THE FIU SERIES

Memphis has faced Florida International only twice and is 0-2 in those meetings. The Tigers have not managed a goal against the Golden Panthers.

THE LAST MEETING

The Tigers surrendered two David Hope goals against FIU last year and were handed their third shutout of the season. Kevin Walsh recorded 3 of the Tigers' 4 shots on goal, but no one was able to find the back of the net against now junior goalkeeper Thomas Kyle.

THE BACK SEVEN

The Tigers' defense has been the core of the team's success. With depth across the back, coach Grant has gotten great play from six field players and his senior keeper. Michael Coburn anchors a back line that includes Rick Alleman, Rory Dowd, Thomas Hyland, Robert Sausaman and at times Jared Britcher. Coupled with Tyler Strom in goal, the defense has Memphis atop the league rankings in goals against average (0.89) and shutouts (6), despite recording only 62 saves, seventh-best in C-USA.

TRANSFER, WALK-ON CAPTAINS

Two seniors will captain the 2007 squad: Kevin Walsh and Jared Britcher. Walsh transferred from CBU following his sophomore season and led the Tiger offense in 2006 with 10 goals and 7 assists. Jared Britcher made the team his freshman season as a walk-on and subsequently earned a starting position. He has 11 goals and 8 assists credited to his career totals. Britcher

er also is a two-time Academic All-American. "He's the model student-athlete," said a grinning Coach Grant.

QUICK STRIKES

In three consecutive games, the Tiger attack responded to an opposition goal with a goal of its own within two minutes. Against Kentucky, the Wildcats scored off a corner kick, and 112 seconds later, Sean Goulding bent a free kick into the box where Robert Sausaman finished it inside the near post to tie the game.

At Marshall, 85 seconds after The Herd tied the game at 1-1, Michael Coburn and Jared Britcher combined to assist Thomas Hyland's game-winning header.

A well-executed corner kick gave the Gamecocks a 1-0 lead in the second period, but before 30 seconds could roll off the clock, Brian Farrell and Michael Coburn had connected to tie the South Carolina game at 1 apiece, where it remained through two overtime periods.

MR. SELFLESS

Sean Goulding has the second-most assists in the league with six. His last one came against Kentucky when the Arbroath, Scotland, native bent a free kick into the box for Robert Sausaman to stick in the net. He is the only attack player without a goal this year, but he has been right in the thick of the offensive production.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN PANTHERS

FIU has allowed 36 goals by opponents this year. While an average above 2 per game

seems high, it's notable that 11 of those scores came in two losses to Michigan and Tulsa. Negating those goals, the Panthers would average fewer allowed than Memphis. In no other game has FIU allowed more than two goals, including two against top-15 teams and No. 1 Connecticut.

The Panthers' struggle has been finding the back of the net. With only 15 scores on the year, FIU has been shut out 6 times and completed its first shutout win this week against Florida Gulf Coast.

Juan Guerra leads the team with 5 goals, and Steven Cabas and Chris Caporaletti each have tallied three goals. Thomas Kyle carries the bulk of the netminding duties. He has earned a .693 save percentage in 12 appearances so far.

RICHIE GRANT
Head Coach

Richie Grant enters his ninth season leading the Tiger soccer program in 2007. In his tenure as a head coach, Grant consistently has shown the ability to recruit athletes from across the South and to complement them with talent from Europe to put together strong teams.

The two-time Conference USA Coach-of-the-Year earned his 79th win at the University of Memphis last season, and his .561 winning percentage is the highest in the program's history. Since his arrival at Memphis in 1999, Grant has failed to reach the .500 mark only twice. He led the team to its first conference title in 2004 and the first NCAA tournament since 1993. Since the 2004 season, the Tigers have been recognized as one of the premier teams in the nation, cracking the top 20 each year.

Immediately following the conference championship, proof of the team's overall strength was solidified in the form of a nationally ranked offense. Grant's fourth in seven years. The 2005 Tigers led C-USA and were third in the nation in goals per game (2.56) and were second in C-USA in goals (46), assists (43) and points (135). Two forwards from the 2005 squad were drafted by Major League Soccer (MLS) franchises.

The 2004 campaign also marked a new era of defensive dominance for Memphis Soccer. The defensive unit set school records for goals allowed and goals against average (0.70), which was ninth best in the country. The following season, goalkeeper Tyler Strom led C-USA with an .815 save percentage.

The 2006 campaign showed the same kind of promise. The Tigers opened the season with 8 wins in their first 10 matches and reached the No. 15 rank in the Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) poll.

Prior to Memphis, Grant turned around the soccer program at Lambuth University in Jackson, Tenn. In his four years at Lambuth, he led the Eagles to consecutive Mid-South Conference titles and an NAIA Region XI championship while posting a 53-29-2 record.

In his 12 years as a head coach, Grant has accumulated 132 wins and a .590 winning percentage. In his eight years at Memphis, he is 79-61-8.

As a player, Grant was a three-time NAIA All-American defender and was twice named the NAIA District V Player-of-the-Year at Green Mountain College in Poultnet, Vt., where he received his bachelor's degree in leisure resources and facilities management in 1993. Grant then went on to play for the Minnesota Thunder, a semi-pro team that competes in the A-league.

After one season with the Thunder, Grant took a coaching position at Bloomsburg University in Pennsylvania and earned his master's degree in communication studies while working as an assistant coach from 1993-95.

Grant earned his NSCAA Advanced National Diploma in 1997 and then his NSCAA Premier Diploma in 2002. He served as the head coach of Tennessee's Under-23 Olympic Development Team in 2001. He is currently in his seventh year at the helm of the Tennessee U-17 ODP squad. Grant served as the head coach of the U-17 Super Clubs national all-star team, which toured England in the summer of 2001 for a week of matches against top international competition.

Grant is married to Memphis assistant women's soccer coach Jodi Grant and has four siblings. His two sisters live in England, and his two brothers reside in Ireland. His parents, Richie and Annette, live in Dublin, Ireland.
