### TERPS CLOSE OUT 2007 ROAD SCHEDULE AT RIVAL CAVALIERS

- The Maryland Terrapins play their last road games of the 2007 season this weekend when they visit ACC foe Virginia.
- Maryland is looking for its first ACC series victory since late March, when the Terps took two from the sixth-ranked Clemson Tigers in College Park. In that series, Maryland won the first two games, 4-3 and 4-1, before falling 5-0 on the final day of the weekend.
- The Terps offense is led by junior outfielder Nick Jowers, who is batting .333. Sophomore third baseman Mike Murphy has been the top run producer, notching 34 runs batted in and five home runs. Senior shortstop Dan Melvin is tied with Murphy for the team lead in home runs with five as well.
- In the bullpen, juniors Brad Taylor and Brett Cecil have been the top hurlers, with Taylor holding a team-best 2.51 ERA in 20 appearances, with one save. Cecil, who already holds the single-season and career save records at Maryland, has seven in 2007, along with a 5-3 record and 2.86 ERA in 25 appearances.
- Maryland currently stands in sixth place in the ACC Atlantic Division, two games behind Boston College, and 11<sup>th</sup> overall in the conference.

**SERIES HISTORY**

- Maryland trails in the all-time series, 73-83-1 (.468).
- Last year, the Cavaliers swept the Terps in College Park, winning 6-0, 8-0, and 7-5.
- The last Maryland victory came in 2002, a 10-3 decision at Shiple Field.

**SCOUTING THE CAVALIERS**

- Virginia enters the weekend with a 34-10 record, including a 13-7 mark in the ACC.
- The top Cavalier hitter is Brandon Guyer, with a .404 average, 14 doubles, six home runs and 40 runs batted in, all team highs.
- On the mound, Maryland will face off against Jacob Thompson (9-0, 1.54 ERA), Matt Packer (3-2, 3.38 ERA), and Sean Doolittle (6-3, 2.33 ERA).

**TURTLE POWER**

- Maryland has had no problems hitting the long ball thus far in 2007, as the Terps have blasted 28 home runs in 44 games.
- Sophomore **Mike Murphy** and senior **Dan Melvin** lead the team with five home runs.
- The Terps are 14-7 this season in games they have hit at least one round-tripper.
- In the second game of the year, Melvin blasted a 12th inning solo shot to give the Terps a 1-0 win over Gardner-Webb.
- In the Saturday win at NC State, senior **Jon Greenwich** pinch hit a blast to deep left field to put the Terps ahead, 3-2, in the top of the ninth.
- Against VCU, Spessard hit his first career grand slam as part of Maryland's 17-2 victory.
- In the loss at Towson, Melvin homered twice, including a three-run shot in the top of the seventh to break open the game. He hit the other one in the top of the 13th.

**TERPS FLY PAST COPPIN STATE**

- On March 14, Maryland banged out 25 hits, tying a school record, as the Terps cruised to a 27-0 victory against Coppin State at Shiple Field.
- Every Maryland position player recorded at least one hit in the contest, with Steve Braun and AJ Casario leading the squad with four hits each. Casario also paced the offense with seven RBIs.
- Senior Brandon Mise notched his first career hit, a triple in the fifth inning, and went on to finish 3-for-3 with an RBI. Other Terps making their mark in the hits column for the first time were freshman Ian Schwalenberg and redshirt freshman Mike Rozak, who each singled.
- Two weeks later, the Terps combined for a no-hitter as they defeated the Eagles 12-0 at Shiple Field.

**SHUT DOWN FOR SIX**

- Juniors Kevin Biringner and Brett Cecil combined for six scoreless innings in the second game of the doubleheader against George Washington. After an early four-run deficit, the two quieted the Colonials' bats as the Terps mounted a late comeback to earn the sweep.
- Biringner, making his first relief appearance of the season, entered to start the fourth inning and allowed just one hit in his three-inning outing, while setting a new career high with six strikeouts.
- Cecil took over in the seventh and was equally effective, as he gave up just two hits in his three-inning stint, earning the win after the Terps' seventh-inning rally. Cecil earned his second victory in as many days after his work in Friday's 6-5 win.

**CECIL SHUTS THE DOOR ON SAVE RECORDS**

- Against Gardner-Webb, junior Brett Cecil set the career saves record at Maryland, earning his 16th save in the extra-innings win. Cecil faced four batters, striking out two as he continued to rewrite the record books.
- In 2006, Cecil shattered the single season mark for saves with 13, a figure that nearly doubled the old record of seven. That mark ranked third in the ACC and tied for 12th in the nation.
- In addition, Cecil recorded 54 strikeouts in 58.1 innings of work while compiling an ERA of 4.78. His 26 appearances tied for fourth on the all-time single season list.
- During the 2006 campaign, he notched career highs in innings pitched (7.1) against North Carolina State and twice struck out six batters, most recently at North Carolina on March 19.
- Cecil has received numerous preseason accolades, as he was named to the Roger Clemens Award watch list, *Baseball America's* All-America second team, All-ACC second team, and the NCBWA Stopper of the Year watch list.

**MELVIN'S MAGIC**

- Senior Dan Melvin entered the season as the top producer in the Terps lineup, as he led the team in 10 different offensive categories in 2006.
- The shortstop posted team highs in the following categories: batting average (.338), at-bats (204), runs (34), hits (69), home runs (five), RBIs (30), slugging percentage (.471), walks (23), on base percentage (.416), and multi-hit games (22).
- Melvin belted a home run over the left field wall in the top of the 12th inning to lead the Terps to a 1-0 victory over Gardner-Webb on Feb. 17. His two-RBI double in the eighth inning gave Maryland the lead and the win against George Washington on February 24.

**NO PLACE LIKE HOME**

- Shipley Field has proven to be friendly confines for the Terrapins, historically and in the 2007 season. The Terps swept their home-opening series against George Washington and are 14-8 in their home park this year.
- Playing at Shipley Field proved to be too daunting a task for visitors outside the Atlantic Coast Conference, as the Terps amassed a 10-0 record against non-conference opponents at home last season. Following a 7-5 loss to Towson on May 4, 2005, Maryland accumulated a 16-game home non-conference win streak. That mark was snapped on March 4 of this year when the Terps dropped the series finale to Lafayette, 7-4.

**KEEP YOUR ENEMIES CLOSE**

- Maryland earned a reputation among its opponents as a tough team to beat in close games, as the Terps marked a 12-4 record in one-run games.
- The Terrapins were able to hold down late leads throughout the season, as they earned a 17-1 record when leading after the conclusion of the seventh inning.
- Crunch time proved to be the best time for the Terps, as they won both of their games in which they were tied heading into the final inning of regulation. The Terps maintained a 4-4 tie into the ninth inning against George Washington until Nick Jowers hit a walk-off home run to earn the 5-4 victory. Against Duke, the two teams were tied at 8-8 heading into extra innings before Dan Benick singled to left field, scoring Matt Maropis and earning the series win.
- This year, the Terps are following a similar pattern. Maryland is 22-3 in 2007 when leading or tied after the seventh inning.
