MEMPHIS-UCF SERIES

Saturday's game is the seventh meeting between the two schools on the gridiron. The Knights lead the all-time series 5-1.

UCF has won five straight over the Tigers since the two schools became Conference USA East Division rivals in 2005. Last year, UCF defeated Memphis 32-14 in Orlando. The Knights won the last encounter at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium, a 28-21 victory in the 2008 campaign.

The Tigers' lone win in the series was a 37-28 victory in the 1990 season.

LAST FIVE MEETINGS WITH THE KNIGHTS

UCF 32, UM 14 (Orlando, 2009): The Knights held a narrow 15-14 lead after three quarters, but exploded for 17 unanswered points in the final period for the 32-14 win. Tiger WR Duke Calhoun caught four passes for 162 yards and one score (61-yard TD reception). Will Hudgens (143 yards) and Tyler Bass (115 yards) both threw for over 100 yards. UCF RB Brynn Harvey rushed for 219 yards on 42 carries and one TD, while QB Brett Hodges passed for 214 yards and two TDs.

UCF 28, UM 21 (Memphis, 2008): Two early Memphis miscues helped UCF jump out to a 14-0 first quarter lead en route to the 28-21 victory. The Knights scored their first TD on a short drive after a blocked punt, and returned a Tiger fumble for a TD for the second score. UCF built its lead to 28-7 before Memphis mounted a rally. Tiger WR Duke Calhoun scored Memphis' first TD on a 54-yard connection. The pass play put Calhoun over 2,000 yard for his career, becoming only the third player in Tiger history to hit that milestone.

UCF 56, UM 20 (Orlando, 2007): In the first C-USA game played in the Knights' new home, Bright House Networks Stadium, the UCF offense turned it on early and often en route to a 56-20 league win. The Knights' offense piled up 601 total yards and scored seven rushing TDs. RB Kevin Smith led the UCF attack with 124 yards on 22 carries and three TDs. Memphis QBs Martin Hankins and Will Hudgens each threw one TD.

UCF 26, UM 24 (Memphis, 2006): A Michael Torres 18-yard FG with 3:01 left provided the winning margin for the Knights in the 26-24 victory. The Tigers — led by QB Martin Hankins' 272-yard, three-TD performance — played catch-up the entire game, but took their first lead at 24-23 on a Hankins-to-Duke Calhoun 26-yard TD pass with 10:40 left. Calhoun had 100 receiving yards and two TDs. UCF QB Steven Moffett passed for 319 yards and two scores.

UCF 38, UM 17 (Orlando, 2005): The Knights rolled up over 500 yards of total offense and blew the game open in the fourth quarter en route to the win. DeAngelo Williams rushed for 136 yards, but had to leave the contest in the third quarter due to dehydration. UCF took advantage with a 17-point fourth quarter to take the win. Knight QB Stephen Moffett was 14-of-21 passing for 290 yards and three TDs.

LARRY PORTER

Head Coach • 1st Year



Former University of Memphis running back Larry Porter has returned to his alma mater after being named the school's 22nd head football coach on November 29, 2009. Porter played for the Tigers in the 1990s and received his degree in 1996.

A native of Jackson, Miss., Porter is returning to Memphis after spending the last five years on the LSU coaching staff. He had also worked three years with LSU coach Les Miles at Oklahoma State before joining Miles in Baton Rouge in 2005. He has coached LSU running backs while also holding two key roles on staff - assistant head coach and chief recruiter. Porter was elevated to the position of assistant head coach during the spring of 2006. He was twice (2007 and 2009) named as the National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com making him one of the top all-around assistant coaches in college football.

In three of the last four seasons (2006-09 included), the LSU rushing unit averaged over 165 yards a game, including a high of 214 yards per game in 2007. That squad closed out the season ranked 11th nationally in rushing. From 2005-08, the Tigers totaled 108 rushing touchdowns, including 35 in 2007.

As LSU's running backs coach, Porter has helped developed some of the finest players at that position in LSU's history. From 2005-09, LSU produced a 1,000-yard rusher twice - Jacob Hester with 1,103 yards in 2007 and Charles Scott with 1,174 yards in 2008 - as well as having five players (Hester, Joseph Addai, Quinn Johnson, Charles Scott, Trindon Holliday) selected in the NFL Draft.

Porter has also had coaching stints at Arkansas State, Oklahoma State and UT Martin. At Oklahoma State, Porter's stable of running backs continued the tradition of "Tailback U.", as he coached 1,000-yard rushers for three straight seasons. In 2004, Vernand Morency earned second-team All-Big 12 honors after rushing for 1,474 yards, which ranked eighth in the nation, and 12 touchdowns.

Prior to his arrival in Stillwater, Porter spent three years at Arkansas State, where he coached Jonathan Adams to back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Adams rushed for 1,004 yards and six touchdowns in 2000 and followed that with another 1,004 yards and five scores in 2001.

Porter began his coaching career at Wooddale High School in Memphis, Tenn., serving as head track and field coach, while assisting with the running backs and secondary on the football squad. After two years at Wooddale, Porter moved to the collegiate ranks, coaching the running backs at Tennessee-Martin in 1998.

Porter lettered four years (1990-93) at Memphis, serving as co-captain of the 1993 Tiger squad. He closed out his career with 2,194 yards and 20 rushing touchdowns, ranking seventh in school history in yardage and tied for fifth in touchdowns. As a rookie in 1990, Porter rushed for 206 yards against Arkansas State, the highest single-game total for a freshman in school history. In his first game, he replaced injured starting tailback Marvin Cox and raced 53 yards for a touchdown against Arkansas State on his first college carry. Porter had a total of six 100-yard games during his career, a figure that ranks tied for fifth in Memphis history.

Porter graduated in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in education. He and his wife Sharmane have three children, Brandon, Omari and Olivia.

SENIORS HONORED IN PRE-GAME CEREMONY

The Tigers end the 2010 season with 21 seniors playing their last game at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium on Nov. 27 against UCF. The 21 seniors to be honored prior to kickoff are: Keenan Bratcher, Darius Davis, D.A. Griffin, Stevie Matthews, Brad Paul, Marcus Ball, Winston Bowers, Charlie Bryant, Jamon Hughes, Kindly Jacques, Colton Jenkins, Malcolm Jones, Lester Lawson, Jeremy Longstreet, John McArthur, Deven Onarheim, Torenzo Quinn, Gregory Ray, Dominik Riley, Justin Thompson, Bryan Wright.

A LITTLE SERIES HISTORY LESSON

Although this is the seventh all-time meeting between the two squads, Saturday's encounter is only the sixth match-up as Division I-A opponents. UCF was an NCAA Division I-AA team in 1990 when the Tigers won that meeting 37-28.

DID YOU KNOW?

Memphis head coach Larry Porter suited up for the Blue and Gray from 1990-93, and his first win as a player came against — you guessed it — UCF.

The Tigers opened the 1990 campaign with a tie against Arkansas State (24-24) and a narrow loss to Ole Miss (23-21). In the season's third week, Memphis hosted UCF at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium and recorded a 37-28 win on Sept. 22, 1990.

TIGERS IN REGULAR SEASON HOME FINALES

Memphis has a 5-5 record in its last 10 regular season home finales. The Tigers dropped a 31-21 decision to UAB in the 2009 last regular home game at the Liberty Bowl.

Prior to last year's regular season home finale setback, Memphis had won four of its last five final home games from 2004-08.

PORTER IN REGULAR SEASON HOME FINALES

In his career wearing the Blue and Gray, Larry Porter was 2-2 in regular season home finales. The Tigers were victorious in Porter's "Senior Day" game in 1993, defeating Southern Miss 20-9 on Nov. 13, 1993.

FLORIDA TIGERS

The Memphis roster has 12 players on it that call the Sunshine State home. DeJarrius Adams (Miami), Lavaris Edwards (Miami), Billy Foster (Ft. Lauderdale), Kindly Jacques (Ft. Lauderdale), Curtis Johnson (Miami), Joel McCleod (Miramar), D'Angelo McCray (Jacksonville), Jermaine McKenzie (Bradenton), Tremaine McKenzie (Bradenton) Andy Summerlin (Apopka), Ryan Williams (Pembroke Pines) and Bryan Wright (Miami) all hail from the state of Florida.

ON THIS DATE

Memphis has a 2-5-1 record when it plays on Nov. 27 in its history. The Tigers last played on Nov. 27 last year and dropped a 33-30 overtime decision at Tulsa. Memphis' last Nov. 27 victory was a 31-15 win at USF to close the 2004 regular season.

HUGHES IN NATIONAL TOP 5 IN TACKLES

Jamon Hughes again recorded double digits tackles, leading the defense with 17 stops versus UAB. Heading into the UCF game, he is third nationally and leads the Tigers with 136 total tackles, including 67 solo stops. He has led the Tigers in tackles in 10 of the 11 games this season. Prior to the UT contest (only 4 stops), Hughes had made six or more tackles in 14-straight games and posted 14 or more tackles in six of those games. He was named the C-USA Defensive Player of the Week after posting 21 tackles against USM.

AND THEN THERE WAS ONE ...

Through the Southern Miss game, four Tiger receivers were holding on to seven-game receiving streaks. Four weeks later, only one remains on a streak - Marcus Rucker. Rucker has caught a pass in all 11 games this season. Jermaine McKenzie and Tannar Rehrer had their streaks stopped at six (McKenzie missed USM game with injury) and seven games, respectively, by Houston. Curtis John-

son pushed his streak to nine games before being held without a catch by Marshall.

TWENTY-SOMETHING

D.A. Griffin leads the Tigers in 20-yard plays this season with 17 - all of which are on kick returns. Greg Ray, Jermaine McKenzie and Marcus Rucker are all tied with 10 offensive plays over 20 yards.

While statistically the receiver or the running back is credited for the offensive play, quarterback Ryan Williams has actually completed 30 passes that have resulted in gains of 20 or more yards. In addition, eight of his pass completions this season have been for 35 or more yards.

And, to take the note a bit further, five of Marcus Rucker's seven TD receptions have resulted from receptions of 20 or more yards this season.

CONSISTENT STARTERS

With a tough season comes a bit of juggling in the lineup. Heading into the UCF game, only six Tigers have started all 10 games. Those consistent starters are: WR Marcus Rucker, LT Ron Leary, LG Joel McCleod, DL Frank Trotter, DL Dontari Poe and CB Mohammed Seisay.

BALL BACK IN LINEUP VS UAB - LOGS TWO PICKS

Senior safety Marcus Ball returned to the field versus UAB after serving a two-game suspension and logged two interceptions in the game. He picked off Bryan Ellis at the Memphis 49 on 1st-and-10 from the UAB28. The play was reviewed and the call on the field stood. Ball made his second interception of the game in the fourth quarter and returned it 63 yards to the UAB seven-yard line. It is the second time in his career he has logged two interceptions in a game; as he also logged two against UTEP last season. The two picks vs UAB bring Ball's career total to five (one of which he registered while playing for Florida State).

HUGHES POISED TO ENTER TOP 5 IN RECORD BOOK

Senior Jamon Hughes will no doubt try to make the best of Senior Day against UCF, but for the linebacker, his status in the Memphis record book is at stake. Hughes enters the finale with 136 tackles this season, which ranks ninth in the single season records at Memphis. Hughes is 26 tackles from tying the school leader - Michael Thomas (162 tackles in 1980), but he needs just eight stops to enter the top 5 as Danton Barto (1993) and Todd Ondra (1979) both total 144 tackles in a tie at No. 5.

Hughes does currently rank tied for third in school single season assisted tackles with 69. He would need 10 assists in the final game to tie Ondra for the lead.

TROTTER COULD ENTER TOP 5 IN RECORD BOOK TOO

Junior defensive lineman Frank Trotter leads the team in TFL with 15 this season and currently ranks seventh in single season TFLs in the Memphis record book. Just one more TFL would put Trotter in the top 5, tying Marquis Bowling (1997) and Marcus Bell (2000). Two TFL against UCF could pop Trotter all the way to a tie for No. 3 with Tim Harris (1984) and Eric Fairs (1984).

WHILE WE ARE TALKING ABOUT RECORDS...

True freshman punter Tom Hornsey ranks sixth in most punts in a season with 74 and is just six away from tying the school record of 80 set in 1978 by Hugh Owens and matched in 1980 by Russell Richards. Hornsey also holds the school records for most yards punted in a season with 3,179 and currently ranks fifth in season punting average (43.0)

MEET ME AT TIGER LANE

Tiger Lane is the place to be before all home games. The newly-developed tailgating area is a \$16 million project that was approved by the Memphis City Council. The Tiger football team started a new tradition of making their Tiger Walk down the center of Tiger Lane for the home opener against Middle Tennessee. The Tigers are joined by the spirit squads, the band and our official mascot, TOM III.

ORLANDO, Fla. — For fans that love smash-mouth football with running the ball a lot and controlling the clock, then they loved the Memphis-UCF game. However, the fans that enjoyed the game more were those wearing the Black and Gold on this day.

The Knights played "old school" football against the Tigers en route to a 32-14 Conference USA victory before a crowd of 40,408 at Bright House Networks Stadium. The contest was UCF's league home opener and was also Memphis' C-USA road opener.

UCF rolled up 261 yards on the ground and controlled the ball nearly 39 minutes (38:57 to be exact) in the win. Brynn Harvey led the Knights' ground attack with 219 rushing yards on 42 carries. UCF quarterback Brett Hodges aided the home team's cause with a 16-of-28 passing performance for 214 yards and two touchdown tosses. Hodges also ran the ball three times for 19 yards.

On the other side, Memphis was unable to get its rushing game in gear. The Tigers managed only 67 rushing yards on 26 carries for a 2.6 yards-per-rush average. Lance Smith was the Tigers' leading rusher with 35 yards on eight carries. Curtis Steele, who returned for his first game action since the first half of the Sept. 12 game, rushed the ball eight times for 22 yards.

The Tiger passing game was a combined effort from Will Hudgens, Tyler Bass and Brian Hall. The trio went 16-of-31 passing for 258 yards and

two touchdowns, but also had two interceptions.

The lone bright spot for Memphis was wide receiver Duke Calhoun, who had four catches for 162 yards and a score. The touchdown reception was a 61-yarder from Bass, marking the third-straight game the duo connected on a touchdown of 60 yards or more.

Calhoun's 162-yard performance was the sixth-best for a single game in Tiger football history. The 100-yard receiving game was the 10th of his career, which is a school record.

The offenses for both teams were slow to start with no scoring in the first quarter. However, when looking at the statistics after one period of play, it began telling what was the eventual story of the game. In the opening quarter, UCF out-rushed Memphis 66-8 and held the ball over four minutes longer than the Tigers (9:53-5:07).

The Knights finally broke the scoreless tie early in the second quarter on a drive that began at the end of the first period. UCF drove 53 yards on nine plays to the Memphis 7 yard line, setting up Nick Cattoi's 24-yard field goal. On the possession, UCF gained 36 of the 53 yards on the ground.

Memphis, though, responded quickly on its next possession. The Tigers took over on their own 15 and moved the ball out to the 39 yard line. Then, on a 3rd-and-8, Bass hooked up with Calhoun on a 61-yard scoring strike to give Memphis a 7-3 lead with 10:24 left on the clock before halftime.

After the short scoring flurry, the defenses stepped up on both sides and forced an exchange of punts, giving UCF the ball with just over four minutes remaining before intermission. The Knights drove the ball to the Tigers 20 yard line, but Jada Brown halted the UCF scoring opportunity when he intercepted Hodges' pass and returned it 62 yards to the Knights 13 with 1:22 on the clock. Four plays later, Memphis missed a 30-yard field goal

attempt, swinging momentum back to the home side of the field.

After the break, the Knights regained the lead at 9-7 on two Cattoi field goals, but as they did in the first half, the Tigers responded immediately. Memphis took only 1:44 to go 65 yards, and the drive culminated in a Hudgens-to-DajLeon Farr 12-yard touchdown catch for a 14-9 lead.

UCF answered with its first touchdown of the day on the ensuing possession. The Knights finished off a six-play, 58-yard drive when Hodges hit Ricky Kay from seven yards out for a 15-14 UCF lead.

The Knights did not trail the remainder of the game, closing the contest with 17 unanswered points in the fourth quarter for the 32-14 victory. Harvey capped the scoring with a 25-yard touchdown run with only 41 seconds left in the game.

Aside from Calhoun, no other Tiger receiver had more than 25 yards. Steele had three catches for 21 yards and Deven Onarheim added a reception for 23 yards. Matt Reagan averaged 49.2 yards on five punts with a long of 56.

For the Knights, Hodges' favorite target was Jamar Newsome, who had five catches for 58 yards and a score. Kay added four receptions for 52 yards.

Greg Jackson paced the Tiger defense with 13 tackles. Cory Hogue led the UCF defense with seven tackles and 1.5 TFL.

PERSONNEL CHANGES IN OFF WEEK

The bye week between the USM and Houston games gave Coach Larry Porter additional time to look at some players in different positions. Senior linebacker Jeremy Longstreet made the transition to running back - a position that he worked at in the spring prior to the 2009 season. Longstreet played running back and linebacker in high school.

Longstreet saw his first chance to tote the pigskin versus Tennessee with Jerrell Rhodes out with an injury. The former defender tallied eight runs for 26 yards and also caught three passes for 40 yards. He had a long reception of 29 yards in the loss to the Vols. A week later, Longstreet rushed for 16 yards on six carries against Marshall.

Senior defensive lineman Charlie Bryant has moved to the offensive line - a spot that has had consistency issues this season due to various injuries. Bryant, a massive 6-8/320, was an o-lineman in high school, but was moved to the d-line in the spring prior to the 2007 season. He saw his first action on offense against Houston when he came in at tight end and aided Jerrell Rhodes in a four-yard gain.

HORNSEY ON RAY GUY WATCH LIST

True freshman Tom Hornsey was announced (Oct. 29) as a candidate for the 2010 Ray Guy Award, presented annually to the nation's top punter. The Australian punter was one of seven from Conference USA vying for the coveted honor. He was also one of just three freshmen on the watch list, while he and Iowa State's Kirby Van Der Kamp are both true freshmen. Hornsey did not make the list of semifinalists.

MCKENZIE HAS FIRST 100-YARD GAME VS HERD

Jermaine McKenzie led the Tigers against Marshall with a career-best 109 yards receiving on six catches. The junior transfer from the University of Miami recorded his first 100-yard receiving game and the second of the season for the Tigers. McKenzie's first reception in the game came on a career long 43-yard catch for a touchdown that gave Memphis a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. He also caught receptions for 30, 18 and 17 yards. He averaged 18.2 yards per reception and caught three of his six passes in the first quarter. McKenzie is second on the team in 2010 in receptions (24) and receiving yards (405).

RAY RUNS FOR CAREER HIGH VS HOUSTON

Gregory Ray rushed for a career-high 176 yards on 23 carries against Houston. He scored a fourth-quarter touchdown on a five-yard run for his third rushing TD this season. On the drive, Ray accounted for 70 of the 77 yards. The contest marked his second 100-yard rushing game of his career with the other being 121 yards against Middle Tennessee earlier this season. Ray is the first Tiger to rush for 175 yards or more since Curtis Steele ran for 232 yards against Tulsa last year. He rushed for 124 yards in the second half and averaged 7.7 yards per carry in the game. Ten of his 23 carries were for first downs or touchdowns. On the touchdown drive, Ray also had a career best 34-yard run. Ray leads the team in rushing with 635 yards on 144 carries.

THREE DEFENDERS NAMED TO PHIL STEELE MID-SEASON TEAM

Phil Steele released his 2010 Midseason All-Conference USA team, and three Tiger defenders were selected, including linebacker Jamon Hughes, who was placed on the first team. Hughes, who received C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors last Monday, is the only Tiger player listed on the first team. Defensive lineman Frank Trotter and safety Marcus Ball were both placed on the third team.

RILEY A FINALIST FOR WUERFFEL TROPHY

Senior offensive lineman Dominik Riley has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2010 Wuerffel Trophy, the national award that honors the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with outstanding academic and athletic achievement. Riley is the lone representative from Conference USA, and is also a finalist for the ARA Sportsmanship Award.

HUGHES NAMED C-USA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior linebacker Jamon Hughes posted 21 tackles, including one sack, against Southern Miss and was named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts. This is the first C-USA weekly honor for Hughes and the first for a Tiger defender since defensive lineman Clinton McDonald was honored in September of 2008.

A native of Rolling Fork, Miss., Hughes totaled the most tackles for a Memphis player in 31 years with 21 stops against Southern Miss. The total ranks tied for second in school history and is the most since Pete Scatamacchia had a school-record 25 against Louisville in 1979. Hughes posted 15 solo tackles in the game, which ranks in a tie for third in school history. The senior linebacker also had a sack for a loss of five yards in the game and received one of ESPN.com's Non-AQ Helmet Stickers for his performance.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

QUARTERBACKS

True freshman Ryan Williams has started the last nine games and is averaging 164 yards a game. Last weekend against UAB, he completed 16 of 31 attempts for 228 yards and a 28-yd TD pass to Marcus Rucker. Williams is poised in the pocket and has made solid throws, but the Tiger offense has struggled to get into the redzone, a spot that they are currently 16-of-17 scoring (leads the nation) when they get in the 'zone. Williams has thrown 30 passes this season that have resulted in gains of 20 or more yards, including eight that have been for 35 or more yards. Cannon Smith, who started the first two games, has come in as a reserve in five of the last seven games. He left the Tennessee game with an injury, and was not available for the Marshall or UAB games.

RUNNING BACKS

Senior Greg Ray and true freshman Jerrell Rhodes are the "go-to" guys for the ground game, but the Tiger offense as a whole is only averaging 97.8 yards rushing per game. Ray logged 176 yards and a TD on 23 carries vs Houston, but has logged 60 or fewer yards in the last three games, including just 18 vs UAB. Rhodes missed the Tennessee and Marshall games with an injury but made a return to the field vs UAB. He posted 85 yds on 11 carries vs the Blazers last week. Jeremy Longstreet, who moved from LB during the week of practice prior to the USM game, had a productive game vs UT with 26 yds on 8 carries and 3 catches for 40 yds., and also had 16 yds on seven carries vs Marshall.

RECEIVERS

The Tigers have talented receivers, with Marcus Rucker emerging the last few weeks as a play-maker. Rucker has caught multiple touchdown passes in two of the last five games (vs USM and UT) and leads the Tigers with 623 yards and seven TDs on 35 receptions. He had his best game against USM with 155 yds. Rucker heads into the UCF game on an 11-game receiving streak. Jermaine McKenzie moved to slot receiver and the change proved beneficial against Marshall as he posted 109 yards and a TD on 6 catches. His TD was a 43-yard strike from Williams. McKenzie is second in receptions (24) and yards (405). Curtis Johnson boasts 19 catches for 215 yards, while Tannar Rehner has hauled in 21 passes for 246 yards. The Tigers are also getting some help from tight end Deven Onarheim (13-123).

OFFENSIVE LINE

The entire starting offensive line returned from last season, including Ronald Leary (LT), Joel McCleod (LG), Brad Paul (C), Dominik Riley (RG) and Tommy Walker (RT). The line has struggled, and has allowed 33 sacks in 11 games. The group has had to make adjustments as injuries have forced a shuffle in the lineup throughout the season. Riley left the MTSU game with a knee injury and missed the UTEP and Tulsa contests. He was back in the starting lineup versus Louisville. Brad Paul, a Rimington Trophy candidate at center, missed the UL & USM games with an injury and Michael Antonescu stepped in to fill that role. True freshman Chris Schuetz had to give up his redshirt when he was called to action versus USM (Antonescu injured) and worked 15 snaps at center. Senior Kindly Jacques has stepped in as the starter at right tackle the last three games.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Frank Trotter continues to be a steady force in the Memphis defensive line. He leads the line in tackles with 74 and leads the team in TFL with 15.0 for minus 23 yards (ranks T21st nationally). Trotter posted a career-high 10 tackles versus Houston and tied that total on the road at Marshall. Also anchoring the line this season is sophomore Dontari Poe who boasts 38 tackles, including 5.5 TFL. Junior Dasmine Cathey has started four games at DE and totals 23 tackles, including a team-leading three sacks. Lester Lawson is also giving the defense quality minutes with 20 tackles, 1 sack, a breakup, a hurry and a forced fumble.

LINEBACKER

The linebackers are led by Jamon Hughes and DeRon Furr. Hughes has led Memphis in tackles in 10 of the 11 games, and heading into the UCF game ranks third nationally with 136 tackles. He was named the C-USA Defensive Player of the Week following his 21-tackle effort vs USM. Hughes totals 5.0 TFL and 2 sacks. Furr, who missed the UAB game with an injury, totals 54 tackles this season, including 7.0 TFL, after logging a career-best 10 stops against Tulsa. Winston Bowens has come in as a reserve and totals 31 stops, 2.5 TFL and 2 pass breakups. Also aiding the LB corps is Terrence Thomas, who made his first career start at UAB, with 36 tackles, 2 sacks, 7.5 TFL, an interception and a PBU. Thomas logged a career-best 12 stops vs. UAB last week.

SECONDARY

The secondary is a position that is getting major contributions from freshmen through 11 games. Four freshmen have made starts in the secondary, including true freshmen Todd Washington, Taurean Nixon and Lonnie Ballentine, and rs-freshman Mohammed Seisay. Washington posted two INTs vs. MTSU and Seisay logged picks in consecutive games vs MTSU and UTEP. Safety Marcus Ball, who leads the group with 58 tackles, was suspended for multiple games and returned to the field vs UAB. In his first game back, he logged two interceptions and had a 63-yd return on one. His replacement vs UT & Marshall was former walk-on Mitch Huelsing, who posted a career-best 11 tackles in his first start vs UT and had 10 stops vs Marshall. Darius Davis missed three games early in the season with a knee injury and was back in the starting lineup vs. Tulsa. He totals 29 tackles this season, and left the UAB game early with an injury. Senior D.A. Griffin primarily works at nickel and leads the team in PBU with 6, and has recorded 29 tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Australian punter Tom Hornsey continues to be a leader for the special teams unit. He has posted 400-plus yards in three games, and ranks 34th nationally in punting. Of his 74 punts, only 25 have been returned. In addition, 24 punts have dropped inside the 20, 17 are for 50+ yards and 14 have been fair caught. Kicker Paulo Henriques has converted his last five FG attempts from 40 or more yds. Henriques is 13-of-17 on FGs and 15-of-16 on PATs. The return game has made some changes with D.A. Griffin working PRs and KORs and Taurean Nixon coming in on KORs. Griffin has posted four 100-yard return games this season, including a 145-yard effort against Houston. Griffin leads the Tigers in plays of 20 or more yards with 17 - all on KOR. His longest return this season is 35 yards, which he posted vs UAB last week.

RUCKER HITS THE CENTURY MARK VS USM

Marcus Rucker had a career high and team season best 155 yards receiving on four catches against Southern Miss with two touchdowns. The 155 yards receiving tied for 11th in school history for most receiving yards in a game. Rucker averaged 38.75 yards on his four receptions, which ranks as the third highest single game average gain per reception in school history. Rucker hauled in a 22-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Williams with 10:44 remaining in the first quarter for his first TD in the game. He later hooked up again with Williams for an 81-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. The 81-yard TD is the 12th longest touchdown reception in school history and the longest offensive play this year for the Tigers. Rucker also receptions of 38 and 14 yards.

The Memphis, Tenn., native leads the team with 623 yards receiving on 35 catches and has caught a pass in all 11 games this year. He is averaging 56.6 yards per game and a team best 17.8 yards per catch. Rucker also leads the team in touchdowns with seven receiving TDs.

GRIFFIN IN HIS COMFORT ZONE RETURNING KICKS

In just his second game returning kicks this season, D.A. Griffin totaled 128 kick return yards on five returns versus Southern Miss. He averaged 25.6 yards per return. Griffin opened the game with a 32-yard kickoff return, marking the fourth 30-yard KO return for the Tigers this season. The 128 yards marked his second career game over the century mark. His other was a 107-yard effort on six returns against USF in the 2008 St. Petersburg Bowl.

Griffin eclipsed his highs against USM with a 145-yard effort (8 KORs) against Houston. He had a long return of 26 yards against the Cougars and five of his eight returns were for 20 or more yards. Griffin hit the century mark for the third and fourth times this season with 100 yards on five returns against Marshall and 118 yards on six returns at UAB.

PROTECT THE BALL

The key to the ground game is protecting the ball, which is one thing U of M running backs have been consistent with over the years.

From 2004-2010, Memphis backs have only accounted for 13 total fumbles lost in 2,402 carries.

In 2007 & 2008, Memphis as a team ranked in the top five nationally at the end of the season in least fumbles lost. In 2007, the Tigers finished the season tied for third nationally in fumbles lost with just four (only two by backs). LSU and San Jose State led the nation in least fumbles lost with just three.

In 2008, Memphis closed out the season ranked in a tie for 5th nationally with four other teams (Eastern Michigan, Miami, UL-Monroe, Rutgers) in fumbles lost with only five (one by a back).

In 2009, Memphis fumbled the ball 24 times, but recovered the ball 13 times. Of the 11 fumbles lost (three of which were versus ECU), only one was by a running back (Steele vs. ECU).

Of the 12 fumbles that Memphis has lost this season, four were by true freshman RB Jerrell Rhodes and one was by newly-converted RB Jeremy Longstreet. Rhodes has toted the ball 113 times this season. Rhodes' most recent miscue was at UAB following a career-long 36-yard return. He appeared to be down prior to coughing up the ball, but following the review, the call on the field stood.

RILEY A FINALIST FOR SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Senior offensive lineman Dominik Riley is one of 10 finalists for the ARA (Awards and Recognition Association) Sportsmanship Award, which is presented to one outstanding NCAA Division I collegiate football player who best personifies the spirit of sportsmanship (announced Oct. 28). Memphis standout running back DeAngelo Williams was the first-ever recipient of the ARA Sportsmanship Award in 2005.

G'DAY MATE

Coach Larry Porter brought in a punter this fall from Down Under. Tom Hornsey, a former Australian Rules Football player, had his first taste of US football this past year training at ProKick Australia, which is an academy developed to assist in the transition to American football.

In his first collegiate game (vs MSU), Hornsey totaled nine punts for 438 yards for an average of 48.7 yards per punt. He booted five punts over 50 yards and had five inside the 20. His first career punt went for 56 yards and that was all through the air.

Hornsey's 438 yards punting versus MSU ranks fourth all-time in the Memphis single game record book. It is the most since James Gaither had 450 yards punting against Southern Miss in 2001.

Hornsey eclipsed the 400-yard mark again versus MTSU, posting 10 punts for 417 yards and a long of 63 yards. His 63-yard punt from the Memphis six-yard line late in the fourth quarter helped keep MTSU in its own territory and go three-and-out in a critical defensive opportunity for the Tigers who were holding on to a seven-point lead.

Against Louisville, Hornsey passed the 400-yard mark for the third time in 2010, logging 419 yards on 10 punts.

Hornsey, who can kick effectively with both his left and right legs, currently ranks 34th nationally in punting with his average of 43.0 yards. He has dropped 24 inside the 20 and totals 17 punts for 50+ yards. Only 25 of his 74 punts have been returned by the opponents. He was named the C-USA co-Special Teams Player of the Week following the MTSU game.

HENRIQUES LEADS TIGERS IN SCORING

Sophomore kicker Paulo Henriques booted three field goals (44, 43, 36 yds) versus UAB to continue to hold the scoring lead for the Tigers. Henriques totals 13 field goals and 15 PATs for 54 points. Henriques booted his top two FGs vs Southern Miss with makes of 45 and 47 yards.

Sophomore receiver Marcus Rucker scored Memphis' only touchdown against UAB, and continues to rank second on the team in scoring with 42 points. He is just ahead of senior Greg Ray, who has scored four TDs for 24 points.

GET IN THE ZONE

Prior to the UAB game, Memphis had scored every time (15 times) that it had been in the redzone this season and ranked first nationally with that perfect mark. Against the Blazers, the Tigers snapped their streak, scoring only once on the two times they made it into the 'zone. The Tigers scored with a field goal by Paulo Henriques.

Late in the fourth quarter, Marcus Ball logged an interception and returned the ball to the UAB 7. It appeared Memphis would be primed to score, but the drive stalled after three incomplete passes and a two-yard run to snap the streak of scoring in the redzone.

This season, the Tigers have been in the redzone 17 times in 11 total games. Memphis has scored eight TDs in the zone this season. Heading into the UCF game, Memphis is still tied for the national lead in redzone scoring.

46TH YEAR AT THE LIBERTY BOWL

The 2010 campaign marks the 46th season that the Tigers will call Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium home. The Tigers opened the 2010 season with the first two games on the road, but ushered in their 46th season at the Liberty Bowl with a win over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 18. The Tigers are 142-126-7 at the Liberty Bowl.

TV TIMEOUT

The Tigers have played 52 games that have been broadcast on national television since 2004, not including pay-per-view games/internet-only contests. The 2010 season opener against Mississippi State was carried by ESPNU while the ECU, USM and Houston games were aired by CSS. The Tennessee game was carried by CBS College Sports, and Memphis' final of six scheduled TV games in 2010 will be the season finale at the Liberty Bowl against UCF on Nov. 27 on CSS.

RYAN WILLIAMS MAKES FIRST START VS MTSU

True freshman Ryan Williams started his first collegiate game against Middle Tennessee and led Memphis to a 24-17 win over the Blue Raiders. The Pembroke Pines, Fla., native is the first true freshman quarterback to start for the Tigers since Tim Jones started the final six games of the 1986 season. Williams completed 15-of-28 pass attempts for 129 yards with a touchdown and no interceptions against MTSU. His TD pass was a 22-yard strike to Jermaine McKenzie.

Williams, who has started the last nine games, is one of 16 true freshman nationally to make a start at QB. He is one of three in Conference USA (UCF's Jeff Godfrey and UH's David Piland).

FOSTER HITS CENTURY MARK IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES

Junior Billy Foster logged his first 100-yard return game in his first collegiate game with the Tigers. He totaled 160 yards on seven returns in the season opener against Miss. State. He recorded four returns over 20 yards, including a long return of 32 yards in the first quarter. The 160 kick return yards ranks tied for fifth all-time in the Memphis single game record books. A week later against ECU, Foster rolled off 111 yards on seven returns with a long of 22 yards.

RUCKER BECOMING A PLAY MAKER

The Tigers lost some big play makers on offense from last season with running back Curtis Steele and receivers Duke Calhoun and Carlos Singleton scoring 24 of the team's 33 touchdowns. Of the returning skill players, only Marcus Rucker, Tyler Bass and Marcus Hightower (left team) had scored for the Tigers.

Rucker scored in the first two games to bring his career TD total to four. He scored the only Tiger points in the season opener versus Miss. State off a 27-yard pass from Cannon Smith with just under two minutes remaining in the game. His second TD was in the third quarter against ECU off a 13-yard pass from true freshman QB Ryan Williams.

Rucker had been held scoreless in four straight games, before his breakout game versus Southern Miss in which he scored twice and logged 155 yards on four catches. His TD catches were for 22 and 81 yards. Rucker also scored twice against Tennessee. With his touchdown catch versus UAB, he now totals nine career TD receptions.

Rucker leads the Tigers in receptions with 35, and in yards with 623.

YOUNG CUBS

Of the 96 players listed on the current roster, 57 percent of the players are either freshmen or sophomores (55 total). The largest class on the squad this season are freshmen, which number 41. On the flip side, there are only 20 seniors this year.

In the season opener against Mississippi State, 10 freshmen played in the game, including six true freshmen (Ryan Williams, Jerrell Rhodes, Todd Washington, Tom Hornsey, Justin Henderson and Johnnie Farms).

With two more true freshmen seeing action against ECU (Anthony Hayes, Corey Jones); Lonnie Ballentine coming in against MTSU; Taurean Nixon starting in the secondary vs. UTEP; and Chris Schuetz dropping his redshirt when he was needed at center against USM, Memphis ranks tied for 15th nationally, having played 11 true freshmen.

Todd Washington was the first true freshman to start for the Tigers this season, making a start at corner against ECU. Other true freshmen to make starts are Ryan Williams and Corey Jones, who both made their first starts vs. MTSU, Taurean Nixon who started in the secondary against UTEP and Tennessee; and Lonnie Ballentine, who made his first start against Houston.

TEN FRESHMEN EARN STARTING ROLES

Of the 11 true freshmen to see action this season, six have made it into the starting lineup. The six true freshmen to start are: Ryan Williams (QB), Todd Washington (CB), Corey Jones (DL), Jerrell Rhodes (RB), Taurean Nixon (DB) and Lonnie Ballentine (CB). In addition, four redshirt-freshmen have started this season, including Ricky Hart (OL), Mohammed Seisay (CB), Brooks Johnson (TE) and Johnnie Farms (DL). Hart started against UTEP for Dominik Riley, who suffered a knee injury versus Middle Tennessee. Seisay has started all 11 games at cornerback.

MR. UNKNOWN

If there's one position on the field that goes unnoticed until disaster strikes, it's the deep snapper. Memphis has one of the most consistent deep snappers in the league in Keenan Bratcher. He is the only constant in the kicking game this season as the Tigers needed to find replacements for senior kicker/punter Matt Reagan and senior holder Brett Toney. Bratcher has not had an errant snap in his four seasons with Memphis and was named to the C-USA Freshman team in 2007 and was an honorable mention all-C-USA pick in 2008 & 2009. He also shared the team's Special Teams Player of the Year with Reagan last season.

TIGERS SNAP 136-GAME SCORING STREAK

The Tigers suffered a 56-0 loss at Louisville on October 9, and with the shutout, snapped a 136-game scoring streak -- a mark that had been second in Conference USA behind East Carolina.

Prior to the UL game, the last time the Tigers were held scoreless was in 1999 -- a 3-0 loss to Ole Miss in the season opener on Sept. 4 at the Liberty Bowl. The last shutout that Memphis pitched was a 13-0 victory over Tulane on Oct. 8, 1994 -- also at the Liberty Bowl.

OFFENSIVE LINE STARTERS

The starting offensive line is made up of five previous starters with experience. Dominik Riley has made 31 consecutive starts while Joel McCleod and Ron Leary have started 23 straight games dating back to last year. Riley missed the UTEP and Tulsa games with a knee injury but was back in the starting lineup versus Louisville. Center Brad Paul, a Rimington Trophy candidate, missed the UL and USM games with an injury and Michael Antonescu made his first career start at center versus the Cards. Antonescu started again versus USM, but an injury forced him to the sidelines and true freshman Chris Schuetz had his redshirt pulled off so he could go in at center. Tommy Walker's streak of consecutive games came to a halt at 20 when he did not start vs Marshall and was replaced by Kindly Jacques.

PORTER WINS HOME DEBUT

Larry Porter was presented the game ball by his team in the locker room following the Tigers' 24-17 win over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 18. With the win, Porter became the third-straight Tiger coach to post a win in their debut at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. The win also marked the first time since 2006 (win over Chattanooga) that Memphis has won its home opener.

EARNING THEIR STRIPES

Three former walk-ons were awarded scholarships during fall camp by Coach Larry Porter including defensive back John McArthur, receiver Stevie Matthews and defensive back Mitch Huelsing. McArthur is a redshirt junior who attended Christian Brothers High and made his debut last year against Ole Miss and appeared in 12 games on special teams. Matthews is a product of Melrose High who also made his debut last season and played mostly on special teams. Huelsing is a redshirt sophomore from Munford, who also spent most of last season playing on special teams. "These guys have earned it," Porter said. "And it's not just for being an athlete, it's for the total person they are. They are model citizens and they bleed blue through and through."

Huelsing has started the last three games and logged double-digit tackles against Tennessee and Marshall.

REPRESENTING THE 901 ...

One of the statements made by Coach Larry Porter early on was that he will look to keep key talent in Memphis. In fact, this year's marketing campaign of billboards and commercials touts the local guys who chose to play in their hometown such as freshmen Fred Harvey (White Station HS), Lonnie Ballentine (Southwind HS) and Al Bond (Southwind HS) who all signed with Porter this past February. The current Tiger roster consists of 28 players from the Memphis area and six others who are within 17 miles of campus in Southaven, MS, West Memphis, AR or Olive Branch, MS.

PORTER IN HEAD COACHING DEBUT

Coach Larry Porter was one of three Conference USA coaches making their head coaching debut during the 2010 season. Joining Porter were East Carolina's Ruffin McNeill and Marshall's Doc Holliday. Porter and McNeill returned to their alma maters, while Holliday is a native of Hurricane, W.Va. Porter dropped his debut to Mississippi State, 49-7. Holliday also dropped his debut, a 45-7 loss to #2 Ohio State. McNeill's Pirates won in exciting fashion on a 33-yard Hail Mary pass with no time on the clock to beat Tulsa, 51-49.



ANY GIVEN SATURDAY

The Tigers had every game this season on a Saturday for the first time since 2003. For the last six seasons, Memphis has played at least two games on a weeknight or on Sunday. Over that span, the Tigers have played on Sunday (3 times), Thursday (3 times), Tuesday (3 times), Friday (3 times) and Monday once. In 2009, the Tigers played three times on days other than Saturday to accommodate a television broadcast.

RILEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-C-USA

Senior offensive lineman Dominik Riley was named to the preseason All-Conference USA Coaches Team for a second-consecutive season. Riley is one of five returning starters on a veteran offensive line that returns nine letterwinners.

The Montgomery, Ala., native was an integral part of a 2009 offensive line that ranked third in Conference USA for sacks allowed and paved the way for running back Curtis Steele to rush for over 1,200 yards and 15 touchdowns. Riley saw playing time at both right and left guard in 2009.

Riley started the first three games of the season but left the MTSU game with a knee injury. He missed both the UTEP and Tulsa games. He was back in the starting lineup versus Louisville.

IDENTITY CRISIS

Senior Winston Bowens is eager to help out the Tiger defense, regardless of where he will be on the field. At 6-1, 250, Bowens isn't a likely candidate for the secondary, but he is a versatile player who could see time at either linebacker or defensive end. Bowens has spent the previous three seasons as a linebacker - a position he has played since he was about five years old - but was shifted to the line in spring practice. He came out in fall camp on the line, but injuries to Jamon Hughes and DeRon Furr left the linebacker corps a bit depleted and Bowens was inserted back in at MLB. **Bowens also works with the special teams unit and has posted 31 tackles and two pass breakups in 10 games of 2010. Bowens saw significant time against MTSU and posted eight tackles, including two TFL, in the win.**

Bowens is no stranger to adapting to the circumstances, having experienced six different defensive coordinators during his time at Memphis (2006-Joe Lee Dunn/Tommy West; 2007-Rick Kravitz; 2008-Tim Walton; 2009-Kenny Ingram; 2010-Jay Hopson.)

TRUE BLUE ROLE MODEL

Former Tiger defender Marcus Bell is in his second season as an intern and he is someone the players can look up to and know that he has walked the walk. Bell played for the U of M from 1997-2000, and finished his career with 209 tackles, including 135 solo stops and 10 sacks. Bell later was selected in the fourth round of the 2001 NFL Draft and enjoyed a seven-year career in the NFL. He returned to Memphis and in addition to helping on the football staff, he returned to the classroom and earned his bachelor's degree in 2010.

PAUL LISTED ON RIMINGTON WATCH LIST

Senior center Brad Paul was named to the 2010 Rimington Trophy Fall Watch List. The Rimington Trophy is awarded to the most outstanding center in NCAA Division I-A (FBS) football. Paul, a 2009 Spring Iron Tiger, is one of five returning starters from a 2009 offensive line that cleared the way for running back Curtis Steele to rush for over 1,200 yards and 15 touchdowns. Paul started 11 of 12 contests throughout the 2009 campaign, missing only the UAB game due to injury.

Paul started the first five games of 2010 and as the center, has had to adjust to two different quarterbacks and helped pave the way for RB Greg Ray to hit the century mark against MTSU. He missed the Louisville and Southern Miss games with a leg injury and returned to the field against Houston.

MAKING THE GRADE

For the spring 2010 semester, three Tiger quarterbacks each had a 4.0 grade point average. All five - Cannon Smith, Andy Summerlin, Ryan Williams, Tyler Bass and Will Gilchrist - boast at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA, while Smith, Summerlin and Williams achieved a 4.0 GPA this spring.

The group certainly helped boost Memphis' football team GPA, which was at its highest since the spring 2006 semester. All of the Tiger Athletics programs as a whole turned in a 2.94 GPA for the spring, which is the highest-ever grade point average achieved by the department. In fact, 92 student-athletes were placed on the U of M Dean's List, including eight football players. The players named to the Dean's List this spring were: Charlie Bryant, Akeem Davis, John McArthur, Jamie McCoy, Dominik Riley, Cannon Smith, Andy Summerlin and Ryan Williams.

MAKING THE GRADE - PART II

The Tigers boast six players who have already earned their bachelor's degree by the start of the 2010 season. The graduates are Dominik Riley (B.A. Criminology and Criminal Justice, Minor in Sociology), Bryan Wright (B.B.A. Finance, concentration in Real Estate), Charlie Bryant (B.A. Criminology and Criminal Justice, Minor in Sociology), Deven Onarheim (B. A. Communications, concentration in Broadcast and Electronic Media), John McArthur (B.B.A. Finance, concentration in Business Finance) and Malcolm Jones (B.A. Communications). According to a survey by ULL's Daryl Cetnar, Memphis ranks tied for 10th in the FBS with most grads.

UPCOMING BIG GAMES

The Tigers will have some key opponents on the schedule over the next couple of years. While the game dates are not available, the key meetings with BCS opponents include Mississippi State (2011), Duke (2012 & 2013), Louisville (2013-16), Tennessee (2015), Missouri (2015 & 2016) and Miami (2014 & 2015).

RILEY A NOMINEE FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM

Dominik Riley is a nominee for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. He is one of 112 student-athletes nominated for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®, the most ever in the 19-year history of the award. Riley was nominated for his numerous community service activities that included: serving as a Student-Athlete Advisory Committee member, volunteering at the National Civil Rights Museum on Martin Luther King Day, reading locally to classes at Perea Elementary School and mentoring high school students through Phi Beta Sigma. He also has volunteered his time with the March of Dimes, the American Cancer Society and HIV and AIDS Awareness. Riley graduated from the U of M last December with a degree in criminal justice and earned a minor in sociology. He is currently working on a master's degree in professional studies with a concentration in human resources.

BAND OF BROTHERS

One of the chants in the huddle breaks that the Tigers repeat is "Eleven Brothers", and while there are not eleven brothers on the team, there are two sets of brothers wearing the Blue and Gray this season. Fraternal twins Jermaine and Tremaine McKenzie joined the Tigers last season. Jermaine is a wideout and Tremaine is a defensive back. Tremaine is older by 13 minutes. Offensive lineman Michael Antonescu, who has been with the Tigers since 2007, was joined late in fall camp by his brother A.J., also an o-lineman.

HARGRAVE CONNECTION

The Tigers have three players on the team that previously played at Hargrave Military Academy. Jerrell Rhodes and Johnnie Farms signed with the Tigers in February and joined the squad this past spring. Cannon Smith played in '07 at Hargrave before joining the University of Miami in '08. He transferred to Memphis in fall 2009 and had to sit out last season.

TIGERS IN OVERTIME GAMES

The Tigers have had six overtime games in their history, including the 2009 season finale at Tulsa, which Memphis dropped 33-30. Prior to that game, Memphis' last OT game was a three overtime contest versus SMU in the 2007 regular-season finale. It was the second 3OT game in Tiger history (the other was versus Houston in 2000). The 55-52 win over SMU is Memphis' only overtime victory.

All six of the Tigers' extended games have been against C-USA opponents and all but one have occurred at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. The following shows Memphis' record in OT:

TIGER TRADITION

The University of Memphis is one of two colleges with a live tiger as a mascot -- the other being Larry Porter's previous coaching stop, LSU. Memphis' TOM III (stands for Tigers Of Memphis) is in his second season attending Tiger football games. He arrives under police escort from his plush habitat across the state line in Mississippi and will lead the March Around into the stadium during pregame. TOM III is owned and cared for by the Highland Hundred football booster organization.

2010 GAME HIGHLIGHTS

THOMAS MAKES FIRST START VS UAB

Junior Terrence Thomas made his first career start against UAB. He started at linebacker for DeRon Furr, who did not make the trip because of an injury. Thomas logged a career-high 12 tackles in the game and had four tackles for loss, totaling 21 yards. The four TFLs is tied for fourth in school history with 13 other players. The last player to record four TFLs was Clinton McDonald against Arkansas State in 2008.

HENRIQUES BOOTS THREE FIELD GOALS VS BLAZERS

Paulo Henriques logged a career high with three field goals made against UAB. He had makes of 44, 43 and 36 yards in the game. He has hit eight-straight field goals dating back to the USM game, and five of those FGs have been for 40 or more yards. Henriques is also 7of-7 on kicks under 40 yards this season.

The last time that Memphis hit three field goals in a game was against Southern Miss last season. The last time Memphis hit three field goals in a half was in 2007 against Marshall (first half). The kicker was Matt Reagan.

TIGERS OPEN MARSHALL GAME WITH BIG PLAYS

True freshman Ryan Williams tossed a 43-yard touchdown pass to Jermaine McKenzie with 9:25 left in the first quarter against Marshall. It was McKenzie's longest reception of the year. This was the third-straight game that Memphis had scored first and the second consecutive game that Memphis had opened with a touchdown to be the first on the scoreboard.

FURR MAKES PICK VERSUS HERD

DeRon Furr registered his first career interception when he picked off Marshall QB Brian Anderson at the Memphis 36. Furr made a 14-yard return on the play. Memphis scored on a 25-yard field goal for three points on the turnover.

DEFENSE POSTS THREE SACKS AGAINST MARSHALL

The three sacks that the Memphis defense logged against Marshall tied a season high, but it was also a small victory for the "D". Marshall had entered the game ranked first nationally having only allowed two sacks in nine games. They had not yielded a sack since Oct. 2, 2010 against Southern Miss. The three Tigers credited with sacks were Lester Lawson, Corey Jones and Dontari Poe.



TIGERS ON THE BOARD FIRST VS UT

The Tigers got on the board first against Tennessee with a four-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Williams to Marcus Rucker. This was the first game this season that Memphis had scored first in the game on a touchdown. Memphis had been on the board first twice this season (vs Houston and UTEP) on field goals by Paulo Henriques.

TIGER DEFENSE SEES CHANGES VS VOLS

Several Tiger defenders made their first starts of the season in the Tennessee game. Winston Bowens started at linebacker for Jamon Hughes; Mitch Huelsing started at safety for Marcus Ball; and Lester Lawson started on the defensive line. It was Huelsing's first career start. Huelsing registered a career-high 11 tackles with 10 solo stops and one tackle for loss. His previous high was three against Houston the week prior to UT. The former walk-on came into the game with just eight total tackles. He was presented a scholarship in fall camp.

BRYANT LOGS FIRST OFFENSIVE ACTION

Senior Charlie Bryant saw his first action on offense against Houston when he entered the game as a tight end and helped Jerrell Rhodes gain four yards on the play. Bryant transitioned from the defensive line to the offense during the bye week.

CANNON SMITH SCORES FROM THE RUN

Cannon Smith entered the Houston game at quarterback and finished the game having completed 2-of-5 passes for 65 yards and a rushing touchdown. He scored on a one-yard run with 9:50 remaining in the game. It was Smith's first career rushing touchdown. On that same drive, Smith completed a career-high 47-yard pass to Marcus Rucker.

HUGHES AND TROTTER MAKE STOPS

Jamon Hughes (15 tackles) and defensive lineman Frank Trotter (10 tackles) each tallied double-digit tackles against Houston to mark the third time this season that two Tiger defenders had logged double-digit stops in the same game. The last time was against Tulsa when Hughes posted 12 tackles and DeRon Furr was credited with 10 tackles.

JONES MAKES FIRST FUMBLE RECOVERY

True freshman Corey Jones logged his first career fumble recovery at the end of the third quarter against Houston. The miscue resulted in a five-yard touchdown run by Greg Ray on Memphis' ensuing drive. Jones finished the game with one tackle. It was just the second fumble recovery for the Tigers this season.

USM GAME YIELDS SEASON'S TOP 3 YARDAGE PLAYS

The Tigers' top three passing plays of the season (at that time) all occurred in the Southern Miss game, with one going for a touchdown. Ryan Williams completed a 45-yard pass to Curtis Johnson on the first drive that was the longest passing play this season until a fourth quarter 81-yard touchdown reception to Marcus Rucker. The 81-yard play is the 12th longest touchdown reception in school history. Williams also completed a 38-yard pass to Rucker in the game. *In the Tigers' next game against Houston, Cannon Smith tossed a 47-yard completion to Rucker, which now ranks second this season.*

RUCKER HAULS IN TWO TD RECEPTIONS VS USM

Marcus Rucker hauled in a 22-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Williams with 10:44 remaining in the first quarter against USM for his third TD catch of the season. Rucker and Williams hooked up again in the fourth quarter for an 81-yard touchdown reception, which is the 12th longest touchdown reception in school history and longest offensive play this season. This is also the first time that Rucker has scored twice in the same game. He did so again versus Tennessee.

SCHUETZ NEEDED AT CENTER VS USM

True freshman Chris Schuetz was expected to redshirt this season, but he was called to duty against Southern Miss. Michael Antonescu started at center with Brad

Paul out with an injury, and Antonescu got a bit banged up and Schuetz was thrown into action. Memphis has played 11 true freshmen this season. Of the 11 true freshmen to see action, six have started at least one game this season.

RUCKER HAS CAREER HIGH VERSUS USM

Marcus Rucker's 155 yards receiving against USM marked his first-ever game over 100 yards. He is also the first Tiger receiver to log 100-plus yards this season. The last Tiger to tally 100 yards receiving was Carlos Singleton versus UTEP in 2009. Singleton is also the last Tiger receiver to post multiple receiving TDs, doing so against UT-Martin last year. Rucker's 155 yards receiving is tied for 11th in school history for most receiving yards in a game. He is the first player to eclipse the 150-yard mark since Duke Calhoun had 162 yards against UCF last season.

In the game, Rucker averaged 38.75 yards on his four receptions, which ranks as the third highest single game average gain per reception in school history. Duke Calhoun's 40.5 yard average on four catches against UCF last season ranks first.

EDWARDS MAKES FIRST START IN SECONDARY

Junior Lavaris Edwards made his first career start in the secondary at corner against USM. Edwards had played three games this season in a reserve role before the USM game. He posted two tackles and had a pass breakup.

GRIFFIN MAKES BIG RETURNS VS GOLDEN EAGLES

Senior D.A. Griffin opened the USM game with a 32-yard kickoff return, marking the fourth 30-yard KO return for the Tigers this season. Griffin, who had returned both punts and kickoffs in 2008 and 2009, was back returning kicks for the first time this season against Louisville. Griffin logged 128 yards on five returns for his second career game over the century mark. His other was a 107-yard effort on six returns against USF in the 2008 St. Petersburg Bowl. Griffin had four KORs of 20-plus yards against USM.

HENRIQUES BOOTS MULTIPLE 40 YARDERS

Paulo Henriques converted a 45-yard field goal with 2:02 remaining in the third quarter against USM. It was a career-high for the sophomore kicker until he later bested it with a 47-yard make with 5:45 left in the fourth quarter. His previous long entering the game was 42 yards versus East Carolina. He finished with seven points on 2-of-2 field goal attempts and 1-of-2 PAT attempts.

PAUL MISSES LOUISVILLE GAME

Junior Michael Antonescu started at center against Louisville for senior Brad Paul, who did not practice the week of the game because of an injury. This was Antonescu's first start at center and his fourth career start. He started the final three games of the 2009 season at right guard.

FURR LOGS FORCED FUMBLE

Linebacker DeRon Furr was credited with a forced fumble in the second quarter against Louisville. It was his first career forced fumble and the third for the Tigers this season. Louisville recovered the ball and scored a touchdown two plays later.

MIXING IT UP ON SPECIAL TEAMS

Against Louisville, senior D.A. Griffin returned kicks for the first time since last season. He was back on both punts and kickoffs and finished the game with 68 all-purpose yards (68 KOR, 0 PR). Coming into the game, Griffin totaled 29 career punt returns and 20 kickoff returns (a majority of those were in '08.)

In addition, true freshman Taurean Nixon returned the first Louisville kickoff of the third quarter. He was back with true freshman Jerrell Rhodes. It was Nixon's first career kickoff return. He returned one kick for 13 yards.

RUCKER LOGS 37-YARD CATCH VS TULSA

Marcus Rucker hauled in a season-high 37-yard reception from Ryan Williams with just over nine minutes

remaining in the first quarter against Tulsa. It was the longest reception for the Tigers this season. Billy Foster and Jerrell Rhodes both have had 35-yard receptions from Williams this season.

RHODES SCORES FIRST RUSHING TD

Jerrell Rhodes busted through for a 22-yard rushing touchdown with 12:41 remaining in the second quarter to put Memphis within seven, 14-7, against Tulsa. It was Rhodes' second career TD and his first rushing score. He scored earlier this season on a 35-yard reception versus East Carolina. Rhodes finished with 62 yards rushing on 10 attempts.

WILLIAMS TAKES TOUGH HIT, LEAVES TULSA GAME

Ryan Williams left the Tulsa game with an injury with about eight minutes remaining in the second quarter. Williams was 5-of-11 for 64 yards before leaving the game. Cannon Smith replaced Williams and finished the game with 18 yards passing, completing four of eight attempts.

ROBINSON LOGS 99 YARDS ON RETURNS

Junior Delmon Robinson had a career-high 99 kick return yards on six returns versus Tulsa. He averaged 16.5 yards per return with a long of 19 yards.

J-MAC SCORES ONLY TD VS UTEP

Jermaine McKenzie hauled in a 15-yard pass from Ryan Williams deep in the endzone with just over three minutes remaining in the second quarter against UTEP for his fifth touchdown pass of the season and McKenzie's second TD catch. McKenzie scored his first touchdown against Middle Tennessee.

RHODES PICKS UP CAREER HIGH VS UTEP

True freshman running back Jerrell Rhodes registered a career high on the ground against UTEP with 90 yards on 23 carries. His previous high was 59 yards on 17 carries versus East Carolina.

SEISAY HAULS IN SECOND PICK OF SEASON

Rs-freshman Mohammed Seisay intercepted Trevor Vittatoe at the UTEP 20 with 5:01 remaining in the second quarter. This was the second straight game that Seisay had recorded an interception. The Tigers scored on their ensuing drive on a touchdown pass from Ryan Williams to Jermaine McKenzie. This was the fifth-straight time that Memphis had scored off of a turnover as the Tigers forced four against MTSU and scored off all four miscues.

SACK THAT QUARTERBACK

The Tiger defense logged three sacks against UTEP, marking the first time since the Marshall game last season (9/26/09) that Memphis was credited with three or more sacks. The defenders credited with sacks were Dontari Poe, Terrence Thomas and Dasmine Cathey.

Memphis matched that mark with three sacks against Marshall.

ROBINSON RETURNS KICKS VS UTEP

Delmon Robinson returned kicks for the first time this season against UTEP, and his first return was for 33 yards. That return was the longest kick return for a Tiger this season, until D.A. Griffin made a 35-yard return against UAB. Robinson finished the game with 51 yards on two returns.

SIX NEW STARTERS IN THE MTSU GAME

Six Tigers saw their first starts against Middle Tennessee, including four on offense. Tigers making their first starts were QB Ryan Williams, receivers Jermaine McKenzie, Tannar Rehrer and Billy Foster and defensive lineman Dasmine Cathey and Corey Jones.

RAY HITS CENTURY MARK VERSUS MTSU

Senior running back Gregory Ray rushed for a career high 121 yards on 25 carries with two touchdowns in a 24-17 victory over Middle Tennessee. In the home opener victory for Memphis, Ray became the first



Tiger tailback to rush over the century mark since Curtis Steele in the final game of the 2009 season against Tulsa. The game also marked the last time a Memphis running back had rushed for two scores.

The Los Angeles, Calif., native rushed for a team season long run of 31 yards in the first U of M drive and also added a 25-yard run in the second quarter. Seven of Ray's 25 carries were for first downs or touchdowns. He scored his first career rushing touchdown when he rumbled nine yards into the end zone in the second quarter against MTSU to give Memphis a 10-3 lead, one it would never relinquish. He later added another nine-yard TD run in the third quarter.

WASHINGTON HAS BIG NIGHT FOR DEFENSE

True freshman defensive back Todd Washington was key in Memphis' win over MTSU. The Gramercy, La., native led the defense with two interceptions, both of which led to Memphis scores. The Tigers scored all 24 of their points off turnovers. Washington's first interception came in the first quarter when he picked off Logan Kilgore on 3rd-and-11 at the MTSU 39-yard line. The Tigers scored a field goal on the ensuing drive to even the score at three. Washington then picked off Kilgore again in the second quarter and returned it 13 yards allowing Memphis to score a touchdown on the drive. The two interceptions are the most by a Tiger since Marcus Ball had two against UTEP in 2009.

MCKENZIE BROTHERS MAKE PLAYS VERSUS MTSU

Twin brothers Jermaine and Tremaine McKenzie may be 13 minutes apart as far as their ages are concerned, but it was only about two minutes that separated the two in the win over MTSU. Older brother Tremaine scooped up his first fumble recovery when Dasmine Cathey forced MTSU's Phillip Tanner to cough up the ball at the MTSU 43 with 11:14 remaining in the second quarter. It was Cathey's first forced fumble since 2008 against Nicholls State.

On the ensuing drive, younger brother Jermaine put points on the board for Memphis when he registered his first career receiving touchdown, hauling in the 22-yard offering from Ryan Williams with 9:17 left in the second quarter.

SEISAY LOGS 20-YARD INTERCEPTION RETURN

Mohammed Seisay picked off MTSU's Logan Kilgore at the Memphis 36 and made a 20-yard return in the third quarter. Seisay's pick followed two by true freshman Todd Washington. The last time Memphis had three interceptions in a single game was in 2005 versus UTEP. The Tigers scored off this turnover on a nine-yard run by Greg Ray.

DEFENSE GETS TURNOVERS, OFFENSE GETS POINTS

The Tiger defense forced four turnovers against MTSU, with all 24 of the team's points coming off of the miscues. The last time that Memphis forced four turnovers was in 2007 against Middle Tennessee (2 INT, 2 fumbles).

JONES POSTS FIRST CAREER SACK

True freshman Corey Jones had his first career sack late in the fourth quarter versus MTSU for a loss of five yards. Jones dropped MTSU's Jeff Murphy for a loss of five on second down, which led to a Blue Raider punt one play later in Memphis territory. In his first career start, Jones finished with three tackles and two TFLs for a loss of 13 yards.

TIGER DEFENDERS KEY IN WIN OVER MTSU

Junior defensive lineman Frank Trotter matched his career and season high with eight tackles and had two TFLs for a loss of six yards against MTSU. Senior linebacker Winston Bowers matched a career best with two TFLs for a loss of six yards and had eight tackles.

HORNSEY BOOTS 63-YARD PUNT

True freshman Tom Hornsey made a career high 10 punts for 417 yards with an average distance of 41.7

yards against MTSU. He kicked a career long 63-yard punt in the fourth quarter and had two punts inside the 20. The last Tiger to boot a punt 60 or more yards was Matt Reagan in 2009 against East Carolina when he kicked a 60 yarder.

WILLIAMS HAS SOLID GAME VERSUS ECU

True freshman Ryan Williams had a solid day at QB against ECU, but the 21 points Memphis gave up in the first quarter off turnovers proved too much to overcome. Williams threw for nearly 300 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions in just his second collegiate appearance. Despite only playing half the game, Williams led the Tigers to scores on four of the seven drives he quarterbacked and averaged 3.4 points per drive with a .571 drive efficiency. He passed for 199 yards in the second half with two touchdowns and 119 yards in the fourth quarter.

The Pembroke Pines, Fla., native is the first Memphis player to throw for three touchdowns in a game since Will Hudgens did it last year against UTEP. Williams averaged a gain of 9.6 yards per play (278 yards on 25 pass attempts and four rushes), which ranks fifth all-time in school history. Four of his passes were for gains of 30 yards or more, including two team long pass completion of 35 yards to Jerrell Rhodes and Billy Foster. The completion to Rhodes resulted in a touchdown. Williams also had a 32-yard touchdown pass to Gregory Ray and a 13-yard passing TD to Marcus Rucker.

MORE FIRST STARTS IN GAME TWO

Tremaine McKenzie made his first start for the Tigers at strong safety against East Carolina. He got the starting nod over senior Darius Davis who was injured in practice during the week. Also making their first starts vs. ECU were linebacker Khiry Battle and corner Todd Washington. Washington is a true freshman from Gramercy, La.

CANNON SMITH STARTS VERSUS ECU

Sophomore Cannon Smith started for the second straight game at quarterback at East Carolina. Smith was replaced by Ryan Williams with about 20 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Smith was 1-of-3 for seven yards and an INT when he came out of the game. He returned to start the second half but was in just two series before coming back out and missing the rest of the game with an injury.

TURNOVERS PROVE COSTLY VERSUS PIRATES

The Tigers yielded three turnovers in the first quarter vs ECU (two fumbles and an interception) and all three resulted in touchdowns. Memphis' first drive ended with a fumble on the second play after the snap struck Cannon Smith in the facemask and ECU recovered the ball at the Memphis 12. ECU scored three plays later. The second miscue was on the Tigers' second drive off a pick thrown by Smith. ECU scored on the 46-yard return. The final miscue of the quarter was a fumbled exchange between Smith and running back Jerrell Rhodes that was recovered at the Memphis 24. ECU scored four plays later.

WILLIAMS TOSSES FIRST CAREER TD PASS

Ryan Williams tossed the first touchdown of his collegiate career when he completed a 32-yard pass to Gregory Ray with just under 14 minutes remaining in the second quarter vs ECU. It was also Ray's first career touchdown reception and a career-high for reception yardage. Williams completed two 30-yard plays on that single drive and four in the game.

HUGHES LEADS DEFENSE, AGAIN

Linebacker Jamon Hughes led the defense in tackles for the second-straight week, posting 17 stops vs ECU. Tremaine McKenzie, who had his first collegiate start in the game, posted 12 tackles for a career-high. The last time a pair of defenders totaled double-digit tackles was Hughes and Deante Lamar against Houston in 2009.

HENRIQUES HITS FIRST COLLEGIATE FIELD GOALS

Paulo Henriques converted his first collegiate field goal with 6:20 remaining in the first quarter against ECU. He booted a 38-yard field goal to put the first points on the board for Memphis. He later added a 42-yard field goal with 1:01 remaining in the fourth quarter. The sophomore finished with nine points in the game with three PATS and two field goals. Henriques handled kickoffs last season but is handling FGs and PATs for the first time in his career. He missed two field goals of 48 and 49 in the season opener versus Miss. State.

TIGERS WITH FIRST STARTS VS MSU

Several Tigers made their first starts in the season opener versus Miss. State, with the majority being on offense. Players seeing their first starts were QB Cannon Smith, RB Gregory Ray, WR Marcus Rucker, WR Curtis Johnson, TE Brooks Johnson, KR Billy Foster, DL D'Angelo McCray, DL Daniel Thomas, CB Mohammed Seisay and punter Tom Hornsey.

SMITH TABBED AS STARTER AT QB VS MSU

Sophomore Cannon Smith started his first career game for the Tigers at QB vs MSU, and his first pass as a Tiger was a three-yard completion to redshirt freshman tight end Brooks Johnson. It was Johnson's first career catch. Smith was replaced by Ryan Williams after completing just four of seven pass attempts for 30 yards. His long pass was 20 yards to Curtis Johnson. Smith returned to the game with just over two minutes remaining in the third quarter. Smith finished the game with 111 yards passing on 10 of 15 attempts with one touchdown. His first career touchdown pass was a 27 yarder to Marcus Rucker.

WILLIAMS MAKES COLLEGIATE DEBUT

True freshman Ryan Williams came in at quarterback with just over six minutes left in the first quarter vs Miss. State. Williams completed his first collegiate pass for an 18-yard gain to Tannar Rehner. Rehner transferred to Memphis this summer from Mesa CC. Williams' second attempt was a 23-yard completion to Jermaine McKenzie, but the play was called back on a holding penalty. Williams started the second half at quarterback and Smith returned to the game late in the third quarter. Williams finished the game with 85 yards passing on 10 of 17 attempts with two interceptions.

Williams is the first true freshman to play QB for the Tigers since Tyler Bass came in against East Carolina in 2008 on the road when Memphis lost Arkelon Hall and Will Hudgens early in the game to injuries.

MCKENZIE LEADS IN RECEIVING VS MSU

In his first career game with the Tigers, receiver Jermaine McKenzie led the Tigers in receiving with five receptions for 45 yards. McKenzie had to sit out the 2009 season after transferring from Miami.

RUCKER PUTS ONLY POINTS ON THE BOARD

Marcus Rucker put the Tigers on the scoreboard with a 27 yard reception from Cannon Smith with 1:39 left in the fourth quarter vs Miss. State. It was Rucker's third career touchdown reception and the first career touchdown thrown by Smith. Rucker scored again the following week versus ECU.

THOMAS LOGS FIRST GAME ACTION & PICK

Junior linebacker Terrence Thomas saw his first game action in the season opener, and picked off MSU's Chris Relf at the 50-yard line in the first quarter. Thomas logged a 10-yard return on the interception. Memphis ended their drive with a missed 49-yard field goal attempt by Paulo Henriques.

HUGHES TALLIES FIRST SACK

Linebacker Jamon Hughes logged his first career sack in the second quarter against MSU. Hughes dropped Chris Relf for a loss of eight yards on 1st and 10 from the UM40. The Bulldogs punted three plays later. Hughes led the team with nine tackles, including six unassisted stops.

STARKVILLE, Miss.-- Despite a spirited effort in the first game under head coach Larry Porter, the University of Memphis Tigers fell to the Mississippi State Bulldogs 49-7 in their season opener at Davis Wade Stadium.

Memphis scored its lone touchdown with 1:39 remaining in the fourth quarter when Cannon Smith hooked up with Marcus Rucker on a 27-yard touchdown strike. The Tigers have now scored in 132 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in Conference USA.

Smith, who started the game at quarterback for the Tigers, finished with 111 yards on 10-of-15 passing with one touchdown and no interceptions.

Freshmen running back Jerrell Rhodes led Memphis on the ground, gaining 26 yards on 10 carries. Greg Ray netted 20 yards on nine carries with a long rush of 13 yards.

Jamon Hughes, a transfer from Mississippi State, and Marcus Ball led the way on defense for the Tigers. Hughes accounted for nine tackles, including an eight-yard sack. Ball had eight tackles, six of which were unassisted.

Memphis found itself in a hole early, as Mississippi State took a 7-0 advantage less than five minutes into the contest after Bulldog quarterback Chris Relf connected with Leon Berry

for a 55-yard touchdown score.

The Bulldogs added another score on their next drive, marching 91 yards in 2:42 to make it 14-0, as Tyler Russell connected on a 20-yard strike with Brandon Heavens for the first of his two touchdown receptions in the contest.

Memphis' best first half scoring opportunity came on its second drive of the game after a Terrence Thomas interception set the Tigers up with good field position on the Bulldog half of the field.

Paulo Henriques' 49-yard kick attempt, however, missed just right, and the Tigers were unable to score for the remainder of the half.

The Bulldogs pushed their lead to 21-0 going into halftime on a 51-yard touchdown run by Vick Ballard at the 1:58 mark in the second quarter.

Ryan Williams made his collegiate debut for Memphis on the third offensive series of the game. Williams completed his first attempted pass to Tannar Rehrer for a pickup of 18 yards. He finished the game with 85 yards on 10-of-17 passing with two interceptions.

Mississippi State kept applying the pressure after halftime, as the Bulldogs marched down the field and added another seven to their lead on the opening drive of the second half.

Russell found a streaking Heavens, and the duo hooked up for another score to make it 28-0.

Williams was intercepted on the ensuing drive, allowing the Bulldogs to set up 1st-and-10 from the Memphis 20. Three plays later, Mississippi State punched it into the end zone, pushing its lead to 35-0.

The Bulldogs extended their lead to 42-0

when Russell found Chad Bumphis across the middle for 57-yard touchdown pass with 6:57 remaining in the third quarter.

Russell and Bumphis connected again at the 11:23 mark of the final period to make it 49-0.

Memphis punter Tom Hornsey's 438 yards ranks fourth all-time on the Tiger single-game punting yards chart. It is the most since James Gaither had 450 yards punting against Southern Miss in 2001. Hugh Owens owns the single-game record with 492 yards punting against Texas A&M in 1979.

Tiger junior Billy Foster logged the first 100-yard return game in his first collegiate game. Foster totaled 160 yards on seven returns. He recorded four returns over 20 yards, including a long return of 32 yards in the first quarter.

The 160 kick-return yards ranks tied for fifth all-time on the Memphis single-game list. Marcus Hightower's 169 return yards against Houston in 2009 is the school record.

GREENVILLE, N.C.--Despite scoring 17 second-half points behind a strong showing from freshman quarterback Ryan Williams, the University of Memphis fell to East Carolina 49-27 Saturday at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. The game was the Conference USA opener for the Tigers.

Williams, who replaced Cannon Smith after four offensive series and again midway in the third quarter, completed 18-of-25 passes for 293 yards and three touchdowns.

Smith, who also played the first two series of the third quarter before leaving with an injury, finished with 19 yards on 3-of-6 passing and one interception.

Freshman Jerrell Rhodes led Memphis in the running game, amassing 59 yards on 17 carries to go along with 35 receiving yards. He was also the recipient of a Williams' touchdown toss, going 35 yards on a first-down screen pass at the 13:15 mark of the fourth quarter.

Greg Ray also saw significant action in the backfield for the Tigers, tallying 34 yards on 10 carries. Ray scored the first touchdown of his career on a 32-yard swing pass from Williams in the second quarter.

Jamon Hughes led the Memphis defense with 17 tackles, including five solo stops and one TFL. Three other Tigers recorded TFLs, including Dasmine Cathey's five-yard sack of Pirate quarterback Dominique Davis.

Another bright spot was freshman punter Tom Hornsey, who had four punts for an average of 43 yards and two downed inside the 5.

Davis paced the East Carolina offense, passing for 244 yards and three touchdowns to go along with two rushing scores. Jon Williams led the Pirates on the ground, totaling 109 yards on 17 carries and one touchdown.

The Tigers found themselves in a hole early, as the

Pirates scored two touchdowns in the first six minutes of the contest.

Memphis forced East Carolina to punt on its first series, and the Tigers took over on their own 6 yard line. The Tigers fumbled the ball on their second play from scrimmage, and Pirate defensive lineman Josh Smith recovered the loose ball at the Memphis 12.

Three plays later, Davis connected with Giavanni Ruffin for an 11-yard score. A Mike Barbour extra point gave the home squad a 7-0 lead.

On the ensuing possession for Memphis, Smith was intercepted by Derek Blacknall, who returned it for a 46-yard score to give the Pirates a 14-0 lead.

The Tigers got on the scoreboard on their next drive, using 25 yards on the ground from Rhodes and a 22-yard scramble from Smith. Smith was sacked on third down, setting up a 38-yard field goal from Paulo Henriques to slice into the Pirate advantage 14-3.

East Carolina extended its lead to 21-3 powered by a 31-yard run from Jon Williams and capped by a five-yard pass from Davis to Dwayne Harris.

Turnovers got the best of Memphis again on its next drive as a botched handoff from Smith to Rhodes was recovered by East Carolina's Matt Thompson at Memphis' 24 yard line.

From there, the Pirates used a four-play drive -- capped by a Williams' two-yard touchdown run -- to extend the lead to 28-3 just before the end of the first quarter.

On the Tigers' fourth possession, Williams replaced Smith as the signal-caller. After a one-yard run from Rhodes, Williams completed a 35-yard pass to Billy Foster streaking down the right sideline.

Two plays later, Williams found Ray out in the flat for a 32-yard touchdown to make it 35-10. It was Williams' first career collegiate touchdown pass, and Ray's first career touchdown reception.

Memphis' defense stepped up the remainder of the first half and held East Carolina at bay. The Tigers had opportunities to put more points on the board, but were unable to capitalize.

Memphis pushed to the Pirate 40 yard line near the six-minute mark, but two-straight dropped passes ended the Tigers' drive.

The Tigers had another chance with 2:52 left before

halftime when they took over the ball at the Pirate 45 after a shifty eight-yard punt return from Curtis Johnson. Williams completed an 11-yard pass to Johnson on third down, setting up a 4th-and-1. The East Carolina defense, however, halted the Memphis drive, ending the Tigers' last chance to score before the break.

Memphis switched quarterbacks at the start of the third quarter, with Smith taking over under center. Smith led the Tiger offense to one first down, but was sacked for a loss of seven yards on third down, forcing another Hornsey punt.

Smith played three series in the third quarter, but was unable to lead the Tigers to a score. Williams entered the game again midway through the third period and played the remainder of the contest.

Williams led the Tigers on a five-play, 60-yard drive that was finished off by a 13-yard touchdown reception by Marcus Rucker to narrow the margin to 35-17.

East Carolina scored its sixth touchdown of the game on its next drive, using 11 plays to go 80 yards in 3:14 to push its lead to 42-17.

Memphis cut the margin to 42-24 on a 35-yard pass from Williams to Rhodes at the 13:15 mark of the fourth quarter.

On the next possession, East Carolina responded with a game-clinching drive, going 71 yards on 17 plays in 7:12 to put the game out of reach at 49-24 with 6:03 remaining.

Memphis added another field goal from Henriques, who connected from 42 yards out with 1:01 left in the game.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. -- Tiger Nation not only witnessed history made Saturday night at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium, but also celebrated it. Behind Gregory Ray's 121 yard rushing and two touchdowns, Memphis recorded win No. 1 of the Larry Porter era with a hard-fought 24-17 victory over Middle Tennessee.

The Tigers held two 14-point leads in the game at 17-3 midway through the second quarter and 24-10 with 8:10 left in the third period. The Blue Raiders, though, cut the Memphis lead to seven points both times, and had two chances to tie the game in the fourth quarter when they started drives in Memphis territory.

The Tiger defense, however, forced punts both times and then held the Blue Raiders on downs with under two minutes to play to secure the win.

In the most-anticipated home opener in years with the unveiling of the tailgater's paradise, Tiger Lane, Memphis didn't disappoint the 27,975 fans in attendance with its first win of the 2010 campaign.

After taking a 17-10 advantage into halftime, Memphis padded its advantage on its second series of the third quarter. Defensive back Mohammed Seisay set up the Tiger offense in Middle Tennessee territory when he picked off Logan Kilgore and ran the interception back to the Blue Raider 44. Three plays later, Ray pushed the Tiger lead to 24-10 on his second nine-yard rushing score of the game.

The Blue Raiders changed quarterbacks on the next possession, substituting Jeff Murphy for Kilgore. Murphy made an immediate impact, finding a streaking Sancho McDonald for a 53-yard pass play that set up the visitors inside the Memphis 10. On 3rd-and-goal from the 1, Murphy found pay dirt on a quarterback

keeper to bring Middle Tennessee within seven at 24-17.

The Tiger offense stalled on the ensuing possession, allowing the Blue Raiders to take over in Memphis territory. A pass deflection by Marcus Ball followed by an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty pushed the Blue Raiders out of field goal range, preserving the Memphis lead.

Middle Tennessee's final chance to tie the contest came with 2:59 remaining and the ball on its own 26. After three plays picked up nine yards, the Blue Raiders faced a 4th-and-1 at the 35 yard line. The Memphis defense, though, stepped up one last time.

Senior linebacker Winston Bowers busted through the line on the 4th-and-1 play and tackled Murphy on a keeper in the backfield for a two-yard loss, halting the hopes of the Blue Raiders. The Tigers took over with 1:45 left and ran out the clock for the victory.

Tiger freshman quarterback Ryan Williams made his first collegiate start and was 15-of-28 passing for 129 yards and one touchdown toss. Tannar Rehrer and Jermaine McKenzie each had 37 yards receiving.

The Middle Tennessee Kilgore-Murphy tandem combined for 22-of-39 passing for 248 yards and one touchdown. Kilgore threw three interceptions. The Memphis defense held the Blue Raider ground game in check, allowing only 67 yards on 34 carries.

Middle Tennessee drew first blood in the contest, receiving the opening kick and completing two consecutive passes to move into Memphis territory. The Tigers' defense, though, held strong and forced the Blue Raiders to settle for a 32-yard field goal. Alan Geantry knocked it through the uprights to make it 3-0 just 2:25 into the game.

Two drives later, Memphis freshman defensive back Todd Washington intercepted Kilgore for the first time in the game, setting up the Tiger offense in great field position at the Blue Raider 39. Memphis drove the ball 34 yards in 4:16 to set up a 22-yard field goal from Paulo Henriques to tie the game 3-3 at the 5:12 mark of the first quarter.

The two teams traded possessions, and Middle Ten-

nessee started at its own 34. On the third play of the series, Washington picked off his second interception and returned it to the Blue Raider 36.

Memphis took advantage of the Washington pick. The Tigers moved the ball 36 yards in six plays, and Ray polished off the drive with a nine-yard touchdown run to put Memphis up 10-3 with 11:52 left to play in the first half.

The Tiger defense continued to apply pressure on the Blue Raider offense, as Dasmine Cathey stripped Middle Tennessee running back Phillip Tanner of the ball. Tiger strong safety Tremaine McKenzie recovered the ball at the Blue Raider 43.

For the second-straight time after a Blue Raider turnover, Memphis cashed in. Williams hooked up with Jermaine McKenzie over the middle on the ensuing drive for a 22-yard score that pushed the lead to 17-3. It was McKenzie's first career touchdown reception.

It didn't take long for Middle Tennessee to respond as the Blue Raiders scored a four-play, 62-yard drive that was capped by a 52-yard touchdown pass from Kilgore to Malcolm Beyah. The 63-second drive cut the Memphis lead to 17-10 with just over eight minutes left in the first half.

Jamon Hughes led the Tiger defense with nine total tackles and one TFL. Frank Trotter and Winston Bowers each added eight total tackles. Darin Davis led the Blue Raider defense with eight hits, one sack and one TFL.

EL PASO, Texas -- A Dakota Warren 18-yard field goal as time expired lifted UTEP past Memphis 16-13 in Saturday's Conference USA showdown at the Sun Bowl. The win was UTEP's first in the short four-game series with the Tigers. Memphis won the previous three encounters in 2005, 2006 and 2009.

Despite not leading until time expired, the Miners managed to pull out the victory behind Warren's three field goals, including two from 50 yards or longer. Joe Barnyard scored UTEP's lone touchdown on a six-yard touchdown run, tying the game at 10-all with 3:16 left in third quarter.

After Barnyard's run tied the game at 10-all, Memphis used a 15-play, 62-yard drive that spanned over two quarters and ate up 7:41 off the clock. The Tigers started the possession on their own 20 yard line and moved to the UTEP 18, where Paulo Henriques capped the drive with a 35-yard field goal. Henriques second field goal of the contest gave Memphis a 13-10 advantage with 8:35 remaining.

UTEP, though, responded on the ensuing possession after Marlon McClure's 40-yard kickoff return set up the Miners at their own 40. Seven plays later, Warren tied the game at 13-all with his second 50-yard field goal of the contest with just over 5:30 on the clock. Warren's 50-yarder finished a 27-yard, 2:52 drive.

After UTEP tied the game, Memphis received the ball on its own 18 yard line with 5:29 remaining. The Tiger offense moved the ball into Miner territory, but the visitors' drive stalled at the UTEP 46, and Memphis was forced to punt. Tom Hornsey's fifth punt of the game rolled down inside the UTEP 10 and pinned the Miners at their own 4.

Taking over on its own 4 yard line with 3:13 left, UTEP moved the ball quickly out to its own 42 in seven plays. On

the drive's eighth play, Miner quarterback Trevor Vittatoo hit Kris Adams for a 30-yard gain to the Tiger 28 with over a minute left on the clock, putting UTEP in excellent field position for a game-winning score. The Miners moved the ball inside the Memphis 5 yard line via the run on the next four plays. After taking a final timeout with only seconds left, Warren capped the 12-play, 95-yard drive with his third field goal, this time an 18 yarder for the victory.

Barnyard totaled 45 yards on nine carries as part of a running back corps that posted 117 yards on the ground. Of Barnyard's 45 yards, 27 came on the final drive, including an 18-yard run that moved the Miners down to the Tiger 2 yard line. Donald Buckram led the UTEP rushing game with 59 yards on 13 carries.

Vittatoo led the Miners through the air, netting 171 yards on 16-of-33 passing. He threw one interception and was sacked three times.

Jerrell Rhodes led the Memphis offense, amassing 90 yards on 23 carries. The 90 yards and 23 rushes both were career bests for Rhodes. Gregory Ray, who rushed for 121 yards last week in the victory over Middle Tennessee, finished with 46 yards on nine carries.

Ryan Williams, making his second career start at quarterback for the Tigers, finished with 144 yards on 20-of-30 passing with two interceptions and one touchdown. Williams' scoring toss came late in the second quarter, a 15-yard connection with Jermaine McKenzie.

Jamon Hughes led a Tiger defense that kept the Miners in check for the majority of the game. He totaled 11 tackles to lead the effort. Marcus Ball added eight total tackles for Memphis. Mohammed Seisay recorded his second interception in as many weeks to lead the Tiger secondary. Jamie Irving paced the UTEP defense with 10 total hits and 2.5 TFL.

The Tigers drew first blood on the scoreboard and led for the majority of the game. After forcing UTEP to punt on its first series, Memphis began its opening possession on its own 22 yard line. Williams, who was 4-of-4 passing for 32 yards on the drive, directed the Tigers to the UTEP 20. From there, Henriques kicked a 37-yard field goal to give the Tigers the early 3-0 advantage. The Tigers' drive was 13 plays and 58 yards and spanned 6:29.

Memphis forced UTEP to punt again on its next series,

and the Tigers took over deep in their own territory at the 3 yard line. Memphis moved out to its 37, but UTEP defensive back Travaun Nixon picked off a Williams' pass to set up the Miners at the Tiger 47 at the end of the first quarter.

Despite the Miners starting on its side of the field, the Memphis defense stiffened and held UTEP to only seven yards on three plays. UTEP faced either a punt or long field goal, and the Miners went with the latter. Warren set up for a 57-yard field goal, and his kick barely went over the crossbar to tie the contest at 3-all. Warren's 57-yard field goal came on the third play of the second quarter at the 14:17 mark.

After an exchange of punts, Memphis turned the field on UTEP and forced the Miners to start their second possession of the second quarter at their own 9 yard line. On the drive's second play, Seisay intercepted Vittatoo's pass at the 20 yard line and set up the Memphis offensive in excellent field position.

Three plays later, the Tigers took advantage of the Miners' miscue. On 3rd-and-5 from the UTEP 15, Williams threaded the needle to Jermaine McKenzie in the back of the end zone to put Memphis up 10-3. The score came with only 3:39 left before halftime.

The squads mounted no additional scoring opportunities the remainder of the half, and Memphis took a 10-3 lead into the break.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. -- Turnovers proved to be an obstacle Memphis couldn't overcome versus Tulsa, as the Tigers fell to the Golden Hurricane 48-7 at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. The contest was the Conference USA home opener for the Tigers.

The Tigers surrendered the pigskin on three occasions, and Tulsa took advantage of all three Memphis miscues, scoring 13 of its 20 first-half points off the home squad's turnovers. Tulsa quarterback G.J. Kinne led the Golden Hurricane offensive attack, going 18-of-31 through the air for 214 yards and two touchdowns.

Memphis scored its lone touchdown early in the second period on a Jerrell Rhodes' 22-yard touchdown scamper, cutting the Tulsa lead in half at 14-7. From that point, it was all Golden Hurricane the rest of the way. After leading 20-7 at the break, Tulsa added two touchdowns in the first eight minutes to put the game out of reach at 34-7.

The Tulsa defense also played well. The Golden Hurricane forced four Tigers' turnovers and held the Memphis offense to only 69 yards for the remainder of the game following its touchdown drive early in the second quarter.

For Memphis, quarterback Ryan Williams suffered an injury late in the second quarter and

did not return. Cannon Smith replaced the injured Williams for the remainder of the contest.

Rhodes led the Memphis ground game with 62 yards on 10 carries, while Gregory Ray added 48 yards on 13 rushes. Before leaving the game with an injury, Williams was 5-of-11 passing for 64 yards and an interception. Smith finished the game going 4-of-8 passing for 18 yards.

In addition to their 214 yards via the air, the Golden Hurricane showed a balanced offensive attack with 233 yards rushing. Ja'Terian Douglas led all Tulsa rushers with 46 yards on five carries.

Memphis found itself in an early 7-0 hole after turning the ball over on a Williams' interception 2:39 into the contest. Tulsa defensive back Marco Nelson picked off Williams' pass, setting up the Golden Hurricane offense at the Memphis 48 yard line.

On the ensuing possession, the Golden Hurricane used a six-play, 48-yard drive that was capped by a Kinne eight-yard quarterback keeper for a 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the contest.

Memphis had a chance to put points on the board in the next drive, but a Paulo Henriques' 46-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right with just under seven minutes remaining in the first quarter.

After an exchange of punts, Tulsa took over the ball at its own 38 yard line with 1:54 left in the first quarter. The Golden Hurricane wasted no time adding to its advantage, driving the 62 yards in only four plays. Douglas hit paydirt from 18 yards out, and Tulsa led 14-0 at the end of the first quarter.

The Tigers' next possession produced their lone touchdown of the game, as Rhodes found the end zone from 22 yards out with 12:41 left in the second quarter. It was Rhodes' first career rushing touchdown and brought the Tigers to within seven, 14-7.

The next two Golden Hurricane scores - both Kevin Fitzpatrick field goals of 19 and 23 yards - came off Memphis fumbles deep in its own territory and extended the visitors' lead to 20-7 at the half.

Tulsa put out any hopes of a Memphis comeback early in the third period with two touchdown drives. The Golden Hurricane hit the end zone on drives of 74 and 51 yards in the first eight minutes of the third quarter to build their lead to 34-7. Kinne found Charles Clay on a two-yard pass for the first score, and Alex Singleton scored on a five-yard run for Tulsa's second touchdown of the third period.

The Golden Hurricane added two more touchdowns in the fourth quarter for the 48-7 final.

Jamon Hughes led the Tiger defense with 12 total tackles, while DeRon Furr added 10 tackles.

Curnelius Arnick and Tanner Antle paced the Tulsa defense with nine tackles apiece.

LOUISVILLE, Ky.-- Louisville scored 35 points on the strength of 380 total yards in the first half en route to defeating Memphis 56-0 at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium Saturday. It was Memphis' first visit to Louisville since 2003 when the Tigers won that contest 37-7.

The two longtime rivals played to nearly a standstill in the first quarter. The Cardinals only outgained the Tigers 82-59 in yardage, and Memphis nearly doubled up Louisville in time of possession at 9:13-5:47. The Tigers pushed the ball into Cardinal territory twice in the opening period, but the Louisville defense picked off a Ryan Williams pass to halt the Tigers' best early scoring drive.

The home team, though, broke through late in the first period. The Cardinals struck with 1:56 remaining in the first quarter when quarterback Adam Froman tossed a 39-yard scoring strike to Cameron Graham to give Louisville a 7-0 lead. The score was the first of five-consecutive drives that ended in touchdowns for Louisville.

And it didn't take long for the Cardinals to add to their lead. After forcing a Memphis punt on its next possession, Louisville took over on the Tiger 48 yard line. On their first play from scrimmage in the second quarter, the Cardinals used a little trickery from their "Wild Card" formation.

The end result was Froman hit a wide-open Josh Chichester on a flea-flicker style play to increase Louisville's lead to 14-0.

The Tigers piled up 100 yards in the second quarter, but managed only one deep drive in Louisville territory. Memphis began its second drive of the period on its own 20 yard line and moved the ball to the Cardinal 25, setting up a field goal opportunity. Paulo Henriques' 42 yard attempt, though, missed just left of the upright.

After the missing, the Cardinal offense continued to click and added two more scores before halftime. The first came on the first play after Memphis' missed field goal as Bilal Powell took the handoff and raced 74 yards to give Louisville a 28-0 lead.

The Cardinals tacked on one more touchdown before the half as Froman hooked up with Josh Bellamy for the second time in the second quarter, and Louisville took a 35-0 lead into the break.

Louisville continued its assault on the first two drives of the second half. The Cardinals received the second-half opening kick-off and marched 69 yards in eight plays to extend their advantage to 42-0. On the second scoring drive, Louisville put together a seven-play, 58-yard drive that ended with a Justin Burke-to-Andre Smith four-yard touchdown connection for a 49-0 lead.

Louisville added another score in the fourth quarter for the 56-0 final.

While the Cardinal offense took the spotlight, the Louisville defense also played well. The Cardinals held Memphis to 223 of total offense, including only 39 yards on 34 carries. The Tigers converted only 3-of-16 thirds down conversions and did not scratch on the scoreboard despite

winning the time of possession battle 33:14-26:46.

Williams finished with 174 yards on 15-of-27 passing and one interception. He was replaced in the fourth quarter by Cannon Smith after suffering an injury.

Jerrell Rhodes led the Memphis ground game, totaling 49 yards on 11 carries. Williams' favorite targets were Jermaine McKenzie and Marcus Rucker. McKenzie posted a career high with 71 receiving yards on three catches, while Rucker caught a team-high five passes for 32 yards.

Memphis punter Tom Hornsey averaged 41.9 yards on 10 punts and had three of his punts downed three inside the 20.

Jamon Hughes and Marcus Ball led the Tiger defense with seven tackles apiece.

For Louisville, Powell finished the game with 204 yards on 18 carries with two touchdowns. Froman rolled up 235 yards on 12-of-16 passing and four touchdown passes. Bellamy led all receivers with six receptions for 112 yards and two scores.

Darius Ashley led the Cardinal defense with seven total tackles and two sacks. Antwone Canady added four hits and one sack.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - Tiger linebacker Jamon Hughes had a stellar performance for the University of Memphis Saturday, but the home team's effort came up short in a 41-19 Conference USA loss to longtime rival Southern Miss. The game was the 61st overall meeting between the "Black & Blue" rivals, the longest series against a single opponent in Tiger football history.

Hughes posted 21 total tackles, including 15 solo stops and one quarterback sack. The 21 total tackles are tied for the second-most in a single game in school history and are the most since Pete Scatamacchia posted a school-record 25 tackles against Louisville in 1979.

Despite Hughes' game, Southern Miss rolled up 41 points and 515 yards of total offense en route to the victory. It was the third-straight game the Golden Eagles scored 40 or more points and the fifth time they scored 30 or more points in a game in 2010.

Leading the Golden Eagle offense was quarterback Austin Davis, who was 19-of-30 passing for 275 yards and three touchdowns. Davis' favorite target was Kelvin Bolden, who posted career highs with eight receptions for 154 yards to go with one score. Kendrick Hardy led the Southern Miss ground attack with 101 yards on 11 carries.

The Memphis offense came alive late in the second half and finished with 269 yards of total offense in the contest. Tiger quarterback Ryan Williams was 11-of-21 passing for 237 yards and two touchdown tosses. Marcus Rucker caught four passes for a career-best 155 yards and two scores. Rucker's 155 receiving yards is tied for the 11th-

best single-game performance in school history.

Most of the offensive fireworks came late in the game with the outcome already decided. With the Golden Eagles leading 27-9 entering the fourth period, the visitors from Hattiesburg increased their advantage to 34-9 with 12:28 left in the game. Southern Miss drove 59 yards in four plays, and the Golden Eagles hit paydirt when Davis hit Bolden from 28 yards out.

On the next possession, the Tigers took over on their own 16 yard line. After a Jerrell Rhodes three-yard gain moved the ball to the 19, Williams found Rucker across the middle for an 81-yard touchdown that pulled the Tigers to within 34-16. The 81-yard connection is the Tigers' longest this season, and it is also the 12th-longest pass play in school history. The 81-yard score was career longs for Williams (pass) and Rucker (reception).

Southern Miss had another answer on its next possession. The Golden Eagles went 80 yards in six plays, and Hardy capped the drive with a 59-yard scamper to the end zone. The touchdown increased Southern Miss' lead to 41-16.

The Tigers ended the scoring on the ensuing possession, driving 44 yards to set up Paulo Henriques 47-yard field goal. The 47-yard field goal is Henriques career long, besting his previous long set earlier in the game when he converted a 45-yarder.

In the third period, the only scoring came when the teams exchanged field goals, before the offensive shootout took place in the fourth quarter.

The second quarter had little offense as neither team had a possession of more than eight plays, including Southern Miss' scoring drive. The Golden Eagles extended their lead to 24-6 with 6:09 left in the second quarter on a Desmond Johnson two-yard touchdown run. Southern Miss' scoring drive was only two plays and 19 yards, and the Golden Eagle offense was set up with a short field when Roshaad Byrd recovered a Williams' fumble deep in Memphis territory.

Southern Miss opened the game's scoring on its first possession of the contest. The Golden Eagles took over on their own 20 and drove inside the Tiger 20, where the drive stalled. Danny Hrapmann capped the six-play, 61-yard drive with a 36-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

The Tigers responded on the ensuing possession with a confident five-play drive that ended with a Williams-to-Rucker 22-yard touchdown connection. Williams accounted for all 67 yards on the possession, going 3-of-4 through the air for 67 yards.

Memphis maintained its lead until late in the opening period. The Golden Eagles began the second scoring drive with 8:50 left in the first quarter on their 27 yard line. On the drive's seventh play, Davis found Johdrick Morris from six yards out to give Southern Miss a 10-6 advantage. The big gain on the drive came on the play prior to the score when Davis hit Bolden for a 41-yard gain to the Memphis 6 yard line.

After the kickoff, Memphis started on its own 23 and moved the ball to the 44. The turnover bug, though, bit the Tigers on a 2nd-and-1 from the 44 when Rhodes fumbled, and Southern Miss' Cordarro Law recovered the Memphis miscue. Set up at the Tiger 41 yard line, the Golden Eagles used 10 plays to increase their lead to 17-6 at the end of the first quarter. Davis picked up his second touchdown toss of the game when he hit Desmond Johnson on an 11-yard scoring strike.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - Memphis redshirt senior Gregory Ray had a career night rushing, but the Houston offense was clicking on all cylinders en route to a 56-17 Conference USA victory over the Tigers at Liberty Memorial Stadium. The game was Memphis' Homecoming.

Ray carried the ball 23 times for a career-best 176 yards and one touchdown. The 176-yard performance bested his previous career high of 121 yards against Middle Tennessee earlier this year. Ray's one touchdown came in the fourth quarter from five yards out.

Ray's 176 rushing yards were the most by a Tiger since the 2009 regular season finale at Tulsa last November. In that game versus the Golden Hurricane, Curtis Steele rushed for 232 yards.

Senior linebacker Jamon Hughes paced the Memphis defense with 15 stops, marking the 12th consecutive game he's been the Tigers' leading tackler dating back to last season. It was Hughes' 14th-straight game in which he logged six or more tackles. Frank Trotter was the Tigers' second-leading tackler with 10 hits.

The Tigers' first touchdown drive began late in the third quarter after the Memphis defense recovered a Cougar fumble at its own 23 with 1:39 left. Five plays and 2:18 later, Ray scampered into the end zone from five yards out for Memphis' first touchdown. Ray's score cut the Houston lead to 49-10.

On the Tigers' scoring drive, Ray was responsible for 70 of the 77 yards, gaining all 70 of his yards on five carries. Ray had two huge rushes of 34 and 28 yards on the possession.

Memphis scored its second touchdown five minutes later when redshirt sophomore quarterback Cannon Smith found the end zone from one yard out. Smith's touchdown was the final score in the Cougars' 56-17 win.

Smith finished the game with five rushes for 22 yards and was 2-of-5 passing for 65 yards.

The Cougars led 35-3 at the break and scored the first two touchdowns of the second half to increase their advantage to 49-3 with 5:33 left in the third period. Houston quarterback David Piland threw his fourth and fifth touchdowns of the game in the period before being pulled for freshman quarterback Terrance Broadway.

Piland finished the game 20-of-23 passing for 292 yards and five touchdowns. Broadway came in with five minutes left in the third quarter and was 4-of-4 passing for 111 yards, including a 54-yard scoring strike to E.J. Smith with 12:41 left in the contest.

Michael Hayes led the Houston ground attack with 123 yards on 20 carries and one score. Chris Wilson added 95 rushing yards on 18 carries. Three Cougars - Smith (89 yards), James Cleveland (84) and Patrick Edwards (78) - went over the 75-yard receiving mark in the contest.

The Tigers opened the scoring on the game's first possession. Memphis began the drive on its own 32 and moved the ball into Houston territory on the third play when Ryan Williams completed a nine-yard pass to Deven Onarheim to the Cougar 46. The Tigers' drive continued to the Houston 22 yard line where Memphis got a 39-yard field goal from Paulo Henriques for a 3-0 lead with 9:57 left

in the first quarter.

From that point, the Houston offense exploded for 49-straight points. The Cougars gained their first lead of the game three minutes later when an eight-play, 66-yard drive culminated in a Piland-to-Edwards 15-yard touchdown. Houston took the lead with 6:44 left in the opening period.

The Cougars revved it up in the second quarter with a 28-point eruption for a 35-3 halftime lead. After a Hayes one-yard run gave Houston a 14-3 lead, the Cougars' special teams got in the act on the visitors' next score. The Houston defense forced a 3-and-out on the Tigers' next possession, and Tom Hornsey sent a 45-yard punt to the Cougar 26 yard line. Edwards received the punt and raced 74 yards to the end zone for a 21-3 Houston lead.

The Cougars added two more scores before half-time - both Piland touchdown tosses - to take a 35-3 advantage. Piland's second touchdown connection of the game was a 54-yard pass to Edwards, and his third scoring pass was a 22-yarder to Hayes.

MEMPHIS - Behind 509 yards of offense and five touchdowns from freshman quarterback Tyler Bray, the Tennessee Volunteers overpowered Memphis 50-14 Saturday night at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Things began with a promising look for Memphis as the Tigers took over on its own 38 after Tennessee's opening drive ended on downs. Memphis drove 62 yards in eight plays capped by a four-yard touchdown toss from Ryan Williams to Marcus Rucker to draw first blood and take a 7-0 advantage with 11:02 left in the first quarter.

Bray finished with 325 yards on 19-of-33 passing and five touchdowns, both career highs. Tauren Poole led the way on the ground for Tennessee, totaling 101 yards and one touchdown on 16 carries. He also had two receptions for 50 yards and one score.

Rucker led the Tiger offense, finishing with a career-tying five receptions for 76 yards and two touchdowns. Williams finished with 221 yards on 18-of-27 passing to go along with two touchdowns and two interceptions.

Making his first career start at safety, Mitch Huelsing led the way on defense for Memphis, amassing a career-best 11 tackles (10 unassisted) to go along with one tackle for loss. DeRon Furr finished with two tackles for loss, a pass break up and a fumble recovery.

Bray connected on the first of his five strikes with 4:51 remaining in the first quarter when he found Tauren Poole for a nine-yard touchdown reception. Poole would finish the half with two catches for 50 yards and added 81 yards on 13 carries. A missed PAT by Michael Palardy left the Volunteers trailing 7-6.

Tennessee scored again less than four minutes later, when Bray found fellow freshman Justin Hunter streaking down the sideline for a 42-yard touchdown score to put the Vols ahead 13-7.

Ryan Williams was intercepted on the first play of the Tigers' next drive, and the Volunteers would take over at the Memphis 33-yard line. Tennessee used six plays to go 26 yards and set up a 26-yard Palardy field goal to extend its advantage to 16-7.

A three-and-out on the next series gave Tennessee the ball back at its own 24-yard line. Nine plays, 76 yards, and 3:55 later, the Volunteers extended their advantage to 23-7 when Bray hooked up with Denarius Moore for a 14-yard touchdown reception.

Cannon Smith entered the game at quarterback on the next series for the Tigers, but was unable to shift the momentum. The redshirt-sophomore completed a pass with first down yardage to Billy Foster before he was picked off by Janzen Jackson on his next attempt.

The interception set up another touchdown toss from Bray, who found Da'Rick Rogers for a 22-yard score as Tennessee pulled further ahead 30-7.

Gregory Ray rushed twice for 22 yards to open the next Memphis drive before a fumble by Smith again set the Volunteers up with excellent field position. Bray again capitalized, this time finding Gerald Jones for a nine-yard score as Tennessee pulled ahead 37-7.

The Volunteers, who amassed 398 yards of total offense in the first half, tacked on another field goal on its next possession and took a 40-7 lead into the break. After gaining 62 yards and scoring on its first possession, Memphis managed just 55 yards of offense for the remainder of the first half.

Each team would open the second half with back-to-back punts before Ryan Williams' second interception of the night set up another Volunteer touchdown. On the play following the interception by Malik Jackson, Poole spun away from a duo of Tiger defenders and sprinted 21 yards into the endzone for his first rushing touchdown of the evening.

The PAT from Palardy extended the advantage to 47-7, and the Volunteers would add another field goal before the end of the quarter to make it 50-7.

Memphis added one more score before the final whistle when Williams found Rucker streaking down the sideline for a 38-yard score. It was Williams' ninth touchdown pass of the season and Rucker's sixth touchdown reception, both of which are team highs. It marked the second time this season Rucker has caught multiple touchdowns and the third game that Williams has thrown multiple TDs.

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. - Memphis scored on its first drive of the game on a 43-yard pass from Ryan Williams to Jermaine McKenzie and took a 10-0 advantage into the half, but it wasn't enough as the Marshall Thundering Herd used four second-half scores to pull away 28-13.

McKenzie finished with career highs in both catches (six) and receiving yards (109) to go along with one touchdown, while Williams finished 14-of-32 passing for 201 yards and one touchdown.

After gaining 124 yards in the opening quarter, the Tigers managed just 117 yards for the remainder of the game. Marshall scored 28 second-half points behind quarterback Brian Anderson, who finished with 251 yards on 20-of-28 passing, three touchdowns and one interception.

A Dontari Poe sack on the first defensive series of the game forced a Marshall punt, giving Memphis a chance to draw first blood. The Tigers did just that, marching 82 yards on six plays in 3:02 on a drive that was capped by Williams finding McKenzie down the right sideline to take an early 7-0 lead.

On the ensuing Marshall possession, DeRon

Furr intercepted an Anderson pass and returned it to midfield.

The Tigers capitalized on the Herd miscue and extended their advantage to 10-0 with 10:26 left in the second quarter on a Paulo Henriques 25-yard field goal. Henriques' field goal finished off an 11-play, 41-yard drive that spanned 3:25.

Neither Memphis nor Marshall was able to put a scoring drive together for the remainder of the first half, and the Tigers preserved their 10-0 advantage going into the break.

Once the second half started, it didn't take Marshall long to get on the board. After a stalled Memphis drive, Tom Hornsey kicked an uncharacteristic short 28-yard punt, allowing Marshall to take over at its own 40 yard line. The Thundering Herd marched 60 yards in eight plays and scored on a Troy Evans' 13-yard run to cut the Tiger lead to 10-7 at the 9:05 mark of the third quarter.

A Williams' fumble on the ensuing Memphis possession gave Marshall the ball on the Tiger 24 yard line. The Herd capitalized on the turnover when Anderson tossed the first of his three second-half touchdown passes to Courtney Edmonson. The touchdown strike gave the Thundering Herd its first lead of the game at 14-10.

Marshall extended its advantage to 21-10 less than 15 seconds into the fourth quarter. After a Tigers' offside penalty on 4th-and-1 gave Marshall a first down, Anderson found Brian Lee on the next play for a 32-yard score at the 14:43 mark.

After each team failed to get anything going on their next two drives, Memphis got the ball back with 11:19 to play and in good field possession at the Marshall 44 yard line. The Tigers used five plays and gained 15 yards to set up a Henriques' 45-yard field goal to pull within 21-13 at the 8:41 mark.

Marshall put the game out of reach on its next drive, as Anderson threw his third and final touchdown pass, this one for 62 yards to Evans. Evans finished the game with three catches for 81 yards and a touchdown, in addition to his 28 rushing yards and a score via the ground.

Memphis did force two turnovers in the contest. DeRon Furr registered a second-quarter interception which led to Henriques' first field goal. Corey Jones also recorded a forced fumble when he sacked Anderson in the second quarter. Frank Trotter recovered for the Tigers.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.--Memphis had its chances, but UAB (4-8; 3-4 C-USA) was too much behind Bryan Ellis' 361 yards and three touchdowns as the Blazers defeated the Tigers 31-15 Saturday at Legion Field in the "Battle for the Bones."

Memphis had solid offensive production, but turnovers again proved key in the loss. Ryan Williams led the way for the Tigers, throwing for 228 yards on 16-of-31 passing with one touchdown and one interception.

Jerrell Rhodes led the team with 85 yards rushing on 11 carries with an average rush of 7.7 yards. It is his second highest career rushing total with his high being 90 yards against UTEP earlier this season, and the 7.7-yard average is a career best.

It didn't take long for the Blazers to get on the board as they took the opening kickoff and drove 80 yards in nine plays and 2:48 to take an early 7-0 advantage at the 12:12 mark. Ellis found Jeffrey Anderson for a 52-yard connection down the sideline.

The Tigers responded with the first of Paulo Henriques' three field goals on the day. Memphis (1-10; 0-7 C-USA) drove 43 yards in 11 plays and five minutes before the sophomore kicker knocked it through the uprights from 44 yards out to narrow the margin to 7-3 with 7:04 remaining in the first quarter.

The Tiger defense held the UAB offense in check on the following possession, but a muffed punt resulted in a turnover and gave the ball back to the Blazers at the Tiger 25-yard line. UAB capitalized and scored two plays later on

a one-yard touchdown run from Pat Shed and went ahead 14-3 with 2:25 remaining in the first quarter.

Shed finished with 125 yards and one touchdown on 20 carries to go along with two catches for 63 yards and a score through the air.

UAB then extended its advantage to 17-3 at the 10:24 mark of the second quarter on the first and only field goal of the day by Josh Zahn from 25 yards out.

Memphis responded with a field goal of its own as Henriques booted his second 40-plus field goal of the day, this one from 43 yards out to bring Memphis within 17-6. Henriques has converted his last five attempts from more than 40 yards.

The Blazers scored another touchdown before the break to extend their advantage to 24-6 as Ellis tossed his second touchdown of the day, this time finding Shed out of the backfield for a 54-yard strike.

After a 35-yard return on the ensuing kickoff by D.A. Griffin, Memphis capitalized on the good field position by marching 39 yards in seven plays and 39 yards to set up Henriques' third field goal of the half. He knocked it through the uprights from 36 yards out to make the score 24-9 at the break. The 35-yard kickoff return was the longest on the season for Memphis.

Both offenses stalled on the opening drives of the second half, but the Tigers narrowed the gap on its second drive of the half. Marcus Rucker hauled in two catches on the drive, including a touchdown grab, for 48 yards to lead the Tigers into the endzone for its only touchdown of the game.

Rucker finished the game with 90 yards and one touchdown on four catches. It was Rucker's seventh touchdown of the season and ninth of his career. It was Williams' 11 TD pass this season. Rucker has scored in three of the last five games, and has five TDs in that span as he logged multiple TDs against USM and Tennessee.

Memphis attempted a two-point conversion in hopes of making it a one possession game, but failed and found itself down 24-15 with 7:20 remaining in the third quarter.

After Tom Hornsey pinned UAB on its own one-yard line, the Blazers blazed through the Tiger defense, going 99 yards in four plays and 1:30, capped by a 72-yard connection from Ellis to Patrick Hearn to put the Blazers ahead 31-15.

Hornsey finished the day with a 42.8 average on five punts and had two downed inside the 20-yard line.

The Tigers had an opportunity to cut into the lead in the fourth quarter when Marcus Ball made his second interception of the day and returned it 63 yards to the UAB seven-yard line. Memphis failed to score, however, and turned the ball over on downs four plays later.

Jamon Hughes continued to lead the defense in tackles, registering 17 stops today. He has led the team in tackles in 10 of the 11 games this season, and totals seven games of double-digit stops this season. Hughes now totals 136 career tackles and ranks ninth in the Memphis record book for single season tackles. The school record is 162 by Michael Thomas in 1980.

Junior Terrence Thomas made his first career start today. He started at linebacker for DeRon Furr, who did not make the trip because of an illness. Thomas logged a career-high 12 tackles in today's game and had four tackles for loss, totaling 21 yards. The four TFLs is tied for fourth in school history with 13 other players. The last player to record four TFLs was Clinton McDonald against Arkansas State in 2008.
