NO. 3/2 TIGERS TO MEET CAL STATE NORTHRIDGE IN NCAA TOURNEY FIRST ROUND ON THURSDAY

The University of Memphis squad (31-3, 16-0 C-USA), ranked No. 3 in the Associated Press poll and No. 2 in ESPN/USA Today poll, opens NCAA Tournament play on Thursday, Mar. 19 when it faces Cal State Northridge (17-13, 11-5 Big West). The NCAA Tournament first round game is slated for an 11:25 a.m. (CT) start at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

CBS Sports (Memphis digital cable channel 3/ WREG) is televising the Tigers-Matadors NCAA Tournament first round game.

Memphis finished the 2008-09 C-USA regular season with a perfect 16-0 league mark and then won the league's postseason tournament. It was the fourth-straight year the Tigers swept the C-USA regular season and tournament titles, and the third-consecutive year they posted an unblemished record in league regular season play.

Memphis enters the NCAA Tournament on a 25-game win streak, which is currently the longest in the nation. The win streak began on Dec. 22 with an 87-49 victory over Drexel. The streak also includes wins over Cincinnati 60-45, Northeastern 80-48, Lamar 108-75, Marshall 80-57, UCF 73-66, Tulsa (away) 55-54, UAB (home) 81-68, Rice 80-

contests and 11 of its last 14 games. The Matadors won the Big West Conference Tournament with wins over UC Santa Barbara (67-60) and Pacific (71-66, ot). Of its three setbacks in the last 14 games, Cal State Northridge dropped two decisions by single digits.

Senior forward Tremaine Townsend leads the Matadors' offense as the squad's lone double-figure scorer at 10.9 ppg. Senior guard Rob Haynes is the team's second-leading scorer at 9.4 ppg. Townsend leads Cal State Northridge on the glass with an 8.4 rebounding average (first in Big West Conference). Haynes (42.3 percent) and junior guard Kenny Daniels (37.9 percent) are the team's top three-point threats.

Cal State Northridge is shooting 45.4 percent from the floor, 35.2 percent from the arc and 69.4 percent from the free throw line. The Matadors are out-rebounding their opponents by an average margin of + 3.6 boards per game (37.3-33.7).

Bobby Braswell is in his 13th season as the head coach of the Matador program. He has an overall record of 205-180 (.532 winning percentage). Braswell has led Cal State Northridge to three regular season titles (two Big West, one Big Sky) and two tournament crowns (one Big West, one Big Sky).

AND THE WINNER GETS...

Thursday's Memphis-Cal State Northridge NCAA Tournament first round winner will meet the California-Maryland winner in the second round on Saturday. The Bears, the West Region No. 7 seed, bring a 22-10 mark into the NCAA Tournament, while the Terrapins, the No. 10 seed, have a 20-13 record.

CALIPARI IN NINTH YEAR AT HELM OF TIGER PROGRAM

John Calipari (Clarion State, 1982) is in his ninth season at the helm of the Memphis Tiger basketball program. He has a 250-68 record (.786 winning percentage) at Memphis.

The 2008-09 season is his 17th as a collegiate head coach. The Moon, Pa., native has an overall collegiate coaching record of 443-139 (.761 winning

- The first one to break the trend was Shyrone Chatman, who started at Memphis in 1997 and graduated August 2002.

MEN'S HOOPS GSR COHORT

- The Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of the Memphis basketball program for the 1998-2001 cohort is 55 percent and has increased from last year's rate of 40 percent. This rate measures freshman and transfer student-athletes who receive athletic aid.
- If the rate was completed today for the 2000-2003 cohort, our rate would be 7 of 11 (64 percent).

MEN'S APR

- When the NCAA release goes out May 2009, the Tiger hoops program will have an Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 953. We also had a 1000 score for the 2007-08 year.
- 925 is the minimum score required by all Division I programs. This rate measures eligibility and retention points for student-athletes each semester that they receive athletic aid. The Memphis basketball APR score of 953 is for the four-year period, 2004-08.

MEMPHIS EXHAUSTED ELIGIBILITY

- For the last NCAA report that tracks student-athletes who completed their eligibility at Memphis, we have graduated 88 percent. This is for 328 student-athletes who entered Memphis as scholarship freshmen during the fall semester for the years, 1992-2002.

percentage). While at Memphis, Calipari has led the Tigers to nine-straight 20-win seasons and nine-consecutive postseason berths.

MATADORS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Cal State Northridge is making its second NCAA Tournament appearance. The Matadors won the Big Sky Conference's automatic berth in 2001 and received a No. 13 seed in the Midwest Region. Cal State Northridge fell to No. 4 seed Kansas 99-75 in the first round in Dayton, Ohio.

BATTLE OF THE ENTERTAINMENT WORLD

Thursday's NCAA Tournament first round game between Memphis and Cal State Northridge features a battle of two schools with prominent entertainers as alumni.

A couple of Memphis graduates that went on to television and film are Dixie Carter, Fred Thompson and Wink Martindale. Matador graduates include Paula Abdul, Richard Dreyfuss, Jenna Elfman, Helen Hunt, Chris Kattan, Cheech Marin and Eva Mendes.

Of course, the city of Memphis is also known as the home for the King of Rock 'n Roll, Elvis Presley, and pop icon Justin Timberlake, who is a huge Tigers' fan.

SEEDING IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

For the fourth time in school history and the second time in the last four years, Memphis earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers also earned a No. 2 seed in the 2007, 1985 and 1982 NCAA Tournaments (*see Memphis' all-time seeds in box on page 5*).

In the 2006 NCAA Tournament, Memphis earned a No. 1 seed, marking the first time in school history the Tigers were a top seed. The 2007-08 Tigers also earned a No. 1 seed.

Overall, this year's No. 2 seed is the eighth time the Tigers are a top four seed. In addition to its No. 1 seed in 2006 and 2008 and four No. 2 seeds in 1982, 1985, 2007 and 2009, Memphis was a No. 3 seed in 1986 and a No. 4 seed in 1983.

The NCAA Tournament began seeding teams in 1979.

MEMPHIS IN NCAA TOURNEY

The Tigers are playing in their 22nd NCAA Tournament in 2009. Memphis has an overall NCAA Tournament record of 30-21 (.588 winning pct.; *see all-time NCAA Tournament results in box at right*).

In last year's NCAA Tournament, the Tigers defeated Texas-Arlington 87-63, Mississippi State 77-74, Michigan State 92-74, Texas 85-67 and UCLA 78-63 to advance to the NCAA title game for the second time in the program's history. Memphis fell to Kansas 75-68 in overtime in the championship game.

The 2008 Final Four appearance was the program's third in school history. The previous two seasons (2005-06, 2006-07), Memphis advanced to the Elite Eight/regional finals, where it lost to NCAA

championship game participants Ohio State (92-76) in 2007 and UCLA (50-45) in 2006.

The Tiger program made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1955. Memphis advanced to the 1973 NCAA Tournament championship game, where it lost to UCLA. The Tigers advanced to their second Final Four in 1985, falling to Villanova in the

national semifinals. Memphis earned five-straight NCAA Tournament bids from 1982-86.

ONE AND ONLY, PART I

Memphis is the only program in NCAA Division I basketball to earn a No. 1 or No. 2 seed in the last four postseason tournaments (2006-09). The

The other 30-win team in the NCAA Tournament is Utah State with a 30-4 record.

CHINESE COACHES JOINS TIGER STAFF AS PART OF CBA EXCHANGE PROGRAM

University of Memphis head coach **John Calipari** started an exchange program with the Chinese Basketball Association in September of 2007, and it will continue through 2012.

The first year of the program in 2007-08 was a huge success. Last year, **Cui Wanjun** stayed with the Tigers and was a part of Memphis' magical ride to the NCAA championship game. In June 2008, Calipari took a team of Conference USA All-Stars to China for a three-game exhibition tour. During pregame ceremonies before the final game, the Tigers' **Robert Dozier** presented Wanjun with his NCAA Final Four ring.

The CBA exchange program continues for the 2008-09 season with the additions of Chinese coaches **Zheng Wu** and **Hu Weidong** to the Tiger staff.

Weidong, a 6-foot-6 guard, is a two-time MVP of the CBA and helped lead China to a bronze medal at the 1994 Goodwill Games. He had offers to play in the NBA in 1998 and 2000, but injuries halted both attempts. Weidong played on the Chinese National Team that competed in the 1992, 1996 and 2000 Olympics.

Wu is a 6-foot-7 guard who played for the Chinese National Team in the 1992 and 1996 Olympics.

TIGERS TOUGH ON THE ROAD UNDER CALIPARI

The old formula goes that a team should win at least 66.7 percent of the time on its home floor, and then win 33.3 percent of the road games. If that is the case, then Memphis head coach **John Calipari's** teams are more than holding their own.

Since Calipari took over in 2000-01, the Tigers have a 153-19 record at home (The Pyramid/FedExForum) for an incredible 89.0 winning percentage.

And, the Tigers have proven to be just as tough on the road in the Calipari era. Memphis has a 69-28 record in road games (not including neutral sites) for a 71.1 winning percentage.

The Tigers' loss at Georgetown Dec. 13, 2008, snapped their 19-game road win streak. The streak dated back Jan. 11, 2007, and went through Mar. 5, 2008.

In 2005-06, Memphis was the last NCAA Division I team in the nation to lose a road game. The Tigers dropped their lone road game Mar. 2, 2006, at UAB 80-74.

TIGER SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM IN CALIPARI ERA

Before **John Calipari** took the reins of the Tigers in 2000-01, the Memphis basketball graduation rate was zero. Enter the new head coach who re-energized the program in several ways — including academics.

Fifteen of his last 18 seniors have earned their bachelor's degrees, and this year's three seniors — **Antonio Anderson, Robert Dozier** and **Chance McGrady** — all are on schedule to graduate in the spring of 2009. Junior **Shawn Taggart**, who transferred from Iowa State, is also on pace to earn his degree in the spring.

One of Calipari's most recent graduates, **Jeremy Hunt**, is playing professional basketball overseas. **Antonio Burks** recently finished up work on his degree in between his overseas playing stints.

In his time at UMass, nearly 80 percent of Calipari's players earned their degrees.

CALIPARI/UNIVERSITY REACH OUT TO FORMER TIGERS

If there is a coach that understands the history of the Tiger basketball program, it is **John Calipari**. And, he also quickly learned how much the city of Memphis and Tiger fans love the program and hold fond memories of past Memphis teams.

With that in mind, Calipari and the University are reaching out to former Tiger players and asking those who want to return to complete their degrees to do so. **Antonio Burks**, who played for Calipari from 2002-04, took advantage of his former head coach's offer and finished in May 2008.

Other former Tigers who returned to school and earned their degrees are **Chris Garner, Cedric Henderson** and **Andre Turner**. All three graduated in 2008. **Turner**, who is better known as "The Little General" of the Tiger squads from 1983-86, made his return to campus after a 20-year professional hoops career overseas.

CBA EXCHANGE - NOT ONLY HOOPS

In addition to the exchange of basketball ideas between the U.S. and China (via Memphis), there will also be an exchange of undergraduate students. During each year of the program, 100 Chinese students will attend the University of Memphis. Also, the UofM opened the Confucius Institute in November of 2007. It is only the 24th such institute in the U.S.

TIGERS TIE C-USA TOURNEY TITLE MARK

With its 2009 C-USA Tournament crown, Memphis claimed its fourth league tournament championship. (2006, 2007, 2008, 2009) The four tourney titles tied Cincinnati's four postseason crowns.

The Bearcats won the 1996, 1998, 2002 and 2004 C-USA Tournaments. The Tigers are the only C-USA program to have won four-straight league tournament championships.

THIRTY TIMES FOUR/PART I

With its three wins in the Conference USA Tournament Mar. 12-14, Memphis went over the 30-win plateau (now has 31 wins; 31-3 record) for the fourth-consecutive year. The Tiger hoops program is the first in NCAA Division I history to record four-consecutive 30-win seasons. Memphis had 33-4 marks in 2005-06 and 2006-07 and a 38-2 record in 2007-08.

Last season, Memphis became only the second school in NCAA Division I history to have three-straight 30-win campaigns. The Tigers joined Kentucky (1947-49; 1996-98) in that select group. Last year's UCLA squad also joined the club after Memphis did so.

FORMER TIGER KEITH LEE EARNS DEGREE FROM UNIVERSITY OF MEMPHIS

You can come back home, and that's always been the case with **Keith Lee**, one of the most beloved players in Memphis basketball history. Tiger Nation has been proud of Lee during and since his playing days in the early 1980s, and now fans have one more reason to cheer for Lee, who was in attendance at the Dec. 20 contest.

The Tigers' all-time leading scorer (2,408 points) and rebounder (1,336 board) earned his bachelor's degree in Interdisciplinary Studies and walked at the University's December commencement on Dec. 13 at FedExForum. A four-time Associated Press All-America from 1982-85, Lee was named the Metro Conference Player of the Year twice and the league's Freshman of the Year in 1982. In his career, Lee helped lead the Tigers to an overall record of 104-24, three Metro Conference Tournament titles, four NCAA Tournament appearances and the 1985 NCAA Final Four.

Lee is one of several former Tigers returning to the Memphis campus to finish their degrees. The following are other former Tigers who graduated from the University of Memphis in recent years:

Last year, Calipari became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to have three-straight 30-win seasons, joining Kentucky's Adolph Rupp (1947-49). UCLA's Ben Howland became the third coach to join the club.

Calipari led the Tigers to 33-4 records in 2005-06 and 2006-07 and an NCAA record 38-2 mark in 2007-08. Memphis enters the NCAA Tournament with a 31-3 mark.

CALIPARI HAS SIXTH 30-WIN SEASON

With the Tigers' victory over Houston Mar. 13 in the C-USA Tournament semifinal, head coach **John Calipari** recorded his sixth 30-win season as a collegiate head coach. It is his fourth-straight 30-victory season at Memphis, as the Tigers went 33-4 in both 2005-06 and 2006-07 and 38-2 in 2007-08. Memphis is 31-3 entering this year's NCAA Tournament.

TIGERS IN TOP FIVE IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

On Feb. 16, Memphis jumped into the top five of the Associated Press (AP) poll for the first time in 2008-09, coming in at the No. 5 spot. On Feb. 23, the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll followed suit and placed the Tigers in the No. 4 position, after ranking them No. 6 in their Feb. 16 poll.

In the Mar. 16 polls, Memphis moved up one spot to No. 3 in the AP poll and to No. 2 in the coaches poll.

CALIPARI'S TEAMS TOUGH AT THE TOP

When teams are ranked in the top five, they become huge targets for all opponents they play. That has been true for **John Calipari**-coached teams at both UMass and Memphis.

But, while some top-ranked teams fall easily,

Calipari squads have done quite well, and in turn, have had staying power near the top of the polls. Calipari's UMass and Memphis teams have an impressive combined record of 134-12 when ranked in the top five of the national polls (.918 winning percentage).

At Memphis, Calipari's teams are 79-6 (.929 winning percentage) when ranked in the top five. During his time at UMass, the Minutemen went 55-6 (.902 winning percentage) when ranked in the top five. The following shows Calipari's record when ranked at or near the top:

ONE AND ONLY, PART III

Memphis is the only program in NCAA Division I history to have three-consecutive years of 25-game or longer win streaks. The Tigers put together win streaks of 25 games in 2006-07 and 26 games in 2007-08. Memphis enters the 2009 NCAA Tournament with a 25-game win streak.

All three Memphis win streaks came under the direction of **John Calipari**, making him the first head coach in NCAA Division I history to accomplish the feat.

UCLA had an NCAA record 88-game win streak from 1971-74, but only had back-to-back years of 30-game win streaks (1971-72, 1972-73). The season prior (1970-71), the Bruins finished the campaign with 15-straight victories, and the year after (1973-74), they won 13 straight for their 88-game streak.

HERE WE GO AGAIN/PART I

For a third-consecutive year, Memphis has the longest win streak in the nation. The Tigers' current win streak is 25 straight entering the NCAA Tournament. Memphis' streak is the longest for the 2008-09 season, moving past Utah State's 19-game streak that ended with a Feb. 14 loss.

It is the third-consecutive year that the Tigers posted the nation's longest win streak. The previous two years, the Tigers posted the longest win streak for each season, with 25 straight in 2006-07 and 26 straight in 2007-08.

STREAKING TIGERS

Don't look now, but Memphis has quietly put together a 25-game win streak. The streak is the longest in the nation, and the following shows the top-five current win streaks in NCAA Division I:

Despite the slow start to 2008-09, the Tigers are streaking now with 25-straight wins. Memphis' current win streak began Dec. 22.

In **John Calipari's** collegiate coaching career, winning streaks have become common. Calipari is in his 17th season as a college head coach in 2008-09, and in those 17 years, his teams have had winning streaks of 10 or more games 13 seasons.

During his tenure at Memphis, Calipari's teams have had win streaks of 10 or more games eight times, including two in the 2007-08 season. Calipari's Tiger teams have also put together win streaks of 15 or more games in four seasons (26 in 2007-08; 25 in 2006-07 and 2008-09; 15 in 2005-06). 2008-09 TIGER SENIORS SET SCHOOL'S WINS RECORD FEB. 18

THIRTY-SOMETHING

When the Tigers held Tulsa to 37 points in the Feb. 11 encounter, it sent both sides to the record books. For Memphis, the last time it held an opponent to 37 or fewer points came in the 1978-79 campaign. In the final game that year, the Tigers held Florida State to 35 points, but dropped the game 35-34 in the Metro Conference Tournament on Mar. 2, 1979.

For the Golden Hurricane, the 37 points were their lowest offensive output since Mar. 3, 1952. In that game, Tulsa netted only 33 points in a 39-33 setback to Oklahoma A&M.

"TAG" TEARING UP THE GLASS

Whatever has inspired Shawn Taggart of late, Tiger Nation hopes it continues the remainder of the regular season and into postseason play. In the 12 recent Memphis victories over No. 18/18 Gonzaga, Tulsa (twice), Southern Miss (twice), SMU, UTEP, UAB, Houston (twice) and Tulane (twice), the 6-foot-10 forward averaged 8.3 boards per game.

Taggart also shot the ball well from the charity stripe in those nine games. The Richmond, Va., native was 43-of-53 from the foul line (81.1 percent).

In the last 12 games, Taggart has three double-doubles and four double-digit rebounding games. He averaged 11.3 points and 8.7 boards in three C-USA

TIGERS HAVE ONE NCAA FIRST

With its win over Tulane Mar. 7, Memphis became the first NCAA Division I school to record three-straight undefeated league seasons with 15 or more victories. The Tigers posted perfect 16-0 records in 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09.

Kentucky had four-straight undefeated seasons in the SEC from 1946-49, but its best mark was 13-0 in 1949. West Virginia has three-consecutive perfect seasons in the Southern Conference, but its best record was 12-0 in 1956-57 and 1957-58. UCLA (1971-73) and Penn (1993-95) had three-straight 14-0 conference seasons.

TIGERS EARN 11TH DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN SEASON IN C-USA

With its win Feb. 14 at Southern Miss, Memphis recorded its 11th season of double-digit victories in Conference USA play. The Tigers finished C-USA regular season play with a 16-0 mark.

In 2007-08, Memphis posted its 10th season of double-digit league wins, which set the C-USA record. Before the shift in C-USA prior to the 2005-06 campaign, the Tigers were tied for the second-most, double-digit conference win seasons with seven (at the time tied with Charlotte).

TIGER SUCCESS AT FEDEXFORUM

After a rough first year at their new home in 2004-05, the Tigers have bounced back quite nicely and made FedExForum one of the toughest arenas

for opponents to play in. The Tigers have a 93-10 overall record (.903 winning percentage) at FedExForum.

Since the 2005 Conference USA Tournament, Memphis has won 83 of its last 87 home games (.954 winning percentage).

TIGERS CLAIM FOURTH-STRAIGHT OUTHRIGHT C-USA TITLE

With its 71-60 victory over UAB Feb. 26, Memphis clinched the 2008-09 Conference USA regular season title outright. The win gave the Tigers a 13-0 league mark. Memphis finished its C-USA season with a perfect 16-0 conference record.

With the win over UAB, the Tigers claimed the C-USA regular season title outright for a fourth-straight year. This is the first time in school history that the Memphis basketball program has won four-consecutive league titles outright.

The C-USA regular season crown is Memphis' fourth-straight and fifth in the last six seasons. Memphis shared the 2003-04 C-USA regular season title and then claimed the league's outright championships in 2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09.

TIGERS TIE A C-USA RECORD

By claiming this year's Conference USA regular season crown, Memphis joins former league member Cincinnati as the only two programs to win

four-consecutive outright C-USA regular season titles.

The Bearcats won four-straight C-USA outright regular season titles from 1997-2000. The Tigers have tied the feat, winning the last four C-USA regular season championships.

MEMPHIS IN CONFERENCE USA

The Tigers have an all-time record of 164-55 (.749 winning percentage) in Conference USA play. Memphis has posted double-digit league wins in 11 of its 14 seasons in Conference USA (includes 2008-09), including a school-record and league-record tying 16 games in 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09.

This year's 16 C-USA victories tied the Tiger record for most league wins in a season in school history. Prior to the previous three campaigns (2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09), Memphis' most C-USA wins were 13 on two occasions in 2002-03 (13-3) and 2005-06 (13-1).

Memphis won its first outright C-USA regular season title in 2005-06, and followed that with outright regular season crowns in 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09. Memphis also tied for the C-USA regular season crown in 2003-04 (12-4 record) and 1995-96 (11-3).

Memphis also won three National Division titles in 1997-98, 2001-02 and 2002-03, and captured two league White Division championships in 1995-

CALIPARI IN CONFERENCE USA

Head coach **John Calipari** has a 117-25 (.824 winning percentage) in Conference USA play. Calipari's teams have posted double-digit C-USA win seasons in eight of his nine years (includes 2008-09). His teams averaged 13.0 C-USA victories per season in his nine years in the Bluff City.

Calipari guided Memphis to five C-USA regular season titles in 2003-04, 2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09, and two league National Division championships in 2001-02 and 2002-03.

STREAKING IN C-USA

Entering league play in 2008-09, the Tigers still have two streaks going in Conference USA.

The Tigers have won 49-straight regular season Conference USA games and 61-straight C-USA overall contests, including the league's postseason tournaments. The last time Memphis suffered a setback to a C-USA foe was Mar. 2, 2006, when the Tigers fell at UAB 80-74 — a span of 1,113 days.

The 61-game win streak (includes C-USA Tournaments) is the longest in C-USA history. The 49-game regular-season win streak is also tops in C-USA history, moving past Cincinnati's 21-game regular season win streak from 1998-99 through 2000-01.

TIGERS' C-USA STREAK AMONG BEST IN NCAA DIVISION I HISTORY

ANDERSON THE ONE AND ONLY

Everyone knows **Antonio Anderson's** game is

an all-around one, and the stats prove it. Earlier this season, the senior became the 45th member of the Tiger 1,000-point club in a win over Northeastern (Dec. 31, 2008).

Against UAB on Jan. 17, the 6-foot-6 guard grabbed his 500th rebound and now has 586 career boards. Then, in the regular season finale versus Tulane Mar. 7, the Lynn, Mass., native recorded his 500th assist and now has 511 dimes, which places him in the No. 5 spot on the Memphis career assists chart.

Anderson is the only player in Memphis history to have 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 500 assists in a career.

Even more proof of his all-around game is that he has 209 career steals (fourth on career steals list).

'REKE AT POINT=BETTER OFFENSIVE FLOW

TIGERS DOUBLE THEIR PLEASURE TIMES THREE IN SAME GAME

On Mar. 7, Memphis wrapped up a perfect Conference USA regular season with a win over Tulane. The day was made even more perfect as three Tigers posted double-doubles in the victory.

Robert Dozier had 16 points and 12 boards, Tyreke Evans 17 points and 10 boards and Shawn Taggart 14 points and 10 boards. The last time three Tigers had double-doubles in the same game was in the 2001-02 campaign. In a 98-93 victory at TCU on Jan. 9, 2002, Kelly Wise had 24 points and 18 rebounds, Chris Massie 19 points and 17 boards and Dajuan Wagner 21 points and 10 assists.

The last time all three double-doubles were points and rebounds was in the first game at The Pyramid on Nov. 29, 1991 (a 92-89 DePaul overtime win). David Vaughn had 16 points and 11 boards, Anfernee Hardaway 18 points and 15 boards and Anthony Douglas 20 points and 13 rebounds.

DOUBLE YOUR SCORING PLEASURE

When **Antonio Anderson** and **Robert Dozier** joined the Memphis 1,000-point club this season, the tandem became only the eighth duo in Memphis basketball history to accomplish the feat in the same campaign.

Prior to this year, the last time two Tigers reached 1,000 points in the same season was the 2004-05 campaign when Rodney Carney and Anthony Rice did so. In two seasons (1982-83 and 1985-86), Memphis had three players score their 1,000th point in the same year.

The three treys made were also a career best for the Lithonia, Ga., native.

Fairfield was able to keep pace with the Tigers, leading by as much as seven after Han's jumper at the 14:57 mark of the first half. The Tigers, however, came back to tie the game at 23-all with an Anderson three-point basket with 8:02 left in the first half. The Tigers ended the first half on a 25-7 run, and led at the break 45-30.

The Stags made things interesting early in the second half, cutting the lead to 11 points after a quick 12-2 run, which was capped by a Greg Nero three-point bucket. The Tigers responded with a Mack trey and never looked back.

Memphis shot 51.8 percent from the floor and 34.8 percent from the behind the arc. The Tigers also made 24-of-30 from the free throw line, good for 80 percent. The Stags were forced into 26 turnovers, which gave way to 37 points off turnovers for Memphis. The Tigers out-rebounded Fairfield 32-20. The Memphis bench also came up big, contributing 35 points in the game.

The game was full of storylines. The contest pitted Memphis head coach John Calipari against the program (UMass) that he raised to a national power in the 1990s. It also had former Tiger assistant Derek Kellogg making his first visit to the Bluff City as the head coach at UMass, his alma mater. The game was teacher (Calipari) versus pupil (Kellogg).

Antonio Anderson had 15 points and a career-high 12 rebounds as No. 13/12 Memphis overcame a poor shooting performance to beat Massachusetts 80-58 before an capacity crowd of over 18,000 for an 11 p.m. (CT) game at FedExForum. The game tipped off ESPN's 23 hours of hoops.

Freshman Tyreke Evans had 19 points and Robert Dozier added 18 for the Tigers, who were held to just 39 percent shooting for the game, including 2-of-19 from beyond the arc.

Ricky Harris led the Minutemen with 17 points, while Tony Gaffney scored 16 points and grabbed a career-high 19 boards.

Despite a first half filled with sloppy ball handling and poor shot selection, the Tigers still held a lead of 33-25. With the Minutemen shooting 30 percent from the field, coupled with 24 turnovers, Memphis was able to pull away in the second half.

Memphis extended their lead into the double digits at the 15:37 mark of the second half when Shawn Taggart converted on a three-point play. Massachusetts never got the deficit under 10 again.

This game marked Calipari's 221st win as the Tiger head coach, surpassing Larry Finch as the program's all-time winningest head coach.

Stephen McDowell led the Mocs with a game-high 27 points, including a 7-for-12 mark from behind the three-point arc. Nichaeus Doaks added 15 points and 16 rebounds.

Antonio Anderson's driving basket at the buzzer lifted Memphis to a 55-54 Conference USA victory over Tulsa. The win extended the Tigers' C-USA win streak to 45 games, including the league's postseason tournament.

Memphis coach John Calipari set up the play after Tulsa's Ben Uzoh hit two free throws to give the Golden Hurricane their first lead of the game with 4.5 seconds to play.

The play — labeled "Maryland" because Lefty Driesell used it in 1982 — called for all the Memphis players to go the left side of the court except for Anderson, who caught the in-bounds pass near mid-court on the right and drove to the basket where he lofted in a double-clutch layup over Tulsa's 7-foot center Jerome Jordan.

Tyreke Evans led the Tigers with 23 points. Jordan had 20 points, 13 rebounds and four blocks for Tulsa. Uzoh added 16 points, eight rebounds and three assists.

Tulsa dominated Memphis on the glass 43-25, but was hurt by 22 turnovers, compared to just 11 for the Tigers.

Memphis led 30-20 after a three-point shot by Tyreke Evans at the 2:19 mark in the first half. It would be their largest lead of the game. Tulsa closed the half on a 6-0 run, making it 30-26 at the halfway point.

The Tigers even led by seven (49-42) with 5:43 remaining in the game. But, Tulsa fought back once again and tied the game at 52 with 1:20 remaining.

Willie Kemp played a huge role in the Tigers' victory with a career-high five steals. He also had two key offensive rebounds late in the second half, and made the in-bounds strike to Anderson for his game-winning layup.

Tyreke Evans scored 22 points, including 14 in the first half, to help lead No. 14/15 Memphis to a 68-50 non-conference victory over No. 18/18 Gonzaga. Robert Dozier played what was perhaps his best game to date this season, scoring 18 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

The win marked the Tigers' 14th straight of the season, the second-longest in the nation.

Memphis began to pull away in the first half and ran its advantage up to 17 at the intermission (40-23) after Evans connected on a three-pointer just before the buzzer.

The Tigers built a 26-point lead in the second half after Anderson's three-point bucket just before the shot clock expired. Only a late 11-0 rally by Gonzaga made the game seem competitive.

Gonzaga was held to a season low in scoring, 29 points below its average, and shot only 36 percent while committing 15 turnovers.

Memphis' defense kept Gonzaga's offense in check. Josh Heytvelt was held to only 11 points, with most of those coming after the game had already been put away. Matt Bouldin, coming off a game at Portland where he scored a career-high 26 points, was held to just six points, seven below his season average.

Perhaps the best defensive job was performed on Jeremy Pargo, the reigning West Coast Conference Player of the Year. Pargo, who was defended most of the game by Doneal Mack, was held to just two points, while committing five turnovers.

The Bulldogs were outrebounded 39-25 and had five of their shots sent away, including three by Shawn Taggart.

This marked the fourth game between the two teams in what has become an annual series. Memphis has won all four meetings.

Memphis implemented a trap on Jordan nearly every time he touched the ball, causing him to have to make tough passes. Shawn Taggart, Dozier and Pierre Henderson-Niles forced Jordan into six turnovers.

The Tigers held Tulsa to just 36 percent shooting for the game, including 25 percent in the first half and 22 percent from beyond the arc.

Memphis struggled in the first half, missing 14 of its first 20 shots. However, the Tigers went on 11-2 run over the final six minutes of the half to take a 28-15 lead at the intermission.

During the run, the Tigers got a layup from Evans, a three-pointer from Dozier and two three-point plays. Tulsa scored only two points in the final 6:24 of the first half.

Ben Uzoh, Tulsa's leading scorer, was held scoreless in the first half, and scored just three points in the entire game.

Memphis forced 24 Golden Hurricane turnovers, grabbing 16 steals in the process, as well as scoring 22 points off of the turnovers. Tulsa's 37 points were the program's fewest in game since it scored 33 points in a 39-33 loss to Oklahoma A&M on Mar. 3, 1952.

Tyreke Evans scored 19 points and grabbed six rebounds to help lead the No. 8/10 University of Memphis Tigers to a 72-47 Conference USA victory over Southern Miss. Antonio Anderson and Robert Dozier each added 12 points.

The Tigers' win marked their 16th straight this season, now the longest winning streak in the nation after Utah State fell to Boise State later that same day. The victory is also Memphis' 52nd straight in Conference USA.

Southern Miss was led by Jeremy Wise, who scored 15 points on 4-of-10 shooting. Courtney Beasley chipped in 12 points.

The Golden Eagles were able to hang around for the first half and actually took a quick lead of 32-31 in the opening minutes after intermission. However, Evans then scored nine-straight points in a 10-2 run that gave Memphis a 41-34 advantage. The Tigers did not trail the rest of the way.

For one stretch in the second half, the Tigers held Southern Miss to one field goal in a 7:25 span, resulting in a 21-5 Memphis run and giving the Tigers a 52-37 lead with 11:47 remaining.

The Tigers, once again, showed off their stellar defense, holding the Golden Eagles to just 37.5 percent shooting for the game, including 16.7 percent from beyond the arc. Southern Miss' 47 points marked the third-lowest total a team had scored against Memphis this season.

This victory was even more special for the three seniors on the Tigers' squad. Robert Dozier, Antonio Anderson and Chance McGrady earned their 126th victory as Tigers, tying a school record for most wins in a four-year period in school history.

Tyreke Evans scored 23 points and Shawn Taggart added 12 and grabbed 10 rebounds as the No. 5/3 Memphis Tigers ran their win streak to 21 straight with a 69-60 Conference USA victory over Houston.

Robert Dozier added 15 points for the Tigers, who have now won 57-consecutive games in Conference USA. Memphis' last loss in C-USA play was more than three years ago on Mar. 2, 2006, at UAB.

With a victory over Tulane in their regular season finale on Saturday, the Tigers will complete their third-consecutive unbeaten year in conference play.

Aubrey Coleman scored 19 points and Qa'raan Calhoun added 15 for the Cougars, who have lost nine straight to Memphis.

The Cougars missed six of their first seven shots, allowing the Tigers to open the game on an 11-2 run. Memphis would never trail in the game after that.

The Tigers took a 37-31 lead into halftime, after an 8-0 run by Houston late in the first half.

Calhoun hit a deep 3 with 9:41 left in the second half to tie it at 48. The Tigers would again take control of the game with an 11-2 spurt. Dozier, Taggart and Evans each drove for layups, before Dozier finished a fast break with another easy basket. He was fouled and completed the three-point play to put the Tigers up 59-50.

Houston cut the lead to five again, making it 63-58 with two minutes remaining. Memphis, however, would make all of its free throws down the stretch, going 14-of-14 from the line in the game.

The Tigers' defense held the Cougars to only 35 percent shooting for the game, including 26.7 percent from beyond the arc. Memphis outrebounded Houston 37-33.

On a Senior Day that Tiger Nation enjoyed and did not want to end, the senior trio of Antonio Anderson, Robert Dozier and Chance McGrady went out in style with a 74-47 Conference USA victory over Tulane in the No. 5/3 Tigers' final regular season home game of 2008-09.

Three Tigers — Dozier (16 points/12 rebounds), Tyreke Evans (17 points/10 rebounds) and Shawn Taggart (14 points/10 rebounds) — posted double-doubles in the victory. Anderson had four assists and became the first player in school history to record 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 500 assists in a career.

Kevin Sims led Tulane with 14 points, five boards and three assists. Robinson Louisme added nine points.

It looked as if the Green Wave would play spoiler on the Tigers' special day. Down 35-26 at the intermission, Tulane cut the Memphis lead to 44-41 on consecutive treys by Daniel Puckett and Sims.

From that point, the Tigers took control and finished the contest with a 30-6 run. Anderson (seven points) and Dozier (three points) combined for the first 10 points in the spurt for a 54-43 lead at the 8:21 mark. Just over four minutes later, Robert Sallie connected on back-to-back treys for a 68-45 lead with 3:05 remaining.

Memphis opened the game with a 10-2 run, but Tulane bounced back to cut the Tiger advantage to two at 12-10 with 12:37 left. Memphis then responded with an 18-8 spurt to take a 30-18 lead five minutes before the break.

The Tigers shot 47.6 percent from the field, and held the Green Wave to 29.8 percent from the floor. Memphis won the battle on the boards 47-26.

For the seniors, Robert Dozier, Antonio Anderson and Chance McGrady, the win made them the winningest players in the history of college basketball. The trio now has 134 wins in their four-year career at Memphis. The previous record of 133 wins was held by Duke from 1998-2001.

The Tigers also extended their Conference USA winning streak to 60 games, now only four games behind the Kentucky record of 64 straight. It was also the 24th-straight victory this season for Memphis.

Kelvin Lewis led Houston with 18 points on 5-of-12 shooting. Aubrey Coleman added 14 points.

Memphis was able to build a lead early and sustain it throughout the game. The Tigers pushed their lead to 11 points after a Witherspoon layup at the 11:58 mark of the first half. The lead would stay in double digits for the rest of the game.

After Houston's Kelvin Lewis made two free throws to open the second half to cut the Tiger lead to 34-24, Memphis went on a 27-0 run over the next 9:52 to take a commanding 61-24 advantage.

The Tigers dominated the glass, out-rebounding the Cougars 48-24. Memphis also held Houston to 34 percent shooting for the game, including just 20 percent from beyond the arc.

Tulsa, which had won seven straight entering the contest, scored the fewest points ever in a C-USA Tournament game. Glenn Andrews led the Golden Hurricane with 13 points.

Tulsa kept up for a while in the first half, coming within three points at 21-18 after Steven Idlet made two free throws at the 4:09 mark. The Tigers, however, closed the first half on a 7-2 run for a 28-20 halftime advantage.

Memphis led 43-30 at the 12:04 mark of the second half and used a 14-0 run to take a 57-30 advantage with 6:15 left to put the contest out of reach.

The Tigers held Tulsa's leading scorers to a combined 7-of-28. Jerome Jordan had four points, Ben Uzoh seven points (3-of-11 FG) and Ray Reese six points. The Golden Hurricane missed 13 of their first 15 shots after the intermission, and went scoreless for 6 1/2 minutes of the second half.

The Tigers outrebounded Tulsa 41-37 and held the Golden Hurricane to 26 percent shooting from the floor, including 14 percent from beyond the arc.

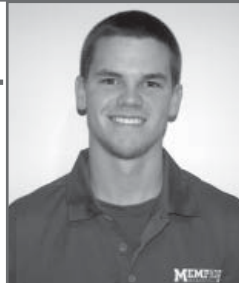
