### UT MARTIN

#### MEMPHIS-UT MARTIN SERIES

Saturday's game is seventh overall encounter between the two schools, but the first since the 1932 season. Memphis holds a narrow 4-2 advantage in the series, and the Tigers have won the last four match-ups from 1928-32.

The Tigers won the last meeting with the Skyhawks, a 6-0 victory in Memphis in the 1932 campaign. Tennessee Martin's last victory in the series was a 15-6 win in the 1925 season.

#### A SPECIAL WIN OVER TENNESSEE MARTIN

Memphis' win over Tennessee Martin in the 1929 campaign was a part of a magical season in Tiger football history. That 1929 Memphis squad was the first unbeaten team in the program's history. Those Tigers posted an 8-0-2 mark.

In that campaign, Memphis' first road game was at Tennessee Martin, and the Tigers defeated the Skyhawks 13-2 on Oct. 19, 1929. Tennessee Martin was the first team to score points against the Tigers, as Memphis shut out its first three opponents that year.

#### KEEP THE STREAK ALIVE

When the Tigers host Tennessee Martin Saturday, they will look to keep perfection intact in the Tommy West era. Since West took over in 2001, Memphis is a perfect 8-0 against FCS opponents. Tennessee Martin is a member of the Ohio Valley Conference and earned a FCS playoff berth in 2006.

Four of the eight FCS victories came against Chattanooga, where West began his collegiate head coaching career. The other four FCS wins were over Murray State, Tennessee Tech, Jacksonville State and Nicholls State.

The last time Memphis played a FCS foe was last year when the Tigers hosted Nicholls State at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. Memphis defeated the Colonels 31-10.

#### MEMPHIS VERSUS THE OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE

The Tigers have an all-time record of 33-19-9 against members of the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC). Memphis has played Austin Peay (6-0), Jacksonville State (2-0), Murray State (10-9-3), Southeast Missouri State (2-1-2), Tennessee Tech (9-7-4) and Tennessee Martin (4-2). The Tigers have never played Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Samford or Tennessee State.

The last time Memphis played an OVC foe was the 2007 season when it hosted Jacksonville State at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. The Tigers defeated the Gamecocks 35-14.

## TOMMY WEST

Head Coach • 9th Year • 47-53, 82-88  
10th Year at Memphis



Tommy West came to Memphis in 2000 as the defensive coordinator and a year later became the Tigers' 21st head football coach. In just eight seasons at the helm of the program, West has guided the U of M to five bowl game appearances in the last six years, and is one of just two coaches in Tiger football history to win seven or more games a season in four years. West is also one of just four coaches in school history to secure four winning seasons while guiding a Tiger program for at least five seasons.

The Gainesville, Ga., native was hired as the Tigers' head coach on November 30, 2000, and continues to work towards the team goal of a C-USA championship.

Under West's guidance, the Tigers won five of their last six games in 2003 en route to an 8-4 record and snapped a 32-year bowl drought. The Tigers went on to defeat North Texas in the New Orleans Bowl and ended the year at 9-4. West was named the Coach of the Year by the Tennessee Sports Writers Association.

The 2004 Tigers opened the season at 5-1 and rolled off three straight wins at the end of the year to earn their second straight bowl invitation. Despite the loss to Bowling Green in the GMAC Bowl, the Tigers ended the year at 8-4, which was good for second in Conference USA. The eight wins also marked the first time since 1962 and 1963 that the Tigers had amassed eight wins in consecutive seasons. In 2004, West's Tigers also made history ranking 25th in the *Associated Press* poll following their victory over Ole Miss. It was the first time ever that Memphis had been ranked by the national entity.

In 2005, West and his staff did an amazing job in getting the Tigers to their third straight bowl game despite numerous injuries that threatened to derail the team's post-season streak. Memphis finished the year with a 7-5 record and a victory over Akron in the Motor City Bowl, and was one of just 29 schools in the nation playing its third straight bowl game that year.

Despite a rough beginning in 2006, the Tigers did show marked improvement by year's end. This was evident in the latter weeks of the season when Memphis narrowly lost to UCF, 26-24, and then a week later stunned eventual league champion Houston with a solid effort, forcing the Cougars into overtime and ultimately losing by a field goal. By the last game of the season, the Tigers were confident and handed UTEP a 38-19 loss at the Sun Bowl.

West led his 2007 squad to a 7-6 overall record and a 6-2 showing in C-USA as the Tigers entered the New Orleans Bowl on a three-game winning streak. The six victories in Conference USA action were the most ever for a Tiger team since Memphis began playing in the league in 1996. In addition, the Tigers won all three games against C-USA West Division foes and finished the season tied for second in the East Division with East Carolina.

The 2008 Tigers opened with a 0-3 record, but fought hard to win six of the last nine games of the regular season despite injuries to three quarterbacks. Memphis evened the record to .500 and earned bowl eligibility with a commanding 45-6 victory over Tulane in the final home game for 25 Tiger seniors.

Memphis went into the magic Jack St. Petersburg Bowl ranked in the top 25 nationally in rushing offense, total offense, fewest turnovers, sack denial and third down conversions. In addition, the Tigers held the distinction for being one of the top 10 programs in the country in least fumbles lost (6th), time of possession (3rd), offensive first downs (10th) and first down defense (10th).

West and his wife, Lindsay, have one son, Turner, who is a junior receiver for the Tigers this season.

## TWO TIGERS TO BE INDUCTED INTO M CLUB HALL OF FAME

Two former Tiger football players will be among the seven former players to be inducted into the M Club Hall of Fame this weekend. Alex Dees (1966-68) and Jerome Woods (1994-95) are representing Tiger football, and will be recognized at the UT Martin game. Dees earned All-Missouri Conference honors as a senior in 1968. That same year, the defensive end was also named an Associated Press All-America honorable mention after leading the team in tackles with 101. He is one of only two players in the history of the Missouri Conference to be an unanimous All-Missouri Conference selection with the other being Mean Joe Green.

Woods led the team in interceptions and tackles in 1995, and was a first round pick of the Kansas City Chiefs in the 1996 NFL Draft. He transferred to Memphis after playing two years at Northeast Mississippi JC. As a senior in 1995, Woods started every game and led the team with 120 tackles and finished with 67 solo stops, seven tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries, 10 pass breakups and six interceptions. Following the season, he was named to the Football News All-America second team, the College Sports Magazine All-America third team and the Associated Press All-America third team. He was also selected to the All-National Independent first team and was the Defensive Player of the Year. Following his time at Memphis, Woods enjoyed a successful 10-year career with the Kansas City Chiefs. He totaled 128 games in the NFL with 206 career tackles, 169 solo stops, 15 interceptions and five forced fumbles.

## TALK ABOUT STATE REPRESENTATION

In Saturday's game, the state of Tennessee will be well represented on the playing field when Memphis hosts Tennessee Martin. A combined 84 players (36 Memphis, 48 Tennessee Martin) from the state are listed on the teams' two rosters.

## NINESKYHAWKSMAKE HOMECOMINGS

When Tennessee Martin plays at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium Saturday, nine players on the Skyhawk squad will see familiar surroundings, as they call the Memphis area home. Six Skyhawks hail from Memphis, while one is from Cordova, one from Millington and one from Bartlett.

## ONCE A TIGER, NOW A SKYHAWK

Tiger Nation will probably do a "double-take" when they see one Skyhawk take the field Saturday in the Memphis-Tennessee Martin contest. Miguel Barnes, a senior running back for the Skyhawks, began his collegiate career as a Memphis Tiger.

Barnes, who is from Millington, Tenn., lettered two years at Memphis in 2006-07. In his two seasons at Memphis, Barnes played in 15 games. He rushed the ball 65 times for 275 yards and one touchdown, and also had

## NOTES

- Duke Calhoun caught a three-yard pass from Arkelon Hall in the second quarter to advance his receiving streak to 39 games.
- Curtis Steele rushed 12 yards for a touchdown with 6:10 remaining in the first quarter for his third TD of the season; the 10th of his career. Steele scored twice from the run versus Ole Miss, and has now scored in seven of his last eight games for the Tigers. In that eight-game span, he has scored 11 TDs.
- Alton Starr jostled Phillip Tanner and forced him to fumble the ball on 3rd-and-28 late in the second quarter, and defensive end Jada Brown pounced on the ball for the turnover. It was Starr's first forced fumble and Brown's second recovery.
- Matt Reagan's 10 punts against Middle Tennessee are the most by a Memphis kicker since Ben Graves had 10 in 2000 against Mississippi State. The last time Memphis had 10 punts as a team was in 2005 against UTEP.

three receptions for 28 yards. In the 2006 season, Barnes had seven kickoff returns for 143 yards (20.4 average).

### A PRESIDENT DIVIDED

University of Memphis president Dr. Shirley C. Raines, who has been the University of Memphis president since 2001, is a graduate of Tennessee Martin. Dr. Raines earned her Bachelor of Science degree from UT Martin in 1968.

### ON THIS DATE

The Tigers are 1-8 when playing on Sept. 19 in the program's history. Memphis' lone Sept. 19 victory was a 25-6 win over Stephen F. Austin in the 1959 campaign.

Since that win, the Tigers have dropped six-straight Sept. 19 contests. The last time Memphis played a Sept. 19 game was the 1998 season, falling at Minnesota 41-14.

### WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Memphis and Tennessee Martin have gone through name changes in both institutions' histories. Since founded in 1912, Memphis has gone through five name changes — West Tennessee State Normal School (1912), West Tennessee State Teachers College (1925), Memphis State College (1941), Memphis State University (1957) and University of Memphis (1994).

Tennessee Martin has had four name changes — Hall-Moody Institute (1900), University of Tennessee Junior College (1927), University of Tennessee Martin Branch (1951) and University of Tennessee at Martin (1967).

### EIGHT GAMES SLATED FOR TV

Last Saturday's game at Middle Tennessee was televised by CSS and was the second-straight televised game for the Tigers this season.

Memphis opened the season on ESPN against Ole Miss, and is slated to appear on television eight times this season. CSS is also carrying the Marshall (9/26), UAB (11/14), and Houston games (11/21). CBS College Sports Network has the Friday, Nov. 27, meeting with Tulsa on its broadcast schedule, and ESPN returns to the Liberty Bowl for the Tuesday night meeting with East Carolina on Oct. 27. That game will air on ESPN2. In addition, the Tigers travel to Knoxville to face the Vols on Nov. 7, and

because of the SEC TV contract, that game will be broadcast by a network to be selected at a later date.

### CALHOUN SETS SCHOOL RECORDS

Duke Calhoun needed just four receptions and 66 yards to hold the school record in both career categories, and with his five receptions for 53 yards versus Ole Miss, he notched the school record with 149 career receptions. He surpassed Damien Dodson, who totaled 147 receptions from 1996-99.

Heading into the Middle Tennessee game, Calhoun was just 13 yards short of the record in Memphis career receiving yards. Calhoun logged 27 yards on four receptions and now holds the top spot with 2,138 yards. He made the move to No. 1 over Earnest Gray (1975-78), who previously held the top spot with 2,123 yards. Gray logged his record yardage in 44 games, while Calhoun set the new record in 39 games in the Blue and Gray.

Calhoun will open the UT Martin game with career totals of 153 receptions and 2,138 yards.

### TIGER STREAK THIRD NATIONALLY

Duke Calhoun caught a three-yard pass from Arkelon Hall in the second quarter against Middle Tennessee to advance his receiving streak to 39 games. He remains ranked third nationally in active receiving streaks.

Calhoun has caught a pass in each of his 39 games in a Tiger uniform. He leads the receiving corps this season with nine catches for 80 yards, while also holding the school record with seven career 100-yard games.

## SINGLETON IS OTHER HALF OF RECEIVING THREAT

Senior receivers Carlos Singleton and Duke Calhoun give Memphis a hefty one-two punch for the receiving corps. At 6-9, Singleton gives opposing DBs fits and has the arm strength to go up top and pull the jump ball down.

Singleton is tied for the school record in career TD receptions with 19. He had a 28-game receiving streak until Memphis lost two QBs in the first quarter of the ECU game in 2008, and has registered a catch in 37 of his 39 games played. He and Calhoun are poised to finish their careers as the top two receivers in school history.

Singleton currently ranks fourth all-time in both receptions (131) and receiving yards (1,930). With 70 more yards, he will become just the fourth Tiger in school history to amass 2,000 yards receiving.

Singleton opened the season with three receptions for 27 yards against Ole Miss and had three catches for 45 yards versus Middle Tennessee. He had the Tigers' only offensive play of 20 or more yards versus MT with a 20-yard reception in the third quarter.

## TIGER RECEIVING DUO IS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN SCORING THREAT

How tough of a threat are Duke Calhoun and Carlos Singleton together? Well, heading into the UT Martin game, they are the fourth-most prolific scoring threat in the nation by way of the air attack. In addition, of the top five threats, three are from C-USA schools. son opener against Ole Miss. He booted seven punts and averaged 44.1 yards. He dropped three kicks inside the 20 and had a long punt of 57 yards. Reagan also attempted a field goal in the game, missing a 49-yard attempt in the first quarter that bounced off the upright. Reagan's career high is 44 yards, which he logged last year against Marshall.

Reagan logged 10 punts against Middle Tennessee, which was the most by a Memphis punter since Ben Graves had 10 in 2000 against Mississippi State. The last time Memphis had 10 punts as a team was in 2005 against UTEP. Reagan has now handled all 17 of Memphis' punts and ranks 28th nationally with his average of 42.6 yards per punt. He has dropped eight punts inside the 20 and totals three of 50 or more yards.

## TIGERS NEED LEAD AT HALF AND IN 4TH

Under Coach West, the Tigers are 34-12 when leading at the half, and 42-5 when leading at the start of the fourth quarter. In fact, in the last seven years (2003-09

included), Memphis is 29-7 when leading at the half, and an impressive 34-4 when leading at the end of the third quarter.

In 2008, the Tigers saw a 21-13 lead at the start of the fourth quarter against Rice slip away as the Owls outscored Memphis, 29-14, in the final period. Rice picked up two touchdowns, one off an interception return, in the final 1:15 remaining on the game clock to garner the 42-35 victory.

The other three losses that Memphis has suffered in the last seven years when leading at the start of the fourth quarter were the 35-32 loss to Arkansas State in 2007, the 35-20 loss to East Carolina in 2006 and the 20-16 loss to Tennessee in 2005.

Against UT, Memphis entered the fourth quarter with a slight 16-14 lead but UT dropped two field goals on the Tigers for the win. Early in the 2006 season against ECU, Memphis was leading 20-14 at the start of the fourth quarter and allowed ECU 21 points for the 35-20 loss.

Against ASU in '07, the Tigers let go of a 31-6 lead when the Indians scored 15 points in the third quarter and 14 in the final stanza to gain the 35-31 advantage.

## TIGERS LOOKING FOR 30 POINTS

The number 30 seems to be key for the Tigers under Tommy West. Since 2001, Memphis has an impressive 32-8 record when it scores 30 or more points in a game.

Last season, Memphis was 5-1 when scoring at least 30 points. The Tigers lost to Rice despite scoring 35 points, and scored 31 in a win over Nicholls State; 33 in a win over UAB; 36 in the victory over USM; 31

in the road victory at SMU; and dropped a season-high 45 on the Tulane Green Wave.

On the other hand, the Tigers have a 9-36 mark when they allow the opponents 30 or more points. Just two games into the 2009 season, Memphis gave up 31 points to both Ole Miss and Middle Tennessee.

The Tigers had held the Rebels to just 17 points in the first three quarters, but then allowed the 8th-ranked Rebels 28 points in the final stanza, 21 of which were in the final six minutes of the game.

## MEMPHIS VS NON-LEAGUE FOES UNDER WEST

With losses to Ole Miss and Middle Tennessee to open the season, the Tigers are now 16-21 against non-conference opponents in the Tommy West era. Included in that non-conference mark is a perfect 8-0 record against NCAA Division I-AA foes with the 31-10 win over Nicholls State on Sept. 20, 2008. In addition, of the 21 non-league losses, 12 of them are to SEC opponents.

In the five years (1996-2000) prior to West taking over the program, the Tigers' non-conference record was 8-17.

## ANY DAY OF THE WEEK

The Tigers will have three games this season that will be on days other than Saturday to accommodate a television broadcast. The first was the opening game versus the Ole Miss Rebels, played on Sunday, Sept. 6, and carried by ESPN. The second is a Tuesday night meeting (Oct. 27) with East Carolina that will air on ESPN2, and the final contest is a Friday afternoon contest at Tulsa to be carried by CBS College Sports for Thanksgiving weekend (Nov. 27).

Motor City Bowl on ESPN.

During the 2004 season, the Tigers played Louisville (Nov. 4), Southern Miss (Nov. 12) and USF (Nov. 27) on ESPN, and closed out the season in the GMAC Bowl.

The Tigers have played on ESPN 20 times dating back to a 34-3 loss to Georgia in 1982. ## FASTEST TO 2,000 YARDS

Duke Calhoun made a 54-yard touchdown catch in the UCF game on Nov. 22, 2008, and in doing so, became only the third Tiger in school history to log 2,000 career yards receiving.

Calhoun, who enters the UT Martin game with 2,138 yards, is the fastest Tiger receiver to gain 2,000 yards. He was playing in his 35th career game against the Knights. Earnest Gray tallied his 2,000th yard in the 10th game of his senior season (1978), and the 43rd game of his career. Damien Dodson recorded his 2,000th yard in the ninth game of his senior season (1999); the 39th game of his career.

Steele for third with Dave Casinelli, who logged seven from 1962-63. While he won't catch DeAngelo Williams, who could hold the school record for many years with 34 games, Steele needs to match his 2008 total of six for sole possession of No. 2, currently held by Gerard Arnold (11 from 1997-99).

Steele just missed the century mark in the opening weekend against Ole Miss when he tallied 90 yards on 19 carries. He did add two TDs to his career record, rushing for a two-yard TD in the second quarter and a five-yard TD in the fourth quarter. It was the second time in his career that he had scored twice in a single game.

## REAGAN LOOKING FOR STRONG SENIOR SEASON

With his two successful PATs in both the Ole Miss and Middle Tennessee games, kicker Matt Reagan continues to rank fifth in U of M history in scoring with 200 points (95 PATs/35 FG), and could potentially end his career as the No. 2 kicker all-time behind former Tiger and current Patriots kicker Stephen Gostkowski. Reagan needs 64 points and 16 PATs made in order to rank second all-time at Memphis in both categories. He led the Tigers in scoring last season with 55 points despite missing four games with a hip injury.

Reagan earned recognition in the classroom in the spring, earning the Children's Literature Award from the English department and the Paul H.

Sisco Outstanding Senior Award from the Geography department. This summer, Reagan worked an internship with the National Weather Service, and had two major weather events to learn from, including a tornado that touched down locally in Cordova and Olive Branch in July.

### PROTECT THE BALL

The key to the ground game is protecting the ball, which is one thing U of M running backs have been consistent with over the years.

From 2004-2009, Memphis backs have only accounted for seven total fumbles lost in 1,842 carries.

In the two previous seasons, Memphis as a team has ranked in the top five nationally at the end of the season in least fumbles lost. In 2007, the Tigers finished the season tied for third nationally in fumbles lost with just four (only two by backs). LSU and San Jose State led the nation in least fumbles lost with just three.

Last year, Memphis closed out the season ranked in a tie for 5th nationally with four other teams (Eastern Michigan, Miami, UL-Monroe, Rutgers) in fumbles lost with only five (one by a back).

### STEELE SCORING FOR TIGERS

Curtis Steele rushed 12 yards for a touchdown with 6:10 remaining in the first quarter against Middle Tennessee for his third TD of the season; the 10th of his

career. Steele scored twice from the run versus Ole Miss, and has now scored in seven of his last eight games for the Tigers. In that eight-game span, he has scored 11 TDs. Steele left the MT game in the second quarter with an apparent knee injury.

### SMITH LOGS FIRST TD AS A TIGER

Lance Smith scored his first rushing touchdown of his career in a Memphis uniform on a three-yard carry with 1:47 left in the fourth quarter versus the Blue Raiders. It was his ninth career rushing touchdown, with Smith scoring eight TDs in two years at Wisconsin.

With Curtis Steele scoring twice against Ole Miss and once against Middle Tennessee, the Tigers have scored all four of their TDs this season from the run.

### BASS SEES ACTION VERSUS MT

Sophomore quarterback Tyler Bass came in as the Tigers' signal caller with just over eight minutes left in the MT game. It was only his third career game for the Tigers. He played against East Carolina last season when Memphis lost two QBs in the first quarter, and played the next game against Southern Miss. He was 9-of-10 for 107 yards and had 51 yards rushing before leaving that game with a knee injury. Bass finished the game having completed all four pass attempts for 33 yards, and rushing for 17 yards on five carries.

### STARR FORCES MT FUMBLE

Defensive back Alton Starr jostled MT's Phillip Tanner and forced him to fumble the ball on 3rd-and-28 late in the second quarter, and defensive end Jada Brown pounced on the ball for the turnover. It was Starr's first forced fumble and Brown's second recovery. Brown previously had a recovery in 2006 against UTEP. The play was reviewed to determine if Tanner was down, but the call on the field stood.

### SMITH HITS CENTURY MARK FOR RETURNS

Against Middle Tennessee, Lance Smith logged 121 yards on five kick returns for his first game over 100 yards in a Tiger uniform. He averaged 24.2 yards on his returns and had a long return of 37 yards to open the game.

### SEVERAL TIGERS GET 1ST STARTS

Junior Charlie Bryant started on the defensive line against Ole Miss for his first career start. Bryant has played in 18 career games, and finished the game with three tackles, including 1.5 TFL for minus three yards.

Other players to get their first starts on offense and defense in the season opener were offensive linemen Ronald Leary, Brad Paul, Joel McCleod and Tommy Walker, receiver Brian Hall and defensive back Akeem Davis. Davis, a sophomore transfer from Jones County CC, led the

defense against the Rebels with eight tackles, seven of which were solo stops.

## TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

True freshman defensive lineman Dontari Poe played on the defensive line against Ole Miss, coming into the game in the first quarter. He had one solo tackle on the day. Other true freshmen to play in the opener were kicker Paulo Henriques, DB Derek Smith (special teams) and WR Marcus Hightower (special teams). Henriques handled kickoffs and averaged 63.3 yards on three kicks with one touchback. Memphis only had one touchback the entire 2008 season.

## STEELE SCORES TWICE ON REBELS

Curtis Steele rushed for touchdowns in the second and fourth quarters against 8th-ranked Ole Miss to mark the second time in his career that he had scored two TDs from the run. He also had two touchdowns against Southern Miss last season.

Steele took the direct snap and rushed two yards into the endzone with 13:37 remaining in the second quarter and then scored on a five-yard run with 9:09 remaining in the game. Steele finished the day with 90 yards on 19 carries. He had the longest run of the day – 28 yards—which occurred on the same drive that he scored on in the fourth quarter.

## HALL PICKED OFF BY OLE MISS

Arkelon Hall was picked off two times by Ole Miss for only his second career game of multiple interceptions. He also threw two picks against Rice last year. Hall got the starting nod at QB and struggled versus the 8th-ranked Rebels. He completed 15 of 30 passing attempts for just 110 yards and his long pass of the day was a 16 yarder to Duke Calhoun. Hall was picked off the second time with just 41 seconds remaining in the first half by Fon Ingram who raced 38 yards for the TD to put the Rebs up 17-7 heading into the intermission.

## TIGER TRIO OF BACKS LOGS YARDS

In addition to Curtis Steele logging 90 yards against the Rebels, two other Tiger backs had a steady day on the ground. Transfer Lance Smith tallied 63 yards on 10 carries for an impressive 6.3 yards per carry, and senior T.J. Pitts posted 16 yards on six carries. Smith was quite busy against the Rebels, totaling 132 all-purpose yards that also included a reception for seven yards and four kickoff returns for 62 yards.

## GIVE THAT BACK

Senior wide receiver Duke Calhoun forced his first career fumble in the first quarter against Ole Miss after an interception of Arkelon Hall by Johnny Brown. Brown returned the ball 30 yards to the Memphis 10 before having it knocked out by Calhoun and recovered by senior wide receiver Carlos Singleton at the Memphis 3. The play was reviewed regarding whether Brown was down when the ball popped out, and the call stood.

## SECONDARY YIELDS TWO PICKS

Defensive backs Deante' Lamar and Darius Davis both had interceptions of Heisman hopeful Jevan Snead. Lamar picked off Snead at the 50-yard line at the start of the second quarter for his second career interception. He also had a pick in the Louisville game last season. Lamar made a 25-yard return on the play to set Memphis up on the Ole Miss 25. The Tigers scored three plays later to cut the deficit to three points with 13:31 remaining in the second quarter.

Davis picked off Snead at the Memphis 41-yard line in the second quarter for his first career interception. Memphis punted on their ensuing drive.

## TWO SACKS FOR TIGERS IN OPENER

Defensive lineman Jada Brown and linebacker Greg Jackson both tallied sacks against the 8th-ranked Rebels. Brown dropped Jevan Snead for a loss of three yards on 3rd-and-9 on the Memphis 33 with 4:24 remaining in the third quarter for his fifth career sack. Ole Miss was forced to punt on the next play.

Jackson sacked reserve QB Nathan Stanley in the final minute of the game for a loss of 12 yards. Jackson now has 6.5 sacks in his career. The senior linebacker finished with four tackles and 2.5 TFL for a loss of 16 yards.

## DEFENSE SHOWS PROMISE VS REBS

Much attention was on the defense this spring and in fall camp because it appeared that there would be a great deal of talent and depth in the line and at linebacker. The only place that questions remained was in the secondary. Some questions were answered in the season opener against Ole Miss when DBs Darius Davis and Deante' Lamar both hauled in interceptions. In addition, the defense showed promise through about three and a half quarters, but seemed to run out of gas at the end when Ole Miss managed four TDs in the final 13 minutes of the game.

There was a period of time when the defense really kept the Rebels at bay following their first TD of the game. After that score, the Rebels were forced to either punt or were intercepted on their next eight straight drives. The only score in that span was when Arkelon Hall was picked off and the Rebs scored off the miscue. Follow-

ing those eight failed offensive drives, the Rebels scored on their final four straight drives.

## TRANSFER U

A talented group of D-I transfers has been patiently waiting for their chance to get back on the field. Many were able to practice with the team last season, but could not see game action until 2009. The group includes: TE DajLeon Farr (Univ. of Miami), DB DeRon Furr (Auburn), LB Jamon Hughes (Mississippi State), RB Darcel Johnson (Arkansas),



LB Derek Odom (LSU) and RB Lance Smith (Wisconsin). Furr was named the Defensive MVP of the 2009 Blue-Gray Game after logging seven tackles and an interception, which he returned for a touchdown. Hughes and Smith both earned the Top Newcomer Awards at the spring game for their efforts.

In addition to the above players, coach Tommy West picked up three transfers this fall (Kellen Heard, Marcus Ball, CJris Hobbs), who are eligible to play this season. Heard transferred from Texas A&M, where he was a defensive lineman and earned his bachelor's degree. He made the shift to the offensive line during camp. Ball, a transfer from Florida State, was cleared the last day of camp, and is expected to see action in the secondary. He is sitting out the first three games from an NCAA-imposed academic suspension from his time at FSU. Hobbs began practicing with the Tigers prior to the Middle Tennessee game after graduating and transferring from Stanford. A defensive back, Hobbs also handled punt returns for Stanford.

West had hoped to also have the services of receiver Jermaine McKenzie, a transfer from Miami, but the NCAA denied his request for a waiver to play without sitting out so he will be able to practice, but cannot participate in games.

## TWO TIGERS ON PRESEASON TEAM

Two Tigers were selected to the Conference USA Football Coaches Preseason team as released by the league this summer. Offensive lineman Dominik Riley and return specialist D.A. Griffin earned recognition from the C-USA coaches.

## TIGERS PICKED 3RD IN POLL

Members of the media predicted Memphis to finish third in the East Division. The poll was compiled by Ted Lewis of the *New Orleans Times Picayune*, with the assistance of media members who cover C-USA football on a regular basis.

East Carolina was predicted to win the East, while Houston was selected to win the West Division. ECU received 20 first-place votes and the Cougars totaled 22 first-place votes. Southern Miss follows ECU in the poll, with Memphis, UCF, Marshall and UAB rounding out the East Division. Tulsa is listed second in the West, followed by UTEP, Rice, SMU and Tulane.

## TWO TIGERS ON NATIONAL WATCH LISTS

Senior running back Curtis Steele opens the 2009 season as a candidate for the prestigious Doak Walker Award (nation's top running back), and junior lineman Dominik Riley is on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (nation's top lineman).

Steele was the 2008 C-USA Newcomer of the Year and earned C-USA Second Team honors after rushing for 1,223 yards and seven touchdowns on 218 attempts. He is only the fourth different Tiger to reach the 1,000-yard rushing mark in a season. Steele totaled six 100-yard rushing games and averaged 105.8 yards rushing in the last 10 games of the season, with all six 100-yard performances occurring in the stretch.

Riley started all 13 games at left guard, and was the only underclassman to start all 13 games on the Tiger offensive line last year. He was part of a line that ranked second in C-USA in fewest sacks allowed with 17. The Tiger offensive line contributed to Memphis ranking 22nd nationally in rushing offense and 26th in total offense in 2008. The front line also had to make several adjustments throughout the season as four different quarterbacks were utilized due to injuries. In fact, the Tigers had ranked as high as 14th nationally in passing offense prior to Arkelon Hall and Will Hudgens being injured in the ECU game.

## FORMER TIGER JOINS RADIO BROADCAST

Former Tiger football letterman Chris Powers will officially join play-by-play announcer Dave Woloshin in the broadcast booth for the 2009 college football season. Powers, who filled in at times for former color commentator Bob Rush during the 2008 campaign, will be handling color-commentary for the Tigers. The former Memphis tight end handled

color commentary for the Marshall, UAB, East Carolina and SMU road games and serving on the broadcast crew for the home contests, as well as the 2008 magicJack St. Petersburg Bowl. As a member of the Memphis football team from 1995-98, Powers played in 44 career games as a tight end and center. He logged four career touchdown catches during his career, including the memorable game-winning TD reception against Tennessee in 1996. He moved to center in 1998 and started all 11 games that season.

## STEELE RUSHES FOR 1,000+ IN 2008

Curtis Steele became only the fourth Tiger in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season, totaling 1,223 yards in 2008. Steele was the first Tiger to achieve 1,000-plus yards since DeAngelo Williams in 2005. Williams logged three straight 1000-yard seasons (2003-05); Gerard Arnold logged 1,059 yards in 1998; and Dave Casinelli tallied 1,016 yards in 1963.

Steele's six games of 100-plus yards also ranks tied for fourth in a single season.

Steele just missed the century mark against Ole Miss with 90 yards on 19 carries. He posted 29 yards on just five carries against Middle Tennessee before leaving the game with a knee injury. He needs just 375 yards to enter the all-time Tiger Top 10 for running backs. The No. 10 spot is currently held by Teofilo Riley (1996-99), who totaled 1,716 yards in his four-year career. If Steele can achieve the 375 yards this season, he would be the only back in the Tiger Top 10 to do so in just two seasons.

## SINGLETON NEEDS JUST ONE TD FOR RECORD

With his 18-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter against SMU last season, Carlos Singleton tied the school record for career touchdowns with 19. He is tied with Tavares Gideon, who totaled 19 TD receptions in two seasons (2002 & 2004). Singleton will set a new record on his first TD catch of the 2009 season.

Singleton is second on the team in receptions with six and in receiving yards with 72.

## WEST RANKED THIRD IN WINS

That 47th win (vs Tulane in '08) put West third all-time at the U of M, surpassing Zach Curlin, who was 43-60-14 in 13 years (from 1924-36). Billy J. Murphy holds the all-time lead in wins with his 91-44-1 record in 14 years (1958-71). Murphy captured his 47th win in the sixth game of his seventh season (1964). Murphy is followed in wins by Ralph Hatley who went 59-43-5 in 11 years at the helm of the U of M program (1947-57). Hatley picked up his 47th win in the third game of his ninth season (1955).

### STARR MAKES RETURN AFTER INJURY

Senior Alton Starr has been working hard this summer and through fall camp to reclaim a spot in the lineup after being sidelined with a knee injury that kept him out of spring workouts. Starr suffered a torn ACL in the St. Petersburg Bowl, and had surgery on January 16. At the start of camp, it seemed Starr would potentially miss the first couple games of the year, but he has worked hard and practiced fully for the final two weeks.

Starr saw action in the season opener against Ole Miss in the defense, and on special teams. He had one assisted tackle in the season opener. He saw extended time in the secondary versus Middle Tennessee and, in addition to his six tackles, forced a fumble that was recovered by Jada Brown.

### KICKING IT

Senior Matt Reagan missed four games in 2008 with a hip flexor injury, but despite

that, he continues to make his way up the charts for the Tigers. He led the team in scoring in '08 with 55 points (31 PAT, 8 FG).

Heading into the UT Martin game, he ranks fifth all-time at Memphis in scoring by a kicker with 200 total points. He also ranks fourth in career PATs made (95) and fourth in PATs attempted (100).

In addition, Reagan ranks fifth in the record book in FGs made with 35 and his success rate of 68.6 percent is good for fifth all-time. Reagan missed his only field goal attempt so far this season, a 49 yarder that would have been a career high make. The ball bounced off the upright in the Ole Miss game.

### RECEIVERS TAKE A HIT WITH INJURIES

The receiving corps was one place that appeared to have the most depth heading into fall camp. But, the group took a hit through camp, basically losing three players in a matter of days. In just his fourth practice with the team, junior college transfer Billy Foster suffered a dislocation of his ankle that required reconstructive surgery and will sideline him for 2009. University of Miami transfer Jermaine McKenzie's application for a waiver to play this season was denied by the NCAA, and he will not be eligible this year. Sophomore Cam Baker suffered a knee injury in camp that threatened to put him out for the first two games. Both McKenzie and Foster were described by coach Tommy West as "touchdown a game guys."

### BALL AND HEARD WERE LATE AD-DITIONS

Defensive back Marcus Ball and offensive lineman Kellen Heard are not in the 2009 edition of the Tiger Football media guide because they joined the Tigers during fall camp. Heard transferred to Memphis with one year of eligibility from Texas A&M, where he lettered three seasons on the defensive line. He made the transition to offensive line in fall camp. As an Aggie, Heard played in 36 games and totaled 67 tackles, seven FFL, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He earned his bachelor's degree from A&M and is working on his master's degree at Memphis.

Ball played in four games at Florida State as a true freshman in 2006 before injuring his knee. He was granted a redshirt year for 2006 and played in nine games as a sophomore in '07. He totaled 24 tackles, a fumble recovery, an interception, three pass breakups and 1.5

tackles for loss. In 2008, Ball played at Pearl River Community College, and was a first-team all-American safety at PRCC. **Ball will miss the first three games of the season for an NCAA-imposed suspension regarding academic issues at FSU.**

### WEST VS NEWBIES

Memphis head coach Tommy West is 10-3 against opposing coaches in their first year at their respective programs, since taking over the Tigers in 2001. West will meet just one coach this season who is new, and that happens to be at his alma mater, Tennessee, where Lane Kiffin is in his first year with the Vols. ## DEFENSE LOOKING TO CONTINUE CLIMB

The Tiger defense made great strides in 2008 and averaged a 30-spot improvement over the 2007 season. In 2007, Memphis ranked 103rd in rushing defense, and in 2008, the squad made a jump to 76th. Pass efficiency defense saw a similar leap from 96th in '07 to 76th in '08. Overall, the Tigers' improvement in total defense saw the squad move from 100th in '07 to 57th in '08. The challenge now is to make an even greater leap into the top 25.

## NEW TO THE SIDELINES IN '09

Just before spring practice, Tommy West enticed Arkansas State co-defensive

coordinator Jack Curtis to join the Tigers as the safeties coach. Curtis coached at ASU the last seven seasons, and in 2007 the Red Wolves were the leading defensive unit in the Sun Belt Conference. West waited until the completion of the spring session to finalize his staff with the hiring of John Wozniak to serve as the special teams coordinator. Wozniak was at Montana State last season, and has had Division I coaching stints at LSU, Georgia Southern and Oklahoma State.

## RILEY IS LONE RETURNING FULL-TIME STARTER IN O-LINE

The Tiger offensive line was bolstered by four seniors last season, which leaves junior Dominik Riley as the only returning full-time starter on the line in 2009. Riley started all 13 games at left guard and worked over 65 percent of the team's offensive plays last year. Riley worked some at center in the spring, but appears to have settled in at right guard during fall camp. Senior Malcom Rawls also has considerable experience in the line, having started five games at right guard. Ronald Leary, who played eight games last year, was named to the 2008 C-USA All-Freshman Team. The Tiger offensive line was key last season in Memphis ranking 22nd nationally in rushing offense and 26th in total offense.

## “UN”LUCKY NUMBER 7?

If there is anyone on the Tigers' squad that has seen his share of adversity, it is senior QB Will Hudgens, who ironically enough wears the number 7.

Hudgens, a local standout, came to Memphis in 2004. He sat out that season while rehabilitating a torn ACL in his left knee that he suffered in a dunk contest his senior year. In 2005, Hudgens was listed at backup QB, but was pressed into action in the season opener versus Ole Miss when starter Patrick Byrne broke his leg on Memphis' first drive. Hudgens started the next two games against Chattanooga and Tulsa, but suffered a broken right leg and ligament damage in the Tulsa meeting. He had surgery and missed the rest of the season.

In 2006, Hudgens was poised to make a return to the field. He came in off the bench in the season opener against Ole Miss and in the second game versus Chattanooga. He completed one pass for eight yards against Chattanooga before suffering another broken leg, which was officially ruled a non-displaced tibial fracture. He was able to practice with the team the week of the Marshall game, but did not see game action the remainder of the season. He joined the Tiger baseball team in the spring and had a productive season on the mound for the squad.

In 2007, Hudgens played in 13 games and was truly a utility player for the Tigers, working as a backup QB, a fullback and

deep snapper. Hudgens started versus Marshall for Martin Hankins, who was injured, and led the squad to a win with 346 yards on 30-of-45 passing and two touchdowns. Hudgens played baseball for the Tigers again in the spring and was eventually drafted by the Cincinnati Reds. He spent the summer playing in Montana, and was granted the opportunity to return to school to compete in 2008 with the Tiger football team.

And, eight games into the 2008 season, Hudgens was sidelined again with a right knee injury he suffered against East Carolina after he came in for Arkelon Hall, who fractured his thumb. Hudgens was tackled on a three-yard run and did not return to the field. MRI tests showed that Hudgens tore his ACL and MCL, and he had surgery to repair the damage.

Hudgens finally got some good news this past summer as the NCAA granted him a sixth season of eligibility. Look for Hudgens to be a play-maker who could make a difference in many roles including passing, rushing and punting.

## HUDGENS HAS MAJOR TALENT

Senior Will Hudgens was drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 23rd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He spent summer 2008 throwing for the Billings (Mont.) Mustangs, and went 3-0 with the Mustangs before leaving early to be with the Tigers for last year's fall camp.

Hudgens came in off the sidelines in the first seven games of '08 and threw three touchdown passes and rushed for one score. He also had come in as a punter in the pooch punt situation, and averaged 47.6 yards on his seven kicks.

Hudgens was called to duty on Memphis' first drive against East Carolina for Arkelon Hall, who suffered a fracture in his thumb on the first play of the game. Hudgens took six snaps (one on a punt) and left the game with a knee injury. An MRI revealed that Hudgens had torn both his MCL and ACL, and would have to miss the remainder of the season.

In an interview after getting injured, Hudgens said that he has no regrets about returning to play football, despite the fact that the Reds had informed him after the draft that he could play football, but if he was injured, the contract would be void.

## OLE MISS 45, MEMPHIS 14 SEPT. 6, 2009 • LIBERTY BOWL STADIUM

**MEMPHIS, Tenn.** — Sometimes the game of football can be frustrating, and other times, it just can't be your day. It was a combination of both for Memphis, which dropped a 45-14 decision to No. 10/8 nationally-ranked Ole Miss before a crowd of 45,207 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

For the Tiger offense, it just wasn't clicking in the 2009 season opener. Memphis managed 284 yards of total offense and had only 175 yards through three quarters. Returning starting signal-caller Arkelon Hall was out-of-sync the entire contest, connecting on 15 of his 30 pass attempts for 110 yards. Hall was intercepted twice, including one returned for a touchdown.

As the offense stalled much of the contest, the Memphis defense played well until the final period when frustration entered in, and the visiting Rebels from Oxford, Miss., took advantage with a 28-point outburst. Through three quarters, the Tiger defense held the high-powered Ole Miss offense to only 195 yards of total offense. Memphis also put the clamps on Rebel quarterback Jevan Snead, one of the nation's best at his position, in the first three periods. Snead managed only 8-of-17 passing for 102 yards with no touchdown passes and two interceptions entering the fourth quarter.

It was the fourth quarter, though, when the combination of "not-your-day" and frustration for the Tigers became apparent, and Ole Miss opened up the game en route to the victory. In the final quarter, the Rebels outscored Memphis 28-7 and outgained the Tigers 154-109. Snead found his rhythm in the fourth quarter, going 4-of-5 passing for 73 yards and two scores.

The Tigers' first three offensive series set the tone for that side of the ball in the contest. In its first three possessions, Memphis ran eight plays and had a total of -4 yards of total offense. One of the drives ended with a Hall interception, but the Tigers forced a fumble on the return and regained possession inside their own 10. Memphis, however, had to punt after a 3-and-out series.

Despite the solid play of the Tiger defense, Ole Miss took advantage of favorable field position early in the first quarter. After Memphis' first 3-and-out, the Rebels started on their own 44 and quickly moved inside the Memphis 20. The Tiger defense, though, held and forced Ole Miss to settle for a Joshua Shene 27-yard field goal four minutes into the contest.

After the Tigers' second 3-and-out possession, Ole Miss started its first touchdown-scoring drive at the Memphis 26. Four plays later, Brandon Bolden hit paydirt from one yard out, and the Rebels held a 10-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

On their next possession, the Tiger offense got into gear and moved the ball into Ole Miss territory to the Rebel 29. Penalties, however, halted the drive and forced a Memphis field goal attempt. Matt Reagan's 49-yard try hit the right upright and bounced back.

With all the bad luck the offense was having, the Tiger defense could have packed it in after one quarter. That wasn't the case on this day. Undeterred, the Memphis defense came up with a huge play early in the second quarter.

After the missed Tiger field goal, Ole Miss took possession, and in two plays, had the ball near

midfield. Then, on a 1st-and-10, Tiger defensive back Deante' Lamar picked off Snead at the 50 yard line and returned it to the Rebel 25, setting up the offense in excellent field position.

The Memphis offense made the most of the turnover. Three plays after the interception, Curtis Steele went over the goal line from two yards out, cutting the Rebel advantage to 10-7 early in the second quarter.

With new life, Memphis played the Rebels to a near standstill the rest of the quarter. However, a last-minute Tiger mistake before halftime proved to be a huge blow that Memphis couldn't overcome.

Down 10-7 with under two minutes left before the half, Memphis took over on its own 26 and moved the ball to the 31 yard line. Then, on 3rd-and-5, Ole Miss' Fon Ingram picked off a Hall pass and returned it 38 yards for a back-breaking touchdown just before intermission. The Rebels' led 17-7 at the break.

After a scoreless third quarter, Ole Miss exploded for 28 fourth-quarter points. Snead led the Rebels' final-period scoring flurry with two touchdown tosses — one to Markeith Summers (18 yards) and one to Dexter McCluster (17 yards).

Memphis' final score was another Steele touchdown from five yards out.

Steele led all rushers with 90 yards on 19 carries. Lance Smith added 10 carries for 63 yards. Duke Calhoun led the Tiger receiving corps with five catches for 53 yards. Reagan had seven punts for a 44.1 yard average.

Bolden paced the Ole Miss ground attack with 71 yards on nine rushes. McCluster had a game-high six receptions for 65 yards.

## MIDDLE TENNESSEE 31, MEMPHIS 14

SEPT. 12, 2009 • FLOYD STADIUM

**MURFREESBORO, Tenn.** — Baseball legend Yogi Berra said it best: "It's deja vu all over again."

For the fifth-consecutive year, Memphis has started a season behind the proverbial "eight ball." But, Tiger Nation will not panic, as in three of the four previous seasons, the fans have seen their beloved football team rebound to earn bowl berths.

The Tigers will have to put together another rebound performance this year, as they dropped their second-straight contest to open the 2009 campaign with a 31-14 setback to Middle Tennessee before a Blue Raider school-record crowd of 28,105. Memphis' trip to Murfreesboro was its first since 1953. The Tiger-Blue Raider series was renewed in 2007 after a 53-year draught.

As he did in Middle Tennessee's 21-7 victory at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium in 2007, Blue Raider quarterback Dwight Dasher proved to be the difference. Dasher's 231 passing yards not only nearly doubled the Tigers' yards through the air, but were more than Memphis' entire offensive output of 219 yards. Dasher was also the game's leading rusher with 89 yards on 17 carries, and he was 18-of-26 passing with two touchdown tosses.

Dasher's performance overshadowed Tiger wide receiver Duke Calhoun's record-setting day. After taking over the top spot on the school's all-time receptions list in the season opener versus Ole Miss, Calhoun set the Memphis career receiving yardage mark in the fourth quarter against Middle Tennessee. His 12-yard catch at the start of the final period gave Calhoun the record, and he now has 2,138 yards. Calhoun surpassed Earnest Gray, who totaled 2,123 yards from 1975-78. Calhoun also extended his streak of games with at least one reception to 39 straight, the third-longest in the nation.

The game started as if it was going to be a shootout, with both teams scoring early. Middle Tennessee struck first on its first possession of the contest. Starting on their own 4 yard line, the Blue Raiders took only nine plays to move the ball 96 yards for a 7-0 lead. Dasher accounted for 33 yards (30 rush, 3 pass) on the drive, but the big blow was Malcolm Beyah's 41-yard connection with Garrett Andrews, which put Middle Tennessee at the Tiger 4 yard line. On the next play, Phillip Tanner hit paydirt for a 7-0 lead for the home team.

Memphis immediately responded on its next possession. The Tigers began the drive on their own 31, and kept the ball on the ground most of the way to the end zone. On the 69-yard drive, Memphis gained 55 yards via the rushing game. Curtis Steele got the final carry of the possession and found the end zone from 12 yards out to tie the contest at 7-all midway through the opening quarter.

In the second quarter, Middle Tennessee took the lead for good after a costly Memphis turnover. After the Tiger defense held the home squad to a 3-and-out, the Blue Raiders were forced to punt. The Memphis return team, though, fumbled the punt and Middle Tennessee recovered on its own 43. Three plays later, Dasher hit Shane Blissard on a 40-yard touchdown strike for a 14-7 lead.

On their next possession, the Blue Raiders wasted little time moving the ball into scoring position again. With a 1st-and-10 on Middle Tennessee

43, Dasher rushed for 42 yards on the first play and put the Blue Raiders inside the Memphis 20 yard line. Alan Gendreau wrapped up the drive with a 28-yard field goal for a 17-7 Middle Tennessee lead at the break.

After intermission, Memphis managed only 51 yards on its first two possessions. Then, on its third drive of the third quarter, Middle Tennessee put the game out of reach when Dasher hit Patrick Honeycutt for a 24-yard score to increase the advantage to 24-7.

Each team added another touchdown in the final period for the 31-14 final. Memphis' last score was a Lance Smith three-yard touchdown run.

Tiger starting quarterback Arkelon Hall was 13-of-22 passing for 93 yards, which was his lowest yardage output passing the ball of his Memphis career. Sophomore Tyler Bass relieved Hall in the final quarter and was 4-of-4 passing for 33 yards. Calhoun (4 catches, 27 yards) and Carlos Singleton (3 catches, 45 yards) led the Tiger receiving corps.

T.J. Pitts led the Tiger ground attack with 40 yards on nine carries. Steele rushed for 29 yards on five carries before leaving the game in the second quarter with a knee injury.

Honeycutt led all receivers with game highs of five receptions and 71 yards for Middle Tennessee.

Greg Jackson paced the Memphis defense with eight total tackles and one TFL. Winston Bowens added seven tackles and two TFL.
