

**CINCINNATI vs. MEMPHIS**  
**October 23, 2004**

**Game Notes**

**Cincinnati Notes:**

- The 49 points by UC is the most in the 29-game series with Memphis and the 39-point margin is the largest in the series. Both previous marks were set in a 48-10 win in 2002.
- The 10 points by Memphis was its fewest of the year.
- The 57 yards rushing by Memphis' DeAngelo Williams was his lowest total since he gained one yard against Mississippi on Sept. 7, 2002. The 52 yards passing by Danny Wimprine was the fewest since three against Mississippi State on Sept. 3, 2001.
- Trent Cole recorded one sack and one tackle for loss to raise his career totals to 15.5 sacks and 42 TFLs, fourth and sixth all-time at UC.
- Andre Frazier recorded a sack to raise his career total to 18.5, second on UC's all-time list.
- Mike Daniels' 34-yard punt return in the second quarter was a career long and the longest by a Bearcat this year.
- Antwan Giddens' first quarter 22-yard touchdown catch was the first reception of his career.
- Bradley Glatthaar's second quarter touchdown was the first of his career.
- Evan Sparks made the first rushes of his career, gaining 14 yards on 4 carries.

Memphis won the coin toss and deferred. Cincinnati elected to receive and defended the North end zone.

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### Post-Game Quotes

#### **CINCINNATI HEAD COACH MARK DANTONIO:**

"This was a great win for us. It was our best game here by far. They (Memphis) came into the game leading the conference giving up 80 yards and we got 242. That's execution. It was a great game called by Coach (Don) Treadwell. They were one of the top teams in the conference in offense and we held them to 200 yards. That was a great job by Coach (Pat) Narduzzi. We felt like we had to make them one dimensional. They were a great throwing team and a great running team and we wanted to take away one aspect. We were able to do both. On offense, we needed to be able to run the football and I thought our running backs did a good job.

"I think this (win) speaks for their attitude. I've been impressed with their attitude all along. That team has never quit. It's never not played hard. We've made mistakes but we've always played hard. That's been our mindset. I'm glad it happened for our players tonight. Our guys hung in their with great toughness and great effort.

"We thought our three keys to victory were to be multidimensional--to be able to run and throw the football. We needed to make them one dimensional. Our players played aggressively. They showed a lot of speed to the ball and we took away what they did. And we thought on special teams we had to play flawless and get two big plays, and I think we did this."

#### **FRESHMAN WIDE RECEIVER ANTWAN GIDDENS**

"I was really excited to get a chance to play. I've been hungry for success for awhile. When I got the ball, I just tried to get into the end zone. It felt good to have my first catch be a touchdown. My chance came today to make a catch and I did it."

#### **SENIOR DEFENSIVE END ANDRE FRAZIER**

"Today I thought we came out really focused and ready to play. Coming off of the loss to Army, we had a real sour taste in our mouths. But it gave us time to find our weak points and we had to go back to the basics. The difference from the Army game was that we came out so focused. The coaches instilled in us to watch a lot of film and do the basics."

#### **MEMPHIS HEAD COACH TOMMY WEST:**

"We got wore out in every phase. We didn't win a phase. It was a bad day."

"We didn't fight hard enough. And I'm not going to lay that on the players. It's my responsibility to have this football team ready to play. I did not do my job. I have to do my job better than I did it."

"I didn't see this coming. It was start to finish. I didn't see this coming at all."

"It was that way from the get-go. They scored the first three times they had the ball. You come in at halftime and it's 35-3. You come out of halftime and you have to try to work your way back into the game. We're trying to get first downs, trying to put something on the board. We just couldn't do it. We weren't good enough to do it tonight."

"I think they're a physical team. We were concerned about their front, their defensive front. We have a better football team than just played. This is my responsibility, this is my fault. I have to get my football team ready to play. That's not us. That's not the way we play."

"We didn't play good anywhere. There's no way you can put it on one area. Give them (Cincinnati) all the credit."
