THIS WEEK'S STORYLINES

- Six Wolverines had a goal and 12 had at least one point in U-M's weekend split with Bowling Green last week. Louie Caporusso had a goal and two assists and David Wohlberg had three assists to lead U-M's scorers over the weekend.
- Chris Brown took over the team lead in points with a goal and an assist against Bowling Green on Nov. 21 to give him a 6-4-10 line. The freshman also leads the Wolverines in goals.
- The 4-1 victory over BGSU in Toledo on Nov. 21 snapped a five-game losing streak for the Wolverines. This weekend, U-M looks to end its four-game home losing streak -- its longest since a five-game stretch in 1988-89.
- Coach Berenson is in his 26th season behind the Michigan bench with a career record of 678-317-68 (.670). Two career milestones are within his reach in 2009-10. First, Berenson needs 11 more wins to tie Len Ceglarski (Clarkson, Boston College) for sixth on the NCAA all-time coaching wins list. Second, U-M's 27th victory this season would push him to the 700-win plateau. Berenson's teams have averaged just under 27 wins per year since he took over the helm in 1984-85.

by U-M early in the third period gave BGSU a five-on-three power play. The Falcons scored on both power plays and added an even-strength goal in a span of 2:22 to earn a 4-2 win at Yost.

- In Toledo, Ohio, on Nov. 21, Carl Hagelin scored at 2:18 of the first period, followed by A.J. Treais at 11:07. Brian Lebler answered a BGSU goal with a tally of his own at 16:51 to put U-M ahead 3-1 after 20 minutes. Chris Brown tacked on a power-play goal in the third stanza. Michigan out-shot the Falcons, 30-12.

COLLEGE HOCKEY SHOWCASE

- Michigan's 18 College Hockey Showcase wins are tops among the four competitors (Michigan State, Minnesota, Wisconsin). At 18-13-1, Michigan's winning percentage of .578 is equal to that of Minnesota (16-11-5).
- Michigan is 8-8-0 against Minnesota in the College Hockey Showcase, having won each of the last two meetings. Last fall, U-M topped then-No. 1 Minnesota, 6-3, in Minneapolis.
- During the CHS, the Wolverines are 2-4-0 vs. the Golden Gophers at Yost.
- The traditional Big Ten rivals have met on 258 previous occasions as the Wolverines were former members of the WCHA. The Golden Gophers have the edge all-time at 127-116-15.
- U-M is 10-5-1 in the College Hockey Showcase against Wisconsin. Last season's 3-0 loss in Madison ended a two-game winning streak over the Badgers in the CHS.
- During the CHS, U-M is 4-2-0 vs. the Badgers at Yost.
- Michigan is 62-52-7 all-time vs. Wisconsin.
- All-time College Hockey Showcase results are available on page 9 of the game notes.

TEAM NOTES

- Nationwide, Michigan was the only team that did not play an overtime contest in 2008-09, which meant that the Wolverines did not participate in a shootout. The CCHA introduced shootouts to break ties in regular season play in 2008-09. U-M has not played to overtime since the Frozen Four semifinals in 2007-08.
- Michigan has earned an NCAA Tournament berth in 19 straight seasons -- a national record. If the Wolverines reach the 2010 Frozen Four, which is being held at Detroit's Ford Field, it would be their 11th appearance in the event since 1992.
- Michigan was picked to finish first in the CCHA this season by both the media and coaches in the league's preseason polls on Sept. 30. Notre Dame

and Miami closely followed U-M in both polls, earning second and third place, respectively.

- Michigan was ranked No. 4 in the preseason *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll. U-M was fifth in the final *USA Today* poll of 2008-09.
- The USCHO.com/CBS College Sports preseason poll slotted U-M No. 3 in the nation. The Wolverines finished the 2008-09 poll also at No. 3.
- The Wolverines have 18 players back from last season's squad, which finished 20-8-0 in CCHA play to tie for second place. U-M had a 29-12-0 overall mark. Michigan returns eight forwards, eight defensemen and a pair of goaltenders.

CAMP RANDALL HOCKEY CLASSIC

- Michigan will play the second outdoor game in program history on Feb. 6, 2010, when it visits Wisconsin for the Camp Randall Hockey Classic. The Wolverines played Michigan State in the "Cold War" on Oct. 6, 2001, to a 3-3 tie at Spartan Stadium in front of a world outdoor record 74,544 fans. Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium seats 80,321 spectators for football games.

OFFENSE

- U-M is averaging 2.67 goals per game, which is tied for 32nd in the country. Michigan has been among the top five in national scoring average in each of the last five seasons.
- Michigan's four-goal outburst vs. BGSU on Nov. 21 was its highest goal total in six games, when U-M had six goals at LSSU on Oct. 31.
- Carl Hagelin has been U-M's most consistent scorer, posting a point in all six weekends of play this season. Hagelin is tied for second on the team with nine points. His five goals are second. Hagelin had a single goal during the MSU series.
- Michigan scored three goals in one period for the sixth time this season on Nov. 21. Including Saturday night, the feat has been achieved four times in the first period of play. U-M leads all CCHA teams with 11 first period goals.

- David Wohlberg has a point in four of the last five games (1-4-5). He had three assists during the BGSU series and leads Michigan with six assists.
- Against Bowling Green on Nov. 21, Brian Lebler scored his first goal since Oct. 10 at Alaska-Anchorage. The senior has two goals for the season.
- A.J. Treais potted his second goal of the season and first career game-winning goal vs. BGSU on Nov. 21. He had not scored since Oct. 22 vs. Niagara.
- Defenseman Brandon Burlon's assist vs. BGSU on Nov 21 was his first point since Oct. 10 at Alaska-Anchorage. He has a pair of assists for the season.
- Freshman defenseman Lee Moffie scored his first career goal on Nov. 13 vs. Michigan State. He has the only tally by a U-M defenseman into a guarded net -- Tristin Llewellyn scored into an empty net at LSSU on Oct. 31.
- U-M's top scorers on the blue line are Chris Summers and Chad Langlais who have identical 0-5-5 scoring lines.
- Michigan returns 68.5% of its offense from 2008-09 -- 95 of 145 goals and 175 of 249 assists. Five of U-M's top seven scorers from last season are back: junior Louie Caporusso (24-25-49) junior Carl Hagelin (13-18-31), sophomore David Wohlberg (15-15-30), junior defenseman Chad Langlais (6-18-24) and junior Matt Rust (11-11-22).
- Louie Caporusso was one of 10 finalists for the 2009 Hobey Baker Memorial Award. His 49 points were eighth-best nationally. U-M has had a Hobey Baker finalist in four of the last five seasons (T.J. Hensick - 2005, 07; Kevin Porter - 2008).

POWER PLAY

- Michigan's power play is converting at a 14.1% clip (9-64), which is 44th in the country.
- Michigan was 2-for-7 on the power play last weekend, scoring a goal with the man-advantage each night vs. the Falcons. Prior to Louie

Per the CCHA's new scoring system, teams winning in regulation or overtime will now receive three points. The winning squad in a shootout will earn two points in the standings, while a shootout loss garners one point. In addition, a loss in regulation or overtime will result in no points for the losing team.

Caporusso's first power-play goal of the season on Nov. 20, U-M had been held without a PPG over 20 straight opportunities.

• Twelve different players have a point on the power play. Carl Hagelin (2-2-4) and Louie Caporusso (1-3-4) are the top threats.

• Chris Brown scored his team-best third power-play goal of the season at BGSU (Nov. 21).

• Last season, U-M's power play was 15.8% (38 for 241), which was 35th in the country.

• Last season, Louie Caporusso led U-M with 10 power-play goals, which was tied for ninth in the country. He had an additional six assists to lead U-M in power-play points.

• Last year, U-M gave up three shorthanded goals for the second straight season.

DEFENSE

• U-M is allowing 2.50 goals per game, which is tied for 18th in the country.

• Michigan has held its opponent to fewer than 20 shots on goal in five games this season. The 12 shots that BGSU took on Nov. 21 were the fewest by an opponent since Jan. 15, 2000, when Miami registered 10 shots in a 5-1 Michigan win.

• U-M hasn't allowed a second period goal over the last three games. The middle frame has been its best defensive period (7 ga); however the Wolverines have just six goals for.

• Captain Chris Summers leads all defensemen with a +2 rating.

• U-M's blocked shot leaders are Chris Summers (14), Steve Kampfer (13) and Brandon Burlon (11).

• Hogan is 2-2-0 for his career when making 30-plus saves after posting 32 saves in a win vs. Niagara (Oct. 22) and 35 saves in a win at LSSU (Oct. 31).

• Michigan allowed a season-high five goals to Miami on Nov. 7. The eight goals against during the series were a weekend high for the season.

• Last year, Michigan allowed 2.05 goals against per game, which was fourth in the country. U-M was also fourth in GAA in 2007-08

(2.07).

• Bryan Hogan set career bests in every major statistical category last season thanks to a 24-6-0 record, 1.97 goals against average and .914 save percentage. He also had three shutouts. Hogan was picked for the 2009-10 Preseason All-CCHA second team.

• Bryan Hogan was third in the country in winning percentage (.800) with a record of 24-6-0. He had a 1.97 goals against average, which was seventh nationally, and a .914 save percentage, good for 28th in the country.

• Hogan's 1.97 GAA in 2008-09 was the second best figure ever posted at U-M, trailing only Billy Sauer's 1.95 GAA that was set in 2007-08. Hogan and Sauer are the only U-M netminders to post sub-2.00 GAA in a season.

• Hogan's save percentage of .91387 ranked third on U-M's single season list, just barely ahead of Bob Gray's effort in 1963-64 -- .91356. Sauer set the standard with a .924 save percentage in 2007-08 and Al Montoya put up a .917 save percentage in 2003-04.

PENALTY KILL

• Michigan's penalty-kill rate is 89.6%, which is sixth in the country.

• Michigan recorded its seventh perfect game on the penalty kill on Nov. 21 against Bowling Green. U-M negated all five Falcon power plays, including a five-minute major in the third period. U-M's PK is first in the CCHA (89.1%) and sixth in the country (89.6%).

• U-M allowed two Falcon power-play goals on Nov. 20, marking just the second time this season U-M has yielded multiple PPGs.

• U-M's penalty kill succeeded at a rate of 88.1% (193 for 219), which ranked sixth in the nation and second all-time (since 1970-71) at Michigan. The 2002-03 Wolverines killed 89.2% of power plays faced.

• U-M was perfect on the PK in 21 games.

• In the CCHA, Michigan was No. 2 in penalty killing efficiency at 91.8%.

• Carl Hagelin had a team-best two short-handed goals. Ben Winnett, Matt Rust, David Wohlberg and Chris Summers also had shorties

HEAD COACH RED BERENSON



A 17-year veteran of the NHL, Red Berenson (U-M, 1962) has spent 25 seasons at the helm for the Wolverines, where he owns a 678-317-68 record. In 2007-08, he was honored with the Spencer Penrose Award as college hockey's top coach. Berenson is in seventh place on college hockey's coaching wins list and is one of eight head coaches in college hockey history to accumulate 600 wins. A former Michigan captain and two-time All-American for U-M from 1960-62, Berenson has averaged more than 26 wins per season in his collegiate coaching career. He has led Michigan to a pair of NCAA Championships (1996, 1998) and 19 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, the longest active streak of any school in college hockey. He spent three seasons (1980-82) as head coach of the NHL's St. Louis Blues before coming back to Michigan, earning NHL Coach of the Year honors in 1981. For his "outstanding service to hockey in the United States" Berenson was given the NHL's Lester Patrick Award on Nov. 6, 2006.
