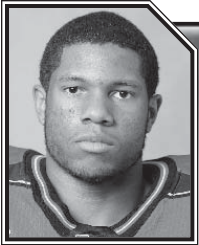

A four-year defensive back who started at strong safety as a senior ... saw significant action on special teams his first three seasons and increased time in the secondary in 2007 ... a durable, athletic player with a nose for the ball ... solid tackler ... played in every game (50) during his four seasons ... earned Iron Terps status his final three springs.

As a Senior (2008): Started all 13 games at strong safety ... served as the quarterback of the secondary ... also saw plenty of action on special teams ... ranked fifth on the team in tackles (66) ... ranked 15th in the ACC among defensive backs in tackles (5.1 pg) ... his three pass breakups were tied for fourth on the team ... posted the 15th-highest strength index on the team (third among DBs) in spring testing ... made first career start vs. Delaware (8/30) ... tied for team lead with a career-high nine tackles, including a career-best seven solo stops, vs. MTSU (9/6) ... also posted his first career tackle for loss against MTSU ... contributed six tackles and his first PBU of the season vs. Cal (9/13) ... equaled his career high with nine tackles at Clemson (9/27), setting a career best for tackles in a season in the process ... had five tackles and a crucial PBU during the final series vs. North Carolina (11/15) ... graded out as the top DB vs. the Tar Heels. ... had six stops vs. Florida State (11/22) ... posted his first career interception and a pass breakup vs. Nevada in the Humanitarian Bowl (12/30).

As a Junior (2007): Played in all 13 games in a reserve role at safety and posted 28 tackles ... saw his role increase as the season progressed ... played on all four special teams units ... posted the 14th-highest strength index on the team (fourth among DBs) in spring testing ... (vs. Villanova) ... played in a reserve roll and recorded three tackles ... (vs. WVU) ... played and recorded two tackles ... (vs. WF) ... had three tackles ... saw his most extensive career action

to date in the secondary (22 plays) ... (vs. Rutgers) ... had one tackle ... (vs. GT) ... forced a Tashard Choice fumble in the second quarter, ending a potential scoring drive for the Jackets ... recorded four tackles ... (vs. UVA) ... had two tackles ... (vs. Clemson) ... made a season-high six tackles ... in on a season-high 40 defensive snaps ... (vs. FSU) ... recorded five tackles, including a season-high three solo stops ... At DeMatha High School: A three-year letterwinner and two-year starter ... a versatile athlete who played tailback and safety, as well as returning kicks ... rushed 133 times for 1,128 yards and 15 touchdowns as a senior ... averaged 106.3 yards per game and 8.5 yards per carry ... also recorded 54 tackles and four interceptions ... rushed for 85 yards and two TDs in WCAC championship game ... ran for over 800 yards with eight touchdowns as a junior ... a consensus first team all-state pick as a defensive back ... first team All-Metro (*Washington Post*), All-WCAC and all-county ... selected to play in the Good Samaritan Bowl all-star game ... named to George Michael's Golden 11 team ... a *SuperPrep* All-American ... an All-East Region selection by *PrepStar* ... team won state his last two years and was 22-1 in that time ... also lettered two years in track ... an early commitment who was also recruited by Virginia Tech ... coached by Bill McGregor.

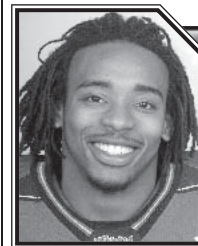

A two-year starter during his five seasons ... one of the top cornerbacks in the ACC his final two years ... played in 43 career games, including 21 starts ... has good speed and coverage skills ... has good jumping ability which allows him to cover bigger receivers ... also saw action on special teams throughout his career ... was durable throughout his career until an injury midway through his senior season ... invited to the 2009 Under Armour Senior Bowl and the 2009 NFL Combine ... member of the 2008 Terrapin Council, the team's leadership committee.

As a Senior (2008): An All-ACC nominee ... started the first seven games at CB before being sidelined with a season-ending shoulder injury ... had two interceptions on the season which was second on the team ... notched the team's first interception of the season when he picked off a pass by Delaware WR Aaron Love on a flee-flicker during the first drive of the season-opener's second half (8/30) ... added his first career forced fumble when he stripped Delaware RB Jonathon Smith on fourth down in the second quarter of the same game ... intercepted Cal QB Kevin Riley and returned it 17 yards to set up Maryland's second touchdown during the first quarter vs. the Golden Bears (9/13) ... notched two PBUs and his first career blocked field

goal at Virginia (10/4) ... tallied a forced fumble vs. Wake Forest (10/18) before leaving the game with a season-ending shoulder injury ... had his streak of 20 straight starts snapped the following week vs. NC State (10/25) ... was a regular at practice after the injury, serving as a student coach.

As a Junior (2007): An All-ACC nominee at cornerback ... led the team with four interceptions, the most by a Terp since Dominique Foxworth had five in 2002 ... second on the team in pass breakups (nine) ... fifth on the team with 65 tackles ... also fourth on the team with 47 solo stops ... tied for seventh in the ACC and 77th in the country in interceptions (0.31 pg) ... tied for fifth in the ACC and 55th in the NCAA in passes defended (1.00 pg) ... started all 13 games at cornerback ... also a regular on special teams where he posted 10 tackles on the season ... (*vs. Villanova*) ... grabbed his first career interception and returned it 28 yards ... recorded four tackles as defense held Wildcats to 28 total yards in the second half ... (*vs. FIU*) ... snagged an interception for the second consecutive week ... returned the pick 21 yards to set up a Lance Ball TD and seal the win ... (*vs. WVU*) ... started and recorded two tackles ... (*vs. WF*) ... picked off a Riley Skinner pass in the fourth quarter and returned it six yards ... recorded five tackles, including four solo ... had one tackle for a loss of one yard ... As a Freshman (2004): Redshirt season ... named defensive scout team player of the week for his work leading up to the NC State and Virginia Tech games.

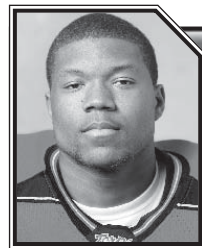

A powerful, athletic linebacker who played in 28 career games, mostly as a reserve ... has experience at both middle and outside linebacker ... played mostly Will LB as a senior and spent much of the three previous seasons at Mike LB ... battled injuries as a sophomore and junior ... posted the third-highest strength index among his linebacker group in spring 2008 testing.

As a Senior (2008): Played in all 13 games at LB and on special teams, including one start at Will LB ... more than tripled his previous career high for tackles ... made

first career start vs. Delaware (8/30) ... tallied four tackles (two solo) against the Blue Hens ... notched four tackles, including one TFL, and his first career PBU vs. Eastern Michigan (9/20) ... had five tackles at Clemson (9/27) ... registered seven tackles at Virginia (10/4) ... tallied a career-best 11 tackles and two PBUs while filling in for injured LB Dave Philistin vs. NC State (10/25).

A two-year starter who emerged as one of the top offensive linemen in the league as a junior, his first as a starter ... played both right and left tackle ... a two-time all-league performer ... has ideal size for a tackle and good strength ... played through injury (back) in 2005 and saw limited action in 2006 ... played in 39 career games, including 24 starts (18 at left tackle/six at right tackle) ... awarded a medical redshirt prior to the 2007 season due to an injury during his junior campaign ... member of the 2008 Terrapin Council, the team's leadership committee.

As a Senior (2008): An honorable mention All-ACC selection by AP/ACSMA ... played in all 13 games ... started the first six games at left tackle and the next six at right tackle ... member of a line that enabled Da'Rel Scott (1,133) to become the seventh Terp back, and first since 2002 (Chris Downs), to gain over 1,000 rushing yards ... the line also aided Chris Turner to throw for 2,516 yards, the seventh-highest single-season total in school history ... a preseason second team All-ACC choice by *Athlon* and *Lindy's* ... also a preseason honorable mention All-America by *Sporting News* ... part of the unit that surrendered just seven sacks during the seven-game span from Sept. 20 to Nov. 15, five of which resulted in Maryland victories ... part of the unit that surrendered just one sack and helped RB Da'Rel Scott rush for a career-high 197 yards vs. Delaware (8/30) ... member of the unit that scored 35 points vs. then-No. 23 Cal (9/13) ... helped the offense account for 51 points and 486 total yards against Eastern Michigan (9/20) ... part of the unit that helped Terp ball carriers rack up 203 rushing yards (including 163 by Scott) vs. NC State (10/25) ... part of the unit that helped Scott and fellow RB Davin Meggett combine for 215 rushing yards and allowed just one sack vs. North Carolina (11/15) ... helped spearhead a solid offensive attack in the win over Nevada in the Humanitarian Bowl (12/30) ... offense posted 456 total yards, including 258 rushing yards, vs. a Wolf Pack defense which entered the game ranked third nationally against the run (74.5 ypg) ... also made a key defensive play in the game ... when Nevada LB Brandon Marshall recovered a Turner fumble during the third quarter, he forced a fumble by Marshall and recovered it at the Wolf Pack's 45-yard line to regain possession for Maryland.

As a Redshirt Junior (2007): A second-team All-ACC selection by Rivals.com ... played in all 13 games at left

tackle, starting 12 ... aided running backs Lance Ball and Keon Lattimore to rush for nearly 1,600 yards and 25 TDs ... also helped first-year starting QB Chris Turner post the third-best passing-efficiency rating in the ACC ... earned the James M. Tatum Award as the team's top offensive lineman ... (vs. *Villanova*) ... earned his first career start, opening the game at left tackle ... saw action on 49 plays ... (vs. *FIU*) ... earned second-consecutive start ... (vs. *WVU*) ... started at left tackle and was in on 60 plays, most among offensive linemen ... (vs. *WF*) ... started at left tackle, but missed much of the second half due to injury ... (vs. *Rutgers*) ... despite missing practice time during the week due to injury, started at left tackle and saw action on 66 plays, fourth most among offensive players ... (vs. *GT*) ... started at left tackle and saw time in 43 plays, third most among O-linemen ... (vs. *UVA*) ... started at left tackle and was in on 56 plays, second most among offensive linemen ... (vs. *Clemson*) ... did not start due to an ankle injury, but did see action on three plays at left tackle ...
