TIGERS HOST NO. 11/11 SYRACUSE IN A TOP-25 MATCH-UP AT FEDEXFORUM ON SATURDAY

The University of Memphis squad (6-2, 0-0 C-USA), ranked No. 23 in the Associated Press poll and No. 21 in ESPN/USA Today poll, continues its seven-game homestand at FedExForum on Saturday, Dec. 20 when it hosts No. 11/11 Syracuse (10-1, 0-0 Big East). Game time is 5 p.m. (CT), and ESPN is slated to televise the contest.

The Tigers' homestand continues over the Christmas and New Year holidays with games against Drexel Dec. 22, Cincinnati Dec. 29, Northeastern Dec. 31, Lamar Jan. 3 and Marshall Jan. 7. Memphis opened this seven-game homestand Dec. 17 with a 59-51 victory over Arkansas-Little Rock. The Tigers' next road game is Jan. 10 at UCF in Orlando, Fla.

Prior to its Dec. 17 victory over Arkansas-Little Rock, Memphis dropped its road opener of the 2008-09 campaign with a 79-70 overtime setback at No. 19/19 Georgetown Dec. 13. The loss ended the Tigers' 19-game road win streak that stretched back to the middle of the 2006-07 season. Before the Georgetown loss, the Tigers were off 10 days for fall semester final exams.

Syracuse brings a 10-1 record into Saturday's top-25 match-up at FedExForum. The Orange won

contest when the Vikings hit a 60-foot desperation shot at the final buzzer.

Sophomore guard Jonny Flynn leads four players averaging double figures at 17.5 ppg. Eric Devendorf (13.9 ppg), Paul Harris (13.4 ppg) and Arinze Onuaku (13.0 ppg) also average double digits in the scoring column. Harris leads the Orange on the glass with an 8.9 rebounding average, while Onuaku is second at 7.6 rpg. Flynn is tops on the squad with 53 assists (4.8 apg) and 20 steals.

The Orange are shooting 50.2 percent from the field, 30.3 percent from the arc and 67.1 percent from the charity stripe. Syracuse is out-rebounding its opponents by an average margin of +5.9 boards per game (40.9-35.0).

**FORMER TIGER KEITH LEE
EARNs DEGREE FROM
UNIVERSITY OF MEMPHIS**

You can come back home, and that's always been the case with **Keith Lee**, one of the most beloved players in Memphis basketball history. Tiger Nation has been proud of Lee during and since his playing days in the early 1980s, and now fans have one more reason to cheer for Lee, who will be in attendance at Saturday's contest.

The Tigers' all-time leading scorer (2,408 points) and rebounder (1,336 board) earned his bachelor's degree in Interdisciplinary Studies and walked at the University's December commencement on Dec. 13 at FedExForum. A four-time Associated Press All-America from 1982-85, Lee was named the Metro Conference Player of the Year twice and the league's Freshman of the Year in 1982. In his career, Lee helped lead the Tigers to an overall record of 104-24, three Metro Conference Tournament titles, four NCAA Tournament appearances and the 1985 NCAA Final Four.

Lee is one of several former Tigers returning to the Memphis campus to finish their degrees. The following are other former Tigers who graduated from the University of Memphis in recent years:

ninth season at the helm of the Memphis Tiger basketball program. He has a 225-67 record (.771 winning percentage) at Memphis.

The 2008-09 season is his 17th as a collegiate head coach. The Moon, Pa., native has an overall collegiate coaching record of 418-138 (.752 winning percentage). While at Memphis, Calipari has led the Tigers to eight-straight 20-win seasons and eight-consecutive postseason berths.

TIGERS TAKING OVER ESPN

Maybe for Saturday afternoon, ESPN should change their call letters to TSPN — Tiger Sports Programming Network. Memphis sports will be featured on both ESPN and ESPN2 Saturday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m. (CT).

The Tiger football team starts the afternoon with its appearance in the St. Petersburg Bowl against Big East opponent South Florida. Game time is 3:30 p.m. (CT) on ESPN2. Then, Memphis basketball will be on ESPN at 5 p.m. (CT) when it hosts Big East foe Syracuse at FedExForum.

BATTLE OF WINNINGEST PROGRAMS IN THIS DECADE ON SATURDAY

Saturday's encounter between Memphis and Syracuse pits two of the winningest basketball programs since the 2000-01 campaign (see box on page 9). The Tigers are the fifth-winningest program since 2000-01 — the year **John Calipari** arrived in the Bluff City — with 240 victories. The Orange are tied for the No. 8 spot on that list with 232 wins.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

For the first time in the short Memphis-Syracuse series, a home contest will be played when the Tigers host the Orange at FedExForum Saturday. The previous encounters between the two storied programs took place on a neutral court at Madison Square Gar-

den in New York, N.Y. Both contests were part of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

Next season (2009-10), the Tigers will make their first trip to Syracuse to play the Orange in the Carrier Dome.

TIGERS' MEMORABLE WIN OVER THE ORANGE

In a game that many national basketball pundits gave Memphis little chance to win, the Tigers rode the shooting of freshman Jeremy Hunt to a 70-63 upset victory over Syracuse in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at Madison Square Garden. It was the season opener for both teams.

Hunt finished with 19 points to lead Memphis. Matching Hunt point-for-point was Orange phenom Carmelo Anthony, who scored a game-high 27 points.

John Grice added 17 for Memphis, while Rodney Carney, another Tiger freshman, had 12 points, nine boards (team high) and five assists. Anthony tied for Syracuse rebounding honors with Hakim Warrick with 11 boards each. Warrick now plays for the NBA's Memphis Grizzlies.

Memphis and Syracuse went on to have outstanding seasons, as both earned NCAA Tournament bids. The Orange won the NCAA title that season.

CALIPARI'S MEMORABLE WIN OVER THE ORANGE

John Calipari's first NCAA Tournament team and 30-win season at UMass came in the 1991-92 campaign, and it was a memorable year for the Minutemen. The season was extended another weekend in March with some late-game heroics and a victory in the NCAA second round over Syracuse.

Calipari led UMass to its first Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, and the Minutemen earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. After a first round win over Fordham in Worcester, Mass., Calipari and UMass faced the No. 6 seed Orange in the second round.

The contest went into overtime, and the contest remained in the balance late in the extra session when UMass' Harper Williams threw up a three-point prayer with the shot clock running down. Harper's trey gave the Minutemen the lead for good en route to the 77-71 victory that propelled UMass to the Sweet 16 the following week.

LOVE THOSE LONG HOMESTANDS

The Tigers continue their seven-game homestand Saturday when they host No. 11/11 Syracuse at FedExForum. Following Saturday's game, Memphis also hosts Drexel Dec. 22, Cincinnati Dec. 29, Northeastern Dec. 31, Lamar Jan. 3 and Marshall Jan. 7. The Tigers opened this homestand Dec. 17 with a 59-51 victory over Arkansas-Little Rock.

This seven-game homestand is the longest in the John Calipari era (since 2000-01). The previous longest homestand under Calipari was six-straight home games at FedExForum in 2005-06 (Dec. 20, 2005-Jan. 8, 2006). Memphis posted a 5-1 record in that homestand with wins over Louisiana Tech, Gon-

zaga, Purdue, Middle Tennessee and Winthrop. The lone loss was to Texas.

The last time Memphis had a stretch of seven-consecutive home games or longer was back in the 1995-96 campaign. The Tigers posted a perfect 7-0 record in that stretch with home wins over Jackson State, Florida A&M, Georgia State, Tennessee, Sam Houston State, Louisiana-Monroe and Temple. During that homestand, Memphis rose in the national polls from No. 7 to No. 3. Ironically, the Tigers' first contest after the seven-game homestand was a neutral site game versus Calipari's UMass Minutemen in Worcester, Mass. The No. 1 Minutemen defeated the No. 3 Tigers 64-61.

To find a longer homestand than seven, one has to go all the way back to the 1979-80 campaign when the Tigers played nine-straight at home from Dec. 1, 1979-Jan. 3, 1980. Memphis went 7-2 in that homestand.

The Tigers also had a nine-game homestand in the 1975-76 season (9-0 record) and an eight-game homestand in 1974-75 (7-1 record).

MEMPHIS VS. THE BIG EAST

The Tigers are 125-137 all-time versus current members of the Big East Conference. Memphis has played Cincinnati (30-36), Connecticut (1-0), DePaul (14-12), Georgetown (2-7), Louisville (34-51), Marquette (14-12), Pittsburgh (1-1), Providence (2-3), St. John's (0-1), Seton Hall (3-1), Syracuse (1-1), USF (18-3), Villanova (4-8) and West Virginia (1-1).

Memphis has played 14 of the 16 Big East schools, leaving Notre Dame and Rutgers as the only two the Tigers have not faced. Most of the contests versus Cincinnati, DePaul, Louisville, Marquette and USF were league games (Missouri Valley, Metro, Great Midwest, Conference USA).

Since the start of the 2005-06 campaign (when the Big East realigned), Memphis is 7-1 against teams from the Big East. Earlier this year, the Tigers defeated Seton Hall 84-70 in the semifinals of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off on Nov. 21, but lost at Georgetown 79-70 in overtime on Dec. 13. Last year, Memphis posted victories over Big East foes Connecticut, Georgetown and Cincinnati.

Syracuse's Hakim Warrick netted a game-high tying 25 points, and Gerry McNamara added 21 points to lift the No. 5/6 Orange to a 77-62 victory over No. 24/23 Memphis in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic championship game. Craig Forth led Syracuse on the boards with six rebounds.

Tiger forward Rodney Carney tied Warrick for game-high scoring honors with 25. Sean Banks and Darius Washington Jr. each scored 13 points apiece. Duane Erwin led Memphis with 10 boards.

The contest was tied at 51-all with 7:59 left after a Banks' jumper. But that's when the Orange's veteran leadership took control of the contest.

Over the next two minutes, Syracuse put together an 11-2 run to take the lead for good at 62-53. McNamara led the spurt with four points. The Tigers were able to cut the Orange advantage to six points on two occasions — both Washington three-pointers — but could get no closer. McNamara put the game away with a three-point play (layup, free throw) with only 2:39 left.

The Orange jumped out to an early 9-3 advantage and never fell behind in the first half. Down 19-12, Memphis was able to put together a 9-2 run to tie the contest at 21-all at the 4:43 mark. A Banks' trey and layups from Carney and Washington led

the spurt. Syracuse regained the lead and held a narrow 31-29 advantage at the break.

The Orange shot 50 percent from the field and 78.1 percent from the foul line. Memphis managed only 32.8 percent shooting from the floor. Syracuse won the battle on the boards 36-30.

MEMPHIS, MAKE ROOM FOR ANOTHER KING

Move over a little, Elvis. You too, Jerry Lawler. There is another king in Memphis.

With the Tigers' 80-58 victory over UMass Nov. 17, head coach **John Calipari** became the winningest coach in Memphis basketball history. Calipari entered 2008-09 with 219 wins at Memphis, and with his squad's six victories this year, he surpassed Larry Finch's win total of 220. TIGER SUCCESS AT FEDEXFORUM

After a rough first year at their new home in 2004-05, the Tigers have bounced back quite nicely and made FedExForum one of the toughest arenas for opponents to play in. Since the 2005 Conference USA Tournament, Memphis has won 68 of its last 71 home games (.958 winning percentage).

Overall, the Tigers have a 78-9 record (.897 winning percentage) at FedExForum. Memphis had a perfect 19-0 home mark in 2006-07, and was 20-1 at FedExForum in 2007-08.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Memphis has had a long history of success in non-league games, and that has continued under head coach **John Calipari**. Since Calipari took over in 2000-01, the Tigers have a non-conference record (including postseason) of 116-36 for a 76.3 winning percentage.

In 2007-08, Memphis had a 22-2 record against non-conference opponents (including postseason).

CALIPARI, BOEHEIM AMONG COACHING ELITE

John Calipari already counted himself among the coaching elite in terms of coaching wins in the first nine, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 years. Well, just a few games into 2008-09 — his 17th season as a head coach — he is already in the top five for most wins by an NCAA Division I coach in his first 17 years.

Calipari took over the No. 2 spot on that list with the Tigers' Dec. 2 win over Marist. Syracuse's Jim Boeheim is also on that list, sitting in the No. 4 spot with 411 wins in his first 17 years.

CHINESE COACHES JOINS TIGER STAFF AS PART OF CBA EXCHANGE PROGRAM

University of Memphis head coach **John Calipari** started an exchange program with the Chinese Basketball Association in September of 2007, and it will continue through 2012.

The first year of the program in 2007-08 was a huge success. Last year, **Cui Wanjun** stayed with the Tigers and was a part of Memphis' magical ride to the NCAA championship game. In June 2008, Calipari took a team of Conference USA All-Stars to China for a three-game exhibition tour. During pregame ceremonies before the final game, the Tigers' **Robert Dozier** presented Wanjun with his NCAA Final Four ring.

The CBA exchange program continues for the 2008-09 season with the additions of Chinese coaches **Zheng Wu** and **Hu Weidong** to the Tiger staff.

Weidong, a 6-foot-6 guard, is a two-time MVP of the CBA and helped lead China to a bronze medal at the 1994 Goodwill Games. He had offers to play in the NBA in 1998 and 2000, but injuries halted both attempts. Weidong played on the Chinese National Team that competed in the 1992, 1996 and 2000 Olympics.

Wu is a 6-foot-7 guard who played for the Chinese National Team in the 1992 and 1996 Olympics.

FEDEXFORUM
THE HOME OF THE TIGERS

The 2008-09 season marks the fifth for the Tigers in their home arena, FedExForum, which officially opened in September, 2004. Located just a few feet off Beale Street on historic Highway 61, FedExForum rises to extend the heart of the Memphis entertainment district.

Memphis plays all of its 2008-09 home contests in the 18,400-seat arena and also hosts its C-USA rivals during the 2009 C-USA Tournament. At 135 feet high, FedExForum provides a new backdrop for historic Beale Street. The 805,850 square-foot arena, covering 13.8 acres, features five levels as well as state-of-the-art locker rooms and facilities for sports teams, as well as an exceptional dining and entertainment experiences for its patrons.

TIGERS TOUGH ON THE ROAD UNDER CALIPARI

The old formula goes that a team should win at least 66.7 percent of the time on its home floor, and then win 33.3 percent of the road games. If that is the case, then Memphis head coach **John Calipari's** teams are more than holding their own.

Since Calipari took over in 2000-01, the Tigers have a 135-18 record at home (The Pyramid/FedExForum) for an incredible 88.2 winning percentage.

And, the Tigers have proven to be just as tough on the road in the Calipari era. Memphis has a 59-28 record in road games (not including neutral sites) for a 67.8 winning percentage.

The Tigers' loss at Georgetown Dec. 13, 2008, snapped their 19-game road win streak. The streak dated back Jan. 11, 2007, and went through Mar. 5, 2008.

In 2005-06, Memphis was the last NCAA Division I team in the nation to lose a road game. The Tigers dropped their lone road game Mar. 2, 2006, at UAB 80-74.

TIGER SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM IN CALIPARI ERA

Before **John Calipari** took the reins of the Tigers in 2000-01, the Memphis basketball graduation rate was zero. Enter the new head coach who re-energized the program in several ways — including academics.

Fifteen of his last 18 seniors have earned their bachelor's degrees, and this year's three seniors — **Antonio Anderson**, **Robert Dozier** and **Chance McGrady** — all are on schedule to graduate in the spring of 2009. Junior **Shawn Taggart**, who transferred from Iowa State, is also on pace to earn his degree in the spring.

One of Calipari's most recent graduates, Jeremy Hunt, is playing professional basketball overseas. Antonio Burks recently finished up work on his degree in between his overseas playing stints.

In his time at UMass, nearly 80 percent of Calipari's players earned their degrees.

CALIPARI/UNIVERSITY REACH OUT TO FORMER TIGERS

If there is a coach that understands the history of the Tiger basketball program, it is **John Calipari**. And, he also quickly learned how much the city of Memphis and Tiger fans love the program and hold fond memories of past Memphis teams.

With that in mind, Calipari and the University are reaching out to former Tiger players and asking those who want to return to complete their degrees to do so. Antonio Burks, who played for Calipari from 2002-04, took advantage of his former head coach's offer and finished in May 2008.

Other former Tigers who returned to school and earned their degrees are Chris Garner, Cedric Henderson and Andre Turner. All three graduated in 2008. Turner, who is better known as "The Little General" of the Tiger squads from 1983-86, made his return to campus after a 20-year professional hoops career overseas.

CBA EXCHANGE - NOT ONLY HOOPS

In addition to the exchange of basketball ideas between the U.S. and China (via Memphis), there will also be an exchange of undergraduate students. During each year of the program, 100 Chinese students will attend the University of Memphis. Also, the UofM opened the Confucius Institute in November of 2007. It is only the 24th such institute in the U.S.

MEMPHIS TIED FOR LONGEST STREAK IN AP TOP 25 POLL

When Duke fell out of the Feb. 12, 2007, Associated Press Top 25 poll after its fourth-straight loss, Memphis and UCLA tied for the longest streak for consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 poll. The Tigers and Bruins are currently tied with 64-straight weeks ranked in the poll, including the most recent regular season poll released Dec. 15. Memphis was ranked No. 23 in the latest AP poll, while UCLA was No. 14.

Memphis was ranked in all 20 polls last year, and climbed as high as No. 1. The Tigers held the No. 1 spot for a school-record, five-straight weeks. In 2005-06, the Tigers were ranked all 19 weeks and reached as high as No. 3 in the poll. Duke's streak ended at 200-straight weeks in 2006-07.

Despite playing most of the game in foul trouble, the 6-foot-6 guard was the Tigers' second-leading scorer with 20 points. In the final minutes of regulation, Evans scored five of Memphis' nine points (three-pointer, layup) to help send the contest into overtime.

Evans was also selected to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All-Tournament Team Nov. 23. In the three-round tournament, Evans averaged 11.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.0 steals.

Dozier is one of two Conference USA players on the Naismith Trophy preseason list. Joining Dozier on the list is UAB's Robert Vaden.

"TAG" ON A TEAR

When Joey Dorsey's career came to an end last season, many questioned how the Tigers would

make up for his domination on the glass. The answer — eight games into 2008-09 — is **Shawn Taggart**.

Taggart is averaging 9.4 boards per game and has grabbed double-digit rebounds in six of the Tigers' eight contests. His 9.4 rebounding average is second in Conference USA.

He started the year with 12 boards versus Fairfield and then followed with 11 rebounds in games against UMass and Chattanooga. Taggart had 10 rebounds in the loss to Xavier Nov. 23, and followed with a season-high 13 boards in a win over Marist Dec. 2. He grabbed 11 rebounds versus Georgetown Dec. 13.

The Richmond, Va., has also shown his ability to score and has four double-doubles in his first seven games. He posted a double-double of 14 points and 12 rebounds in the season-opening win over Fairfield on Nov. 15. It was his first double-double in a Memphis uniform.

Five days later (Nov. 20), Taggart had his second double-double as a Tiger with 16 points and 11 boards in the victory over Chattanooga. Taggart's third double-double performance was against Marist with 21 points and 13 boards. Taggart recorded his fourth double-double with a career-high 23 points and 11 rebounds versus Georgetown Dec. 13.

GARCIA PUT ON SCHOLARSHIP FOR YEAR; STILL WAITING ON NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE

Angel Garcia got a bit of good news Dec. 18 when the NCAA allowed Memphis to keep him on scholarship throughout the 2008-09 academic year. The 6-foot-11 forward is now able to join the team on the bench during games and other team functions. The NCAA Clearinghouse is still reviewing his case.

Garcia participated in individual workouts during September and October, and also received a waiver to practice the first two weeks of preseason drills. However, he suffered a MCL sprain on the second day of preseason drills and has been unable to practice or play this semester.

ALL-AROUND 'REKE

All the talk from the national pundits about **Tyreke Evans** was that he was a talented and gifted scorer. Well, at least we can give them some credit, as Evans has proved he can score. After the Tigers' first seven games, the 6-foot-6 guard is averaging 16.1 points.

But, Evans is quickly proving there is more to his game than just putting the ball in the net. The Chester, Pa., native is also averaging 6.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.7 steals.

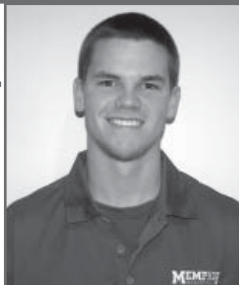
