Overview

A gritty, "bulldog" type player ... Likes to push the ball on offense, but can also operate in the halfcourt ... A tenacious defender ... Can shoot the three-pointer, but is more effective driving to the hoop ... Has a point guard mentality and does a great job of getting his teammates involved.

Career

Has played in 73 games, making one start ... Averaging 4.7 points, 1.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists ... Shooting 35.6 percent from the field and 31.8 percent from the arc ... Has seven blocks and 98 steals ... Has a career assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.9:1.

On his average of 110 assists per season (220 total), will move into top 10 on Memphis career assists leaders chart (Tony Madlock holds the No.

10 spot on the career assists list with 321) ... On his average of 49 steals per season (98 total), will move just outside the top 10 on the Tiger career steals list (Cheyenne Gibson is No. 10 with 155 steals).

2006-07 Season (Junior)

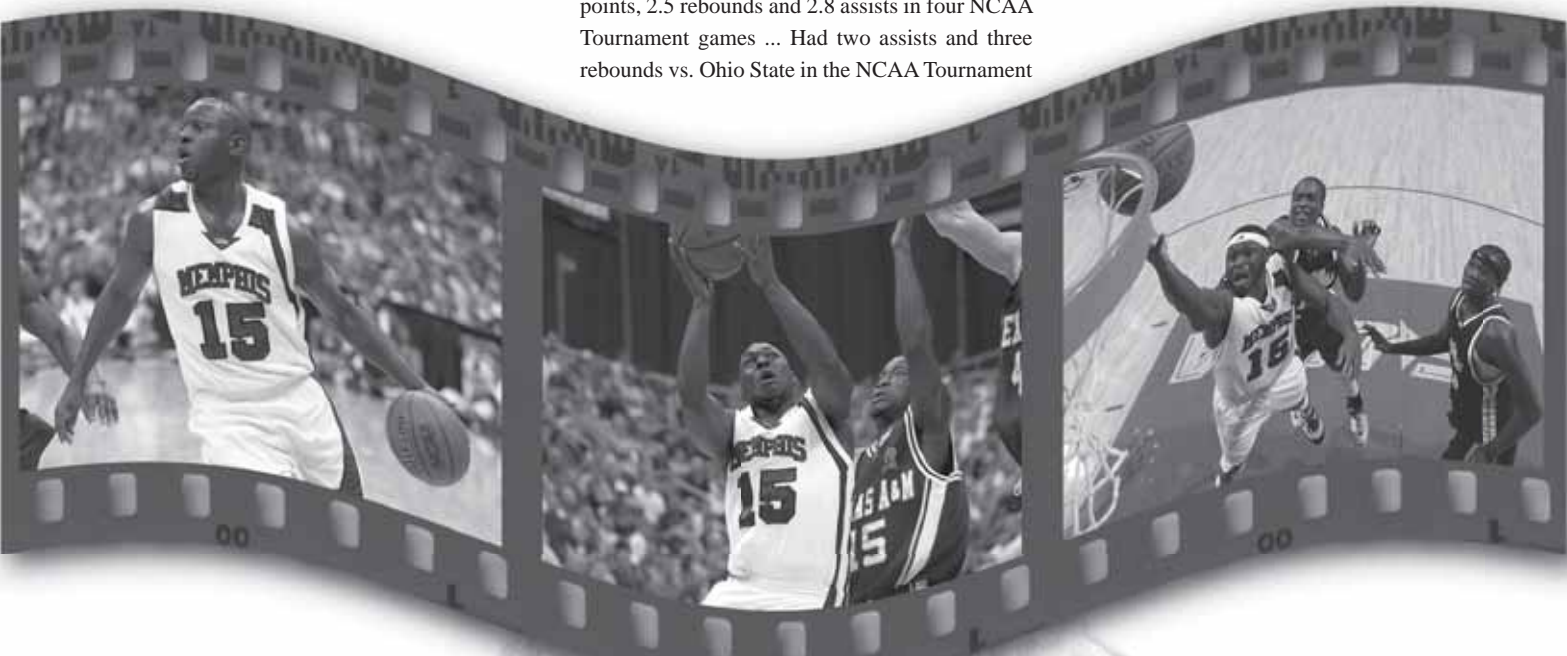
Played in 36 of the Tigers' 37 games ... Missed one game (Middle Tennessee) after suffering a mild concussion in practice the day prior to the contest ... Averaged 5.3 points, 2.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists ... Had an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.8:1 ... Ranked among Conference USA leaders in assists (T15th) and assist-to-turnover ratio (5th) ... Shot 33.5 percent from the floor and 28.9 percent from the arc ...

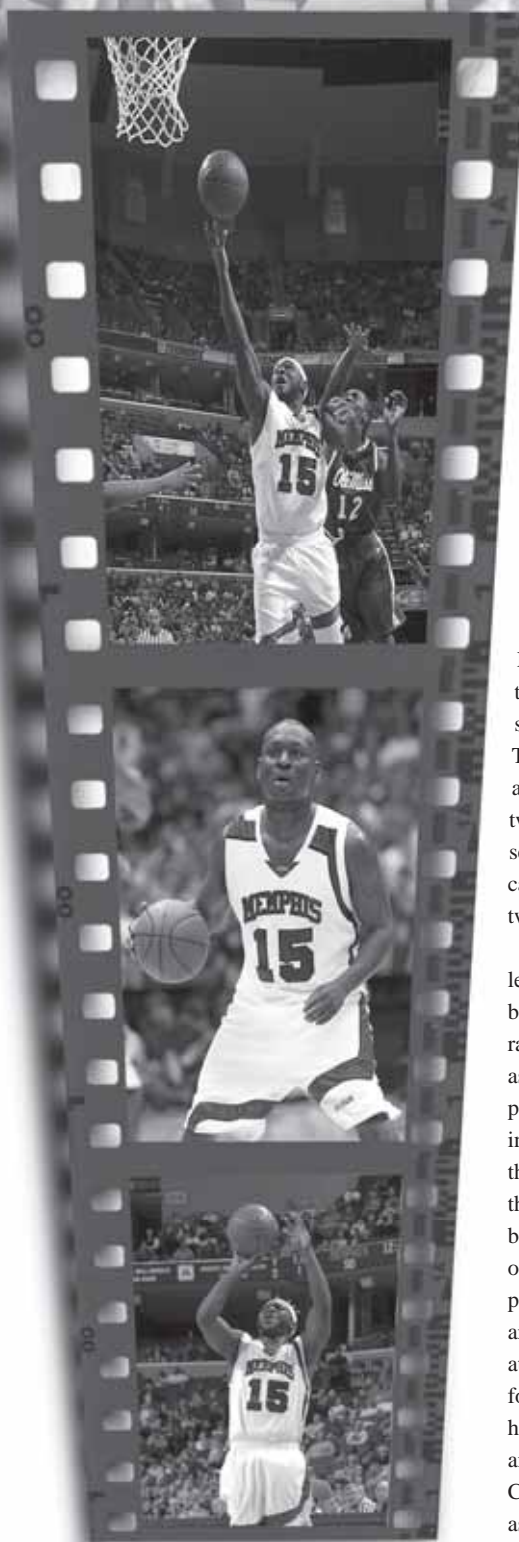

Had a stretch of five games (from Jan. 24/Tulsa through Feb. 8/UAB) in which he had an assist-to-turnover ratio of 4:1 (16 assists, four turnovers) ... Tied a career high with six rebounds vs. UTEP ... Also had five points, five assists and three steals vs. the Miners ... Had four points and five assists vs. Rice ... Scored eight points in both road games at Tulsa and UAB ... Had six assists (with no turnovers) vs. SMU ... Scored eight points and had three assists in a home win over Southern Miss ... Hit a key three-pointer just before the halftime buzzer to give the Tigers a 39-31 lead at the break ... Scored a career-high 15 points at Arizona ... Tied career bests with four field goals made and three treys made ... Tied a career high with eight assists vs. Austin Peay ... Also had three points, three rebounds and three steals vs. the Governors ... Tied a career high with eight assists in a win over Kentucky in the EA Sports Maui Invitational third-place game ... 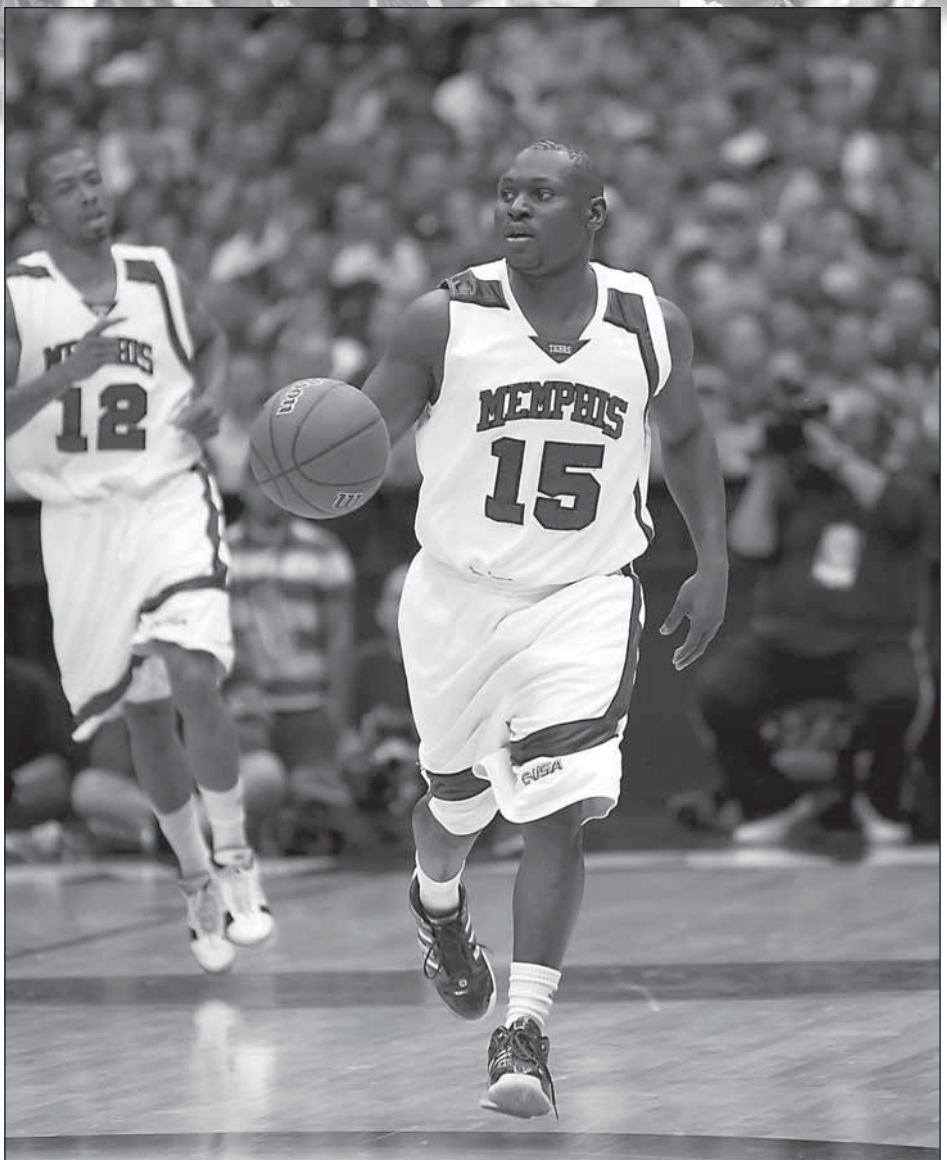

An Associated Press All-State second team selection in 2001 and 2002 ... Four-time All-District 16 AA and *Commercial Appeal* Best of the Preps selection ... Was a finalist for the *Commercial Appeal* Best of the Preps Player of the Year award in 2002 and 2003 ... Helped lead Booker T. Washington to a 34-2 record and the Tennessee Class AA state title as a freshman in 2001 ... Earned Tennessee Class AA state tournament MVP honors ... Highest scoring campaign was his junior year when he averaged 18.8 points ... Also averaged 6.7 assists and 3.4 steals that season ... Highest assists average was 8.4 dishes per game his sophomore season ... Had career averages of 15.8 points, 7.9 assists and 3.4 steals at Booker T. Washington ... Had his high-scoring game of 43 points vs. Sheffield ... Dished out a career-best 20 assists vs. Oakhaven ... Holds the school's single-game assists record ... Also set the state record for assists in a game ... Became the school's first freshman to be named team MVP ... Played for Coach Fred Horton.

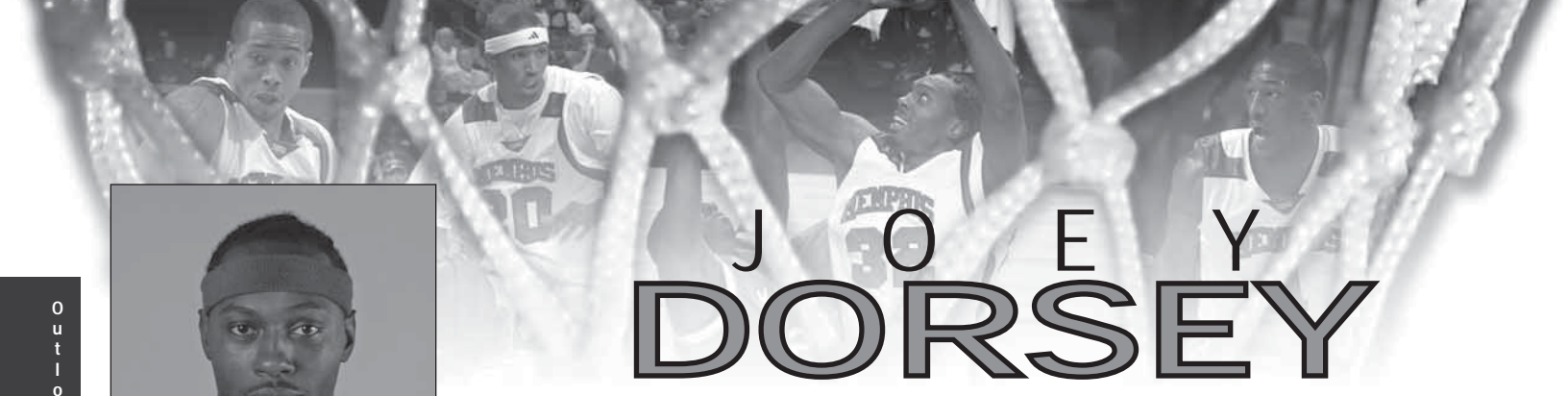

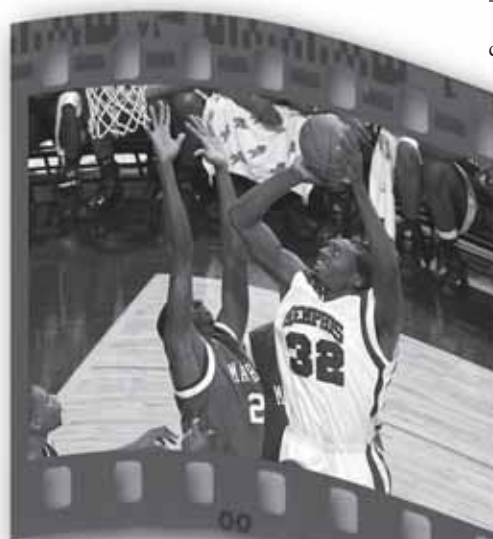
What Could Happen in 2007-08

With 264 points and 153 boards, could become only the fifth player in Tiger history to score

1,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds ... Can move into the top 10 on the Memphis most career games played list ... Enters 2007-08 with 111 games played and needs only 15 to break into the top 10 ... Needs 24 games played to take over the top spot on that list ... On his pace of 64 blocks per season, can move to the No. 2 spot on the Tigers career blocked shots leaders chart ... On his pace of 282 boards per season, could move to the No. 2 position on the Memphis career rebounding list ... On his pace of 40 steals per season, could move into the top 10 on the Tiger career steals leaders list.

Summer 2007

Selected to Team USA for the 2007 Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil ... Team USA placed fifth with a 3-2 record ... The team dropped its first two games, but bounced back to win its final three contests ... Averaged 3.0 points and 3.4 rebounds in five appearances ... In first two games, averaged only 3.0 minutes of action and scored two points and grabbed one rebound ... In last three contests, averaged 19.3 min-



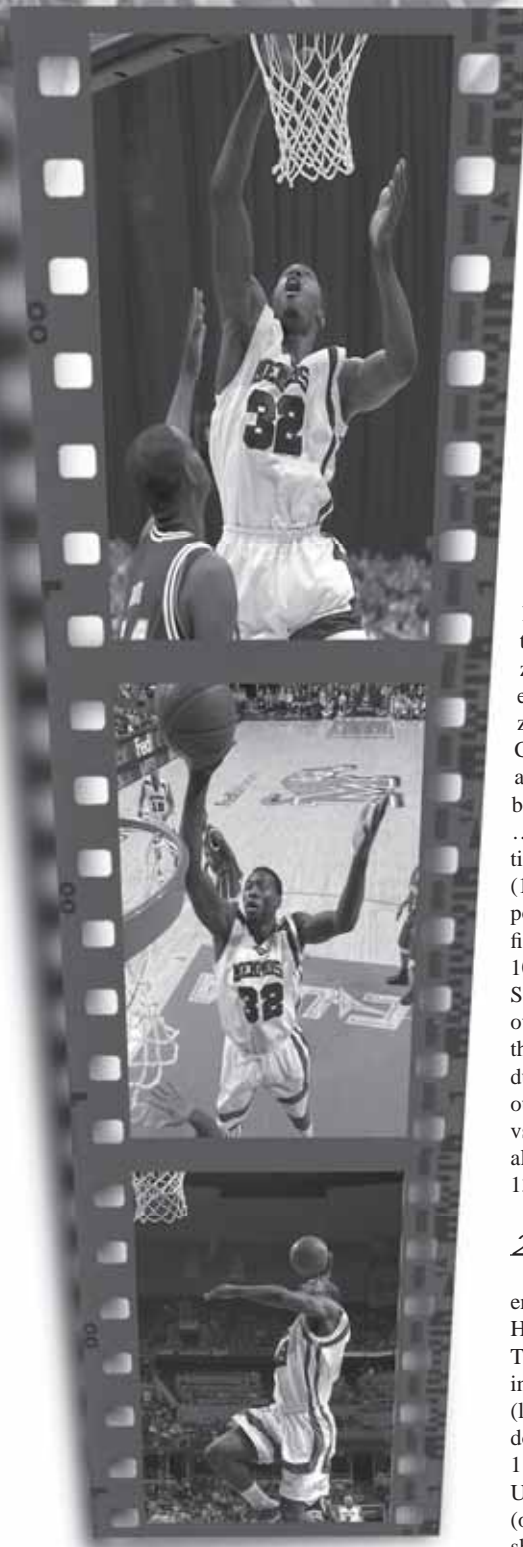
utes and posted 4.3 ppg and 5.3 rpg ... Hit a key free throw late and blocked a last-second three-point attempt in Team USA's upset over Argentina ... Had three points, four rebounds and three assists vs. Argentina ... Grabbed nine boards vs. the U.S. Virgin Islands ... Had five points, three boards and three steals vs. Panama.

2006-07 Season (Junior)

Started all 37 games ... Averaged 8.5 points and 9.4 rebounds (led team) ... Had 81 blocked shots (led team) and 53 steals (second on team) ... The 81 blocks are the sixth-most for single season in Tiger history ... Shot 61.4 percent from the floor (led team) ... Posted seven double-doubles and 20 double-digit rebounding contests ... Tigers were 18-2 when he had double-digit rebounds (only losses at Tennessee and at Arizona) ... Ranked among Conference USA leaders (overall games) in rebounding (1st; 9.4 rpg), field goal percentage (2nd; .614), steals (10th; 1.43 spg) and blocked shots (2nd; 2.19 bpg) ...

Postseason (NCAA/C-USA Tournaments): Started all seven postseason games ... Averaged 7.3 points and 8.7 boards ... Also had 10 blocks and four steals ... Shot 47.1 percent from the field ... In four NCAA Tournament games, averaged 6.3 points and 7.8 boards ... Had eight points and four boards vs. Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament South Regional semifinal ... Posted eight points, nine rebounds and two blocks vs. Nevada and its All-America post Nick Fazekas in the NCAA Tournament second round ... Scored nine points and grabbed 15 boards vs. North Texas in the NCAA Tournament first round ... Averaged 8.7 points and 10.0 rebounds in three C-USA Tournament games ...
