## International Students at the U of M

The University of Memphis is proud to have over 1,000 students from around the globe choose to make the University of Memphis their home away from home. International students wishing to learn more about the University of Memphis or even wishing to submit an on-line application can go to the International Student Office website at: <http://cipsweb.memphis.edu/iso/default.htm>. Some general information is included below for potential students' information.

The University of Memphis is authorized under Federal law to enroll nonimmigrant alien students on the F-1 student visa. Applicants must complete credentials before May 1 for fall admission; September 15 for spring admission; or Feb. 1 for summer admission.

### UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION

The international application (available at <http://www.enrollment.memphis.edu/Admissions/Applications/Ugrad/International/default.htm>) should be completed carefully and returned to the Office of Admissions, The University of Memphis, Memphis, TN 38152, U.S.A. Applications and fees received after the stated deadlines will be returned. A non-refundable international application and processing fee of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) is required of every international applicant, unless previously paid. A check or money order, made payable to The University of Memphis, must be sent with the application form. Applications received without the fee will be returned.

### REQUIREMENTS OF ALL INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

- ♦ **Educational Background:** List on the form provided in this packet every school you have attended, beginning with the time you entered primary school, to the present, including each primary, secondary, and post secondary institution.
- ♦ **Required Transcripts:** You must arrange for the Office of Admissions to receive official copies of your academic records from your attendance at secondary school, college, university, and professional institutions of learning. These transcripts must be sent directly from your high school or college to The University of Memphis. An exception is made for those who hold the bachelor's degree or its equivalent in that they need not send their secondary school records. Records should list the subjects studied and the grade, mark or other evidence that each individual subject was completed to the satisfaction of the authorities in charge. If it is impossible for the school to send us an official copy, certified copies by an official at the American Embassy or a known world organization may be acceptable. All records must be in English. Since certificates and records filed for examination are not ordinarily returned, you should send certified photostatic copies if the documents in question cannot be easily replaced.
- ♦ **Required Test of All Applicants:** All applicants whose native language is not English must supply results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or its equivalent. TOEFL information can be obtained by writing to TOEFL, Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey, 08541, U.S.A. **All test scores must be sent directly from the testing agency to The University of Memphis, institutional code 1459.** Scores must be less than two years old.
- ♦ **Financial Statement:** U.S. visa regulations require that certification of admission be based on both academic acceptance and satisfactory evidence of adequate funds to meet the expenses involved in the student's program of study. An applicant on an F-1 visa must supply the form provided by the university, sufficient evidence of financial support for themselves and members of their families who will accompany them to Memphis. This requires that applicant to certify that their intent is to attend the university full-time and no employment will be sought.
- ♦ **Required Photographs:** Applicants must send two recent passport sized photos of themselves to the Office of Admissions, The University of Memphis, Memphis, TN 38152, USA.
- ♦ **Health Certificate Required:** Each international student, within 30 days from the beginning of classes, must submit a certificate from a licensed U.S. physician or other qualified U.S. authority verifying freedom from tuberculosis. Failure to do so shall result in denial of enrollment. In the event that a student either has tuberculosis or has potential tuberculosis requiring treatment, continued enrollment will be conditional upon the determination by a licensed U.S. physician that such enrollment does not present a risk to others and upon the student's
- ♦ **Affidavit of Support,** sufficient evidence of financial support for the applicant and all members of his/her family who will accompany the applicant to Memphis. This requires that the applicant certify that his/her intent is to attend the University full-time and that no employment will be required.

## Lady Tiger Tennis

- ◆ Had the athletic department's highest team GPA in 2005-06 and were honored at a Tiger football game as the "Eye of the Tiger" for it.
- ◆ Had four players named to the Dean's List following the Fall 2006 semester -- Alex Tjioe and Christina Wieser and freshmen Marjorie Ondeck and Dara Toulch.
- ◆ Had the second-winningest singles player in Memphis history inducted into the MClub Hall of Fame when Christina Ladyman was inducted in 2005.
- ◆ Broke into the national rankings for the first time in program's history in 2003 following a win over then-No. 75 Georgia State.
- ◆ Has had a player earn an all-conference honor in seven of the last nine years. Marlene Dirnstorfer was a third-team All-Conference USA honoree in 2004.
- ◆ Marlene Dirnstorfer was named a Co-SIDA Academic All-District Honoree in the spring of 2004, the program's first Academic All-District Honoree. She repeated her second team honor in the spring of 2005.
- ◆ Had its first-ever nationally ranked doubles team at the beginning of the fall 2002 season. Seniors Sabrina Lindemann and Monica Gonzalez-Gordo were ranked No. 31 in the country in the ITA pre-season poll.
- ◆ Received team and individual academic honors from the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) in each of the past six seasons.
- ◆ Head Coach Charlotte Peterson got her 300th career win in 2001. She is just the second female coach in The University of Memphis history to have 300+ career wins.
- ◆ Senior Sabrina Lindemann earned ITA Southeast Regional awards when she earned the ITA Southeast Region Cissie Leary Sportsmanship Award in 2003
- ◆ Marlene Dirnstorfer shared the athletic department's top female student athlete academic award in the spring of 2005, sharing the M-Club Female Student-Athlete of the Year Award with volleyball player Heather Watts.

## Charlotte Peterson

### Head Coach

Charlotte Peterson is in her 32nd season at the helm of her alma mater coming in to the 2006-07 season. The longest-tenured women's coach in Lady Tiger history, Peterson is also just the second women's coach at Memphis to pass the 300-career win mark, bringing a 351-437 record into the upcoming season.

Peterson handles her coaching duties, as well as all her recruiting, travel planning and scheduling for the Lady Tiger tennis program. She also teaches tennis in the Memphis community and in the physical education department. Her work with tennis landed her a spot on the inaugural NCAA Division IA Tennis Committee for women and helped her get inducted in the Memphis Amateur Sports Hall of Fame in the Fall of 2005.

A native of Memphis, Peterson graduated from Kingsbury High School in 1967 and enrolled at then-Memphis State University, where she lettered for three years as a member of the Lady Tiger tennis team. She received her bachelor of science degree in biology in 1972 and her Master's degree in physical education in

1974. She began her coaching career as an assistant coach while working on her master's degree.

Peterson, who specialized as a doubles player, competed in state and local tournaments until the fall of 1995. She was ranked in both the state of Tennessee and the Southern States Region. In 1986, she won the Memphis City Senior Women's 35 singles title and was runner-up in the Women's 35 singles at the Mississippi Valley Seniors' Tournament.

She has had various articles published, including "Psychological Aspects of Coaching Tennis," which was published in the National Association of Girls and Women 1978-79 Tennis Guidebook: "Roadtrip Viewed From Coach's Eyes," Tennis Network, May 1987, and "Charging the Net Could Yield Results," Tennis Network, March 1987.

Peterson has directed local NTRP tennis tournament since 1983, as well as hosting the Lady Tiger Bass Fishing Tournament each spring, which benefits the women's tennis program and The University of Memphis. Each fall, Peterson

organizes the Varsity Pro Shop Tennis Invitational which features the region's top tennis programs in a double-elimination format held at the U of M HPER courts.

Petersen has also been an instructor at The University of Memphis All-Sports Camp from 1979-91, and in 1992, became the director of the U of M All-Sports Camp.

She is very active in church activities, which include working with youth and college career groups. She also gives tennis lessons to seniors in conjunction with members of the Memphis tennis community.

Coach Peterson is also the creator and director of the University of Memphis Bass Fishing Tournament which is held in April at Sardis Lake, Mississippi. This event has developed into a top tournament for local anglers, bringing in revenue for the women's tennis program at Memphis.

## Lee Taylor Walker

### Assistant Coach

Former Tiger tennis player Lee Taylor Walker is entering his third year as an assistant coach with the men's tennis program and his first year as an assistant with the women's program in 2006-07.

A three-year letterwinner for the Tiger tennis team from 2001-2004, Walker was named the program's first-ever All-Conference USA first team honoree following a senior season which saw him ranked as high as #48 in the country in singles. That same season, Walker led five newcomers to Memphis' first ever C-USA semifinal appearance. Walker capped his Tiger career with 54 singles wins and 64 doubles wins after coming to Memphis in his sophomore season

following his one year at Clemson. In Memphis, he teamed with Ben Stapp, and the duo became the first-ever Tiger doubles team to earn a national ranking, climbing as high as No. 12 in the country before Stapp graduated. In 2005, Walker was one of ten players selected to the C-USA All-Decade Team (1995-2005).

"LT's playing ability is very beneficial for the team. His work ethic sets a good example for all the players," Goebel said. "He was highly successful with our program both on and off the court."

Walker was selected by the ITA after his senior season (2003-04) as the men's tennis recipient of the ITA/Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship

and Leadership award, which he received in New York during the U.S. Open festivities. This award goes to a player who has exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and leadership as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements. He is the first Tiger to ever receive the national award that is given annually to one men's and one women's college tennis player for their accomplishments. That same year, Walker was also awarded the C-USA sportsmanship award.

While a student-athlete at Memphis, Walker helped re-form a chapter of the Fellowship for Christian Athletes (FCA), coordinating huddle meetings, visits to Streets Ministries

and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Lee currently works with Campus Outreach, a ministry on the University of Memphis campus devoted to helping students take their spiritual next step and serve the community.

"I want to help this university develop champions on the court and men and women of character off the court," said Walker. "I believe that success on the tennis court is achieved after the need for inner-growth is realized. Coaches throughout my life have helped me see this and now I want to assist our players in that growing process."

A native of Jackson, Tenn., Walker attended the University School of Jackson before playing one year of college tennis at Clemson. While at Clemson, he was an ACC Academic Honor Roll member. He was a two-time ITA Scholar-Athlete while at Memphis. Lee Taylor finished graduate school in December (2006), receiving his Master's Degree in Human Movement Sciences with a concentration in Sport & Leisure Commerce. Lee Taylor is engaged to Erin May Ferris, a former Lady Tiger soccer player. They plan to get married following the spring season.

## 2007 Lady Tiger Season Preview

The youth movement is on for the University of Memphis Lady Tiger tennis team in 2006-07. The roster for Head Coach Charlotte Peterson's 32nd season at Memphis consists of four freshmen, two sophomores and one senior.

Returning to the Lady Tigers from last year's 3-16 team are senior Christina Wieser and sophomores Flavia Russo and Ekin Zafir. Wieser tied for the team league with six singles wins during the dual season last season, but had off-season knee surgery, which forced her to miss the entire 2006 fall schedule.

Russo is back after playing in six singles matches and seven doubles matches as a freshman. During the fall, Russo was 3-6 in singles and was 2-3 in doubles when teamed with freshman Amanda Brown.

Also back after just one season of collegiate tennis is Zafir. Zafir played in all 19 matches last season, going 1-12 at No. 4 singles and 0-5 at No. 3 singles. Unless a couple of the freshmen emerge in the spring, Zafir will again have to play up in the line-up. In the fall, Zafir went 3-8 in singles and teamed with freshman Dara Toulch to go 2-4 in doubles play.

Outside of the returning three players, Memphis will be incredibly young up and down the line-up. Freshman Marjorie Ondeck will likely play toward the top of the singles line-up after

going 6-5 through the fall and picking up her first career singles title in the consolation draw of the Memphis Lady Tiger classic to close out the fall season. Ondeck also teamed with now-graduated Alex Tjioe at the top doubles spot, where the duo was 2-5.

Also possibly playing toward the top of the line-up will be Dara Toulch. Toulch was 3-6 in singles during the fall, but her previous international experience playing in the World Maccabiah Games should help her get ready for the spring dual season. Toulch teamed with Ekin Zafir during the fall in doubles, posting a 2-4 mark.

Amanda Brown also had a solid freshman fall season, finishing fifth at the Air Force Invitational in her bracket. Brown, who was 4-5 in singles during the fall, will also regularly see playing time in the line-up.

The unknown player for Memphis this spring will be Katie-Mary Outhwaite, who just joined the Lady Tigers in January after graduating from high school in her native Australia in December. Outhwaite will likely be slowly worked in to the line-up through doubles play first, but could see some singles action with just seven players on the roster.

The schedule features a lot of strong, regional action again for Memphis. The Lady Tigers will open the season at UALR, a team that Memphis

has faced home-and-home in each of the past five seasons. The Lady Tigers will then host a tough Murray State team to open the home schedule, before embarking on a four-game road swing that includes matches at Chattanooga and Tennessee Tech before taking on defending NAIA national champion Auburn-Montgomery on the road. The difficult road swing will close with Memphis' first conference game of the year, when the Lady Tigers play at UAB, Feb. 25th.

After a pair of home conference matches against Houston and Southern Miss, Memphis will embark on its longest road trip of the season with a seven-match road schedule. Memphis will play at New Mexico State before playing its first-ever dual match at UTEP, a C-USA member since last season. Memphis will then venture to Florida, where the Lady Tigers will face Stetson, Rollins and league-member UCF before returning to the Mid-South to play at Arkansas State and Southern Illinois.

Memphis will close out its season at home with the back half of the home-and-home with UALR, and three non-conference matches against McNeese State, Northwestern State and Morehead State before traveling to Tulsa, Okla., for the Conference USA women's championships.
