The University of Michigan baseball team makes the first of two straight trips to the Lone Star State as the Maize and Blue open the 2014 season at the Texas State Tournament in San Marcos, Texas. The Wolverines face host Texas State on Friday, Feb. 14 at 3:30 p.m. CST. Michigan then faces Washington right after at 7 p.m. CST. The Maize and Blue plays Air Force on Saturday, Feb. 15 at 6 p.m. CST and wraps up the tournament with a noon first pitch on Sunday, Feb. 16 against Washington. All four games will be video streamed on Texas State's website. Michigan is coming off a 29-27 season and a tie for fifth place finish in the Big Ten in 2013.

BAKICH GOING FOR 100TH WIN IN OPENING TOURNEY

-- Michigan's first win of 2014 will also be the 100th career win for head coach **Erik Bakich**. Bakich, who is in his second season as the Wolverines head coach, is in his fifth season as a head coach. The skipper coached three seasons at Maryland, winning 32 games in 2012 with the Terrapins. The Maize and Blue won 29 games last season, a seven-game improvement from 2012. The 14-10 conference record also was a six-game conference improvement from the prior season.

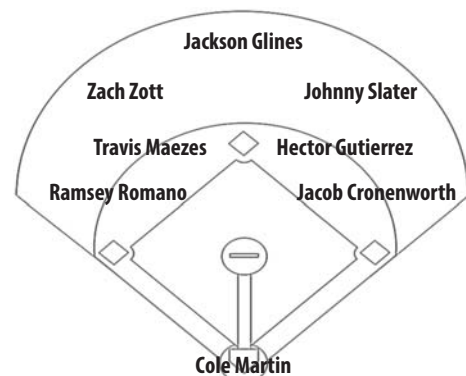

The 2014 Big Ten Baseball Tournament will be held May 21-25 at TD Ameritrade Field in Omaha, Neb. The tournament bracket is set to be announced on the evening of Saturday, May 17, which is the final scheduled day of regular-season competition.

WOLVERINE NOTES

SCOUTING TEXAS STATE -- The Bobcats return 21 letterwinners and six starters in the field from last year's 29-29 team that finished 16-11 in the WAC. Texas State moves to the Sun Belt Conference this season. **Garrett Matlage** returns to the lineup for Texas State. Matlage hit .320 with 13 doubles and 44 RBI. On the mound, **Lucas Humpal** was 5-2 with a 3.30 ERA in 25 appearances last year.

SCOUTING WASHINGTON -- The Huskies return 23 letterwinners and five position starters from last year's team that went 24-32 overall and 15-15 in the Pac-12 Conference. **Andrew Ely** returns for Washington in 2014. The infielder hit .338 with 14 RBI last season. On the mound, senior **Trevor Dunlap** with 4-3 with a 2.16 ERA and 52 strikeouts.

SCOUTING AIR FORCE -- The Falcons return 16 letterwinners and four starters in the field from last year's team that went 15-39 overall and 7-23 in the Mountain West Conference. **Seth Kline** returns to the lineup after hitting .356 with 16 doubles and 40 RBI last season. On the bump, **Cameron White** struck out 70 batters in 107 innings pitched in 2013.

U-M HITS THE ROAD FOR SEASON'S FIRST MONTH

-- The Michigan baseball team will play its first 24 games of the season on the road, starting with the Texas State Tournament in San Marcos, Texas. The Wolverines will travel 10,614 miles in five weeks, including the Spring Break trip to North Carolina and Florida, a trip to Charleston, S.C., and the Big Ten opener at Indiana. EARLY LIDLIFTER FOR U-M -- Michigan's Feb. 14 start in the season opener at Texas State is the earliest start in U-M baseball history. Last year, the Wolverines opened on Feb. 15 at California in Berkeley, Calif.

MICHIGAN ROTATION RETURNS FOR 2014

-- The Maize and Blue return every pitcher that started a game in the 2013 season into this year's rotation. Redshirt seniors **Logan McAnallen** and **Ben Ballantine**, juniors **Trent Szkutnik** and **James Bourque** and sophomore **Evan Hill** combined to start 54 of Michigan's 56 games last season while senior **Alex Lakatos** and junior **Matt Ogden** each started a contest in 2013. Bourque, Szkutnik, Ballantine and Hill are scheduled to start at the Texas State Tournament.

CRONENWORTH NAMED TO STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST -- **Jacob Cronenworth** has been named to the 10th annual Stopper of the Year watch list, the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association announced today (Tuesday, Feb. 11). The Stopper of the Year Award is given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Cronenworth is one of 50 Division I relievers named to the list. Last season, the St. Clair, Mich., native had a 1.93 earned-run average and seven saves in 15 appearances for the Maize and Blue.

YOUTH SERVED ON THE WOLVERINES

-- Thirteen newcomers dot the Michigan baseball rosters, including projected starters at second base (**Hector Gutierrez**), third base (**Ramsey Romano**), center field (**Jackson Glines**) and right field (**Johnny Slater**). Pitchers **Jackson Lamb**, **Keith Lehmann** and **Brett Adcock** headline freshmen who will be in the bullpen this week.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT MOVES TO AN EIGHT-TEAM FORMAT

-- The conference office announced that the Big Ten Baseball Tournament will feature an eight-team field for the first time in conference history, beginning with the 2014 event. The 2014 Big Ten Baseball Tournament will be held May 21-25 at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha, Neb., home of the College World Series.

The tournament's double-elimination format will culminate with a single championship game on Sunday, with the winner earning the tournament title and the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Championship. All eight teams will begin play in one of two brackets, with the No. 1, No. 4, No. 5 and No. 8 seeds appearing in one bracket and the No. 2, No. 3, No. 6 and No. 7 seeds appearing in the other bracket.

WOLVERINES PROMINENTLY LISTED IN MULTIPLE PREVIEWS

-- Baseball America came out with its 2014 Big Ten Conference preview along with the top-10 prospects for this year's draft and the top five for the 2015 draft. Junior **Trent Szkutnik** was named BA's 10th-best Big Ten prospect in the 2014 draft. Sophomore **Evan Hill** is the Big Ten's best 2015 prospect and the 49th-best sophomore in the country, according to the publication. Classmate **Travis Maezes** was named the third-best Big Ten prospect in the 2015 draft.

Maezes also was selected to the Preseason All-Big Ten team by Perfect Game USA. The website also had a prospect watch, as junior **James Bourque**, Szkutnik and junior **Matt Ogden** were named to the top 25 for the 2014 draft and Hill was on the top 10 in the 2015 prospect list.

The website CollegeBaseballInsider.com surveyed the head coaches in the Big Ten about the top players in the conference. Senior **Cole Martin** was named the Big Ten's best defensive catcher.

STADIUM UPGRADES COMPLETE AT WILPON COMPLEX

-- The Wilpon Complex/Fisher Stadium project is complete and ready for Michigan's home opener on Wednesday, March 26 against Western Michigan. Included in the upgrades is a brand-new synthetic playing surface, a new scoreboard/video board, an expansion of the home and visiting dugouts and a new nutrition lounge in the locker room.

Erik Bakich Head Coach

2nd Season at Michigan - 29-27 (5th Season as a Head Coach)

Erik Bakich completed his first season as head coach of the University of Michigan baseball program in 2013. Bakich was announced as the 19th head coach in the history of Michigan baseball on June 27.

In Bakich's first season in Ann Arbor, he guided the Maize and Blue to 29 wins and 14-10 record in the Big Ten, good for a tie for fifth place. That was a seven-game overall and a six-game conference improvement from 2012. Also, the Wolverines returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2010. Bakich coached three All-Big Ten honorees (Michael O'Neill - 1st, Jacob Cronenworth - 2nd, Cole Martin - 3rd) and four Academic All-Big Ten selections. O'Neill also was an ABCA All-Mideast Region first team selection and a third round pick by the New York Yankees in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. A trio of freshmen (Cronenworth, Travis Maezes and Evan Hill) earned Big Ten All-Freshman team honors and were Louisville Slugger Freshman All-Americans.

Bakich (pronounced back-itch) comes to Ann Arbor after spending three years as the head coach at the University of Maryland. He led the Terrapins to a 32-24 record in 2012, which was a 15-win improvement from his first season in College Park. Maryland started the season by taking 2-of-3 games at UCLA, which went on to earn a No. 2 national seed and a berth in the College World Series. The Terps also enjoyed wins over Purdue, East Carolina and St. John's in the non-conference slate and North Carolina, Virginia, Miami, N.C. State and Florida State in Atlantic Coast Conference action. Maryland had a 3.21 team earned-run average, which was third in the ACC. Bakich also had four players drafted from the 2012 team in this year's MLB First-Year Player Draft, including Alfredo Rodriguez, who was picked in the 17th round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

Bakich, who is currently the youngest head baseball coach at a BCS school, had an initial recruiting class at Maryland in 2010 that was ranked in the top 25 by Baseball America. That marked the first time the Terps had a ranked recruiting class. Bakich followed it up with a 2011 class that received accolades from a number of publications and a 2012 class that was ranked in the top 25 by Perfect Game USA. In the last 11 years, he has coached 77 players that have been selected in the MLB Draft, including 25 in the first five rounds and nine first-round picks.

Bakich also had a hand in several improvements to facilities at Maryland. Included in these improvements are a 5,000-square-foot indoor hitting and pitching facility that was built next to Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium, a new turf infield (added prior to the 2011 season) along with a brick backstop, a new outfield fence and warning track. A new scoreboard and upgrades to signage in the stadium and renovated locker rooms are other highlights of facility upgrades for Maryland's baseball program.

Bakich instituted the inaugural Maryland Baseball Leadoff Banquet in 2011, which featured keynote speaker Tommy Lasorda in its first season and Baltimore Orioles manager Buck Showalter in 2012.

Bakich was the assistant coach at Vanderbilt University from 2003-09, serving as the Commodores' recruiting coordinator as well as being the hitting coach and working with the outfielders. Under Bakich's assistance, Vanderbilt was 276-157 in his seven seasons in Nashville. That included a 54-win team in 2007 and two seasons of 40-plus wins (45 in 2004; 41 in 2008).

In his first year at Vandy, Bakich helped the Commodores reach the Southeastern Conference Tournament, something they had not done in eight years prior to his arrival. Vandy then advanced to a Super Regional in the 2004 season after winning the Charlottesville Regional.

While at Vanderbilt, Bakich recruited and coached David Price, who was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2007 draft and finished second in voting for the 2010 Cy Young Award as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays. Bakich also hauled in top-25 recruiting classes all seven years, including the top-ranked class in 2005 and the second-ranked class in 2008. From 2008-10, 22 Commodores that Bakich recruited were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft.

Bakich began his college coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Clemson in 2002. There, he worked with the Tigers' outfielders and infielders as well as assisted in Clemson's recruiting efforts. In Bakich's one season at Clemson, the Tigers went 54-17 and advanced to the College World Series.

Bakich had a successful career as a player prior to his coaching career. After transferring from San Jose City College in California, Bakich was a standout for East Carolina in 1999 and 2000. While there, the Pirates won back-to-back Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) championships and earned number-one seeds at NCAA Regionals both years. Bakich was named to the All-Baton Rouge Regional team as a third baseman after earning unanimous all-tournament honors at the Bell South Hurricane Classic in Miami, Fla., earlier in the 1999 season.

He finished his playing career at ECU with a .315 batting average, 14 home runs and 85 RBI. Bakich graduated from East Carolina in 2000 with a degree in exercise and sports science. Upon graduation, Bakich played professionally in the Independent Professional Baseball League until 2001. At the conclusion of his playing career, Bakich returned to East Carolina, where he served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach for one year.

Bakich and his wife, Jiffy, have two sons, Colt and Beau.
