Maryland vs. Georgia Tech

IN THE RED ZONE...

• Coming off one of its biggest non-league wins in recent years, the University of Maryland returns to Atlantic Coast Conference action this weekend when the Terrapins play host to Georgia Tech. The Terps and Yellow Jackets are set to kick off at noon ET Saturday at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium. The Terps, who play four of their next five at Byrd, downed No. 10 Rutgers, 34-24, Saturday in Piscataway, N.J., and now set their sights on evening their conference record in their ACC home opener. Both Maryland and Georgia Tech snapped two-game losing skids last weekend with wins over ranked teams. The Yellow Jackets downed No. 13 Clemson, 13-3, in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets have defeated the Terps in their last three meetings. Saturday's game will be televised to a regional audience on the Raycom/Lincoln Financial Sports network. Locally the game can be seen on WJZ (CBS 13) in Baltimore and WDCA (Channel 20) in Washington, D.C. The Terrapin Sports Radio Network will handle the broadcast of the matchup with pregame starting at 10:30 a.m. The game will be replayed at 7:30 p.m. Sunday on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic.

• Maryland, which defeated a top 10 team for the first time in three years with the win over Rutgers, is led by the 35th ranked defense in the nation. The Terps allow 317.4 yards per contest. Rutgers had 392 yards of total offense Saturday, but that was nearly 140 yards below its season average (525.0). The Scarlet Knights came into the game with the ninth-ranked offense in the nation. Junior linebacker **Erin Henderson** is the Terps' top playmaker. He is among the top tacklers in the league for the second straight year, ranking second in stops and tied for 16th in the country (11.0 pg). He has led the team in tackles each game this season. He ranked second in the ACC and 31st nationally in tackles (8.8 per game) in 2006. The junior is a preseason All-American and on the watch lists for the Nagurski Trophy, and Bednarik and Butkus Awards. Junior LB **Dave Philistin**, a first-year starter, is second on the squad in tackles (35). Senior tackles **Dre Moore** and **Carlos Feliciano** lead the rush defense which is allowing 141.2 yards per game and held Heisman candidate Ray Rice to 97 yards. Junior cornerback **Kevin Barnes**, in his first season as a starter, is tied for first in the league in interceptions (0.60 pg). He has three of the team's seven picks.

• The Terps offense is led by a solid ground game, which features senior backs **Lance Ball** and **Keon Lattimore**. Lattimore ranks second in the ACC and 28th nationally in rushing (106.6 ypg), and has tallied a league-high eight rushing TDs. Maryland's 176.8 rushing yards per game ranks second in the ACC, behind only Georgia Tech (204.2). Lattimore and Ball combined for over 200 yards vs. Rutgers. Sophomore WR **Darrius Heyward-Bey**, a member of the 2007 Biletnikoff Award watch list, leads the team in receptions (19) and receiving yards (258). Senior guard **Andrew Crummey**, a preseason All-American and candidate for the Lombardi Award and Outland Trophy, headlines the offensive line which has three new starters. Junior quarterback **Jordan Steffy** is in his first year as a starter after taking over for two-year starter Sam Hollenbach. Steffy ranks sixth in the ACC in passing efficiency (123.2 rating) and second in completion percentage (68.0). Steffy was knocked out of the Rutgers game at the end of the first half. Sophomore **Chris Turner** came on and engineered four second-half scoring drives in the win.

• The Terps special teams has distinguished itself well after five games despite three new starters. True freshman **Travis Baltz** took over for Adam Podlesh at punter and junior **Obi Egekeze** replaced Dan Ennis as the place-kicker. Baltz ranks ninth in the ACC in punting average (39.2). He averaged a career-best 44.7 yards per punt vs. Wake Forest. Egekeze has hit 5 of 9 field goals, with two of the misses coming from beyond 50 yards. Redshirt freshman **Da'Rel Scott**, a backup running back, has served as the kickoff return specialist the last two games, averaging 21.3 yards on six attempts. Junior **Danny Oquendo** is the lone returning specialist. He ranks eighth in the ACC in punt return average (8.5 ypr).

QUICK HITTERS...

- The Terps have not started their conference schedule 0-2 under **Ralph Friedgen**. Maryland last lost its first two ACC games in 2000. The Terps opened league play 0-3 that season.
- Maryland is 193-158-4 (.546) all-time in ACC contests, including a 30-19 (.612) mark under Friedgen. The Terps are 4-4 vs. Georgia Tech at home.
- The Terps will celebrate the 50th anniversary of 'The Queen's Game' this weekend. On Oct. 19, 1957, England's Queen Elizabeth - during a 10-day visit to Canada and the United States - came to College Park to see an American college football game. The Terps played host to No. 14 North Carolina that day and downed the Tar Heels, 21-7. The University of Maryland Archives is commemorating the visit with a special exhibit (see note on page 7). There will be a special recognition ceremony prior to the Georgia Tech game. The 1957 team will also be honored prior to the game.
- This weekend the M Club and the Maryland Gridiron Network will serve as hosts to the inaugural Terrapin football "Decades Reunion." All members of teams which ended in year '7' will be honored at a reception Friday evening at the Gossett Team House. Members of those teams will be honored at halftime of the Georgia Tech game.
- **Lance Ball** needs 20 yards to become the ninth back in school history to reach 2,000 career rushing yards. He also needs just 23 yards to move into the all-time top 10 in rushing yards.
- Three true freshmen - P **Travis Baltz**, OL **Bruce Campbell** and DB **Dominique Herald** - have seen action so far this season.

TERPS UPEND A TOP 10 TEAM...

Maryland's win over No. 10 Rutgers Saturday was its first over a top 10 team since 2004 (20-17 vs. No. 5 Florida State, Oct. 30). The Terps also downed a ranked team on the road for the second time in three opportunities. They lost to No. 20 Boston College, 38-16 on Nov. 18, 2006, but defeated No. 19 Clemson, 13-12, Nov. 4 of last year. It also marked the first time Maryland defeated a top 10 team on the road since Nov. 17, 1990 when they upended No. 8 Virginia, 35-30, in Charlottesville. That win came in the regular season finale and clinched a berth in the Independence Bowl for the Terps. In addition, Maryland defeated a top 10 non-conference team on the road for the first time since 1984. Frank Reich engineered a 31-point comeback in the Terps' 42-40 win at No. 6 Miami on Nov. 10, 1984. Until Saturday the Terps had lost seven in-a-row to top 10 non-conference foes on the road.

STRETCHING THE FIELD...

Sophomore **Chris Turner** helped spark the offense to the win over Rutgers, but the Maryland wide receiving

corps aided the inexperienced signal-caller by making a number of big plays down the field. Over the first three games of the season, the Terps had only eight plays of 20 or more yards, but over the last two contests they have posted eight, including five in pass game. In the Rutgers game, the top four wideouts (**Darrius Heyward-Bey**, **Danny Oquendo**, **Isaiah Williams** and **LaQuan Williams**) accounted for 13 receptions for 199 yards (15.3 yards per catch). None of the receptions may have been bigger, however, than the LaQuan Williams' 27-yard catch on third-and-12 midway in the fourth quarter which enabled the Terps to extend their slim 20-17 lead. Williams laid out to corral Turner's pass at the 2-yard line, and **Keon Lattimore** scored one play later for a 27-17 lead, one Maryland did not relinquish.

TURNER IN THE CLUTCH...

Chris Turner was efficient with his 14-for-20, 149-yard performance vs. Rutgers. He did not throw a TD pass, but also did not turn the ball over. Most importantly he was key on third down where Maryland was 9-for-21 (43 percent) for the game, including 6 of 12 in the second half. Turner went 7-for-8 for 57 yards on third down. Four of those completions lead to first downs. Turner had seen action in just a few series in the season opener vs. Villanova (Sept. 1) and had one play vs. Wake Forest (Sept. 22).

DEFENSE CLAMPS DOWN...

Heading into the final drive in regulation vs. Wake Forest (Sept. 22) in the ACC opener and clinging to a 24-17 lead, the Terps had surrendered just 292 yards of total offense to the Demon Deacons. However, WFU was able to put an 80-yard, eight-play scoring drive together which knotted the game, sending it into overtime where Wake scored the game-winning TD on its first possession, a three-play, 25-yard march.

Fast forward to the fourth quarter of Saturday's Rutgers game where Maryland was holding onto a 27-24 lead with less than three minutes to go. The No. 10-ranked Scarlet Knights got the ball at their own 35, but this time the Terps defense stiffened. Three incomplete passes by Mike Teel, two of which were broken up, one by DL **Mack Frost** and one by CB **Kevin Barnes**, left Rutgers with a fourth-and-10. Junior DL **Jeremy Navarre** ended any hopes of a comeback with a sack of Teel, the second one of the game. In fact, the Terps sacked Teel twice after the junior had only been sacked eight times since the beginning of the 2006 season (16 games).

RUSHING ATTACK...

Senior RB Keon Lattimore set the tone vs. Rutgers with 25 rushing yards on the Terps' opening drive of the game and went on to post a career-best 124 yards on the ground (career-high 34 carries) vs. Rutgers. Lattimore, who is No. 2 in the ACC in rushing (106.6 ypg), went over 100 yards for the fourth time this season, which ranks seventh on the school's single-season list. Redshirt freshman **Da'Rel Scott** made his first career appearance at running back and had three rushes for 29 yards. In addition, **Lance Ball**, a member of the Doak Walker watch list, also chipped in a season-high 90 yards on 12 carries. In all the Terps tallied a season-high 239 yards on the ground, their highest total since posting 250 vs. Virginia in 2005.

GEORGIA TECH AT-A-GLANCE...

- Like Maryland, Georgia Tech enters Saturday's game after scoring a big upset last week. Tech upended No. 13 Clemson 13-3 to improve to 3-2 overall and 1-2 in the ACC. Georgia Tech won primarily due to its efforts on special teams. The Yellow Jackets blocked a punt and recovered a fumble on a kickoff to set up two scores. Clemson also missed four field goals in the game.
- The Georgia Tech special teams have indeed been special this season. Senior Durant Brooks ranks second in the NCAA with a punting average of 47.13, and kicker Travis Bell is second in the country with 2.4 field goals per game. Bell leads the ACC in scoring at 10.2 points per game, a figure that puts him 19th in the nation in scoring.
- In addition, the Yellow Jackets have been impressive on kickoffs. Tech is allowing only 15.9 yards per kick return, the lowest in the country, and is averaging 28.14 yards per return on the other side of the ball, seventh best in the NCAA.
- Georgia Tech has been winning the battle at the line of scrimmage. The Yellow Jackets run defense currently ranks sixth in the nation, allowing only 64.6 yards per game.
- The Jackets rank third in the country in sacks (4.2 pg) and 11th in sacks allowed (0.8 pg). They also rank third in the country with 10.4 tackles for loss per game.
- Georgia Tech has lost only four turnovers on the season. The Jackets rank ninth in the country in turnover margin at +1.40 per game.
- Senior Tashard Choice ranks third in the ACC in rushing yards, just behind Maryland's **Keon Lattimore**. Choice is averaging 100.2 yards per contest.
- Georgia Tech ranks 118th out of 119 NCAA bowl subdivision schools in third-down efficiency. The Yellow Jackets are converting only 23.5 percent of their third down attempts.

MARYLAND-GEORGIA TECH SERIES HISTORY...

- Georgia Tech owns a 13-5 advantage in the all-time series, and has taken the last three from Maryland.
- Georgia Tech edged Maryland 27-23 last season in a thriller in Atlanta. The Terps had the ball at the Yellow Jacket 7-yard line with only seconds remaining, but were stopped shy of the winning score.
- Maryland's **Lance Ball** and Tech's Tashard Choice had 116 and 138 rushing yards, respectively, in that game, as the two dueling it out on the ground. The Yellow Jackets' Calvin Johnson had 133 yards receiving and Terrapin wide out Darrius Heyward-Bey had 111 to provide Maryland's yards through the air. All but Johnson return this season for the rematch.
- Maryland Coach **Ralph Friedgen** is of course familiar with both schools, having coached at Georgia Tech for several years when he was not manning the Maryland sidelines. Friedgen left College Park in 1986 for Atlanta following four seasons as the Maryland offensive coordinator. He held that same post with Georgia Tech from 1987-91 and again from 1997-2000, before returning to Maryland as the head coach for the 2001 season.

OFFENSIVE NOTES...

- Maryland has done an excellent job holding the ball and keeping it away from their opponents. The Terps sit atop the NCAA in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 34:48 minutes per game.
- In the first quarters of games this season, Maryland is outscoring its opponents 36-13.
- The Terps posted a season-high 458 yards of total offense vs. Rutgers (Sept. 29) and had over 200 rushing and passing yards for the second time this season (also Villanova).
- One of the foremost offensive minds in the collegiate or pro game, head coach **Ralph Friedgen** is in his second season as the Terps' offensive coordinator.
- With eight touchdowns on the season, running back **Keon Lattimore** has now more than doubled his season total from each of the last two seasons (three).
- In his last seven games, stretching back to last season, Lattimore has rushed for 737 yards (119 vs. Wake Forest, 85 vs. Purdue, 106 vs. Villanova, 111 vs. FIU, 80 vs. WVU, 112 vs. WFU, and 124 vs. Rutgers.)
- At 9.60 points per game, Lattimore is currently the second leading scorer in the ACC, and is tied for 30th in the NCAA. His 106.6 rushing yards per game rank second in the conference and 28th in the country.
- Lattimore has rushed for over 100 yards in four out of Maryland's five games this season, a number which is even more impressive considering he is splitting time with **Lance Ball**. Saturday against Geor-

- Only six players in school history have more than 100-yard rushing games in a season than Lattimore, who currently stands at four. Steve Atkins (1978) and Charlie Wysocki (1980) jointly hold the record with eight in one year.

- Lattimore now has six career 100-yard rushing games (119 vs. Wake Forest and 114 vs. Virginia in 2006; 106 vs. Villanova, 111 vs. FIU, 112 vs. WFU, and 124 vs. RU in 2007). That puts him in a tie for fifth on Maryland's career list.

- When Lattimore finished with 111 yards on 12 carries against Florida International in week two, he became the first Terrapin back to open the season with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Bruce Perry opened with five straight 100-yard games in Maryland's ACC Championship season in 2001.

- Sophomore wide receiver **Darrius Heyward-Bey** has caught a pass in each of the Terps last 17 games, the longest active streak on the team. He has led the team in receiving yards in eight of those contests (Georgia Tech -111, Florida State - 57, Miami - 175, Purdue - 81 in 2006), including four of the Terrapins' games this season (Villanova - 81, FIU - 48, WVU - 56, and RU - 61).

- Heyward-Bey is currently tied for ninth in the ACC in receptions per game (3.80) and ranks 12th in receiving yards per game (51.60).

- Quarterback **Jordan Steffy** has been efficient and accurate while directing the Terrapin offense. He is 68-of-100 (68.0 percent) for 674 yards on the year. His completion percentage ranks second in the ACC.

- In his first five games as a starter, Steffy owns a pass efficiency rating of 123.22 which ranks sixth in the conference and 64th in the NCAA.

- With eight touchdowns through only five games this season, Lattimore is quickly moving up Maryland's single season rushing TDs list. He currently stands tied for 17th, and needs only three more scores to move into the top 10. LaMont Jordan set the single-season record back in 1999 with 16 scores on the ground.

- Maryland's dynamic tailback duo of Lattimore and Ball combined for 1,558 yards last season, and have hit the ground running to start 2007. Through five games this year, the pair have combined for 794 yards rushing and 12 touchdowns on 175 carries. Lattimore and Ball were one of just five running-back combos in the nation last season to collect over 700 rushing yards apiece.

- In his first game as a collegiate starter, Steffy completed 19 of 24 passes (79 percent) for 174 yards and one interception. The junior's debut was the most efficient effort by a Maryland quarterback starting his first career game since Brian Cummings completed 83 percent of his passes in a 1995 win over Tulane to open the year.

- Joey Haynos** and **Dan Gronkowski** form one of the top tight end duos in the nation. Each has started at the position. In fact, even though Haynos was the second-leading receiver on the team in 2006, Gronkowski started more games in the Terps' two-tight end set. Gronkowski opened nine contests,

while Haynos started six. Gronkowski, considered the better blocker, had just two catches, though he should see more opportunities in the passing game this season. Haynos is a member of the Mackey Award watch list.

- The Terps return just two starters (**C Edwin Williams** at center, **RG Andrew Crummey**) on the offensive line, but still have quite a bit of experience. LG **Jaimie Thomas** played in all 13 games last season, starting three, while **Dane Randolph** played in 11 games, mostly at right tackle. Randolph started four games there including the Champs Sports Bowl game. Starting left tackle **Scott Burley** has played in each of the last three seasons, including eight games as a sophomore in 2005. Junior **Jack Griffin**, meanwhile, who is penciled in as the No. 2 right tackle, redshirted last season, but did see action as a freshman and sophomore, though that came on the d-line. Griffin is also the primary backup at right guard, while junior **Phil Costa** serves as the reserve center and left guard. Friedgen considers the Terps to have seven starters along the o-line due to the skill and versatility of this group.

- Crummey has started a team-high 33 games, while Williams' 18 consecutive starts lead the offense. Williams is the only offensive returnee to start all 13 games in 2006.

- Sophomore **Josh Portis**, who was second on the depth chart at quarterback, was ruled ineligible for the year, just prior to the season opener. Sophomore **Chris Turner**, who was second on the depth chart with Portis for much of preseason camp, serves as Steffy's primary backup and has played in three games this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES...

- The Terps rank seventh in the ACC and 35th in the nation in total defense (317.4 yards per game).
- In their first two games of the year, the Terps held back-to-back opponents below 200 yards of total offense for the first time since 2003. In that year, Maryland held The Citadel to 137 yards of total offense in a 61-0 win, and then limited West Virginia to 156 in a 34-7 win the following week.
- Prior to West Virginia (Sept. 13), the Terps had not allowed the opposing team to rush for 100 yards in three straight games (Purdue, 21 yards, Villanova,

12 yds, FIU, 82 yds.).

- Maryland held Rutgers to 82 yards on 23 carries Saturday, marking the third time in five games the Terps haven't allowed 100 yards rushing. Rutgers entered the game averaging 228.3 yards per game on the ground.

- Maryland's pass defense has been stout thus far, allowing only 176.2 yards per game by opponents, the 19th best figure in the nation, and second best in the ACC.

- After totaling eight interceptions all of last season, the Maryland defense has recorded seven already this season through only five games. **J.J. Justice** got in on the action Saturday when he picked off Mike Teel. The Terps picked off Wake Forest's Riley Skinner three times the week before. The last time Maryland had intercepted three passes in a game was Oct. 20, 2005 against Virginia Tech. Against Wake, **Kevin Barnes**, **Isaiah Gardner**, and **Erin Henderson** all had picks.

- For Barnes, it was his third interception of the season. The corner, who is in his first season as a full-time starter, is tied for first in the ACC in interceptions per game (0.60), and is tied for 19th in the country in that category.

- The Terps currently rank fourth in the ACC and tied for 29th in the NCAA with a turnover margin of .80. Maryland has forced 13 turnovers on the season, which is tied for 14th in the country. The Terrapins recovered two fumbles and picked off a pass in the win over Rutgers.

- Henderson, the Terps active career leader in tackles with 169, has again led Maryland in stops in each of its first five games this season. In Saturday's upset of No. 10 Rutgers, Henderson had 11 total tackles. It was his 11th career game with double-digit stops. He led the team in stops in five of the Terps 13 games a season ago. Henderson is the returning starter at weakside linebacker, where he tallied 8.8 tackles per game last season, second most in the ACC.

- Henderson is currently tied for 16th in the NCAA in tackles per game (11.00) and tied for 63rd in tackles for loss per game (1.20). He is the second-leading tackler in the ACC.

- Defensive linemen **Mack Frost** and **Jeremy Navarre** each had key fourth quarter sacks of Rutgers QB Mike Teel in Saturday's win. It was the first two sacks allowed by Rutgers on the year.

- Navarre's came on a fourth down as Rutgers, then trailing by three, was attempting to tie or take the lead. Navarre's hit forced a fumble, and Maryland took over on downs, setting up **Lance Ball's** second touchdown of the day on the very next play. For Frost it was his first of the season.

- The four sacks of Villanova quarterback Antwon Young in the season opener were the most by Maryland since posting the same number vs. NC State last season (Oct. 21). Senior **Dre Moore** had a pair of sacks for 13 yards, setting a new career high.

- One area of strength for the Terrapins in preseason camp was the defensive line, where the Terps return Moore and fellow senior **Carlos Feliciano**, as well as juniors Frost and Navarre. Frost consistently drew praise from Friedgen for his work in preseason practice, while the head coach has stated that Moore is playing the best football of his career.

- Six Terrapin defenders have started more than 15 career games for Maryland and three (Navarre, **Trey Covington** and **Christian Varner**) have started more than 20. Covington has started 26 of the last 27 games at LEO, a hybrid linebacker/defensive end position, while Varner has started 28 of the last 29 at safety, including a team-high 27 straight. In addition, Navarre has started 27 of the last 29 contests.

- In the season opener versus Villanova, **Dave Philistin** got the starting nod at middle linebacker, marking the third consecutive season the Terps have opened the year with a different Mike from the year before. Wesley Jefferson, who manned the middle for the Terps a year ago after replacing D'Qwell Jackson in 2006, graduated early to pursue a career as a state trooper. Jefferson was second on the team in tackles in 2006. **Chase Bullock** entered the fall No. 1 on the depth chart and remained there until an injury forced him out of the lineup.

- Phillistin is second on the team in tackles (35) and has also broken up three passes on the season. He had a career-high 11 stops in Saturday's win over Rutgers, including eight solo tackles.

- Maryland has had at least one defensive player drafted into the NFL in each of the last 11 seasons, and 17 defensive players overall in that time span, including cornerback Josh Wilson last season. Of the Terps defenders selected, 11 have gone in the first three rounds, including first round picks Chad Scott (1997) and Shawne Merriman (2005).

DEFENSIVE NOTES...(CONT'D)...

- Varner and Gardner are the only two defensive returnees to start all 13 games last season. Jefferson was the only other defender to start each contest in 2006.
- The Terps suffered a major loss in the preseason when LB **Alex Wujciak** injured a knee during a practice. He had ACL surgery at the end of August and should return next season. The redshirt freshman was expected to play LEO and possibly at Mike.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES...

- In punter Adam Podlesh and kicker Dan Ennis, the Terps never had to worry about their special teams last season. Podlesh was a four-time All-ACC punter and two-time semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, while Ennis connected on 20 of 25 field goals last season and tied for ninth nationally in field goals per game (1.54).
- The Terrapins tapped place-kicker **Obi Egekeze** and punter **Travis Baltz** at the start of the season to replace their sensational specialists from 2006, and the early returns are solid. Egekeze was near perfect this season, until last weekend when he went 2-for-5. Through five games Egekeze is a perfect 16-for-16 on PATs, and 5 of 9 on field goal attempts. Two of those misses have come from beyond 50 yards (52 vs/ FIU; 51 vs. Rutgers). He ranks 10th in the ACC in scoring (6.2).
- Baltz, a true freshman, has been solid thus far in his brief Maryland career. After averaging 43.0 yards on two punts against Villanova, Baltz averaged 37.9 yards on nine punts against FIU, but pinned the Golden Panthers' inside their 20-yard-line on five of his nine kicks. The five punts inside the 20 were the most by a Maryland punter since Brooks Barnard had six in **Ralph Friedgen's** first game as head coach, a 23-7 win over North Carolina in 2001. Baltz's nine punts were the most by a Maryland punter since Adam Podlesh booted the ball 11 times in a 13-3 loss to NC State in 2004.
- Against Wake Forest, Baltz had perhaps his best game as a collegian, punting six times for 268 yards, a 44.7 average. He recorded one punt for a career long of 54 yards, and put two balls inside the 20-yard line.
- Kickoff specialist **Chris Roberts** has also helped pick up the special teams unit. He's averaged just over 60 yards per kickoff, with opponents' average starting point of drives the 27-yard line. He had his first touchback vs. Rutgers (Sept. 29). The Scarlet Knights averaged less than 18 yards per kickoff return.
- Egekeze and Baltz hope to live up to the Terps' lofty standards. Maryland has a strong history of special teams play in the Friedgen era. Podlesh, as well as Barnard and former kicker Nick Novak, moved on to the NFL. Although Egekeze served as a kickoff specialist last season, neither he nor Baltz had at-

- tempted a kick in a game prior to the 2007 opener.
- When Baltz entered the Villanova game (Sept. 1) in the second quarter, he became the first true freshman to start an opening-day game for the Terps since defensive end **Jeremy Navarre** in 2005, and only the second of the Ralph Friedgen era.
- The Terps have some big shoes to fill at kick returner as Josh Wilson has taken his game to the NFL. Wilson ranked third in the ACC (11th nationally) last season in kick returns (27.3 ypr) en route to setting a single-season school record for return yards (847). Backup running back **Da'Rel Scott** got a shot at returning kicks against Wake Forest (Sept. 22) and responded with 101 yards on four returns, including a long return of 39 yards. Scott only had two attempts vs. Rutgers (Sept. 29) and averaged 13.5 ypr. Reserve safety **Terrell Skinner**, who moved from wide receiver in the spring, opened the season as the primary kick returner, and has averaged 18.5 yards on six returns and is second on the depth chart now.
- Maryland is fortunate to have the sure-handed **Danny Oquendo** back to handle punt return duties. Last season, Oquendo ranked eighth in the ACC and 53rd nationally in return average (8.4). Through five games this season, Oquendo has averaged 8.5 yards on eight returns. His average places him 10th among ACC players and 66th in the NCAA. **Christian Varner** has served as Oquendo's backup and returned two punts for 17 yards vs. Rutgers (Sept. 29).

MAKING PLAYS ON OFFENSE...

- Entering the Wake Forest game, Maryland had eight plays from scrimmage of 20 yards or more on the season. Against WFU (Sept. 22) and Rutgers (Sept. 29), they had four apiece. **Keon Lattimore** and **Darius Heyward-Bey** had runs of 25 and 54 yards, respectively, while tight ends **Dan Gronkowski** and **Joey Haynos** had receptions of 26 and 20 yards from **Jordan Steffy**. The four vs. Rutgers, included a 39-yard completion from **Jordan Steffy** to **LaQuan Williams**, the longest pass play of the season for Maryland. Williams later added a spectacular 27-yard catch from **Chris Turner** on the Terps TD drive in the fourth quarter. **Isaiah Williams** also got into the action with a 28-yard completion from Turner. **Lance Ball** added a 32-yard scamper in the third quarter, which set up **Obi Egekeze** 37-yard field goal.
- Heyward-Bey had touchdown receptions of 65 and 96 yards last season, but his 54-yard run against Wake Forest was the longest rushing attempt of his career and the longest rush of the season for Maryland.

SELECT COMPANY...

- **Ralph Friedgen's** 50 wins as Terps' head coach ranks tied for second in Atlantic Coast Conference history among coaches in their first six years. Danny Ford of Clemson posted 51 from 1979-84 and Dick Crum of North Carolina (1978-82) also tallied 50.
- Though he was the top second-, third- and fourth-year coach in ACC history by wins, Friedgen's five-year win total (41) fell short of the mark of 44 victories set by Clemson's Danny Ford from 1979-83. That mark tied him for second with former Terrapin great **Jerry Claiborne** (1972-76) on the list. Claiborne holds the league's seven-year mark with 58 victories.

TERPS OWN NATION'S LONGEST STREAK...

- In special teams coach **Ray Rychleski's** seven years, Maryland has had three punters (Brooks Barnard, Adam Podlesh, and Travis Baltz), two long snappers (Jon Condo and Andrew Schmitt) and zero blocked punts. In fact since the Wake Forest game in 1999 (Oct. 9), only three players (Barnard, Podlesh, Baltz) have started at punter.
- The Terrapins' streak without a blocked punt goes back 90 games, now the longest streak in college football.
- The Terps have not had a punt blocked since Nov. 13, 1999 (Florida State). That amount of time became the longest in NCAA football when Georgia had a punt blocked by Ole Miss last season, snapping a streak which began earlier in the 1999 season.

TERPS TOUGH ROAD LAST SEASON...

- The Terrapins road back to a bowl game last season was a challenging one, as their schedule was one of the toughest in the nation. The Terrapins played five teams ranked in the AP Top 20 at the time of the game (West Virginia, Georgia Tech, Clemson, Boston College, Wake Forest).
- Eight bowl teams were among the 12 teams on Maryland's schedule last season. The Terps closed their 2006 schedule with five straight bowl teams.

...AND IT DOESN'T GET ANY EASIER...

- In 2007, the Terps face seven teams that played in bowl games a year ago (West Virginia, Wake Forest, Rutgers, Georgia Tech, Clemson, Boston College, Florida State). So far they have also faced two ranked opponents and likely to face at least two, if not three, more.
- The Terps' three-game stretch from Sept. 13 through Sept. 29 may have been one of the hardest in the country. In consecutive weeks, the Terps played host to West Virginia to College Park (ranked No. 4 in both polls), traveled to defending ACC champion Wake Forest, and headed to New Jersey to face Rutgers (ranked No. 10 in both polls). They went 1-2 in that stretch.
- Prior to the start of the season, SI.com had the Terps' schedule ranked 24th-most difficult in the country.

TERPS AMONG A SELECT GROUP...

- The Terps are one of just five teams in the nation (Washington, Washington State, East Carolina and Middle Tennessee State) to play two top 10 teams this season. They are also one of only three teams (East Carolina and MTSU) to play two in non-conference action. Most importantly, the Terps are the only team among this group to come away with a victory.
- East Carolina: at No. 9 Virginia Tech, at No. 5 West Virginia (two non-conference).
- Middle Tennessee St.: at No. 8 Louisville, at No. 2 LSU (two non-conference).
- Washington St.: at No. 7 Wisconsin, at No. 1 USC.
- Washington: No. 10 Ohio St., No. 1 USC .

TERPS HONOR QUEEN'S VISIT VS. GEORGIA TECH...

The Terps will celebrate the 50th anniversary of 'The Queen's Game' in the Georgia Tech contest. On Oct. 19, 1957, England's Queen Elizabeth - during a 10-day visit to Canada and the United States - came to College Park to see an American college football game - a "typical American sport" as she called it. The Terps played host to No. 14 North Carolina that day and downed the Tar Heels, 21-7 before a crowd of 43,000. The University of Maryland Archives is

commemorating the visit with a special exhibit in the Audrey Armistead Ruckert Reception Foyer of Hornbake Library on campus which features images and other memorabilia - including a Canadian flag that flew over the stadium - from the Queen's Game, as well as her visit afterwards to a local Giant food store. THE HENDERSON LINEBACKER LEGACY...

Junior Erin Henderson is continuing his own legacy this season. Henderson is the younger brother of E.J., who was a consensus All-American at linebacker for the Terps in 2001 and 2002. Erin and his brother posted comparable numbers as sophomores. Erin totaled 114 total tackles in 2006, while E.J. posted 109 in 2000. Now Erin, a preseason All-America pick by Playboy, is looking to have an explosive junior season similar to his brother's. E.J. burst onto the national scene with 150 tackles and 28 tackles for loss in 2001, as Maryland captured the ACC title. Henderson leads the team in tackles (55) and is on pace to post well over 100 stops this season.

- In 2006, Erin Henderson averaged 12.4 stops over the last five regular-season games, and recorded six double-digit tackle games on the season, including a career-high 17-tackle effort versus Clemson. He has 11 career double-digit tackle outings.

STEFFY TAKES THE REINS...

• Recently anointed starting quarterback **Jordan Steffy** has had to fight his way through more than just competition to climb to the top of the depth chart. A highly touted prospect out of Leola, Pa., Steffy played in six games as a freshman in 2004 and showed potential, before injuries derailed his career. He suffered a concussion against Virginia Tech, and a torn meniscus the next month. In April 2005 he survived a near-fatal car accident, and in July of that year he had surgery on his biceps, as a result of overthrowing. After a redshirt season and a year as the back-up quarterback, Steffy has finally claimed the starting job.

- Friedgen on Steffy - "He knows the offense very well and he's a very instinctive player. He's also a leader on the team. One of the things I like about him is that he's patient. He'll take the check down."
- Steffy demonstrated poise and excellent decision making in the Terps off-season scrimmages. In the three scrimmages of spring practice, he threw for 376 yards, with three touchdowns and no interceptions on 30 of 47 passing. He finished with 19 completions on 26 attempts for 165 yards and an interception in the team's final summer scrimmage.
- Steffy has started the season by completing 68.0 percent of his passes, which ranks second in the ACC. He also ranks sixth in the league in passing efficiency (123.2).

IN THE BOOKS...

There are currently two players in the two-deep - LEO **Jermaine Lemons** and TE **Dan Gronkowski** - who have graduated. Lemons is pursuing another degree and Gronkowski is in grad school. There are also 12 players on the roster, including seniors **Lance Ball**, **Andrew Crummey**, **Isaiah Gardner**, **Joey Haynos**, **Brendan McDermond**, **Dre Moore**, **Chris Roberts** and **Christian Varner**, as well as juniors **Obi Egekeze**, **Matt Goldberg**, **Erin Henderson**, and **Richard Taylor**, who are expected to graduate by December. In addition, all 15 seniors on the roster are on track to graduate by August, 2008.

LEMPA LOOKING TO PICK UP TERPS' SECONDARY...

- The newest addition to the Terrapin coaching staff is secondary coach **Kevin Lempa**, who came to College Park after four seasons with Boston College. Last season, Lempa's Eagles intercepted 21 passes, almost triple that of the Terrapins secondary. The 21 picks were tied for third most nationally.
- The Terps have already picked off seven passes after posting eight all of last season.
- Two of Lempa's defensive backs at Boston College – cornerback DeJaun Tribble and strong safety Ryan Gasper – were All-ACC performers last season, a fact that bodes well for his Terrapin defenders this season.
- Lempa has a pair of returning starters (S **Christian Varner** and CB **Isaiah Gardner**) in the secondary and a number of other speedy, talented youngsters. Junior CB **Kevin Barnes** opened the season opposite Gardner, while senior J.J. **Justice** stepped into the free safety role manned by Varner last season. Varner moved to strong safety prior to the spring. Barnes and Justice are both veterans of the system. Sophomores **Anthony Wiseman** and **Nolan Carroll** and senior **Colin Nelson** are others who will vie for time at cornerback this season, though Wiseman has seen most of the action, serving as the nuckel back. Junior **Richard Taylor** was expected to compete for a starting spot, but injured his knee toward the end of the spring and is working is way back into playing shape.

GETTING ONE BACK...

Scott Burley, who took over the starting left tackle spot in the spring, has earned another year of eligibility. Burley entered the preseason as a senior, but due to ankle and back woes last season, the Baltimore native is now a junior. He was granted another year by the NCAA toward the end of August.

HAYNOS SELECTED TO MACKEY WATCH LIST...

Senior tight end **Joey Haynos** was named to the preseason watch list for the 2007 John Mackey Award Monday in an announcement in July by the Nassau County Sports Commission. The Mackey Award is bestowed upon the best tight end in college football and is named after the NFL Hall of Famer who is considered to be the best to have played the position. Haynos is one of 30 student-athletes on the watch list, including four from the Atlantic Coast Conference. DajLeon Farr of Miami, Anthony Hill of North Carolina State, and Tom Santi of Virginia join Haynos on the list. The selection committee votes on the award toward the end of the college football season with the winner announced in mid-December. Matt Spaeth of Minnesota won the 2006 Mackey Award. Haynos was an honorable mention All-ACC selection last season and should vie for all-league honors again in 2007. He was a preseason second team All-ACC choice by *Athlon* and *Lindy's*. The native of Rockville, Md., has played in 35 career games after walking on in 2003. He was the second-leading receiver on the team in 2006 with 37 receptions for 369 yards, both career highs. He has snagged seven balls for 64 yards so far this season.

HENDERSON NAMED TO NAGURSKI TROPHY WATCH LIST...

Junior linebacker **Erin Henderson** was named to the preseason watch list for the 2007 Bronko Nagurski Trophy in an announcement by the Football Writers Association of America in June. The Nagurski Trophy is awarded to the best defensive player in college football and is sponsored by the Charlotte Touchdown Club. Henderson was one of 49 student-athletes on the original watch list, including seven from the ACC. Xavier Adibi and Vince Hall of Virginia Tech, Calais Campbell of Miami, Jolonn Dunbar of Boston College, Chris Long of Virginia and Philip Wheeler of Georgia Tech join Henderson on the list, which may be adjusted throughout the season. Henderson was a second-team All-ACC selection in 2006, after missing all of the previous year with a knee injury. He ranked second in the ACC and 31st nationally in tackles, posting 8.8 per game (114 total). Henderson, an Aberdeen, Md., native, was named to the Preseason Playboy All-America team in May. His brother E.J., who currently plays for the Minnesota Vikings and was a Maryland All-America linebacker, was a finalist for the 2002 Nagurski Trophy. Henderson has a team-high 32 stops on the season. The FWAA All-America Committee selects the Bronko Nagurski winner from the association's 11-man All-America defensive team in November. The Charlotte Touchdown Club will hold its banquet on Monday, Dec. 3.

HENDERSON ALSO ON BEDNARIK AWARD WATCH LIST...

Not only was linebacker **Erin Henderson** named a preseason All-American by Playboy and selected to the Nagurski Trophy watch list, but the junior is also on the Bednarik Award watch list as the nation's most outstanding defensive player. The Bednarik Award is presented by the Maxwell Memorial Football Club. Paul Posluszny of Penn State won the last two years, and Erin's brother E.J. captured the award in 2002.

HENDERSON ON BUTKUS AWARD WATCH LIST...

Erin Henderson was named to the preseason watch list for the 2007 Butkus Award on Tuesday, Aug. 28 in an announcement by the Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando. The Butkus Award is bestowed upon the top linebacker in college football. Patrick Willis of Mississippi won in 2006. Henderson is one of 65 student-athletes on the watch list. He was already on the watch list for the Nagurski Trophy and the Bednarik Award, which both honor the top defensive player in the nation. Henderson's bother, E.J., won the 2002 Butkus Award. The Butkus Award Watch List will be trimmed to 10 semifinalists on Thursday, Oct. 18. That list will be cut to three finalists and will be announced on Thursday, Nov. 9. The winner will be announced in December in Orlando, Fla.

CRUMMEY EARNS A NUMBER OF PRESEASON ACCOLADES...

Offensive guard **Andrew Crummey** was named to the 2007 ESPN.com Preseason All-America football team in early August, adding another accolade to his impressive list of summer honors. The senior was selected as a second team All-American by *The Sporting News*, as well as first team All-ACC by *Athlon*, *Blue Ribbon Yearbook*, *Lindy's*, *The Sporting News* and *Street and Smith's*. Six ACC players were selected to the 25-man team, the most of any conference. Crummey was joined by Wake Forest center Steve Justice and place-kicker Sam Swank, Boston College cornerback DeJuan Tribble, Miami safety Kenny Phillips and Georgia Tech punter Durant Brooks. A two-year starter at right guard, Crummey helped pave the way for running backs **Lance Ball** and **Keon Lattimore** to rush for more than 700 yards each last season. The offensive line as a whole allowed only 19 sacks, the second fewest in the ACC, and Crummey was named to the All-ACC second team. He has 33 career starts, most on the team, and has proven to be a durable and dependable lineman, missing only one start in his last 29 games. As a freshman, he played in 10 games, starting five, and was named a second team Freshman All-American by *The Sporting News*.

CRUMMEY ADDED TO LOMBARDI AND OUTLAND WATCH LISTS...

Senior guard **Andrew Crummey** was one of 60 players added to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List on Friday, Aug. 24 and one of a handful placed on the Outland Trophy watch list at the end of August. The 38th annual Rotary Lombardi Award, presented by Wachovia, honoring the top lineman in college football and benefiting the American Cancer Society, will be presented in Houston on Dec. 5. The new players were added to the preliminary watch list announced in March based on various preseason honors. There are now 103 players on the watch list. The Outland Trophy has been awarded to the best interior lineman in college football since 1946. The winner is selected by the FWAA's All-America Committee, which chooses the association's 25-man All-America team and picks the three Outland Trophy finalists. The winner will be announced on Dec. 6 in Orlando, Fla., on the ESPN Home Depot College Football Awards Show.

HEYWARD-BEY PLACED ON BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST...

Sophomore **Darrius Heyward-Bey** was named to the preseason watch list for the 2007 Fred Biletnikoff Award on Friday, Aug. 31 in an announcement by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation. The Biletnikoff Award is bestowed upon the best wide receiver in college football and is named after the NFL Hall of Famer who is considered to be among the greatest to have played the position. Heyward-

Bey is one of 30 student-athletes on the watch list, including four from the ACC. Greg Carr of Florida State, James Johnson of Georgia Tech and Lance Leggett of Miami join Heyward-Bey on the list. The selection committee votes on the award toward the end of the college football season with the winner announced in December. Georgia Tech's Calvin Johnson won the 2007 Biletnikoff Award. Heyward-Bey earned freshman All-America and All-ACC honors last season, and led the Terps with 45 receptions for 694 yards. A preseason All-ACC selection this season by *Athlon's*, *Lindy's*, and *The Sporting News*, the sophomore is the second-leading returning receiver in the ACC.

BALL ON DOAK WALKER WATCH LIST...

Senior running back **Lance Ball** was named to the preseason watch list for the 2007 Doak Walker Award on Tuesday, Aug. 28 in an announcement by the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum. The Doak Walker Award, named for the former SMU back, is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate running back. This year's field includes 2006 recipient Darren McFadden of Arkansas. For Ball it's his second-straight appearance on the watch list after being tapped prior to last season. The fifth-year back has led the team in rushing the last two seasons, compiling over 1,700 yards in that span. Ball, a native of Teaneck, N.J., was an All-ACC honoree as a sophomore and ranks ninth on the school's career rushing yards list and 13th on the career TDs chart (16). He is the fifth-leading returning rusher in the ACC (62.7 yards per game in 2006). Ball is one of 51 student-athletes on the watch list, including six from the Atlantic Coast Conference. Toney Baker and Andre Brown of NC State, James Davis and C.J. Spiller of Clemson, and Javarris James of Miami join Ball on the list. The Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors will select the semifinalists on November 12, and the Doak Walker Award National Selection Committee will cast votes to determine the finalists to be announced on November 19. The committee will cast a second vote beginning on November 26 to determine the recipient. The recipient of the 2007 Doak Walker Award will be announced live on ESPN along with other NCFCA member awards on The Home Depot College Football Awards on Thursday, December 6.

LB UNIT: HOME OF THE HARDWARE...

Three of the last six years, the Atlantic Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year has been a Maryland linebacker. Last season the Terps had to replace the 2005 honoree after losing the eventual NFL second-round pick D'Owell Jackson. Focus this season will be on junior **Erin Henderson**, who had a number of preseason accolades after a standout 2006 campaign. Henderson, who mans the Will linebacker slot, finished second in the ACC in tackles last season. Henderson, younger brother

of former All-American E.J., was a second-team All-ACC choice in 2006. Erin was on the 2007 Playboy Preseason All-America team and is on the watch lists for the Nagurski Trophy (top defender in the nation), Bednarik Award (top defensive player in the nation) and Butkus Award (top linebacker in the country). E.J. was the league's defensive player of the year in 2001 and 2002 and Jackson (2005) earned their hardware while also garnering national award attention.

PROTECTING THE HOUSE...

- The Terrapins are 31-9 at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium under **Ralph Friedgen**. Maryland was 5-1 at home last season.
- The Terps finished the 2003 season with a perfect 6-0 record at home, marking the second time in three years that the team had finished its home slate unblemished.
- In 114 previous seasons of football, Maryland has finished undefeated at home 19 times. Just eight of those occasions, however, have come since 1950 (when Byrd Stadium opened) and just three times has it happened since 1975 ('76, 2001 and '03).
- The Terrapins' 6-0 mark in 2003 was a tie for the second-best record at home in school history. The 1976 team was also 6-0, only to be trumped by the 2001 team which won all of its games on a seven-game home slate.

MORE ON CHEVY CHASE BANK FIELD AT BYRD STADIUM...

- Now in its 58th year of operation, Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium continues to serve as the home of the Terps. Opened on Sept. 30, 1950, and constructed for a sum of \$1 million, Byrd was named after Dr. H.C. "Curley" Byrd, a multi-sport star at Maryland who later became the school's head football coach and ultimately its president.
- The Terrapins are 187-108-1 within the friendly confines of Byrd. With the temporary bleachers, Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium can hold up to 51,500.
- The crowd of 53,107 vs. West Virginia (Sept. 13) was the fifth largest all-time at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium. Four of the top 14 crowds at Byrd Stadium have watched Maryland play West Virginia, including the last three times the Mountaineers have visited College Park. (2007, 2005, and 2003).

BYRD TO GET A FACELIFT...

Maryland is in the design phase of a \$50.8 million expansion of Tyser Tower. The new facility will include suites, new areas for working media and new booths for radio and television. Construction is scheduled to begin in phases immediately after the end of the 2007 season with the goal of opening prior to the 2009 season. Phase One includes the expansion of Tyser Tower which includes the addition of 64 suites, mezzanine seating for 500, new work area for television, radio and print media, new work area for coaches and gameday staff, a new merchandise outlet, enhanced seating for disabled customers and a new state-of-the-art video scoreboard. Phase Two will include installation of railings in the north and south lower bowl, chairback seating in the 200 level on the north side and additional restrooms and concessions on the south side. The playing field will be lowered to improve site lines in the first 10 rows and converting those 3,000 seats into some of the best in the stadium.

TERRAPIN SPORTS RADIO NETWORK ADDS TWO AFFILIATES...

The University of Maryland Athletics Department and Terrapin Sports Marketing announced Friday, Aug. 31 that WEMD 1460 AM, based in Easton, Md. and WPTX 1690 AM in Lexington Park, Md., were added as new affiliates on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network. WEMD provides coverage from Annapolis, Md. to Cambridge, Md., while WPTX will cover southern Maryland. The Terrapin Sports Radio Network now features 10 affiliates, including LIVE 105.7 FM (WHFS) in Baltimore (Flagship), ESPN Radio 1300 AM (WJFK) in Baltimore (Flagship), WJFK 106.7 FM in Washington D.C., WTBO AM 1450 in Cumberland, Md., WFMD AM 930 in Frederick, Md., WARK AM 1490 in Hagerstown, Md., WMSG AM 1050 in Oakland, Md. and WQMR FM 101.1 in Ocean City, Md.

'TERRAPINS RISING' GOES BEHIND THE SCENES WITH MARYLAND FOOTBALL...

'Terrapins Rising,' a reality television show chronicling spring practice, gave fans a behind-the-scenes look at the inner workings of a major college football program, the first show of its kind. The 10-episode series, which was being presented by Under Armour, began on Monday, June 25 and aired weekly each Monday on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic. Footage for the show was shot throughout the five weeks of spring practice, which concluded on April 28 with the annual Red-White Game. 'Terrapins Rising' was the result of a partnership between Maryland Athletics, Under Armour and Atkinson Productions. A film crew, led by former University of Maryland and Washington Redskins place-kicker Jess Atkinson, followed the team. The crew also sat in on team and positional meetings, as well as a number of off-the-field activities. "This isn't something that's been done at the college level," head coach **Ralph Friedgen** said of the reality show. "It's really ground-breaking. We think the show will give fans better insight into how much goes on day-to-day with the players and coaches." Atkinson, owner of Atkinson Productions, has worked with the university the past six years, producing Fridge TV and video segments for the school's athletics Web site, umterps.com. 'Fridge TV,' the Terps' weekly football television show, is broadcast during the regular season on Comcast SportsNet.

TERP ALLEY...

- In an effort to restore some tradition on gameday in College Park, the football staff created Terp Alley in 2001, a tradition that has become a part of the gameday experience outside Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium.
- For every football home game, the entire football team makes its first appearance of the day at "Terp Alley." The team is dropped off at the circle at the top of Field House Drive (between the football press box and Ludwig Field) approximately two hours before kickoff and is led past fans gathered along the street to the football complex by the Maryland band and cheerleaders.



- Ralph Friedgen is in his seventh year as Maryland's head football coach. He is the 33rd man to hold the post at the university and it is his first head coaching position.
- Friedgen's current record at Maryland -- which also serves as his career record -- stands at 53-26 (.671), including the first back-to-back-to-back 10-win seasons in school history (10-2 in 2001, 11-3 in 2002 and 10-3 in 2003).
- In his first four years at Maryland, Friedgen set the ACC record for wins (36) by a fourth-year head coach. He tied for second in the ACC in wins by a fifth-year coach.
- Friedgen is the second-most successful sixth-year coach in ACC history, with his 50-24 mark (through the end of 2006) eclipsing those of such former league mentors as Bobby Ross and Lou Holtz. Friedgen is currently 19th among all active coaches for Football Bowl Division (formerly Division I-A) victories.
- Under Friedgen, the Terps have posted a school-record three-straight bowl wins, culminating with last year's 24-7 triumph over Purdue in the Champs Sports Bowl. The Terps have out-scored their last three bowl opponents by a 95-17 margin.
- Four of the school's 13 nine-win seasons have come in Friedgen's first six years as head coach.
- Maryland posted a school record-tying 11-victory season in 2002, when the Terps won 10 of their last 11 games. Only the 1976 team won as many games.
- By winning 11 games in 2002, Friedgen became just the second coach in school history to do so (Jerry Claiborne, 1976) while becoming the first coach in Terrapin lore to win 10 games in three straight campaigns.
- Friedgen led the Terps to a top 20 final national ranking in both major national polls for three straight years (2001-03). Maryland ended 2003 ranked 17th in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press. In 2002, the Terps were ranked 13th in both polls and in 2001 the team finished 10th in the *ESPN/USA Today* poll and 11th in the AP standings. It was the program's best three-year ranking finish since 1974-76 (when the Terps finished 13th, 13th and eighth).
- He has led Maryland to bowl appearances in

four of his six seasons, including dominating wins in the 2004 Toyota Gator Bowl (41-7) and a 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (30-3) victory over perennial national power Tennessee (a team ranked fifth in the two major preseason polls). The Terrapins also earned a BCS Orange Bowl berth during the 2001 campaign.

- Friedgen has a 30-19 (.612) Atlantic Coast Conference record, including a 7-1 mark in 2001 when the Terps became the first team other than Florida State to win an outright ACC title since the Seminoles joined the league, and a 6-2 mark and runner-up finish in 2002.
- He has 31 wins in 40 games at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium, where the Terps averaged a school-record 52,426 fans in 2005.
- He led his 2001 team to just the fifth 10-win season in school history and its first ACC title since 1985.
- By winning the ACC title in '01, Friedgen became the first mentor in conference history to win the championship in his first year as a head coach. He also tied the mark of 10-2 set by Ken Hatfield (Clemson) in 1990, the best record ever by an ACC coach in his first season.
- Prior to his current stint in College Park, Friedgen served as Georgia Tech's offensive coordinator for nine of the previous 14 years.
- From 1998-2000, Friedgen orchestrated a Yellow Jacket offensive unit that averaged 36.7 points and 444 yards of total offense per game, while posting a cumulative record of 27-8 (.771).
- Friedgen was the offensive coordinator at Maryland under Bobby Ross when the Terps won three consecutive ACC titles in the mid-'80s.
- The 60-year-old Friedgen owns the rare distinction of coordinating the offense of a collegiate national champion (Georgia Tech in 1990) and a Super Bowl participant (the San Diego Chargers in 1994).
- In his first five years as a full-time coach at Maryland (1982-86), Friedgen was instrumental (along with QB coach Joe Krivak) in the development of future pro quarterbacks Boomer Esiason, Frank Reich and Stan Gelbaugh, all of whom spent at least a decade in the NFL.
- A 1970 graduate of Maryland who also earned his master's degree in College Park, Friedgen came to the school as a 190-pound former high school quarterback and finished his four years with two letters as an offensive guard and Academic All-ACC honors.
- A prep standout, Friedgen's coaching roots began under the tutelage of his father, Ralph, a high school coach for more than 30 years in upstate New York.

Maryland 31, Villanova 14

COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP) -- Keon Lattimore ran for 106 yards and three touchdowns, Jordan Steffy played exceptionally well in his first start as Maryland's quarterback, and the Terrapins wore down Villanova in a 31-14 victory.

Lattimore also caught six passes for 33 yards. The senior averaged 5 yards on his 21 carries and moved over 1,000 yards rushing for his career.

Steffy did a fine job running the offense, going 19-for-24 for 174 yards and running for 47 yards and a touchdown.

Up 10-7, the Terrapins opened the third quarter with an 11-play, 66-yard touchdown drive. Five plays after Steffy ran for 2 yards on a fourth-and-1 from the Villanova 42, Lattimore scored on a 14-yard run.

On Maryland's next possession, Steffy left with a leg cramp in the middle of a 57-yard touchdown drive that Lattimore concluded with an 18-yard run for a 24-7 lead.

Then, after a Maryland interception, Steffy moved the Terrapins 87 yards and scored on a 10-yard TD run with 12:46 left.

That ended a night Steffy had been waiting for since he arrived at Maryland as a freshman in 2004. Before facing the Wildcats, the redshirt junior had thrown only 37 passes and had gone two years since his last completion.

Steffy's play against Villanova belied his inexperience. First, he moved the Terrapins 46 yards for a field goal. Then he directed a 90-yard march in which he passed for 28 yards and ran for 22. The drive ended with Lattimore dragging two tacklers into the end zone on a 12-yard run.

The Wildcats then moved 84 yards on eight plays, closing to 10-7 on Antwon Young's first career touchdown pass, a 26-yarder to Matthew Sherry.

Young went 17-for-28 for 176 yards in his first college start. The Wildcats finished with 11 yards rushing on 22 carries.

Villanova got a touchdown with 54 seconds left when Salim Koroma picked off a Turner pass and took it 42 yards to the end zone.

MIAMI (AP) -- Keon Lattimore ran for 111 yards and two early touchdowns, and Maryland held off pesky Florida International 26-10 on Saturday night.

Jordan Steffy completed 18 of 25 passes for 135 yards and Lance Ball had a 1-yard scoring run with 53 seconds left to seal the win for Maryland, now 2-0 for the fourth time in Ralph Friedgen's seven seasons.

Moses Hinton caught a 49-yard TD pass from Wayne Younger for Florida International (0-2), losers of 14 straight games -- the second-longest current drought in major college football behind Duke.

FIU put a major scare into Maryland last season, losing 14-10 when the Terrapins intercepted a pass near the goal line on the game's final play. This one wasn't easy for the Terps, either -- who scored 10 fourth-quarter points off a pair of FIU turnovers.

Lattimore is the brother of Baltimore Ravens linebacker Ray Lewis, who starred at Miami before entering the NFL. Lattimore has fond memories of seeing Lewis play at the Orange Bowl, the Hurricanes' home field that FIU is using this season while its own stadium is remodeled. Now, he's got memories of his own.

Lattimore had a 42-yard run on Maryland's first play, and he scored from 1 yard out to make it 9-0. The scoring started with a safety on a botched FIU punt 26 seconds into the game.

FIU went three-and-out on its next possession and Lattimore came through again, this time with a 14-yard TD to make it 16-0 with 8:13 left in the quarter.

A big play helped FIU get back into the game. Off play-action, Younger found Hinton down the left sideline for the first score in Mario Cristobal's era as FIU coach.

FIU got within 16-10 early in the fourth on Chris Abed's 42-yard field goal. But Lionell Singleton fumbled a punt return away deep in FIU territory with 12:27 left, setting up Obi Egekeze's 36-yard field goal that restored Maryland's nine-point lead.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Keon Lattimore rushed for 80 yards and led Maryland receivers with four catches, leading the Terrapins' offense in a 31-14 defeat to No. 4 West Virginia Thursday night before 53,107 at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium.

The crowd was the fifth-largest in the history of the stadium.

Lattimore scored on a 4-yard run midway through the first quarter, marking his third straight game with a rushing touchdown.

Steve Slaton ran for 137 yards and three touchdowns and Noel Devine amassed 125 yards on his first three carries for the Mountaineers. The freshman finished with 136 on five carries, including a 76-yard run to set up one of Slaton's touchdowns.

Maryland fumbled the snap on the first play from scrimmage, giving WVU a short field at the 20-yard line. Two plays later, White scampered in from 22 yards for the touchdown.

The Terrapins responded immediately, though, going 75 yards in 11 plays to set up Lattimore's 4-yard run that tied the game at 7-7 with 9:53 left in the first quarter.

West Virginia scored 24 unanswered points over the next two periods, turning a 14-7 halftime lead into a 31-7 advantage. The Mountaineers took control by going 63 yards in nine plays with the second-half kickoff, setting up a 1-yard score by Slaton.

Maryland finished the scoring with 5:50 left when Steffy found Oquendo. The Terrapins recovered the onside kick, but were unable to move downfield.

Erin Henderson led the Maryland defense with 11 tackles, his second straight game with double figures on the defensive chart.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Josh Adams scored on a 6-yard run on the first possession of overtime to help Wake Forest cap a comeback and beat Maryland 31-24 on Saturday.

Alphonso Smith had a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown late in the third quarter to jumpstart the Demon Deacons (2-2, 1-1 Atlantic Coast Conference).

Riley Skinner - playing in his first game since separating his shoulder in the season opener - had a 1-yard TD sneak after Smith's return midway through the fourth, then found John Tereshinski with a 6-yard scoring pass to tie it with 3 seconds left in regulation.

Then, after Adams' score in overtime, the Terps were unable answer with a touchdown.

The Terrapins (2-2, 0-1) got 112 yards and a touchdown from Keon Lattimore, his third 100-yard game of the season, along with rushing scores from Lance Ball and Cory Jackson.

Ball added 56 yards on 14 carries and junior quarterback Jordan Steffy completed 11 of 20 passes for 115 yards. He completed passes to eight different receivers

Steffy's third-down pass for Ball at the goal line with Maryland leading 24-3 helped spark the comeback. Smith jumped in front of the route and raced the length of the field for the score.

Skinner completed 22 of 35 passes for 219 yards with three interceptions, but the redshirt sophomore came up huge down the stretch in directing the decisive scoring drives. Adams finished with 91 yards rushing.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (AP) - Backup quarterback Chris Turner led Maryland to 20 second-half points, Keon Lattimore rushed for 124 yards and a touchdown and the Terps ruined No. 10 Rutgers' second stay in the top 10 with a 34-24 victory.

For Maryland (3-2), it was redemption. The win ended Rutgers' 10-game home winning streak and snapped a two-game Terps losing streak that included a 31-24 overtime loss to Wake Forest last week.

Turner completed 14 of 20 passes for 149 yards in relief of Jordan Steffy, who left late in the first half with a concussion.

Maryland rallied despite losing a 14-3 advantage late in the first half and heading into halftime with Rutgers leading 17-14.

Turner led the rally that culminated in field goals of 26 and 37 yards from Obi Egekeze, a 2-yard TD run by Lattimore and a late 14-yard dash by Lance Ball, who rushed for 90 yards and two touchdowns.

Teel threw two touchdown passes and Ray Rice scored on a 1-yard run with 4:41 to go to cut the Maryland lead to 27-24. But the Terps defense held stout against a Scarlet Knights offense that was averaging 46 points. Rice was held to 97 yards rushing on 21 carries, including 38 yards on his last 15 attempts.

The victory over a top 10 team was the first for Maryland since upsetting Florida State in 2004. The Terps outgained the Scarlet Knights 458-392 while forcing three turnovers.

Turner, who took over after Steffy was hurt on the Terps' final series of the first half, got Maryland going early in the second half. A 28-yard pass to Isaiah Williams and a penalty for roughing the passer led to Egekeze's 26-yard field goal that tied the game at 17 midway through the third quarter.

Ball broke off a 32-yard run and Turner hit Darius Heyward-Bey for 18 to set up a go-ahead 37-yard field goal with 3:43 left in the third quarter.

Maryland's defense held Rutgers to one first down on its next two series, and Turner led Maryland on a 58-yard touchdown drive. Lattimore capped it with a 2-yard run one play after LaQuan Williams stretched out to making a diving third-down catch of a 27-yard pass.
