YOUNG TERPS SHOW PROMISE, DEFEAT TWO TOP 5 TEAMS

HOME SWEET HOME

- Following renovations made to Shipley Field prior to the 2005 campaign, Maryland hitters were quick to settle in and establish a new home field advantage. Seven Terps batted over .300 at "the Ship" last season, and 23 of the squad's 35 home runs were slugged there, as well.
- Infielder Elliot Singletary was Maryland's top hitter at home last season, registering a .353 batting average at Shipley. In addition, 17 of his team-best 25 doubles were ripped during home games. Will Frazier, Dan Melvin and Truan Mehl all put up exceptional numbers in College Park, as well, hitting .344, .340 and .338, respectively. Other Terps with impressive stats at home included Matt Maropis (.326), Brian Jarosinski (.318) and Jason Von Behren (.310). Jarosinski's bat came alive at Shipley, as he hit a whopping 173 points higher at home than on the road.
- Not only was the Terrapin offense stellar at home, but the defense performed better there, too. With just 62 errors in 31 home games, Maryland's fielding percentage was 15 points higher (.951) at home than it was on the road (.936).
- Contoured vinyl seats and remodeled restrooms made for a more comfortable experience for spectators at Maryland games, while flags of ACC opponents and a brand new sound system gave Shipley a more fan friendly look and feel. On the field, the additions of batting cages and bullpens gave both home and away teams ample space to warm up, and outfield padding and a revamped warning track made for a safer playing environment.

SINGLETARY SEEING DOUBLE

- Leadoff hitter Elliot Singletary led the ACC and tied for second in the nation with 25 doubles in 51 games last season. It was the second-highest total in school history, trailing only Ken Noe, who hit 28 in 1991.
- Singletary headlined a group of six Terps who each had at least 10 doubles. Truan Mehl finished second on the team and seventh in the ACC in doubles with 20 in 56 games. Will Frazier, the school's all-time leader in the category, had 17. Also among the team leaders in doubles were Dan Melvin (15), Matt Maropis (13) and Jordan Wilson (11).

NO FEAR FOR THE TURTLES

- The 2005 Terrapins proved they had what it took to take down the best, twice upsetting a top-five team on the road.
- On Apr. 2, Maryland stunned top-ranked Georgia Tech, 2-1, in Atlanta. Ben Pfinsgraff surrendered one run and five hits over 7.2 innings against one of the nation's top hitting teams and Michael Meagher shut the door, retiring all four batters he faced. Truan Mehl was 3-for-3 and drove in both Maryland runs on a pair of RBI base hits, as the Terp offense left just four men on base. It marked the program's first win over a top five team since May 3, 2003 (8-7, at No. 5 NC State).

- A month later, Maryland pulled off another improbable upset, handing then-No. 4 Miami a loss in the finale of a three-game set in Coral Gables. The Terps scored eight runs over the first three innings and held on to defeat the Hurricanes, 11-9, on May 1. Will Frazier and catcher Chad Durakis each belted three-run home runs and Joe Palumbo had a career-high four hits to fuel the Maryland attack. Starter Chris Clem gave up eight hits and four runs in 6.1 innings to earn the win.

DOWN (IN HISTORY) GO FRAZIER, OTHERS

- Several Terps helped rewrite the Maryland record books last year as they moved their way up the school's career and single season lists in various statistical categories.
- Will Frazier became Maryland's all-time leader in doubles with 60, a record he set in his final collegiate game against Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament. During the 2005 season, Frazier also set new school marks for most career extra base hits, with 94, and total bases, with 404. He also ranks second on the all-time home run (34), RBI (147) and at-bats (794) lists, third on the all-time hits list (242) and fifth on the all-time runs list (148).
- Staff workhorse Chris Clem established a new school record for innings pitched in a career (2002-05) with 298.2. The right-hander made 13 starts on the hill, the most by a Terp pitcher last year and logged a team-high 86.1 innings. He lasted at least 6.0 innings in 11 of his last 12 starts and walked more than two batters just twice all year.
- Truan Mehl moved into a sixth-place tie on Maryland's single season hits list, finishing with a team-high 82. The Overland Park, Kan. native also moved into second place on the single-season at-bats list with 238.
- Infielder/outfielder Matt Maropis ran his way into the record books, as well. After stealing 19 bases in 2005, he raised his career total to 35, which puts him in a tie with Steve Neuberger (1993-96) for seventh on the Terps' all-time list.
- In his rookie season, catcher Chad Durakis proved he was not afraid to take one for the team, leading the squad with 10 HBPs. It was the third-highest single season total in school history.



WILL FRAZIER

PFINSGRAFF HONORED

- Ben Pfinsgraff was named ACC Co-Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 4 after beating No. 1 Georgia Tech on the road. The right-hander threw a season-high 131 pitches and held the conference's top offense to just five hits and one run in 7.2 gutsy innings. Pfinsgraff shared the honor with Barrett Browning of Florida State.

TERPS IN THE TOURNEY

- For the second straight season, the Terps won a game in the ACC Tournament. On May 24, they defeated Virginia Tech, 5-4, in the opening round of play. Will Frazier had an RBI single in the ninth inning to lift Maryland to a one-run victory over the Hokies in Jacksonville. Chris Clem struck out seven over 7.2 strong innings and Seth Overbey came on in the eighth to pick up the win.
- It marked the first time the program had won in the ACC Tournament in back-to-back seasons since 1994-95.

MAXWELL HEADLINES PRESEASON HONORS

- For the second straight year, centerfielder Justin Maxwell was named a preseason All-American by *Baseball America*. Maxwell was also recognized by ACC coaches as the best athlete and best defensive outfielder in the league.
- Maxwell was one of the three Terps named to SEBaseball.com's preseason All-ACC teams. He was a first team choice while Matt Maropis and Will Frazier were both named to the second team.
