HEAD COACH DAVID DURDEN

SECOND SEASON AT MARYLAND • UC-IRVINE '98



David Durden is entering his second season as head coach for the Maryland men's and women's swimming programs. He was hired as head coach on August 18, 2005. During the 2005-06 season, he led the women's team to a 7-5 overall record, 4-4 ACC record, and fifth place finish at the ACC Championships where one woman, senior Sasha Malanina (Volgograd, Russia), was an ACC Champion in the 400-IM. Last year, he coached '06 graduate Krisztina Kovacs (Budapest, Hungary) and senior Sasha Malanina, who were both named All-American Honorable Mentions at the 2006 NCAA Championships. He also coached the 2005-06 Maryland men's team to an eighth place finish at the 2006 ACC Championships.

"Having an opportunity to get my first head coaching job at one of the top spots in the Atlantic Coast Conference is great," said Durden.

Before Maryland, Durden spent five seasons at Auburn University. During his last season at Auburn, he was the assistant head men's coach for the 2005 NCAA National Championship Team. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach for both the men's and women's programs at Auburn. "We feel that we've found an outstanding coach who knows what it takes to establish and lead a winning program," said Associate Athletics Director Troy Tucker. "He shares our values related to the balance between athletics, academics and student-athlete welfare."

In his time at Auburn, the Tiger men's and women's teams won six National Team Championships - the men winning in 2003, 2004 and 2005, and the women winning in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Auburn women finished second at the NCAA Nationals in 2005.

Durden has also spent time at Auburn as the primary coach for a number of world-class, postgraduate swimmers who were preparing for World Championship and World University Games teams. He was the primary coach for multiple World Record Holders and NCAA Record Holders as well as the men's recruiting coordinator.

In 2004, Durden coached three swimmers who represented the United States at the Olympic Games. Durden served as the head coach for the Panama team at the 2004 Olympic Games and the 2003 Pan-American Games.

He is a NCAA Division I Certified Coach, a member of U.S. Swimming and a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association. For the past five years, he has been involved with the swim camps at Auburn, serving as the director last season.

Before coaching at Auburn, Durden served as an assistant for Irvine Novaquatics and Dr. Dave Salo, where he assisted in general coaching with the Olympic Trials Group and helped place four swimmers on the 2000 U.S. Olympic Team.

Durden is a 1998 graduate of the University of California-Irvine and earned a degree in electrical engineering.

He married the former Cathy Sursi in May of 2006. The couple resides in Crofton, Md.

Casey Moore joins the Maryland swimming and diving coaching staff for the 2006-07 Season as the head coach of the diving program.

Moore has coached since she was sixteen years old. She was the head coach for nine years at Crofton Swim and Tennis Club. She also coached at Calvert Hall College High School in Towson, Maryland, for one year and at American University for two seasons.

Moore has traveled throughout the United States and Japan doing themed high dive shows with Watershow Productions, Inc.

Moore dove for the University of Delaware in 1996 and briefly at Maryland in 1997. While at Maryland, she actively participated in Gymkana for four years and served as president of Gymkana in 2000.

Last year, Moore taught biology and forensics at Loch Raven High School in Towson, Maryland. Currently, she works for Varsity Group, an educational solutions company in Dupont Circle, Washington DC. She also competes in triathlons with a team called Team Z, out of Arlington, Virginia.



DEMERAE CHRISTIANSON
ASSISTANT COACH
FIRST SEASON
AUBURN '04

Demerae Christianson joined the coaching staff of the Maryland swimming and diving program in the summer of 2006.

A 2004 graduate of Auburn, Christianson joined the Terps after a year as an assistant coach at her alma mater, where she helped lead the Tigers to their fourth NCAA title.

Christianson was a part of three of Auburn's four championship teams. The Tigers won three straight NCAA titles from 2002-2004. A 15-time All-American, Christianson won gold in the 100 fly at the 2003 World University Games in Korea. She was named team captain for the 2005 World University Games in Turkey. There, she won gold in the 4x100 medley relay and bronze in the 100 fly. In 2004, she placed third in the Olympic trials.

A native of Gillette, Wyoming, Christianson says that she is "excited to be at Maryland working with Coach Durden."



KEVIN CLEMENTS
ASSISTANT COACH
SECOND SEASON
AUBURN '02

Kevin Clements was hired as Maryland's assistant coach for the men's and women's swimming programs in 2005; he is entering his second season as assistant coach for Maryland.

Clements joined the Terps after a head coaching position for the Roland Run Stingrays and Mariners Swim Club.

Clements completed a successful career at Auburn in 2002; he was part of three SEC championships and the 1999 National Championship. He set three Auburn school records in the 400 IM, 500 free and 1650 free. Clements also swam to five SEC conference records and swam to 11 NCAA All-American Honors. Clements finished third in the 200 IM, fourth in the 400 IM, and fifth in the 400-free at the 2000 Olympic Trials, and he finished fifth in the 200 IM at the 2004 Olympic Trials.

After a successful career at Auburn, Clements swam professionally for Speedo and was coached by Bob Bowman at North Baltimore Aquatic Club. During his time in Baltimore, Clements became the second-fastest American ever in the 200 IM and in 2004 was the National Champion in the 400 IM.

Clements married the former Jaqi Philipps in June of 2006.



JAROD SCHROEDER
ASSISTANT COACH
FIRST SEASON
NORTHERN ILLINOIS '95

Jarod Schroeder joined the Maryland staff as an assistant coach for the men's and women's swimming and diving teams during the summer of 2006.

A 1995 graduate of Northern Illinois University, Schroeder was an assistant coach for the Northwestern swimming and diving program starting in 2000. As a coach of that perennial top-25 program, he mentored Olympic Trials qualifiers, NCAA qualifiers, and U.S. National Finalists.

In addition, Schroeder served as the head coach of the New Trier Swim Club in Winnetka, Illinois since 2002. While at New Trier, he developed Olympic Trials qualifiers, U.S. Open finalists, and U.S. National finalists.

After finishing a career at NIU in which he served as team captain and was a 2-time Illinois Collegiate Swimmer of the Year, Schroeder took on volunteer assistant coaching jobs at his alma mater and the University of Wisconsin.

Schroeder, elected to the NIU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006, carried impressive stats during his swimming career. He was co-captain of the 1999 Pan-American Games team, where he was a double silver medalist. The previous year, he had participated in the 1998 Goodwill Games. While at NIU, he was three times named the Mid-America Conference Swimmer of the Year, earning seven individual conference titles and three Conference records.

"I'm really excited to become a part of Maryland Swimming," says Schroeder. "We have a young staff with a lot of National Team experience. It will be fun to work with Dave to bring Maryland Swimming and Diving to national prominence."

Schroeder was married to Liz Haag in August of 2005.
