MICHIGAN OPENS BIG TEN PLAY BATTLING FOR LITTLE BROWN JUG

▶ Michigan's Big Ten slate begins by hosting Minnesota and playing for the Little Brown Jug. The Wolverines and Golden Gophers have the nation's oldest FBS trophy game as the Little Brown Jug has been on the line since 1909.

▶ Michigan has won the last six meetings with Minnesota and 22 of the last 23.

▶ The Wolverines have won eight straight Big Ten openers and 31 of their last 32. U-M boasts a 48-11-2 mark since 1953 in its first Big Ten game of the season.

▶ The Wolverines rank 1st in the Big Ten and 8th in the NCAA in total defense, allowing an average of 261.0 yards per game. That total includes 80.3 yards of rushing defense, which ranks 3rd in the conference and 9th in the nation, and an average of 180.8 yards of passing defense that is 3rd in the Big Ten and 28th in the country.

▶ Michigan has allowed a total of 168 yards rushing (1.83 avg.) in the last three games, the lowest three-game total since 2006 when it held Northwestern, Ball State and Indiana to 60 combined yards rushing. The Wolverines allowed 81 yards rushing to Utah (2.2 avg.), kept Miami (Ohio) to 33 rushing yards (1.38 avg.), the lowest total by a U-M opponent since Bowling Green rushed for 32 yards Sept. 25, 2010, and allowed 54 yards on the ground at Notre Dame (1.74 avg.).

▶ The Wolverines have allowed four total yards rushing in the first half of the last two games, allowing just one yard rushing before halftime to Miami (Ohio) and allowing three rushing yards to Utah in the first half.

▶ Michigan's 20.3 points allowed per game ranks 5th in the Big Ten and 33rd in the NCAA. U-M has held three of its four opponents to their lowest scoring output of 2014.

▶ Michigan has scored on its first offensive drive in all three games at home this season.

▶ Michigan is one of 19 teams nationally perfect in Red Zone scoring opportunities this season. The Wolverines have scored a touchdown on 8-of-10 trips to the Red Zone (.800), which ranks 1st in the Big Ten and is tied for 6th in the NCAA.

▶ The Wolverines rank 6th in the Big Ten and 37th in the NCAA with their average of 211.0 rushing yards per game. Michigan is 4th in the Big Ten and 21st in the NCAA in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 32:42 per game, and also 5th in the conference with 84 first downs.

▶ U-M is tied for 2nd in the Big Ten and for 11th in the NCAA with an average of 33.5 penalty yards per game, and the Wolverines' 3.75 penalties per game is the 2nd-lowest average in the conference and 15th lowest in the nation.

▶ Michigan registered 11.0 tackles for loss vs. Utah, the program's highest single-game TFL total since recording 11 Oct. 4, 2008 vs. Illinois.

QUARTERBACKS

► **Devin Gardner** ranks 5th in the Big Ten and 38th in the NCAA with a completion percentage of 64.1 (59-of-92).

► **Devin Gardner** completed 14-of-26 passes for 148 yards and rushed for 29 yards on 10 carries vs. Utah.

► With 177 total yards against Utah, **Devin Gardner** upped his career total to 5,860 and moved to 7th among U-M's leaders in total offense, passing Todd Collins (5,702, 1991-94) and Jim Harbaugh (5,745, 1983-86)

► **Devin Gardner** upped his career passing yards to 5,134 to remain 8th among U-M's all-time leaders in the category. He needs 217 yards to reach the 7th spot, currently held by Tom Brady (5,351, 1996-99).

► **Devin Gardner** is one of only eight Wolverines to post 5,000 career passing yards.

► **Devin Gardner** holds the 7th position among U-M's all-time career leaders in passing touchdowns with 39. He needs three more to reach the 6th spot, currently held by Steve Smith (42).

► **Devin Gardner** ranks 8th on U-M's all-time career completions list with 360. He needs 27 completions to tie Jim Harbaugh (387, 1983-86) for 7th on Michigan's all-time list.

► **Devin Gardner** completed 13-of-20 passes for 184 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 25 yards on six carries in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

► **Devin Gardner** began U-M's game at Notre Dame by completing 6-of-6 passes for 50 yards and did not throw an incomplete pass until the beginning of the second quarter. Gardner completed 19 of his first 20 passes (95.0%) to start the 2014 campaign.

► **Devin Gardner** threw 172 consecutive passes without an interception before tossing an interception in the third quarter at Notre Dame. It marked Gardner's first interception since the Wolverines' game at Michigan State on Nov. 2, 2013.

► **Devin Gardner** completed 13-of-14 passes for 173 yards and three touchdowns in Michigan's 52-14 win vs. Appalachian State.

► **Devin Gardner's** completion percentage of 92.8 (13-of-14) vs. the Mountaineers ranks 2nd for a single game (min. 10 attempts) in program history, trailing only Tate Forcier, who completed 100 percent (12-12) of his passes vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 25, 2010.

► **Devin Gardner** ranks 2nd on Michigan's career passing efficiency rating list (146.6).

► Over his last 12 games, **Devin Gardner** has thrown 19 touchdown passes and only nine interceptions.

► **Devin Gardner** has accounted for at least two touchdowns in 16 of his last 21 games.

► **Devin Gardner** owns 12 200-yard passing games in his collegiate career, tying him for 5th on U-M's all-time list in that category with Jim Harbaugh (1983-86) and Denard Robinson (2009-12). Todd Collins (1991-94) ranks 4th with 14 200-yard passing games, and Tom Brady (1996-99) is 3rd with 15.

► The Wolverines also return **Shane Morris**, who completed 29-of-47 passes for 261 yards last season. Morris started the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl against Kansas State in place of an injured Gardner, completing 24-of-38 passes for 196 yards and carrying the ball four times for 43 yards.

► **Shane Morris** became the first Michigan quarterback to make his starting debut in a bowl game, tallying 239 yards of total offense against Kanas State in the 2013 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl. Morris, who completed passes to nine different receivers in the contest, became the third true freshmen quarterback to start a bowl game for the Wolverines. He joined fellow lefty Rick Leach (1976 Orange Bowl) and Chad Henne (2005 Rose Bowl) as the only rookie signal-callers to lead the Wolverines in a bowl game.

108th Season of Big Ten Action

• Michigan is in its 108th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference.
 • The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 482-193-18 record in conference play and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships.
 • U-M also leads the conference with 407 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

U-M In 135th Season of Gridiron Action

• The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine 1-0 at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto 0-0 in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1.
 • U-M enters its 131st year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games.
 • The Wolverines are the sixth-oldest football program in NCAA history.

RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- ▶ Ten different Wolverines posted a reception vs. Utah.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** led Michigan in catches (4) and receiving yards (82) vs. the Utes.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** recorded a career-high nine receptions for a game-high 107 yards at Notre Dame.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** is tied for 14th on U-M's career 100-yard receiving games list with four.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** ranks 2nd in the Big Ten and tied for 25th in the NCAA in receptions per game with his average of 6.7 per game.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** is tied for 3rd in the Big Ten and for 30th in the NCAA with three receiving touchdowns this season.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** is 5th in the Big Ten with 20 receptions this season.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess'** 284 receiving yards rank 8th in the Big Ten and tied for 52nd in the NCAA.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess'** average of 94.7 receiving yards per game is 5th in the Big Ten and 28th in the country.
- ▶ Dating back to 2012, **Devin Funchess** has recorded at least one reception in 17 straight games.
- ▶ **Devin Funchess** made his presence felt in Michigan's 52-14 victory vs. Appalachian State, posting seven receptions for 95 yards and a career-high three touchdowns.
- ▶ Against the Mountaineers, **Devin Funchess** became the third wide receiver in program history to register three touchdown receptions in a season opener.
- ▶ **Jehu Chesson** has posted at least two receptions in each of Michigan's four games this season. He has a catch in six straight games dating back to last season.
- ▶ **Amara Darboh** posted career highs with six receptions and 88 receiving yards in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ **Amara Darboh** recorded his first career touchdown on a 17-yard reception in the first quarter vs. the RedHawks.
- ▶ **Amara Darboh** hauled in a career-long 26-yard reception in the second quarter vs. Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ **Dennis Norfleet** made his first career start vs. Appalachian State and set career highs with three receptions and 30 receiving yards. Norfleet added three more catches at Notre Dame, and has posted six receptions for 46 yards through two contests.
- ▶ Tight end **A.J. Williams** recorded his first reception of the season -- and second of his career -- with a seven-yard catch in the second quarter vs. Utah.
- ▶ Seeing his first extensive action of the season, tight end **Jake Butt** hauled in three receptions for 59 yards and one touchdown in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ **Jake Butt** recorded the third touchdown catch of his career on a 29-yard pass from Devin Gardner in the third quarter vs. the RedHawks.
- ▶ **Jake Butt** is averaging 36.2 receiving yards per game over his last five games dating back to last season.
- ▶ **Jake Butt**, who tore his anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and meniscus in February, made his season debut on the third offensive play vs. Notre Dame. Butt, an ESPN.com All-Big Ten Freshman Team selection in 2013, recorded 20 receptions for 235 yards and two touchdowns last season, including 13 receptions for 168 yards and two touchdowns over Michigan's final five games.
- ▶ Tight end **Khalid Hill** earned his first career start and hauled in his first career catch, a 12-yard reception in the fourth quarter, vs. Appalachian State.
- ▶ Playing his first game at tight end, converted defensive lineman **Keith Heitzman** notched the first reception of his collegiate career, a 26-yard grab in the third quarter vs. Appalachian State.

RUNNING BACKS

▶ **Derrick Green** rushed for 59 yards on 14 carries and hauled in two receptions for 26 yards vs. Utah.

▶ **Derrick Green** recorded his first career catch, a 14-yard gain, in the third quarter vs. the Utes. He added another 12-yard reception in the fourth quarter.

▶ **Derrick Green's** 391 rushing yards through four games are 5th in the Big Ten and tied for 25th in the country. Green's 97.8 rushing yards per game are 5th in the Big Ten and tied for 33rd in the FBS.

▶ **Derrick Green** ranks 6th in the Big Ten and 31st in the NCAA with his average of 6.1 rushing yards per carry.

▶ **Derrick Green's** 366 rushing yards at home this season rank 3rd in the Big Ten and 9th in the country.

▶ **Derrick Green's** three rushing TDs this season are tied for 8th in the conference and 51st in the FBS.

▶ **Derrick Green** rushed for 137 yards and a career-high two touchdowns on a career-high 22 carries in U-M's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ **Derrick Green** posted his first multi-touchdown performance against the RedHawks and upped his career touchdown total to five.

▶ **Derrick Green** has recorded 100-yard rushing performances in two of Michigan's four games this season.

▶ **Derrick Green** is one of five student-athletes in the Big Ten with at least two 100-yard rushing games against FBS opponents this season.

▶ **Derrick Green** and **De'Veon Smith** each recorded their first career 100-yard rushing performances in Michigan's 52-14 victory vs. Appalachian State.

▶ **Derrick Green** rushed for 170 yards and one touchdown on 15 carries vs. the Mountaineers. His previous single-game high was 84 yards, which he recorded last season at Northwestern.

▶ **De'Veon Smith** posted 115 rushing yards and the first two touchdowns of his career on eight carries vs. Appalachian State. His previous career best was 57 rushing yards, which he tallied last season vs. Ohio State.

▶ For the 38th time in program history U-M boasted two or more 100-yard rushers in a single game vs. Appalachian State, the first time two Wolverine running backs topped 100 yards in the same game since Carlos Brown (132) and Brandon Minor (157) vs. Minnesota on Oct. 27, 2007.

▶ **Justice Hayes** posted a career-long 18-yard reception in the fourth quarter vs. Utah.

▶ Fullback **Joe Kerridge** hauled in his first catch of the season on a fourth-down conversion in the first quarter at Notre Dame. Kerridge owns seven career receptions.

▶ **De'Veon Smith, Derrick Green** and **Drake Johnson** posted career-long rushes in Michigan's season opener vs. Appalachian State. Smith ran for 61 yards in the second quarter, Green recorded a 62-yard run in the third quarter and Johnson registered a 27-yard run in the fourth quarter.

OFFENSIVE LINE

▶ Michigan broke the school's single-game total offense yards-per-play record in the season-opening victory vs. Appalachian State with an average of 10.18 yards per play, breaking the previous standard of 9.05 yards per play set in 1996 vs. Minnesota and matched in 2013 vs. Indiana.

▶ Michigan broke the program's single-game rushing average record in the season-opening win vs. Appalachian State. The Wolverines averaged 9.72 yards per carry, gaining 350 yards on 36 attempts, to break the previous record of 9.23 yards per carry set in 1992 vs. Iowa.

▶ **Mason Cole, Erik Magnuson, Jack Miller, Graham Glasgow** and **Ben Braden** have started the last three games along the offensive line for Michigan.

▶ Against Appalachian State, left tackle **Mason Cole** became the first true freshman in Michigan history to start a season opener on the offensive line.

2014 SCHEDULE NOTES

▶ Michigan is one of three schools in the Big Ten and one of nine nationally in a power-five conference that does not play an FCS opponent this season.

▶ For the first time in program history, Michigan will play Notre Dame, Michigan State and Ohio State all on the road in the same season.

▶ This is the first time since 1966 that Michigan will play Michigan State and Ohio State on the road. It's the sixth time that U-M will play both teams on the road in the same season: 1948, 1958, 1960, 1962, 1964 and 1966.

▶ 2014 marks the first time in the history of the Michigan-Michigan State series that the Wolverines have played consecutive road games in East Lansing.

▶ Three of Michigan's 12 regular-season opponents posted at least nine victories in 2013 -- Michigan State (13-1), Ohio State (12-2) and Notre Dame (9-4).

▶ Six of the Wolverines' 12 regular-season opponents received bowl bids in 2013, while compiling a 55-25 record (.688 winning percentage).

▶ U-M is scheduled to face three teams ranked in the AP preseason Top 25, tied for the 3rd-highest total among Big Ten programs.

▶ **Mason Cole** is the second true freshman in program history to start a game at tackle and sixth true freshman to start a game on the offensive line, joining Bubba Paris (1978), Tom Dixon (1980), Dean Dingman (1987), Justin Boren (2006) and Kyle Bosch (2013).

▶ The Michigan offensive line paved the way for Wolverine ball carriers to amass 350 rushing yards (program-record 9.7 yards per carry) vs. Appalachian State, the first time Michigan rushed for at least 350 yards in a game since totaling 353 yards on the ground vs. Illinois on Oct. 13, 2012.

▶ U-M allowed only one sack vs. both Appalachian State and Miami (Ohio) and only two quarterback takedowns at Notre Dame.

▶ Junior offensive lineman **Graham Glasgow** made his first start of the season at Notre Dame. Glasgow, who made nine starts at center and four starts at left guard last season, started at right guard against the Fighting Irish and vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ Sophomore right tackle **Ben Braden** made his first collegiate start against Appalachian State.

▶ **David Dawson, Chris Fox** and **Logan Tuley-Tillman** made their collegiate debuts in the season opener.

DEFENSIVE LINE

▶ **Frank Clark** posted 2.5 tackles for loss vs. Utah and has notched 11.5 TFLs over Michigan's last 13 games.

▶ **Frank Clark** posted his first sack of the season vs. the Utes. He owns 7.5 career sacks.

▶ **Willie Henry** recorded his first interception and first touchdown of his career on the same play in the second quarter vs. Utah. It was Michigan's first interception for a touchdown since **Brennen Beyer** scored at Iowa last season.

▶ **Willie Henry** notched the first full sack of his career in the second quarter vs. Utah.

▶ **Mario Ojemudia** posted a career-high 2.5 TFLs vs. the Utes and matched a career-best with four total tackles vs. Utah.

▶ **Brennen Beyer** notched his second sack of the season in U-M's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio), taking down RedHawks signal caller Andrew Hendrix for a loss of 12 yards in the first quarter.

▶ **Brennen Beyer** has tallied a sack in two of his last three games and owns four career quarterback takedowns.

▶ **Maurice Hurst Jr.** recorded his first career TFL at Notre Dame.

▶ **Bryan Mone** posted a career-high three tackles at the Fighting Irish.

▶ **Taco Charlton** recorded his first career sack, for an eight-yard loss, in the second quarter of the 52-14 victory vs. Appalachian State.

▶ **Chris Wormley** tallied his first sack of the season in the second quarter of U-M's season-opening victory vs. Appalachian State. He owns 4.5 sacks for his career.

▶ **Ondre Pipkins** had a career-high five tackles vs. the Mountaineers.

▶ **Ryan Glasgow** made his first collegiate start vs. Appalachian State, while defensive linemen **Maurice Hurst Jr., Bryan Mone, Henry Poggi** and **Alex Mitropoulos-Rundus** made their collegiate debuts against the Mountaineers.

LINEBACKERS

▶ **Jake Ryan** paced Michigan with a career-high 13 tackles vs. Utah. It marked Ryan's fifth career double-digit tackle game, and bettered his previous career high of 11 tackles, which he registered most recently at Notre Dame earlier this season.

▶ **Jake Ryan** notched a team-high 3.0 tackles for loss against the Utes, including his first sack of the season. He owns 8.5 career sacks.

▶ **Jake Ryan** leads U-M with 33 tackles through four games. He is tied for 11th in the Big Ten in tackles per game with his average of 8.2.

▶ Dating back to 2011, **Jake Ryan** has recorded a tackle for loss in 28 of his last 35 games.

▶ **James Ross III** posted his first TFL of the season vs. Utah.

▶ **Joe Bolden** (seven) and **Jake Ryan** (six) combined to record 13 tackles in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ **Joe Bolden** posted his first career pass breakup vs. the RedHawks.

▶ **Joe Bolden** tied a career high with 10 stops against Utah. It marked Bolden's second career double-digit tackle effort, and his most tackles since notching 10 vs. Air Force on Sept. 8, 2012.

SECONDARY

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** notched a career-high two pass breakups vs. Utah. He also tied a career-best with five tackles vs. the Utes.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** is tied for 4th in the Big Ten with five pass breakups this season. He ranks 6th in the conference and 48th in the NCAA with 1.3 PBUs per game.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** has registered at least one pass breakup in three of Michigan's first four games.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** grabbed his first career interception in the first quarter of Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** made his first collegiate start vs. the RedHawks.

▶ **Jabrill Peppers** matched his career high with three tackles vs. Utah.

▶ **Jeremy Clark** posted his first career TFL vs. the Utes.

▶ **Dymonte Thomas** posted the first forced fumble of his career vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ Michigan allowed the RedHawks to convert only 2-of-12 third-down attempts (16.7%).

▶ **Delonte Hollowell** made his first career start at Notre Dame, finishing the game with a career-high six tackles, including his first career tackle for loss.

▶ Michigan allowed only 127 passing yards in the season opener vs. Appalachian State. U-M limited the Mountaineers to only 11 passing yards in the first half of the season opener.

▶ The Wolverines locked down Appalachian State on third down, allowing the Mountaineers to only convert 5-of-17 attempts (29.4 percent).

▶ **Jeremy Clark** and **Jabrill Peppers** earned their first collegiate starts vs. Appalachian State. Clark finished with three tackles and one pass breakup, while Peppers recorded two tackles in his first game as a Wolverine.

▶ **Dymonte Thomas** notched a career-high five tackles, all solo stops, in the season opener vs. the Mountaineers. Thomas recorded five solo tackles during his freshman campaign in 2013.

SPECIAL TEAMS

▶ **Dennis Norfleet** already ranks 2nd in program history in career kickoff return yards (1,881), trailing only Steve Breaston (1,993).

▶ **Will Hagerup**, who was named Big Ten Eddleman-Field Punter of the Year in 2012, has booted 13 punts for 538 yards (41.4 avg.) this season. Five of his 13 punts have landed inside the 20.

▶ **Will Hagerup**, punted five times for 194 yards vs. Utah to up his career punting yardage to 4,507. He moved to 11th place among U-M's all-time leaders in the category. Hagerup passed Jason Vinson (4,376, 1995-96) and needs 46 more to reach the 10th spot, currently held by Mark Werner (4,553, 1968-69).

▶ **Matt Wile**, who has appeared in 43 contests, has made 9-of-15 career field goals with a long of 52 yards against South Carolina in the 2013 Outback Bowl.

▶ **Matt Wile** posted a season-long 42-yard field goal in the first quarter vs. Utah. He has recorded a field goal of 40 yards or more in each of the last two games.

▶ **Matt Wile** accounted for 10 points in U-M's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio). Wile went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, connecting from 29 and 40 yards, respectively. He also made 4-of-4 PATs vs. the RedHawks.

▶ Michigan was one of eight teams in the NCAA to block a punt in week one and is one of 21 teams in the nation with at least one punt block this year. Redshirt freshman **Mike McCray** blocked an Appalachian State punt in the second quarter that sophomore **Ben Gedeon** returned 32 yards for a touchdown.

HISTORY OF THE LITTLE BROWN JUG

According to the NCAA records book, there are 65 trophy games involving Division I-A teams. They all owe their creation to the University of Michigan, the University of Minnesota, some misgivings about water and a 30-cent, putty-colored jug.

Michigan had won 28 straight games as it headed to Minneapolis for a battle with Minnesota in 1903. The Golden Gophers came into the game 10-0 on the season, with a crowd of 20,000 to root the home team on. Having doubts that Minnesota would provide pure water to the Michigan bench, head coach Fielding Yost ordered a manager, Tommy Roberts, to purchase a receptacle for drinking water which would be free from suspicion. Roberts purchased a five-gallon jug from a variety store in Minneapolis, and Michigan and Minnesota prepared to duel.

The Wolverines took a 6-0 lead in the first half, but the Gophers rallied to tie the game on a touchdown with two minutes remaining. When Minnesota blasted over the goal line, the fans, some sitting in trees and atop telephone poles, rushed the field in excitement. The pandemonium that ensued led to the game being called with time still left on the clock.

In their haste to leave and catch the train back to Chicago, the Michigan players dressed quickly and departed the stadium, leaving the jug behind. Minnesota equipment manager Oscar Munson found the jug the following morning and brought it to Director of Athletics L.J. Cooke. In remembrance of the exceptional tie, they decided to hold on to the jug and adorned it by painting, "Michigan Jug - Captured by Oscar, October 31, 1903," and the score "Minnesota 6, Michigan 6" on the side of the jug.

When Yost sent a letter requesting the return of the jug, Cooke wrote back, "If you want it, you'll have to come up and win it." Due to the brutality of the 1903 game, the two teams did not meet again until 1909, when Michigan did win the jug, 15-6. The Wolverines defended the jug in Ann Arbor in 1910, but due to Michigan's withdrawal from the Big Ten, the jug was not played for again until 1919.

The trophy disappeared from the trophy case of the Michigan Athletic Administration building in 1930 and was not found until 1934. Before the actual jug was found behind a clump of bushes by a gas station attendant in Ann Arbor, a replica of the prize was displayed in Michigan's trophy case. The authenticity of the original was confirmed by a flaw that could not be duplicated. Since then, the trophy has been carefully safeguarded.

Dating back to 1909, the battle for the Little Brown Jug is the oldest trophy game in Division I FBS. Sixteen years passed before the next trophy game was created. In 1925, the Illibuck (Illinois-Ohio State), the Old Oaken Bucket (Indiana-Purdue) and the Beer Barrel (Kentucky-Tennessee) trophies were first played for, the last of which was created, "to rival Michigan's Brown Jug."

Michigan-Minnesota Connections

Michigan Stadium -- 1927- Present (88th Year)

The football program is in its 88th season in the "Big House" in 2014 with an all-time record of 405-123-15 at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium by defeating Ohio Wesleyan 33-0 on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has increased nine times to its present 109,901. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 38 times in the past 39 years and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 115,109 fans against Notre Dame in the second night game ever in Michigan Stadium in 2013. The previous mark was 114,804 fans against Notre Dame during the first night game at Michigan Stadium in 2011.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 254 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan.

The Wolverines drew 781,144 fans for their seven-game home schedule in 2013. The seven-game average of 111,592 ranked No. 1 in the FBS.

Michigan Stadium was the first college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones. It was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

CAPACITY: 109,901 -- the largest college-owned structure of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

COMPLETION: 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan, led by captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State 21-0.

REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- Michigan defeated Connecticut 30-10.

ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 46,173,363 fans have watched the Wolverines play 541 games. The single-game attendance record is 115,109 set against Notre Dame on Sept. 7, 2013. The NCAA season record of 897,431 was set in 2011.

FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

Brady Hoke was named the 19th head coach in University of Michigan football history on Jan. 11, 2011. A former assistant coach at U-M (1995-2002), Hoke has guided the Wolverines to a 28-15 record (15-9 Big Ten) in his first four seasons as head coach of Michigan. Hoke led the Wolverines to an 11-2 record (6-2 Big Ten) and Allstate Sugar Bowl victory in his first season at the helm, while U-M finished the 2012 season with an 8-5 (6-2 Big Ten) mark following a bid to the Outback Bowl. The Wolverines went 7-6 in 2013 and made an appearance in the 2013 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl.

Hoke had previous head coaching stints at San Diego State from 2009-10, where he earned a 13-12 record, and his alma mater, Ball State, where he went 34-38 from 2003-08. Collectively, Hoke is 73-63 in 11 seasons as a head coach.

Hoke's first-season success in Ann Arbor was acknowledged across the country. He was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual. The Big Ten Conference's coaches voted Hoke as the inaugural recipient of the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award, while the Big Ten media named him the Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

With four wins more than the 2010 squad (7-6), Hoke and the Wolverines tied Fielding Yost's 1901 team as the only two teams with a four-win improvement from the previous season. Yost's 1901 team went 11-0 following a 7-2-1 1900 season.

Only the legendary Yost precedes Hoke as a Michigan head coach to win 10 games in his first season. Hoke also became the fifth Big Ten coach to win at least 10 games in his first season as head coach, and became the third U-M coach to win his first six games (Fielding Yost-1901, Bennie Oosterbaan-1948). Nationally, Hoke became one of eight coaches to direct a team to a BCS bowl in his first season, while he became the third coach to direct a team to a BCS bowl victory in his first season.

In 2012, Hoke became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02. The Wolverines were a perfect 8-0 at Michigan Stadium in 2011 and 6-0 at the Big House in 2012.

Since Hoke's arrival, the defense has improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the Football Bowl Subdivision in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in the

country in scoring and total defense in 2011 and 2012. Meanwhile, the offense has averaged over 30 points per game during Hoke's tenure, including averaging 34 points per game through 12 games in 2013.

Fifteen Wolverines have earned All-Big Ten distinction in three seasons under Hoke, including back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year winners in center David Molk (2011) and left tackle Taylor Lewan (2012-13). Devin Funchess also earned Big Ten Kwalick-Clark Tight End of the Year honors in 2013.

The 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, Hoke guided the Aztecs to a 9-4 record, marking the most victories since 1996 (8) while earning the program's first trip to a bowl game in 12 years, a 35-14 victory over Navy. Six of his players earned All-MWC first team honors in 2010, including running back Ronnie Hillman, the league's Freshman of the Year. Seven additional players earned second-team (4) honors and honorable mention (3). In 2009, Hoke's first season at San Diego State, five players were named to All-MWC teams, while 11 were MWC All-Academic selections.

As head coach at Ball State, he mentored players to 35 All-MAC selections in six years en route to a pair of bowl game appearances in 2007 and '08. The 2008 season marked the best season in program history, recording a school-record 12 wins and completing an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular-season campaign.

Collectively, Hoke has 30 years of collegiate coaching experience beginning with assistant positions at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94) and Michigan (1995-2002). A defensive line coach at U-M, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, '98, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl winning squad. During his tenure, U-M posted a 76-23 overall record, claiming at least 10 victories on four occasions.

A 1982 graduate of Ball State University, Hoke earned four letters (1977-80) with the Cardinals. He was part of the only two teams in Ball State football history to post undefeated conference seasons: as a player in 1978, and as the head coach in 2008. Hoke led Ball State to the 1978 MAC championship, and as a team captain in 1980 earned All-MAC second-team honors. He graduated from Fairmont East High School in Kettering, Ohio, in 1977.

He and his wife, the former Laura Homberger, have one daughter, Kelly.

Quarterback Devin Gardner connected with wide receiver Devin Funchess for three touchdowns before halftime, and tailbacks Derrick Green (170 yards) and De'Veon Smith (115) became the first Michigan tailback duo to rush for 100 yards or more apiece in the same game in seven seasons and took advantage of great blocking from the line spearheaded by center Jack Miller to complete a pounding of Appalachian State.

The balanced attack built a 42-0 lead en route to the University of Michigan football team's 52-14 victory in Saturday afternoon's (Aug. 30) season opener before 106,811 at Michigan Stadium.

And the defense limited the Mountaineers to 280 yards total offense, while the special teams provided a touchdown with Ben Gedeon's 32-yard return of a punt blocked by Mike McCray.

The common theme on each unit of the team was an urgency that permeated every play.

"We are just here to make our mark," Funchess said. "You only get one chance to make a first impression. That is what we did today. It shows all of our hard work from offseason. We came out and showed what we had today.

Gardner hit nearly every pass he threw, missing only one of 14 attempts for 173 yards with nary a turnover.

Gardner looks to find more consistency with new offensive coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who tutored outstanding quarterback AJ McCarron in a 2012 national championship season for Alabama.

Both Hoke and Gardner said the quarterback benefited from having Nussmeier on the sideline, exchanging strategy thoughts and tough love.

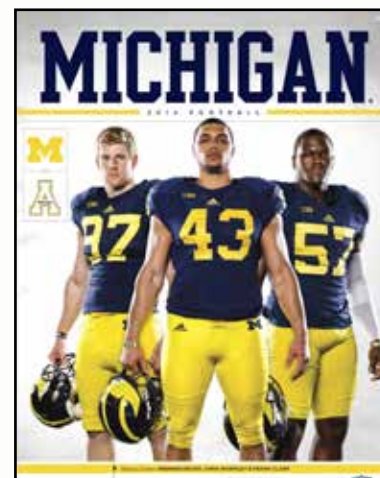
"It helped me a lot in making adjustments during the game, the eye-to-eye factor," said Gardner, noting that the different run play he checked into at the line of scrimmage that resulted in Green's 62-yard run was what most pleased Nussmeier.

"He said it was the best play I made," said Gardner.

Gardner not only made the plays but checked into the right plays -- something he's been urged to do more of this year. Green rushed for 170 yards on 15 carries and Smith had 115 yards on only eight carries. Funchess caught seven passes for 95 yards.

"He's a lot more confident," Funchess said of Gardner. "And as a player, you have to bring swag to yourself. Today, he brought swag."

And together, they brought the house down on Appalachian State.

The University of Michigan football team fell at Notre Dame (No. 16 AP, No. 15 USA Today) 31-0 under the lights at Notre Dame Stadium. Notre Dame quarterback Everett Golson completed 23-of-34 passes for 226 yards and three touchdowns.

Graduate student Devin Gardner finished the game throwing 19-for-31 for 189 yards and two interceptions, while Michigan's leading rusher was sophomore De'Veon Smith, who ran for 30 yards on seven carries. Junior Devin Funchess led all receivers with 107 yards on a career-high nine receptions.

Senior Jake Ryan paced Michigan with a career-high-tying 11 tackles, while junior Joe Bolden added a career-high tying 10 stops. Senior Brennen Beyer recorded U-M's lone sack of the evening, a 16-yard quarterback takedown at the start of the fourth quarter.

Notre Dame scored the first points of the game on a one-yard touchdown run by Cam McDaniel with 1:50 left in the first quarter, taking advantage of two defensive pass interference calls against Michigan on the drive.

Midway through the second quarter, the Irish converted on a fourth-and-3, before Everett Golson threw a two-yard touchdown pass to Amir Carlisle to cap off a 13-play, 80-yard drive with 3:58 left in the first half. Notre Dame scored again before halftime, as Golson found William Fuller in the end zone with 34 seconds left, giving the Irish a 21-0 lead going into the intermission.

Notre Dame continued the scoring in the second half, outscoring Michigan 10-0 after the break. Fuller led Irish receivers with nine catches for 89 yards and a touchdown, while Carlisle finished with seven receptions for 61 yards and two scores.

The Maize and Blue won the rushing yards battle, 100-56, and had more total yards than Notre Dame (289-282) but was penalized five times for 50 yards, while the Irish committed only two penalties for five yards.

Sophomore running back Derrick Green ran for 137 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while graduate student quarterback Devin Gardner passed for 184 yards and two more scores, as the University of Michigan football team rebounded to down Miami University 34-10 inside Michigan Stadium.

Junior/sophomore wide receiver Amara Darboh had a career day, hauling in six receptions for 88 yards and a touchdown, while sophomore tight end Jake Butt added three catches for 59 yards and a touchdown.

The U-M defense was particularly stifling, including posting a shutout in the second half. The Wolverines held Miami to only 33 yards rushing and 198 yards of total offense. Junior linebacker Joe Bolden led the defense with seven tackles, while fifth-year senior linebacker Jake Ryan was right behind him with six tackles.

The Wolverines jumped on the RedHawks early, going up 10-0 in the first quarter on a 29-yard field goal from senior kicker Matt Wile and a 17-yard touchdown pass from Gardner to Darboh. The touchdown drive was set up by a Miami turnover -- the first Michigan had forced this season -- after sophomore defensive back Jourdan Lewis made an acrobatic interception of Miami quarterback Andrew Hendrix to give the Wolverines a short field.

Michigan had trouble holding onto the ball in the second quarter, turning the ball over three times to allow Miami to get back into the game.

A Darboh fumble after a long reception and a Gardner interception led to two Miami scoring drives, the first of which was a 26-yard field goal by Kaleb Patterson. On the ensuing kickoff, Patterson kicked off high and short, but Michigan could not field the ball cleanly, allowing Miami to recover the fumble. With a short field, the RedHawks got on the board with their first touchdown, a short three-yard touchdown pass from Hendrix to Dawan Scott, tying the game at 10-10.

The Wolverines responded on the next drive to take a 17-10 lead into the half. After Gardner was sacked to make it a 2nd-and-17, Green got his number called four consecutive times and covered 47 yards, capping the drive with a short one-yard touchdown run.

The two teams traded punts for most of the third quarter until Butt recorded a 29-yard touchdown reception from Gardner to make the score 24-10.

The Michigan defense opened up the fourth quarter by stopping Miami on fourth down. On the next drive, Gardner engineered a nine-play, 68-yard drive to tack on another touchdown, culminating with Green plowing into the end zone from 12 yards out, increasing the lead to 31-10 with 9:50 to play. Then, with 18 seconds left, Wile added a 40-yard field goal to cap the scoring at 34-10.

Despite leading in total yards and time of possession, the University of Michigan football team dropped a home contest to Utah 26-10 inside Michigan Stadium.

The Wolverines outgained Utah 308-287 and held the Utes to only 82 yards rushing but turned the ball over four times during the contest. Individual statistical leaders included Devin Gardner, who completed 14-of-26 attempts for 148 yards and wide receiver Devin Funchess, who had four receptions for 82 yards. On defense, linebacker Jake Ryan led the way with 13 tackles, including three for loss.

All the scoring the two teams mustered in the first quarter was a field goal each. Michigan got on the board first, courtesy of a 42-yard field goal by senior kicker Matt Wile. The Wolverines did not get any points on their next drive but managed to pin Utah deep after a punt by fifth-year senior Will Hagerup was downed at the three-yard line. The Utes quickly erased that, though, knotting up the score at 3-3 after a 35-yard field goal by Andy Phillips, which was set up largely due to a 67-yard screen pass from quarterback Travis Wilson to running back Bubba Poole on third down. Poole would have likely scored on the play if not for a touchdown-saving tackle by Michigan sophomore defensive back Jourdan Lewis.

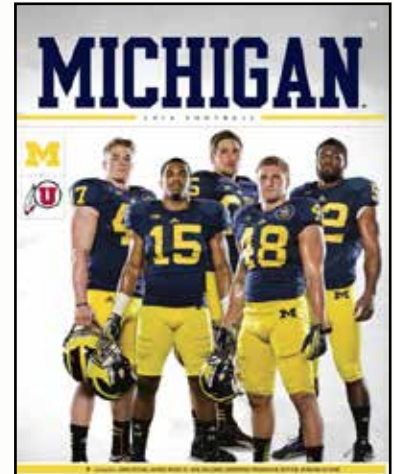
On the second play of the second quarter, Utah's Kaelin Clay returned Hagerup's punt 66 yards for a touchdown to stake the road squad a 10-3 lead.

The teams traded punts on each of their next two possessions, before Michigan was driving on the third, making it all the way to Utah's 25-yard line, until Gardner's intended pass for Funchess was intercepted by Ute defensive back Brian Blechen. On the ensuing drive, Utah's backup quarterback Kendal Thompson, who was in the game after Wilson was exited earlier in the quarter, threw an interception deep in his own territory directly to Michigan junior/sophomore defensive tackle Willie Henry (Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville), who ran it back a short seven yards for the touchdown.

Utah's Phillips connected on a 38-yard field goal at the end of a 16-play drive to cap the scoring in the first half, giving the Utes a 13-10 lead going into the break.

Utah added to its lead early in the second half. First, in the opening two minutes of the third quarter, Wilson found Dres Anderson for a 28-yard touchdown to make the score 20-10. Then, in the fourth quarter, Phillips added two more field goals, from 48 and 50 yards, respectively, to increase the lead to 26-10.

Due to severe weather, the game was then suspended for nearly two-and-a-half hours, but neither team scored again.
