Leading Off

• After playing just one home game in the last 22 days, including an eight-day break from action for finals, Maryland returns to Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium on Thursday to play host to Wake Forest in the final series of the 2011 season. The Terps and Demon Deacons play at 7 p.m. Thursday and Friday, and 1 p.m. Saturday. Senior day festivities will be held prior to Saturday's game.

• In its most recent game, Maryland defeated Delaware 7-6 on May 10 to finish 16-10 in non-conference games this season, including a 12-4 mark at home. Junior right-hander **Chuck Ghysels** pitched six innings and recorded a career-high eight strikeouts while limiting Delaware to one run. Sophomore outfielder **Jordan Hagel** had three hits and three stolen bases, as the Terps racked up a season-high eight stolen bags.

• Freshman first baseman **Tim Kiene**, who enters the weekend on an eight-game hitting streak, has continued his upward progression at the plate. Over the last 27 games Kiene is hitting .373, raising his season batting average 152 points (from .118 to .270) over that span. Kiene's .351 batting average in ACC play would rank 11th overall and third among freshmen in the league, but he is four plate appearances shy of qualifying.

• Leadoff batter **Charlie White**, another freshman, paces the Terps in hitting (.300) and ranks second on the team with 17 stolen bases on 18 attempts. He had a 10-game hitting streak, which matches the longest this season by a Terp (also **Alfredo Rodriguez**), snapped on May 8 at North Carolina. Junior center fielder **Korey Wacker** has been hot at the plate recently, recording multiple hits in eight of the last 13 games. Freshman catcher/DH **Alex Ramsay** has been as well, hitting .370 over the last 13 games.

About the Demon Deacons...

• Wake Forest is 22-28 overall with a 12-15 mark in the ACC, having won five of their past six league games. The Demon Deacons swept Boston College at home May 6-8 and took two of three at Duke last weekend. They need two wins over Maryland to clinch one of the eight spots in the ACC Tournament to be played next week.

• Wake ranks 12th in the league in team batting (.226) and ninth in team pitching (4.66 ERA). The Deacons have hit 46 home runs, which is the third-most by any league team (Virginia Tech - 58, Florida State - 48), and they have stolen 88 bases, which is tied for third with Miami (Clemson - 94, Maryland - 92).

• Junior designated hitter Carlos Lopez ranks second in the ACC with 11 home runs, while his .276 batting average is second-best on the team. Sophomore left fielder Mac Williamson leads the team in hitting (.278) and RBI (45) and has nine homers. Senior center fielder Steven Brooks is second in the league with 26 stolen bases.

• Wake Forest's starting rotation is made up entirely of lefties; sophomore Brian Holmes (3-3, 2.54) gets the ball Thursday, sophomore Tim Cooney (6-2, 2.61) will go Friday, and junior Austin Stadler (1-8, 9.32) starts Saturday. Holmes and Cooney both rank in the top 10 in ERA in the ACC, while Cooney's 77 strikeouts are just outside the top 10.

SERIES HISTORY: Wake Forest leads the all-time series, 93-56-1. The Terps won game one of the series before the Demon Deacons took games two and three last season in Winston Salem. Maryland swept the series the last time it was played in College Park (May 8-10, 2009).

About The Starting Pitching...

• Maryland's weekend rotation has fluctuated this season, with junior RHP **David Carroll** the only pitcher to start every weekend. For the first seven weekend series this season, Carroll started on Saturday; he moved up to Friday the next four weekends, then returned to his Saturday role in the May 6-8 series against North Carolina. In his Saturday starts Carroll has a 5-1 record with a 2.42 ERA; on Friday he is 0-3 with a 10.31 ERA.

• For the second consecutive week junior RHP **Sander Beck** will start game one of the series and freshman RHP **Brady Kirkpatrick** will start game three. Beck is the second most experience pitcher on the team with 43 appearances and 27 starts in his career (**Eric Potter** has 67 app. & 35 starts), and he ranks third on the team this season with 55 strikeouts. Kirkpatrick, who spent much of the season as a reliever, is in the weekend rotation for the fifth straight week.

Ninth-Inning Comeback...

• Maryland scored five runs in the top of the ninth inning to overcome a 10-8 deficit on the way to a 13-11 win over NC State on 4/29. **Aaron Etchison**, **Tim Kiene**, **Jake Stinnett** and **Jordan Haggel** all had RBI singles in the rally, with Haggel's two-run base hit capping it off. It was the Terrapins' first win when trailing after eight innings since 2/27/09, an 11-10 win over Quinnipiac. The last time Maryland came back in the ninth to win an ACC game was 4/19/08, a 14-13 win over Georgia Tech.

Pitching Keys Mid-Week Wins...

• Maryland pitching held both Saint Joseph's (4/26) and George Mason (4/27) to just three hits. It marked the first time Maryland held its opponent to three hits or less in back-to-back outings since March 5, 2002, when the Terps held UMES to two hits, then three hits in a doubleheader. In the win over Saint Joseph's, **Charlie Haslup**, **Jeff Crosswhite**, **Jimmy Reed** and **Jake Stinnett** combined for 11 strikeouts and kept the Hawks hitless over the final six innings. Against George Mason **Chuck Ghysels** allowed two hits in seven innings, while **Michael Boyden** and **Korey Wacker** pitched an inning each to finish it out.

Immediate Impact...

• Maryland has 22 newcomers on the 2011 squad, including 13 freshmen and nine junior-college transfers; 20 have made their Maryland debuts, with several playing key roles. Among positional players (including DH), newcomers account for 350 of 477 starts (73 percent). Newcomers have also accounted for 265 1/3 of 466 total innings pitched (57 percent).

• Breaking it down further, freshmen have combined to make 198 of 477 starts (42 percent), while contributing 183 of Maryland's 434 hits (42 percent). With the JUCO transfers included, newcomers account for 319 of 434 hits (73 percent), an equal distribution to the percentage of starts they have.

• The numbers are similar with runs and RBI. Newcomers account for 160 of 211 RBI (76 percent), with freshmen totaling 92 RBI (44 percent). Of 238 runs scored, newcomers have 178 of them (75 percent), while freshmen have 108 (46 percent).

Aggressive On The Base Paths...

• With 123 stolen bases last season, Maryland demolished the previous school record of 95 set in 1998. The Terps have been aggressive again this year, ranking second in the ACC with 92 stolen bags. **Alfredo Rodriguez** leads the way with 20, which is tied for fourth in the conference.

Carroll Named CB360 Primetime Pitcher of the Week...

• **David Carroll** was selected as the Primetime Pitcher of the Week by CollegeBaseball360.com for his performance in the Terrapins' 5-0 win over No. 7 Florida State on April 2. Carroll pitched 7 1/3 shutout innings to help the Terrapins end a 40-game losing streak against the Seminoles that dated back to the 1998 season. It was Maryland's first home win over FSU since 1993. The 6-foot-8 right-hander allowed just three hits and kept the ball in the infield for nearly all of his outing, with the ball reaching the outfield just five times (two of the three hits, three fly-outs). Carroll also struck out a then-season-high seven and induced inning-ending double plays in the fifth and seventh.

Dual Role...

• **Korey Wacker** has been pulling double duty for Maryland this season. He has started 50 games in center field and pitched in 16 games, serving as the closer. A lefty, Wacker is hitting .257 and has a team-best 2.77 ERA.

• Wacker has been at his best in the ninth inning. Five of the seven times he entered at the beginning of the ninth he recorded a perfect inning. On the two occasions he didn't - 4/5 vs. West Virginia and 4/29 vs. NC State, Maryland was still able to hold on for wins.

Quick Hits...

• After hitting 13 home runs through the first 44 games this season, the Terps have hit seven in the last nine games.

• Freshman **Michael Montville** had an outstanding series against North Carolina, recording five hits in nine at-bats, including two home runs and five RBI.

• Against Miami on 4/17, freshman **Austin Kilbourne** became the first Terp to record at least five RBI in a game since Tyler Bennett had eight on May 9, 2009.

• Maryland's four shutouts this season are the most since it had five in 2007.

• Against West Virginia on 4/5, **Jake Stinnett** became the first Terp to homer twice in a game since Tyler Bennett had three round-trippers against Wake Forest on May 9, 2009.

• **Alfredo Rodriguez** ranks fifth in school history with 46 career steals. He needs two more to pass Chris Cannan (1991-94) and Mark Poehlman (1977-80), who both had 47, for fourth place.

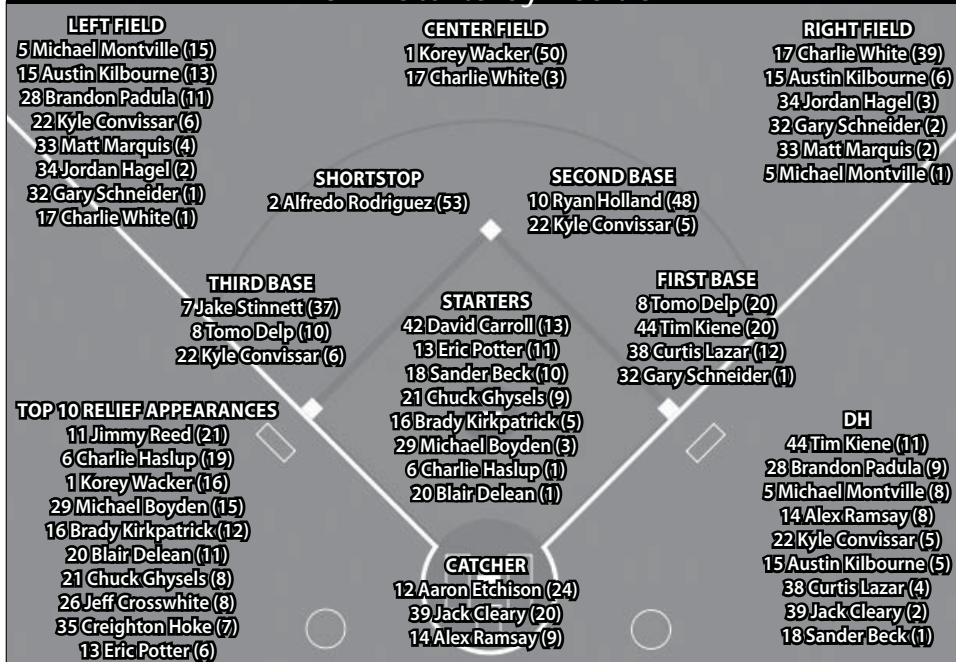
• Rodriguez has started 118 straight games at shortstop. The last time he didn't start was April 28, 2009.

• Maryland was the last team in the ACC to allow a home run to an opponent (March 12 at Georgia Tech). The Terps have given up just 19 this season, far less than the 72 they had allowed through the same number of games last year.

• Though opponents haven't hit many home runs off Maryland, its a bad omen when they do - the Terps are 0-12 when allowing a homer.

• Maryland has two MLB draft picks on its roster - freshman **Tim Kiene** (30th round, Washington Nationals) and junior **Chuck Ghysels** (36th round, Cincinnati Reds).

2010 Recruiting Class Ranked 25th by Baseball America

The University of Maryland baseball team's 2010 recruiting class was ranked as the 25th best in the nation by Baseball America.

Head coach Erik Bakich, recruiting coordinator Dan Burton and pitching coach Sean Kenny, who are in their second season at Maryland, signed 22 newcomers to their first recruiting class. It is the first time Maryland's recruiting class was ranked in Baseball America's top 25.

The class consisted of 13 freshmen and nine junior-college transfers, as well as six players from Maryland. Two of the signees - freshman Tim Kiene (South Windsor, Conn./Avon Old Farms) and junior Chuck Ghysels (Springboro, Ohio/Lincoln Trail CC) - were selected in the 2010 Major League Draft, but chose attending Maryland over signing professional contracts.

Maryland was one of three ACC schools included in the rankings. Georgia Tech came in at No. 7, while North Carolina was No. 13.

Terps Picked 4th in ACC Atlantic Division

Maryland was picked to finish fourth in the Atlantic Coast Conference Atlantic Division in a vote by league coaches.

The Terrapins received 28 total points, placing them eighth overall. Clemson received eight of 12 votes to become the Atlantic Division champion. Virginia was the popular pick to win the Coastal Division, receiving nine of 12 votes.

With seven votes, Clemson was also the coaches pick as the overall champion. Three coaches picked defending ACC champion Florida State to repeat, and two named Virginia as the likely 2011 overall winner.

Teams were awarded six points for each first-place vote, five points for each second-place vote, etc., in determining the predicted order of finish for each division.

Florida State joined Clemson in the 2010 College World Series at Omaha, Neb., and Georgia Tech, Miami, North Carolina, NC State, Virginia and Virginia Tech also made the NCAA tournament field to give the ACC a conference-record eight teams in postseason play.

Second Season at Maryland
East Carolina '00

Erik Bakich was hired as the sixth head coach in Maryland baseball history on June 29, 2009, coming off a successful stint as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt.

Bakich, now in his second with the Terps, signed the first nationally-ranked recruiting class in school history last summer, in addition to overseeing a dramatic improvement in the baseball facilities.

Maryland's class of 22 newcomers, consisting of 13 freshmen and nine junior-college transfers, was ranked No. 25 by Baseball America. It also included six players from Maryland, which Bakich has made a priority in the Terrapins' recruiting efforts.

In just 18 months since Bakich and his staff arrived at Maryland, the facilities have seen a number of improvements and additions: a 5,000 square foot indoor hitting and pitching facility, a new turf infield, brick backstop, renovated locker rooms, new outfield fence and warning track, new scoreboard and upgrades to signage in Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium are among the highlights.

Bakich also instituted the inaugural Maryland Baseball Leadoff Banquet, which featured keynote speaker Tommy Lasorda and raised thousands of dollars for the baseball program.

Bakich's success recruiting at Maryland comes as no surprise. He spent the previous seven seasons helping build Vanderbilt into a perennial contender. He established himself as one of the best recruiters in college baseball, hauling in top-25 classes all seven years in Nashville, including the top-ranked class in 2005 and the second-ranked class in 2008. From 2008-10, 22 Commodores that Bakich recruited were selected in the major league draft, including five in the first round. The top overall pick in 2007 was David Price, a player that Bakich recruited.

In addition to his duties as recruiting coordinator, Bakich trained the Commodores' outfielders and served as a hitting coach. In 2004, Vanderbilt experienced the biggest batting-average increase in program history, hitting .304 that season coming off a .258 clip the previous year. Vanderbilt finished in the top three in the SEC in team batting three of the last four seasons under Bakich's tutelage.

Bakich comes with familiarity to ACC baseball, as he began his college coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Clemson in 2002. There, he assisted in the Tigers' recruiting efforts and worked with the team's outfielders and infielders. In Bakich's one season at Clemson, the Tigers went 54-17 and advanced to the College World Series.

Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin added Bakich to his staff in 2003 and handed over the team's primary recruiting duties immediately. In his first year at Vandy, Bakich helped the Commodores reach the SEC Tournament, something they hadn't accomplished in eight years prior to his arrival. The following season, Vanderbilt won 45 games, won an NCAA Regional and

advanced to a Super Regional.

Since arriving at Maryland, Bakich has worked relentlessly to instill his blue-collar, hard-working attitude in each player. A proven developer of talent in addition to his recruiting ability, Bakich is quick to point out parallels between Vanderbilt and Maryland, and says the two elements to Vanderbilt's success will be the same at Maryland.

Recruiting and development – which Bakich listed as the two cornerstones of the Maryland program, were the same things that enabled great success in a short time at Vanderbilt.

Bakich says making the ACC Tournament will be the first goal each season, and as the program continues to grow, more goals will be added annually, such as making the NCAA Tournament and playing deep into June.

Prior to his coaching career, Bakich had a successful stint as a player.

After transferring from San Jose City College in California, Bakich was a standout for East Carolina in 1999 and 2000. While there, the Pirates won back-to-back CAA Conference championships and earned number one seeds at NCAA Regionals both seasons. Bakich was named to the All-Regional team at LSU as a third baseman after garnering a unanimous All-Tournament selection at the Bell South Hurricane Classic in Miami, FL earlier in the 1999 season.

He finished his playing career at ECU with a .315 batting average, 14 home runs and 85 RBIs. Bakich graduated from East Carolina in 2000 with a degree in Exercise and Sports Science. Upon graduation, Bakich played professionally in the Independent Professional Baseball League until 2001. At the conclusion of his playing career, Bakich returned to East Carolina, where he served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach for one year.

Bakich and his wife, Jiffy, have a son, Colt.
