Just The Facts /Scouting North Carolina A&T

Today's match-up marks the second time that the Lady Hawks and Lady Aggies have faced off this season. The first meeting took place in Princess Anne back on January 19, with North Carolina A&T prevailing, 72-59. The Lady Aggies went on a 17-4 second half run to help seal the deal.

A&T has won ten games in a row, with the most recent win coming on Monday night over Bethune-Cookman, 89-55. They score nearly 72 points per game while only allowing opponents to score 60 a night. The Lady Aggies have also out-rebounded their foes by an average of two rebounds per contest. They shoot nearly 43 percent from the floor, including over 31 percent from beyond the 3-point line.

Amber Bland leads the team in scoring, dropping over 14 a game and nearly 16 a game vs. teams in conference.

Snap Crackle and Pop

The Lady Hawks had their school record seven game winning streak snapped recently at the hands of Hampton. UMES had posted seven straight MEAC wins, including four on the road and a three game streak where they knocked off Morgan State, Coppin State and Delaware State. They have won 10 of their last 13 outings.

Despite leading at the half vs. Hampton, the lead seemed to pop away and when UMES countered the inside game of Hampton the Lady Pirates guards stepped up to get the win and with it create a four team tie for second place in the league with the Hawks, Coppin State and Delaware State.

One For the Record Books

UMES scored a program record 105 points in their victory over Howard. The last time they scored over 100 points was the 1991-92 season when they topped Bowie State 102-50. The team shot over 50 percent from the floor in both halves, winding up with a final tally of over 53 percent. The win was also their seventh consecutive, also a new program high.

To Be The Best, You Have To Beat The Best

In its last six games UMES has won the last three against some pretty impressive teams. The last three win were at Morgan State, at Coppin State and home vs. Delaware State. Those teams were the MEAC Tournament Runner-Up, the MEAC Regular Season Champions and the MEAC Tournament Champions, not a bad three in row to have won.

Five Straight Is Great, Six Is Sweeter

UMES has won six straight games, now the longest winning streak since the team joined the MEAC in 1981-82. In the 1991-92 season UMES won five straight, the final four regular season games and the first tournament game. That team also set the team record for wins with 17. The current Lady Hawks however have won six straight MEAC games, a school record and a win today would make it seven, two new school records.

Veltkamp Is One Smart Cookie

The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Women's Basketball Team has a lot going for them these days. They are tied for second place in the conference and have won a school record six straight games. Off the court they are just as successful and senior standout Kristi Veltkamp has been a perfect example of that success. Besides being a nominee for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, Veltkamp was announced today as a First Team selection to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Women's Basketball Team, a program from the College Sports Information Director's Association (CoSIDA).

Veltkamp is a selection in the District Two, University Division, along with four other of the region's top players, Maryland's Crystal Langhorne, American's Elizabeth Hayes, Villanova's Stacie Williams and George Washington's Sarah-Jo Lawrence. The University Division is inclusive of only DI schools.

As a first-team selection, Veltkamp goes to the national ballot where she will be voted on as an Academic All-American. Voting begins on February 12.

Think Pink

For UMES' Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference's basketball double header against Hampton University on Monday, February 11th the school will feature a "Think Pink" theme. The event is a global initiative from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA). The nation of coaches representing the WBCA assists in raising breast cancer awareness on the court, in communities and beyond.

The WBCA began "Think Pink" in 2007 and had over 120 schools on board. This year they have more than tripled that number and UMES is proud to among them.

The Lady Hawks will assist in the effort by letting anyone into the game wearing pink for just a two dollar donation to the American Cancer Society. UMES will give away pink t-shirts showing UMES' commitment to the event and the players will adorn pink sports gear for the game. The UMES staff will wear pink to show their support and the American Cancer Society will have an informational table set-up for the event. UMES will also recognize breast cancer survivors and those affected by the disease at half-time of the women's game.

The Hytche Center will be decorated for the game with pink balloons and pink ribbons will also be handed out.

Super Sophomores Double The Double-Double

April McBride has been regularly getting a double double this season (see below) but has been the only Lady Hawk to achieve this feat other than Brittany Adkins, who has one. McBride recorded her sixth double-double of the season on Saturday against Morgan State with 20 points (the sixth time this season she eclipsed 20) and a career high 19 rebounds, one shy of the illustrious 20-20 club. Joining her with a double double was Tiffany Reid who scored a career high 24 points and snatched 12 boards (10 defensive). Together the duo has accounted for quite a lot, including 12 of the game highs in scoring this season and 13 of the game highs in rebounding.

The Alaskan Assassin

.Sharp-shooter Jelia Abdul-Bassit, or 'The Alaska Assassin,' as she has come to be known to the Hawk faithful got on track in the win at Bethune-Cookman. Abdul-Bassit posted a season high 14 points on 5-7 shooting, including 3-4 from behind the arc. Abdul-Bassit has always had the ability to come into a game and make a difference but she has been hampered by an elbow injury this year, playing in just eight of the team's 18 games. She also set or matched season highs in minutes, blocks, assists and rebounds. If last Monday's game is any indication 'The Alaskan Assassin's' elbow is just fine and she may have quite a few more MEAC teams in her sights this season.

Another Double Double

April McBride has been a double double machine this season. In the win at Florida A&M McBride posted her fifth of the season with 12 points and 12 rebounds. She had previously recorded the feat three times in a row, at Delaware, at Syracuse and vs. Canisius. She also had 13 and 13 vs. Kent State. Oddly enough McBride has never had 20 points this year when recording a double double,. She has scored in the 20s four times, but her point production is just a little down when her rebounding is up. She is currently averaging 15 points a game and just under eight rebounds a game.

Double Digit Fives

In the Norfolk State win UMES put five players, the starters, in double figures. Casey Morton led all scorers with 20 points while Brittany Adkins scored a career high 16 points with then coming from the free throw line. Chena Parker and Tiffany Reid both had 12 points while the team's leading scorer, April McBride had 11. Queenique Tyler came one point shy of making it six players as she had nine points.

The last time UMES had five players in double figures goes back to the 2005-06 season when two current Hawks, Tiffany Reid (13)

and Kristi Veltkamp (14) were in double figures along with Toni Kennedy (29), Jamila Griffith (13) and Daynese Stowe (14). That game was a 97-78 thumping of Howard in Princess Anne on March 4, 2006. Four of those players, excluding Veltkamp were starters. The fifth starter, Rachel Goodwin, had eight points and 11 assists in the win.

0-2

Fred Batchelor has never been 0-2 in the MEAC until this season, much less 0-3. Until this season he has always picked up a win in his first or second MEAC game. It has been four seasons since UMES started 0-2 in league play. In the 2003-04 year under former coach Surina Dixon, UMES actually started 0-4 before beating Norfolk State for a MEAC win. That season they finished 12-17 and 6-12 in league play. The 03-04 year was the also the last time Batchelor was 0-2 in conference play when he was with Elizabeth City and started 0-2 before getting a win over Virginia State in CIAA play.

Career High

April McBride scored a career high 27 points at South Carolina State. This marks the fifth time in her career and fourth this season she has scored in the 20s. Actually, all previous four times she has scored exactly 20 points.

Shutout

The UMES women saw several players post the goose egg in the loss to South Carolina State. In fact, only four players scored. While they got a big output from April McBride (27 points), Tiffany Reid (13 points) and Casey Morton (17 points) only one other Lady Hawk scored. Jessica Ayilola posted five points. Brittany Adkins, Chena Parker, Kristi Veltkamp, Jelila Abdul-Bassit and Queenique Tyler combined for an 0-11 performance and Talareah Frazier never even attempted a shot. Part of the struggles weren't even the SCSU defense but cold shooting as UMES was just 25 percent from the floor in the first half, resulting in an 32-17 half-time deficit, three points more than they could come back from.

Outgunned

For the first time on the road this season UMES really seemed to outmatch their opponent. UMES dominated most categories. They out rebounded Winston-Salem State 57-28, out shot them 49.2 percent to 22.1 percent, had more assists (18-5), more blocks (4-2), more steals (9-3), more points in the paint (46-14), more points off of turnovers (25-18) and more second chance points (23-4). The only category UMES didn't win was turnovers, where they tied the Lady Rams with 22 miscues.

Inside Presence

The UMES big women had quite a day in the Lady Hawk's victory with Chena Parker leading the team in scoring and rebounding (22 points, nine rebounds) while senior center Kristi Veltkamp tied Parker with nine rebounds and sophomore center Jessica Ayilola scored a career high tying 11 points. Forwards Brittany Adkins and April McBride also had great games with Adkins pulling down six rebounds and McBride scoring 12 points.

Chena, Warrior Princess

Freshmen center Chena Parker picked up right after her 13 point outing at American with a 22 point career high performance in the win at Winston-Salem State. She not only led the team in scoring but in rebounding as well, tying senior Kristi Veltkamp with nine. What is more amazing is Parker posted 20 of those by halftime and got some rest in the second half.

Lucky 13 for #13

Freshmen center Chena Parker scored 13 points in just her second start in a 60-56 win over American. Those 13 points matches her career high when Parker, who wears number 13, scored 13 points in a win over the University of Delaware. When she scores, 13 points, UMES is 2-0.

Did You Read Reid's line?

Tiffany Reid scored a career high 22 points in the win at American, topping her previous high set earlier this year in a loss to Morgan State. She added four rebounds, had three steals and dished out a pair of assists in the win while playing 31 minutes. She was a solid 6-8 from the floor and 4-6 from behind the arc.

Not Quite 10 Years and Two Days

Much was made of Washington Redskins quarterback Todd Collins who hadn't started a game in 10 years and two days. Well, almost but not quite in the same club is senior Brittany Adkins who started her first game since her freshmen year in the win at American. It had been 77 games and 1,859 days since Adkins started in a 60-54 win against Florida A&M in Princess Ann on February 12, 2005. That is coincidentally two points shy of the score UMES topped American by, 60-56. In her only other start UMES fell to Norfolk State earlier in the 2004-05 season 63-46. Lesson learned: When Adkins starts and UMES scores exactly 60 points, they always win.

Who Started?

Coach Fred Batchelor rewarded some hard work while keeping out some injuries in the starting line-up of the game against Kent

State. With Tiffany Reid and Casey Morton, both normal starters, missing practice time due to injuries Batchelor started walk-on guard Dominique Reece and freshmen guard Queenique Tyler who made her fourth career start. Freshmen center Chena Parker also started over Jessica Ayilola. Parker worked hard in practice and the move seemed to pay off as Ayilola and Parker both scored six points.

Four Out of Five Double, Four Out of Five Doubles

April McBride has now posted four double doubles in her last five games. She tallied 13 points and grabbed 13 rebounds before leaving the game with three minutes left in the overtime period. The only game she has not posted one recently was a loss to Army, where she came up five rebounds shy but did manage a career-high tying 20 points.

The O.T.

UMES played their first overtime game of the season on Sunday, defeating Kent State 76-71. Last season they played just one overtime game, a 54-48 win over Winston-Salem State, coincidentally the Hawk's next opponent. The previous year (05-06) UMES played three overtime games and sported an 0-3 record in those games, losses to Howard, Bucknell and Furman all coming in a four game span. One year earlier UMES was 3-0 in overtime games, picking up wins over Florida A&M, North Carolina A&T and American. They topped the Eagles that year 62-59, the last time the two teams meant.

Coach Fred Batchelor is 5-3 in overtime games since coming to UMES.

Hawks Shutdown by Army

UMES was without four players in its loss to Army but Head Coach Fred Batchelor wasn't sure it would have mattered. That was because Army was on fire, shooting 68.4 percent for the game and a whopping 71.4 percent in the first half. UMES wasn't bad, shooting 46 percent for the game themselves. The shooting was so good that Army guard Cara Enright had 25 points and 9-15 shooting. Army was also 58 percent from three point range and 77.3 percent from the charity stripe.

"I've never seen that shooting percentage," Head Coach Fred Batchelor said. "I always say defense has something to do with it, we could have played better defense, of course, but when they don't miss, for a team to shoot 68 percent from the field, even healthy they would have been a tough team to beat."

Career Marks

The players responded to loss of four players for the Army contest. Four players set or tied career highs in scoring while the team set or tied seven other career highs in assists, rebounding or blocks. April McBride led the Hawks with 20 points, tying her career high for the third time while Talareah Frazier, Dominique Reece and Josephine McLane all set new career highs in scoring with 10, three and nine points respectively. The unsung hero of the game was Brittany Adkins who poured in eight points and grabbed ten rebounds, tying a career mark in rebounding and setting a new one with 32 minutes played. Frazier and McLane also set a new mark of 30 and 28 minutes played respectively. Kristi Veltkamp, Frazier, Queenique Tyler, Reece and McLane all tied or set new marks in the assist category as well.

Triple double doubles

April McBride recorded her third straight double double in the loss to Canisius. She tallied 19 points and 11 rebounds to lead the game in both categories. Previously she had 14 points and 10 rebounds at Syracuse and 11 points and 11 rebounds at Delaware. These are the first double doubles of the year for McBride and she is averaging 14.67 points and 10.67 rebounds in her last three games.

Steady Diet of Adkins

Brittany Adkins has been coming on strong as of late. Entering her senior season Adkins had scored in double figures just one time but this season she has already done it twice, most recently coming in the loss to Canisius where she posted her first career double double of 11 points and ten rebounds. In the loss to Army she came a bucket shy of the feat again with eight points and 10 rebounds.

Ouch! That Hurts!

The Lady Hawks have been bitten by the injury bug as of late. Tiffany Reid missed one game with a lower back injury but returned two days later to play a little hurt and still managed ten points. She then sustained a head injury at Syracuse and missed the Canisius and Army games. Jasmine Speed hurt her knee in the Longwood game and is expected to miss the rest of the year with a torn ACL. Jelila Abdul-Bassit is battling an elbow injury that will require surgery after the season. She is expected to return against Winsotn-Salem State and finish the year. Casey Morton is battling a wrist injury sustained against Canisius and missed the Army game but returned against Kent State. Then in the Army game Talareah Frazier hurt her ankle and missed the Kent State game, she will return against American.

Hometown Hero

April McBride recorded the team's second double double of the year in the loss to Syracuse. McBride, hailing from New Rochelle, N.Y. posted 14 points and 10 rebounds in front of her family and friends. It was the second straight double double performance by the super sophomore.

Chena Who?!

UMES freshmen Chena Parker was brought in because of her incredible talent and potential. Coach Batchelor expected her to come into her own this season, learning behind senior center Kristi Veltkamp and sophomore Jessica Ayilola. Well, it didn't take long. As Parker got her chance at the University of Delaware playing for Veltkamp and Ayilola who were in foul trouble. She hadn't scored all year but tallied 13 points on 5-7 shooting and grabbed eight rebounds propelling UMES to the win. "Her play was huge," said Batchelor. "If she didn't do what she did we wouldn't have won this game. She is a player, the staff knows that, we weren't surprised."

Double Double 11s

April McBride recorded the team's first double double of the year in the win at Delaware, posting 11 points and 11 rebounds. It was also her first career double double. She was also one of four Lady Hawks to score in double figures with Morton (14), Parker (13) and Ayilola (11) also lighting up the Blue Hens.

20-20 Scoring

Casey Morton and April McBride both scored in the 20s with the win over Western Michigan. Morton had a game high 21 while McBride added 20. UMES only had three players reach that mark last season with McBride, Veltkamp and the graduated Candyce Jeter each getting 20 once last season. Morton's 21 are the most points in a game by a UMES player since Toni Kennedy had 29 vs. Howard in March of 2006. It is the first time two Lady Hawks had had at least 20 in a game since December 17, 2005 when Veltkamp had 27 and Kennedy had 24 in an OT loss to Bucknell.

Block Party

UMES senior Kristi Veltkamp is usually a reserved young lady but when the Lady Hawks played Western Michigan she threw a party for almost 800 people. The block party saw Veltkamp swat four of the Broncos shots while she invited April McBride who got in the action on one block. The four blocks remind the Hawk faithful of her play form 05-06 when she was the MEAC Defensive Player of the Year.

D-Fence

UMES seems to be struggling offensively but defensively the Lady Hawks are stifling. They held Longwood to just 43 points and Saint Francis (PA) to 58 points. Their opponents are averaging just 54 points per game and shooting just under 35 percent from the field.

Oh Snap!

UMES snapped their winless streak against the Purple Eagles of Niagara University with their win. The Lady Hawks had never beaten the Niagara in three tries. The first time to the Hytche Center proved to be the difference as UMES was down 13 and rallied to take the win from a school located 20 minutes from Head Coach Fred Batchelor's boyhood home.

It's Her Party and She Will Shoot if She Wants To

Hawk freshmen guard Casey Morton had a coming out party of sorts in the Niagara win. She exploded for a career high 12 points and 3-7 shooting from behind the arc. "Morton, played well, she made some freshmen mistakes, but we expect that, what matters though is that she finished the game strong," said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. She kept hot in the loss to Saint Francis (PA) scoring a team high 11 points.

Don't Cost Nothin'

Tiffany Reid took advantage of the free throw line in the win over Niagara, connecting on 12 of 16 attempts. Her 17 points led the Hawks and the 'free' throws were exactly what UMES ordered for their comeback win.

100 And Counting

Head Coach Fred Batchelor picked up career win number 100 in the NCCU victory. Batchelor had made seven previous tries at #100 but couldn't manage the win. The win snapped a seven game streak dating back to last season. "The 100 wins are more about the kids who worked hard and dedicated themselves," Batchelor said. "This is a tribute to those kids and the great staff I have had the pleasure to work with. It feels good, especially since it took seven games to get it." UMES hadn't won since February 17, 2007 at Florida A&M.

UNC, UMES, Same Difference

While UMES Women's Basketball is a solid program, one on the rise, no one has been in a hurry to compare them to perennial power North Carolina. Well, you read it here first; the two have something in common, defense. Both teams have faced North Carolina Central this season and both held them to exactly 32 points. The Lady Hawks forced 24 turnovers, forced a field goal percentage of 25 percent and didn't allow NCCU to make a bucket from the field since the 9:40 mark of the second half. In fact, the Lady Eagles, only got one more point the rest of the game.

V For Victory, V For Veltkamp

UMES senior forward Kristi Veltkamp had struggled last season, the year after she earned Defensive Player of the Year in the MEAC. Well, those struggles disappeared, at least on the offensive end as Veltkamp dominated in the post, tallying 16 points and grabbing six rebounds in the win over NCCU.

Reid Returns

Red-shirt Sophomore Tiffany Reid returned to the UMES line-up against Morgan St. after missing the entire 2006-07 season with a shoulder injury. Reid picked up where she left off, scoring a game-high 21 points on 5-8 shooting. Reid also went 9-12 from the free throw line. She was second on the team in scoring against North Carolina Central University, netting 13 points. She missed the Longwood game due to a leg injury but shouldn't miss much time.

April Showers

Sophomore April McBride scored 20 points in the loss to Morgan State. She lead her squad by making a game-high seven field goals (7-11 FG), while logging a team-leading 34 minutes. The Lady Eagles of NCCU held her scoreless in the first half but McBride turned in an eight point second half. She has now led the Lady Hawks in scoring twice with the last time coming in the loss to Longwood.

The Batchelor

Fourth-year Head Coach Fred Batchelor challenged his team after their opening loss. "We aren't experienced enough yet to understand what it means to open your season at home against a conference team, even if it doesn't count in the standings. We got outplayed at every position tonight. [Reid and McBride] played great but we struggled to find another presence. This just shows we are young, we have a lot to learn and we have to get better. We have to work harder." Some of that paid off with a win over NCCU.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md. — In the season opener for both teams, Morgan State University (MSU) topped the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) 77-71 despite two strong performances by Hawk sophomores. April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle H.S.) and Tiffany Reid (Philadelphia, Pa./National Christian Academy) poured in 20 and 21 points respectively but the Hawk defense let another sophomore Corin Adams, score a game high 23 to secure the win.

The two Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) rivals opened their season in a non-conference contest, one Head Coach Fred Batchelor was hoping for a better result from. "We aren't experienced enough yet to understand what it means to open your season at home against a conference team, even if it doesn't count in the standings. We got outplayed at every position tonight. [Reid and McBride] played great but we struggled to find another presence. This just shows we are young, we have a lot to learn and we have to get better. We have to work harder."

As a team UMES (0-1) out shot the Lady Bears (44%-37.7%), were even in rebounding at 42, and were better at the charity stripe (72.4% to 58.6%). But that didn't translate to the final score as Adams poured in 23 and Shalane Price added ten off the bench. Morgan State got 25 total from their reserves while the Lady Hawks could muster just 18, eight from senior Brittany Adkins (Millsboro, Del./Sussex Technical H.S.).

Freshmen Casey Morton (Mardela Springs, Md./Mardela H.S.) added eight points. The Hawk freshmen were responsible for 14 points together, but also for 16 turnovers, one more than half of their team total, 30.

MSU (1-0) committed 21 miscues themselves.

"Our freshmen have to grow up quick, we are depending on them," said Batchelor. "But I really think they are wonderful. We are relying on them a lot and putting them in a tough position. However, I am confident they will pull through and lead us to better things."

UMES controlled most of the first half, carrying a 34-32 lead into the locker room. They led by as many as seven that period, taking a 19-12 advantage at the 7:17 mark on a McBride jumper. Morgan State quickly tied it just two minutes later as Price hit a jumper that would make it 22 all.

In the second frame the Hawks pushed their lead to five on a Reid three from the corner to open the scoring. Morgan again tied it a minute and a half later at 37. All in all the two teams traded the lead ten times. The Lady Bears were up as many as ten in the second half, the first time coming at the 13:40 mark on a Theresa Davis runner and the last at the 4:55 mark on a Danielle Scott floater. They led by ten a total of four times.

The Lady Hawks got it as close as four with 20 seconds to play on an Adkins lay-in but a pair of Price free throws clinched the 77-71 win for Morgan State.

UMES continues its long home stand with a match-up on Wednesday, November 14 against North Carolina Central University at 7:00 pm.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md. — The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) women's basketball team picked up its first win of the season tonight, topping North Carolina Central University (NCCU) 54-32 and with it earned Head Coach Fred Batchelor's 100th career win.

Kristi Veltkamp (Hudsonville, Mich./Lansing Home School) turned in a solid first half, scoring 15 points and grabbing three rebounds. She would finish with 16 points and seven boards to lead the Lady Hawks in both categories. Veltkamp and Jessica Ayilola (Brooklyn, N.Y./Robert Morris Univ.) played a two woman game on the inside, dominating the middle. Ayilola would add five points and get seven boards as well to round out a strong presence.

The Lady Hawks were dominant in the paint, out rebounding the smaller Lady Eagles 47-29 and out scoring them in the paint 32-10.

"It was great to have our two bigs have a good game at the same time. That made it very difficult to defend us tonight," said Batchelor. "All around we took a tremendous step to becoming a more cohesive unit tonight."

Tiffany Reid (Philadelphia, Pa./National Christian Academy) was the only other Hawk in double figures, she added 13. The 'unit' was impressive top to bottom with April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle N.Y.) scoring all eight of her points in the second half. Casey Morton (Mardela Springs, Md./Mardela H.S.) got the start again. The freshmen point guard scored only three points but snatched seven rebounds.

UMES was without a made three point shot all evening. They averaged over three and a half made per game last season. It was January 15, 2007 against Delaware State when UMES last went without a three point goal. Coincidentally, UMES also won that game.

The Hawks also took care of the ball better, committing only 21 turnovers and forcing 24. UMES (1-1) committed 30 in their opener on Saturday. The Lady Hawks defense didn't just force turnovers but contained the Lady Eagles offense. Their 32 points matches a season low, the same they scored against North Carolina. NCCU's (0-3) last field goal was with 9:40 left in the game.

The Lady Eagles were led by LaVonna Hailey and Tonia Roundtree who both had seven points. Jori Nwachukwu had a team high seven rebounds.

"Were still young," said Batchelor. "We are still getting ready to play our style of basketball. This will be a team that peaks later this year, but I believe that will be at the right time."

Nonetheless, UMES got the win tonight and with it Batchelor's 100th career victory. "The 100 wins are more about the kids who worked hard and dedicated themselves. This is a tribute to those kids and the great staff I have had the pleasure to work with. It feels good, especially since it took seven games to get it." UMES hadn't won since February 17, 2007 at Florida A&M.

NEWARK, Del. — Last season the University of Delaware (UD) was an large selection to the NCAA Tournament. This season they are 1-7 after their game against the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) as the Lady Hawks used an inside presence to top the Blue Hens 65-53 in the first road game of the year for Head Coach Fred Batchelor's squad.

The freshmen again played a big role as Casey Morton led UMES (4-3) with 14 points and a career high six assists and no turnovers.

"Our freshmen have to play well for us to win," said Batchelor. "Casey has been doing that. She is a tough kid, she never gets down."

The second leading scorer however was as much of a surprise to UD (1-7) as it was to the Hawk faithful in attendance. Chena Parker hadn't scored all season, but tonight, playing for UMES' big women who were in foul trouble, she stepped in to the tune of 13 points and eight rebounds.

"Her play was huge," said Batchelor. "If she didn't do what she did we wouldn't have won this game. She is a player, the staff knows that, we weren't surprised."

In a contest with eight lead changes and six ties the game was back and forth the entire second half. UMES, down two at the break, started the second half on a Jessica Ayilola lay-in to make it 32-31 after a free throw. Delaware then responded with a Courtney Irving free throw and a pair of throws by Kyle DeHaven. UD was back in front 34-32.

With 17:41 Parker was fouled on a put back attempt and calmly sank both free throws for her first career points to tie the game. Her first field goal came a little less than four minutes later on a pretty lay-up on a pass from Tiffany Reid to cut the lead to one. She continued to be a presence inside playing for Ayilola who finished with three fouls and Kristi Veltkamp who finished with four personals.

"We made high percentage shots tonight and out rebounded them," added Batchelor. "That was the key."

Delaware has been out rebounded on the season by an average of eight boards per game and tonight that held true to form as the Lady Hawks held the edge 46-32, a 14 rebound lead. They also outscored UD in the paint 28-16.

UMES took the lead for good at the 7:22 mark on a Brittany Adkins free throw to make it 51-50. They would end the game on a 14-3 run. With 3:12 remaining in the game UMES played solid defense, rebounded even better and held the ball to secure the win. Adkins wrapped up the game with a pair of free throws to make the difference 12, 65-53.

April McBride recorded the first double double of the year for the Hawks, posting 11 points and 11 rebounds. Ayilola added 11 points to make it four Lady Hawks in double figures. Reid had eight points and nine boards.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. — The University of Maryland Eastern Shore headed north to Syracuse to take on a team receiving votes in the polls and held 85-56 to fall to 4-4 while the Orange improved to 9-1. The Lady Hawks were led by April McBride with her second straight double double with 14 points and 10 rebounds while Tiffany Reid was the only other Hawk in double figures with a team high 15 points.

With five players in double-digits, the Orange women's basketball team improved to 9-1 with an 85-56 win against Maryland Eastern Shore on Wednesday in the Carrier Dome. Senior forward Fantasia Goodwin posted the eighth double-double of her career and fifth of the season by posting a game-high 19 points and 13 rebounds.

Syracuse, which had nine student-athletes with at least one point, improved its winning streak to eight games. It is only the fourth time in the program's 36-year history that a team has won eight consecutive games. The 9-1 mark is the best since beginning with the same record in 1978-79.

The Orange, who has scored 70 or more points in four consecutive outings and six times this season, helped its cause by shooting 43.3 percent (26-60) from the floor, while holding Maryland Eastern Shore to only 31.3 percent (21-67). SU has shot above 40.0 percent in six straight games and is averaging 44.8 percent shooting during the winning streak.

Sophomore forward Nicole Michael posted 12 points and 12 boards for her 11th career double-double.

Junior Chandra Jones had 18 points, eight rebounds and a game-high six assists. She has scored 10 or more point in nine-of-10 games this season.

Rounding out the group of Orange student-athletes in double-figures were sophomore Vionca Murray and freshman Erica Morrow with 11 points each - a career-high tying mark for Murray.

Senior center Vaida Sipaviciute, who had a team-high five blocks, tallied five points and senior forward Tracy Harbut and freshman guard Tasha Harris each had four.

The Orange, which is receiving votes in the AP poll, wasted no time as Michael laid in the games first hoop only six seconds into the game and sparked a 9-2 run to open the contest. In the first half the Orange used runs of 9-2, 10-1 and 9-3 to lead as many as 21.

The Orange shot 48.3 percent (14-29) in the first and for the opening 12 minutes limited the Lady Hawks to 8.7 percent (2-23) shooting. Maryland Eastern Shore improved its shooting to 20.0 percent (7-35) in the first, but Syracuse owned the glass by pulling down 35 rebounds. The Lady Hawks only grabbed 18.

After SU took a 44-25 lead into the break, the Lady Hawks came within 17 points in the second and that was after freshman center Chena Parker made a lay-up in the opening minute of the second.

A three-point play by Goodwin at 5:43 gave the Orange its largest lead of 33 (81-48) and its second 80-plus point outing of the year.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md. — The Lady Hawks played the game against Army without four players, including three starters. All are injured and out of the lineup but Head Coach Fred Batchelor didn't think that if they had been healthy this would have been a sure win. That is because Army shot an amazing 68.4 percent for the game, including 71.4 percent in the first half, to take a 76-64 win over the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) in women's basketball action on Thursday afternoon in the William P. Hytche Athletic Center.

"I've never seen that shooting percentage," Batchelor said. "I always say defense has something to do with it, we could have played better defense, of course, but when they don't miss, for a team to shoot 68 percent from the field, even healthy they would have been a tough team to beat."

UMES (4-6) was without guards Casey Morton, Tiffany Reid and Jelila Abdul-Bassit and forward Jasmine Speed. Speed is out for the season with a torn ACL while the other three have a variety of injuries that should not keep out of action much longer. The Hawks did have three starters in the line-up with Kristi Veltkamp, Jessica Ayilola and April McBride but started Queenique Tyler and Talareah Frazier, both freshmen, at the guard spots.

The players responded however as four players set or tied career highs in scoring while the team set or tied seven other career highs in assists, rebounding or blocks.

McBride led the Hawks with 20 points, tying her career high for the third time while Frazier, Dominique Reece and Josephine McLane all set new career highs in scoring with 10, three and nine points respectively.

The unsung hero of the game was Brittany Adkins who poured in eight points and grabbed ten rebounds, tying a career mark. She was two points shy of a second consecutive double double.

UMES out rebounded the Black Knights 25-21. Rebounds, however, were tough to come by, especially on the Army glass as they shot a blistering 26 of 38 from the field and seven of 12 from behind the arc. The Hawks weren't bad from the floor, connecting on 23 of 50 shots for 46 percent but the sharp shooting cadets couldn't seem to miss.

Cara Enright had a quiet 25 points. Quiet, because she only took 15 shots and made nine of them, including a three for seven mark from behind the arc. Nalini Hawkins added 17, including seven on the charity stripe while Alex McGuire finished with 16 points. McGuire was a perfect six for six from the free throw line, helping Army (7-6) to a 77.3 percent effort there.

Stefanie Stone was also in double figures for Army with 10 points.

Army led 38-33 at the half and the score was nearly identical in the second half, 38-31 as UMES was downed by 12. It was a seven point game with just over a minute to go as Frazier sank a pair of free throws after going hard to the basket, making it 71-64. The Lady Hawks were forced to foul and Army extended their lead.

UMES played the final six and half minutes without their leading scorer McBride, who fouled out. Army's Erin Anthony was also disqualified on fouls with just under five minutes to play. She finished with two points and three rebounds.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md. — Tiffany Reid returned to action today against the Kent State University (KSU) Golden Flashes and poured in 19 points, on 7-15 shooting to lead the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Lady Hawks to an overtime win, 76-71. Reid, who had missed the last two games with a head injury sustained at Syracuse, looked to be her old self, knocking down two three pointers, going a perfect 3-3 from the free throw line and tallying three blocked shots and three assists for an overall solid performance.

UMES (5-6) was glad to have her back, as four players sat out against Army last Thursday. Today it was just three players, including Talareah Frazier who missed the game after playing against Army. Casey Morton also returned after missing the Army game. She added 12 points and handed out four assists.

Injuries seem to be the story for the Hawks who hope to have Frazier and Jelila Abdul-Bassit back for the game at American on Tuesday. April McBride went down with three minutes to play in the overtime period and could not finish the game. Luckily however she is not expected to miss much time, if any.

McBride would finish with her fourth double double in her last five games, dropping in 13 points and grabbing a game high 13 rebounds.

"Effort overcame free throw shooting tonight," said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. "We missed some big ones but we kept pushing it and came away with the win." Ironically it was McBride, hurt in the overtime period, which made only one of two at the end of regulation with fewer than 10 seconds left that tied the game at 67 instead of giving the Hawks the lead. In the final three minutes Morton and Jessica Ayilola both missed two free throws that would have given UMES a lead.

The Lady Hawks shot just 12 of 26 from the charity stripe, 46.2 percent for the game but got two key ones from Reid with under two minutes to play in OT that gave them the lead for good, 72-71.

Kent State (3-9) also knows what it is like to have a limited bench. They came into the game with just eight players and lost two of them to fouls before the overtime period. First Ellie Shields fouled out with less than five minutes to play and then their big gun, Anna Kowalska fouled out with just over two minutes to play in regulation. Kowalska had a game high 23 points and four blocks while Shields left with six points and seven rebounds.

The Golden Flashes never gave up as Stephanie Gibson had a double double of 18 points and 10 rebounds while teammate Ashley Harkins, playing for the first time in six games, added 12 points.

The Lady Hawks didn't lead the game until the 12:46 mark of the second frame when Morton took a pass from Queenique Tyler after a Reid steal and laid it in. Reid extended the lead to five after a Harkins turnover with a three from the wing, 46-41. UMES led by as many as eight in the game, that coming with 7:37 to play when Josephine McLane hit a jumper to make it 56-48.

Tyler finished in double figures for the first time this season with ten points.

PWINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — The University of Maryland Eastern Shore

(UMES) Lady Hawks used a dominant low post effort to run past Winston-Salem State University (WSSU) 82-46 on Saturday afternoon in the LJVW Coliseum.

UMES (7-6) jumped out to a 19-2 lead with 11:12 remaining in the first half on a Kristi Veltkamp (Hudsonville, Mich./Lansing Home School) free throw. Freshmen Chena Parker (Poughkeepsie, N.Y./Manhattan Center for Science and Math) scored an amazing 14 points during that stretch and would finish with 20 points in the first half.

Jessica Ayilola (Brooklyn, N.Y./Robert Morris University) capped off the first 20 minutes with a lay-in at the buzzer to give UMES a 46-17 lead going into the break. The Lady Hawks shot 51.4 percent in the first half, while holding WSSU to 22.2 percent on just six field goals.

Parker would open up the scoring in the second half with a jumper but would get into foul trouble early on and would finish one rebound shy of a double-double as with a career-high 22 points and nine rebounds on 10-of-14 shooting from the field in just 16 minutes of action.

The Lady Hawks would take their biggest lead of the game on a Queenique Tyler (Ft. Washington, Md./Potomac H.S.) three-pointer to make it 77-37 with 5:27 remaining in the game, however; WSSU would close out the game on a 13-6 run as UMES Head Coach Fred Batchelor would empty the bench.

All but two Lady Hawks would score in the game, while four finished in double figures. Parker led the way followed by April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle H.S.) who added 12 points to go along with a game-high four steals, while Ayilola and Reid finished with 11 and 10 points respectively.

The Lady Rams were led by Bradford with 16 points and she was joined by teammate Talshesia Kee who added 15 as they combined for 67 percent of the total offense.

UMES finished 31-of-63 from the field for 49.2 percent, while holding WSSU to just 15 field goals on 22.1 percent shooting. They also flexed their muscle down low as they out rebounded the Lady Rams, 57-28, and outscored them in the paint, 46-14. In addition, the Lady Hawks dished out 13 more assists, 18-5, and had six more steals, 9-3, than their opposition.

ORANGEBURG, S.C. — A poor shooting first half by the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Lady Hawks proved costly in a 65-62 loss to South Carolina State University (SCSU) on Monday night in the S-H-M Memorial Center.

Casey Morton (Mardela Springs, Md./Mardela H.S.) had a chance to tie the game as time expired but her three-point attempt missed, giving the Lady Hawks their first Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) loss of the season.

After trailing 32-17 at the break, UMES (7-7, 0-1 MEAC) would trim the lead to 36-28 behind back-to-back three-pointers from Morton.

Following a SCSU (4-9, 1-1 MEAC) lay-in by Jenell Moore to make it 41-33, the Lady Hawks would respond once again but this time behind back-to-back three-pointers from Tiffany Reid (Philadelphia, Pa./National Christian Academy) and capped off by an April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle H.S.) lay-in that tied it at 41 all with 9:44 to go.

UMES would take a 46-47 lead with 6:49 left in the game on a pair of Morton free-throws.

In a half that featured six lead changes and five ties, both teams would exchange several leads over the final six minutes of regulation.

A Sophila Hipps free-throw with 45 seconds left gave the Lady Bulldogs a 59-58 advantage but both sides would trade four sets of free-throws that ended with a pair of Moore free-throws that sealed the win for SCSU.

McBride was one of three UMES players in double figures as she led all scorers with a career-high 27 points on 11-of-17 shooting, while Morton and Reid added 17 and 13 respectively. Reid had a team-high four steals.

The Lady Bulldogs matched UMES with three players in double figures and were led by Hipps with 20 points. Moore had a double-double finishing with 15 points and 13 rebounds, including going a perfect four-of-four from the field and seven-of-eight from the free-throw line. Patience Figgins finished one rebound shy of a double-double with 14 points and nine rebounds.

The Lady Hawks came out red-hot in the second half shooting 57.7 percent from the field and 50 percent from three-point range after only connecting on 25 percent from the floor and going zero-for-nine from beyond the arc in the first 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, SCSU shot a respectable 44.7 percent from the field and 35.7 percent from three-point range for the game, including four-of-six in the first half, however; the UMES defense would limit their second half three-point shooting to just one-of-eight.

In the end, UMES was outrebounded by the Lady Bulldogs, 37-30, but had fewer turnovers, 16-13, and more points off them, 15-12.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md. — Five players scored in double figures as the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Lady Hawks rolled through the Spartans of Norfolk State University (NSU) 88-65. Leading by as many as 31, UMES never let Norfolk State lead, running a helter-skelter offense that was fast paced and yet in control getting easy lay-ups in transition.

UMES (8-8, 1-2 MEAC) played defense as well, forcing 30 turnovers and out rebounding the Spartans 43-28. Norfolk State did shoot well, 41.8 percent, but the Hawks were better (56.4 percent). That hot shooting meant eight players scoring, five of which were in double figures.

Freshmen Casey Morton (Mardela Springs, Md./Mardela H.S.) led all scorers with 20 points, one shy of a career high, while dishing out six assists, matching her career high. She added four rebounds and a pair of steals. The Hawks' other Eastern Shore product, Brittany Adkins (Millsboro, Del./Sussex Technical H.S.), was the game's second leading scorer with 16, 10 coming on the charity stripe. Her points are a new career high. Adkins grabbed three rebounds and had two assists as well.

"Casey did a great job of attacking tonight, as did a lot of our players," said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. "I think [Morton] played one of her better games tonight. She showed some leadership and that is what we need from our point guard," he added.

Chena Parker (Poughkeepsie N.Y./Manhattan Center) and Tiffany Reid (Philadelphia, Pa./National Christian Academy) both scored 12 points. Parker was a board shy of a double double with nine caroms while Reid added a pair. Reid also posted three steals and three assists. Parker also added three assists and a steal and a block.

Also in double figures for the Hawks was April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle H.S.) with 11 points and seven rebounds. She did that in just 23 minutes as she was limited with foul trouble.

UMES jumped out to an early lead 4-0 and ran it to 13 in at the 12 minute mark. They led 20-7 on a Reid jumper. The Lady Hawks would push that lead to as many 25 in the half. They were up that on two different occasions in the half and led 45-28 at the break, up 17.

The Hawk's largest lead, 31 came at the 12:46 mark of the second half when Adkins hit a runner to make the score 64-33. NSU (2-12, 0-5 MEAC) chipped away and got it as close as 17 with 4:11 to play but would get no closer.

"We were penetrating and creating very well tonight," said Batchelor.

The game saw an amazing 55 total fouls and 66 free throw attempts between the two teams. UMES was better than the Spartans on the line, making 23-36 (63.9 percent) while NSU was 17-30 (56.7 percent).

Norfolk State was led in scoring by Raychele Payne with 14 while Danelle Tate had 13 and Ebony Gibbs had ten. All three players came off the bench as the substitutes produced 44 bench points to the starters accounted for just 21.

The 65 points is the most scored by NSU this season.

With the win UMES improves to .500 on the season and gets their first Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference win of the year.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Lady Hawks used an impressive second half shooting display to knock off Florida A&M University (FAMU) 60-50 on Saturday afternoon in the Gaither Athletic Center.

UMES (9-8, 2-2 MEAC) spoiled the Rattlers homecoming by converting seven-of-11 (63.6 percent) from downtown and 14-of-22 (63.6) from the field in the second half.

"I thought both the effort and the energy were better in the second half," said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. "We were able to knock down some shots, which I thought gave us a lot of confidence and swung the momentum in our favor."

On the next trip down the floor Brittany Adkins (Millsboro, Del./Sussex Technical H.S.) was sent to the line where she would convert both free-throws to give the Lady Hawks the lead for good at 32-31.

Both teams struggled shooting in the first half, but it was the second half that made the difference as UMES would finish 39.3 percent from the floor and 33.3 percent from beyond the arc

Meanwhile, the Lady Hawks defense helped their cause by holding FAMU to 31.6 percent from the field and 25 percent from downtown.

UMES dominated the Rattlers on the boards, 47-32, including grabbing seven more on the offensive end, 16-9.

There were 37 total turnovers in the game with FAMU holding a 20-17 advantage, however; the Lady Hawks made the most of those mistakes by converting 15 points to just eight from the opposition.

Tiffany Reid (Philadelphia, Pa./National Christian Academy) led all scorers with 16 points on six-of-10 shooting from the field and four-of-eight from three-point range. She converted all four of her shots in the second half, which included three from beyond the arc. April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle H.S.) recorded her fifth double-double of the season as she added 12 points and 12 rebounds. Parker grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds to go along with six points.

The Rattlers were led offensively by Stephanie Foster who finished with 14 points, while Joslyne Jackson and Taniyah Dawson added 12 and 11 points respectively.

"This was a good win for our team," said Batchelor. "I think it is important to go on the road in a hostile environment and come away with the victory."

After leading 48-36 at the break, UMES would extend their lead back out to 15 on an April McBride (New Rochelle, N.Y./New Rochelle H.S.) free-throw. The Bears would then cut into the advantage, 55-44, on a Shalane Price lay-in, but that was the closest they would come in the second half as the Lady Hawks answered with a nine point run that was capped off by a Tiffany Reid (Philadelphia, Pa./National Christian Academy) three-pointer.

Reid, one of two Lady Hawks to have a double-double, finished with a career-high 24 points and 12 rebounds, which was one shy of tying a personal best. She connected on nine-15 from the floor and six-of-nine from beyond the arc, while adding five assists. McBride recorded her sixth double-double of the season, finishing with 20 points and a career-high 19 rebounds to go along with a new personal best, six assists. Casey Morton (Mardela Springs, Md./Mardela H.S.) also chipped in with 14 points.

The Bears had three players finish in double figure scoring and were led by Corin Adams and Price with 20 apiece, while Brittany Dodson added 19. In the end, UMES outrebounded MSU, 48-32, had more assists, 19-7, but was outscored in the paint, 50-24, and had more turnovers, 20-11.

"It felt good to get this win and the team continues to improve with each game," said Batchelor. "I was really pleased with the way everyone played tonight."

BALTIMORE, Md. — It may have taken four seasons, but University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Head Coach Fred Batchelor got his first win over the Lady Eagles of Coppin State University with a 69-62 decision in the Coppin Center on Monday night. The win gives UMES their fifth straight Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) win, the last four of which have been on the road. It also means that the Lady Hawks elevate themselves to the top half of the conference standings, making the rivalry game against Delaware State on Wednesday even bigger.

UMES (12-8, 5-2 MEAC) got the win with some outstanding scoring and tremendous defense. UMES placed four players in double figures and for the second straight game had two players each record a double double.

Reigning MEAC Player of the Week April McBride posted 18 points and grabbed 16 boards while senior Brittany Adkins recorded her second career double double with 13 points and 13 rebounds.

UMES got scoring from Casey Morton, who tallied 18 points and reigning MEAC Defensive Player of the Week Tiffany Reid who added 15. Reid added three steals and dished out three assists as well.

The Hawks dominated the boards with Chena Parker chipping in with 10 to make it three UMES players in double digit caroms. Jessica Ayilola also came up big with six boards as well to make it a huge 55-35 UMES advantage on the glass.

In what was a well played game, there were just 31 turnovers between the two clubs, UMES seemed to take advantage of their opportunities. They converted twice the points in the paint (16-8), outscored CSU off of turnovers (18-17) and won the second chance points (21-8). The all-around good game saw seven lead changes and five ties and UMES up three, 27-24 at half-time. They took the lead with 49 second remaining in the first half on a pair of McBride free throws, 25-24.

They would not trail the remainder of the game.

The only thing UMES didn't seem to do better than the Eagles was shoot the ball, as Coppin had a clear advantage from the floor but simply didn't get as many shots as UMES did, whether it was from the floor, behind the arc, or from the charity stripe.

The free throw line was a huge advantage for UMES as they took 40 free throws to the Eagles' 21. The Hawks converted just 24 of their free throws, but making more than your opponent takes can be a significant advantage.

"This was a great win," said Batchelor. "We did a nice job of getting good plays and great rebounding. We scored when we had to and really found a way to control the game. I am proud of the team effort."

PRINCESS ANNE, Md.—It wasn't as even as close as the score. The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) Lady Hawks rolled to an easy 105-87 win against Howard University as the Hawks continued their school-record winning streak with its seventh straight win. They led by as many as 41 points and dominated the stat sheet, out rebounding the Bison by 30, 64-34, and shooting a blistering 53.2 percent for the game.

Howard allowed their opponent to score more than 90 points for their sixth straight game but did score a season high 87 on the Hawks. That can be attributed to the pressure defense that Howard put on the UMES second unit, forcing turnovers and converting shots late in the game. In all, they forced 26 Hawk miscues, and committed just 17 of their own.

"I would have liked for us to complete the game a little better," Head Coach Fred Batchelor said. "We have a much better bench than it looked like in the last couple minutes and I thought we didn't play our best to finish the game. I thought we played, at spurts, very well, particularly with the starting lineup and their rotation."

UMES used a slightly different starting line-up with senior Kristi Veltkamp assuming the starting center role, replacing Chena Parker who was out with an illness. The start pushed Veltkamp to her best game of the season with 16 points and nine rebounds. She was aggressive as well, contesting many shots and fouling out early in the second half.

Also aggressive was April McBride who posted her seventh double double of the year with 18 points and 13 rebounds while Tiffany Reid posted 24 points, matching her career high. She wasn't the only Lady Hawk posting career highs as Josephine McLane posted a career high 16 points. Freshmen sensation Casey Morton also finished in double figures with 12 points but contributed more in the transition game, handling the Howard pressure and turning over the ball just once.

Howard led only one time, by a single point in the opening minute. From there UMES ran away to a lead as large as 33 in the half, the margin they would take to the locker room, 54-21 at the break.

The Hawks lead would be 41 mid-through the second half on a Veltkamp jumper that would make it 80-39 just under the 12 minute mark. From there Howard would begin cutting away as Batchelor entered many reserves and mixed up his line-ups.

UMES was beginning to allow the Bison to score but never stopped putting the ball in the basket themselves, as they reached the 100 point plateau for the first time since the 1991-92 season when they downed Bowie State 102-50.

McLane would be the one to put them over that hump as she drained a three from the left wing to make it 101-72 with 4:08 remaining.

Howard never quit, getting a jumper from Asha Santee with two seconds remaining to cut the lead under 20 for the first time since the 8:30 mark of the first half. UMES would win by a final of 105-87, a difference of 18.

Howard's Zykia Brown led them with 19 points while Shannon Carlisle matched her, also with 19. Santee added 17 points while Lonice Kenley had 13. Carlisle led Howard in rebounding with six.

With the win, UMES moves into sole possession of second place in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) as Hampton, the team UMES was tied with entering the night, lost at Delaware State today. Hampton and UMES tangled on Monday at 6:00 p.m. in the Hytche Center.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md. — The University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) sports three players at 6-3 on their roster, but that didn't seem to matter as Hampton used their muscle to out rebound and out play the Lady Hawks in the post and come away with a 68-64 win, snapping the Hawks seven game win streak.

Hampton dominated the glass, collecting 50 rebounds, 18 on the offensive end, and blocked four shots. They stood tall against the bigger team and really out fought the Hawks. They outscored UMES in the paint (22-16) and got 16 points off of second chance points while UMES got just four and only 12 offensive boards.

The Lady Hawks seemed unable to find an answer for the balanced attack of the Lady Pirates as they got 15 points from Rachel Butler, 14 from Quanneisha Perry and 11 from Chinyere Ukoh. Four other players had five or more points while five players also had six or more rebounds. Butler led the game with nine caroms.

"We weren't really ready to play tonight, I didn't see it," UMES coach Fred Batchelor said. "I didn't see the attitude, the mentality that I thought we needed to have going into this game. I thought that they felt if they played good enough they'd win and they weren't really prepared to do what it took to win."

Three Hawks scored in double figures with Tiffany Reid again leading UMES in scoring; she had 17. April McBride had 16 points while Casey Morton pitched in 15 points. Morton and McBride tied for a team high in rebounds with seven.

Neither team shot the ball particularly well as they combined to take 123 shots. Hampton shot 39.3 percent for the game while UMES was just a little worse at 37.1 percent.

Hampton jumped out on the Hawks early, going up by as many as nine but UMES came roaring back at the end of the half, going on a 17-7 run to take a lead at the 2:24 mark. That came on a Queenique Tyler three-pointer, making the score 29-28. Hampton got the lead right back on a Perry lay-in but Brittany Adkins would get a runner and Reid a trey to push it to 34-30 with just over a minute left in the half. Ashlee Finley made one of two free-throws for Hampton and the half-time margin saw UMES up 34-31.

In the second half the Lady Hawks extended their lead to as many as ten. That came a little under six minutes in when Morton got a runner to make it 48-38. From there Hampton came battling back cutting the lead to two with just over nine minutes to play. A minute and a half later the game was tied when Ukoh got a lay-in to make it 55 all.

That was the last UMES lead.

Laura Lewis put them ahead 57-55 just 23 seconds later on a lay-up and Hampton would go on to extend their lead in the final minutes of the game.

The Hawks made one last heroic effort in the closing seconds, making it 67-64 with just ticks on the clock when Reid sank a three-pointer. They were forced to foul on the inbound however and Artavia Burns made one of two free throws to put it out of reach with less than four seconds to play.

With the loss, UMES maintains second place in the MEAC, having a tie-breaker over Coppin State.
