DID YOU KNOW?

- Michigan leads the all-time series with Purdue, 43-14.
- QB Denard Robinson is 5th in Michigan history with 46 TD passes and tied for 4th with 39 TD runs. Robinson ranks 5th in school history in passing yards (5,768) and 7th in rushing yards (3,670).
- Against Notre Dame on Sept. 22, Robinson moved into first place in U-M history in career total offensive yardage (9,438), surpassing previous record holder Chad Henne (9,400, 2004-07).
- Robinson has broken off a 20+-yard run 35 times in his career.
- Robinson is the first player in FBS history to have at least 200 yards rushing and 200 passing in three career games, according to the NCAA record book.
- Robinson owns the top eight single-game total offense totals in U-M history.
- Strong safety Jordan Kovacs needs four tackles to become only the 15th player in U-M history to record 300 career tackles.
- Punter Will Hagerup leads the Big Ten in average per punt (49.0).
- U-M is 13-0 under head coach Brady Hoke when scoring 20 or more points. The Wolverines are 0-4 under Hoke when scoring less than 20 points.

RADIO COVERAGE

The Michigan Football Radio Network is comprised of 41 affiliates in addition to Armed Services Radio and SiriusXM (channels 94 and 201). Frank Beckmann handles play-by-play with Jim Brandstatter serving as the color analyst. Doug Karsch provides sideline reports.

WOLVERINES AND THE BOILERMAKERS

This will be the 58th meeting between Michigan and Purdue. U-M leads the all-time series 43-14. The Wolverines are 20-5 in the last 25 meetings between the two programs. Michigan holds a 15-9 advantage in West Lafayette, including a 12-7 mark at Ross-Ade Stadium.

ROBINSON CONTINUES TO CLIMB ALL-TIME LISTS

Denard Robinson continues to move up the NCAA and Michigan record books. Heading into this week's game with Purdue, Robinson is one rushing touchdown shy of becoming only the eighth player in NCAA history to rush for 40 touchdowns and pass for 40 touchdowns. After amassing 90 rushing yards against Notre Dame, Robinson (3,670 yards) moved into a tie for fifth place among the all-time NCAA leaders in rushing yards by a quarterback, matching Kent State's Joshua Cribbs (3,670, 2001-04). Against the Fighting Irish, Robinson moved into first place in U-M history in career total offensive yardage (9,438), surpassing previous record holder Chad Henne (9,400, 2004-07). With 5,768 career passing yards, Robinson remains in fifth place among Michigan's all-time leaders in the category. He needs 90 more yards to reach the fourth spot, currently held by Todd Collins (5,858, 1991-94).

MICHIGAN AFTER THE BYE WEEK

Michigan has won eight of its last nine games following the bye week. U-M posted a 36-14 home victory over Purdue last season following the bye.

THE LAST TIME VS. PURDUE ...

• Running back Fitzgerald Toussaint and the U-M football team entertained the Homecoming crowd with a 36-14 rout over the Purdue Boilermakers on Saturday, Oct. 29, 2011, at Michigan Stadium. Toussaint set career highs for carries (20) and rushing yards (170) and matched his career high with two touchdown runs. It was the second time in Toussaint's career he has eclipsed the 100-yard threshold.

• The Wolverines outgained the Boilermakers 535-311 and possessed the ball for 36:25. Quarterback Denard Robinson and running back Michael Shaw each added rushing touchdowns while running for 63 and 56 yards, respectively. Robinson also completed 9-of-14 throws for 170 yards, while wide receiver Jeremy Gallon hauled in a team-high three catches for a career-high 79 yards.

BRADY HOKE AGAINST PURDUE

• Saturday will mark Brady Hoke's fourth contest against Purdue as a head coach. Hoke is 1-2 vs. Purdue. He went 0-2 against the Boilermakers while head coach at Ball State, and recorded a 36-14 victory over Purdue last season at Michigna Stadium.

LAST GAME ...

Unable to overcome five first-half turnovers, the University of Michigan football team (No. 18 AP/No. 17 USA Today Coaches) fell to the Notre Dame Fighting Irish (No. 11 AP/No. 15 USA Today Coaches), 13-6, on Sept. 22, 2012, at Notre Dame Stadium. The Maize and Blue cut the Notre Dame lead to a touchdown late in the contest but could not halt the Fighting Irish offense on their final drive as time expired.

The Michigan defense held strong throughout the game, allowing just 239 total yards and only 13 points for the second consecutive week. Fifth-year senior safety Jordan Kovacs and sophomore linebacker Desmond Morgan led the way with seven tackles. Senior/junior safety Thomas Gordon also added six takedowns and an interception.

Senior quarterback Denard Robinson led the U-M offense with 138 yards through the air

and 90 on the ground, allowing him to surpass Chad Henne (9,400, 2004-07) as the career yardage leader at Michigan (9,438). Meanwhile, fifth-year senior Roy Roundtree, senior/junior Jeremy Gallon and junior Devin Gardner each hauled in three passes.

WOLVERINES FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2012

Ten of Michigan's 12 2012 regular-season opponents received bowl bids in 2011, while compiling an 80-51 record (.611 winning percentage). The Wolverines face five of those opponents on the road, including three in prime-time (Alabama, at Notre Dame, at Nebraska).

2012 CAPTAINS

U-M has totaled over 150 yards rushing in its last three games, including a season-best 294 against Massachusetts (Sept. 15). Michigan also totaled 214 yards rushing vs. Air Force and 161 yards vs. Notre Dame.

Denard Robinson ranks third in the Big Ten and is tied for 16th in the nation in rushing, averaging 110.3 yards per game.

Robinson leads the Big Ten in total offense, averaging 319.5 yards per game in 2012.

• QB/WR Devin Gardner has become one of Denard Robinson's top targets. The 6-4 junior leads U-M with 11 catches for 195 yards and three TDs. Gardner caught a TD pass in each of the Wolverines' first three games, including 44-and-42-yarders.

• Freshman tight end Devin Funchess registered four catches for 106 receiving yards in Michigan's 31-25 victory over Air Force on Sept. 8. For his efforts, he became the ninth Wolverine freshman to register a 100-yard receiving game and the first since Roy Roundtree posted 126 yards vs. Purdue on Nov. 7, 2009. He is also the first U-M tight end to surpass 100 yards since Jerame Tuman recorded 126 against Colorado in 1997.

• The first five catches of Funchess' career were all for 20 yards or more, while the first six all converted first downs.

• Through four games, Funchess ranks third on the team in receiving yards per game (37.8 avg.).

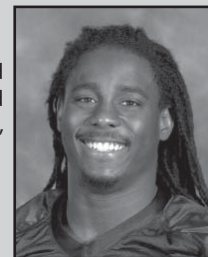

• Quarterback Denard Robinson and running back Fitzgerald Toussaint became U-M's first pair of 1,000-yard rushers since 1975 by each surpassing the mark in the win over Ohio State last season. Robinson finished with 1,176 yards in 2011, while Toussaint gained 1,041. Gordon Bell (1,388) and Rob Lytle (1,030) achieved the feat 36 years ago.

• Robinson and Fitzgerald were the only pair of teammates in the FBS last season to each amass over 1,000 yards on the ground.

• Senior/junior running back Fitz Toussaint has 1,278 career rushing yards, 1,011 of which came in 2011.

• Senior running back Vincent Smith ranks 41st in career rushing.

Brady Hoke was named the 19th head coach in University of Michigan football history on Jan. 11, 2011. A former assistant coach at U-M (1995-2002), Hoke led the Wolverines to an 11-2 record (6-2 Big Ten) and Allstate Sugar Bowl victory in his first season. Hoke had previous head coaching stints at San Diego State from 2009-10, where he earned a 13-12 record, and his alma mater, Ball State, where he went 34-38 from 2003-08. Collectively, Hoke is 58-52 in nine seasons as a head coach.

Hoke's first-season success in Ann Arbor was acknowledged across the country. He was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual. The Big Ten Conference's coaches voted Hoke as the inaugural recipient of the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award, while the Big Ten media named him the Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

Michigan's offense averaged 33.3 points per game, which ranked second in the Big Ten, while U-M's defense allowed 17.4 points per game, good for second in the league. Four Wolverines earned All-Big Ten distinction in 2011, highlighted by center David Molk, who was named the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the conference. Molk also was named the 2011 Rimington Trophy recipient and earned Consensus All-America honors, being named first-team All-America by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Sporting News and Associated Press.

With four wins more than the 2010 squad (7-6), Hoke and the Wolverines tied Fielding Yost's 1901 team as the only two teams with a four-win improvement from the previous season. Yost's 1901 team went 11-0 following a 7-2-1 1900 season.

Only the legendary Yost precedes Hoke as a Michigan head coach to win 10 games in his first season. Hoke also became the fifth Big Ten coach to win at least 10 games in his first season as head coach, joining Wisconsin's Bret Bielema (12-1, 2006), Ohio State's Earle Bruce (11-1, 1979), Yost (11-0, 1901) and Minnesota's Henry Williams (10-0-2, 1900). Since 1901, Hoke is the third U-M coach to win his first six games (Fielding Yost-1901, Bennie

Oosterbaan-1948). Nationally, Hoke became one of eight coaches to direct a team to a BCS bowl in his first season, while he became the third coach (and is now one of four coaches) to direct a team to a BCS bowl victory in his first season.

The 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, Hoke guided the Aztecs to a 9-4 record, marking the most victories since 1996 (8) while earning the program's first trip to a bowl game in 12 years, a 35-14 victory over Navy. Six of his players earned All-MWC first team in 2010, including running back Ronnie Hillman, the league's Freshman of the Year. Seven additional players earned second-team (4) honors and honorable mention (3). In 2009, Hoke's first season at San Diego State, five players were named to All-MWC teams, while 11 were MWC All-Academic selections.

As head coach at Ball State, he mentored players to 35 All-MAC selections in six years en route to a pair of bowl game appearances in 2007 and '08. The 2008 season marked the best season in program history, recording a school-record 12 wins and completing an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular-season campaign.

Collectively, Hoke has 29 years of collegiate coaching experience beginning with assistant positions at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94) and Michigan (1995-2002). A defensive line coach at U-M, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, '98, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl winning squad. During his tenure, U-M posted a 76-23 overall record, claiming at least 10 victories on four occasions.

A 1982 graduate of Ball State University, Hoke earned four letters (1977-80) with the Cardinals. He was part of the only two teams in Ball State football history to post undefeated conference seasons: as a player in 1978, and as the head coach in 2008. Hoke led Ball State to the 1978 MAC championship, and as a team captain in 1980 earned All-MAC second-team honors. He graduated from Fairmont East High School in Kettering, Ohio, in 1977.

He and his wife, the former Laura Homberger, have one daughter, Kelly.

The football program is in its 86th season in the "Big House" in 2012, with a 394-120-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has increased nine times to its present 109,901. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 37 times in the past 38 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 114,804 fans against Notre Dame in the first night game ever in Michigan Stadium in 2011. The previous mark was 113,090 fans against Connecticut during the 2010 rededication of Michigan Stadium.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 240 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan.

The Wolverines drew 897,431 fans for their eight-game home schedule in 2011. The eight-game average of 112,179 broke Michigan's NCAA record of 111,825 fans per contest set during the 2010 season.

Michigan Stadium was the only college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones. It was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

CAPACITY: 109,901 -- the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

COMPLETION: 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- Michigan defeated Connecticut, 30-10.

ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 44,724,811 fans have watched the Wolverines play 529 games. Stadium attendance record of 106,982 set Nov. 22, 1997 against Ohio State. Since expansion of the "Big House" in 1998, and the rededication in 2010, the single-game attendance record is 114,804 set against Notre Dame on Sept. 10, 2011. The NCAA season record of 897,431 set in 2011.

FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 37 of the past 38 seasons in attendance.

ARLINGTON, Texas -- The eighth-ranked University of Michigan football team was unable to overcome a 31-point first-half deficit, falling 41-14 to the second-ranked University of Alabama in the 2012 Cowboys Classic held Saturday evening (Sept. 1) at Cowboys Stadium. The announced crowd of 90,413 fans was the largest for a collegiate game in Cowboys Stadium history.

Senior co-captain and quarterback Denard Robinson (Deerfield, Fla./Deerfield Beach HS) completed 11-of-26 passes for 200 yards and tossed one touchdown. He added 27 rushing yards on 10 carries and scored the team's first points on a six-yard TD run.

Senior/junior wide receiver Jeremy Gallon (Apopka, Fla./Apopka HS) caught four passes for a career-best 107 yards in the contest, including a 71-yard career-long catch on Michigan's first scoring drive of 2012. It was Gallon's first career 100-yard receiving game.

Senior/junior safety Thomas Gordon (Detroit, Mich./Cass Technical HS) led the defensive effort, tying a career high with nine tackles and adding a forced fumble. Senior co-captain and safety Jordan Kovacs (Curtice, Ohio/Clay HS) chipped in eight stops and one tackle for loss.

The Crimson Tide scored touchdowns on three consecutive first-quarter possessions to open up a 21-0 lead on the Wolverines. Quarterback A.J. McCarron tossed a pair of touchdown passes on the first two scoring drives, finding tight end Michael Williams for a two-yard touchdown and DeAndrew White for a 51-yard score. Alabama reached the end zone for the third time as Eddie Lacy ran nine yards over left tackle at 1:42 of the opening stanza.

Alabama added to its lead with 10 points in the second quarter. Kicker Jeremy Shelley connected on a 22-yard field goal at 9:53, and linebacker C.J. Mosley intercepted a third-down pass from Robinson and returned it 16 yards for the touchdown at 4:25.

Michigan chipped into the deficit as Robinson kept the ball and ran six yards behind the left side across the goal line. The Wolverines reached Crimson Tide territory as Robinson tossed a perfect strike to Gallon that covered 71 yards to the Alabama one-yard line. The

Wolverines were called for too many men in the huddle on first down, moving the ball back to the six-yard line. Robinson scored his 36th career rushing touchdown on the first-down play following the penalty. The three-play, 75-yard drive took 2:05.

Alabama increased its lead to 34-7 with a 51-yard field goal by kicker Cade Foster at 2:34 of the third quarter.

The Wolverines continued to fight back as Robinson threw a 44-yard touchdown pass to junior wide receiver Devin Gardner (Detroit, Mich./Inkster HS) with 14 seconds left in the third quarter. The receiving touchdown was the first of Gardner's career and just his second reception. The five-play, 86-yard drive took 2:20.

Alabama running back T.J. Yeldon added a one-yard rushing touchdown with 5:32 remaining to put the Crimson Tide ahead by the game's final score, 41-14.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Senior quarterback Denard Robinson (Deerfield Beach, Fla./Deerfield Beach) threw for two touchdowns and ran for two more scores, from 79 and 58 yards out, as the University of Michigan football team (No. 19 AP/No. 19 USA Today Coaches) escaped Air Force, 31-25, on Saturday (Sept. 8) at Michigan Stadium. Michigan thwarted Air Force on its final offensive possession late in the fourth quarter to pick up its first win of the season.

With the win, Michigan improves to 2-0 against the Falcons all-time and claims its 110th victory in home openers.

Robinson amassed 208 yards passing and 218 rushing, along with four total scores (two rush, two pass) -- the sixth game he has tallied two or more touchdowns both with his arm and legs.

Freshman tight end Devin Funchess (Farmington Hills, Mich./Harrison) led the receiving core with 106 yards, becoming only the ninth freshman in school history to have a 100-yard receiving game, which included a 30-yard touchdown reception.

Michigan's defense was led by junior/sophomore linebacker Jake Ryan (Westlake, Ohio/St. Ignatius) and freshman linebacker Joe Bolden (Cincinnati, Ohio/Colerain), who each compiled a career high in tackles with 11 and 10, respectively.

Air Force received the ball to begin the game, using the first 5:33 but missed a field goal attempt from 36 yards out to turn the ball over to the Wolverines. Two plays later, Robinson took a designed draw up the middle and sprinted 79 yards to give the Wolverines a 7-0 lead. The score was the second rushing touchdown of the season for Robinson and the 18th-longest rushing touchdown in Michigan history.

On the ensuing Falcons possession, Air Force drove 71 yards, capping the drive with a 22-yard field goal to make the score 7-3.

With 7:34 left in the first half, Robinson connected with Funchess for a 30-yard touchdown, extending the Michigan lead to 14-3. The score marked the first in Funchess' collegiate career and the second passing touch-

down on the season for Robinson.

Capitalizing on a Robinson interception late in the first half, the Falcons marched 55 yards downfield to score their first touchdown of the game. Senior running back Cody Getz took an option pitch and scooted five yards around the left side to bring Air Force within four points heading into the locker room, 14-10.

Repeating his first-half success, Robinson took the first snap of the second half and dashed 58 yards to the end zone to give the Maize and Blue a 21-10 lead.

Getz took a fourth-and-goal sweep and dashed for his second touchdown of the game with 9:50 left in the third quarter, closing the gap between the two teams to 21-17.

Late in the third quarter, Robinson connected with junior receiver Devin Gardner (Detroit, Mich./Inkster) for a seven-yard score, the second receiving touchdown of the season for Gardner.

To start the fourth quarter, Getz raced into the end zone for the third time on the day for an eight-yard score. After the addition of a two-point conversion, the Falcons clawed back to within three, 28-25.

Midway through the fourth quarter, senior/junior kicker Brendan Gibbons (West Palm Beach, Fla./Cardinal Newman) knocked through a 31-yard field goal -- his first of the season -- to give the Maize and Blue a 31-25 lead.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- The University of Michigan football team (No. 17 AP/No. 18 USA Today Coaches) used a balanced attack, earning touchdowns from eight different players, en route to a 63-13 victory over Massachusetts Saturday (Sept. 15) at Michigan Stadium.

Senior quarterback Denard Robinson (Deerfield Beach, Fla./Deerfield Beach) compiled 291 yards passing and 106 yards rushing. For the second consecutive game, Robinson totaled four touchdowns -- three through the air and one on the ground. Robinson also accounted for 366 total yards in the first half, a career best.

Senior/junior running back Fitzgerald Toussaint (Youngstown, Ohio/Liberty) added 85 yards and a score on the ground, while junior receiver Drew Dileo (Greenwell Springs, La./Parkview Baptist) led the aerial attack with 91 yards on three catches.

The Michigan defense allowed only 259 total yards and surrendered just 13 points. Senior linebacker Brandin Hawthorne (Pahokee, Fla./Pahokee) posted seven tackles, while senior/junior safeties Jordan Kovacs (Curtice, Ohio/Clay) and Thomas Gordon (Detroit, Mich./Cass Tech) each tallied six.

Michigan moved 65 yards down the field on the opening drive, ending with a 26-yard touchdown pass from Robinson to freshman tight end Devin Funchess (Farmington Hills, Mich./Harrison HS), his second in as many games.

The Maize and Blue continued its success on the second drive as Toussaint scored on an 11-yard run to cap an eight-play, 45-yard drive, extending the Wolverines lead to 14-0.

UMass got on the board early in the second quarter when Brendon Levensgood connected on a 25-yard field goal, making the score 14-3.

On the ensuing Michigan possession, Dileo caught a pass from Robinson for 66 yards, taking the Maize and Blue to the Minutemen five yard-line. Senior running back Vincent Smith (Pahokee, Fla./Pahokee) took the ball up the middle on the following play to score his first touchdown of the season.

With 9:49 left in the first half, Robinson threw an interception to Christian Birt, who ran the ball in from 32 yards out to narrow the Michigan lead to 21-10. However, the Wolverines got the ball back and marched 75 yards down the field, capping the drive with a 42-yard touchdown pass from Robinson to junior receiver Devin Gardner (Detroit, Mich./Inkster), marking his third score on the season.

After forcing the Minutemen to a three-and-out, Robinson scrambled to the left, then cut back across the field 36 yards for his fourth rushing touchdown in three games, making the Michigan lead 35-10.

Approaching the two-minute mark in the half, UMass moved the ball down the field with help from a flea-flicker and Levensgood connected on his second field goal of the game, making the score 35-13.

With 19 seconds left in the first half, Robinson fumbled the ball on a one-yard rushing attempt, but senior/junior tackle Taylor Lewan (Scottsdale, Ariz./Chaparral) pounced on the ball in the end zone to give the Wolverines a 42-13 halftime lead.

Fifth-year senior receiver Roy Roundtree (Trotwood, Ohio/Trotwood-Madison) started the scoring for Michigan in the second half, hauling in an 18-yard touchdown reception from Robinson on the first possession to extend the Wolverines' lead to 49-13. The score was the first of the season for Roundtree.

One drive later, the Wolverines stormed down the field once again behind a balanced rushing attack, ending with Smith's second touchdown of the game from nine yards out, giving Michigan a 56-13 lead.

Midway through the fourth quarter, sophomore/freshman running back Justice Hayes (Flint, Mich./Grand Blanc Community) joined the scoring with a one-yard touchdown run -- the first of his career -- to extend the Maize and Blue lead to 63-13.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. -- Unable to overcome five first-half turnovers, the University of Michigan football team (No. 18 AP/No. 17 USA Today Coaches) fell to the Notre Dame Fighting Irish (No. 11 AP/No. 15 USA Today Coaches), 13-6, on Saturday night (Sept. 22) at Notre Dame Stadium. The Maize and Blue cut the Notre Dame lead to a touchdown late in the contest but could not halt the Fighting Irish offense on their final drive as time expired.

The Michigan defense held strong throughout the game, allowing just 239 total yards and only 13 points for the second consecutive week. Fifth-year senior safety Jordan Kovacs and sophomore linebacker Desmond Morgan) led the way with seven tackles. Senior/junior corner Thomas Gordon also added six take-downs and an interception.

Senior quarterback Denard Robinson led the U-M offense with 138 yards through the air and 90 on the ground, allowing him to surpass Chad Henne (9,400, 2004-07) as the career yardage leader at Michigan (9,438). Meanwhile, fifth-year senior Roy Roundtree senior/junior Jeremy Gallon and junior Devin Gardner each hauled in three passes.

The Wolverines surrendered five interceptions to the Fighting Irish in the opening 30 minutes -- the final five Michigan pass attempts of the half. Despite the giveaways, the Michigan defense held Notre Dame to just 111 yards of offense and 10 points in the first two quarters while forcing two turnovers of its own.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Maize and Blue claimed an 80-25 advantage in total yards of offense but failed to capitalize on two trips to the Notre Dame red zone -- one ending in a missed field goal and the other in an interception on a failed half-back pass attempt.

Early in the second period, after a Fighting Irish interception return by Manti Te'o to the Michigan 17-yard line, sophomore kicker Kyle Brindza connected on a 33-yard field goal to give Notre Dame a 3-0 lead.

Minutes later, Notre Dame threatened to score again, but Gordon picked off a Fighting Irish pass in the end zone to nullify the threat.

Late in the first half, Te'o garnered his second pick of the game, and with 1:21 left, replace-

ment quarterback Tommy Rees ran the ball in from two yards out to give Notre Dame a 10-0 halftime advantage.

The Michigan defense stayed strong to start the second half, allowing 29 yards and zero points in the third quarter.

Just 1:50 into the fourth quarter, senior/junior kicker Brendan Gibbons split the uprights from 33 yards away to get the Wolverines on the board, cutting the Notre Dame lead to 10-3.

On the ensuing Notre Dame possession, the Fighting Irish took the ball down the field and Brindza added a 39-yard field goal to extend the lead to 13-3.

The Wolverines took the ball following the score and marched the field, capping a 56-yard drive with a 31-yard Gibbons field goal, bringing the Maize and Blue within seven points with just 3:27 left in the contest.

With Michigan needing a third-down stop in Notre Dame territory, the Fighting Irish completed a 32-yard pass to extend the final drive of the game. Notre Dame garnered one additional first down en route to running out the final seconds.

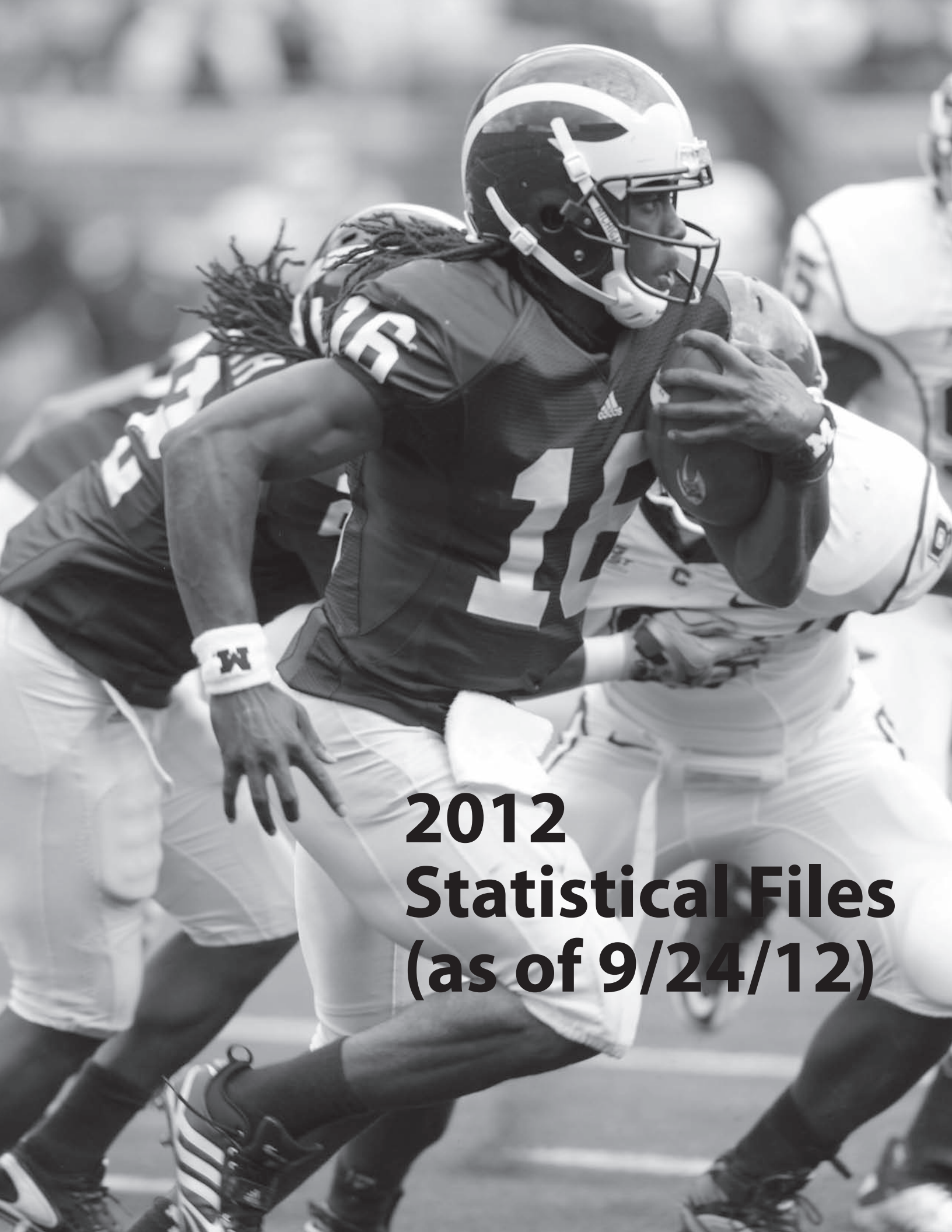
