TERPS RETURN HOME FOR IMPORTANT THREE-GAME SERIES AGAINST DEACONS

- After losing all three games last weekend at Georgia Tech, the Maryland Terrapins will try to regain momentum in the Atlantic Coast Conference when they host Wake Forest for a three-game weekend set.
- In Atlanta, the Terps dropped a close 5-4 decision on Friday night after a ninth-inning rally by the Jackets. A day later, Georgia Tech's offense exploded to a 16-6 victory. Sunday, a pair of GT homers sank the Terps, 4-2.
- In midweek action, Maryland took a 9-0 home victory against UMBC before falling in 13 innings the next day at Towson, 7-6.
- Maryland is looking for its third conference series win of the season, as the Terps have taken two games apiece from NC State and Clemson.
- Freshman **AJ Casario** leads the team in batting average (.327) and triples (3), while junior **Joe Palumbo** and sophomore **Mike Murphy** have been the Terps' best power hitters, with each recording four home runs.
- The Terrapins currently sit in fourth place in the ACC Atlantic Division, with a slim one-game lead over Wake Forest and Boston College. Overall, the Terps are tied with Miami for the seventh-best conference record.

SERIES HISTORY

- Maryland trails in the all-time series, 51-86-1 (.373)
- Last season, Maryland fell in the first two games at Winston-Salem, 15-4 and 4-3, before taking the finale 3-2.
- In 2005, the Terps won the opener, 5-4 in 10 innings, before recording 7-6 and 11-5 losses at Shiplely Field.
- Maryland is looking for its first series win against Wake Forest in seven seasons, as the Terps took two of three at Wake in 2000.

SCOUTING THE DEMON DEACONS

- Wake Forest is 15-16, and 4-8 in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Allan Dykstra leads the Deacon offense, as he is batting .358 with 10 doubles, 12 home runs, and 35 runs batted in, all team highs.
- The Deacons will send RHP Brad Kledzik (2-2, 4.81 ERA), LHP Garrett Bullock (2-1, 5.31 ERA), and RHP Charlie Mellies.

IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

- For Wake Forest Sunday starter Charlie Mellies, as his twin brother Dan is a member of the Terrapins.
- Charlie has played the Terps twice, earning a no-decision both times. In 2004, he pitched one inning of relief, allowing two runs and three hits. A year later, he started and threw 3.1 innings, allowing five runs on eight hits.
- Dan, a catcher who is currently injured, faced the Deacons once, as a defensive replacement in the eighth inning of the 3-2 win last season.

TERPS FLY PAST THE EAGLES

- On March 14, Maryland banged out 25 hits, tying a school record, as the Terps cruised to a 27-0 victory against Coppin State at Shiplely Field.
- Every Maryland position player recorded at least one hit in the contest, with Steve Braun and AJ Casario leading the squad with four hits each. Casario also paced the offense with seven RBIs.
- Senior Brandon Mise notched his first career hit, a triple in the fifth inning, and went on to finish 3-for-3 with an RBI. Other Terps making their mark in the hits column for the first time were freshman Ian Schwalenberg and redshirt freshman Mike Rozak, who each singled.
- Two weeks later, the Terps combined for a no-hitter as they defeated the Eagles 12-0 at Shiplely Field.

CASARIO ROYALE

- Freshman AJ Casario shook off a rough start to the season and has become one of the Terps' most dangerous offensive weapons, as the lefty slugger finds himself atop several offensive categories.
- Casario leads the squad in batting average (.327) and triples (3), while placing second in stolen bases (six) and third in runs batted in (23).
- Against Lafayette, he was a perfect 4-for-4 from the plate, driving in two runs while scoring twice. Against Coppin State on March 14, he turned in a 4-for-6 performance with seven RBIs, highlighted by his sixth inning grand slam to right field. The blast was also his first career home run.

SHUT DOWN FOR SIX

- Juniors Kevin Biringner and Brett Cecil combined for six scoreless innings in the second game of the doubleheader against George Washington. After an early four-run deficit, the two quieted the Colonials' bats as the Terps mounted a late comeback to earn the sweep.
- Biringner, making his first relief appearance of the season, entered to start the fourth inning and allowed just one hit in his three-inning outing, while setting a new career high with six strikeouts.
- Cecil took over in the seventh and was equally effective, as he gave up just two hits in his three-inning stint, earning the win after the Terps' seventh-inning rally. Cecil earned his second victory in as many days after his work in Friday's 6-5 win.

TURTLE POWER

- Maryland has had no problems hitting the long ball thus far in 2007, as the Terps have blasted 21 home runs in 31 games.
- Sophomore **Mike Murphy** and junior **Joe Palumbo** lead the team with four.
- The Terps are 11-4 this season in games they have hit at least one round-tripper.
- In the second game of the year, senior **Dan Melvin** blasted a 12th inning solo shot to give the Terps a 1-0 win over Gardner-Webb.
- In the Saturday win at NC State, senior **Jon Greenwich** pinch hit a blast to deep left field to put the Terps ahead, 3-2, in the top of the ninth.
- Against VCU, Spessard hit his first career grand slam as part of Maryland's 17-2 victory.
- In Wednesday's loss at Towson, Melvin homered twice, including a three-run shot in the top of the seventh to break open the game. He hit the other one in the top of the 13th.

CECIL SHUTS THE DOOR ON SAVE RECORDS

- Against Gardner-Webb, junior Brett Cecil set the career saves record at Maryland, earning his 16th save in the extra-innings win. Cecil faced four batters, striking out two as he continued to rewrite the record books.
- In 2006, Cecil shattered the single season mark for saves with 13, a figure that nearly doubled the old record of seven. That mark ranked third in the ACC and tied for 12th in the nation.
- In addition, Cecil recorded 54 strikeouts in 58.1 innings of work while compiling an ERA of 4.78. His 26 appearances tied for fourth on the all-time single season list.
- During the 2006 campaign, he notched career highs in innings pitched (7.1) against North Carolina State and twice struck out six batters, most recently at North Carolina on March 19.
- Cecil has received numerous preseason accolades, as he was named to the Roger Clemens Award watch list, *Baseball America's* All-America second team, All-ACC second team, and the NCBWA Stopper of the Year watch list.

MELVIN'S MAGIC

- Senior Dan Melvin entered the season as the top producer in the Terps lineup, as he led the team in 10 different offensive categories in 2006.
- The shortstop posted team highs in the following categories: batting average (.338), at-bats (204), runs (34), hits (69), home runs (five), RBIs (30), slugging percentage (.471), walks (23), on base percentage (.416), and multi-hit games (22).
- Melvin belted a home run over the left field wall in the top of the 12th inning to lead the Terps to a 1-0 victory over Gardner-Webb on Feb. 17. His two-RBI double in the eighth inning gave Maryland the lead and the win against George Washington on February 24.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Shipley Field has proven to be friendly confines for the Terrapins, historically and in the 2007 season. The Terps swept their home-opening series against George Washington and are 11-3 in their home park this year.
- Playing at Shipley Field proved to be too daunting a task for visitors outside the Atlantic Coast Conference, as the Terps amassed a 10-0 record against non-conference opponents at home. Following a 7-5 loss to Towson on May 4, 2005, Maryland accumulated a 16-game home non-conference win streak. That mark was snapped on March 4 of this year when the Terps dropped the series finale to Lafayette, 7-4.

KEEP YOUR ENEMIES CLOSE

- Maryland earned a reputation among its opponents as a tough team to beat in close games, as the Terps marked a 12-4 record in one-run games.
- The Terrapins were able to hold down late leads throughout the season, as they earned a 17-1 record when leading after the conclusion of the seventh inning.
- Crunch time proved to be the best time for the Terps, as they won both of their games in which they were tied heading into the final inning of regulation. The Terps maintained a 4-4 tie into the ninth inning against George Washington until Nick Jowers hit a walk-off home run to earn the 5-4 victory. Against Duke, the two teams were tied at 8-8 heading into extra innings before Dan Benick singled to left field, scoring Matt Maropis and earning the series win.
- This year, the Terps are following a similar pattern. Maryland is 19-3 in 2007 when leading or tied after the seventh inning, and is 8-6 in one-run and two-run games.
