### TRACKING THE TERPS

- After suffering a home loss to Virginia earlier this season, the Terps swept the Cavs in three straight sets on Nov. 5.
- Head Coach **Tim Horsmon** earned his 250th career win with the sweep of Georgetown during the Maryland Invitational on Sept. 4.
- With the win on Friday, Maryland now has eight conference wins this season. In 2009, the Terps finished at 6-14 within the ACC.
- Against Virginia Tech, junior **Maddi Lee** led the Terps with 11 kills on .409 hitting. Lee also added one solo block and two block assists.
- Sophomore **Kara Bates** continued her late-season surge by leading Maryland with 20 total kills on the weekend (13 @ UVA, 7 @ VT).
- Senior **Brittney Grove** chipped in a .429 attack percentage against the Cavaliers. Grove knocked in 10 kills and trailed only fellow senior **Bethany Springer's** 17 for most digs with 16.
- Junior **Lisa Scott** led Maryland with a .500 attack percentage against Virginia, with nine kills on 14 total attacks. The Langley, Va. native also recorded four block assists.
- Following Maryland's final home series of the season, the Terps will travel to the sunshine state to take on Florida State and Miami on Nov. 19 and 21, respectively. Maryland will close out the 2010 regular season at Boston College on Nov. 24.

**All-time Series History:** Maryland owns an all-time 46-55 record against the Demon Deacons and Blue Devils. Versus Wake Forest, the Terps are 22-16, having won on the road earlier this season. Against Duke, Maryland is 24-39 all-time. The Terps narrowly lost on the road in five sets to Duke earlier this year.

## LAST TIME OUT

- Maryland lose on the road to the Virginia Tech Hokies, 3-1.
- Maddi Lee led the Terrapin offense with 11 kills on a .409 attack percentage.
- Lisa Scott recorded five total blocks (1 BS, 4 BA) to lead Maryland's defense at the net.

## TRACKING THE TERPS

- Maryland's 17-10 start is the best under head coach Tim Horsmon. They are also currently 10-3 at home in College Park.
- The Terps are tops in the conference in service aces averaging 1.43 aces per set. Freshman Sarah Harper ranks tied for sixth in the ACC with 0.29 aces per set and 29 total.
- Following this weekend's final home series against Wake Forest and Duke, Maryland will head out for a pair of games against Florida State and Miami before closing the regular season at Boston College.
- Maryland was predicted to finish ninth in the Atlantic Coast Conference coaches preseason poll, ahead of Wake Forest, N.C. State and Boston College.

## WATCH LIST

- Junior Lisa Scott already ranks 6th in school history with 66 block solos and is on pace to threaten the school's all-time mark of 97. Kelly Malins and Kelli Myers are tied for No. 5 with 83. Scott leads the Terps in attack percentage with a .346 mark, which ranks seventh in the ACC.
- Mary Cushman currently leads the team in kills (295) and is third in attack percentage (.252). To break into the top-10 single-season kill record, Cushman needs 419.
- Sophomore Remy McBain leads all Terrapins with 1,001 assists. She ranks seventh in the ACC with 10.01 assists per set.

## SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

- After moving back above .500 in ACC play with a 3-0 sweep at NC State, the Demon Deacons lost at North Carolina, 3-1 before sweeping North Carolina Central on Nov. 9.
- Since losing at Florida State on Oct. 24, the Blue Devils are on a four-game ACC winning streak, having swept their last three opponents, Georgia Tech, NC State and North Carolina.

## MILESTONE MAKER

- Head Coach Tim Horsmon earned his 250th career win with a 3-0 sweep of Georgetown on Sunday, Sept. 4, 2010 during the Spring Hill Suites at Arundel Mills Maryland Invitational.

## OFF TO A GREAT START

- Maryland's eight-matches winning streak was the longest streak since 2005. The Terps' 17-10 start is also the program's best under third-year head coach Tim Horsmon.

## TERPS IN TOURNAMENTS

- Freshman Sarah Harper was named to the Villanova Classic All-Tournament team for her combined 32 digs over three games.
- Junior Lisa Scott was named the MVP of the Terrapin Invitational and was accompanied by senior Michelle Kenning and sophomore Remy McBain on the All-Tournament team.
- Senior Brittney Grove was named tournament MVP and sophomore Remy McBain and freshman Mary Cushman joined Grove on the All-Tournament team at the Maryland Invite.
- Senior Bethany Springer and freshman Mary Cushman earned All-Tournament team honors at the Tiger Invitational in Columbia, Mo. Springer finished with 41 digs while Cushman led in total attacks (79) and kills (39).

## MCTRIPLE-DOUBLE

- Sophomore Remy McBain recorded her first career triple-double against Duke with 40 assists, 18 digs and 10 kills.
- McBain nearly recorded a second career triple-double against Clemson, when she tallied 42 assists, 11 digs and nine kills.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

- Her performance against Clemson also gave McBain her tenth career double-double and eight in 2010.
- She earned her first double-double of the season vs. Nevada at the Tiger Invitational. The Leonia, N.J., native dished out a season-high 41 assists and grabbed 12 digs during the first match of the Tiger Invitational.

## FIRST-YEAR PHENOMS

- Mary Cushman and Sarah Harper both started in the Terrapins season opener against Missouri. Harper came out of the weekend with 32 digs and Cushman has a .267 attack percentage with 640 total attacks and 257 kills.

## HORSMON ADDS TO COACHING STAFF

- Head Coach Time Horsmon added Mitch Kallick as an assistant coach and Krista Valdivia as a volunteer assistant coach in early 2010.
- Kallick comes to College Park from Cal-Fullerton. He spent two seasons on the Titan coaching staff and served as the program's primary recruiting coordinator. On the court, Kallick was responsible for working with the outside hitters and defensive specialists.
- Valdivia, who was an All-American setter for Michigan Tech from 1993-96, has 12 years of coaching experience, 10 as a head coach at Michigan Tech. She led the team to two NCAA appearances and coached 20 All-conference players.

## CUSHMAN NAMED ALL-AMERICAN & NEW YORK POY

- Mary Cushman, a six-foot outside hitter from Rochester, N.Y., was recently named the Gatorade New York Player of the Year for the second straight season. She was also named to the 2009-10 Under Armour Girls High School Second-Team All-America by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).
- Cushman broke her own school record for kills with 351 this past season, leading the Eagles (34-2-1) to the sectional finals. She also compiled 171 digs, 56 service aces and 52 blocks. Cushman is a three-time Monroe County Player of the Year and three-time Section V Class AA MVP, and holds school career records for kills, digs and service aces.
- The New York native is one of the most highly-rated signees in Maryland history, coming in at No. 56 in the nation by prepvolleyball.com.

## TERPS WELCOME FOUR FRESH FACES

- Maryland rejuvenates their roster with four fresh faces this fall with: Carlisle Abele (Birmingham, Ala.), Mary Cushman (Rochester, N.Y.), Sarah Harper (Charlottesville, Va.) and Caroline Niski (St. Charles, Ill.).
- Abele played in the 2009 Alabama All-Star Volleyball Game as a part of the North Alabama squad, and went on to defeat the South Alabama team. She helped lead her high school team to become area champions in 2007. Abele holds records at Mountain Brook High School in kills (1,236) and aces (224).
- Cushman is a top-100 recruit. She became a two-time New York State Gatorade Player of the Year (2009, 2010) and was the first athlete from West Irondequoit to be chosen for the award. Cushman was also named a 2010 Under Armour Second Team High School All-American (volleyball).
- Harper was a two-time First Team All-State (2008, 2009), Region II Player of the Year (2008), two-time First Team All-Region II (2007, 2008) and three-time First Team All-District (2007, 2008, 2009).
- Niski helped lead her team to state title in 2008, earning MVP honors. She was also a three-time All-Conference selection (2007, 2008, 2009), including unanimous selection in 2009.

# 2010 Maryland Volleyball

## HEAD COACH TIM HORSMON



Tim Horsmon became only the third coach in Maryland volleyball history in February 2008, coming to College Park, Md. after five extremely successful seasons at the University of Dayton.

Horsmon's collegiate career ranks among the greatest starts in NCAA history. In nine years as a Division I head coach, his teams have earned eight trips to the NCAA Tournament, eight conference championships (including a 17-1 record in conference tournament play), and a tremendous 231-119 overall record. His teams amassed an amazing 93-10 record (.903) in conference regular-season matches at both Dayton and Robert Morris.

From 2003 through 2007, Horsmon led the University of Dayton to unprecedented success. In five seasons, his teams won four Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament Championships (2003, 2004, 2005, 2007) and earned four NCAA Tournament berths (2003, 2004, 2005, 2007) -- the first conference championships and NCAA berths in program history.

His 2007 team finished with a 33-2 overall record, a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance and a ranking in the CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, reaching as high as 12th during the season. Horsmon was named the 2007 American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year and the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year.

At Dayton, Horsmon coached four consecutive A-10 Players of the Year (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006), back-to-back Atlantic 10 Setters of the Year

(2005, 2006), two A-10 Rookies of the Year (2003, 2007), four A-10 Most Outstanding Players of the Year (2003, 2004, 2005, 2007) and eight AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans.

From 1999 through 2002, Horsmon served as head coach of Robert Morris University in Pittsburgh. Almost immediately, he turned around a program coming off five consecutive losing campaigns. In four seasons, Horsmon guided the Colonials to three Northeast Conference regular-season championships (1999, 2001, 2002), four Northeast Conference Tournament championships (1999, 2000, 2001, 2002) and four straight NCAA Tournament appearances. His record in conference play was a dominant 42-2. Horsmon earned Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1999 and 2002.

In addition to his collegiate experience, Horsmon served as head coach of the Adidas Penn Juniors 18-year-old Elite team and the Southern Maryland Juniors - both club Junior Olympic teams. The Adidas Penn Juniors were regionally ranked on the east coast. The Southern Maryland Juniors were ranked No. 1 in the Chesapeake Region in 1999.

Horsmon, a Maryland native, began his career in 1996 as head coach at Calvert High School in Prince Frederick, Md. In three seasons, he amassed a 60-5 record and won the Class 3A Maryland State Championship and a regional title in 1998. That year, Horsmon was named Washington Post Coach of the Year.

Horsmon holds a bachelor of science from Frostburg State University (1991) and a teaching certificate from Salisbury State University (1993). He is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association and serves as a poll voter for the USA Today/AVCA Top 25.
