

## Tiger Men's Tennis

- ♦ Broke into the national rankings for the first time in 26 years in 2001, and were in the national rankings every year from 2001-2006.
- ♦ Has received the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's Team Academic All-American award in four of the last six seasons.
- ♦ Plays in one of the country's toughest tennis conferences. Twenty-seven singles players were ranked among the ITA/FILA Regional rankings at the end of the Fall 2006 season.
- ♦ Received the Conference USA Sport Award for having the highest GPA in all of C-USA men's tennis following the 2005-06 season.
- ♦ Has had a singles player in the year-end national singles rankings in 2003-04 and 2004-05. In 2003-04 it was current assistant coach Lee Taylor Walker, in 2004-05 it was senior Alex Bucewicz, who capped his Tiger career the No. 124 ranked singles player in the country.
- ♦ Has had some impressive doubles tandems earn national rankings, as Memphis has had a doubles tandem in the national rankings since current Tiger assistant coach Lee Taylor Walker and alum Ben Stapp earned the program's first-ever doubles ranking of No. 12 in the country in 2003-04. The tandem of James Spence and Sam Withell were the latest Tigers to be in the doubles national rankings, finishing 2005-06 as the No. 45 ranked tandem in the country.
- ♦ Lee Taylor Walker, now the Tigers' assistant coach, capped an impressive collegiate career in 2004-05. Walker helped the Tigers make their first-ever appearance in the Conference USA Semifinals and was the first-ever Tiger voted to First Team All-Conference USA. ## Paul Goebel

### Head Coach

Paul Goebel is entering his third season as the head coach of the Tiger men's tennis program, his seventh overall season with the program after spending the four seasons prior to 2004-05 as an assistant coach at Memphis. Goebel has continued to build on the framework left in place by previous head coach Phil Chamberlain, by continuing to put together one of the toughest schedules in the country, and by adding regional talent to the line-up.

Goebel signed the program's biggest recruiting class to date for

the 2006-07 season, including three Tennessee prep products (Johnson City's Brad Chase, Memphis University School's Spencer Heflin and Chattanooga's Charlie Ramsay) and one Louisiana native (Baton Rouge Catholic's Cody Loup). Goebel also added one of the top junior college doubles tandems (Benedikt Fischer and Amrit Narasimhan) and Arkansas transfer Jimmy Khougasian, for the upcoming season.

Goebel continues to surround the program with strong support, hiring the program's first-ever First Team All-Conference USA honoree,

Lee Taylor Walker, as his assistant coach in 2004-05, while bringing NCAA Division II All-American Tobias Huning on board as a volunteer assistant coach in 2006-07. His work with tennis in the Southeast helped earn him a spot on the ITA Southeast Regional committee for the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons, an honor he earned from other collegiate tennis coaches in the region.

Under Goebel's guidance, the Tigers battled through adversity in 2005-06. Coming off an outstanding fall season that saw the top doubles

team of James Spence and Alex Jago climb as high as No. 8 in the country, the team was dealt a blow when Jago was diagnosed with a career-ending wrist injury at the end of the fall season. Goebel was able to bring back Sam Withell to team with Spence, and the duo recovered to finish as the No. 45 ranked team in the country by the end of the spring season.

A native of Hendersonville, N.C., Goebel came to Memphis after a stellar career at Middle Tennessee, where he was an All-American. A member of the MTSU team from 1990-1994, Goebel served as the team's captain from 1992-1994 and was a four-time, all-conference player. He was also named the student-athlete of the year in 1994.

Following his collegiate playing career, Goebel served as a student assistant coach in 1995 at Middle Tennessee, also playing professionally. In 1999, Goebel was ranked No. 1 in the nation in the Men's 25 and over age group.

Goebel moved to Memphis and became a tennis professional at The Racquet Club of Memphis beginning in 1996. At The Racquet Club, Goebel has taught top national and southern-ranked juniors and has coached in a variety of area training centers, zonals and national team events.

Goebel and his wife, Shelly, have a son, Reed, a daughter, Isabelle, and welcomed a second son, Luke, in August of 2006.





## Lee Taylor Walker

### Assistant Coach

Former Tiger tennis player Lee Taylor Walker is entering his third year as an assistant coach with the men's tennis program and his first year as an assistant with the women's program in 2006-07.

A three-year letterwinner for the Tiger tennis team from 2001-2004, Walker was named the program's first-ever All-Conference USA first team honoree following a senior season which saw him ranked as high as #48 in the country in singles. That same season, Walker led five newcomers to Memphis' first ever C-USA semifinal appearance. Walker capped his Tiger career with 54 singles wins and 64 doubles wins after coming to Memphis in his sophomore season following his one year at Clemson. In Memphis, he teamed with Ben Stapp, and the duo became the first-ever Tiger doubles team to earn a national ranking, climbing as

high as No. 12 in the country before Stapp graduated. In 2005, Walker was one of ten players selected to the C-USA All-Decade Team (1995-2005).

"LT's playing ability is very beneficial for the team. His work ethic sets a good example for all the players," Goebel said. "He was highly successful with our program both on and off the court."

Walker was selected by the ITA after his senior season (2003-04) as the men's tennis recipient of the ITA/Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship and Leadership award, which he received in New York during the

U.S. Open festivities. This award goes to a player who has exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and leadership as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements. He is the first Tiger to ever receive the national award that is given annually to one men's and one women's college tennis player for their accomplishments. That same year, Walker was also awarded the C-USA sportsmanship award.

While a student-athlete at Memphis, Walker helped re-form a chapter of the Fellowship for Christian Athletes (FCA), coordinating huddle

meetings, visits to Streets Ministries and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Lee currently works with Campus Outreach, a ministry on the University of Memphis campus devoted to helping students take their spiritual next step and serve the community.

"I want to help this university develop champions on the court and men and women of character off the court," said Walker. "I believe that success on the tennis court is achieved after the need for inner-growth is realized. Coaches throughout my life have helped me see this and now I want to assist our players in that growing process."

A native of Jackson, Tenn., Walker attended the University School of Jackson before playing one year of college tennis at Clemson. While at Clemson, he was an ACC Academic Honor Roll member. He was a two-time ITA Scholar-Athlete while at Memphis. Lee Taylor finished graduate school in December (2006), receiving his Master's Degree in Human Movement Sciences with a concentration in Sport & Leisure Commerce. Lee Taylor is engaged to Erin May Ferris, a former Lady Tiger soccer player. They plan to get married following the spring season.





## Tobias Huning

### Volunteer Assistant Coach

Tobias Huning is in his first season as a volunteer assistant coach with the Tiger men's tennis program heading into the 2006-07 season. A four-time All-American in NCAA Division II, Huning came to Memphis after a stellar collegiate tennis career.

"We are very honored to have a volunteer assistant of Tobi's caliber," Goebel said. "He excelled at the highest levels of junior and college tennis and competed with the best players in the world. Our players are fortunate to have a guy like him around, he'll challenge them immediately with his standard of tennis."

Huning played collegiate tennis for three years at Lander University in South Carolina, where he was a three-time NCAA All-American (1999, 2000, 2001) and a two-time NCAA Academic All-American (2000 and 2001) while helping Lander to two NCAA Division II Championships (1999 and 2000).

Huning graduated from Lander in 2001 with a degree in business administration with a concentration in economics and finance and transferred to Valdosta State University in Georgia in the fall of 2001. There, he teamed with Marco

Borges and the duo spent time as the No. 1 ranked doubles team in NCAA Division II tennis, winning the 2001 ITA National Small College Division II Doubles Championship Title in Plano, Texas, and the 2001 ITA Men's Tennis Southeast Regional Doubles Championship. Huning would earn his fourth NCAA All-American honor while on the Valdosta State roster. He received his MBA in Management from Valdosta in 2004.

A native of Wuelfrath, Germany, Huning played No. 1 singles and doubles at both Lander and Valdo-

sta State, and was the No. 2 ranked singles player in the country for a stint during his four-year career.

He then served as an assistant coach at Valdosta, where he helped the men's team to a Gulf South Conference runner-up finish in 2002 and 2003 and a team championship in 2004 and the women's team to a national championship tournament berth (2004).

Huning has also spent some time on the professional tennis circuit, attaining his highest singles ranking of 948 and his top doubles ranking of 458.

## 2007 Tiger Season Preview

It is an almost entirely new line-up for Head Coach Paul Goebel as he enters his third season at the helm of the Tiger tennis program. Gone are Alex Jago and James Spence to graduation, Michael Jetter to his eligibility completion following the 2005-06 season and Bryan Bankester and Matt Brewer, both players who played in the singles line-up last season. In their place are Jimmy Khougassian, a transfer from SEC foe Arkansas; a pair of junior college teammates in junior Amrit Narasimhan and sophomore Benedikt Fischer, and three true freshmen, Spencer Heflin, Cody Loup and Charlie Ramsay.

Memphis had some surprisingly strong play in doubles throughout the fall, with a large number of newcomers finding some chemistry on the court. The tandem of Khougassian and Ramsay finished the tournament schedule with a 7-6 mark despite it being Ramsay's first semester of college tennis. Maybe less surprising was the tandem of Narasimhan and Fischer, who were one of the top junior college tennis tandems last year. The duo capped their first tournament season at Memphis with an 8-6 mark. With those two tandems, Memphis should be able to consistently get points in doubles play, especially with Garrison Pilant and Tezar Putra, two members of the Tigers' doubles line-up last season, in the mix for the third doubles lineup.

In singles, the Tigers will have to replace their top four slots in the line-up. Matt Brewer was

2-4 at No. 1 last season and Sam Withell was 0-5 last season. Neither returns for the upcoming spring season. The Tigers are also without Michael Jetter (1-3) and James Spence (0-4), who each completed their eligibility following last year. Spence graduated in August of 2006 and Jetter will graduate in May of 2007.

The Tigers may look to the junior college transfers to fill two of the top four spots, and with over a year of college tennis already under his belt, Khougassian may also fit in among the top four spots after playing the past year and a half at Arkansas.

The other singles slots may be split between the two returning Tigers, Garrison Pilant and Tezar Putra, and the three freshmen. Charlie Ramsay, a freshman from Chattanooga, led Memphis with a 5-5 mark in singles during the fall, and is 5-8 heading in to the spring dual season. Fellow freshman Spencer Heflin was 4-9 through the tournament season, while Cody Loup carries a 1-10 mark in to the spring dual season.

Pilant is coming off a long lay-off from tennis after undergoing wrist surgery in the fall, and will likely make his way back in to the line-up through the doubles line-up. Putra was also a regular in the Tiger line-up last year. He was 3-9 last season, including a 2-1 mark at No. 4 singles and a 1-1 mark at No. 6 singles, but he battled through a difficult fall schedule, finishing with a

1-10 mark heading in to the dual matches.

As always, the Tiger schedule features a number of nationally-ranked and regionally-ranked teams. For the second straight year, Memphis will open the season with a road swing through Tennessee and Vanderbilt, and will also make a second road trip to Arizona for a trio of contests against three opponents that began the year among the national rankings (Arizona, Arizona State, and Denver).

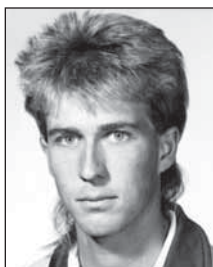

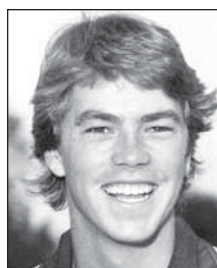

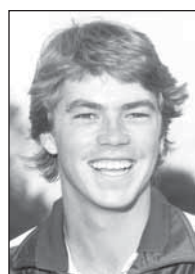
