The Next Step

Coming off of a school-record 12-win season in 2005, head coach Brooks Monaghan and his squad are feeling very confident about their chances for another successful campaign in 2006. This season the Lady Tigers return 10 of 11 starters from last year's team. With a highly touted signing class and a new, aggressive game plan, Memphis looks ready to make a run at a Conference USA title and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance.

"We're really excited for the upcoming season," Monaghan said. "Our goal is definitely to win the conference tournament, and we feel that if we're clicking on all cylinders we have as good of a shot as anyone else."

One thing that the Lady Tigers will feature is a lot of depth. Memphis returns 17 of 24 letterwinners from the 2005 campaign. The squad will have also have a lot of youth with 11 returning sophomores and 12 talented newcomers all vying for playing time this fall.

"We have a lot of players that can come off the bench and give us support," Monaghan said. "If we have to go to the bench, we definitely feel comfortable doing that."

AN ELITE SCHEDULE

The Lady Tigers are set for another challenging season in 2006 with four NCAA Tournament qualifiers on the slate. A look at the NCAA teams with their 2005 record.

FORWARDS

Offensively, the Lady Tigers will be moving to a new 4-3-3 system. Monaghan looks for this attacking style to increase his team's goal production from 2005. The new offense should benefit from the leadership of talented senior Shoko Mikami, last season's Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year. Mikami returns to the center forward position to lead the attack.

"We feel like this alignment really suits our team," Monaghan said. "Shoko sees the field so well that we can run the offense through her, and the addition of Geneil Newbern on the outside should make our forward combination very tough to handle."

Newbern, a senior transfer from Georgia, should provide a jolt to the Lady Tigers' attack. As a freshman at Georgia, Newbern recorded 12 goals and six assists and was named All-Southeastern Conference honorable mention.

In addition to Mikami and Newbern, the Lady Tigers return sophomore forward

Kylie Hayes. Hayes made a serious impact as a freshman, scoring 14 goals and tallying 33 points. Her exceptional speed should continue to challenge opposing defenses.

Martin Methodist transfer Harumi Someya should add a lot of depth to the forward position, and freshmen Liza Welford and Leslie Walker have the potential to step in and play immediately.

MIDFIELDERS

Directing the action at center midfield will be senior Melissa Savage. The Arlington, Texas, native has played in every match for the Lady Tigers during her college career, starting all but five.

"Melissa is so versatile for us at the midfield," Monaghan said. "She dominates the center of the field. She has great maneuverability and ball-handling skills, and she is an aggressive defender."

Savage will be flanked by sophomores Laura Pfeffer and Emiko Schwab. Despite being a freshman Pfeffer played in every match in 2005. Schwab burst onto the scene offensively during the last three matches of the 2005 regular season, scoring four goals in that span.

Also look for sophomore Katy Booth and freshmen Tori Dalton, Laura Laufenberg, Roma Rozanska and Brittany Baldwin to make an impact in the midfield and compete for playing time.

DEFENDERS

Last year, Memphis set a school record and league-high mark for its defensive ef-

iciency. The Lady Tigers allowed just 1.19 goals per game, despite starting two freshmen and one sophomore in the backfield.

With the change in alignment, there will be added pressure on the defense this season. However, the Lady Tiger roster is stacked with defenders and the battle for playing time should be fierce. Several changes to the backfield should add quite a bit of athleticism to the defense, and an additional year of experience should give the needed maturity to keep opponents out of the net.

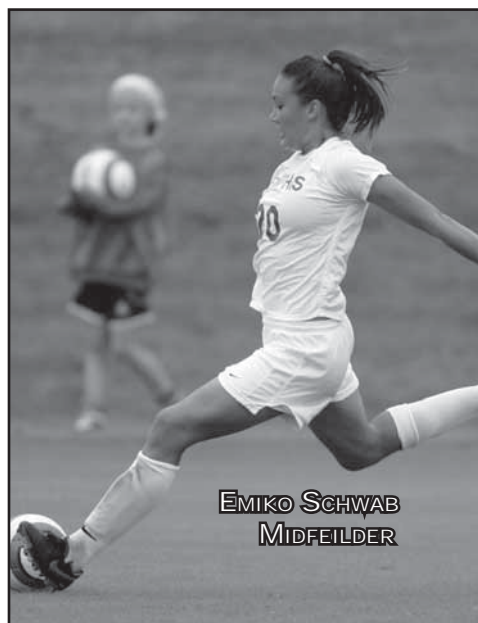
Senior team co-captain Nicky McLeod will move from her position at outside mid-field to defender, where she will replace departed seniors Courtnee Melton and Robyn Smart. Monaghan hopes that McLeod's leadership and experience will allow his squad to continue their stellar defensive play.

"Nicky's speed up and down the line should really help us out in the backfield," Monaghan said. "She's an excellent defender and her experience will make a difference."

Among those vying for time in the backfield is junior Caroline Barrett, sophomores Elaine Sedgewick, Kate Murphy, Halley Jo Sullivan, Lindsey Joseph, Maggie Leone and Chloe James and freshmen Lia Fannin. Murphy was another freshman who played extensively last season, appearing in all 19 matches and starting 17.

Transfer Maiko Higashiyama is another player with the talent to step up immediately. Higashiyama also comes from Martin Methodist and was an NAIA All-American in 2005.

Sophomore Alexandra Atkinson will look to resume her spot in the Lady Tigers' starting lineup after being one of only three players to start all 19 games last year.

GOALKEEPERS

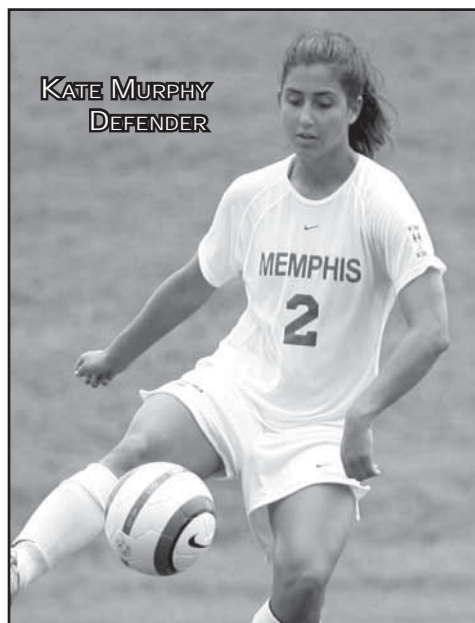

"Isabel continued to improve through the spring," Monaghan said. "After the way she performed last season, we feel confident that we can rely on her in goal this year."

SCHEDULE

In 2006, the Lady Tigers will face a tough slate of non-conference opponents. During the Lady Tiger Fall Tournament, Memphis will host SEC foe Alabama and 2005 NCAA Tournament participant Samford. The team will follow those matches up with a weekend road trip to Ole Miss and Mississippi State. Memphis will also host Arkansas at home on Sept. 17.

The Lady Tigers will open Conference USA play Sept. 29 at Mike Rose Stadium against East Carolina, followed by another home match versus Marshall on Oct. 1. After that, Memphis hits the road for two-consecutive weekends to face UCF, Southern Miss, Colorado College and 2005 conference powerhouse UTEP. The team will return home for big matches with Rice on Oct. 20 and Houston on Oct. 22, before closing the season Oct. 27 at 2004 C-USA champion UAB.

Brooks Monaghan has been a part of the University of Memphis women's soccer program since its inception in 1995 and has played a major role in its rise over the last six seasons. Now, entering his seventh year as a head coach, Monaghan has not only maintained the Lady Tiger program, but has substantially raised the bar of success.

Monaghan took the reins of the program in 2000 after serving for five years as an assistant coach for his predecessor, Les Szabo. Despite taking over a difficult situation, Monaghan has been able to slowly build the Lady Tiger soccer program into a winner.

Over the past two seasons, Monaghan has produced the most successful campaigns in program history, winning 11 matches in 2004 and 12 in 2005. Those years represent the first time Memphis women's soccer has ever posted back-to-back winning records.

Last year Monaghan became the longest tenured women's soccer coach in school history. Just the program's second coach, Monaghan surpassed Szabo in 2004 as Memphis' all-time winningest coach with his 35th career win.

Another indicator of Monaghan's success as a coach has been the numerous accolades awarded to his players. In six seasons, he has had 15 players receive All-Conference USA honors, including five first team recipients. Last season, junior Shoko Mikami was named the C-USA Offensive Player of the Year, making her the first Lady Tiger to re-

ceive a conference MVP award.

The Lady Tiger program has also flourished off the field during Monaghan's tenure. Since 2000, the team has never posted a composite grade-point average below 3.0. In the spring of 2006, 19 of 26 players finished the semester with a GPA above 3.0. Six Lady Tigers also made the Tiger Academic 30 for having one of the top 30 GPAs of any student athlete.

"The most important thing we can do as coaches is try to prepare young people for success later in life," Monaghan said. "Soccer is important to me, and I want to win. However, the foundation of our program is the student-athlete."

When Monaghan took over the program, he was already familiar with the demands of running a successful college soccer program, having enjoyed tremendous success during his playing career at Memphis. The former goalkeeper still holds school records for single-season shutouts (11) and career shutouts (24). He is second to Lady Tiger assistant coach Sebastian Vecchio in career goals-against average (1.40) and single-season goals-against average (0.80). His 298 career

saves rank second all-time. He was named first team All-Great Midwest Conference in 1992 after helping to lead the Tigers to a share of a conference title. In 1993, he was the Defensive MVP of the league's championship game, helping the Tigers to their first ever NCAA Tournament appearance. His 38 wins at goalkeeper still stand as the school record.

"Making the NCAA Tournament was such a great time for me as a player," Monaghan said. "That is the standard that I want reach as a coach and that I want my players to strive for."

"To be a part of Memphis from so many different angles - first as a player, then as an assistant and now as a head coach - has been wonderful. I grew up here and I've always loved the city and the school. Now I get to be a part of building a winning program at my alma mater and that's a dream come true."

A former prep standout at Christian Brothers High School in Memphis, Monaghan's collegiate play helped earn him a spot on the U.S. U-20 National Squad. Monaghan has also played professionally, spending two seasons with the New Orleans Gamblers from 1995-96 and the Memphis Express in 2002.

A Memphis native, Monaghan received a bachelor's degree in Business Management from Memphis in 1994. He is single and resides in Memphis.





Jodi GRANT

Assistant Coach - Sixth Season
University of Memphis - 1999

Keeping an assistant coach with the talent of Jodi Grant is almost impossible, and as with head coach Brooks Monaghan, Memphis has been fortunate enough to have Grant as a part of the women's soccer program since its inception.

"This program would not be where it is without Jodi," Monaghan said. "I look at her as a co-head coach. Jodie is irreplaceable and she deserves as much credit as I do for our success."

A native of Sherwood Park, Alberta, Canada, Grant is entering her sixth season as a full time assistant coach with the Lady Tigers. Prior to that, she served as a graduate assistant coach for one season and as a volunteer assistant coach the year before that.

Grant first came to the University of Memphis as a player on the inaugural Lady Tiger squad in 1995.

She played four seasons, and in 79 career games, compiled school records that still stand today for career goals (33), points (92) and shots (178). She also is the co-holder of the record for most assists in a game (4) and is second all-time in school history in assists in a season (11) and career (26). A third team All-Conference USA selection as a junior in 1997, Grant was also named to the C-USA All-Freshman Team in 1995.

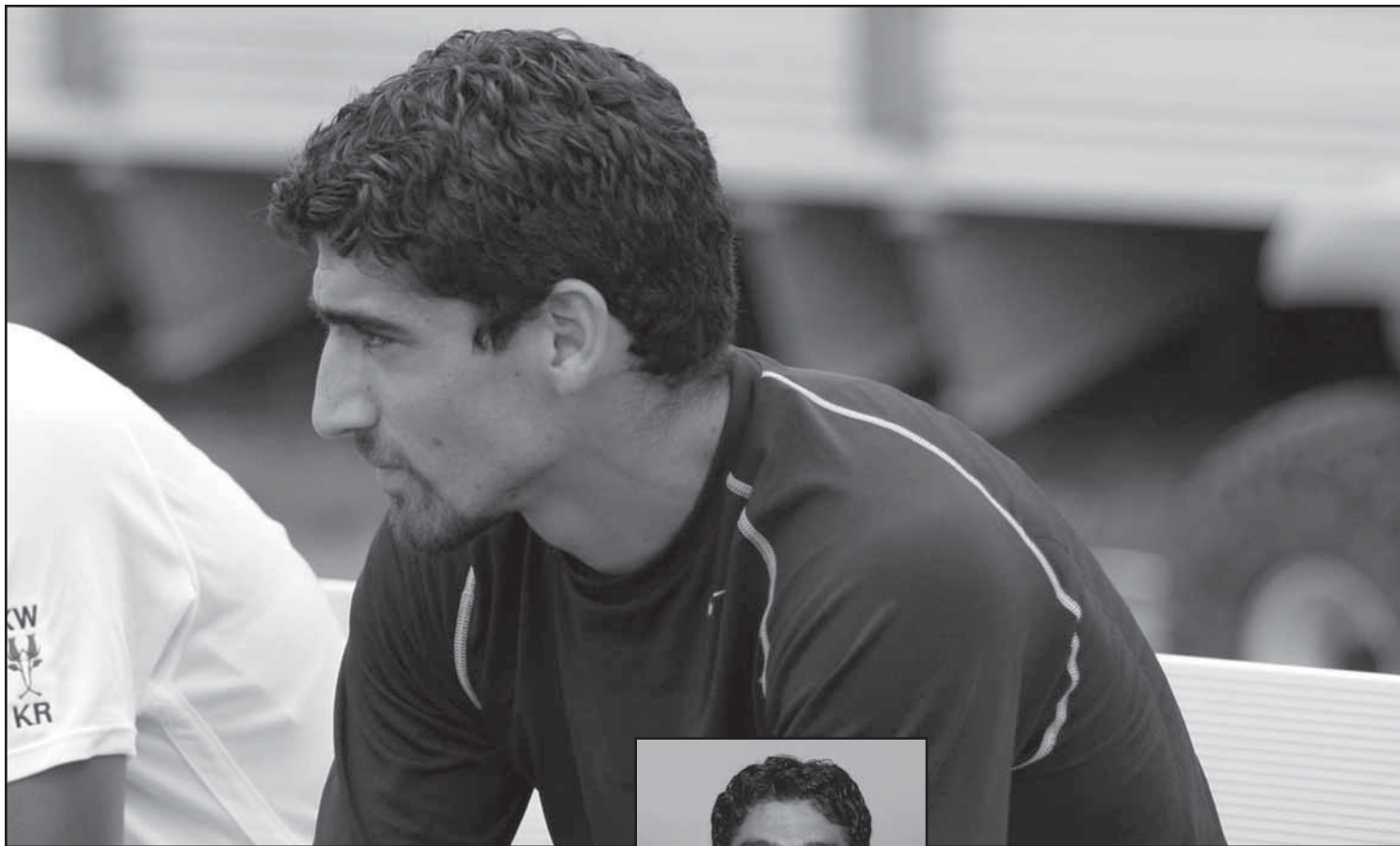
At the conclusion of her playing days, Grant spent one year as a volunteer assistant coach in 1999 and another as a graduate assistant coach in 2000, helping Monaghan in the transition from former head coach Les Szabo. She was named a full-time assistant coach prior to the 2001 season.

In addition to helping Monaghan with

on-field coaching duties and recruiting, Grant has also played an instrumental part in the Lady Tigers' success in the classroom. The last three seasons, Memphis was the recipient of the women's soccer team academic award from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, and last spring had 19 players finish with a grade-point average above 3.0. The Lady Tigers also had three players garner individual academic awards in 2005.

"Jodi is a great tactician on the field, but she's just as good in teaching the kids off the field," Monaghan said. "She is a great role model for all of the players and really understands where they are coming from."

Grant earned her undergraduate degree in Exercise and Sport Science from Memphis in 1999 and also earned a master's degree in Student Personnel Services from the university in 2002. Formerly Jodi Fisher, Grant married Memphis men's soccer head coach Richie Grant in May 2006. The couple resides in Memphis.



Sebastian VECCHIO
 Assistant Coach - Second Season

After completing his playing career with the Memphis men's soccer team in 2004, Sebastian Vecchio stepped over into the coaching ranks with the women's program, joining the Lady Tigers as an assistant coach in charge of goalkeepers.

In 2005, his first season with the women's team, Vecchio helped to mold sophomore goalkeeper Isabel Briones into one of

Conference USA's best netminders. Under Vecchio's tutelage, Briones was twice named Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week.

"Sebastian was a great addition to our staff last year," said head coach Brooks Monaghan. "He has already helped Isabel Briones take her game to the next level. He's a great coach in terms of teaching and fundamentals."

As a player, Vecchio was a two-year starter for the Tigers after transferring to Memphis from NAIA Mid-Continent College in Kentucky. He allowed just 12 goals in over 1,500 minutes of play during the 2004 season for a 0.69 goals-against average en route to being named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year and to the All-C-USA first team. The native of Buenos Aires, Argentina, ended his Tiger career with a 1.02 career goals-against average and 21 wins in two seasons. Prior to his collegiate playing days, Vecchio played with the Argentina U-16 National Team.

Vecchio earned his bachelor's degree in Marketing from Memphis in 2005. He is single and resides in Memphis.

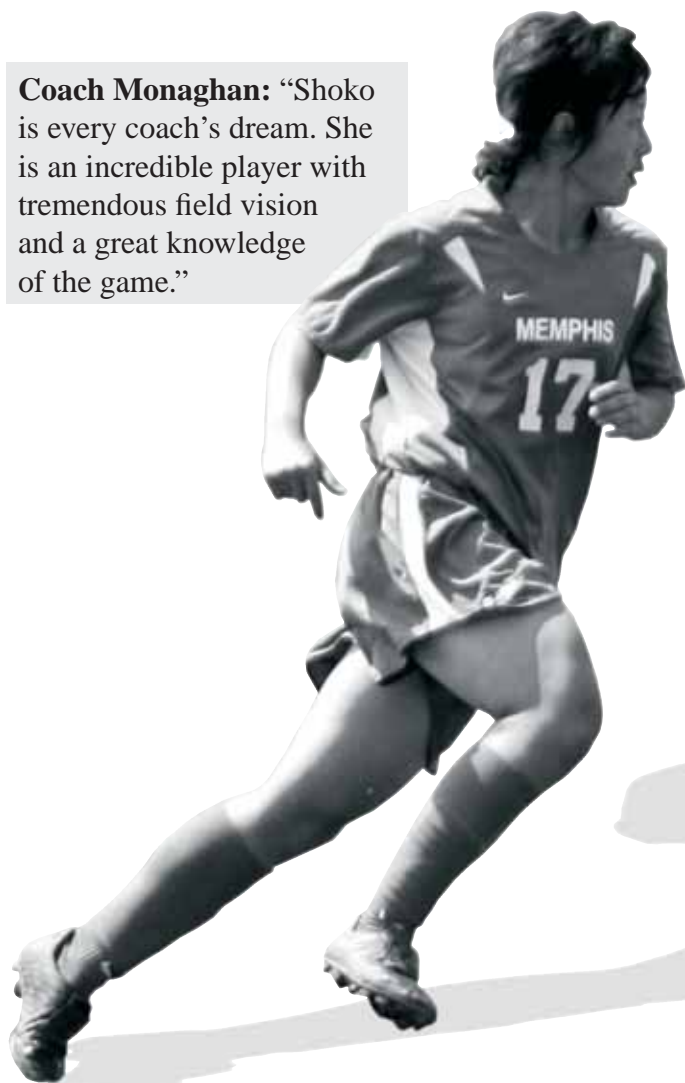

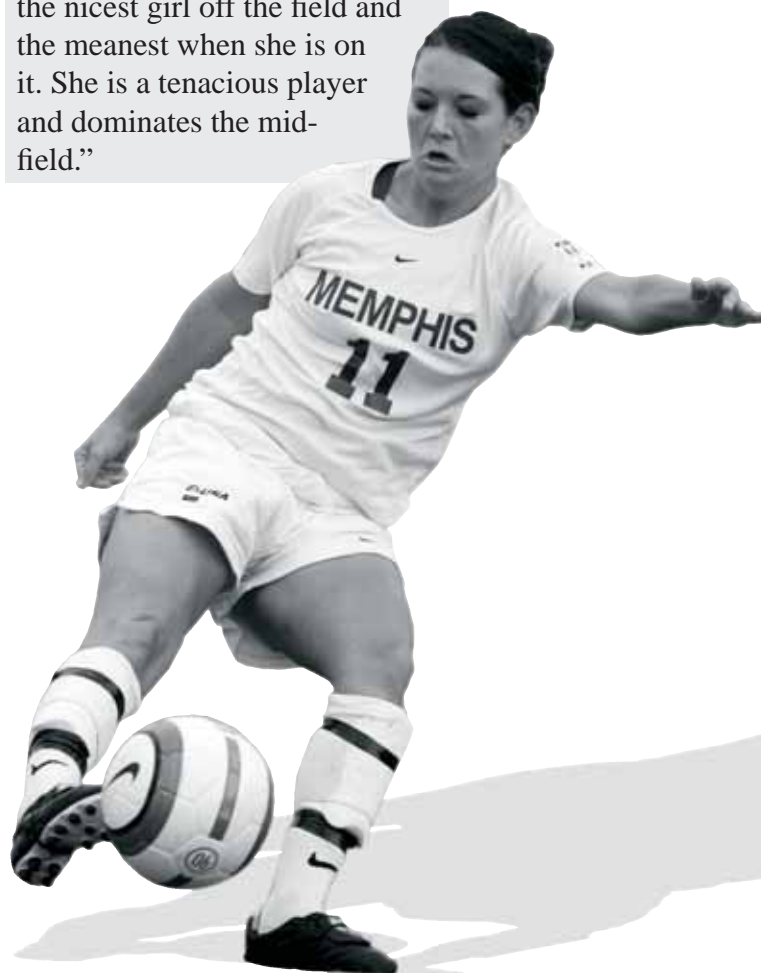

2006 SPRING REVIEW

One reason for the optimism surrounding the upcoming Memphis women's soccer season is the superb performance of the team during the 2006 spring schedule.

The Lady Tigers finished the spring 6-2-1, with their only losses coming 3-2 against 2005 NCAA Tournament participant Missouri and 1-0 to Peach Belt Conference champion Columbus State. Memphis rolled over rival Ole Miss 3-0 and tied Mississippi State 1-1. The team also looked dominant against the Region III and Georgia Olympic Developmental Program squads, winning both matches by a combined score of 9-1.

Along with a preview of next year's lineup, the Lady Tigers showcased their new 4-3-3 alignment and put together an offensive explosion. The new attacking system helped Memphis produce 25 goals over nine matches.

Led by proven team co-captain and reigning Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year Shoko Mikami, the Lady Tigers' front three posted impressive numbers.

Finishing second to Mikami, who had eight goals, Georgia transfer Geneil Newbern was as good as advertised. Newbern scored six goals,

while 2005 Conference USA All-Freshman Team player Kylie Hayes posted four scores.

"Overall, I'm pleased with what we accomplished this spring," Memphis head coach Brooks Monaghan said. "The team worked hard adjusting to a new style of play. They overcame their initial frustrations and gained a strong belief in our new system."

Monaghan was specifically pleased with the way his team was able to continue its defensive dominance while switching to a more aggressive system.

Last season, Memphis was second in Conference USA in defensive efficiency, allowing just 1.21 goals per game. During the spring season, the Lady Tigers clamped down even further, surrendering only seven scores and just .78 goals per contest. Even in its two losses Memphis gave up only three scores.

All of this success has left Monaghan anxiously awaiting the start of the 2006 campaign.

"We are excited for the fall," Monaghan said. "Our players have set high expectations for the season, and we are looking forward to it. We had the chance in the spring to play against several teams with different types of systems, and we've learned to adapt to the way we need to play to succeed in the fall."



Setting the standard

In 2005, the University of Memphis women's soccer team followed up on a successful 2004 campaign by posting a 12-7 record and reaching its second-consecutive Conference USA Tournament. The 2005 season marked the first time that the Lady Tigers recorded back-to-back winning seasons and will likely be viewed as a turning point in the history of the program.

"We really stepped up and met our expectations last season," said Memphis head coach Brooks Monaghan. "We set a goal to make the conference tournament and we did that."

Despite starting between five and seven underclassmen in every match, the Lady Tigers didn't show any signs of inexperience. In fact, the young players gelled into their roles almost immediately, and Memphis started the season by winning six of its first nine contests with two of the losses in that span coming against NCAA Tournament participants Ole Miss and Samford.

"I was really excited by the number of young players who stepped up and helped make it a successful season," said Monaghan.

Memphis continued its winning ways in conference play. The Lady Tigers won a school record six league games in route to a 6-3 conference mark. The team earned one

of its most impressive wins of the season, knocking off defending Conference USA champion UAB 1-0 at Mike Rose Stadium.

The Lady Tigers earned the No. 5 seed in the conference tournament and faced second-seeded UTEP. Memphis fell behind the Miners 5-0 before rallying at the 80 minute mark

to score four goals. Unfortunately, the deficit proved too much for coach Monaghan's squad, and the Lady Tigers were forced out of the C-USA Tournament in the quarterfinals for a second straight year.

"We really feel that our season ended too early," said Monaghan. "UTEP was a very good team, but hopefully next year we can fight for a higher seed."

As a team, Memphis had one of the highest scoring offenses in the country. Ranked in the nation's top 20 in goals per game through most of the season, the Lady Tigers broke

several school records for offensive production.

The team set records for goals in a season with 50 and points in a season with 157 and, its 52 assists came within one of tying the school record of 53. Memphis led Conference USA in assists per game at 2.74. Defensively, the Lady Tigers had arguably the best season in program history, tying a school record for goals against average with a 1.19.

Several Lady Tigers had standout individual seasons, and none made a bigger splash than junior Shoko Mikami. The Japanese native recovered from a knee injury that hampered her through much of the 2004 season and regained the form that saw her lead the nation in goals and points when she was a freshman at Christian Brothers University in 2003. Mikami became the focal point of the Lady Tiger offense and set a school record for points in a season with 42. She also tied the school record for assists with 12, and her 15 goals were the second-most ever scored by a Memphis player in one season. Mikami led the conference in goals, assists and points during the regular season. For her efforts, the Lady Tiger junior was named first team All-Conference USA and became the first Memphis player to ever receive the C-USA Offensive Player of the Year award.

Among the freshmen who performed well for Coach Monaghan in 2005 was forward Kylie Hays. Hayes, a multi-sport high school athlete, showed tremendous speed and athleticism on the attack.

The Ohio native ended her rookie campaign with 14 goals and 33 points, trailing only Mikami for the team lead in both categories. Hayes was named to the conference All-Freshman squad.

Sophomore Askuka Kubota earned second team All-Conference USA honors. A midfielder by trade, Kubota proved an excellent striker, finishing third on the team in goals with five and second to Mikami in assists with 17.

Goalkeeper Isabel Briones had a breakout season in 2005. The Lady Tiger sophomore tied the school record for shutouts in a season with six and surrendered just one goal in seven of the team's matches. Briones was named C-USA Player of the Week twice, with the first honor coming after recording a season-high nine saves in a 1-0 win over defending conference champion UAB. The Alabama native moved into the top-5 all-time Memphis leaders in victories, shutouts and saves.
