DID YOU KNOW?

- This will be the 63rd meeting for the Paul Bunyan Trophy.
- U-M's defense ranks in the top 5 nationally in seven categories; leads the nation in scoring (6.3 avg.) and third down defense (18.1%) while listing second in total defense (181.3 avg.), pass defense (115.5 avg.) and pass efficiency (76.6 rating).
- U-M had three players named Big Ten Player of the Week: Jourdan Lewis (defense), Jehu Chesson (special teams) and Jabrill Peppers (freshman).
- Michigan is ranked 12th in the AP poll and 14th in the coaches poll.
- U-M faces its third ranked team in the past four games.

Radio Coverage

In its 14th season as a division of IMG College, the Michigan Sports Network represents one of the largest and most-listened to college sports network in the Midwest. Anchored by WWJ-AM (950) in Detroit, the Michigan IMG Radio Network is comprised of 34 affiliate stations in Michigan and Ohio during football season. In addition, U-M football can also be heard on American Armed Forces Radio and is also available on Sirius (channel 81) and XM (channel 81). Jim Brandstatter (play-by-play) and Dan Dierdorf (color) bring the action to you from the booth, with Doug Karsch providing sideline reports and analysis. Jon Jansen hosts the pre-game tailgate show with Karsch and provides halftime and post-game analysis on the network.

Wolverines and Spartans

This will be the 108th meeting between Michigan and Michigan State. The Wolverines hold a 68-34-5 advantage in the all-time series and has won 23 of the last 35 games played between the two schools. U-M has a 34-18-3 mark against Michigan State in games played at Michigan Stadium.

Battle for the Paul Bunyan Trophy

Today's game will be the 63rd meeting for the Paul Bunyan Trophy. Since the battle for the trophy began in 1953 with Michigan State's inception into the Big Ten, Michigan holds a 35-25-2 advantage in the series and quest for the coveted trophy. Michigan has won 31 of the past 45 games played between the two rivals (since 1970).

- The Wolverines (.730) trail the Irish (.732) in all-time winning percentage.

109th Season of Big Ten Action

- Michigan is in its 109th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference.
- The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 487-198-18 record in conference play and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships.
- U-M also leads the conference with 402 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

U-M In 136th Season of Gridiron Action

- The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine 1-0 at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto 0-0 in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1.
- U-M enters its 132nd year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games.
- The Wolverines are the sixth-oldest football program in NCAA history.

Battle for State Supremacy

- The annual battle on the gridiron between Michigan and Michigan State started in 1898 and has featured some of the most exciting contests in both schools' histories.
- The two programs have met every year since 1945, a streak of 70 consecutive seasons.
- With the exception of 1943 and 1944, when the series was suspended due to World War II, the Wolverines and Spartans have met on the football field every year since 1910.

Michigan State Series History

- This will be the 108th meeting in the all-time series with Michigan State
- The Wolverines lead the all-time series, 68-34-5, and have won 23 of the last 35 games played between the two schools dating back to 1979
- Michigan has won four of the last 10 games in the series; their last win came in 2012, a 12-10 affair at Michigan Stadium
- The last two games in the series were played in East Lansing, a pair of victories secured by the Spartans

63rd Battle for the Paul Bunyan Trophy

- Today's game between the in-state rivals will be the 63rd played for the Paul Bunyan Trophy
- The Wolverines hold a 35-25-2 advantage in the trophy game
- Michigan has won 31 of the past 45 games played between the two schools since 1970
- Michigan State has won six of the past seven but the series is tied, 6-6, in the last 12 games played in the series
- MSU has held possession of the Bunyan Trophy for the past two seasons, winning a 29-6 game in 2013 and a 35-11 affair in 2014; both games were played at Spartan Stadium in East Lansing

Paul Bunyan Trophy History

- The Paul Bunyan Trophy dates back to 1953, when Michigan State entered the Big Ten Conference, and has become the cornerstone of the Michigan-Michigan State rivalry since its inception
- It was a donation by then-Michigan governor G. Mennen Williams, the Paul Bunyan Trophy stands nearly four feet tall
- The wooden trophy depicts the figure of legendary folk hero Paul Bunyan astride an axe,

with his feet planted over the state of Michigan. On each corner of the state lies a flag emblazoned with the Michigan 'M' or the Spartan 'S.' Each year the winner of the Michigan-Michigan State game is awarded ownership of the prize

Greater Rushing Effort Key to Victory

- One of the major components to securing victory in the annual Michigan-Michigan State football game has been the ground game
- The school that has won the running game battle has claimed wins in 43 of the last 47 contests
- From 1969 through 1994 -- 26 consecutive games -- the winning team gained more yards on the ground
- MSU put an end to the string by winning in 1995 despite being out-gained in the rushing department by the Wolverines 218 to 73
- Michigan lost the rushing battle in 2007, 191-100, but came out on top in a 28-24 affair at Spartan Stadium

U-M vs. MSU at the Big House

- This will be the 55th game between the two rivals at Michigan Stadium
- The Wolverines have compiled a 34-18-3 record at Michigan Stadium, including a 12-10 victory in the 2012 meeting at the Big House
- U-M has claimed victories in 11 of the last 14 games played at Michigan Stadium
- The Wolverines boast an impressive 18-5 home record against the Spartans since 1968
- Michigan sports a 49-20-3 all-time record against Michigan State in Ann Arbor

When Both Teams are Ranked Nationally

- This will be the 17th time in history of series that both teams enter the game ranked in the national polls
- The all-time series is 6-9-1 when both teams are listed in the polls
- Michigan lost the last meeting when both squads were ranked, a 6-29 drop in East Lansing during the 2013 season (U-M #23, MSU #24)
- U-M won games in 1964, 1975, 1979, 1989, 1997, 2003 while Michigan State claimed victories in 1950, 1951, 1956, 1957, 1961, 1999, 2010, 2011, and 2013 seasons; the lone tie came in 1958

Michigan When Ranked vs. MSU

- This will be the 50th time that Michigan enters a match-up with Michigan State ranked in the top 25 of the Associated Press national poll
- The Wolverines have compiled a 30-18-1 record in those contests, but is 6-9-1 when both teams are ranked in the AP poll
- U-M has won 28 of the past 41 games when they enter the game listed in the top 25

The 2015 Schedule

- Michigan's 2015 opponents had a combined record of 88-67 (.568) during the 2014 season
- U-M will play eight teams that played in bowl

game during the 2014 season: Utah (Las Vegas), BYU (Miami Beach), Maryland (Foster Farms), Michigan State (Cotton), Minnesota (Citrus), Rutgers (Quick Lane), Penn State (Pinstripe), Ohio State (Sugar/College Football Playoff)

- Five of the seven teams in the Big Ten East Division played in bowl games last year
- Michigan's 2015 crossover opponents in the Big Ten West Division are Indiana and Minnesota
- Three of the Wolverines five road games will be played in primetime. U-M suffered a 24-17 defeat to Utah in its season opener at Rice-Eccles Stadium at night. The 2015 team will also play its Big Ten opener at Maryland and will travel to Minnesota for a Halloween night game
- The Wolverines will host rivals Michigan State and Ohio State at Michigan Stadium for the first time since 1967
- Michigan will not face a team from the Mid-American Conference for the first time 2012 and for just the second time in the past 15 seasons
- All four non-conference opponents from the western half of the United States: Utah, Oregon State, UNLV and BYU

The Team, The Team, The Team

- Michigan scored on offense, defense and special teams against Northwestern; it was the first time since the Indiana game in 2003 that U-M accomplished the feat
- Michigan has outscored the opposition, 97-0, over its last three games; has not allowed a point in 41 straight defensive possessions
- The Wolverines have outscored the opponent, 157-7, over the last 19 quarters, stretching back to the start of the second quarter against Oregon State (Sept. 12)

Offense:

- The offense has been balanced through five games, with the ground game gaining 201.3 yards per contest and the air attack averaging 189.2 yards per game
- Michigan has gained 1,208 rushing yards on the season; rushed 253 times for 1,208 yards and 15 touchdowns
- Seven different Wolverines have scored rushing touchdowns this season, led by tailback De'Veon Smith (4) and quarterback Jake Rudock (3); three others have two rushing scores
- In the passing game, Michigan has completed 106-of-175 (60.6 pct.) for 1,135 yards and five touchdowns
- U-M has won the time of possession battle in each of the six contests this season and has 9-minute-plus advantage on the opposition (34:48 to 25:12)
- Michigan's offensive line has allowed eight sacks in six games; The front did not yield a sack at Utah or against UNLV and allowed one sack vs. Oregon State, two against BYU and Maryland and three vs. Northwestern
- The offense has converted 19-20 red zone chances this season. U-M has scored 15 touchdowns and four field goals. The Wolverines

scored four rushing touchdowns and converted one field goal against Oregon State after tallying two passing touchdowns and one field goal at Utah. Michigan scored one rushing and one passing TD against UNLV. U-M went 3-for-4 against BYU, scoring three touchdowns.

- The Wolverines are converting 43 percent of their third-down chances (39-of-90) and have moved the chains on 4-of-10 fourth-down opportunities
- Jake Butt leads a tight end corps that includes fellow veterans A.J. Williams, Khalid Hill and Michael Jocz. The tight end corps has collected 35 passes for 447 yards and one touchdown. Butt is the team's second-leading receiver with 22 receptions for 274 yards followed by A.J. Williams (7 for 79 yards), Ian Bunting (4 for 55 yards) and Khalid Hill (2 for 39 yards).
- Michigan has lined up with the same five starters along the offensive line in each of the six games. This group boasts 102 combined starts, with each of the five players having double-digit starts in their careers: Graham Glasgow (29), Kyle Kalis (21), Erik Magnuson (18), Mason Cole (17) and Ben Braden (17)
- Despite starting just two games in 2014, De'Veon Smith rushed for a team-high 519 yards on 108 carries (4.8 avg.). He led the Wolverines with six rushing touchdowns and posted only 17 lost yards on those 108 attempts
- Senior fullbacks Joe Kerridge and Sione Houma are leading the way for a corps of running backs. The duo has combined for 20 carries totaling 116 yards and one touchdown. In the passing game, Kerridge has grabbed four receptions for 27 yards and Houma has three catches for 19 yards.

Jake Butt

- 2015 Mackey Award candidate; award given annually to the nation's top tight end
- Team's top career receiver with 64 receptions for 728 yards and five touchdowns
- Has 23 receptions totaling 282 yards and one touchdown this season
- Caught at least one pass in nine straight games and in 17 of his last 20 games
- Led team with four receptions for 61 yards against Maryland (4 for 61 yards)
- Made 3 catches for 40 yards vs. Northwestern
- Had a 41-yard reception against BYU, the longest reception for a Wolverine this year
- Made four receptions for 25 yards and gained two yards on a fumble vs. Oregon State; surpassed the 50-catch mark for his career
- Tied for the team lead with eight receptions totaling 93 yards and one touchdown at Utah; set new career highs in receptions and yards
- His eight catches at Utah are the most for a U-M tight end since Jay Riemersma collected nine receptions against Michigan State in 1995
- Scored team's first TD of the season on a 19-yard pass from Jake Rudock with 46 seconds left in the third quarter against the Utes
- Appeared in 10 games and made five starts as a sophomore in 2014; caught 21 passes for 211

Mason Cole

- Started 18 consecutive games at left tackle
- Starting left tackle in all six games this year
- Returning starter after earning first varsity letter in 2014
- Named to the Freshman All-America Team by Sporting News, ESPN.com and 247Sports.com
- Started all 12 games at left tackle during the 2014 season
- Became the first true freshman in school history to start a season opener along the offensive line; started the opener against Appalachian State at left tackle
- Joined former U-M All-American Bubba Paris as the only Wolverines to start a game at tackle as a true freshman

Defense:

- Michigan is ranked in the top 5 nationally in six defensive categories
- The defense has pitched a shutout in three consecutive games for the first time since the 1980 season; Michigan became the first FBS school to accomplish the feat since Kansas State shut out three straight opponents in 1995
- U-M is just the fifth team ever to have multiple 28-point shutouts over AP ranked teams in a single season: 1945 Army, 1948 Michigan, 1956 Georgia Tech, 1966 Notre Dame and this year's teams are the only to accomplish the feat
- Michigan is the first team since 2011 to hold two major conference/independent opponents under 110 total yards in a game
- Michigan has held the opposition scoreless in 18 of the last 19 quarters
- The defense has yielded just seven points over the last 19 quarters (TD by Oregon State)
- The U-M defense is allowing just 65 yards per contest rushing and 115.5 yards passing
- The Wolverines have yielded 38 points on the season (6.3 avg.)

THE PAUL BUNYAN TROPHY

The annual Michigan-Michigan State game gives the winner state bragging rights, an inside track to a bowl game, and last, but certainly not least, ownership of the mammoth Paul Bunyan Trophy. The four-foot wooden statue, donated by then-Governor G. Mennen Williams in 1953, portrays the legendary figure astride an axe with feet planted on a map of the state of Michigan. Two flags—one with the Michigan ‘M’ and the other with the Michigan State ‘S’—are planted on either side of Bunyan.

Since the battle for the trophy began in 1953 with Michigan State’s inception into the Big Ten Conference, Michigan holds a 35-25 edge with two ties. Since 1970, Michigan has won 31 of the 45 games played between the two schools.

The first game for the Paul Bunyan Trophy was a disputed one for the Wolverines, who said before the Michigan State game that they would refuse the trophy if they won. However, Michigan State won the initial contest 14-6 in East Lansing. In 1954, Michigan was glad to take the trophy back when it defeated Michigan State 33-7 in Ann Arbor.

Michigan Stadium -- 1927-2015 (89 Years)

The football program is in its 89th season in the "Big House" in 2015, with a 411-125-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has been altered 10 times to its present capacity of 107,601. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 38 times in the past 40 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 115,109 fans during the 2013 Notre Dame game.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 262 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan, surpassing the population of Ann Arbor itself.

Michigan Stadium was the first college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones and was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

CAPACITY: 107,601 -- the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

COMPLETION: 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- vs. Connecticut.

ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 47,870,155 fans have watched the Wolverines play 551 games (an average of 86,879/game). The stadium attendance record of 115,109 was set on Sept. 7, 2013 against Notre Dame.

FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

100,000-Plus Crowds at Michigan Stadium

The football program has played 262 consecutive home games in front of crowds in excess of 100,000. The last time Michigan did not have 100,000 in attendance in Michigan Stadium was on Oct. 25, 1975 vs. Indiana. A crowd of 93,857 was on hand for the 55-7 Michigan victory.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 38 of the past 40 seasons in attendance.

Jim Harbaugh was named the 20th coach in University of Michigan football history on Tuesday, Dec. 30. He becomes the sixth former Michigan football player to be named the leader of college football's winningest program.

Harbaugh comes to Ann Arbor after an impressive four-year run in the National Football League with the San Francisco 49ers. He led the franchise to the NFC Championship Game in each of his first three seasons, winning the George Halas Trophy as NFC Champions in 2012. Harbaugh tallied a 49-22-1 overall record that included a 5-3 mark in the postseason as 49ers head coach.

Harbaugh led the Niners to a 13-3 regular season record and to the NFC Championship Game during his first season in 2011, earning the AP NFL Coach of the Year award. He followed up with an 11-4-1 regular season mark in 2012, culminating with an appearance in Super Bowl XLVII. Harbaugh's 49ers lost a back-and-forth affair, 34-31, to the Baltimore Ravens and his brother, John, in the only match-up of brothers as head coaches in NFL history. He helped guide San Francisco back to the NFC title game after a 12-4 regular season record in 2013 and posted an 8-8 mark during the 2014 season.

Prior to making the jump to the 49ers, Harbaugh established himself as a leader of young men at the college level. He turned around a Stanford program that went 1-11 prior to his arrival. The Cardinal improved each of his four seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign and FedEx Orange Bowl victory over Virginia Tech in 2010. Harbaugh finished his tenure at Stanford with a 29-21 overall record (.580) and 21-15 mark in Pac-10 Conference play.

After 4-8 and 5-7 records his first two seasons at the helm, Harbaugh led the Cardinal to an 8-5 record and a tie for second place in the Pac-10. The appearance in the Sun Bowl following the season was Stanford's first bowl game since the 2001 season. The program continued its ascension in 2010, posting a 12-1 overall record and 8-1 mark in the Pac-10. Stanford was selected for a BCS bowl game, and proceeded to defeat Virginia Tech, 40-12, to claim the FedEx Orange Bowl in Harbaugh's final game with the program. The

Cardinal finished the 2010 season ranked fifth in the national polls and Harbaugh was named the Woody Hayes Award as the nation's top coach by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. He accepted the 49ers head coaching position on Jan. 7, 2011.

In his first head coaching experience, Harbaugh led the University of San Diego to a 29-6 record during his three seasons directing the program (2004-06). In his first year, the Toreros posted a 7-4 record after winning their final five games of the season. The team proceeded to post 11-1 marks during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, claiming the Pioneer Football League Championship each season.

Harbaugh spent the 2002 and 2003 NFL seasons as the quarterbacks coach with the Oakland Raiders. He worked with the quarterbacks, helping quarterback Rich Gannon lead the organization to Super Bowl XXXVII after posting an 11-5 regular season record and the AFC Western Division title. Gannon won the 2002 AP NFL MVP award and was selected to the 2003 Pro Bowl.

He began preparing for a career as a coach during his professional playing days. Harbaugh spent eight years as

an NCAA-certified unpaid assistant coach for his father, Jack, at Western Kentucky (1994-2001). He worked as an offensive consultant and recruited for the Hilltoppers during that time. Harbaugh's effort helped his father's team capture the 2002 Division I-AA National Championship.

Harbaugh played for five different organizations during his 15-year NFL career (1987-2001). He completed 2,305-of-3,918 passes for 26,288 yards and 129 touchdowns in 177 games. Harbaugh made 140 career starts. He was named the AFC Offensive Player of the Year, the NFL Comeback Player of the Year and a Pro Bowl selection after leading the Indianapolis Colts to the AFC Championship Game in 1995. He was inducted into the Colts Ring of Honor in 2005.

As a collegiate player, Harbaugh was one of the most efficient passers in NCAA history. In 1985, he led the nation in pass efficiency and finished as the runner-up in 1986. His career pass efficiency rating was the NCAA's top mark for over 12 years. Harbaugh won the *Chicago Tribune* Big Ten Most Valuable Player award, earned first-team All-America honors and finished third in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy following the 1986 season.

He completed 387-of-620 passes for 5,449 yards and 31 touchdowns during his career, with all four statistical categories still listing among the top-12 in school history. He also added 12 rushing touchdowns during his career, including eight scores as a senior. Harbaugh became the first Michigan quarterback to ever throw for more than 300 yards in a single game (310 vs. Wisconsin) and eclipsed the 200-yard passing mark 12 times. He led the Wolverines to a 21-3-1 record as a full-time starter during his final two seasons, including a pair of victories against rivals Michigan State and Ohio State.

Harbaugh and his wife, Sarah, have two daughters, Addison and Katherine, and a son, Jack. He also has three children, Jay, James Jr., and Grace.

He is the son of Jack and Jackie Harbaugh. Jack was an assistant coach at Michigan from 1973-79. Harbaugh's brother, John, is head coach of the Baltimore Ravens and his sister, Joani, is married to Indiana University men's basketball coach Tom Crean.

- Harbaugh mentored two Stanford student-athletes to runner-up finishes in Heisman Trophy voting: Toby Gerhart (2009) and Andrew Luck (2010).
