### Radio Coverage

In its 14th season as a division of IMG College, the Michigan Sports Network represents one of the largest and most-listened to college sports network in the Midwest. Anchored by WWJ-AM (950) in Detroit, the Michigan IMG Radio Network is comprised of 34 affiliate stations in Michigan and Ohio during football season. In addition, U-M football can also be heard on American Armed Forces Radio and is also available on Sirius (channel 135) and XM (channel 195). ### Wolverines and Golden Gophers

This will be the 102nd meeting between Michigan and Minnesota. The Wolverines hold a 73-25-3 advantage in the all-time series and have won 22 of the last 24 games played between the two schools. U-M has a 32-12-2 mark against Minnesota in games played in Minneapolis, including a 1-0 mark in the inaugural meeting at TCF Bank Stadium during the 2012 season (35-13).

### U-M Looks to Regain Nation's Oldest Trophy

The Wolverines look to retain possession of the "Little Brown Jug" when they face Minnesota in the 95th battle for the oldest trophy game in college football history. The Wolverines have a 69-23-2 edge in "Little Brown Jug" games. Minnesota gained possession of the Little Brown Jug last season, posting a 30-14 win over Michigan at Michigan Stadium.

## 109th Season of Big Ten Action

- Michigan is in its 109th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference.
- The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 487-199-18 record in conference play and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships.
- U-M also leads the conference with 402 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

## U-M In 136th Season of Gridiron Action

- The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine 1-0 at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto 0-0 in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1.
- U-M enters its 132nd year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games.
- The Wolverines are the sixth-oldest football program in NCAA history.

## Michigan vs. Minnesota in Minneapolis

- This will be the second game played between the two schools at TCF Bank Stadium
- Michigan won the inaugural match-up at the Gophers new home, a 35-13 victory, during the 2012 season
- This will be the 47th game between the two schools in Minnesota; the Wolverines hold a 32-12-2 all-time advantage in games played in Minneapolis
- Michigan is 1-0 at TCF Bank Stadium and posted a perfect 11-0 mark at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome
- U-M has won 19 out of the last 20 games played in Minnesota (1969 to present)
- Michigan has won 15 straight games at Minnesota with its last loss coming during the 1977 season

## Nation's Oldest Trophy Game

- The Wolverines look to regain possession of the "Little Brown Jug" when they face Minnesota in the 95th battle for the oldest trophy game in college football history.
- Michigan has a 69-23-2 edge in Little Brown Jug games
- U-M has won 22 of the last 24 games in the "Little Brown Jug" series and 41 of the last 47 contests.

## Michigan Football on Halloween

- This will be the 19th time that Michigan plays a football game on Halloween
- Michigan has claimed victories in 13 of the 18 previous games played on Oct. 31 with one tie (13-4-1)
- The Wolverines have a 2-0-1 record against the Gophers on Halloween, with all three prior match-ups being held in Minneapolis
- U-M claimed victories over Minnesota in 1981 (34-13) and 1998 (15-10); the infamous 6-6 tie that started the Little Brown Jug rivalry in 1903 was played on Halloween

## Michigan When Ranked vs. Minnesota

- This will be the 52nd time that Michigan enters a match-up with Minnesota ranked in the top 25 of the Associated Press national poll
- The Wolverines have compiled a 41-9-1 record in those contests, including a 24-2 record in the last 26 games when ranked in the AP poll
- U-M has compiled a 7-2 record against the Gophers when both teams enter the game listed in the top 25 of the AP poll
- Michigan lost the first four games played between the two schools when ranked in the polls (1939-42) but has rattled off a 41-5-1 record since that time

- Four of the Wolverines coaches played in the NFL, with each of those individuals logging more than 10 years in the league: Harbaugh (15 years), Greg Jackson (12 years), Tyrone Wheatley (10 years) and Mike Zordich (12 years)
- Those four coaches totaled 49 years of playing experience at the NFL level
- This does not include the seven years of NFL experience logged by strength and conditioning coach Kevin Tolbert and the 21 years of coaching experience gained by defensive analyst Dave Adolph

## The Team, The Team, The Team

- Michigan scored on offense, defense and special teams against Northwestern; it was the first time since the Indiana game in 2003 that U-M accomplished the feat
- Michigan has outscored the opposition, 120-27, over its last four games; did not allow a point in 44 straight defensive possessions before MSU's second quarter TD
- The Wolverines have outscored the opponent, 180-34, over the last 23 quarters, stretching back to the start of the second quarter against Oregon State (Sept. 12)

## Offense:

- The offense has been balanced this season, with the ground game gaining 181.4 yards per contest and the air attack averaging 186.1 yards per game
- Michigan has gained 1,270 rushing yards on the season; rushed 286 times for 1,270 yards and 17 touchdowns
- Seven different Wolverines have scored rushing touchdowns this season, led by tailback De'Veon Smith (4), fullback Sione Houma (3) quarterback Jake Rudock (3); three others have two rushing scores
- In the passing game, Michigan has completed 121-of-200 attempts (60.5 pct.) for 1,303 yards and five touchdowns
- U-M has won the time of possession battle in six of seven contests this season and has 8-minute-plus advantage on the opposition (34:05 to 25:55); the team lost the TOP battle against Michigan State (30:11-29:49)
- Michigan's offensive line has allowed 11 sacks in seven games; The front did not yield a sack at Utah or against UNLV and allowed one sack vs. Oregon State, two against BYU and Maryland and three vs. Northwestern and Michigan State
- The offense has converted 24-25 red zone chances this season. U-M has scored 17 touchdowns and seven field goals. The Wolverines scored four rushing touchdowns and converted one field goal against Oregon State after tallying two passing touchdowns and one field goal at Utah. Michigan scored one rushing and

one passing TD against UNLV. U-M went 3-for-4 against BYU, scoring three touchdowns.

- The Wolverines are converting 41 percent of their third-down chances (43-of-105) and have moved the chains on 4-of-11 fourth-down opportunities
- Jake Butt leads a tight end corps that includes fellow veterans A.J. Williams, Khalid Hill and Michael Jocz. The tight end corps has collected 38 passes for 471 yards and one touchdown. Butt is the team's second-leading receiver with 23 receptions for 278 yards followed by A.J. Williams (9 for 99 yards), Ian Bunting (4 for 55 yards) and Khalid Hill (2 for 39 yards).
- Michigan has lined up with the same five starters along the offensive line in each of the seven games. This group boasts 111 combined starts, with each of the five players having double-digit starts in their careers: Graham Glasgow (31), Kyle Kalis (24), Mason Cole (19), Ben Braden (19) and Erik Magnuson (18)
- Despite starting just two games in 2014, De'Veon Smith rushed for a team-high 519 yards on 108 carries (4.8 avg.). He led the Wolverines with six rushing touchdowns and posted only 17 lost yards on those 108 attempts
- Senior fullbacks Joe Kerridge and Sione Houma are leading the way for a corps of running backs. The duo has combined for 25 carries totaling 148 yards and three touchdowns. In the passing game, Kerridge has grabbed four receptions for 27 yards and Houma has three catches for 19 yards.

## Jake Butt

- 2015 Mackey Award candidate; award given annually to the nation's top tight end
- Team's top career receiver with 65 receptions for 728 yards and five touchdowns
- Has 23 receptions totaling 278 yards and one touchdown this season
- Caught at least one pass in 10 straight games and in 18 of his last 21 games
- Led team with four receptions for 61 yards against Maryland (4 for 61 yards)
- Made 3 catches for 40 yards vs. Northwestern
- Had a 41-yard reception against BYU, the longest reception for a Wolverine this year
- Made four receptions for 25 yards and gained two yards on a fumble vs. Oregon State; surpassed the 50-catch mark for his career
- Tied for the team lead with eight receptions totaling 93 yards and one touchdown at Utah; set new career highs in receptions and yards
- His eight catches at Utah are the most for a U-M tight end since Jay Riemersma collected nine receptions against Michigan State in 1995
- Scored team's first TD of the season on a 19-yard pass from Jake Rudock with 46 seconds left in the third quarter against the Utes
- Appeared in 10 games and made five starts as a sophomore in 2014, catching 21 passes for 211 yards and scored two touchdowns
- Named to the ESPN.com All-Big Ten Freshman Team after appearing in all 13 games with eight

starts in 2013; recorded 20 receptions for 235 yards and two touchdowns on the season

- Notched career highs in receptions (5), receiving yards (85) and posted a 37-yard career long catch while adding one touchdown reception against Ohio State in 2013

## Jehu Chesson

- Hauled in 45 passes for 565 yards and one TD during his career
- Appeared in 31 career games with 13 starts at wide receiver; started six games this year
- Tallied a reception in 16 of the last 20 games dating back to 2013
- Has two rushing touchdowns and a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown this season
- Gained 303 offensive yards; carried the ball six times for 113 yards and two touchdowns and caught 17 passes for 190 yards
- Led the team with four receptions totaling 58 yards against Michigan State
- Took the opening kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown against Northwestern; became the second player in school history to take the opening kickoff of the game for a TD (Tyrone Wheatley vs. Houston in 1992); caught two passes for 26 yards and rushed twice against the Wildcats
- Named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Northwestern
- Led team with 107 yards at Maryland, catching four passes for 41 yards and scoring on a 61-yard jet sweep
- Scored his first career rushing TD on a 36-yard jet sweep against UNLV; added a 12-yard catch
- Caught a 14-yard pass, gained four yards on a reverse and played special teams vs. Oregon St
- Caught three passes for 22 yards at Utah
- His lone receiving touchdown, a 33-yard catch against Akron in 2013, was the very first reception of his career
- Made 14 receptions for 154 yards during the 2014 season; made four starts at wide receiver

## Amara Darboh

- Team-leader with 28 receptions for 332 receiving yards and two touchdowns this season
- Caught three passes for 52 yards against Michigan State
- Made two receptions for 11 yards vs. NU
- Snared three catches for 27 yards at Maryland
- Caught four passes for 57 yards and one touchdown against BYU; snared a one-handed catch that set-up the first scoring drive of the game
- Became a U.S. citizen on Thursday, Sept. 24, after taking the formal oath at the U.S. Federal Court House in Detroit
- Surpassed the 50-catch mark for his career against UNLV, hauling in a team-high four receptions for 34 yards
- Made four catches for 50 yards vs. Oregon St
- Led team with 101 receiving yards on eight receptions and one touchdown at Utah
- Caught a 10-yard TD reception from Jake Rudock with 54 seconds left in the contest against the Utes

- U-M is just the fifth team ever to have multiple 28-point shutouts over AP ranked teams in a single season: 1945 Army, 1948 Michigan, 1956 Georgia Tech, 1966 Notre Dame and this year's teams are the only to accomplish the feat
- Michigan is the first team since 2011 to hold two major conference/independent opponents under 110 total yards in a game
- U-M held the opposition scoreless in 13 consecutive quarters and in 19 of 20 quarters (second quarter of Oregon State until the second quarter of the Michigan State game); the only points came on a fourth quarter touchdown by UNLV
- The U-M defense is allowing just 65 yards per contest rushing and 146 yards passing

- Michigan has 13 different players with 15 or more stops this season
- U-M forced eight 3-and-outs by BYU in 12 drives and 12 in 16 drives for Maryland
- The Wolverines have forced eight turnovers on the season (seven interceptions and one fumble); picked up a season-high three picks at Maryland
- Jeremy Clark leads the team with three interceptions (Utah, UNLV and Maryland) followed by Jourdan Lewis with two picks (Maryland and Northwestern)
- The defense has batted down 34 passes in seven games, led by cornerback Jourdan Lewis' 16 PBUs; U-M batted down a season-high 10 passes against Michigan State and also added six PBUs at Maryland and added five vs. Northwestern

## HISTORY OF THE LITTLE BROWN JUG

According to the NCAA records book, there are 65 trophy games involving Division I-A teams. They all owe their creation to the University of Michigan, the University of Minnesota, some misgivings about water and a 30-cent, putty-colored jug.

Michigan had won 28 straight games as it headed to Minneapolis for a battle with Minnesota in 1903. The Golden Gophers came into the game 10-0 on the season, with a crowd of 20,000 to root the home team on. Having doubts that Minnesota would provide pure water to the Michigan bench, head coach Fielding Yost ordered a manager, Tommy Roberts, to purchase a receptacle for drinking water which would be free from suspicion. Roberts purchased a five-gallon jug from a variety store in Minneapolis, and Michigan and Minnesota prepared to duel.

The Wolverines took a 6-0 lead in the first half, but the Gophers rallied to tie the game on a touchdown with two minutes remaining. When Minnesota blasted over the goal line, the fans, some sitting in trees and atop telephone poles, rushed the field in excitement. The pandemonium that ensued led to the game being called with time still left on the clock.

In their haste to leave and catch the train back to Chicago, the Michigan players dressed quickly and departed the stadium, leaving the jug behind. Minnesota equipment manager Oscar Munson found the jug the following morning and brought it to Director of Athletics L.J. Cooke. In remembrance of the exceptional tie, they decided to hold on to the jug and adorned it by painting, "Michigan Jug - Captured by Oscar, October 31, 1903," and the score "Minnesota 6, Michigan 6" on the side of the jug.

When Yost sent a letter requesting the return of the jug, Cooke wrote back, "If you want it, you'll have to come up and win it." Due to the brutality of the 1903 game, the two teams did not meet again until 1909, when Michigan did win the jug, 15-6. The Wolverines defended the jug in Ann Arbor in 1910, but due to Michigan's withdrawal from the Big Ten, the jug was not played for again until 1919.

The trophy disappeared from the trophy case of the Michigan Athletic Administration building in 1930 and was not found until 1934. Before the actual jug was found behind a clump of bushes by a gas station attendant in Ann Arbor, a replica of the prize was displayed in Michigan's trophy case. The authenticity of the original was confirmed by a flaw that could not be duplicated. Since then, the trophy has been carefully safeguarded.

Dating back to 1909, the battle for the Little Brown Jug is the oldest trophy game in Division I FBS. Sixteen years passed before the next trophy game was created. In 1925, the Illibuck (Illinois-Ohio State), the Old Oaken Bucket (Indiana-Purdue) and the Beer Barrel (Kentucky-Tennessee) trophies were first played for, the last of which was created, "to rival Michigan's Brown Jug."

**Michigan Stadium -- 1927-2015 (89 Years)**

The football program is in its 89th season in the "Big House" in 2015, with a 411-126-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has been altered 10 times to its present capacity of 107,601. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 38 times in the past 40 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 115,109 fans during the 2013 Notre Dame game.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 263 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan, surpassing the population of Ann Arbor itself.

Michigan Stadium was the first college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones and was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

**CAPACITY:** 107,601 -- the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

**COMPLETION:** 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

**FIRST GAME:** October 1, 1927 -- Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

**DEDICATION GAME:** October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

**REDEDICATION GAME:** September 4, 2010 -- vs. Connecticut.

**ATTENDANCE:** Since 1927 -- 47,981,895 fans have watched the Wolverines play 552 games (an average of 86,924/game). The stadium attendance record of 115,109 was set on Sept. 7, 2013 against Notre Dame.

**FIELD:** 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

**100,000-Plus Crowds at Michigan Stadium**

The football program has played 263 consecutive home games in front of crowds in excess of 100,000. The last time Michigan did not have 100,000 in attendance in Michigan Stadium was on Oct. 25, 1975 vs. Indiana. A crowd of 93,857 was on hand for the 55-7 Michigan victory.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 38 of the past 40 seasons in attendance.

Jim Harbaugh was named the 20th coach in University of Michigan football history on Tuesday, Dec. 30. He becomes the sixth former Michigan football player to be named the leader of college football's winningest program.

Harbaugh comes to Ann Arbor after an impressive four-year run in the National Football League with the San Francisco 49ers. He led the franchise to the NFC Championship Game in each of his first three seasons, winning the George Halas Trophy as NFC Champions in 2012. Harbaugh tallied a 49-22-1 overall record that included a 5-3 mark in the postseason as 49ers head coach.

Harbaugh led the Niners to a 13-3 regular season record and to the NFC Championship Game during his first season in 2011, earning the AP NFL Coach of the Year award. He followed up with an 11-4-1 regular season mark in 2012, culminating with an appearance in Super Bowl XLVII. Harbaugh's 49ers lost a back-and-forth affair, 34-31, to the Baltimore Ravens and his brother, John, in the only match-up of brothers as head coaches in NFL history. He helped guide San Francisco back to the NFC title game after a 12-4 regular season record in 2013 and posted an 8-8 mark during the 2014 season.

Prior to making the jump to the 49ers, Harbaugh established himself as a leader of young men at the college level. He turned around a Stanford program that went 1-11 prior to his arrival. The Cardinal improved each of his four seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign and FedEx Orange Bowl victory over Virginia Tech in 2010. Harbaugh finished his tenure at Stanford with a 29-21 overall record (.580) and 21-15 mark in Pac-10 Conference play.

After 4-8 and 5-7 records his first two seasons at the helm, Harbaugh led the Cardinal to an 8-5 record and a tie for second place in the Pac-10. The appearance in the Sun Bowl following the season was Stanford's first bowl game since the 2001 season. The program continued its ascension in 2010, posting a 12-1 overall record and 8-1 mark in the Pac-10. Stanford was selected for a BCS bowl game, and proceeded to defeat Virginia Tech, 40-12, to claim the FedEx Orange Bowl in Harbaugh's final game with the program. The

Cardinal finished the 2010 season ranked fifth in the national polls and Harbaugh was named the Woody Hayes Award as the nation's top coach by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. He accepted the 49ers head coaching position on Jan. 7, 2011.

In his first head coaching experience, Harbaugh led the University of San Diego to a 29-6 record during his three seasons directing the program (2004-06). In his first year, the Toreros posted a 7-4 record after winning their final five games of the season. The team proceeded to post 11-1 marks during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, claiming the Pioneer Football League Championship each season.

Harbaugh spent the 2002 and 2003 NFL seasons as the quarterbacks coach with the Oakland Raiders. He worked with the quarterbacks, helping quarterback Rich Gannon lead the organization to Super Bowl XXXVII after posting an 11-5 regular season record and the AFC Western Division title. Gannon won the 2002 AP NFL MVP award and was selected to the 2003 Pro Bowl.

He began preparing for a career as a coach during his professional playing days. Harbaugh spent eight years as

# MICHIGAN FOOTBALL HEAD COACH JIM HARBAUGH

an NCAA-certified unpaid assistant coach for his father, Jack, at Western Kentucky (1994-2001). He worked as an offensive consultant and recruited for the Hilltoppers during that time. Harbaugh's effort helped his father's team capture the 2002 Division I-AA National Championship.

Harbaugh played for five different organizations during his 15-year NFL career (1987-2001). He completed 2,305-of-3,918 passes for 26,288 yards and 129 touchdowns in 177 games. Harbaugh made 140 career starts. He was named the AFC Offensive Player of the Year, the NFL Comeback Player of the Year and a Pro Bowl selection after leading the Indianapolis Colts to the AFC Championship Game in 1995. He was inducted into the Colts Ring of Honor in 2005.

As a collegiate player, Harbaugh was one of the most efficient passers in NCAA history. In 1985, he led the nation in pass efficiency and finished as the runner-up in 1986. His career pass efficiency rating was the NCAA's top mark for over 12 years. Harbaugh won the *Chicago Tribune* Big Ten Most Valuable Player award, earned first-team All-America honors and finished third in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy following the 1986 season.

He completed 387-of-620 passes for 5,449 yards and 31 touchdowns during his career, with all four statistical categories still listing among the top-12 in school history. He also added 12 rushing touchdowns during his career, including eight scores as a senior. Harbaugh became the first Michigan quarterback to ever throw for more than 300 yards in a single game (310 vs. Wisconsin) and eclipsed the 200-yard passing mark 12 times. He led the Wolverines to a 21-3-1 record as a full-time starter during his final two seasons, including a pair of victories against rivals Michigan State and Ohio State.

Harbaugh and his wife, Sarah, have two daughters, Addison and Katherine, and a son, Jack. He also has three children, Jay, James Jr., and Grace.

He is the son of Jack and Jackie Harbaugh. Jack was an assistant coach at Michigan from 1973-79. Harbaugh's brother, John, is head coach of the Baltimore Ravens and his sister, Joani, is married to Indiana University men's basketball coach Tom Crean.

- Jim Harbaugh joins Gustave Ferbert (1897-99), Elton "Tad" Wieman (1927-28), Harry Kipke (1929-37), Bennie Oosterbaan (1948-58) and Bump Elliott (1959-68) as former Wolverine players to serve as head coach.
