“LADY HAWK HOOPS LOOK TOWARDS SEASON WITH YOUNG EYES”
UMES Women’s basketball announces its 2007-2008 schedule.

PRINCESS ANNE, Md.—The Lady Hawks of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) are looking forward to the 2007-2008 season. On a team with just two seniors, that gaze will be from the perspective of quite a few young eyes.

“We are young yet deep at all positions,” said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. Batchelor gets excited when he talks about his 07-08 squad and why not? It is a team with a recruiting class of seven freshmen, a DI transfer and two super sophomores that partner with two juniors and two seniors.

“We will have three players who were on the All-MEAC freshmen team, each a different year,” added Batchelor. “Those players and some others can have a lot of individual success this season and together that can lead to even more team success.”

Kristi Veltkamp, a 6-3 center, is at the top of those three former All-MEAC freshmen team members. Veltkamp is one of two seniors returning and a former Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Defensive Player of the Year. She averaged just over seven points and five boards last season and blocked 73 shots, more than the rest of the team combined. She finished 23rd in the nation in blocks at 2.4 per game.

April McBride was last year’s freshmen sensation. The six foot wing player was all everything for the Hawks, leading them in scoring at 10.5 points per game, the only Hawk to average double figures, and in rebounding at 7.5 per game. Her sophomore year could be even bigger.

Tiffany Reid is the third member of the Hawks who earned All-Rookie consideration. She earned it after the 2005-2006 season but had to sit out last season due to a shoulder injury. She tallied 7.9 ppg and 6.3 rebounds on a team that finished third in the MEAC and saw Veltkamp average almost 12 points per game and former Lady Hawk Toni Kennedy post an impressive 17 points per game in the year she led the nation in three point shooting. Batchelor is excited to have the 5-10 guard back to play on the wing with McBride as both will just be entering their second year of collegiate competition.

Other top returnees include senior Brittany Adkins and junior Jelila Abdul-Bassit. Adkins, a local product from nearby Millsboro, Del is a 6-1 forward who sees valuable time for Batchelor. Averaging three points and three boards per game, Adkins defines hustle and is a scrappy player Batchelor can count on. Abdul-Bassit, a 5-10 guard, hopes to pick up in Kennedy’s shoes. Her three-point accuracy can be deadly when she is on and Batchelor hopes a new set of players will allow her to get free and be on more time than not.

Also a junior is Jasmine Speed who started 22 games last year for the maroon and grey. She tallied almost six rebounds and five points per game. Her stocky 5-10 frame allows her to play the forward and center positions and gives Batchelor extra toughness on the inside.

The only other player not a freshman this upcoming season is Jessica Ayilola. She is however, part of the new class of players coming in this season. The 6-3 sophomore played one year at Robert Morris University before transferring and sitting out last year. In 2005-2006 Ayilola saw limited action, playing just nine games but starting two before deciding to transfer.

That leaves seven spots on the roster that will all be occupied by freshmen. UMES looks strongest at guard in the incoming class with five players at that position. Talareah Frazier (5-2), who could be one of the conference’s top defenders, sat out last season but is ready to go for the 07-08 campaign. Her competition at the point includes local standout Casey Morton (5-9) who was an early signing for the Hawks and Bria Jackson (5-3) who was the last player signed to the class.

Dominique Reece (5-7) and Queenique Tyler (5-5) will also see time at the guard spot.

Chena Parker (6-3) will see time at center for UMES while Josephine McLane, another early signing, can play a variety of positions from guard to forward.

“We will play a style that will allow everyone to contribute,” said Batchelor. “I don’t think seeing the floor significantly will be an issue for most of our players.”

With such a young team Batchelor made another off-season preparation, a very home friendly schedule.

UMES’s first 13 games are non-conference contests and nine of them will be played in the friendly confines of the William P. Hytche Athletic Center. That doesn’t count an opening exhibition game against Batchelor’s former school Elizabeth City State on November 7 at 7:00 pm.

“It’s a good opportunity to start the season at home with such a young team,” said Batchelor. “Nine home games is great and the opportunity to open at home is wonderful.”

The Hawks open at home on the tenth of November against conference foe Morgan State in a non-MEAC game. From there they host North Carolina Central, who is playing a DI schedule for the first time, on November 14th. UMES closes out the month with return games from last season against Niagara and St. Francis (Pa.)

More return games start December as Longwood and Western Michigan come to Princess Anne on the first and third of the month. The Lady Hawks don’t hit the road until December 6th when they travel a few hours north to Newark, Delaware to take on the University of Delaware. They go to Syracuse on the 19th and then come home ten days later to play Canisius.

Army and Kent State, both big programs, grace the Hytche in January with dates on the third and sixth while UMES travels to American on the 8th.

The Hawks enter their MEAC schedule on the 12th, sort of, when they travel to new MEAC member Winston-Salem State. That game does not count however in conference standings. From there on out it is MEAC games the rest of the way. They meet rival Delaware State on the sixth of February at home and on the sixth of March in Dover. They play a Homecoming game against Florida A&M on the 23rd of February.

“We play some quality schools from some top conferences this season,” added Batchelor. “Then we play the always demanding MEAC schedule, but it will be a good test, we play at home a lot early which allows our new players to adjust to the college game and then we are ready for MEAC play come January. I really like our schedule.”

And when asked about the team, “I really like that too,” he said.

It should be an exciting year for the Lady Hawks.

Scouting Western Michigan

The Broncos come to Princess Anne, Md. on a east coast swing, having played in Washington D.C. on Saturday night. They lost to American 65-61 and have now lost three straight. They have an overall mark of 2-5 with wins over Northwestern and Central Connecticut at home.

Western Michigan averages 67 points per game but allows 76. That is good news for the struggling offense of UMES as they are just averaging just 56 points per game and allowing 54. Defense has never been the questions for the Lady Hawks so hopefully the effort will continue.

The Broncos are led by Tiera DeLaHoussaye who averages 11.1 points per game. She is the only player in double figures but Sara Vest is close with nine a game. They have used the same starting line-up all season with other starters Brenna Banktson averaging 8.9 points and Amanda Parker 8.1 points. They are led on the glass by Ebony Cleary who averages 5.9 boards per game.

Last season Western Michigan defeated UMES in Kalamazoo by a margin of 66-62 with Kristi Veltkamp scoring 15 points.

Last Time Out

A controversial foul call sent the crowd into a frenzy and put Longwood University's Keiva Small on the line with 1.5 seconds remaining and the game tied at 42. She made the first and missed the second, forcing the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) to have no shot attempt and suffer a heartbreaking defeat 43-42 to the Lancers.

With just 25 seconds remaining in the game UMES was down three, 42-39. April McBride drove to the basket, missed in traffic and got the put back to make it 42-41. She was fouled on the play and calmly sunk the free throw to tie it at 42 all. After a timeout Longwood ran their offense but Small missed a jumper to win it. The ball was lose on the floor and Small picked up and attempted a shot that appeared blocked by McBride but a foul was called and Small made the shot and gave Longwood the win.

UMES was without its top scorer Tiffany Reid and reserve guard Jelila Abdul-Bassit for the game. The defensive effort was still there as Longwood scored just 43 points and shot just over 32 percent for the game.

"I can't say enough about the defense," said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. "But when you hold a team to 43 points you have to win. We missed a lot of shots and didn't take advantage of opportunities. We forced 26 turnovers but only scored 16 points on them, half of what we should have. We didn't connect on free throws either, offensively we really just struggled."

The offense was ineffective without Reid or the long distance shooting of Abdul-Bassit. They shot just under 30 percent for the game and only 57 percent from the free throw line. They connected on just two of eight from long range.

April McBride led the Lady Hawks in scoring with 12 points but no other player was in double figures. She also led the rebounding effort with six. Batchelor looked to the bench for some scoring, playing 11 players, but to no avail. Talareah Frazier had a career high seven points and Kristi Veltkamp added six. Only four other UMES players scored.

In contrast, Longwood got 16 points and a game high eight rebounds from Small and 12 points from Odessa Williams. Krystal Garrison added eight to the effort.

The Lancers led the first six minutes of the game but UMES bounced back and made the half a back and forth effort until halftime. The Hawks led 23-22 at the break, a half that saw six ties.

UMES led by as many as four in the second half, another period of play with four ties. They maintained the lead 39-38 with 4:32 to play. William's jumper gave the Lancers the lead with 3:13 to play before the end of game dramatics.

D-Fence

UMES seems to be struggling offensively but defensively the Lady Hawks are stifling. They held Longwood to just 43 points and Saint Francis (PA) to 58 points. Their opponents are averaging just 54 points per game and shooting just under 35 percent from the field.

Oh Snap!

UMES snapped their winless streak against the Purple Eagles of Niagara University with their win. The Lady Hawks had never beaten the Niagara in three tries. The first time to the Hytche Center proved to be the difference as UMES was down 13 and rallied to take the win from a school located 20 minutes from Head Coach Fred Batchelor's boyhood home.

It's Her Party and She Will Shoot if She Wants To

Hawk freshmen guard Casey Morton had a coming out party of sorts in the Niagara win. She exploded for a career high 12 points and 3-7 shooting from behind the arc. "Morton, played well, she made some freshmen mistakes, but we expect that, what matters though is that she finished the game strong," said Head Coach Fred Batchelor. She kept hot in the loss to Saint Francis (PA) scoring a team high 11 points.

Don't Cost Nothin'

Tiffany Reid took advantage of the free throw line in the win over Niagara, connecting on 12 of 16 attempts. Her 17 points led the Hawks and the 'free' throws were exactly what UMES ordered for their comeback win.

100 And Counting

Head Coach Fred Batchelor picked up career win number 100 in the NCCU victory. Batchelor had made seven previous tries at #100 but couldn't manage the win. The win snapped a seven game streak dating back to last season. "The 100 wins are more about the kids who worked hard and dedicated themselves," Batchelor said. "This is a tribute to those kids and the great staff I have had the pleasure to work with. It feels good, especially since it took seven games to get it." UMES hadn't won since February 17, 2007 at Florida A&M.

UNC, UMES, Same Difference

While UMES Women's Basketball is a solid program, one on the rise, no one has been in a hurry to compare them to perennial power North Carolina. Well, you read it here first; the two have something in common, defense. Both teams have faced North Carolina Central this season and both held them to exactly 32 points. The Lady Hawks forced 24 turnovers, forced a field goal percentage of 25 percent and didn't allow NCCU to make a bucket from the field since the 9:40 mark of the second half. In fact, the Lady Eagles, only got one more point the rest of the game.

V For Victory, V For Veltkamp

UMES senior forward Kristi Veltkamp had struggled last season, the year after she earned Defensive Player of the Year in the MEAC. Well, those struggles disappeared, at least on the offensive end as Veltkamp dominated in the post, tallying 16 points and grabbing six rebounds in the win over NCCU.

Reid Returns

Red-shirt Sophomore Tiffany Reid returned to the UMES line-up against Morgan St. after missing the entire 2006-07 season with a shoulder injury. Reid picked up where she left off, scoring a game-high 21 points on 5-8 shooting. Reid also went 9-12 from the free throw line. She was second on the team in scoring against North Carolina Central University, netting 13 points. She missed the Longwood game due to a leg injury but shouldn't miss much time.

April Showers

Sophomore April McBride scored 20 points in the loss to Morgan State. She led her squad by making a game-high seven field goals (7-11 FG), while logging a team-leading 34 minutes. The Lady Eagles of NCCU held her scoreless in the first half but McBride turned in an eight point second half. She has now led the Lady Hawks in scoring twice with the last time coming in the loss to Longwood.

The Batchelor

Fourth-year Head Coach Fred Batchelor challenged his team after their opening loss. "We aren't experienced enough yet to understand what it means to open your season at home against a conference team, even if it doesn't count in the standings. We got outplayed at every position tonight. [Reid and McBride] played great but we struggled to find another presence. This just shows we are young, we have a lot to learn and we have to get better. We have to work harder." Some of that paid off with a win over NCCU.
