DAVE COTTLE DIRECTOR

HEAD LACROSSE COACH AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, HE LED THE TERPS TO BACK TO BACK ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS IN 2004 AND 2005. THE TERPS FINISHED THEIR 2008 SEASON RANKED 4TH IN THE COUNTRY. THIRD WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN THE NCAA-2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR-1988 USILA COACH OF THE YEAR. HE WAS ALSO THE ASSISTANT COACH FOR TEAM USA WHICH WON THE 1994 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP. AT SALISBURY STATE COTTLE EARNED ALL-AMERICAN HONORS WHILE BEING THE SECOND PLAYER IN LACROSSE HISTORY TO SCORE OVER 100 POINTS IN A SINGLE SEASON.

ASSISTANT COACH AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND. HAS THIRTY-THREE YEARS OF COACHING EXPERIENCE ON THE DIVISION I LEVEL (AT ARMY AND MARYLAND) AND HAS BEEN FEATURED ON THE COVER OF INSIDE LACROSSE. DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR FOR NINE FINAL FOURS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND. A 1974 GRADUATE OF JOHNS HOPKINS, SLAFKOSKY LED THE BLUE JAYS TO A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HIS SENIOR YEAR AS A MIDFIELDER. HE COORDINATES ON-FIELD SESSIONS AND ACTIVITIES.

RYAN MORAN

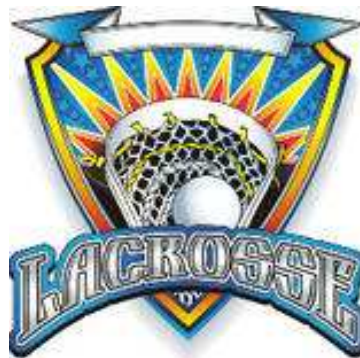

TRANSPORTATION

WE WILL PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION FROM BALTIMORE-WASHINGTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT BEFORE AND AFTER CAMP AT A COST OF \$35 PER CAMPER. ON THE FIRST DAY OF CAMP, TRANSPORTATIONS WILL LEAVE BWI WITH ENOUGH TIME TO ALLOW YOUR SON TO CHECK-IN TO CAMP AND HAVE A CHANCE TO SETTLE INTO HIS ROOM BEFORE THE FIRST SESSION THAT AFTERNOON. ON THE LAST DAY OF CAMP, TRANSPORTATION TO BWI WILL LEAVE AT 3:00PM. PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THESE TIMES AS YOU MAKE TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS AND PROVIDE US WITH THE FLIGHT/TRAIN INFORMATION AT LEAST TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO THE START OF CAMP.

HOUSING

3. ALL CAMPERS WHO ENROLL WILL BE REQUIRED TO ATTEND ALL SESSIONS AND COMPLY WITH ALL THE RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CONDUCT OF THE CAMP PARTICIPANTS. ANY VIOLATION OR ABUSE OF THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL FROM CAMP WITHOUT A REFUND.
