# 2009 SPRING OUTLOOK

## Theme This Spring – Competition.

With five new junior college transfers out on the field for the first time this spring, and seven transfers from Division I programs who have had a year to learn the system in 2008, the competition for starting jobs will be fierce this spring.

Some of the heaviest competition on the offense should take place at quarterback and in the offensive line. Four of the five consistent starters in the offensive line were seniors in 2008, leaving Dominik Riley as the only player to start all 13 games. There are several talented players who will vie for a starting post, including returnees Malcom Rawls and Ronald Leary. Coach Tommy West said that his goal this spring is to come out of the workouts with a starting offensive line. The talent is there, the only drawback is the lack of game experience. The QB competition will heat up in the spring, but will not likely hit the boiling point until fall camp. Returning is senior Brett Toney, who started two games last season when Arkelon Hall was injured. Hall returns after starting 11 games last season. Byron Ingram, a transfer from Georgia Tech, will get a look. The fire should be turned up in the fall when up-and-comer Tyler Bass returns full speed and highly-touted prep signee Will Gilchrist arrives in Memphis.

Defensively, the fight for playing time will be all over the field. The defensive line is expected to be the most deep and talented group, but who will start up front is certainly not going to be determined before the start of spring ball. Linebackers will be bolstered by returning starters Greg Jackson, Jeremy Longstreet and Winston Bowns. But add to that group returnee Jeremy Rockette, Mississippi State transfer Jamon Hughes and LSU transfer Derrick Odom. Hughes and Odom have been chomping at the bit to be back in uniform after sitting out in '08. West candidly described the secondary as a "work in progress." The group returns several key players including Alton Starr, Deante Lamar, D.A. Griffin and Darius Davis, but also gains transfers DeRon Furr, Tremaine McKenzie and Torenzo Quimm this spring. Starr will not work out this spring after having knee surgery following the magicJack St. Petersburg Bowl. He is expected to return in the fall.

"The theme for the spring is pretty much competition because there are so many new guys. I expect there to be some getting after it in the spring and people fighting for a job. We are in the best place I think we have been since I have been here as far as talent and depth. We have to play well at QB and we have to play well in the secondary. Those are the two places that I feel the emphasis is to play well right now."

## POSITION BREAKDOWN

**Quarterback** – Arkelon Hall returns for his senior season after throwing for

2,275 yards and 12 TDs in 11 games last season. Senior Brett Toney, who got his dream job of starting QB for two games in '08 when Hall and Will Hudgens were both injured in the East Carolina game, had solid efforts as the signal caller throwing for 338 yards and three TDs. Byron Ingram will have his chance to prove himself after transferring from Georgia Tech last fall and piloting the scout team last season. U of M officials are in the process of petitioning for a sixth year of eligibility for Will Hudgens, who has had two broken legs and an ACL surgery during his time at Memphis. Tyler Bass, who was expected to redshirt in '08 was called to duty with injuries to Hall and Hudgens, but only saw two games of action before suffering a knee injury that required surgery. He will throw some this spring, but will not participate in scrimmages. West will have to wait until the fall to observe prep standout Will Gilchrist, who was described on signing day as having Martin Hankins' arm, but more speed than the former Tiger QB.

**Running Back** – The running game was back on track in 2008 with the emergence of Curtis Steele. Steele, a junior college transfer, was redshirted in 2007 and was nearly pulled out of his redshirt towards the end of the season after injuries hobbled the Tiger ground game. He came out in 2008 and had a stellar junior season, rushing for 1,223 yards and seven TDs. He is the first Tiger since Heisman candidate DeAngelo Williams to rush for over 1,000 yards in a season. The ground game will be enhanced by sophomore Brandon Ross, Wisconsin transfer Lance Smith and Greg Ray. Ross was thrust into action as a true freshman because of injuries to others and had a solid season. In just eight games, he rolled off 296 yards and two TDs on 58 carries. Ray was hobbled by a nagging hamstring injury in '08 and was forced to redshirt.

**Tight End** – Junior Deven Onarheim gets his shot this season after playing behind Brett Russell for the last two seasons. Onarheim has the size (6-7, 255) to block, but also has strong hands and experience hauling in receptions. Donald Law will get some looks at TE after redshirting in 2008, and Miami transfer DajLeon Farr will have this spring to show his talents. West intends to look at Farr at both tight end and defensive end this spring.

**Offensive Line** – The offensive line lost some key players who had been anchoring the front for several years. It won't require a total overhaul, though, as starter Dominik Riley is expected to shift to center and Ronald Leary and Malcom Rawls work at tackle and guard. Both have considerable game experience from last year. Challenging for playing time will be junior college transfers Brad Paul and Kindly Jacques as well as Maurice Holloway, Paul Edwards, Lionel Henderson and Robbie Hardie.

Paul was signed in December, and Jacques redshirted last season to gain experience. West is hoping to come out of the spring with a two-deep for the line as he generally steers away from using fall newcomers up front, hoping to get those guys a year in the weightroom and a year learning the system.

**Wide Receiver** – Look for the air attack to be slightly different this season. West has shifted the emphasis from big and powerful to simply, FAST. The solid one-two punch of Carlos Singleton and Duke Calhoun is back as both combined for 1,278 yards and eight scores on 92 receptions last season. The air attack will be ramped up with the speed of Calhoun and Singleton added with transfer Jermaine McKenzie, returnee Cam Baker and redshirt freshmen Marcus Rucker and Curtis Johnson. The real key is for Tiger QBs to throw the ball up there and give the wideouts a chance to make the plays they are capable of making.

**Defensive Line** – The defensive front will be the most talented and deepest position for the Tigers. But West is laying down the challenge of having this line be much more visible in games. There will be tremendous competition in the defensive line, and West expects to have enough talent to have a two-deep coming out of the spring. Some of the returning players who will be challenging for a spot on the two-deep will be seniors Greg Terrell, Jada Brown, Josh Weaver and Steven Turner, who have all logged extensive playing time over the years. Demetrius Culpepper, Joel McCleod and Charlie Bryant all have game experience in the Blue and Gray, and West picked up noted junior college transfer Justin Thompson in December. Tim McGee, who missed last season after requiring shoulder surgery, will also add to the size and talent of the line.

**Linebackers** – The linebackers were described by West as "having some quality and depth for the first time since 2002" when the Tigers were led by Coot Terry, Greg Harper and Derrick Ballard. Tiger fans are well aware of what that trio meant to the program, and will be excited to hear West make similar comparisons. Starters Greg Jackson, Jeremy Longstreet and Winston Bowns return as does backup Jeremy Rockette, but they won't have the luxury of sitting back and assuming a starting role this spring as they will be heavily challenged by LSU transfer Derrick Odom and Mississippi State transfer Jamon Hughes. Both are aggressive linebackers who are expected to add to the strength of the front seven.

**Secondary** – West noted that the secondary played better in 2008, and stressed that it is important to continue to improve. The lineup for the secondary is certainly not set heading into the spring, and that is one area that could see many different combinations before the starters are tabbed. The group won't have the services

of Alton Starr this spring as he is rehabilitating from a knee surgery following the bowl game. There are veterans in the mix such as Deante' Lamar, D.A. Griffin and Darius Davis, but they will be challenged by transfers DeRon Furr, Tremaine McKenzie and Torenzo Quinn as well as Curtis Echols and Lavaris Edwards. Echols was shifted from receiver to defensive back last fall, and is looking to have a breakout year with a full season of defense under his belt, while Edwards saw some action in '08 as a true freshman.

## 2009 TIGER NOTES

### Tiger Streak Among National Leaders

Senior receiver Duke Calhoun will open the 2009 season with a 37-game active receiving streak. The streak will rank third nationally among active streaks heading into the '09 season. Calhoun has caught a pass in each of his 37 games in a Tiger uniform. In 2008, he ranked second on the team in receptions (40) and third in receiving yards (487). He holds the school record with seven career 100-yard games. He has etched his name in the career record book as he ranks second in career receptions with 144 and third in career yards with 2,058. He will need just four receptions and 66 yards to hold school records in both categories.

### Singleton Is Other Half of 1-2 Receiving Threat

Senior receiver Carlos Singleton returns to the lineup and, along with Calhoun, gives Memphis a hefty one-two punch for the talented receiving corps. At 6-8, Singleton gives opposing DBs fits and has the arm strength to go up top and pull the jump ball down. He opens the 2009 season tied for the school record in career TD receptions with 19. He had a 28-game receiving streak until Memphis lost two QBs in the first quarter of the ECU game in 2008, and has registered a catch in 35 of his 37 games played. He and Calhoun should finish their careers as the top two receivers in school

history as Singleton needs just 23 receptions and 266 yards to surpass the current record holders in both categories.

## Steele Gives Tigers Ground Presence

Senior running back Curtis Steele has played just one season for the Tigers, but already he is in good company in the U of M record book. He is the first back since DeAngelo Williams to register 1,000 yards rushing in a season, and is only the fourth back in school history to do so. Williams holds the top three single-season records for his efforts in 2003-05, but Steele's 1,223 yards in '08 are good for the No. 4 spot. Last season, Steele logged six 100-yard games, which ranks him fourth in a single season, and tied for fourth for career century games. While he won't catch Williams, who logged 34 career 100-yard games, he needs just six more for the No. 2 spot all-time.

## Tigers Appear In Five Bowls In Last Six Years

With the 2008 magicJack St. Petersburg Bowl invitation, The Tigers were competing in the postseason for the fifth time in the last six years, and could count themselves among the 36 teams nationally who played in at least five bowl games in the six-year span. The Tigers snapped a 32-year bowl drought, one of the nation's longest at the time, with an invitation to the New Orleans Bowl in 2003 after ending the regular season with an 8-4 record. Memphis traveled to the Big Easy and defeated North Texas, 27-17. Memphis has also appeared in the 2004 GMAC Bowl, the 2005 Motor City Bowl and the 2007 New Orleans Bowl in the last six years.

## Protecting the Ball is the Name of the Game

The key to the ground game is protecting the ball, which is one thing U of M backs have been consistent with over the years. From 2004-2008, Memphis backs have only accounted for seven total fumbles lost in 1,786 carries. Through 13 games (977 total offensive plays) in 2008, the Tigers lost just five fumbles (only one by a RB), and two of those were in the loss to Louisville. Memphis closed out the season ranked in a tie for 5th nationally with four other teams (Eastern Michigan, Miami, UL-Monroe, Rutgers) in fumbles lost with just five.

## West Ranks Third In Wins

With the 2008 regular-season finale win over Tulane, head coach Tommy West notched his 47th victory at the U of M. That 47th win has West third all-time at the U of M, surpassing Zach Curlin, who was 43-60-14 in 13 years (from 1924-36). Billy J. Murphy holds the all-time lead in wins with his 91-44-1 record in 14 years (1958-71). Murphy is followed in wins by Ralph Hatley who went 59-43-5 in 11 years at the helm of the U of M program (1947-57).

## West Stays Inside for DC

Linebacker coach Kenny Ingram, who just completed his third season with the Tigers in 2008, was named the squad's defensive coordinator on March 5 at a campus press conference. Ingram replaces Tim Walton, who left the staff for a position with the Detroit Lions. In his new role, Ingram will continue to work with the linebackers. He is the Tigers' fifth defensive coordinator in the last five years.

Just before spring practice, West enticed Arkansas State co-defensive coordinator Jack Curtis to join the Tigers as the safeties coach. He still has to find a special teams coordinator to replace Garret Chachere, who recently took a position with the University of Arizona.

## Waiting in the Wings

A talented group of transfers has been patiently waiting for their chance to get back on the field. All were able to practice with the team last season, but could not see game action until 2009. The group includes: TE DajLeon Farr (Univ. of Miami), DB DeRon Furr (Auburn), LB Jamon Hughes (Mississippi State), QB Byron Ingram (Georgia Tech), RB Darcel Johnson (Arkansas), LB Derek Odom (LSU) and RB Lance Smith (Wisconsin). Expect heavy competition in the spring and during fall camp as these talented Tigers vie for starting roles.

## Riley Is Lone Returning Full-Time Starter in O-Line

The Tiger offensive line loses four starting seniors heading into the spring including Brandon Pearce, Cody Stubblefield, Philip Beliles and Michael Denning. The only returning full-time starter is junior Dominik Riley, who started all 13 games at left guard. Senior Malcom Rawls also has considerable experience in the line, having started five games at right guard.

## Defense Making Strides

The Tiger defense made great strides in 2008 and averaged a 30-spot improvement over the 2007 season. In 2007, Memphis ranked 103rd in rushing defense, and in 2008, the squad made a jump to 76th. Pass efficiency defense saw a similar leap from 96th in '07 to 76th in '08. Overall, the Tigers' improvement in total defense saw the squad move from 100th in '07 to 57th in '08. The challenge now is to make an even greater leap into the top 25.

## "Will" He, or Won't He?

QB Will Hudgens is waiting to find out if he will be able to suit up again in the Blue and Gray. U of M officials have put in a request with the NCAA for a sixth year for Hudgens, who sat out as a true freshman in '04 after suffering an ACL injury as a high school senior. Hudgens was pressed into action in 2005 with an injury to starter Patrick Byrne. He played two more games before breaking his right leg and suffering ligament damage. In 2006, just two games into the season, he broke his leg again and was sent to the sidelines for the re-

mainder of the season. His 2007 season was free of major injuries, but eight games into the 2008 season, he tore his ACL and MCL, and was forced to have surgery again. He had played sparingly before being called to action when Arkelon Hall was injured on the first drive of the ECU game. Hudgens handled seven snaps before leaving the field. It is unknown how long it will take for the decision to be revealed by the NCAA.

## Tigers Put Up Big Numbers in '08

In the first seven games of the '08 season, Memphis tallied over 400 yards of total offense, and in two games last year the Tigers amassed over 500 yards. The U of M closed out the season averaging 417.2 yards of total offense per game. That total had Memphis ranked 26th nationally in that category. The 977 offensive plays for the Tigers ranks third

all-time behind the 2007 (1,017) and 2003 (1,000) seasons. The 5,424 total yards ranks fourth all-time, and marks only the fourth time in school history that the Tigers have logged over 5,000 offensive yards. Seven of the top eight records for season offensive yardage are all held by Tommy West-coached teams.

## Tigers Converting on Third Down

In 13 games in 2008, Memphis converted 91 of 196 third-down attempts, which ranked the Tigers 20th nationally with a success rate of 46.4 percent. Memphis' 91 first downs were achieved through 37 runs and 54 pass completions. The 91 successful third down conversions ranks second all-time at Memphis, as does the 46.4 percent success rate. The records are 94 set by the 2007 squad, and 47.6 percent (88/185) set by the 2004 Tigers.

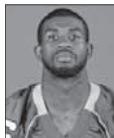
