TIGERS TO MEET UCLA IN NCAA TOURNAMENT ELITE EIGHT CONTEST IN OAKLAND ON SATURDAY

The University of Memphis Tiger squad (33-3, 13-1 C-USA), ranked No. 4 in the AP poll and No. 3 in the ESPN/USA Today poll, advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight with its 80-64 win over Bradley Mar. 23. Memphis, the Oakland Regional No. 1 seed, will meet No. 2 seed UCLA (30-6, 14-4 Pac-10) in a 6:05 p.m. (CT) game. The Bruins advanced to the Oakland Regional final with a thrilling 73-71 victory over Gonzaga. The contest will be televised by CBS Sports.

Memphis enters the NCAA Tournament Oakland Regional title game having won 22 of its last 23 games. The Tigers had a 15-game win streak from Jan. 4 through Feb. 25. The streak ended with an 80-74 setback at UAB Mar. 2. Since that loss to UAB, Memphis has won seven straight, including three in the Conference USA Championship presented by Aeropostale to claim the tournament title. The Tigers defeated Tulane, Houston and No. 24/25 UAB en route to the championship.

The Bruins bring a 10-game win streak into Saturday's NCAA Tournament regional championship game. Prior to Thursday's game against Gonzaga, UCLA had held its previous nine

CALIPARI IN SIXTH YEAR AT HELM OF TIGER PROGRAM

John Calipari (Clarion State, 1982) is in his sixth season at the helm of the Memphis Tiger basketball program. He has a 148-58

record (.718 winning percentage) at Memphis.

The 2005-06 season is his 14th as a collegiate head coach. The Moon, Pa., native has an overall collegiate coaching record of 341-129 (.726 winning percentage). While at Memphis, Calipari has led the Tigers to six-straight 20-win seasons and six-consecutive postseason berths.

SCOUTING THE BRUINS

UCLA, ranked No. 8 in both national polls, has a 30-6 overall record entering Saturday's NCAA Tournament Oakland Regional title game. The Bruins have won 10 straight entering

Freshman forward Shawne Williams scored a season-high 26 points, and Rodney Carney added 17 points — including a late, clutch three-pointer — to lift No. 11/11 Memphis to an 88-80 victory over No. 16/16 UCLA in the NIT Season Tip-Off semifinals.

Darius Washington Jr. scored 16 points, while Joey Dorsey had a solid all-around performance with seven points, nine boards (team high) and three blocks. UCLA's Jordan Farmar led all scorers with 28 points. Arron Afflalo (14 points), Michael Fey (13) and Cedric Bozeman (11) also netted double figures for the Bruins.

The Tigers led 51-34 at the half and held on to that advantage at 73-55 with only 8:20 left. That's when UCLA began its run.

Farmar started the run with a three-pointer at the 8:03 mark, and six minutes later a Farmar free throw at the 2:25 mark cut the Memphis lead to only seven points at 77-70. Farmar scored 11 of UCLA's 15 points in the spurt.

However, Carney answered with a three-pointer with 2:04 left that halted the Bruin run and gave the Tigers the momentum the rest of the game. Memphis hit 6-of-6 from the free throw line in the final 25 seconds to seal the win.

In the first half, Memphis jumped out to a 9-2 lead in the first three minutes and did not fall behind the remainder of the contest. The Tigers' largest lead in the first half was 19 points (48-29) with 1:39 on the clock.

Memphis shot 53.4 percent from the field and 47.1 percent from the arc. UCLA hit 38.8 percent from the floor and 38.9 percent from the three-point line. The Tigers won the battle on the glass by a narrow 40-37 margin.

Saturday's game, including three victories to win the Pac-10 Tournament crown. UCLA defeated Belmont, Alabama and Gonzaga to reach Saturday's regional championship contest.

Sophomore Arron Afflalo leads the Bruins in scoring at 16.2 ppg. Sophomore Jordan Farmar (13.6 ppg) is UCLA's other double-digit scorer. Luc Richard Mbah a Moute leads UCLA on the glass with an 8.1 rebounding average, while Farmar is averaging 5.2 assists per contest. Afflalo (37.0 percent) and Farmar (34.1 percent) are the Bruins' top three-point threats.

The Bruins are shooting 48.1 percent from the field, 35.4 percent from the arc and 70 percent from the foul line. UCLA is out-rebounding its opponents by an average of 4.6 boards per game (32.9-28.3).

MEMPHIS IN NCAA TOURNEY

The Tigers are playing in their 19th NCAA Tournament in 2006. Memphis has an overall NCAA Tournament record of 22-18 (.550 winning percentage; *see all-time NCAA Tournament results in box at right*).

Prior to this year's tournament, Memphis last played in the 2004 NCAA Tournament and advanced to the second round. The Tigers defeated South Carolina 59-43 in the first round before falling to Oklahoma State 70-53 in the second round.

The Tiger program made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1955. Memphis advanced to the 1973 NCAA Tournament championship game, where it lost to UCLA. The Tigers advanced to their second Final Four in 1985, falling to Villanova in the national semifinals. Memphis earned five-straight NCAA Tournament bids from 1982-86.

SEEDING IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

For the first time in school history, Memphis earned a No. 1 seed in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. The school's previous best seed was a No. 2 seed in the 1982 and 1985 NCAA Tournaments (*see Memphis' all-time seeds in box on page 3*).

Overall, this year's No. 1 seed is only the fifth time the Tigers are a top four seed. In addition to two No. 2 seeds in 1982 and 1985, Memphis was a No. 3 seed in 1986 and a No. 4 seed in 1983.

The NCAA Tournament began seeding teams in 1979.

REMEMBERING THE FIRST MEMPHIS/ UCLA MATCH-UP

Although the two school have played four other times since their first match-up, the Memphis-UCLA encounter in the 1973 NCAA Tournament title game still brings back fond memories for many Tiger fans. Memphis dropped an 87-66 decision (*see boxscore on*

page 5) to the Bruins and Bill Walton, but that was the only thing that dampened the spirits of the Tigers' NCAA Tournament run.

The Memphis trio of **Larry Finch**, **Larry Kenon** and **Ronnie Robinson** led the Tigers to the title game. Memphis defeated South Carolina (90-76), Kansas State (92-72) and Providence (95-85) en route to the NCAA championship contest. In fact, the Tigers' win over South Carolina was the program's first NCAA

Tournament victory.

Gene Bartow was the Tigers' head coach at the time, and John Wooden coached the Bruins.

A MEMPHIS-UCLA CONNECTION

Despite the Tigers losing 87-66 in the 1973 NCAA title game, the UCLA athletic administration must have been impressed by then Memphis head coach **Gene Bartow** because, when John Wooden retired following the 1974-

75 season that ended in his 10th NCAA title, Bartow was hired as Wooden's successor.

Bartow coached two years (1975-76, 1976-77) at UCLA and directed the Bruins to a combined 52-9 record and consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. The 1975-76 team advanced to the NCAA Final Four and finished third. Following those two years at UCLA, Bartow moved on to UAB, where he was hired as athletics director and head coach and charged with starting an entire athletic department from scratch.

Bartow is now with the NBA's Memphis Grizzlies.

MEMPHIS VS. THE PAC-10

The Tigers have an all-time record of 9-11 against Pacific-10 Conference schools. In its history, Memphis has played seven — Arizona, Arizona State, Oregon State, Southern Cal, Stanford, UCLA and Washington — of the league's institutions.

Earlier this year, Memphis defeated UCLA 88-80 in the NIT Season Tip-Off on Nov. 23. Prior to this season, the last time the Tigers played a Pac-10 school was the 2002-03 campaign when Memphis met Arizona State in the 2003 NCAA Tournament first round. Memphis dropped an 84-71 decision to the Sun Devils.

COMMON FOES

The Tigers and Bruins have faced two common opponents in 2005-06 (in addition to each other). Both squads played Alabama and

Gonzaga and posted 2-0 records against those common opponents. Memphis played both teams during the regular season and posted an 87-76 win over Alabama and an 83-72 victory over Gonzaga. UCLA met both common foes in the NCAA Tournament and defeated the Crimson Tide 62-59 and Bulldogs 73-71 en route to Saturday's regional title game.

MEMPHIS VS. NCAA TOURNAMENT FIELD

The Tigers played nine teams in the NCAA Tournament field. Memphis had an 8-3 record against teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. The Tigers played Duke (0-1), Texas (0-1), Gonzaga (1-0), Alabama (1-0), UCLA (1-0), Tennessee (1-0), Winthrop (1-0), Wisconsin-Milwaukee (1-0) and UAB (2-1).

The nine NCAA Tournament teams the Tigers played have posted an 13-7 record in "Big Dance" play.

CALIPARI IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

John Calipari has his eighth team in the NCAA Tournament in 2006. He has a 15-7 record (.682 winning percentage) in his previous seven NCAA Tournament trips.

Calipari guided the UMass Minutemen to five-straight NCAA Tournaments, including a trip to the 1996 NCAA Final Four. The 2005-06 Tiger squad is Calipari's third NCAA Tournament team at Memphis. The 2002-03 and 2003-04 teams also made the "Big Dance."

In NCAA Tournament history, Memphis and Duke are the 22nd and 23rd teams, respectively, to enter the "Big Dance" with 30 or more victories.

A MATCH-UP OF VITALE'S SUPER SEVEN SOPHS

Saturday's contest will be a Dick Vitale Super Seven Soph (former Diaper Dandies) match-up, as point guards **Darius Washington Jr.** of Memphis and Jordan Farmar of UCLA will face off. Last season, Washington and Farmar were consensus Freshman All-America team picks, and in the 2005-06, both were Wooden Award, Naismith Award and Cousy Award (nation's top point guard) candidates.

CHASING GREATNESS; 2005-06 TIGERS HAVE BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Head coach **John Calipari** has continually hit home about the 2005-06 Tiger squad "chasing greatness," and it is. One step in "chasing greatness" took place Feb. 18 at Tulane. With its 105-65 victory over the Green Wave, Memphis improved its record to 24-2, marking the program's best start in school history at that time. The program's previous best 26-game start was 23-3 by the 1984-85 and 1985-86 squads.

Well, the next step in "chasing greatness" took place Mar. 19 in the NCAA Tournament second round when the 2005-06 Tigers won their school-record 32nd game. The team's 32-3 record was the program's best 35-game mark.

Memphis improved on that record with its NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 win over Bradley to improve to 33-3.

AN NCAA FIRST SINCE 1999

It has happened nine previous times in NCAA Tournament history, and now Memphis is the 10th team to do so. The Tigers are the first team since Auburn in 1999 to receive a No. 1 seed after not making the NCAA Tournament the previous year. Auburn earned a No. 1 seed and advanced to the Sweet 16 in 1999.

CHASING MORE GREATNESS

The 2005-06 Tigers have won 33 games, which is the school record for most victories in a single season. This year's squad bested the previous school season wins record of 31 set by the 1984-85 NCAA Final Four team. The following chart shows the winningest teams (single season) in Memphis history:

MARCH IS WHAT IT'S ALL ABOUT

John Calipari's teams always improve as the season progresses toward March, which is the month all college teams play for. And, Calipari's teams are always ready for play in March, and that can be seen in his career record in that month.

Calipari has a 67-25 record (.728 winning percentage) in games played in March. In his 14 years as a collegiate head coach, Calipari has guided his teams to 13 postseason berths (eight NCAA, five NIT). He led the UMass Minutemen to the 1996 NCAA Final Four and the Memphis Tigers to the 2002 NIT championship.

In NCAA Tournament first round games, Calipari has a 7-1 record. He is 4-3 in NCAA Tournament second round games and 3-1 in Sweet 16 contests. Calipari is 1-1 in Elite Eight games.

JOEY'S DOUBLE DIGIT BOARDS EQUAL WINS FOR TIGERS

The equation may look a little funny, but it's added up to success for the Tigers the past two seasons. Last year, **Joey Dorsey** hit the double-digit plateau in rebounds seven times, and seven times the Tigers won.

The 6-foot-9 sophomore forward and the Tigers have carried over that trend to 2005-06. But, the Tigers lost to UAB Mar. 2 when Dorsey grabbed double-digit boards (16), marking the first time that has happened in his two-year career at Memphis. The Baltimore, Md., native

TIGERS FINDING THEIR TOUCH

Memphis has found its shooting touch, and it couldn't have come at a better time. In the three NCAA Tournament games, the Tigers are shooting 53.8 percent from the floor (91-of-169), including a 60.7 mark against Oral Roberts in the NCAA Tournament first round Mar. 17. That 60.7 shooting percentage is the second-best mark in Tiger NCAA Tournament history.

In the seven contests prior to the NCAA Tournament, Memphis shot only 39.7 percent from the floor (160-of-403). The best percentage the Tigers shot in that seven-game span was a 44.4 percent mark versus Houston in the Conference USA Tournament semifinals.

ONE OF ONLY TWO, PART II

Earlier this year, **John Calipari** became only the 13th head coach in the history of NCAA Division I basketball to lead two different schools to a top-five national ranking. Calipari led UMass to a No. 1 ranking in both 1995 and 1996 and guided Memphis to a No. 3 ranking this year.

Well, there's even more elite company Calipari is a part of. He is one of only two coaches in NCAA Division I history to guide two different schools to a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The NCAA began seeding teams in 1979.

Calipari took UMass to a No. 1 seed in 1996, and Memphis is a top seed in 2006. Roy Williams is the other coach to do so. Williams guided Kansas to a No. 1 seed in 1992, 1995, 1997, 1998 and 2002, and led North Carolina to a top seed in 2005.

2005-06 TIGERS MAKING DEFENSIVE HISTORY

Tiger head coach **John Calipari** loves defense, so reading this may place a smile on his face. The 2005-06 Memphis squad has set school single-season marks for steals and blocked shots.

IT'S A TREY THING

Earlier this year, senior **Rodney Carney** set school records for career and season three-pointers made. Well, the 2005-06 Tigers have set the record for most treys in a season.

Memphis entered NCAA Tournament play with 251 three-pointers and hit 11 treys versus Oral Roberts to give the Tigers 262 for the year. The 262 three-pointers broke the previous mark of 259 treys by the 2003-04 squad. Memphis now has hit 275 three-pointers this year.

CALIPARI AMONG COACHING ELITE

John Calipari can already count himself among the coaching elite in terms of coaching wins in the first nine, 10, 11, 12 and 13 years. Now, he is among the coaches with the most victories in his first 14 seasons.

Calipari took over the No. 6 spot with Memphis' three wins in the Conference USA Championship Mar. 9-11. He now has 337 career wins after the Tigers' NCAA Tournament regional semifinal win Mar. 23. Last season, the Moon, Pa., native became one of only seven coaches in NCAA history to win 300 games in his first 13 years, joining Roy Williams, Everett Case, Denny Crum, Jim Boeheim, Tubby Smith and Nolan Richardson. The Tigers' Mar. 23 game versus Bradley in the NCAA Tournament regional semifinal game was the 28th-consecutive contest in which the Tigers were ranked in the top five in the national polls.

In terms of playing consecutive games while being ranked in the top five (regular season and postseason), the 2005-06 team has the longest streak at 28. The 1984-85 NCAA Final Four squad had two streaks of 22 and 10 during the regular season. The 10-game streak was broken in early January when the Tigers fell to No. 6 for three-straight games. That team moved back into the top five in mid-January and stayed there through the end of the postseason (22 games).

The last time the Memphis, Tenn., native posted those offensive numbers was against Winthrop Jan. 11 (73-63 Tiger win). Winthrop was a 2006 NCAA Tournament team (lost in first round to Tennessee).

Allen followed up that NCAA Tournament first round performance with eight points, six assists and three steals in the win over Bucknell Mar. 19. In the Tigers' regional semifinal win over Bradley Mar. 23, Allen scored only three points, but added five assists and two steals (compared to no turnovers) in 16 minutes of action.
