Women's Basketball to Wrap Up Non-Conference Schedule Tuesday

The University of Memphis women's basketball team (6-6) will wrap up its non-conference schedule on the road at Tennessee Tech, Tuesday, at 7 p.m.

This will be the 21st meeting all-time between the Tigers and the Golden Eagles and TTU leads the all-time series 15-5 and 4-1 in games played in Cookeville. Memphis' only road win at TTU was in the last meeting between the two teams in Cookeville in 2003-04. Memphis won that game 71-50, but TTU returned the favor, upending Memphis in the Elma Roane Fieldhouse last year, 74-58.

Memphis comes in to the game with an even .500 record through the first 12 games of Melissa McFerrin's tenure. The Tigers were off to a quick 5-2 record, including a 5-0 mark in the Elma Roane Fieldhouse, before suffering a four-game losing streak that pushed the Tigers below .500 for the first time on the season. But after the 84-45 loss to UT Arlington, the Tigers bounced back to win the consolation game at the Bahamas Sunsplash Shootout to defeat Winthrop 52-46 to pull back to .500.

Heading in to Tuesday night's game, Memphis is trying to make it out of its non-conference schedule with a mark above .500 for the first time since a 7-6 mark following non-conference play to open the 2004-05 season.

Tennessee Tech is looking to snap a two-game losing streak, having fallen on the road at Southern Illinois, 74-67, and at home, 101-66 to Middle Tennessee on Sunday.

Senior guard/forward Blair Bowens leads TTU with 13.6 points and 22 three-point field goals made, while senior guard Meagan Lyons adds 10.1 points per game. Lyons also leads the team with 23 steals and is shooting 48.8 percent from the floor. Teammate Jasmine White, a sophomore forward, also shoots 48.8 percent from the floor, averaging 9.4 points and a team-high 6.6 rebounds per game.

The two teams have one common opponent so far this season. Memphis lost at Belmont, 69-60, in its second game of the season. TTU also fell at Belmont, 68-62 in its third game of the year.

About Tennessee Tech

This is the 21st overall meeting between Memphis and Tennessee Tech, and the Golden Eagles have the upperhand in the series, 15-5, including a 4-1 record in games played in Cookeville. Memphis' only win in Cookeville was in 2003-04, when the Tigers won 71-50. That was the last meeting between the teams in Cookeville, and TTU made the most of its last trip to Memphis, downing the Tigers, 74-58, last season.

TTU is in its third season under Amy Brown. Brown was a long-time assistant coach at TTU and has a 23-48 overall record coming in to Tuesday night's game, including a 1-0 record over the Tigers.

Memphis is 59-23 overall against the current Ohio Valley membership. The Tigers have a winning record against every OVC member except Tennessee Tech.

Leonard Named to the All-Tournament Team

Senior guard Paris Leonard averaged 10.0 points and 2.5 rebounds in the 1-1 week at the Sunsplash Shootout in Nassau, Bahamas before the break. Leonard scored 16 points against Winthrop, shooting 7-for-16 from the field. It was the second all-tournament honor for Leonard, who was named the tournament MVP for Memphis' tournament at the end of November.

Goldsmith Scores Eight Points in Six Crucial Members

Junior guard Tehani Goldsmith only scored eight points against Winthrop, but they were a crucial eight points, coming in the last six minutes of the game, and snapping a Winthrop run that had given the Eagles the lead. Goldsmith's three cut a five-point Memphis deficit with 6:18 to play and her next two points, a pair of free-throws, gave Memphis a two-point lead it would never relinquish with 2:56 to play.

Goldsmith averaged 10.0 points in the tournament, ranking her third on the team in scoring. She was also the team's top three-point shooter in tournament, connecting on three three-point field goals on six attempts.

Copeland Makes First Career Starts

Sophomore forward/post Shekeira Copeland made her first two career starts at the Bahamas tournament. She averaged 7.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game and tied for the team lead with four steals in the two games. She also shot 46.7 percent from the floor in the two games. She was 2-for-8 from the field in the Bahamas tournament and will be looking to get back on track before the C-USA slate begins on Sunday.

Thornton Looking for 700th Career Point

Senior forward is coming in to the Tennessee Tech game with 680 career points and 561 career rebounds. She needs just 20 more points for 700 for her career and 39 more rebounds for 600 for her three-year Tiger career.

Thornton transferred to Memphis from Birmingham Southern following her freshman season when BSC decided to move to NCAA Division III.

Lonlack Looking for 100th Point

Heading in to just her 13th collegiate game, freshman guard Ramses Lonlack is just one point shy of her 100th career point. The freshman has had a little more trouble scoring now that opponents have seen her defense on tape. She had her first career scoreless night against UT Arlington and scored five points in the win over Winthrop.

Lonlack Nets Double-Double at Mississippi State

Freshman guard Ramses Lonlack became the third Tiger of the season to net a double-double with her 12 point, 11-rebound effort in the loss at Mississippi State. Ashley Thornton and Savannah Ellis each have had double-doubles this season, and both Ellis and Lonlack have gotten their first career double-doubles in the early going.

Lonlack's double-double is the first double-double for a Tiger guard since LaToya Bulard had a double-double of 13 points and 12 assists last season against UCF. The last Tiger guard to have a double-double of points and rebounds was teammate Paris Leonard, who had a double-double of 26 points and 13 rebounds against Austin Peay as a freshman in Memphis' Thanksgiving tournament.

Leonard Creeping Up On 15th All-Time

Senior guard Paris Leonard is just 105 points shy of breaking in to the career top 15 in scoring. Leonard trails Lynn Enzweiler's mark of 1,185 points with 1,080 points.

Stop! Thief!

Memphis ranks second in Conference USA in steals with 9.0/game, with a pair of Tigers ranked in the top five in the league in steals. Senior Paris Leonard, who currently ranks third in the league in scoring, leads C-USA with 2.92 steals per game. Freshman Ramses Lonlack has dropped to fifth in the league with 2.00 steals per game.

Tigers Lose 2007-08 Starting Point Guard

The Tigers will be without junior point guard LaToya Bullard for the 2008-09 season after the Memphis native underwent season-ending surgery on Dec. 15th. Bullard hopes to be back for the 2009-2010 season.

Thornton Adds Another Double-Double

Senior forward Ashley Thornton finished the South Alabama game with 10 points and 10 rebounds, for her fifth double-double of the season. Thornton has now has 13 career double-doubles, which ranks her tied for 8th all-time in the Tiger record book in that category. She shares that slot with former Tiger Melissa Abraham, who had 13 career double-doubles over a four-year career at Memphis. Thornton transferred to Memphis after starting her career at Birmingham Southern as a freshman. She left BSC when they moved to NCAA Division III the year after she was named to the Big South All-Freshman Team.

Leonard Named C-USA Player of the Week

Paris Leonard was named the Conference USA Player of the Week on Dec. 1st following the Tigers' 3-0 week. Leonard, the Thanksgiving tournament MVP, averaged 19.0 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.0 steals per game. She stole a ball and drove the length of the court for a layup, not only pushing Memphis in front for good at 41-39, but also scoring her 1,000th career point.

Leonard is the first Tiger since Princess Swilley on Jan. 27, 2003, to earn C-USA Player of the Week honors. Her only other C-USA Award came in her freshman season when she was voted the league's sixth player of the year.

Lonlack Named C-USA Rookie of the Week

Freshman guard Ramses Lonlack has been a member of the team's starting line-up since the beginning of the season. After averaging 13.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 steals per game last week, Lonlack was named the C-USA Rookie of the Week by the league office on Dec. 1st.

Lonlack had a career-high 18 points in the win over Ohio, and was 3-for-4 from the free-throw line down the stretch to not only break a 69-69 tie, but to score all of Memphis' final three points to secure the 72-69 victory.

Leonard Passes 1,000 Point Mark

With her 21-point effort against Stephen F. Austin in the Thanksgiving Classic championship game, Paris Leonard became the 19th Tiger to score 1,000 career points. She currently ranks 18th in all-time scoring at Memphis with 1,002 points and was named the tournament MVP on Saturday night. The 21-point effort was also Leonard's 50th career double-digit scoring effort.

Tigers Win 18th Tournament Title

With the wins over Wichita State and Stephen F. Austin, the Tigers won their 18 tournament title, after making their 19th tournament championship appearance. Memphis improved to 38-6 all-time in the tournament.

Thornton Grabs 500th Career Rebound

Senior forward Ashley Thornton passed a career milestone in the win over Ohio, grabbing five rebounds in the win, which pushed he past the 500 career rebound mark in just 66 career games. Thornton, who transferred to Memphis as a sophomore, now has 546 career rebounds and 658 career points. The Pinson, Ala., native is now one of just 16 players in school history to have over 500 career rebounds.

Tigers Ink No. 60 Ranked Recruiting Class

Memphis signed three early players for the upcoming 2009-2010 season, a class that Allstar Girls Report ranked the No. 60 ranked class in the country for McFerrin's first full recruiting group. A pair of Tennessee natives will join the Tigers next year, as Ashley Robinson (Millington, Tenn./Millington Central) and Nicole Dickson (Greenville, Tenn./Greenville HS) will join the Tigers. The new Tiger coaching staff went back to the East Coast for

Melissa McFerrin

First Season at Memphis

Career: 56-76 (.424)

Melissa McFerrin was named the University of Memphis women's basketball coach on April 19th, 2008, becoming the fourth coach in the program's modern history.

McFerrin, the 2008 Patriot League Coach of the Year, spent the past four seasons at American University in Washington D.C. Her 2007 American team advanced to the Patriot League championship game and her 2008 squad won the school's first-ever Patriot League regular season championship, finishing with an 18-14 overall record. That team won 11 of 12 games down the stretch, advancing to the post season for the first time since 1997-98 with a WNIT bid. In four seasons at American, McFerrin compiled a 50-70 record and guided five different players to all-conference honors, while two other players earned all-freshman honors.

Prior to her stint with American, McFerrin was an associate head coach at the University of Minnesota from 2002-2004. She helped Minnesota to a 50-15 record, including an NCAA Final Four appearance in 2004 and a Sweet Sixteen berth in 2003. She signed two recruiting classes ranked in the top 20 at Minnesota, and helped guide two Kodak All-Americans, including WNBA player Lindsey Whalen.

McFerrin's time at Minnesota came after a five-year association with the WNBA. She began her affiliation with the WNBA as an assistant coach with the New York Liberty from 1997-1999, assisting with coaching duties for the 1997 WNBA Championship runner-up Liberty squad. She moved to the Washington Mystics as an assistant coach in 1999-2000, taking over as the Mystics' General Manager in 2000. As the GM, she guided a team that made its first-ever WNBA play-off appearance in 2000, and handled all player trades and draft decisions before joining the coaching staff at Minnesota.

Her WNBA stint followed a 14-year coaching career that made three different stops. McFerrin began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Wayland Baptist University in Texas from 1983-84. She was then hired as an assistant coach at Central Michigan University, where she helped the Chippewas to a 95-77 record in her six seasons, including a 1985 Mid-American Conference championship.

She left Central Michigan in 1990 to become an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at The Ohio State University. At Ohio State, she helped the Buckeyes to a 118-90 record and a 1993 Big Ten championship and an NCAA National Championship runner-up. That 1993 squad benefited from a 1992 McFerrin recruiting class that was ranked No. 1 in the nation, one of seven Buckeye recruiting classes to be nationally-ranked under McFerrin's watch at OSU. In 1996, McFerrin helped guide the Buckeyes to the NCAA Second Round before leaving the following season for the WNBA.

A native of Cassville, Mo., McFerrin was a four-year letterwinner and starting point guard for the University of Missouri Tigers from 1979 to 1983. She helped Missouri to a 1983 Big Eight tournament championship and NCAA tournament berth and a 1982 NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance, earning Big Eight honorable mention honors and Scholar-Athlete awards along the way. She graduated cum laude with a degree in secondary education from Missouri in 1983, and received her master's degree in physical education from Central Michigan in 1988.

the third Tiger signee, inking point guard Bilqis Abdul-Qadir from Springfield, Mass., and New Leadership High School.

Included in the class by Allstar Girls Report is Brittney Carter. Carter transferred to Memphis from the University of Georgia over the summer and is sitting out this season per NCAA transfer rules.
