Storyline

* Maryland (3-0) heads to Orlando and Disney's Wide World of Sports as one of eight teams in the prestigious Old Spice Classic over Thanksgiving weekend... The Terrapins are one of seven teams in the field that appeared in the postseason a year ago.

* The Terrapins open play on Thursday evening against Michigan State (2-0), which is ranked 5th in this week's Associated Press poll and 6th in the ESPN / USA Today rankings... The Spartans will have had an eight-day hiatus after beating IPFW, 70-59, on Nov. 19.

* Maryland junior guard Greivis Vasquez was named Monday the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week after averaging 27.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 3.0 steals in wins over Youngstown State and Vermont... It was the second time in his career Vasquez has received the ACC's weekly honor.

* Vasquez is close to becoming the 47th Maryland player in school history to reach 1,000 points in his career... He needs 22 points to reach the plateau... The 6-foot-6 guard from Caracas, Venezuela, enters the Old Spice Classic leading the Terps in scoring (22.3 avg), rebounds (7.7), assists (5.0), steals (2.7) and minutes (33.7).

* Maryland head coach Gary Williams picked up his 400th victory at Maryland last Friday against Vermont (11/21)... The milestone came in dramatic fashion, as Vasquez buried a 3-pointer with 6 seconds left to force overtime... The Terps scored the first 17 points of the extra period, earning the most lopsided OT victory in school history with a 17-2 edge in the extra session... Williams picked up the victory over former assistant Mike Lonergan, now in his 4th season as head coach at Vermont.

Noting the Spartans

Michigan State is 2-0 coming into the Old Spice Classic, owning victories over Idaho (100-62) and at Indiana-Purdue Fort Wayne (70-59)... The Spartans will have had eight days to prepare for the Terps after last playing on 11/19...

Junior forward Raymar Morgan is the leading scorer for the Spartans, averaging 21.5 points per game on outstanding .737 shooting from the floor (14-for-19)...

Kalin Lucas, a sophomore guard, averages 15.0 points and a team-high 6.0 assists per game, with Chris Allen, another sophomore guard, at 14.0 points per game and a team-high four 3-pointers...

Goran Suton, a fifth-year senior center, leads MSU on the boards thus far with 6.0 rebounds per game... The Spartans are hitting .513 from the floor in their opening two outings.

Gary Williams' 20th Season

Head coach Gary Williams reaches another in a career filled with milestones when he coaches his alma mater for the 20th season in 2008-09...

He is the 6th-winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball with an overall record of 607-343 (.639)... He ranks second among active ACC coaches with 400 wins at Maryland (3rd overall) and also ranks second among active league coaches with 165 ACC victories. Williams is the Terps' all-time winningest coach...

He earned his 400th victory at his alma mater on 11/21 with an overtime win over Vermont... His 397 wins in 19 years at the beginning of the season were an average of 20.9 wins per season with the Terps...

Maryland's 70-65 victory over Boston College (2/6/2008) gave Williams his 600th career victory... Only five other active head coaches in Division I have 600 career wins.

Milestones, Streaks, etc.

- Maryland has hit at least one 3-pointer in 323 consecutive games.
- The Terps have won 56 of 60 non-conference games since moving into Comcast Center.
- Maryland has won at least 19 games in 12 straight seasons.
- The Terps have made 15 consecutive postseason appearances.
- Maryland's last losing season came in 1992-93, the last season of devastating NCAA sanctions levied against previous staffs at Maryland... Each school in the ACC has had a losing season since the Terps fell below .500 some 15 seasons ago... In fact, 9 of the 11 ACC opponents have suffered through a losing season since the Terps won the NCAA title in 2002... Duke and UNC are the exceptions.
- Between 2004-05 and 2007-08, Maryland won 82 games, an average of 20.5 per season... That matches the number of wins that Gary Williams directed during the first four seasons (1994-97) of Maryland's run of 11 straight titles.

Tri-Captains

Maryland will have three captains representing the team in a leadership role in 2008-09. Senior Dave Neal will accept the role, along with juniors Greivis Vasquez and Landon Milbourne.

Looking Ahead

Maryland will spend its Thanksgiving weekend with Disney as the Terrapins travel to Orlando, Fla., to play in the Old Spice Classic... Seven of the eight teams in the field played in the postseason a year ago... Maryland opens play on Thursday at 7 p.m. against Michigan State, currently ranked fifth in the Associated Press poll... The Terps would play a second-round matchup against either No. 9 Gonzaga or Oklahoma State on Friday before finishing the tournament on Sunday... The Terps head to Orlando after practice on Tuesday.

Looking Ahead (cont.)

Maryland's next home game is on Dec. 3 against Michigan in the ACC / Big 10 Challenge... All six December games are in the Washington, D.C., area, as the Terps' only appearance away from Comcast Center will come at the Verizon Center in a BB&T Classic matchup against George Washington on Dec. 7...

The Terps have a seven-game homestand between December 12 and January 10, with the final game in that stretch being a Comcast Center matchup with Georgia Tech that serves as the ACC opener.

Maryland Among ACC's Best Last Ten Years

Maryland has been one of the top programs in the ACC over the past 10 seasons.

- With 100 wins since 1999, Maryland is third among all ACC schools in regular-season wins.
- Head coach Gary Williams ranks second among active ACC coaches with 165 career wins in league play.
- The Terps captured the 2002 ACC regular-season title & the 2004 ACC Tourney championship.

Home Sweet Home

Maryland has been a dominant home team over the years:

- The Terps are 794-282 (.738) all-time at home dating back to 1923-24.
- Maryland is 88-20 (.813) all-time at Comcast Center.
- The Terps are 243-55 (.815) at home under Gary Williams (155-35 at Cole Field House).
- Maryland is 142-25 (.849) at home the last 10-plus seasons (since 1998-99).
- Maryland has won 50 of its last 53 regular season non-conference games at Comcast Center under Williams.
- The Terps are 137-4 (.972) in regular season non-conference home games under Williams.
- Maryland is 72-17 (.809) in home-openers in College Park all-time, including a 32-game winning streak (last loss on 11/27/76 to Notre Dame, 80-79, OT)... The Terps did not play a home game in 1918-19.
- Maryland was 476-151 in 47 seasons at Cole Field House; 169-90 in 24 seasons at Ritchie Coliseum and 61-21 in eight seasons at The Gymnasium.

Old Spice Classic

Maryland will be among the eight teams that play in the Old Spice Classic, to be held Nov. 27 - 30 at the Milk House at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Fla.

The tournament features a number of nationally ranked teams, including Michigan State, Tennessee, Georgetown and Gonzaga. Seven of the eight teams appeared in the postseason a year ago.

The event is hosted by ESPNU and the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The Venezuelan Sensation

Junior guard Greivis Vasquez enjoyed a stellar sophomore season for the Terrapins, drawing national attention for his exciting, passionate play:

- Named All-ACC Second Team.
- Vasquez averaged a team-high 17.0 points per game, 5th in the ACC and the top mark for an underclassman... As a freshman he scored 9.8 points per game.
- He tied his previous career-high with 28 points last week against Youngstown State (11/18)... He had also hit that mark last season against American University... 16 of his 28 against the Penguins came in the first half, as he scored 16 of the Terrapins' 37 first-half points.
- The heroics continued on Friday against Vermont as he again led Maryland with 26 points in the overtime win... His 3-pointer with 6 seconds remaining sent the game into overtime, where he added 6 points in the extra session to spark the Terrapins to 17 straight OT points... Vasquez tied his career-high in that game with 9 rebounds and dished out 5 assists.
- For his performance against both Youngstown State and Vermont, Vasquez was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week for the second time in his career... Previously, he shared the award on 2/18/2008 with Tyrese Rice of Boston College.
- Vasquez's back-to-back 20-point games marks the first time he's accomplished that feat since he had 25 at Duke (2/13/08), 20 vs. Florida State (2/16/08) and 25 vs. Virginia Tech (2/20/08).
- Vasquez scored in double figures in 31 of 33 games last season and led the team in scoring 17 times... With his 26 points against Vermont last Friday, Vasquez has now scored in double figures in 29 of his last 30 games (lone miss was at Syracuse in the 2007-08 season finale)... **He needs 22 points to become the 47th Terrapin to reach 1,000 in his career.**
- He led the team and the ACC with 223 assists (6.8 avg) a year ago and dished out at least five assists in 24 games... He recorded 10 or more assists five times (Northeastern, Illinois, Morgan State, North Carolina and NC State)... He has led the Terps in helpers in 14 of the last 16 games in a streak dating back to last season, including 2 of 3 games this year.
- Vasquez finished second in the ACC last season with 37.0 minutes per game... He was behind only Tyrese Rice of Boston College, who logged 38.1 minutes per game... He posted a team-high 42 minutes last Friday in the overtime victory over Vermont, and is logging 33.7 minutes per game so far this season.
- Vasquez opened the 2008-09 season in 11th place on Maryland's all-time assists list... His 403 is 7 helpers behind Walt Williams, who had 410 from 1989-92... Against Vermont, he became the 11th player in school history to hit the 400 plateau... Vasquez's 5.7 per game average over his first two seasons ranks behind only all-time assists leader Steve Blake, who averaged 7.0 over his career.
- He is now 14th all-time in career 3-pointers made (100) and 11th in career 3-point attempts (318).
- Vasquez tied the school record with 15 assists against NC State (2/9/08)... He narrowly missed becoming just the second player to post a triple-double in school history as he finished with 13 points, 15 assists and 9 rebounds against the Wolfpack (Derrick Lewis, 2x, 1987).
- Vasquez spent the summer of 2007 as a member of the Venezuelan National team, which competed in the FIBA Americas Championships in Las Vegas.

More From Milbourne

After playing in just 16 of 34 games as a freshman, Landon Milbourne was one of the most improved players in the ACC as a sophomore:

- Milbourne averaged 8.3 points per game after averaging 1.0 as a freshman... His rebounding jumped from 0.8 to 3.6 per game.
- He scored in double figures in 14 of his last 26 games and set a new career-high with 18 points against Florida State (2/16/08)... He set a new career-high four times after January 1.
- Milbourne shot 47 percent (17 of 36) from three-point range in ACC play.
- Milbourne made his mark on defense as well, as he was third on the team with 23 blocked shots and added 20 steals for the season.

In the season-opener with Bucknell, Milbourne served notice that the upward trend is continuing... He led Maryland with 16 points, including a 6-for-6 effort from the foul line... It was the first time in his three seasons he led the Terrapins in scoring in a game... He also had 3 rebounds and went 4-for-4 from the floor in the second half... He comes into the Old Spice Classic second on the team in scoring with an 11.7 per-game average and is a strong .800 shooter from the line thus far this year.... Milbourne scored in double figures in two of Maryland's three games thus far this season.

Hayes Continues Strong Play

Junior guard Eric Hayes built on an impressive freshman season and continued his development for the Terrapins a year ago:

- Hayes scored in double figures 16 times.
- He was 2nd on the team in assists (131) and third in steals (33).
- Hayes was 4th in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.84).
- Hayes was 8th in the league last season at 33.4 minutes per game.
- He scored a then-career high 18 points against Illinois before pouring in 19 points against Morgan State. Hayes recorded a career-high nine assists against Duke and Virginia.

Hayes is second on the team in minutes this season, averaging 27.3 minutes per game... He is second behind Vasquez with a 4.0 assists average this year and has hit 5 of 12 from behind the 3-point line... Hayes was one of six Terrapins who scored in double figures last week against Vermont, finishing with 11 points... He led the Terps with 7 assists against the Catamounts, committing only one turnover... For the season, Hayes has 12 assists and only 4 turnovers in 82 minutes.

Cliff's Notes

Sophomore swingman Cliff Tucker earned the starting nod at the small-forward position against Bucknell in the season-opener and made the most of the opportunity:

- He finished with 14 points, one of four Terrapins to score in double figures.
- He matched his previous career-high of 10 points in the second minute of the second half on a slashing drive to the basket.
- He hit 6 of 11 from the floor and added 5 rebounds and 2 steals in a 19-minute stint.
- Tucker is 3rd on the team this season in scoring average at 11.0 ppg.
- Tucker had 10 points and 2 steals in 20 minutes against Vermont last Friday.

Strong Start Defensively

In its season-opener, Maryland held Bucknell to just 17 points in the first half on 7-for-28 shooting... The Bison missed all 7 of their 3-pointers before halftime... The 17 points marked the lowest total by a Maryland opponent since 12/28/05 when Delaware State had 13 first-half points...

The Terps limited Youngstown State to just 33 percent shooting from the floor in Tuesday's 73-49 victory, created 23 turnovers, posted 13 steals (more than in any single game in 2007-08) and forced YSU into 0-for-13 shooting from behind the 3-point arc...

Maryland has allowed its first three opponents just 58.3 points per game, a .361 shooting percentage from the floor and a .196 shooting mark from 3-point range...

Maryland held six opponents under 60 points during the 2007-08 season and three under 50 points.

Adept at Long Range

Maryland has proven to be one of the nation's most proficient 3-point shooting teams since the rule was instituted in 1987.

- Maryland has made at least one 3-pointer in 323 consecutive games.
- Maryland has failed to make a 3-pointer just twice in the last 392 games.
- The last game the Terps failed to make a 3-pointer was 1/7/1999 when Maryland went 0-for-7 from 3-point range in a 71-66 win at Virginia.
- Since Gary Williams took over, Maryland has hit a 3-pointer in 607 of 614 games.
- Since the rule was instituted in 1987, Maryland has hit at least one three-pointer in 664 of 673 games.
- Maryland made a school-record 217 treys in 2001-02.
- The Terps' top 3-point shooting percentage was .461 (122-for-290) in 1987-88.
- Maryland set new school records for most 3-pointers in a game (17) and most 3-point attempts (37) in 2006-07 against Missouri-Kansas City.

Attendance Continues to Soar

Attendance for Maryland basketball continues to rise. For the past nine seasons, the Terps have set school records and ranked in the top 10 nationally in overall attendance, home and away. Maryland has eclipsed its own overall record in seven straight seasons, and played before 400,000 fans in nine consecutive seasons. Over the last six years, the Terps have ranked at least 8th nationally in home attendance which has skyrocketed to 1,820,275 - an average of 17,336 each time the Terps play in the Comcast Center.

- In 2007-08, Maryland ranked 6th in the nation as 341,050 watched 19 Terrapin basketball games, as the Terps played to 100 percent capacity for the second time in six seasons.
- In 2006-07, Maryland ranked 8th in the nation as 319,616 fans packed the Comcast Center for Terp basketball games.
- In 2003-04, the Maryland basketball team finished fifth nationally in home attendance average for the second-straight season and records were once again shattered at the Terps' state-of-the-art Comcast Center. The Terrapins and their fans set new records for single-game attendance with 16 full sellouts as the Terps played to 100 percent capacity (17,950) and again established a then single-season mark for season attendance total (287,200).
- In 2002-03, when the Terrapins first moved into the \$125-million, 17,950 seat Comcast Center, they shattered all previous attendance records set in storied Cole Field House.

Terps Sign Two Posts for Fall 2009

The University of Maryland added two outstanding post prospects recently when **Jordan Williams** and **James Padgett** signed National Letters of Intent to play men's basketball at the university, head coach Gary Williams announced.

"With our quality guards returning, we felt a need to get bigger inside," said Gary Williams. "James and Jordan will allow us to do that."

Williams, a 6-foot-10, 245-pound center from Torrington (Conn.) High School, will come to Maryland after being ranked as the 16th center in the nation and a four-star recruit by Scout.com. The Red Raiders, coached by Tony Turina, won the state title in his freshman season and followed that with a berth in the state semifinals. A two-time Class LL All-State pick, Williams averaged 28 points and 16 rebounds per game, leading Torrington to a division title as a junior.

"At 6-10, Jordan is one of those rare players who can run the court very well, while being a traditional inside player," said Gary Williams. "Jordan has great hands in rebounding and catching the basketball. He showed tremendous improvement over the past summer."

Williams chose the Terrapins over St. John's, Providence, Georgetown, Indiana, Marquette and Notre Dame, among others. He played AAU ball for the New England Playaz program.

Padgett is a 6-foot-8, 212-pound power forward from Lincoln High School in Brooklyn, N.Y. He was ranked 54th nationally at power forward by ESPN.com, and 21st in the nation and a four-star prospect at center by Scout.com.

His high school coach, Dwayne Morton, said he hoped Padgett might turn into the "best big man in New York City this year." Morton said he is outstanding with his back to the basket, and ESPN.com called him a "very athletic interior player." He averaged nearly a double-double each game, with 10.4 points and 9.8 rebounds per game last season as a junior.

"James is a strong, physical player who knows how to play with his back to the basket, while expanding his perimeter game," said Gary Williams. "He is a winner. His Lincoln High School team won the New York State Class AA Championship last year."

He played AAU ball for the Juice All-Stars and chose Maryland over Rutgers, Seton Hall, St. John's and Pittsburgh. Lincoln High is the same school that produced Stephon Marbury. Padgett transferred to Lincoln after his sophomore season at Xaverian High.

Early in the second half the Terrapins used baskets by Milbourne, Tucker and David Neal - the team's lone senior - to take a 39-18 lead. Tucker, a sophomore forward, finished 6-for-11 from the floor.

The lead was at least 17 points for the remainder of the game, as the Maryland offense became more comfortable. Milbourne scored 13 of his points in the second half, hitting all four of his shots from the floor and all five of his free throws.

Greivis Vasquez finished with 13 points, six rebounds and six assists for the Terrapins, while Adrian Bowie chipped in a dozen points on 4-for-9 shooting from the floor.

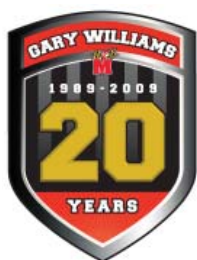

Since returning to the College Park campus in 1989, Gary Williams (Maryland '68) has led his alma mater's basketball program from a period of troubled times to an era of national prominence. With 12 NCAA Tournament berths in the last 15 seasons, seven Sweet Sixteen appearances, a pair of consecutive Final Four showings, and the 2002 national championship - the first of its kind in Maryland basketball history - Williams and his staff have literally forged what is now more than a decade of dominance in college basketball's most storied and competitive conference.

Now, with 400 victories as Maryland's head coach, Williams stands as the Terrapins all-time winningest head basketball coach. He passed Charles "Lefty" Driesell, who amassed 348 victories in 18 seasons from 1969 to 1986. The Terrapins have averaged 22.8 wins per year since the 1994-95 season.



With 607 career victories in 31 seasons overall, Williams is the sixth-winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball. The rise of the Maryland program has run parallel with Williams' ascent among the most notable in the collegiate

coaching fraternity. Williams was one of only five coaches to boast a string of 11 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament from 1994-2004. He has produced more than 20 wins in nine of his last 12 seasons, and a school-record eight straight from 1996-97 to 2003-04. With 16 career 20-win seasons, Williams is tied for sixth among active coaches.

► In June of 2005, Williams received the University of Maryland's highest alumni honor as he, Connie Chung, Renaldo Nehemiah and others were inducted into the University of Maryland's Alumni Hall of Fame. Williams was inducted into the University of Maryland's Sports Hall of Fame in 1999.

► In January of 2005, Williams was named one of *Washingtonian* Magazine's 'Washingtonians of the Year.' He joined others such as Washington D.C. mayor Anthony Williams and Tim Russert of NBC's Meet The Press on the prestigious list.

► In September of 2004, Williams joined Washington Redskins great Darrell Green and Washington Sports and Entertainment Chairman and CEO Abe Pollin as the inaugural inductees into the new Greater Washington Sports Hall of Champions.

► Williams was one of only five coaches in NCAA Division I to have led his team to 11 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, from 1994-2004. The Terrapins' 2008 appearance in the National Invitation Tournament marked the 15th consecutive postseason berth for Williams' teams.

► In guiding his 2004 Terrapins to the ACC Tournament title, Williams became the third coach in league history to lead his team to victory over the top three seeds: No. 3 Wake Forest, No. 2

NC State and No. 1 Duke. By overcoming a 21-point first half deficit against the Wolfpack, Williams engineered the greatest comeback in the 52-year history of the ACC Tournament.

► He is one of seven college basketball coaches since 1980 to guide his alma mater to the Final Four and was the first since 1974 to lead his alma mater to a national title.

► A winner of nearly 70 percent of his NCAA Tournament games while at Maryland, he ranks ninth among active coaches in NCAA Tournament winning percentage overall (.659), and eighth in wins (27).

► With his 500th win at NC State on March 2, 2003, the 1968 Maryland grad became the sixth ACC alumnus in conference history to amass as many as 500 coaching victories.

► With a victory over No. 1 North Carolina in Chapel Hill on Jan. 19, 2008, he is the winningest coach in the nation against top-ranked opponents (7).

► With 400 wins as Maryland's head coach, Williams is only the sixth mentor in Atlantic Coast Conference history to pass the 300-victory milestone.

► With 165 career ACC victories as Maryland's coach, Williams ranks as the third-winningest ACC coach in terms of conference victories. Only Dean Smith (364, North Carolina) and Mike Krzyzewski (264, Duke) have more ACC conference wins.

Williams was heralded as the national and Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year during the Terps' 2002 championship run. He is one of just 11 active coaches in America to boast a national title and one of only three in the conference. He has become the fifth-winningest coach in ACC history after transforming the Maryland program into one of the nation's most formidable, and building a Baltimore-D.C. area following that has consistently resulted in packed arenas. After demolishing attendance records with sellout crowds during the final years of Maryland basketball at Cole Field House, Williams' Terps have finished in the top 10 nationally in each of the last nine seasons. The Terrapins played before 341,050 fans in 2007-08, averaging 100 percent of capacity for the second time in Comcast Center history.

Williams is one of just two 600-win coaches who now engineer the programs at their respective alma maters, joining Jim Boeheim at Syracuse. With Roy Williams of North Carolina, those three also are the only active coaches to direct their alma maters to at least one Final Four appearance.

In 2001, Williams became just the sixth coach since 1980 to direct his alma mater to the Final Four. A year later, he became the first coach since 1974 to guide his alma mater to a national title. Williams is the only active coach to take his alma mater to consecutive Final Four appearances. He is only the eighth mentor ever to guide his alma mater to consecutive Final Fours, and the first since Houston's Guy Lewis in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

A former Terrapin point guard and 1968 graduate, Williams was a starter under coach Bud Millikan during the 1965, 1966 and 1967 seasons. He was the team captain as a senior and still lists one of his most memorable basketball moments as his experience as a spectator at the 1966 national championship game conducted at Maryland's legendary Cole Field House, between Texas Western and Kentucky.

The Terrapins' head coach is an active member of the University of Maryland and greater Baltimore-Washington, D.C. community. Williams is involved in extensive charity, fund-raising and public speaking events throughout the year, particularly in the offseason.

In September of 2004, University President C.D. Mote Jr. announced that Williams will co-chair the scholarship component of Maryland's ongoing \$250 million fund-raising campaign. In addition to a pledge of a half-million dollars of his own for academic scholarships at the university, Williams will represent the University at various functions and perform various networking duties to spearhead the fundraising efforts.

Williams has been heavily involved in the NABC's Coaches vs. Cancer efforts. The program is a partnership between the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the American Cancer Society. The coaches participating in this program are dedicated to fighting cancer through increased support for research, patient services, and prevention education.

Williams has also worked with Maryland grad Boomer Esiason and others to benefit the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, hosting charity basketball games and golf events.

For the past two years, Williams has served as the honorary chairman for the Walk Far for N.A.A.R., which has raised more than \$1 million dollars for the National Alliance of Autism Research. He has also chaired the Salvation Army's FORE Kids golf tournament in 2003 and 2004, which raises proceeds for Washington, D.C.'s youth.
