Interim Head Coach Meredith Smith

First year as UMES Head Coach (4th Overall at school)

Maryland State College (now UMES) '64

Interim Head Coach Meredith Smith thinks he has a "great opportunity."

While his appointment is that of Interim Head Coach, he doesn't see it as a problem at all.

"A lot of people see [Interim] as a negative, but the title gave me a chance to keep going, and keep coaching, I think the success we can have this season will give me an opportunity to keep the job on a permanent basis," Smith said.

Smith is in his first season Interim Head Men's Basketball Coach with the Hawks. Previously, Smith served as the top assistant coach to former head man Larry Lessett. He returned to his alma mater after accumulating almost 30 years of high school coaching experience. Smith graduated from UMES, then Maryland State College, in 1964.

Smith became head coach men's basketball coach at Southern High School in Baltimore City in 1978 and held that position for 24 seasons. During that time he compiled a win-loss record of 414-145, giving him the second most victories in Baltimore City Public School history. Smith won 25 playoff games, including three Maryland State Championships, two Maryland Scholastic Association Conference Championships and a Baltimore City Championship in 1999-2000.

In 1993 the Baltimore Sun named Smith their "Coach of the Year." He holds a Bachelor's degree in Secondary and Physical Education from UMES received a Master's degree from Coppin State University in 1975.

The Hawks totaled only 13 wins in the years of Larry Lessett and when he left at the end of last season the University wanted an alumnus to take a shot at rebuilding the program. Anxious to keep some continuity and to not get behind in recruiting and player development, they named Smith the Interim Head Coach with plans to start a search in January. A search they expect Smith to be a part of.

"Coach Smith has accepted this position; one I believe that is not an easy position to hold, because he is an alumnus of this University and wants what is best for this school," said Director of Athletics Keith Davidson. "Coach Smith taking on this responsibility allows us to properly conduct a search."

"This is a great challenge," said Smith. "However, I believe it is a greater opportunity. This is my alma mater, I have a great love for this University and I will fill the role they need me to fill. I hope I can give the University something it has been missing for almost 30 years."

"My intent is to bring focus and intensity that hasn't been seen. I built a program at the high school level and created a paradigm that I will apply to this situation. The great challenges of overcoming [the stigma of last three seasons] are not lost to me. But perceptions change when enough wins are produced. Intensity and focus bring wins. Winning and losing transcends Xs & Os, the culture around the program has to change. I bring a different philosophical and practical approach to the game," Smith added.

Asst. Coach Michael Farrare

Michael Farrare enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Hawks men's basketball team. Farrare came to UMES in the fall of 2006 after serving as the head junior varsity basketball coach at Bennett High School in Salisbury, Md., for eight years. He was also the assistant varsity basketball coach, assistant varsity football coach and assistant track and field coach there.

Farrare is well known in athletic circles on the Eastern Shore, having been heavily involved in local AAU programs and coaching at the junior varsity and varsity levels in nearby Wicomico County, Md.

A native of Salisbury, Md., Farrare is a 1981 graduate of UMES with a bachelor's degree in Sociology. He received his master's degree in Applied Social Science from Sojourner-Douglass College in May 2007.

Asst. Coach Shawn Smith

The latest addition to the Hawk's staff is Shawn Smith. No relation to Meredith Smith, Shawn Smith comes out of the Philadelphia area where he played at LaSalle University, starting at point guard for three seasons. He averaged a combined 10 points per game and six assists while tallying about two steals per game. Prior to his college career Shawn Smith played at Simon Gratz High School, winning a National Championship in both 1991 and 1993 playing with future NBA star Rasheed Wallace.

No stranger to the camp circuit and AAU programs in Philadelphia, Shawn Smith brings with him a positive attitude and winning mindset. "I am very excited to be here," he said. "I bring a winning tradition to UMES. I want to keep building young people into men and help increase our strengths and improve our weaknesses."

Shawn Smith served most recently as a special education teacher while serving as a counselor and director at several basketball clinics and camps. He was the Head Coach at Rines Basketball Academy before leaving for UMES.

"I want to be able to compete in the conference," he stated. "I want to help Coach [Meredith] Smith build a program and a winning tradition here."

Shawn Smith has three children, Nyseem (12), Aaliyah (6) and Takiar (2).

Asst. Coach Kirkland Hall

The latest addition to the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) men's basketball staff is a familiar one in Kirkland Hall, who was previously the head coach of the Hawks from 1977 through 1985.

During that time period, Hall accumulated the third most wins (79) in UMES men's basketball history. He accomplished that feat without having a single player on scholarship, and finished with a 79-131 overall record.

Prior to joining the UMES coaching staff, Hall served as Director of Facilities and still serves as an Assistant Professor in the Exercise Science Department. He also served as Interim Athletics Director for five years at UMES.

Hall is no stranger to the coaching ranks as he was previously the head softball and baseball coach for UMES over a 19 year period. He finished his coaching career in both sports with the most wins in UMES history.

Hall also spent two years at Fayetteville State University as an assistant basketball and football coach.

A two-sport athlete in baseball and basketball while at UMES, Hall was the first athlete from the university inducted into the MEAC Hall of Fame.

A native of Oakville, Md., Hall is a 1973 graduate of UMES with a bachelor's degree in Physical Education. He obtained a master's degree in Physical Education Administration from Ohio State University in 1974. Currently, he is working towards a Ph.D. in Organizational Leadership from UMES.

Hall currently resides in Eden, Md. with his wife Betty. Together they raised 10 children and have 19 grandchildren. They recently adopted a son, Damon.

Last Time Out

The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) overcame a second half rally by Kennesaw State University (KSU) to end their eight-game losing streak with a 77-72 win on Tuesday night at the William P. Hytche Athletic Center.

"It feels great to get this win," said Interim Head Coach Meredith Smith. "I think the kids are just now fully recovered from the grueling road trip earlier this year. I think we played well at Old Dominion but we didn't get the inside play from [Popovic] and I think tonight we did get that. He had 17 rebounds and Marc Davis added 30 points, which were the keys to the win."

UMES (2-9, 0-1 MEAC) seemed poised to runaway with the game after taking their largest lead of the night, 55-38, on a Davis jumper with 11:33 left in the game but the Owls would use three-point shooting led by Ronnell Wooten who finished 6-of-18, including five in the second half, to battle back.

KSU (2-6) would cut the lead to single digits after Wooten converted on three free-throws. He followed with a three-pointer the next trip down the court to make it 59-53 with 6:07 remaining. After exchanging points over the next three and half minutes, the Hawks would take a 66-57 lead on a Davis lay-in with 2:45 left in the game. However, the Owls would respond with a Shuan Stegall three-pointer that would spark an eight-to-two run that cut the lead to three with just over two remaining. That was the closest the Owls would come however, as the Hawks made nine free-throws, including eight from freshman point guard Marc Davis to clinch the win. Davis finished 13-of-20 from the line and led all scorers with a career-high 30 points, while adding five rebounds and four assists.

"We wanted to run and get on the break," said Davis. "We felt like we were quicker than them and we could penetrate and hit shots or at least get to the line a lot, but I certainly didn't expect to get to the line 20 times."

The Hawks did just that as they went to the line 16 more times than the Owls, 43-27, and also ended their 17 game drought of being out rebounded as they held a 46-40 advantage on the boards thanks to Aleksandar Popovic who finished with a career-high 17 rebounds to go along with seven points and two blocks. UMES could not have picked a better time to finish with their highest shooting percentage of the season (.460) as they came out red-hot in the first half making 16-of-30 (53.3 percent) to build a 42-29 halftime lead, while the defense did its part holding KSU to an opponent season low from the field (.313). Ed Tyson was nearly unstoppable in the first half, scoring 17 points to lead the way. He finished with 25 points on 9-of-20 (45 percent) shooting and also had a game-high three steals. BJ Nimocks added 10 points and eight rebounds off the bench.

The Owls were led by Wooten who finished with 26 points and four rebounds. Stegall added 19 points, six rebounds, and a game-high six assists. Keonte Keith chipped in with 10 points, while Tanner Jacobs grabbed a team-high 12 rebounds.

"I think this game gives us a lot of positives to build on," said Smith. "We know Davis can score under pressure and [Popovic] can play well inside and rebound. Getting a lot of big teams out of the way, we feel battle-tested and feel like we can be successful from here on out."

Scouting The Seahawks

Wagner enters the contest sporting a 6-3 mark and 1-0 in the Northeast Conference (NEC). They have victories over Louisiana-Lafayette, William & Mary, Bucknell, Brown and Yale with the last four coming all in a row. They topped St. Francis (NY) for their conference win. They fell to Columbia, Saint Peter's and Manhattan. They are led by Mark Porter who averages 15.7 points per game while Durrell Vinson averages 14.7 points and Joey Mundweiler who tallies 11.4. On the glass Vinson leads the team, averaging 10.9 rebounds per contest, averaging a double double.

Tonight is a big game for Seahawk's Coach Mike Deane as he goes for career win #400. Tonight the odds may be stacked against UMES with Deane's win looming and the starting five for Wagner having totaled more than 600 points each in their career, combining for 4,145 points.

In the series Wagner leads UMES 3-1. Wagner won the first meeting in 1952-53 with a 63-50 edge and won the last time they met. That was last season as Wagner was the home opener for the Hawks and they topped UMES 82-76 and got 21 points from Porter and 14 from Mundweiler. UMES was led by Corey Brown and Jesse Brooks with 23 and 20 respectively, neither of which is still with the program. Of the returnees Tyson had 14.

Career Bests

Marc Davis had a career best 30 points, five rebounds and 37 minutes, B.J. Nimocks had a career high 10 points and Aleksandar Popovic had a career best 17 rebounds as they were keys to the Hawks win over the Owls of Kennesaw State. Previously Davis had scored 16 at most and Popovic had 12 rebounds with Nimocks having nine. Davis and Popovic both shattered their previous marks. Popovic was a defensive giant with 12 defensive boards and two blocks while Davis picked 13 of his points on the free throw line in 20 trips.

Follow the Leader

Ed Tyson has been the leader in scoring so far this season. He averages almost 17 points a game and has led the Hawks in scoring in nine out of 12 games, counting the exhibition loss to Shenandoah. The other three times, Mark Davis, who attended the same high school as Tyson, led UMES. Those games were against Bradley and George Washington and Kennesaw State. Denzel Jackson, tied for the lead in points in the Bradley and West Virginia contests.

Single Doubles

No UMES player has yet to achieve a double double this season. While the Hawks had had plenty of scorers in double figures they can't match that with another category. Denzel Jackson has been the closest as he has had two double digit rebounding efforts, one against Stony Brook (10) and one at George Washington (11). In those games however he has scored seven and five points. He came two boards shy in the loss to WVU with ten points and eight rebounds. Popovic was three points shy in the Kennesaw State win.

No Place Like Home

UMES recently hosted Delaware State on December 1, 2007. They were glad to be home after a grueling 11 day road trip that saw them go 0-5 and hit four states.

Four is not a double digit

While the number four is just a single digit, not a double digit, four is precisely the amount of Hawks that were in double figures in the loss to Bradley. Denzel Jackson and Marc Davis both had 16 and both were career highs while Ed Tyson and Milutin Mirjagic both had 11.

Lord of the Boards

Freshman Denzel Jackson has lead the Hawks in rebounding in each of the first three games of the season. Coming off the bench, he pulled in eight rebounds in the season opener at VCU, and then grabbed 10 rebounds against Stony Brook and 10 more at Bradley.

Hasn't Missed a Beat

Ed Tyson scored a season-high 32 points in the loss at Iowa. Tyson was on fire, shooting 7-8 from beyond the 3-point arch. The Junior is averaged just under 21 points through the first four games. Tyson finished the season last year averaging over 16 points a game to lead the Hawks. He picked up where he left off, scoring a game high 20 points to start his season. He did it on 7-22 shooting, connecting on two of seven attempts from downtown. Tyson shot even better in the win over Stony Brook, going 7-11 from the field and scoring 20 points for the second consecutive game. Ed was shut out in the first half against Bradley, but finished strong with 11 second half points.

Freshmen Smeshmen

The Hawks are young, sporting seven new faces and just one senior. Six of those seven players however are freshmen and UMES will rely on them heavily this season. Denzel Jackson leads the team in rebounding through four games, pulling in over eight per game. In the opener vs. Virginia Commonwealth four of those six saw significant minutes, including two starters, Marc Davis at the point guard spot and Ishmawiyl McFadden at the small forward. In total the four freshmen combined for 17 points and 14 rebounds. Against Stony Brook, Jackson joined the starting line-up, forming a starting trio along with Davis and McFadden. The trio would produce 23 points, 14 rebounds, and four steals.

About the Hawks

The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) men's basketball team ended last season on a disappointing note losing to Norfolk State in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Tournament 81-70 and finished with a 4-27 (1-17 MEAC) record.

A week following the loss, Larry Lessett Jr. resigned as head coach. In hopes of keeping some continuity and to not get behind in recruiting and player development, the Hawks named Meredith Smith the Interim Head Coach with plans to start a search in January.

While his appointment is that of Interim Head Coach, he doesn't see it as a problem at all. In fact, Smith thinks he has a "great opportunity."

"A lot of people see [Interim] as a negative, but the title gave me a chance to keep going, and keep coaching, I think the success we can have this season will give me an opportunity to keep the job on a permanent basis," said Smith.

This will be Smith's first year as a head coach at the college level, after having previously served as an assistant the past three seasons under Lessett. During that time period the Hawks totaled only 13 wins and when Lessett resigned UMES turned to an alumnus in hopes of rebuilding the program.

Just like any new coach Smith had his work cut out for him. He named Mike Farrare his top assistant almost immediately. Farrare, who served as a volunteer assistant coach last season is also an alumnus. Farrare (class of 1981) is well known in athletic circles on the Eastern Shore, having been heavily involved in local AAU programs and coaching at the junior varsity and varsity levels in nearby Wicomico County, Md.

Also added to the staff was Shawn Smith (no relation to Meredith Smith). Shawn Smith served most recently as a special education teacher while serving as a counselor and director at several basketball clinics and camps. He was the Head Coach at Rines Basketball Academy before leaving for UMES.

Shawn Smith comes from Philadelphia where he played at LaSalle University, starting at point guard for three seasons. He averaged 10 points, six assists, and two steals per game. Prior to his college career Shawn Smith played at Simon Gratz High School, winning a National Championship in both 1991 and 1993 playing with future NBA star Rasheed Wallace.

No stranger to the camp circuit and AAU programs in Philadelphia, Shawn Smith brings with him a positive attitude and winning mindset. "I am very excited to be here," he said. "I bring a winning tradition to UMES. I want to keep building young people into men and help increase our strengths and improve our weaknesses."

Also new to the UMES program will be several new players. Gone are seniors Corey Brown, Antonio McMillion, Shondale Robinson and Art Valentine. Also gone is former All-MEAC Rookie Team member Jesse Brooks.

The Hawk's lone commitment in the off-season was Ishmawiyl McFadden (Philadelphia, Pa./Simon Gratz H.S.). McFadden is a 6-5, 190lb. guard/forward who has an impressive resume. An intelligent player, McFadden was a member of the National Honor Society, he averaged 13.3 points per game his senior season and earned a first team All-Public League selection. He guided his team to the Public League Finals and to the PIAA semifinals boasting a season ending 25-7 record. McFadden was also an All-City Honorable Mention selection averaging nine rebounds, three assists and two blocks per game.

Joining McFadden will be fellow Philadelphians, Denzel Jackson (Philadelphia, Pa./Lincoln H.S.) and Kevin Burwell (Philadelphia, Pa./Imhotep H.S.).

Jackson (6-6, 190 lb.) is an athletic player that will compete for playing time at the forward position, while Burwell will look to join the rotation at guard.

Also joining them will be several other standouts including in-state players Marc Davis (Baltimore, Md./Walbrook H.S.), Josh Bright (Salisbury, Md./Morgan State Univ./Wicomico H.S.), and Omar Akram (Salisbury, Md./Baltimore International College/J.M. Bennett H.S.).

Bright (5-10, 180 lb.) and Davis (5-10, 175 lb.) will also see time at the guard spot this season, along with Roland Dunston (Bear, Del./Glasgow H.S.).

Akram (6-5, 190 lb.) will compete for playing time at the guard and forward positions.

Returning to the backcourt this season is preseason All-MEAC second team selection Ed Tyson (Baltimore, Md./Walbrook H.S.). The 6-2, 200 lb. junior guard had a breakout season last year averaging 16.4 points (fifth in the MEAC), 4.3 rebounds, and 1.7 assists per game. Tyson the only Hawk returnee to average double-figures in scoring last season also led the team in total points (509), field goals (172), and minutes played (1119, second in the MEAC) in 2006-07, while shooting 37 percent from the floor and 32 percent from behind the arc. Needless to say, Tyson will be counted on once again to spur the UMES offense.

The Hawks return two other starters from last year in Aleksandar Popovic (Novi Sad, Serbia/Weatherford College/Laza Kostic) and Milutin Mirjagic (Uzice, Serbia/Uzice Economic School/Borac Creek).

While Popovic's (6-10, 220 lb.) game is suited more as a forward, the junior held his own in the MEAC last season averaging 5.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per game at the center position, while leading the team in blocks with 23.

Mirjacic (6-8, 200 lb.) averaged two points and three rebounds per game as a freshman, seeing limited minutes despite his starting role.

UMES returns four more players that will compete for playing time off the bench. Fellow Serbian Danijel Krleski (Jagodina, Serbia/Svetozar Markovic) averaged less than five minutes a game in 22 contests, but still managed to average 1.2 points per game and shot 37 percent from three-point range, which led the team. The sophomore guard (6-4, 180 lb.) is deadly quick and has a shot to match. Opponents can count on seeing more of him this season.

Also returning to the frontcourt are juniors Brandon Moore (Baltimore, Md./Southern H.S.) and Jahmal Bivins (Randallstown, Md./Randallstown H.S.). Moore (6-9, 205 lb.) started eight of 30 games at the center position and accounted for 1.9 rebounds and 0.9 points per game.

Bivins (6-6, 210 lb.) saw limited action last season appearing in only 12 games. He averaged 0.8 points and 0.4 rebounds per game despite playing 44 total minutes.

The Hawks' lone senior, B.J. Nimocks (Detroit, Mich./Cloud County C.C.) averaged 0.9 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his first season in DI. Nimocks (6-7, 210 lb.) a junior college transfer is a solid on ball defender and usually draws one of the opponent's better players. He should see plenty of time at the forward position and will challenge opposing players with his athleticism.

Although the Hawks are young their schedule features several power conference schools, a big tournament, and the always tough MEAC opponents.

UMES opens the season at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) in Richmond Va. on November 9. They then return home for their lone exhibition game against DIII Shenandoah University. Due to a scheduling conflict the game had to be pushed back after the season opener at VCU. The game will be played in Princess Anne on November 13. UMES beat Shenandoah 88-64 during regular season play last year.

In a return game, Stony Brook comes to the Hytche Center on November 18. The Seawolves were one of the Hawk's four wins last season in a 64-58 road decision.

The Hawks then travel to the Mid-West to play Bradley University and the University of Iowa on November 18 and 20. The two games are part of the South Padre Island Invitational, which concludes in South Padre Island, Texas, on November 23 and 24 with games against Valparaiso and either Austin Peay State University or Florida Gulf Coast University. The Hawks close out the month at West Virginia University on November 27.

December 1 marks the first MEAC game for the men as Delaware State comes to town for a 4:00 p.m. showdown in the Hytche Center. Non-conference games at George Washington, where the Hawks only trailed by four at the half last season, and at Old Dominion are scheduled for December 5 and 8. Other familiar opponents from last year, Kennesaw State and Navy, come to town on December 11 and 22. Those two games sandwich a return trip to Wagner in Staten Island N.Y. on December 15.

UMES closes out their non-conference schedule with two games in January. They travel first to play Nebraska on January 4. The Hawks must wait a month after their first MEAC contest to enter the rest of the conference schedule. They travel to new MEAC member Winston-Salem State on January 12; however, that game does not count in conference standings. UMES plays MEAC contests the rest of the way with the only exception coming in a return game against Dartmouth on January 23. The Hawks play a Homecoming game against Florida A&M on February 23 and finish the regular season with a meeting against rival Delaware State on March 6 in Dover.

Coach Smith might have his work cut out for him, but is dedicated to improving the program as a whole.

"We need to get things done on and off the court accounting for every detail both academically and athletically and if we do so we can bring respect back to the UMES basketball program," said Smith.
