last weekend at the Winthrop Challenge in Rock Hill, S.C., Maryland took two of three games en route to its best start in two seasons. With a win Friday, the Terps would start the year out 3-1 for the first time since the 2005 season.
- Friday's loss at Winthrop drops the Terps' record in season openers to 45-39-1 all-time. They have not won on opening day since 2001, a 19-18 victory against North Carolina A&T in Rupp's first game at the helm of Terps baseball.
- Junior right-hander Kevin Biringner earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors this past week after his five-inning, one-hit performance for the win against Creighton. Biringner retired the first nine batters he faced and finished the day with five strikeouts.
- Junior reliever Brett Cecil set a new school record with his 16th career save on Saturday night in the Terps' 12-inning win over Creighton, 1-0. Cecil, who set the record for a single season in 2006 with 13 saves, was named to the preseason Clemens Award watch list and All-America second team by *Baseball America*.
- The series is the team's last weekend road trip until March 9 when it will open ACC play at NC State. Maryland will travel once prior to meeting up with the Wolfpack when it visits James Madison in Harrisonburg, Va., on February 27.

**SERIES HISTORY**

- This weekend's series is the first matchup between the two teams.

**START ME UP**

- Maryland's starting pitching was nearly lights-out last weekend, as all three starters combined for a total of nine hits, as the Terps won two of three at the Winthrop Challenge.
- Senior Casey Baron started the opener and was effective in five innings of work, allowing three runs as he earned the no decision against the host Eagles.
- Junior Ryan Mooror allowed just two hits in his five-inning stint on Saturday, as the Terps battled Gardner-Webb to a 1-0 victory in 12 innings. Mooror recorded two strikeouts on the day.
- Junior Kevin Biringner earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for his five-inning, one hit performance in Sunday's win over Creighton. He did not allow a hit until the fourth inning, when a leadoff single gave the Bluejays their lone baserunner with Biringner on the mound. In his outing, he notched five strikeouts while issuing no walks.

**SCOUTING THE GOLDEN KNIGHTS**

- UCF enters the weekend series with a 2-3 record, and is batting .263 as a team while the pitching staff has a combined ERA of 6.20
- Last weekend, the Golden Knights took one of three from the No. 15-ranked TCU Horned Frogs at home, with the win coming in a 8-6 come-from-behind contest on Sunday. The Knights overcame a 6-1 deficit by scoring seven unanswered runs.
- UCF defeated Florida International, a 9-3 victory in their second game of the season.
- The Golden Knights' offense is led by sophomore Steve Stropp, who leads the team with a .462 batting average and two doubles.
- Central Florida will start Mitch Houck (Friday), Mitch Herold (Saturday), and Jaeger Good (Sunday) on the mound.

**MELVIN'S MAGIC**

- Senior Dan Melvin entered the season as the top producer in the Terps lineup, as he led the team in 10 different offensive categories in 2007.
- The shortstop posted team highs in the following categories: batting average (.338), at-bats (204), runs (34), hits (69), home runs (five), RBIs (30), slugging percentage (.471), walks (23), on base percentage (.416), and multi-hit games (22).
- This past weekend, he continued his offensive impact as he belted a home run over the left field wall in the top of the 12th inning to lead the Terps to a 1-0 victory over Gardner-Webb. Melvin finished the weekend 4-for-10 with one stolen base.

**JOWERS' POWERS**

- Junior outfielder Nick Jowers showed off his offensive talents at the Winthrop Challenge, as he finished the weekend 4-for-8, with five RBIs.
- On Sunday, he led the Terps to victory over Creighton with his four RBIs, including a RBI sacrifice fly and his sixth career home run, a two-run shot in the fourth inning.
- Jowers is currently tied for seventh in the ACC in batting with a .500 average, and leads the conference in slugging percentage (1.000).

**CECIL SHUTS THE DOOR ON SAVE RECORDS**

- On Saturday against Gardner-Webb, junior Brett Cecil set the career saves record at Maryland as he earned his 16th save in the extra-innings win. Cecil faced four batters, striking out two as he continued to rewrite the record books.
- In 2006, Cecil shattered the single season mark for saves with 13, a figure that nearly doubled the old record of seven. That mark ranked third in the ACC and tied for 12th in the nation.
- In addition, Cecil recorded 54 strikeouts in 58.1 innings of work while compiling an ERA of 4.78. His 26 appearances tied for fourth on the all-time single season list.
- In his career, Cecil has compiled a 5-6 record and 4.35 ERA in 44 appearances. He has pitched 101.1 innings, with six career starts.
- During the 2006 campaign, he notched career highs in innings pitched (7.1) against North Carolina State and twice struck out six batters, most recently at North Carolina on March 19.
- Cecil has received numerous preseason accolades, as he was named to the Roger Clemens Award watch list, *Baseball America's* All-America second team, All-ACC second team, and the NCBWA Stopper of the Year watch list.

**TERPS CLOSE OUT 2006 WITH A BANG**

- As the team opens the 2007 season at Winthrop on Feb. 9, Maryland will be looking to build on its four-game win streak which closed out the 2006 regular season.
- Maryland grabbed an 11-9 victory at West Virginia on May 9, coming off a 13-hit outing which was capped by a three-run eighth inning to earn the lead. In that inning, Mike Murphy led off with a double and scored on a Steve Braun single after advancing to third on Dan Benick's sacrifice. Braun came home on a Nick Jowers triple on the next at-bat, and following a pitching change, Matt Maropis brought home the 11th run of the day on his double to right field. Brett Cecil closed out the game for his 12th save of the season after pitching a scoreless ninth inning. The win earned a season sweep over the Mountaineers, after the Terps defeated WVU, 10-8, in College Park on April 18.
- The final weekend of the season brought three more wins for the Terps, as solid pitching performances by Brad Taylor, Seth Overbey, and Ben Pfinsgraff earned wins over UMES in doubleheader action, 5-1 and 3-2, as well as a 7-0 shutout of Coppin State on May 11 in the season finale.
- The four-game win streak is the team's longest since the 2004 season, when it won four games in five days to end the month of March, notching wins over Duke twice, as well as VCU and Delaware.

**GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES FOR SPESSARD**

- Sophomore infielder Gerry Spessard tied a school record last season when he amassed five triples, a mark that is held by five other Terrapins.
- The last player to reach five triples in a season was Matt Swope, who accomplished the feat. The other players to do so are Ken Noe (1990), Tom Brown (1962), Chet Hanulak (1954), and Charlie Keller (1935).
- Spessard finished the season with a .259 average, and led the team with 14 doubles along with his five three-baggers.

**NO PLACE LIKE HOME**

- Two seasons removed from renovations to Shipley Field, the Maryland Terrapins continued to dominate "the Ship" in 2006, winning 18 of 28 games in College Park.
- Playing at Shipley Field proved to be too daunting a task for visitors outside the Atlantic Coast Conference, as the Terps amassed a 10-0 record against non-conference opponents at home. Following a 7-5 loss to Towson on May 4, 2005, Maryland has since accumulated a 13-game win streak at home against non-conference foes.
- Infielder Dan Melvin concluded a solid junior campaign batting .338, but he was even more effective in College Park. At Shipley Field, Melvin registered a .374 average, with eight of his 16 extra-base hits, as well as two-thirds of his team-leading 30 RBIs occurring at home.
- Terp pitchers felt just as comfortable at home, earning a 4.13 ERA with opposing players batting just .271. Brett Cecil earned eight of his record-shattering 13 saves at Shipley, while senior Seth Overbey was overpowering, with a 3-0 record and 0.69 ERA in 13 appearances.

**KEEP YOUR ENEMIES CLOSE**

- Maryland earned a reputation among its opponents as a tough team to beat in close games, as the Terps marked a 12-4 record in one-run games.
- The Terrapins were able to hold down late leads throughout the season, as they earned a 17-1 record when leading after the conclusion of the seventh inning.
- Crunch time proved to be the best time for the Terps, as they won both of their games in which they were tied heading into the final inning of regulation. The Terps maintained a 4-4 tie into the ninth inning against George Washington until Nick Jowers hit a walk-off home run to earn the 5-4 victory. Four days later against Duke, the two teams were deadlocked at 8-8 into extra innings before Dan Benick singled to left field, scoring Matt Maropis and earning the series win.

**TERPS' YOUTH MOVEMENT**

- Maryland's 2007 squad is rife with young talent, as the team lists just four seniors on the roster, while nine freshman will join the team this season.
- Two returning players will see meaningful action as well for the first time, as Bryan Hoffman and Mike Rozak redshirted last season, their first in College Park.
- Among the senior class are standouts Casey Baron and Dan Melvin, both who will contribute heavily. Melvin led the team in 10 offensive categories last season, while Baron is likely to be the Terps' number-one starter.
