Memphis to Host 24th Annual Piggly Wiggly Classic Friday

The University of Memphis women's basketball team (3-2) will host its 24th Annual Piggly Wiggly Classic, Friday, beginning at 6 p.m. against Wichita State. Stephen F. Austin will face Jacksonville State in the second game at approximately 8:30.

Memphis is carrying a perfect 3-0 mark at home in to Friday's match-up, while Wichita State is coming in with an eye toward snapping a 21-game true road game losing streak that dates back to Jan. 7, 2007. The Shockers dropped their only road contest of the year so far at Oral Roberts, 89-76, and have dropped 26-straight games away from home, including neutral site games. They last won a regular season tournament in 2004.

Both programs are in their respective first seasons with new head coaches. Memphis is 3-2 overall under new head coach Melissa McFerrin, while Wichita State is 3-1 in its first season under Jody Adams. Adams, a former player at the University of Tennessee, guided Murray State to a 27-9 record and an NCAA tournament spot in her first year of head coaching last season. She took the Wichita State job after Jane Albright was released following a 9-22 mark last season.

The Tigers have three different players averaging double-digit points heading in to Fri-

day's game. Senior guard Paris Leonard leads the team with 17.0 ppg after scoring 24 points against both Ole Miss and Ohio in the last two games. Senior forward Ashley Thornton opened the season with three straight double-doubles, but has had some helping rebounding as of late, and has dropped to 12.2 points and 9.0 rebounds per game. Freshman Ramses Lonlack has become a force opposing guards would rather not encounter. The freshman is coming off a career-best 18 point effort against Ohio and is now averaging 10.0 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. Leonard and Lonlack both have helped power Memphis to a league-best 10.40 steals per game. Leonard leads Conference USA in the early going with 3.6 steals and 2.8 three-point field goals per game.

Wichita State is led by senior Marcy Sudbeck, who has had a double-double in each of the Shockers' previous four games. Sudbeck averages 18.3 points and 12.8 rebounds per game. Marisah Henderson and Val Siemens also average double-digits, with 12.3 and 11.8 ppg, respectively.

WSU has already beaten two teams that were in the NCAA tournament last season, defeating UT-San Antonio, 54-51, and Iona, 66-64.

About Wichita State

The Shockers are off to a quick 3-1 start under new head coach Jody Adams. The Shockers have already beaten two teams that went to the NCAA tournament last season, upending UT San Antonio, 54-51, and defeating Iona, 66-64, both at home.

After a 9-22 season last year, the Shockers are looking to snap a 21-game road losing streak that dates back to Jan. 7, 2007 and build some road momentum for the remainder of their schedule.

This will be the first-ever meeting between Wichita State and the Tigers. But the Shockers should be somewhat familiar to a pair of Tigers, as both Shekeira Copeland and Savannah Ellis grew up in Wichita, Kan., graduating from Wichita Heights High School.

Leonard Nearing 1,000

Senior guard Paris Leonard has scored 48 points in the last two games and now needs just 31 more points to hit the 1,000 career point mark. She would be the 19th player in Memphis history to hit the grand scoring mark. The last Tiger to cross the 1,000 point mark was Devin Necaise (2003-2007). Necaise finished her career with 1,071 points, which currently ranks 16th overall. Necaise and Leonard were teammates for two seasons.

Leonard also ranks 6th in school history in three-point field goals made (115) and attempted (352) and is approaching the career top 10 in steals with 149. She needs 30 more steals to break in to the career top 10 in that category as well.

Leonard Rolling Toward 50th Career Double-Digit Scoring Night

Leonard's 24 point night against Ohio was her 49th career double-digit scoring outing. The Memphis native and Wooddale HS graduate has now played in 87 career games with 38 career starts heading in to Friday's game. The senior is also shooting 40.5 percent from the floor, which is a career-best single season field goal percentage for her.

Memphis in the Piggly Wiggly Classic

Memphis is 36-6 all-time in the Piggly Wiggly Classic. Memphis fell in the championship game last year to Louisiana Tech, 82-77. The Tigers have won the tournament title 17 times and have appeared in the championship game 18 times in the 24 years of the tournament.

Thornton Grabs 500th Career Rebound

Senior forward Ashley Thornton passed a career milestone in the win over Ohio, grabbing five rebounds in the win, which pushed her past the 500 career rebound mark in just 66 career games. Thornton, who transferred to Memphis as a sophomore, now has 503 career rebounds and 617 career points. The Pinson, Ala., native is now one of just 16 players in school history to have over 500 career rebounds.

Lonlack Has Career Night in Ohio Victory

Freshman guard Ramses Lonlack scored a career-high 18 points on 7-for-12 shooting in the win over Ohio. The double-digit outing was the third of her five-game old college career.

Lonlack now ranks fifth in Conference USA in steals (2.6/game), 27th in scoring (10.0 ppg) and 9th in offensive rebounds (3.2/game).

The freshman showed no nerves in her first game-winning situation, going to the free-throw line to break a tie by hitting one of two free-throws to give Memphis a one-point lead with 41 seconds remaining. After getting the outlet off a defensive rebound by Jessica Jackson, Lonlack was fouled again and stepped to the line and hit another free-throw to push the Tigers in front 71-69, forcing Ohio to call their last time-out. But the break didn't ice the shooter, as Lonlack knocked down her second free-throw, with three seconds remaining, to ice the win for Memphis. The freshman was 3-for-4 from the line down the stretch, improving to 9-for-12 from the line for her five-game old career.

Jackson Grabs Big Defensive Board

Senior center Jessica Jackson came off the bench and struggled in the early going against Ohio, picking up three fouls in three minutes of play in the first half. But the Collierville native came up big down the stretch, grabbing a defensive rebound as Ohio missed the front end of a one-and-one. Jackson then outlet the ball to Ramses Lonlack, allowing Memphis to head back to the line and to pad a one-point lead to the final 72-69 score.

Ellis Makes First Career Start

Sophomore center Savannah Ellis made her first career start for the Tigers against

Ohio. She finished with six points, four rebounds and one blocked shot in 22 minutes of play.

Ellis now ranks 13th in Conference USA in blocked shots per game with 1.2/outing.

Fellow sophomore Alex Winchell also made her first start of the season against Ohio, but it was the point guard's 12th career start. Winchell finished with three points, three rebounds, three assists and one steal in 34 minutes of play.

3-0 at Home

The win over Ohio pushed Memphis to 3-2 on the season and to 3-0 in the Elma Roane Fieldhouse. The last time Memphis was 3-0 at home to start the season was 2004-05 when the Tigers defeated Mercer in their season opener, then downed Lipscomb. That Memphis team opened the season 4-0, all home games before falling at No. 14 Vanderbilt.

Banishing the Monster

Head Coach Melissa McFerrin referred to the Tigers' shooting woes in the first half at Ole Miss as a case of "being afraid of the invisible seven foot monster in the paint" as Ole Miss used a significant size advantage to hold Memphis to just 3-for-27 shooting in the first 17 of the opening 20 minutes. Memphis came out and was able to get out in transition and to finally start putting points on the board in the second half, including 24 points from Paris Leonard and 11 points from freshman Ramses Lonlack.

Senior Ashley Thornton had her double-double streak snapped at three games against Ole Miss, finishing with eight points and eight rebounds.

Double-Up

Ashley Thornton became the first player since Tamika Whitmore to have three consecutive double-doubles with her 14 points and 10 rebounds Tuesday night. Whitmore had four double-doubles from Jan. 8-Jan. 17, 1999. With her third double-double of the young season, Thornton now has 11 career double-doubles heading into the Ole Miss game.

Winchell Approaching 200 Point Mark

Sophomore guard Alex Winchell comes in to Friday's game against Wichita State just 16 points shy of her 200th career point. In 35 career games, Winchell is averaging 5.3 ppg and averaged 5.0 ppg last season. She has already become a more integral part of the Tiger offense, averaging 7.0 ppg this season. She has also improved her efficiency from the free-throw line, connecting on 7-of-8 attempts through the first five games (87.5) after shooting 45.8 percent from the line last season.

Ellis Powering Toward 100th Career Point

Savannah Ellis was scoreless in the loss at Ole Miss, not attempting a shot in the 21 minutes she played. Ellis has 97 points for her career and is now three points shy of her 100th career point. Getting the ball inside to the posts will be important to the Tiger offense, as Ellis is hitting 50.0 percent from the field this season, and connected on over 60 percent of her shots from the field last season.

Melissa McFerrin

*First Season at Memphis
Career: 53-72 (.424)*

Melissa McFerrin was named the University of Memphis women's basketball coach on April 19th, 2008, becoming the fourth coach in the program's modern history.

McFerrin, the 2008 Patriot League Coach of the Year,

spent the past four seasons at American University in Washington D.C. Her 2007 American team advanced to the Patriot League championship game and her 2008 squad won the school's first-ever Patriot League regular season championship, finishing with an 18-14 overall record. That team won 11 of 12 games down the stretch, advancing to the post season for the first time since 1997-98 with a WNIT bid. In four seasons at American, McFerrin compiled a 50-70 record and guided five different players to all-conference honors, while two other players earned all-freshman honors.

Prior to her stint with American, McFerrin was an associate head coach at the University of Minnesota from 2002-2004. She helped Minnesota to a 50-15 record, including an NCAA Final Four appearance in 2004 and a Sweet Sixteen berth in 2003. She signed two recruiting classes ranked in the top 20 at Minnesota, and helped guide two Kodak All-Americans, including WNBA player Lindsey Whalen.

McFerrin's time at Minnesota came after a five-year association with the WNBA. She began her affiliation with the WNBA as an assistant coach with the New York Liberty from 1997-1999, assisting with coaching duties for the 1997 WNBA Championship runner-up Liberty squad. She moved to the Washington Mystics as an assistant coach in 1999-2000, taking over as the Mystics' General Manager in 2000. As the GM, she guided a team that made its first-ever WNBA play-off appearance in 2000, and handled all player trades and draft decisions before joining the coaching staff at Minnesota.

Her WNBA stint followed a 14-year coaching career that made three different stops. McFerrin began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Wayland Baptist University in Texas from 1983-84. She was then hired as an assistant coach at Central Michigan University, where she helped the Chippewas to a 95-77 record in her six seasons, including a 1985 Mid-American Conference championship.

She left Central Michigan in 1990 to become an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at The Ohio State University. At Ohio State, she helped the Buckeyes to a 118-90 record and a 1993 Big Ten championship and an NCAA National Championship runner-up. That 1993 squad benefited from a 1992 McFerrin recruiting class that was ranked No. 1 in the nation, one of seven Buckeye recruiting classes to be nationally-ranked under McFerrin's watch at OSU. In 1996, McFerrin helped guide the Buckeyes to the NCAA Second Round before leaving the following season for the WNBA.

A native of Cassville, Mo., McFerrin was a four-year letterwinner and starting point guard for the University of Missouri Tigers from 1979 to 1983. She helped Missouri to a 1983 Big Eight tournament championship and NCAA tournament berth and a 1982 NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance, earning Big Eight honorable mention honors and Scholar-Athlete awards along the way. She graduated cum laude with a degree in secondary education from Missouri in 1983, and received her master's degree in physical education from Central Michigan in 1988.

reer double-double, finishing with 11 points and 11 rebounds. That marked the first time since the season opener in 2004-05 that Memphis has had two players get a double-double in the same game. Victoria Crawford and Raven Rogers were the last Tiger duo to have double-doubles in the same game in the season-opening win over Mercer.

Winchell Has Career Night

Sophomore point guard Alex Winchell also had a career night against Louisiana Tech, finishing with 14 points, surpassing her 12 point total against Belmont last season. Winchell was 5-for-6 from the free-throw line down the stretch, and was 4-for-5 from the field. The Atlanta native scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, including all five free-throws.

New Faces on the Sidelines

For just the fourth time since the women's basketball program was reinstated in 1972-73, the Tigers have a new face on the sideline. Melissa McFerrin was hired on April 18, 2008. McFerrin, who was the 2008 Patriot League Coach of the Year, brings a 50-70 overall record with her to the Tiger program.

She is the program's fourth head coach in the modern era. She hired an entirely new staff to join her on the sidelines. Danielle O'Banion joins the program after playing at Boston College and coaching a Final Four Minnesota squad. Tempie Brown, a former Big 10 honorable mention player at Michigan, joined the team after spending the past four seasons at Northwestern University in Chicago, while Michael Wholey was McFerrin's first hire at Memphis. Wholey was an assistant coach under McFerrin at American University last season. Tony Martin rounds out the new staff as the Director of Basketball Operations, after spending the past seven seasons working the AAA Memphis Redbirds team in operations.

Memphis was picked to finish 12th last season in the pre-season poll, and ended up finishing tied for sixth.

Total Team Effort

In the win over Northern Arizona, all 10 Memphis players scored and all 10 tracked down at least one rebound. The last time every Memphis player scored in a game was Feb. 24th of 2007 against Rice and the last time every Memphis player had a rebound was Mar. 2, 2006 against Marshall.

Memphis Gets a Tiger From Overseas

Aroha Jennings (2006-2008) was just the program's second native of New Zealand and capped her career among the top 40 in scoring, despite being here just two years. The international trend continues for Memphis as the team added its fifth-ever international player with the signing of freshman guard Ramses Lonlack. Lonlack had come to the U.S. from her native Cameroon and played 2 1/2 years of prep basketball before signing with the Tigers over the summer.

She is just the second player from the African continent for Memphis, following Nigeria's Charity Egenti (2002-2004). Lonlack played her prep ball in Massachusetts at Stoneleigh-Burnham School. There, she scored over 1,000 points in just 2 1/2 years, although she may draw Tiger fans' attention early for her defensive intensity.
