MICHIGAN HOSTS INDIANA FOR HOMECOMING

▶ Michigan returns to Ann Arbor this week for the university's 114th Homecoming. The Wolverines are 86-27 all-time in Homecoming games and have won all three of their Homecoming games under head coach **Brady Hoke**.

▶ The last time Michigan hosted Indiana for Homecoming was 2009, a 36-33 U-M victory. The Wolverines are 11-1 all-time against Indiana when the Hoosiers are the Homecoming opponent.

▶ Michigan ranks 3rd in the Big Ten and 22nd in the NCAA in Red Zone offense. The Wolverines are 17-of-19 (.895) in the Red Zone this season.

▶ The Wolverines have scored a touchdown on 73.7 percent of their trips to the Red Zone (14-of-19), which ranks 3rd in the Big Ten and 10th in the NCAA.

▶ U-M ranks 1st in the Big Ten and 2nd in the NCAA with an average of 3.38 penalties per game, and the Wolverines' average of 30.50 penalty yards per game is 1st in the conference and 5th in the country.

▶ The Wolverines rank 5th in the Big Ten and 14th in the NCAA in total defense, allowing an average of 319.1 yards per game. That total includes 109.3 yards of rushing defense, which ranks 4th in the conference and 16th in the nation, and an average of 209.9 yards of passing defense that is 7th in the Big Ten and 41st in the country.

▶ U-M's six rushing touchdowns allowed are the fewest in the Big Ten and tied for the 12th-fewest allowed in the NCAA. The Wolverines have only allowed two rushing touchdowns at home, which is the lowest total in the conference and tied for 10th lowest in the country.

▶ Michigan is holding its opponents to an average of 3.06 yards per rush, which ranks 2nd in the Big Ten and 12th in the NCAA. The Wolverines have held five of their eight opponents to an average of 2.5 yards per carry or less. Penn State averaged 1.5 yards on 35 carries, Rutgers averaged 2.5 yards on 30 carries, Utah rushed for a 2.2 average on 37 carries, Miami (Ohio) averaged 1.38 yards on 24 attempts and Notre Dame was held to a 1.74 average on 31 rushes.

▶ The U-M defense's 54.0 tackles for loss rank 2nd in the Big Ten and tied for 26th in the NCAA and is the program's highest total through the first eight games of a season since registering 54.0 in 2009.

▶ The Wolverines' 30.0 tackles for loss in conference games are tied for 1st in the Big Ten. U-M's average of 7.50 tackles for loss per game and 128 tackles for loss yards in conference games are 2nd in the Big Ten.

▶ Michigan recorded 11.0 tackles for loss vs. Utah and vs. Penn State, marking the first time since 2008 U-M has multiple games of at least 11.0 TFLs in the same season.

▶ The Wolverines are 5th in the Big Ten and 15th in the NCAA, allowing their opponents an average of 16.8 first downs per game.

QUARTERBACKS

► **Devin Gardner** ranks 5th in the Big Ten and 56th in the NCAA with a completion percentage of 60.9 (106-of-174).

► **Devin Gardner** has completed 78.3 percent (36-of-46) of his passes in the first quarter this season to rank 1st in the Big Ten and 3rd in the NCAA.

► **Devin Gardner** set program records with 584 yards of total offense and 503 passing yards in last season's 63-47 victory over Indiana at Michigan Stadium. He fell one yard short of the Big Ten record for total offense, which is 585 by Dave Wilson of Illinois on Nov. 8, 1980.

► After completing 15-of-30 passes for 125 yards at Michigan State, **Devin Gardner** upped his career passing yards to 5,668 to remain 6th among U-M's all-time leaders in the category. He needs 190 more yards to reach the 5th spot, currently held by Todd Collins (5,858, 1991-94).

► **Devin Gardner** is 6th on Michigan's all-time list for total yards of offense with 6,457 yards. He needs only three more yards to reach the 5th spot on the list, currently held by Rick Leach (6,460, 1975-78).

► **Devin Gardner** completed 16-of-24 passes for 192 yards and one touchdown in Michigan's 18-13 win vs. Penn State.

► **Devin Gardner** recorded his 20th career 150-yard passing game vs. Penn State, moving to 6th among U-M's all-time leaders in the category, passing Jim Harbaugh (19, 1983-86).

► **Devin Gardner** completed 13-of-22 passes for 178 yards and rushed the ball 10 times for a season-best 40 yards and two touchdowns (19 and 4 yards, respectively) at Rutgers. His 19-yard TD scamper in the fourth quarter was a season long.

► **Devin Gardner** has accounted for at least two touchdowns in 17 of his last 25 games.

► **Devin Gardner** has posted three rushing touchdowns over Michigan's last four contests.

► **Devin Gardner** is one of only eight Wolverines to post 5,000 career passing yards.

► **Devin Gardner** holds the 7th position among U-M's all-time career leaders in passing touchdowns with 40. He needs two more to reach the 6th spot, currently held by Steve Smith (42).

► **Devin Gardner** ranks 7th on U-M's all-time career completions list with 407. He needs 20 completions to tie Denard Robinson (427, 2009-12) for 6th on Michigan's all-time list.

► **Devin Gardner** is 5th on Michigan's career passing efficiency rating list (141.8).

► With 30 pass attempts at Michigan State, **Devin Gardner** surpassed Steve Smith (648, 1980-83) for 7th place on U-M's all-time list with 678 career attempts.

► **Devin Gardner** completed 3-of-6 passes for 39 yards and carried the ball five times for 23 yards and one touchdown in limited playing time vs. Minnesota.

► **Devin Gardner** completed 14-of-26 passes for 148 yards and rushed for 29 yards on 10 carries vs. Utah.

► **Devin Gardner** completed 13-of-20 passes for 184 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 25 yards on six carries in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

► **Devin Gardner** began U-M's game at Notre Dame by completing 6-of-6 passes for 50 yards and did not throw an incomplete pass until the beginning of the second quarter. Gardner completed 19 of his first 20 passes (95.0%) to start the 2014 campaign.

► **Devin Gardner** threw 172 consecutive passes without an interception before tossing an interception in the third quarter at Notre Dame. It marked Gardner's first interception since the Wolverines' game at Michigan State on Nov. 2, 2013.

► **Devin Gardner** completed 13-of-14 passes for 173 yards and three touchdowns in Michigan's 52-14 win vs. Appalachian State.

108th Season of Big Ten Action

• Michigan is in its 108th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference.
 • The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 483-196-18 record in conference play and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships.
 • U-M also leads the conference with 407 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

U-M In 135th Season of Gridiron Action

• The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine 1-0 at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto 0-0 in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1.
 • U-M enters its 131st year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games.
 • The Wolverines are the sixth-oldest football program in NCAA history.

▶ **Devin Gardner's** completion percentage of 92.8 (13-of-14) vs. the Mountaineers ranks 2nd for a single game (min. 10 attempts) in program history, trailing only Tate Forcier, who completed 100 percent (12-12) of his passes vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 25, 2010.

▶ **Devin Gardner** owns 12 200-yard passing games in his collegiate career, tying him for 5th on U-M's all-time list in that category with Jim Harbaugh (1983-86) and Denard Robinson (2009-12). Todd Collins (1991-94) ranks 4th with 14 200-yard passing games, and Tom Brady (1996-99) is 3rd with 15.

▶ **Shane Morris** made his first start of the season and second of his career against Minnesota, completing 7-of-19 passes for 49 yards. Morris has appeared in five games in 2014.

▶ **Shane Morris** became the first Michigan quarterback to make his starting debut in a bowl game, tallying 239 yards of total offense against Kanas State in the 2013 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl. Morris, who completed 24-of-38 passes for 196 yards and carried the ball four times for 43 yards against the Wildcats, became the third true freshmen quarterback to start a bowl game for the Wolverines. He joined fellow lefty Rick Leach (1976 Orange Bowl) and Chad Henne (2005 Rose Bowl) as the only rookie signal-callers to lead the Wolverines in a bowl game.

RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

▶ **Devin Funchess** is tied for 14th on U-M's career 100-yard receiving games list with four.

▶ **Devin Funchess** is 2nd in the Big Ten and tied for 39th in the NCAA in receptions per game with his average of 5.9 per game.

▶ **Devin Funchess** is tied for 7th in the Big Ten and for 74th in the NCAA with four receiving touchdowns this season.

▶ **Devin Funchess** is 5th in the Big Ten with 41 receptions this season.

▶ **Devin Funchess'** 525 receiving yards rank 9th in the Big Ten and 66th in the NCAA.

▶ **Devin Funchess'** average of 75.0 receiving yards per game is 6th in the Big Ten and tied for 48th in the country.

▶ **Amara Darboh** is averaging a team-high 15.0 yards per catch this season.

▶ Dating back to 2012, **Devin Funchess** has caught at least one pass in 21 straight games, surpassing Anthony Carter (20) for 10th among U-M's all-time leaders in consecutive games with a reception. He needs a catch in three more games to reach the 9th spot, currently held by Desmond Howard (24).

▶ **Devin Funchess** led U-M in receptions (5) and receiving yards (64) at Michigan State.

▶ **Devin Funchess** posted seven receptions for 69 yards and one touchdown in U-M's 18-13 victory vs. Penn State.

▶ **Devin Funchess'** 43-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter vs. the Nittany Lions is a season long. His career-long catch is 59 yards, which he recorded last season at Penn State.

▶ **Devin Funchess** led Michigan in receptions (5) and receiving yards (71) at Rutgers.

▶ **Devin Funchess** paced U-M in catches (4) and receiving yards (37) vs. Minnesota.

▶ **Devin Funchess** led Michigan in catches (4) and receiving yards (82) vs. Utah.

▶ **Devin Funchess** recorded a career-high nine receptions for a game-high 107 yards at Notre Dame.

▶ **Devin Funchess** made his presence felt in Michigan's 52-14 victory vs. Appalachian State, posting seven receptions for 95 yards and a career-high three touchdowns.

▶ Against the Mountaineers, **Devin Funchess** became the third wide receiver in program history to register three touchdown receptions in a season opener.

- ▶ **Amara Darboh** hauled in two receptions for 41 yards at Michigan State.
- ▶ **Amara Darboh** posted career highs with six receptions and 88 receiving yards in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ **Amara Darboh** recorded his first career touchdown on a 17-yard reception in the first quarter vs. the RedHawks.
- ▶ **Jehu Chesson** has posted at least two receptions in six of seven games he has appeared in this season. He has a catch in eight of his last nine games dating back to last season.
- ▶ **Dennis Norfleet** posted a career-high tying three receptions at Michigan State.
- ▶ **Dennis Norfleet** registered a career-long 24-yard reception in the fourth quarter of U-M's 18-13 victory vs. Penn State. His previous long was 20, which he recorded at Rutgers. Norfleet has posted 14 receptions for 102 yards through seven games.
- ▶ **Dennis Norfleet** made his first career start vs. Appalachian State and set career highs with three receptions and 30 receiving yards.
- ▶ **Freddy Canteen** made his first career start at Michigan State and finished the game with one reception for eight yards.
- ▶ **Jake Butt** has posted at least one catch in six straight games.
- ▶ Tight end **A.J. Williams** recorded his first reception of the season and second of his career with a seven-yard catch in the second quarter vs. Utah.
- ▶ Seeing his first extensive action of the season, tight end **Jake Butt** hauled in three receptions for 59 yards and one touchdown in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ **Jake Butt** recorded the third touchdown catch of his career on a 29-yard pass from Devin Gardner in the third quarter vs. the RedHawks.
- ▶ **Jake Butt**, who tore his anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and meniscus in February, made his season debut on the third offensive play vs. Notre Dame.
- ▶ **Khalid Hill** is expected to miss the rest of the 2014 season after tearing his ACL during practice leading up to Michigan's game vs. Penn State. Hill started four of U-M's first six games this season, hauling in four receptions for 37 yards.

RUNNING BACKS

- ▶ **De'Veon Smith's** five rushing TDs this season are tied for 11th in the Big Ten and 74th in the FBS.
- ▶ **De'Veon Smith** made his first career start at Michigan State, rushing for 39 yards and one touchdown on a career-high 11 carries. Smith has amassed 345 yards on 70 carries in 2014 (4.9 avg.).
- ▶ **Justice Hayes** matched his career best with three receptions at Michigan State. He also amassed 27 rushing yards on a season-high nine carries.
- ▶ **Derrick Green** is expected to miss the rest of the 2014 season after suffering a broken clavicle at Rutgers.
- ▶ At the time of his injury, **Derrick Green's** 471 rushing yards through six games were 5th in the Big Ten and 37th in the country. Green's 78.5 rushing yards per game were 8th in the Big Ten and 56th in the FBS.
- ▶ Prior to his injury, **Derrick Green** ranked 9th in the Big Ten and 40th in the NCAA with an average of 5.7 rushing yards per carry.
- ▶ Prior to his injury, **Derrick Green's** 372 rushing yards at home in 2014 ranked 5th in the Big Ten and 17th in the country.
- ▶ **Derrick Green** led the Wolverines in rushing yards (74) and carries (12) at Rutgers.

2014 SCHEDULE NOTES

- ▶ Michigan is one of three schools in the Big Ten and one of nine nationally in a power-five conference that does not play an FCS opponent this season.
- ▶ For the first time in program history, Michigan will play Notre Dame, Michigan State and Ohio State all on the road in the same season.
- ▶ This is the first time since 1966 that Michigan will play Michigan State and Ohio State on the road. It's the sixth time that U-M will play both teams on the road in the same season: 1948, 1958, 1960, 1962, 1964 and 1966.
- ▶ 2014 marked the first time in the history of the Michigan-Michigan State series that the Wolverines played consecutive road games in East Lansing.
- ▶ Three of Michigan's 12 regular-season opponents posted at least nine victories in 2013 -- Michigan State (13-1), Ohio State (12-2) and Notre Dame (9-4).
- ▶ Six of the Wolverines' 12 regular-season opponents received bowl bids in 2013, while compiling a 55-25 record (.688 winning percentage).
- ▶ U-M is scheduled to face three teams ranked in the AP preseason Top 25, tied for the 3rd-highest total among Big Ten programs.

▶ **De'Veon Smith** used 10 carries to amass 31 rushing yards and one touchdown at Rutgers.

▶ **De'Veon Smith** led Michigan in rushing yards (57) and carries (9) vs. Minnesota.

▶ **Derrick Green** rushed for 137 yards and a career-high two touchdowns on a career-high 22 carries in U-M's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ **Derrick Green** posted his first multi-touchdown performance against the RedHawks and upped his career touchdown total to five.

▶ **Derrick Green** recorded 100-yard rushing performances in two of Michigan's first six games this season.

▶ **Derrick Green** rushed for 59 yards on 14 carries and hauled in two receptions for 26 yards vs. Utah.

▶ **Derrick Green** recorded his first career catch, a 14-yard gain, in the third quarter vs. the Utes. He added another 12-yard reception in the fourth quarter.

▶ **Derrick Green** and **De'Veon Smith** each recorded their first career 100-yard rushing performances in Michigan's 52-14 victory vs. Appalachian State.

▶ **Derrick Green** rushed for 170 yards and one touchdown on 15 carries vs. the Mountaineers. His previous single-game high was 84 yards, which he recorded last season at Northwestern.

▶ **De'Veon Smith** posted 115 rushing yards and the first two touchdowns of his career on eight carries vs. Appalachian State. His previous career best was 57 rushing yards, which he tallied last season vs. Ohio State.

▶ For the 38th time in program history U-M boasted two or more 100-yard rushers in a single game vs. Appalachian State, the first time two Wolverine running backs topped 100 yards in the same game since Carlos Brown (132) and Brandon Minor (157) vs. Minnesota on Oct. 27, 2007.

▶ **De'Veon Smith**, **Derrick Green** and **Drake Johnson** posted career-long rushes in Michigan's season opener vs. Appalachian State. Smith ran for 61 yards in the second quarter, Green recorded a 62-yard run in the third quarter and Johnson registered a 27-yard run in the fourth quarter.

OFFENSIVE LINE

▶ Michigan broke the school's single-game total offense yards-per-play record in the season-opening victory vs. Appalachian State with an average of 10.18 yards per play, breaking the previous standard of 9.05 yards per play set in 1996 vs. Minnesota and matched in 2013 vs. Indiana.

▶ Michigan broke the program's single-game rushing average record in the season-opening win vs. Appalachian State. The Wolverines averaged 9.72 yards per carry, gaining 350 yards on 36 attempts, to break the previous record of 9.23 yards per carry set in 1992 vs. Iowa.

▶ **Mason Cole**, **Jack Miller**, **Graham Glasgow** and **Ben Braden** have started the last seven games along the offensive line for Michigan.

▶ Against Appalachian State, left tackle **Mason Cole** became the first true freshman in Michigan history to start a season opener on the offensive line.

▶ **Mason Cole** is the second true freshman in program history to start a game at tackle and sixth true freshman to start a game on the offensive line, joining Bubba Paris (1978), Tom Dixon (1980), Dean Dingman (1987), Justin Boren (2006) and Kyle Bosch (2013).

▶ **Erik Magnuson** made his first career start against the Hoosiers in 2013.

▶ The Michigan offensive line paved the way for Wolverine ball carriers to amass 350 rushing yards (program-record 9.7 yards per carry) vs. Appalachian State, the first time Michigan rushed for at least 350 yards in a game since totaling 353 yards on the ground vs. Illinois on Oct. 13, 2012.

► Junior offensive lineman **Graham Glasgow** made his first start of the season at Notre Dame. Glasgow, who made nine starts at center and four starts at left guard last season, started at right guard against the Fighting Irish, vs. Miami (Ohio) and vs. Minnesota before starting the last four games at left guard.

► Sophomore right tackle **Ben Braden** made his first collegiate start against Appalachian State.

► **David Dawson**, **Chris Fox** and **Logan Tuley-Tillman** made their collegiate debuts in the season opener.

DEFENSIVE LINE

► Michigan has held its opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards in five of eight games this season.

► **Frank Clark** recorded the fourth fumble recovery of his career and his first of the season at Michigan State. He added four tackles, including 1.0 TFL, at the Spartans.

► **Frank Clark** has recorded a tackle for loss in seven of eight games this season.

► **Frank Clark's** 9.5 tackles for loss this season are 5th in the Big Ten and tied for 34th in the nation.

► **Frank Clark** has notched 16.5 TFLs over Michigan's last 17 games.

► **Chris Wormley** tallied his fifth career sack in the first quarter at Michigan State. Wormley has notched a sack in two straight games.

► **Frank Clark** posted 2.0 TFLs, including 1.0 sack, in the 18-13 win vs. Penn State.

► The Wolverines posted six sacks in their 18-13 win vs. Penn State, the program's most since Aug. 30, 2008, vs. Utah.

► **Brennen Beyer** registered a career-high 2.0 sacks vs. the Nittany Lions. His previous game high was one (recorded four times previously).

► **Brennen Beyer** is tied for 10th in the Big Ten with career-high-tying 4.0 sacks in 2014.

► **Bryan Mone** and **Chris Wormley** each made their first collegiate start vs. Penn State.

► **Willie Henry** has notched a sack in two of his last four games.

► **Mario Ojemudia** has recorded a sack in two of Michigan's last four games.

► **Taco Charlton** made his first collegiate start at Rutgers. Charlton finished the game with two tackles for loss, including his second full sack of the season in the third quarter. He has posted a TFL in two of his last four games and four of eight contests this season.

► **Ryan Glasgow** set two new career highs with five tackles and 1.0 TFL vs. Minnesota. His previous high for tackles was three vs. Utah (Sept. 20, 2014).

► **Frank Clark** posted 2.5 tackles for loss vs. Utah, including his first sack of the season.

► **Willie Henry** recorded his first interception and first touchdown of his career on the same play in the second quarter vs. Utah. It was Michigan's first interception for a touchdown since **Brennen Beyer** scored at Iowa last season.

► **Mario Ojemudia** posted a career-high 2.5 TFLs vs. the Utes and matched a career-best with four total tackles vs. Utah.

► **Taco Charlton** recorded his first career sack, for an eight-yard loss, in the second quarter of the 52-14 victory vs. Appalachian State.

► **Ryan Glasgow** made his first collegiate start vs. Appalachian State, while defensive linemen **Maurice Hurst Jr.**, **Bryan Mone**, **Henry Poggi** and **Alex Mitropoulos-Rundus** made their collegiate debuts against the Mountaineers.

▶ **Jake Ryan** posted the seventh double-digit tackle game of his career at Michigan State, finishing the contest with 12 takedowns. Ryan notched six of those tackles in the first quarter.

▶ After posting one tackle for loss against the Spartans, **Jake Ryan** (41.5 TFLs) remains 9th on Michigan's all-time career TFL list. Ryan needs 1.5 TFLs to tie Shawn Crable (43, 2004-07) for 8th on Michigan's all-time list, 2.5 to tie Larry Foote (44, 1998-2001) for 7th and 3.5 to tie Glen Steele (45, 1994-97) for 6th.

▶ **Jake Ryan** leads U-M in tackles (68) and TFLs (10.0) through eight games. Ryan's 10.0 TFLs are tied for 3rd in the Big Ten and 26th in the nation.

▶ **Jake Ryan** is 10th in the Big Ten and tied for 88th in the nation in tackles per game with his average of 8.5.

▶ **Jake Ryan** is 5th in the Big Ten and tied for 37th in the NCAA in TFLs per game (1.3).

▶ Dating back to 2011, **Jake Ryan** has recorded a tackle for loss in 31 of his last 39 games.

▶ **Joe Bolden** notched a career-high 12 tackles at Michigan State. It marked Bolden's fifth career double-digit tackle effort.

▶ **Joe Bolden** has posted 63 tackles through eight games. He is 14th in the Big Ten in tackles per game (7.9 avg.).

▶ **Jake Ryan** notched team highs in total tackles (10) and TFLs (3.0) in Michigan's 18-13 win vs. Penn State.

▶ **Mike McCray** recorded the first TFL of his career for two yards on Penn State's attempted fake punt in the third quarter.

▶ **Joe Bolden** (seven) and **Jake Ryan** (six) combined to record 13 tackles in Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

SECONDARY

▶ **Jarrold Wilson** forced the first fumble of his career in the second quarter at Michigan State. On the same play, **Delano Hill** notched the first fumble recovery of his career.

▶ **Jarrold Wilson** (11) and **Delano Hill** (5) set new career highs in tackles against the Spartans.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** notched an interception in Michigan's 18-13 win vs. Penn State. Lewis is tied for 5th in the Big Ten with two interceptions this season.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** is tied for 21st in the Big Ten with four pass breakups this season.

▶ **Raymon Taylor** has a pass breakup in three of his last four games. He owns 13 career PBUs.

▶ **Raymon Taylor** posted a career-best four pass breakups last season vs. Indiana.

▶ **Dymonte Thomas** made his first collegiate start vs. the Nittany Lions.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** notched a career-high two pass breakups vs. Utah. He also tied a career-best with five tackles vs. the Utes.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** has registered at least one pass breakup in three of Michigan's first eight games.

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** grabbed his first career interception in the first quarter of Michigan's 34-10 victory vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ **Jourdan Lewis** made his first collegiate start vs. the RedHawks.

▶ **Jabril Peppers** matched his career high with three tackles vs. Utah.

▶ **Dymonte Thomas** posted the first forced fumble of his career vs. Miami (Ohio).

▶ **Delonte Hollowell** made his first career start at Notre Dame, finishing the game with a career-high six tackles, including his first career tackle for loss.

▶ Michigan allowed only 127 passing yards in the season opener vs. Appalachian State. U-M limited the Mountaineers to only 11 passing yards in the first half of the season opener.

▶ **Jeremy Clark** and **Jabril Peppers** earned their first collegiate starts vs. Appalachian State. Clark finished with three tackles and one pass breakup, while Peppers recorded two tackles in his first game as a Wolverine.

SPECIAL TEAMS

▶ After registering 52 kickoff return yards in U-M's 18-13 victory vs. Penn State, **Dennis Norfleet** upped his career kick-return yardage to 2,029 to establish a new Michigan school record in the category, surpassing Steve Breaston's previous school record of 1,993 yards. Norfleet also holds the program record with 86 career kickoff returns.

▶ **Dennis Norfleet** (2,029) is in 7th place among the Big Ten's all-time leaders in kickoff return yards, passing Indiana's Marcus Thigpen (2,009, 2005-08). He needs 59 more to reach the 6th spot, currently held by Indiana's Derin Graham (2,088, 1998-2000).

▶ **Will Hagerup's** average of 44.5 yards per punt is 3rd in the Big Ten and 19th in the country.

▶ After booting six punts for 254 yards at Michigan State, **Will Hagerup** moved to 8th among U-M's all-time leaders in career punting yards (5,570 yards), surpassing Stan Kemp (5,467, 1964-66) and Chris Stapleton (5,322, 1989-93).

▶ **Will Hagerup** posted a career-best 400 punt yards on eight punts against Minnesota. His previous high was 353, recorded against Alabama in 2012. His effort vs. the Gophers tied for the 6th most in Michigan program history, matching Hayden Epstein's performance against UCLA on Sept. 16, 2000.

▶ **Will Hagerup** has booted 36 punts for 1,601 yards (44.5 avg.) this season. Eleven of his 36 punts have landed inside the 20 (30.6 percent).

▶ **Matt Wile**, who has appeared in 48 contests, has made 14-of-21 career field goals with a long of 52 yards against South Carolina in the 2013 Outback Bowl.

▶ **Matt Wile** connected on a season-long 48-yard field goal at Michigan State. Wile is tied for 3rd on U-M's single-season list of 40+-yard field goals made with five, tying Remy Hamilton (1996), J.D. Carlson (1989) and Brendan Gibbons (2013).

▶ **Matt Wile** is tied for 6th on Michigan's all-time career list of 40+-yard field goals made with eight, tying Bob Bergeron (1981-84) and Hayden Epstein (1998-2001).

▶ **Matt Wile** recorded a career-best three field goals, coming from 45, 42 and 37 yards, in Michigan's 18-13 victory vs. Penn State. It marked just his third career game with multiple field goals. His 45-yarder in the second quarter vs. the Nittany Lions was a season long.

▶ **Matt Wile** has recorded a field goal of 39 or more yards in five of U-M's last six games. He has also connected on eight of his last nine field goals overall.

▶ Michigan was one of eight teams in the NCAA to block a punt in week one and is one of 31 teams in the nation with at least one punt block this year. Redshirt freshman **Mike McCray** blocked an Appalachian State punt in the second quarter that sophomore **Ben Gedeon** returned 32 yards for a touchdown.

MEMORABLE GAMES

2013: Behind record-setting performances from wide receiver Jeremy Gallon and quarterback Devin Gardner, U-M outlasted Indiana 63-47 in an offensive shootout on Oct. 19, 2013 inside Michigan Stadium. The Wolverines amassed a school-record 751 yards of total offense in the victory. Gardner was 21-for-29 passing for a program-record 503 yards and tacked on an additional 81 rushing yards, totaling five touchdowns (3 rush, 2 pass). His school-record 584 yards of total offense fell one yard short of the Big Ten total offense record. Meanwhile, Gallon finished with 14 receptions for 369 yards and two touchdowns, establishing new Big Ten and school records for most receiving yards in a single game. His 369 yards marked the second-highest ever by an FBS receiver.

1979: Quarterback John Wangler threw a 45-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Anthony Carter as time expired to lift Michigan to a dramatic 27-21 homecoming win over Indiana on Oct. 27, 1979 at Michigan Stadium. U-M led the game 21-7 in the fourth quarter, but the Hoosiers responded with two scores to tie the game, 21-21. Determined not to end the game in a tie, the Wolverines got the ball back at their own 22 with 51 seconds left and proceeded to move the ball down to the Indiana 45-yard line. With six seconds remaining in the game, Wangler hit Carter in stride at the 20-yard line, and Carter zipped his way into the end zone, resulting in one of the most memorable plays in Michigan football history.

Michigan Stadium -- 1927- Present (88th Year)

The football program is in its 88th season in the "Big House" in 2014 with an all-time record of 406-124-15 at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium by defeating Ohio Wesleyan 33-0 on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has increased nine times to its present 109,901. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 38 times in the past 39 years and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 115,109 fans against Notre Dame in the second night game ever in Michigan Stadium in 2013. The previous mark was 114,804 fans against Notre Dame during the first night game at Michigan Stadium in 2011.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 256 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan.

The Wolverines drew 781,144 fans for their seven-game home schedule in 2013. The seven-game average of 111,592 ranked No. 1 in the FBS.

Michigan Stadium was the first college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones. It was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

CAPACITY: 109,901 -- the largest college-owned structure of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

COMPLETION: 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan, led by captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State 21-0.

REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- Michigan defeated Connecticut 30-10.

ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 46,493,237 fans have watched the Wolverines play 543 games. The single-game attendance record is 115,109 set against Notre Dame on Sept. 7, 2013. The NCAA season record of 897,431 was set in 2011.

FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 38 of the past 39 seasons in attendance.

Brady Hoke was named the 19th head coach in University of Michigan football history on Jan. 11, 2011. A former assistant coach at U-M (1995-2002), Hoke has guided the Wolverines to a 29-18 record (16-12 Big Ten) in his first four seasons as head coach of Michigan. Hoke led the Wolverines to an 11-2 record (6-2 Big Ten) and Allstate Sugar Bowl victory in his first season at the helm, while U-M finished the 2012 season with an 8-5 (6-2 Big Ten) mark following a bid to the Outback Bowl. The Wolverines went 7-6 in 2013 and made an appearance in the 2013 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl.

Hoke had previous head coaching stints at San Diego State from 2009-10, where he earned a 13-12 record, and his alma mater, Ball State, where he went 34-38 from 2003-08. Collectively, Hoke is 73-63 in 11 seasons as a head coach.

Hoke's first-season success in Ann Arbor was acknowledged across the country. He was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual. The Big Ten Conference's coaches voted Hoke as the inaugural recipient of the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award, while the Big Ten media named him the Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

With four wins more than the 2010 squad (7-6), Hoke and the Wolverines tied Fielding Yost's 1901 team as the only two teams with a four-win improvement from the previous season. Yost's 1901 team went 11-0 following a 7-2-1 1900 season.

Only the legendary Yost precedes Hoke as a Michigan head coach to win 10 games in his first season. Hoke also became the fifth Big Ten coach to win at least 10 games in his first season as head coach, and became the third U-M coach to win his first six games (Fielding Yost-1901, Bennie Oosterbaan-1948). Nationally, Hoke became one of eight coaches to direct a team to a BCS bowl in his first season, while he became the third coach to direct a team to a BCS bowl victory in his first season.

In 2012, Hoke became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02. The Wolverines were a perfect 8-0 at Michigan Stadium in 2011 and 6-0 at the Big House in 2012.

Since Hoke's arrival, the defense has improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the Football Bowl Subdivision in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in the

country in scoring and total defense in 2011 and 2012. Meanwhile, the offense has averaged over 30 points per game during Hoke's tenure, including averaging 34 points per game through 12 games in 2013.

Fifteen Wolverines have earned All-Big Ten distinction in three seasons under Hoke, including back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year winners in center David Molk (2011) and left tackle Taylor Lewan (2012-13). Devin Funchess also earned Big Ten Kwalick-Clark Tight End of the Year honors in 2013.

The 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, Hoke guided the Aztecs to a 9-4 record, marking the most victories since 1996 (8) while earning the program's first trip to a bowl game in 12 years, a 35-14 victory over Navy. Six of his players earned All-MWC first team honors in 2010, including running back Ronnie Hillman, the league's Freshman of the Year. Seven additional players earned second-team (4) honors and honorable mention (3). In 2009, Hoke's first season at San Diego State, five players were named to All-MWC teams, while 11 were MWC All-Academic selections.

As head coach at Ball State, he mentored players to 35 All-MAC selections in six years en route to a pair of bowl game appearances in 2007 and '08. The 2008 season marked the best season in program history, recording a school-record 12 wins and completing an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular-season campaign.

Collectively, Hoke has 30 years of collegiate coaching experience beginning with assistant positions at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94) and Michigan (1995-2002). A defensive line coach at U-M, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, '98, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl winning squad. During his tenure, U-M posted a 76-23 overall record, claiming at least 10 victories on four occasions.

A 1982 graduate of Ball State University, Hoke earned four letters (1977-80) with the Cardinals. He was part of the only two teams in Ball State football history to post undefeated conference seasons: as a player in 1978, and as the head coach in 2008. Hoke led Ball State to the 1978 MAC championship, and as a team captain in 1980 earned All-MAC second-team honors. He graduated from Fairmont East High School in Kettering, Ohio, in 1977.

He and his wife, the former Laura Homberger, have one daughter, Kelly.

Quarterback Devin Gardner connected with wide receiver Devin Funchess for three touchdowns before halftime, and tailbacks Derrick Green (170 yards) and De'Veon Smith (115) became the first Michigan tailback duo to rush for 100 yards or more apiece in the same game in seven seasons and took advantage of great blocking from the line spearheaded by center Jack Miller to complete a pounding of Appalachian State.

The balanced attack built a 42-0 lead en route to the University of Michigan football team's 52-14 victory in Saturday afternoon's (Aug. 30) season opener before 106,811 at Michigan Stadium.

And the defense limited the Mountaineers to 280 yards total offense, while the special teams provided a touchdown with Ben Gedeon's 32-yard return of a punt blocked by Mike McCray.

The common theme on each unit of the team was an urgency that permeated every play.

"We are just here to make our mark," Funchess said. "You only get one chance to make a first impression. That is what we did today. It shows all of our hard work from offseason. We came out and showed what we had today.

Gardner hit nearly every pass he threw, missing only one of 14 attempts for 173 yards with nary a turnover.

Gardner looks to find more consistency with new offensive coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who tutored outstanding quarterback AJ McCarron in a 2012 national championship season for Alabama.

Both Hoke and Gardner said the quarterback benefited from having Nussmeier on the sideline, exchanging strategy thoughts and tough love.

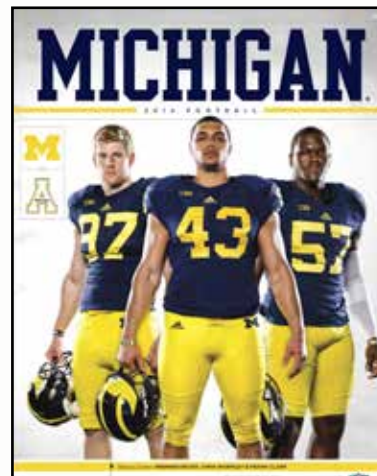
"It helped me a lot in making adjustments during the game, the eye-to-eye factor," said Gardner, noting that the different run play he checked into at the line of scrimmage that resulted in Green's 62-yard run was what most pleased Nussmeier.

"He said it was the best play I made," said Gardner.

Gardner not only made the plays but checked into the right plays -- something he's been urged to do more of this year. Green rushed for 170 yards on 15 carries and Smith had 115 yards on only eight carries. Funchess caught seven passes for 95 yards.

"He's a lot more confident," Funchess said of Gardner. "And as a player, you have to bring swag to yourself. Today, he brought swag."

And together, they brought the house down on Appalachian State.

The University of Michigan football team fell at Notre Dame (No. 16 AP, No. 15 USA Today) 31-0 under the lights at Notre Dame Stadium. Notre Dame quarterback Everett Golson completed 23-of-34 passes for 226 yards and three touchdowns.

Graduate student Devin Gardner finished the game throwing 19-for-31 for 189 yards and two interceptions, while Michigan's leading rusher was sophomore De'Veon Smith, who ran for 30 yards on seven carries. Junior Devin Funchess led all receivers with 107 yards on a career-high nine receptions.

Senior Jake Ryan paced Michigan with a career-high-tying 11 tackles, while junior Joe Bolden added a career-high tying 10 stops. Senior Brennen Beyer recorded U-M's lone sack of the evening, a 16-yard quarterback takedown at the start of the fourth quarter.

Notre Dame scored the first points of the game on a one-yard touchdown run by Cam McDaniel with 1:50 left in the first quarter, taking advantage of two defensive pass interference calls against Michigan on the drive.

Midway through the second quarter, the Irish converted on a fourth-and-3, before Everett Golson threw a two-yard touchdown pass to Amir Carlisle to cap off a 13-play, 80-yard drive with 3:58 left in the first half. Notre Dame scored again before halftime, as Golson found William Fuller in the end zone with 34 seconds left, giving the Irish a 21-0 lead going into the intermission.

Notre Dame continued the scoring in the second half, outscoring Michigan 10-0 after the break. Fuller led Irish receivers with nine catches for 89 yards and a touchdown, while Carlisle finished with seven receptions for 61 yards and two scores.

The Maize and Blue won the rushing yards battle, 100-56, and had more total yards than Notre Dame (289-282) but was penalized five times for 50 yards, while the Irish committed only two penalties for five yards.

Sophomore running back Derrick Green ran for 137 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while graduate student quarterback Devin Gardner passed for 184 yards and two more scores, as the University of Michigan football team rebounded to down Miami University 34-10 inside Michigan Stadium.

Junior/sophomore wide receiver Amara Darboh had a career day, hauling in six receptions for 88 yards and a touchdown, while sophomore tight end Jake Butt added three catches for 59 yards and a touchdown.

The U-M defense was particularly stifling, including posting a shutout in the second half. The Wolverines held Miami to only 33 yards rushing and 198 yards of total offense. Junior linebacker Joe Bolden led the defense with seven tackles, while fifth-year senior linebacker Jake Ryan was right behind him with six tackles.

The Wolverines jumped on the RedHawks early, going up 10-0 in the first quarter on a 29-yard field goal from senior kicker Matt Wile and a 17-yard touchdown pass from Gardner to Darboh. The touchdown drive was set up by a Miami turnover -- the first Michigan had forced this season -- after sophomore defensive back Jourdan Lewis made an acrobatic interception of Miami quarterback Andrew Hendrix to give the Wolverines a short field.

Michigan had trouble holding onto the ball in the second quarter, turning the ball over three times to allow Miami to get back into the game.

A Darboh fumble after a long reception and a Gardner interception led to two Miami scoring drives, the first of which was a 26-yard field goal by Kaleb Patterson. On the ensuing kickoff, Patterson kicked off high and short, but Michigan could not field the ball cleanly, allowing Miami to recover the fumble. With a short field, the RedHawks got on the board with their first touchdown, a short three-yard touchdown pass from Hendrix to Dawan Scott, tying the game at 10-10.

The Wolverines responded on the next drive to take a 17-10 lead into the half. After Gardner was sacked to make it a 2nd-and-17, Green got his number called four consecutive times and covered 47 yards, capping the drive with a short one-yard touchdown run.

The two teams traded punts for most of the third quarter until Butt recorded a 29-yard touchdown reception from Gardner to make the score 24-10.

The Michigan defense opened up the fourth quarter by stopping Miami on fourth down. On the next drive, Gardner engineered a nine-play, 68-yard drive to tack on another touchdown, culminating with Green plowing into the end zone from 12 yards out, increasing the lead to 31-10 with 9:50 to play. Then, with 18 seconds left, Wile added a 40-yard field goal to cap the scoring at 34-10.

Despite leading in total yards and time of possession, the University of Michigan football team dropped a home contest to Utah 26-10 inside Michigan Stadium.

The Wolverines outgained Utah 308-287 and held the Utes to only 82 yards rushing but turned the ball over four times during the contest. Individual statistical leaders included Devin Gardner, who completed 14-of-26 attempts for 148 yards and wide receiver Devin Funchess, who had four receptions for 82 yards. On defense, linebacker Jake Ryan led the way with 13 tackles, including three for loss.

All the scoring the two teams mustered in the first quarter was a field goal each. Michigan got on the board first, courtesy of a 42-yard field goal by senior kicker Matt Wile. The Wolverines did not get any points on their next drive but managed to pin Utah deep after a punt by fifth-year senior Will Hagerup was downed at the three-yard line. The Utes quickly erased that, though, knotting up the score at 3-3 after a 35-yard field goal by Andy Phillips, which was set up largely due to a 67-yard screen pass from quarterback Travis Wilson to running back Bubba Poole on third down. Poole would have likely scored on the play if not for a touchdown-saving tackle by Michigan sophomore defensive back Jourdan Lewis.

On the second play of the second quarter, Utah's Kaelin Clay returned Hagerup's punt 66 yards for a touchdown to stake the road squad a 10-3 lead.

The teams traded punts on each of their next two possessions, before Michigan was driving on the third, making it all the way to Utah's 25-yard line, until Gardner's intended pass for Funchess was intercepted by Ute defensive back Brian Blechen. On the ensuing drive, Utah's backup quarterback Kendal Thompson, who was in the game after Wilson was exited earlier in the quarter, threw an interception deep in his own territory directly to Michigan junior/sophomore defensive tackle Willie Henry (Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville), who ran it back a short seven yards for the touchdown.

Utah's Phillips connected on a 38-yard field goal at the end of a 16-play drive to cap the scoring in the first half, giving the Utes a 13-10 lead going into the break.

Utah added to its lead early in the second half. First, in the opening two minutes of the third quarter, Wilson found Dres Anderson for a 28-yard touchdown to make the score 20-10. Then, in the fourth quarter, Phillips added two more field goals, from 48 and 50 yards, respectively, to increase the lead to 26-10.

Due to severe weather, the game was then suspended for nearly two-and-a-half hours, but neither team scored again.

Despite taking an early lead, the University of Michigan football team could not hold back Minnesota -- which answered with 30 straight points -- dropping a 30-14 decision in the Battle for the Little Brown Jug inside Michigan Stadium. It is the Wolverines' first loss in the rivalry since 2005.

After a scoreless first quarter in which neither team managed to get anything going offensively, Michigan played field position to its advantage. To start the second quarter, fifth-year senior Will Hagerup pinned Minnesota deep, and after a three-and-out, the Wolverines received the ball on the ensuing drive with a short field in front of them. Sophomore running back De'Veon Smith ran the ball four consecutive times for 47 yards, cashing in on a 10-yard scamper to put Michigan in front, 7-0, with 11:10 left in the first half.

The Golden Gophers responded on the next possession to tie the game at 7-7, courtesy of a 10-yard keeper by quarterback Mitch Leidner. Then, on its next drive, despite starting on the one-yard line, Minnesota drove the field and tacked on a 24-yard field goal from Ryan Santoso at the end of the half to take a 10-7 lead into the locker room.

The two teams traded possessions in the third quarter until Minnesota added to its lead with another field goal from Santoso, this time from 48 yards, making the score 13-7. On the second play of the following possession, sophomore Shane Morris' pass was deflected at the line of scrimmage, intercepted and returned for a touchdown by De'Vondre Campbell, increasing the visitor lead to 20-7. Morris fumbled on the next drive, leading to a recovery by Minnesota with a short field. Five plays later, Leidner threw a one-yard touchdown pass to Maxx Williams to make the score 27-7.

The Wolverines kept battling, though. In the fourth quarter, graduate student Devin Gardner replaced Morris at quarterback and promptly drove Michigan down the field for a touchdown to make the score 30-14 with 7:27 to play. The drive was capped by Gardner, who took the ball on a quarterback keeper for the three-yard score.

The University of Michigan football team had a long, go-ahead field goal try blocked and fell at Rutgers by a score of 26-24 under the lights at High Point Solutions Stadium. Devin Gardner threw for 178 yards and rushed for 40 yards and two touchdowns, but it was not enough, as Rutgers' Gary Nova passed for 404 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Scarlet Knights to victory at home.

The Wolverines scored on the opening possession of the game, as Matt Wile connected a 39-yard field goal. Derrick Green ripped off a 26-yard run to begin the drive, and Gardner extended it with a 23-yard completion to Devin Funchess on a third-and-nine situation. Rutgers responded with a field goal of their own, tying the score at 3-3. After forcing a Michigan punt, the Scarlet Knights took a 6-3 lead on a 45-yard field goal with 1:32 left in the first quarter.

U-M scored on its next possession, marching 75 yards down the field for a score. The drive was highlighted by a one-handed catch by Jake Butt that set up a four-yard rushing touchdown for Gardner, who ran around the outside and into the end zone to give Michigan a 10-6 lead just 50 seconds into the second quarter.

After forcing another Wolverine punt, Gary Nova found Andrew Turzilli downfield for an 80-yard touchdown pass. Maurice Hurst Jr. blocked the

ensuing extra-point attempt, holding the Scarlet Knights' lead at 12-10 with 7:23 to play in the first half. Rutgers failed on an attempted fake punt, which gave Michigan the ball on Rutgers' 43-yard line with a little more than four minutes left in the half. This led to a one-yard touchdown rush by De'Veon Smith, giving U-M a 17-12 advantage. The home team charged back, though, and Nova found John Tsimis in the end zone to give Rutgers a 19-17 lead going into halftime.

After another touchdown pass by Nova that increased the Scarlet Knight lead to 26-17, the Maize and Blue answered with another rushing touchdown by Gardner. This time a 19-yard scamper into the end zone, cutting the deficit to 26-24.

Michigan forced a punt on Rutgers' next possession and got the ball on its own 14-yard line with less than six minutes left in the game. The Wolverines drove down the field and attempted a 56-yard field goal with three minutes to go, but it was blocked by Kemoko Turay, sealing the victory for the Scarlet Knights.

Green led all rushers with 74 yards on 12 carries, and Funchess caught five passes for 71 yards. Turzilli led all receivers with 94 yards and two touchdowns.

Behind a defense that allowed only 214 yards of total offense, the University of Michigan football team snapped a three-game losing streak, defeating Penn State, 18-13, in Under the Lights III on Oct. 11 inside Michigan Stadium.

Senior kicker Matt Wile converted all three of his field goal attempts, hitting successfully from 45, 42 and 37 yards, the last of which put U-M up for good in the fourth quarter. Graduate student quarterback Devin Gardner went 16-of-24 for 192 yards and a touchdown in the victory, connecting with junior wide receiver Devin Funchess for the team's lone touchdown in the first quarter. Funchess finished with seven receptions for 69 yards.

But the night belonged to the defense. The Wolverines were stout on the line of scrimmage, sacking Penn State quarterback Christian Hackenberg six times and allowing only 54 yards rushing. Fifth-year senior linebacker Jake Ryan led the way with 10 tackles, including three tackles-for-loss.

Each team put points on the board during a lively first quarter. Sandwiched between a pair of Penn State field goals was Michigan's only touchdown of the night, as Gardner connected with Funchess for a 43-yard score. Gardner's deep ball appeared to be underthrown, but Funchess cut in front of the Penn State defensive back at the last moment to make the catch and run into the end zone for the score. The Wolverines held a 7-6 lead at the end of the first quarter.

The Nittany Lions retook the lead at the outset of the second quarter after forcing Gardner into throwing an interception. Four plays later, Hackenberg found wide receiver DaeSean Hamilton in the back of the end zone for a 10-yard strike, making the lead 13-7.

The Wolverines held the ball for nearly the next seven minutes, finishing off the drive with a 45-yard field goal by Wile to cut the lead to three at 13-10. Neither team scored again in the first half.

In the second half, the Michigan defense stood tall. A momentum-changer came in the third quarter when the punt return unit successfully snuffed out a fake punt near midfield. Later, sophomore defensive back Jourdan Lewis intercepted Hackenberg, setting up Michigan with great field position that led to another Wile field goal -- this time from 42 yards -- to tie the game at 13-13.

With 11:24 to go in the contest, Wile put Michigan ahead for good with a 37-yard field goal. After the two teams traded punts, Penn State got the ball back with 3:44 left in the game with a chance to tie or take the lead, but the defense simply wouldn't allow it. Back-to-back sacks of Hackenberg (one of which was a sack via intentional grounding) gave Penn State a fourth-and-32 from the three-yard line and only 1:43 left. The Nittany Lions intentionally snapped the ball out of the end zone -- resulting in a safety to make the score 18-13 -- in order to try and outside kick. PSU recovered the first attempt, but it was called back because of an offsides penalty. The second attempt was recovered by senior/junior defensive back Blake Countess allowing Michigan to run out the clock for the victory.

The Michigan football team struggled to stop Michigan State on offense and lost 35-11 on at Spartan Stadium. The victory gave the Spartans the Paul Bunyan trophy for the second straight year.

Devin Gardner finished the game 12-of-30 passing for 125 yards and two interceptions. De'Veon Smith was Michigan's leading rusher with 39 yards and one touchdown on 11 carries, while Jake Ryan and Joe Bolden each recorded a game-high 12 tackles.

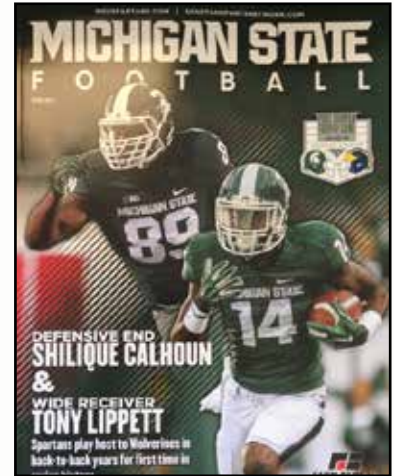
The Spartans scored on the first possession of the game, moving 75 yards down the field on eight plays. Jeremy Langford punched in a two-yard rushing touchdown to end the drive, and MSU took a 7-0 lead at the 11:52 mark of the first quarter.

Michigan forced MSU to go three-and-out on its next possession, and during the punt, Chris Frey was flagged for a helmet-to-helmet hit on Amara Darboh. Following a review of the play, Frey was ejected from the game for targeting. The penalty gave the Wolverines the ball on MSU's 29 yard-line, but a fumble surrendered the ball back to the Spartans. Michigan State drove all the way to Michigan's 5-yard line, but the Maize and Blue pushed the home team back 13 yards in two plays, and Michael Geiger missed a 36-yard field goal attempt with 1:08 left in the first quarter.

After another Michigan punt, Josiah Price fumbled on second down, giving the Maize and Blue possession on State's 31 yard-line. This set up a 48-yard field goal by Matt Wile, bringing the score to 7-3 with 3:30 remaining before the break. State responded with a 73-yard drive, capped off by a one-yard Langford touchdown run to give his squad a 14-3 lead heading into halftime.

With 10:05 to go in the third quarter, RJ Williamson intercepted Gardner and returned the ball 29 yards for a touchdown. This put the Spartans up 21-3, and on their first play after forcing a Michigan punt, Connor Cook threw a 70-yard touchdown pass to Tony Lippett to increase the lead to 28-3. On the Wolverines' next drive, they made it all the way to State's 6-yard line, but Gardner was just inches short of the first-down marker on a fourth-and-five play.

U-M recovered a Michigan State fumble with 5:24 left in the fourth quarter and gained possession on MSU's 33-yard line. Receptions by Devin Funchess and Freddy Canteen set up a one-yard touchdown run by Smith. The Wolverines elected to go for two, and Gardner found Jake Butt in the end zone to make the score 28-11 with 3:40 remaining. Langford ran in another touchdown on the Spartans' final possession, making the final score 35-11.
