### THE ALABAMA A&M SERIES

In thirteen games of a 23 year span, the Tigers own an 8-5-0 record against the bulldogs, including a 39-28 goals scored advantage in the series.

### THE LAST MEETING

Alabama A&M last met the Tigers in Memphis in 2005 and were handed a 7-0 loss in a record-setting afternoon for Memphis soccer. The Tigers' win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 13 extended their program-leading home winning streak to 10 games. Michael Coburn and Tripp Harkins each tallied a score, and Tyler Strom recorded one save in 33 shutout minutes in goal.

### QUICK STRIKES

In three consecutive games, the Tiger attack responded to an opposition goal with a goal of its own within two minutes. Against Kentucky, the Wildcats scored off a corner kick, and 112 seconds later, Sean Goulding bent a free kick into the box where Robert Sausaman finished it inside the near post to tie the game.

### MR. SELFLESS

At Marshall, 85 seconds after The Herd tied the game at 1-1, Michael Coburn and Jared Britcher combined to assist Thomas Hyland's game-winning header.

A well-executed corner kick gave the Gamecocks a 1-0 lead in the second period, but before 30 seconds could roll off the clock, Brian Farrell and Michael Coburn had connected to tie the South Carolina game at 1 apiece, where it remained through two overtime periods.

### DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Tigers' 3-1 loss to No. 10 Creighton marks the most offensive production the defense has allowed this season. Memphis has thrown 4 shutouts in 13 matches and allowed only one goal in each of its last three games. The Memphis defense is third in C-USA with 14 goals allowed through 13 matches and has allowed 2 or more goals in a match only twice.

### TRANSFER, WALK-ON CAPTAINS

Two seniors captain the 2007 squad: Kevin Walsh and Jared Britcher. Walsh transferred from CBU following his sophomore season and led the Tiger offense in 2006 with 10 goals and 7 assists. Jared Britcher made the team his freshman season as a walk-on and subsequently earned a starting position. He has 15 goals and 13 assists credited to his career totals. Britcher also is a two-time Academic All-American. "He's the model student-athlete," said a Memphis Coach Richie Grant.

### SHARING THE WEALTH

With his second career goal against Marshall, Thomas Hyland became the 13th Tiger to score a goal this season. Kevin Walsh and Jared Britcher lead the

team with five goals, and Sean Goulding is the only Tiger to appear in at least four matches who hasn't scored a goal, except for Tyler Strom, who has an assist from minding the goal. Goulding's 6 assists indicate, however, that he is anything but absent from the Tiger attack.

### MIDWEST STRENGTH

Memphis remains the No. 4 team in the NSCAA's Midwest Region immediately behind three top-15 teams: No. 8 Creighton and C-USA rivals Tulsa (No. 14) and SMU (No. 5). The NSCAA will release its next poll October 30.

### FOUR YEARS RUNNING

For the fourth time in as many years, the Tigers have been ranked in the top 25 in a major national poll. *Soccer America's* men's top-25 poll had Memphis sharing the No. 25 ranking with Louisville and Akron two weeks ago. Last week the Tigers beat Marshall, 2-1, on the road and tied South Carolina, 1-1, at home. The National Soccer Coaches Association's (NSCAA) next poll will be released tomorrow.

### ROSTER NOTES

The Alabama A&M roster features 13 international players from five African countries and Jamaica. The remaining six players come from Huntsville, Ala. (2), Jackson, Miss. (3), and Detroit, Mich. (1). All five seniors and each of the team's seven juniors are from overseas. The Tigers do not have a player from Alabama, and there is no native Tennessean on the Bulldog roster.

### SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

Seven Bulldogs have combined to score Alabama A&M's 19 season goals. Mfana Futhi Bhembe leads the team with 5 goals and 1 assist, and Mosito Ranko also has 11 points with his four goals and 3 assists. Two other players each have tallied 3 goals this season. The Bulldogs have allowed 15 goals in their 13 matches, and at 6-6-1 have lost only one match by more than one goal (to South Carolina, 2-0). They have been shut out three times: by UC Riverside (1-0), South Carolina and Central Arkansas (1-0).

Offensive support has come at a premium, as the Dogs have managed 3 scores only twice to help keeper Paul Musoke, who has pitched 5 shutouts this year and boasts a .762 save percentage.

### RICHIE GRANT

Head Coach

Richie Grant enters his ninth season leading the Tiger soccer program in 2007. In his tenure as a head coach, Grant consistently has shown the ability to recruit athletes from across the South and to complement them with talent from Europe to put together strong teams.

The two-time Conference USA Coach-of-the-Year earned his 79th win at the University of Memphis last season, and his .561 winning percentage is the highest in the program's history. Since his arrival at Memphis in 1999, Grant has failed to reach the .500 mark only twice. He led the team to its first conference title in 2004 and the first NCAA tournament since 1993. Since the 2004 season, the Tigers have been recognized as one of the premier teams in the nation, cracking the top 20 each year.

Immediately following the conference championship, proof of the team's overall strength was solidified in the form of a nationally ranked offense. Grant's fourth in seven years. The 2005 Tigers led C-USA and were third in the nation in goals per game (2.56) and were second in C-USA in goals (46), assists (43) and points (135). Two forwards from the 2005 squad were drafted by Major League Soccer (MLS) franchises.

The 2004 campaign also marked a new era of defensive dominance for Memphis Soccer. The defensive unit set school records for goals allowed and goals against average (0.70), which was ninth best in the country. The following season, goalkeeper Tyler Strom led C-USA with an .815 save percentage.

The 2006 campaign showed the same kind of promise. The Tigers opened the season with 8 wins in their first 10 matches and reached the No. 15 rank in the Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) poll.

Prior to Memphis, Grant turned around the soccer program at Lambuth University in Jackson, Tenn. In his four years at Lambuth, he led the Eagles to consecutive Mid-South Conference titles and an NAIA Region XI championship while posting a 53-29-2 record.

In his 12 years as a head coach, Grant has accumulated 132 wins and a .590 winning percentage. In his eight years at Memphis, he is 79-61-8.

As a player, Grant was a three-time NAIA All-American defender and was twice named the NAIA District V Player-of-the-Year at Green Mountain College in Poultney, Vt., where he received his bachelor's degree in leisure resources and facilities management in 1993. Grant then went on to play for the Minnesota Thunder, a semi-pro team that competes in the A-league.

After one season with the Thunder, Grant took a coaching position at Bloomsburg University in Pennsylvania and earned his master's degree in communication studies while working as an assistant coach from 1993-95.

Grant earned his NSCAA Advanced National Diploma in 1997 and then his NSCAA Premier Diploma in 2002. He served as the head coach of Tennessee's Under-23 Olympic Development Team in 2001. He is currently in his seventh year at the helm of the Tennessee U-17 ODP squad. Grant served as the head coach of the U-17 Super Clubs national all-star team, which toured England in the summer of 2001 for a week of matches against top international competition.

Grant is married to Memphis assistant women's soccer coach Jodi Grant and has four siblings. His two sisters live in England, and his two brothers reside in Ireland. His parents, Richie and Annette, live in Dublin, Ireland.
