Radio Coverage

In its 14th season as a division of IMG College, the Michigan Sports Network represents one of the largest and most-listened to college sports network in the Midwest. Anchored by WWJ-AM (950) in Detroit, the Michigan IMG Radio Network is comprised of 34 affiliate stations in Michigan and Ohio during football season. In addition, U-M football can also be heard on American Armed Forces Radio and is also available on Sirius (channel 81) and XM (channel 81). Jim Brandstatter (play-by-play) and Dan Dierdorf (color) bring the action to you from the booth, with Doug Karsch providing sideline reports and analysis. Jon Jansen hosts the pre-game tailgate show with Karsch and provides halftime and post-game analysis on the network.

Wolverines and Nittany Lions

This will be the 19th meeting between Michigan and Penn State. The Wolverines have an 11-7 advantage in the all-time series and are 5-4 at Beaver Stadium. U-M will look to end a three-game losing streak at PSU. The Wolverines have a 6-2 mark against the Nittany Lions in games decided by seven points or less.

Michigan in the National Polls

The Wolverines are ranked in the national polls for the eighth straight week. U-M is listed 14th in this week's Associated Press national poll and ranks 13th in the Amway Coaches poll. Michigan entered the season unranked but following a 31-0 shutout of No. 22 BYU, the team checked into the national polls at No. 22 for the Maryland game. The Wolverines have posted a 2-1 mark against teams listed in the top 25 this season.

- The Wolverines (.731) trail the Irish (.733) in all-time winning percentage.

109th Season of Big Ten Action

- Michigan is in its 109th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference.
- The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 490-199-18 record in conference play and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships.
- U-M also leads the conference with 402 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

U-M In 136th Season of Gridiron Action

- The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine 1-0 at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto 0-0 in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1.
- U-M enters its 132nd year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games.
- The Wolverines are the sixth-oldest football program in NCAA history.

Series History with Penn State

- This will be the 19th meeting between Michigan and Penn State
- The Wolverines lead the all-time series, 11-7, and won last season's match-up 18-13 under the lights at Michigan Stadium
- Michigan has a 6-2 advantage in games decided by seven points or less

Michigan vs. Penn State at Beaver Stadium

- The Wolverines will play at Beaver Stadium for the 10th time on Saturday
- U-M has compiled a 5-4 mark against PSU in State College
- Michigan looks to end a three-game losing streak at Beaver Stadium after winning five of the first six game played at the venue
- This will be Jim Harbaugh's first appearance as a head coach at Beaver Stadium

Michigan When Ranked vs. Penn State

- U-M has been ranked in the AP poll for 12 of the 18 match-ups with Penn State, including the first 10 games of the series
- Michigan is 8-4 all-time against Penn State when listed in the top 25 of the polls
- The Wolverines have compiled a 5-3 record against the Nittany Lions when both teams enter the game ranked in the AP poll
- Michigan has a 2-1 mark against Penn State when ranked in the top 5 of the national polls
- U-M has been ranked in the AP national poll for seven of the nine game played at Beaver Stadium, winning five of those seven contests

NFL Coaching Pedigree

- Michigan has 85 years of NFL experience among the 10 coaches on staff
- The staff has logged 36 years of NFL coaching experience and 49 years of playing experience
- Eight of Michigan's 10 assistants have coached in the NFL: Jim Harbaugh, Tim Drevno, Jedd Fisch, Jay Harbaugh, Greg Jackson, Greg Mattison, Tyrone Wheatley and Mike Zordich
- Four of the Wolverines coaches played in the NFL, with each of those individuals logging more than 10 years in the league: Harbaugh (15 years), Greg Jackson (12 years), Tyrone Wheatley (10 years) and Mike Zordich (12 years)
- Those four coaches totaled 49 years of playing experience at the NFL level
- This does not include the seven years of NFL experience logged by strength and conditioning coach Kevin Tolbert and the 21 years of coaching experience gained by defensive analyst Dave Adolph

The Team, The Team, The Team

- U-M has won the time of possession battle in eight of 10 contests this season and has nearly a 7-minute advantage on the opposition (33:19 to 26:41); the team lost the TOP battle against Michigan State (30:11-29:49) and Minnesota (31:05-28:55)
- Michigan has outscored the opposition, 246-110, over its last seven games; did not allow a point in 44 straight defensive possessions before MSU's second quarter TD
- The Wolverines have outscored the opposition, 215-110, in Big Ten play
- The Wolverines have turned the ball over four times in the past five conference games; lost a

fumble on the final play of the MSU game, committed two turnovers (one fumble, one interception) at Minnesota and threw an interception at Indiana

- Michigan scored on offense, defense and special teams against Northwestern; it was the first time since the Indiana game in 2003 that U-M accomplished the feat

Offense:

- The offense has been balanced this season, with the ground game gaining 168.8 yards per contest and the air attack averaging 224.9 yards per game
- Michigan has rushed 390 times for 1,688 yards and 23 touchdowns
- Nine different Wolverines have scored rushing touchdowns this season, led by tailback De'Veon Smith (5), quarterback Jake Rudock (4), tailback Drake Johnson (3) and fullback Sione Houma (3); three others have two rushing scores
- In the passing game, Michigan has completed 188-of-298 attempts (62.9 pct.) for 2,249 yards and 15 touchdowns
- Michigan's offensive line has allowed 14 sacks in 10 games; the front did not yield a sack at Utah or against UNLV and Rutgers
- The offense has converted 40-42 red zone chances (95%) this season; scored 29 touchdowns and 11 field goals
- The Wolverines are converting 43 percent of their third-down chances (61-of-142) and have moved the chains on 5-of-13 fourth-down opportunities
- Jake Butt leads a tight end corps that includes fellow veterans A.J. Williams, Khalid Hill and Michael Jocz. The tight end corps has collected 55 passes for 722 yards and two touchdowns. Butt is the team's second-leading receiver with 38 receptions for 500 yards and both TDs followed by A.J. Williams (10 for 120 yards), Ian Bunting (4 for 55 yards) and Khalid Hill (3 for 47 yards)
- Michigan has lined up with the same five starters along the offensive line in each of the eight games. This group boasts 126 combined starts, with each of the five players having at least 20 starts in their careers: Graham Glasgow (34), Kyle Kalis (27), Mason Cole (22), Ben Braden (22) and Erik Magnuson (21)

Defense:

- Michigan is ranked in the top eight nationally in six defensive categories, including second in total defense and pass efficiency defense and third in third down defense
- Five of the 10 opponents have failed to score in the second half: UNLV, BYU, Maryland, Northwestern and Rutgers
- The U-M defense is allowing just 103.2 yards per contest rushing and 165.5 yards passing
- The Wolverines have yielded 148 points on the season (14.8 avg.); the opposition has scored 72 points in the first half, 69 in the second half and seven points in overtime
- Michigan has been stout on third down, allowing just 33 conversions in 141 attempts (23%)
- The defense has 25 sacks and 69 TFLs this year
- U-M posted a season-high 10 stops behind the line of scrimmage at Utah, posted nine against UNLV and added eight in Big Ten games at Maryland and against Northwestern
- Michigan has 14 different players with 20 or more stops this season and 19 total players with double-digit tackles
- The Wolverines have forced nine turnovers on the season (eight interceptions and one fumble); picked up a season-high three picks at Maryland
- Jeremy Clark leads the team with three interceptions (Utah, UNLV and Maryland) followed by Jourdan Lewis with two picks (Maryland and Northwestern)
- The defense has batted down 47 passes this season, led by cornerback Jourdan Lewis' 20 PBUs; U-M batted down a season-high 10 passes against Michigan State and also added six PBUs at Maryland and five vs. Northwestern
- Michigan has allowed the opposition only 22 red zone chances (fewest in FBS), with 18 successful scoring drives (8 TDs, 10 FGs)
- The defense held the opposition to less than 100 rushing yards in six of the past nine games
- The opposition has been limited to less than 50 yards rushing in three of the last six games: 50 yards by BYU, 29 by Maryland and 38 by Northwestern; MSU rushed for 58 yards
- The defense has held the opposition to less than 100 yards passing four times this season: 79 yards vs. Oregon State, 55 yards vs. BYU, 76 yards at Maryland and 97 yards vs. Rutgers
- The defense pitched a shutout in three consecutive games for the first time since the 1980 season (BYU, Maryland and Northwestern); Michigan became the first FBS school to accomplish the feat since Kansas State shut out three straight opponents in 1995
- U-M is just the fifth team ever to have multiple 28-point shutouts over AP ranked teams in a single season: 1945 Army, 1948 Michigan, 1956 Georgia Tech, 1966 Notre Dame and this year's teams are the only to accomplish the feat
- Michigan is the first team since 2011 to hold two major conference/independent opponents under 110 total yards in a game
- U-M held the opposition scoreless in 13 consecutive quarters and in 19 of 20 quarters (second quarter of Oregon State until the second quarter of the Michigan State game); the only points came on a fourth quarter TD by UNLV

Michigan Stadium -- 1927-2015 (89 Years)

The football program is in its 89th season in the "Big House" in 2015, with a 412-126-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has been altered 10 times to its present capacity of 107,601. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 38 times in the past 40 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 115,109 fans during the 2013 Notre Dame game.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 264 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan, surpassing the population of Ann Arbor itself.

Michigan Stadium was the first college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones and was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

CAPACITY: 107,601 -- the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.

COMPLETION: 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- vs. Connecticut.

ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 48,091,774 fans have watched the Wolverines play 553 games (an average of 86,965/game). The stadium attendance record of 115,109 was set on Sept. 7, 2013 against Notre Dame.

FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

100,000-Plus Crowds at Michigan Stadium

The football program has played 264 consecutive home games in front of crowds in excess of 100,000. The last time Michigan did not have 100,000 in attendance in Michigan Stadium was on Oct. 25, 1975 vs. Indiana. A crowd of 93,857 was on hand for the 55-7 Michigan victory.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 38 of the past 40 seasons in attendance.

Jim Harbaugh was named the 20th coach in University of Michigan football history on Tuesday, Dec. 30. He becomes the sixth former Michigan football player to be named the leader of college football's winningest program.

Harbaugh comes to Ann Arbor after an impressive four-year run in the National Football League with the San Francisco 49ers. He led the franchise to the NFC Championship Game in each of his first three seasons, winning the George Halas Trophy as NFC Champions in 2012. Harbaugh tallied a 49-22-1 overall record that included a 5-3 mark in the postseason as 49ers head coach.

Harbaugh led the Niners to a 13-3 regular season record and to the NFC Championship Game during his first season in 2011, earning the AP NFL Coach of the Year award. He followed up with an 11-4-1 regular season mark in 2012, culminating with an appearance in Super Bowl XLVII. Harbaugh's 49ers lost a back-and-forth affair, 34-31, to the Baltimore Ravens and his brother, John, in the only match-up of brothers as head coaches in NFL history. He helped guide San Francisco back to the NFC title game after a 12-4 regular season record in 2013 and posted an 8-8 mark during the 2014 season.

Prior to making the jump to the 49ers, Harbaugh established himself as a leader of young men at the college level. He turned around a Stanford program that went 1-11 prior to his arrival. The Cardinal improved each of his four seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign and FedEx Orange Bowl victory over Virginia Tech in 2010. Harbaugh finished his tenure at Stanford with a 29-21 overall record (.580) and 21-15 mark in Pac-10 Conference play.

After 4-8 and 5-7 records his first two seasons at the helm, Harbaugh led the Cardinal to an 8-5 record and a tie for second place in the Pac-10. The appearance in the Sun Bowl following the season was Stanford's first bowl game since the 2001 season. The program continued its ascension in 2010, posting a 12-1 overall record and 8-1 mark in the Pac-10. Stanford was selected for a BCS bowl game, and proceeded to defeat Virginia Tech, 40-12, to claim the FedEx Orange Bowl in Harbaugh's final game with the program. The

Cardinal finished the 2010 season ranked fifth in the national polls and Harbaugh was named the Woody Hayes Award as the nation's top coach by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. He accepted the 49ers head coaching position on Jan. 7, 2011.

In his first head coaching experience, Harbaugh led the University of San Diego to a 29-6 record during his three seasons directing the program (2004-06). In his first year, the Toreros posted a 7-4 record after winning their final five games of the season. The team proceeded to post 11-1 marks during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, claiming the Pioneer Football League Championship each season.

Harbaugh spent the 2002 and 2003 NFL seasons as the quarterbacks coach with the Oakland Raiders. He worked with the quarterbacks, helping quarterback Rich Gannon lead the organization to Super Bowl XXXVII after posting an 11-5 regular season record and the AFC Western Division title. Gannon won the 2002 AP NFL MVP award and was selected to the 2003 Pro Bowl.

He began preparing for a career as a coach during his professional playing days. Harbaugh spent eight years as

MICHIGAN FOOTBALL HEAD COACH JIM HARBAUGH

an NCAA-certified unpaid assistant coach for his father, Jack, at Western Kentucky (1994-2001). He worked as an offensive consultant and recruited for the Hilltoppers during that time. Harbaugh's effort helped his father's team capture the 2002 Division I-AA National Championship.

Harbaugh played for five different organizations during his 15-year NFL career (1987-2001). He completed 2,305-of-3,918 passes for 26,288 yards and 129 touchdowns in 177 games. Harbaugh made 140 career starts. He was named the AFC Offensive Player of the Year, the NFL Comeback Player of the Year and a Pro Bowl selection after leading the Indianapolis Colts to the AFC Championship Game in 1995. He was inducted into the Colts Ring of Honor in 2005.

As a collegiate player, Harbaugh was one of the most efficient passers in NCAA history. In 1985, he led the nation in pass efficiency and finished as the runner-up in 1986. His career pass efficiency rating was the NCAA's top mark for over 12 years. Harbaugh won the *Chicago Tribune* Big Ten Most Valuable Player award, earned first-team All-America honors and finished third in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy following the 1986 season.

He completed 387-of-620 passes for 5,449 yards and 31 touchdowns during his career, with all four statistical categories still listing among the top-12 in school history. He also added 12 rushing touchdowns during his career, including eight scores as a senior. Harbaugh became the first Michigan quarterback to ever throw for more than 300 yards in a single game (310 vs. Wisconsin) and eclipsed the 200-yard passing mark 12 times. He led the Wolverines to a 21-3-1 record as a full-time starter during his final two seasons, including a pair of victories against rivals Michigan State and Ohio State.

Harbaugh and his wife, Sarah, have two daughters, Addison and Katherine, and a son, Jack. He also has three children, Jay, James Jr., and Grace.

He is the son of Jack and Jackie Harbaugh. Jack was an assistant coach at Michigan from 1973-79. Harbaugh's brother, John, is head coach of the Baltimore Ravens and his sister, Joani, is married to Indiana University men's basketball coach Tom Crean.
