## TOUCH 'EM ALL - THE TOP STORYLINES THIS WEEK

• The Wolverines seek their 10th Big Ten Tournament title in program history. Michigan owns a 41-15 (.732) all-time record in 19 appearances in the Big Ten Tournament and, with nine tournament titles, U-M boasts three times as many as the next teams on the leaderboard -- Northwestern and Minnesota with three titles.

• Michigan is hosting the Big Ten Tournament for the 10th time in program history (1982, '95, '96, '98, '99, 2001, '02, '04, '05) and the first time since 2005. The Wolverines captured the tournament title in five of nine host roles and reached the championship game in eight.

• Michigan claimed each of its eight Big Ten Conference series this season and, with a 20-3 league record, finishes in second place in the final conference standings -- two games behind Minnesota (22-1). Michigan and Minnesota do not face each other this season in the regular season. It snapped the Wolverines' streak of nine straight Big Ten titles, dating back to 2008.

• U-M remains unbeaten at Alumni Field this season with a perfect 17-0 home record. Stretching back into last season, when they went 20-1 at home, the Wolverines have won 36 straight at home.

• Since seeing a significant lineup shakeup in the second game of the Wisconsin series, the Wolverines have since averaged 9.8 runs per game over the last nine games. U-M had averaged 2.57 runs in the preceding seven contests.

• Senior RHP Megan Betsa currently leads the nation with 370 strikeouts and ranks third nationally with 12.5 strikeouts per seven innings. She boasts 19 double-digit strikeout performances this season, including 12 of her last 18 starts. She became the first Wolverine player in program history to record three straight 300-strikeout seasons. Standing now at 1,159; she is 46 shy of second place on the all-time leaders list, currently held by Jennie Ritter (1,205, 2003-06), and 61 behind record holder Jordan Taylor (1,220, 2008-11).

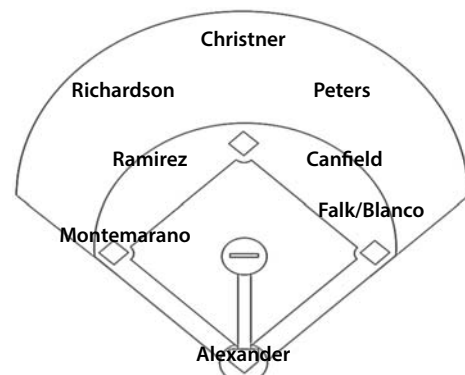

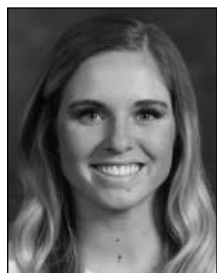

AT THE PLATE

• The Wolverines seek their 10th Big Ten Tournament title in program history. Michigan owns a 41-15 (.732) all-time record in 19 appearances in the Big Ten Tournament and, with nine tournament titles, U-M boasts three times as many as the next teams on the leaderboard -- Northwestern and Minnesota with three titles.

• Michigan is hosting the Big Ten Tournament for the 10th time in program history (1982, '95, '96, '98, '99, 2001, '02, '04, '05) and the first time since 2005. The tournament was reinstated on a rotational basis in 2013 after a four-year absence. From 1995-2008, it was held at the site of the regular-season champion. The Wolverines captured the tournament title in five of nine host roles and reached the championship game in eight.

• Michigan claimed each of its eight Big Ten Conference series this season and, with a 20-3 league record, finishes in second place in the final conference standings -- two games behind Minnesota (22-1). Michigan and Minnesota do not face each other this season in the regular season. It snapped the Wolverines' streak of nine straight Big Ten titles, dating back to 2008.

• Michigan remains unbeaten at Alumni Field this season with a perfect 17-0 home record. Stretching back into last season, when they went 20-1 at home, the Wolverines have won 36 straight home games. U-M owns an impressive 546-133-1 record Alumni Field since its opening in 1982 and is 159-19 since the Wilpon Complex renovations in 2008.

• Since seeing a significant lineup shakeup -- the temporary benching of five regular starters -- in the second game of the Wisconsin series, the Wolverines have since averaged 9.8 runs per game over the last nine games. U-M had averaged 2.57 runs in the preceding seven contests.

• Michigan is batting .424 over its last nine games and knocked out 23 home runs over the stretch -- an average of 2.56 homers per game. Seven Wolverines boast averages of .400 or better, most notably sophomore Faith Canfield and Natalie Peters, who are hitting .586 and .566, respectively, over the stretch. Canfield, junior Aidan Falk, senior Kelly Christner, junior Tera Blanco and sophomore Katie Alexander have all tied three homers over the last nine games.

• The Wolverines currently rank second in the nation with a .982 fielding percentage, trailing only Florida (.986). Five Michigan starters boast fielding percentages of .980 or better, perhaps most notably sophomore second baseman Faith Canfield who has just one error in 124 touches for a stellar .992 fielding percentage.

• Head coach Carol Hutchins claimed her 1,500th career win in the Wolverines' 11-3, six-inning decision against Kent State (March 19). Already the winningest coach in NCAA softball history, Hutchins is now 1,525-487-5 in her 34 seasons as a collegiate coach.

• Senior centerfielder Kelly Christner batted .636 (7-for-11) with a .692 on-base percentage and 1.000 slugging percentage over the Wolverines' four-game week two weeks ago. She tallied three straight games with two hits. She drove in both runs in U-M's 2-0 win at Central Michigan, including a solo homer in the third inning, and boasted four RBI in the season opener against Northwestern.

• Falk posted a .400 average over the Wolverines' Kent State series, shining with a 4-for-7, five-RBI effort in Sunday's doubleheader. She also posted three doubles on the day and leads Michigan with 10 doubles on the season, accounting for nearly half of her total

• Canfield batted .538 over the Wolverines' five-game Judi Garman Classic, with a .647 on-base percentage and .923 slugging percentage. Among her hits, she knocked out a two-run homer to provide the only runs in U-M's 2-0 win against host CSU Fullerton.

• Christner saw her career-long hit streak halted at 13 games in the UCLA game (March 2); she hit an impressive .658 (25-for-38) over the stretch, with a 1.079 slugging percentage and .735 on-base percentage.

• Michigan has a tie on the book for just the fifth time in program history -- and the first time since 2001 -- after a travel drop-dead time halted U-M's 5-5 battle against No. 1 Florida State in the middle of the eighth inning. The Wolverines' previous ties came against CSU Northridge (3-3, 1997), Iowa (2-2, 1999), UCLA (4-4, 2000) and Western Michigan (3-3, 2001).

• Christner was named Big Ten Player of the week after registering a .667 average, .765 on-base percentage and 1.417 slugging percentage over the Wolverines' four-game weekend. She also accumulated nine runs scored, nine RBI, three stolen bases and an outfield assist to excel in every facet of the game.

• Christner tied a Michigan school record with three homers, including her second career grand slam, and posted career bests with four runs and seven RBI, in the tournament opener against N.C. State. She became the fourth Wolverine player to tally three homers and the first since Dorian Shaw did so in 2009, while her seven RBI was the most by a Wolverine player since Amanda Chidester posted seven in 2012.

• Michigan's sophomore class made its presence felt on opening day against Delaware and Illinois State as rightfielder Natalie Peters, catcher Alex Sobczak, leftfielder Courtney Richardson and second baseman Faith Canfield combined for 12 of U-M's 19 hits on the day and eight of its 10 RBI. Richardson belted a three-run homer in the Illinois State contest, while she and Peters tallied three hits apiece against Delaware.

IN THE CIRCLE

• Senior RHP Megan Betsa currently leads the nation with 370 strikeouts on the season -- 63 more than second-place Jacquelyn Sertic from North Dakota State -- and ranks third nationally with 12.5 strikeouts per seven innings. She boasts 19 double-digit strikeout performances this season, including 12 of her last 18 starts. She became the first Wolverine player in program history to record three straight 300-strikeout seasons and the third to surpass 1,000 career strikeouts. Standing now at 1,159; she is 46 shy of second place on the all-time leaders list, currently held by Jennie Ritter (1,205, 2003-06), and 61 behind record holder Jordan Taylor (1,220, 2008-11).

• Betsa also reached 100 career wins with her victory in the Rutgers series finale, becoming just the fourth Wolverine player to achieve the milestone. She is tied with two-time All-America Haylie Wagner (2012-15) for third place among U-M's all-time leaders, six wins shy of Sara Griffin (106, 1995-98) in second place. Jordan Taylor (2008-11) holds the program's wins record with 107.

• Betsa also leads the Big Ten in shutouts (11, ranks 4th nationally), saves (5, 5th nationally) and hits allowed per seven innings (3.45, 8th nationally).

• Betsa claimed her third straight -- and Michigan's fourth straight -- Big Ten Pitcher of the Week last week after throwing three complete-game shutouts in games against Central Michigan and Northwestern last week. She boasted 28 strikeouts and allowed just six hits and four walks through 19 innings pitched. Betsa has garnered the Big Ten's pitching accolade in four of season's eight weeks to date.

• Betsa earned complete-game shutouts in seven consecutive starts and didn't allow a run in 48 innings pitched. Over the stretch, she boasted 87 strikeouts and allowed just 10 hits and a .065 opposing batting average. Betsa owns nine shutouts on the season and 34 in her career, ranking sixth all time among U-M's leaders in the category. Jennie Ritter (2003-06) is Michigan's career leader with 43.

• Betsa also claimed Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors after throwing 15 shutout innings en route to a pair of wins and a save against PSU and EMU. She earned back-to-back complete-game shutouts against Penn State and ended the series with a five-inning, nine-strikeout no-hitter -- and second no-hitter in nine days. She boasted 29 strikeouts and allowed just three hits through 15 innings.

• Betsa also earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week the previous week after tossing a pair of complete-game shutouts over the Wolverines' home series against Kent State, including a 17-strikeout no-hitter in the series opener. It was her fourth career no-hitter and a career-best strikeout tally -- just two shy of the Michigan program single-game record. She followed it up with a 13-strikeout one-hitter in the series finale.

• Junior RHP Tera Blanco netted her first ever Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honor after throwing the best game of her collegiate career to date against the Golden Flashes last weekend, striking out a career-high 13 while allowing one unearned run on just two hits and no walks. Blanco struck out the side in the first, third and seventh innings; she fanned five of the last six batters faced. Blanco also helped her cause with three RBI in the contest.

• Betsa and Blanco combined for a 2.84 ERA, 42 strikeouts and a .184 opposing average at the Mary Nutter Classic. Blanco posted a perfect 2-0 record, improving to 6-1 on the season, while Betsa was 1-1 with a save -- and a no-decision despite a strong performance against No. 1 FSU.

• Blanco posted a 2-0 record at the ACC/Big Ten Challenge with a stellar 0.58 ERA, nine strikeouts and a complete-game shutout. After only limited innings pitched in her first two seasons, Blanco is only 1.1 innings shy of her 2016 total and, with a 4-1 record on the year, has already doubled her previous best win total.

#### TEAM 40

• Michigan returns 17 letterwinners, five starting position players and two starting pitchers from last year's squad. Among the returning starters are three All-Americans in senior RHP Megan Betsa, junior RHP/first baseman Tera Blanco and senior outfielder Kelly Christner.

• Head coach Carol Hutchins is in her 33rd season at the helm of the Wolverines. She has compiled a 1,512-486-5 record over her 32 seasons as a NCAA head coach. Hutchins became NCAA softball's all-time coaching wins leader when she earned her 1458th with an 8-0, 5-inning win at Indiana on April 2, 2016. She was named the inaugural recipient of the espnW Pat Summitt Coaching Award in December.

• Associate head coach Bonnie Tholl is in her 24th season with U-M and 15th as associate head coach, assistant Jen Brundage is in her 19th season and volunteer assistant Alex Lagesse is in her second season.

• Seniors Kelly Christner and Abby Ramirez will serve as team captains for the season. They were elected in a vote by their teammates and coaches. Christner also served as one of three captains last year.

• U-M welcomes a talented group of four freshmen for the 2017 season: middle infielder Madison Uden, catcher Abby Skvarce and outfielders Thais Gonzalez and Haley Hoogenraad.

• Of the 53 games on the Wolverines' 2017 schedule, 13 are against teams who reached last season's NCAA Tournament as well as eight teams listed in the pre-season Top 25. Last season, the Wolverines had the No. 1 non-conference strength of schedule.

• The Wolverines will play nearly 70 percent (37/53) of their games away from Alumni Field this season.

• The Maize and Blue host three Big Ten series: Northwestern, Penn State and Indiana as well as a home-and-home series against in-state rival Michigan State. U-M does not play Minnesota, Purdue, Illinois, Iowa, or Nebraska during the regular season.

#### THE MICHIGAN DIFFERENCE

• Every Michigan team since 1995 has finished in the top 20 in the national polls. Fourteen of those teams finished in the top 10.

• Michigan has had 58 All-America total selections in 38 seasons, while 20 players have earned multiple All-America honors. At least one U-M player named All-America in 26 of Hutchins' 32 seasons. U-M has

boasted nine All-Americans over the last two seasons, including a program-high five in 2015 and three first-team selections in 2016.

- The Wolverines surpassed 50 wins 13 times since 1995. Michigan's program single-season wins record is 65, set by the 2005 NCAA championship team. The Wolverines have compiled 22 consecutive 40-win seasons.

- U-M has won nine consecutive BIG Championships and 19 of the last 25 since 1992. No other team has a stretch of more than two in a row (Northwestern, 1984-85).

- Since the recruiting class of 1992, every four-year U-M player has participated in at least one Women's College World Series.

- Michigan's 12 WCWS appearances (1995-98, 2001-02, 2004-05, 2009, 2013, 2015-16) ranks as the third most in the NCAA -- tied with California and Fresno State.

- Michigan has appeared in 11 of the 12 NCAA Super Regionals held since the format was introduced in 2005. The Wolverines are six-time Super Regional hosts, winning five of those home series.

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR -- OFFENSE

- Michigan lost three big bats in its hitting lineup with the graduation of Sierra Lawrence, Sierra Romero and Kelsey Susalla, who all ranked among the Wolverines' 2016 top-five hitting leaders and combined for 178 RBI.

- Junior RHP/first baseman Tera Blanco is the Wolverines' top returning hitter after boasting a breakout season in which she batted .404 with 12 homers and 66 RBI en route to NFCA First Team All-America honors.

- Senior centerfielder Kelly Christner had a dip in her offensive production last season and, for her final season, will look to recreate the success of her

sophomore season when she recorded a .393 average with 21 home runs and 67 RBI en route to, like Blanco, NFCA First Team All-America honors.

- The Wolverines also return lineup stalwarts in sophomore first baseman Aidan Falk, senior third baseman Lindsay Montemarano and senior shortstop Abby Ramirez.

- Ramirez, who hit in the No. 9 slot for much of the last two seasons, will likely to move to the top of the lineup, while sophomore Natalie Peters, perhaps the most consistent hitter during the Wolverines' fall ball slate, will initially slot in at No. 2 -- or vice versa. Both are speedy slap hitters.

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR -- PITCHING/DEFENSE

- Michigan returns a pair of starting pitchers from last season's staff in senior RHP Megan Betsa and junior RHP Tera Blanco as well as sophomore RHP Leah Crockett, who saw limited time as a rookie in 2016.

- Betsa was the Wolverines' top pitcher again in 2016, posting a 28-5 record last season with a 1.98 ERA and 306 strikeouts. She ranked third nationally with 10.5 strikeouts per game, sixth with 3.93 hits allowed per game and 10th with nine complete-game shutouts. She was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and garnered NFCA All-America second team honors for the second straight season.

- Blanco, who garnered 2016 NFCA First Team All-America honors as a first baseman, posted a 2-1 record, 2.39 ERA and 29 strikeouts through 29.1 innings pitched last season -- all primarily in early-season tournament appearances. She boasted the bulk of innings in U-M's fall ball slate, however, allowing 10 runs over 32 innings, including a complete-game shutout against Saginaw Valley State.

- Michigan returns a veteran infield in junior first baseman Tera Blanco, senior shortstop Abby Ramirez and senior third baseman Lindsay Mon-

temarano; the latter two have previously earned Big Ten All-Defensive team selection. With Blanco taking on a greater pitching role in 2017, junior Aidan Falk will likely start at first base while Blanco is in the circle and sophomore catcher Alex Sobczak will retake her spot behind the plate. Sophomore Faith Canfield, who saw time at second base last season when Ramirez was out with injury, is the likely 2017 starter at the position to replace Sierra Romero.

- The Wolverines will have two new faces in the outfield after the graduation of Sierra Lawrence and Kelsey Susalla. Senior Kelly Christner will move from left to centerfield, sophomore Natalie Peters will step into rightfield and sophomore Courtney Richardson and freshman Haley Hoogenraad are slated to split time in left.

#### PRESEASON RANKINGS/ACCOLADES

- Michigan is ranked No. 6 in both the USA Today/NFCA and the ESPN/USA Softball preseason polls.

- Two Wolverines were included in the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List: senior Megan Betsa and junior Tera Blanco.

#### FALL BALL

- Michigan played four games at the Traverse City Collegiate Tournament, earning wins against Central Michigan (2x), Western Michigan and Saginaw Valley State by a combined 21-2 margin.

- The Wolverines also played a home-and-home series against in-state rival Michigan State, claiming both slates, 7-4, and 6-4.

- Michigan's lone fall ball loss came in an exhibition contest against the NPF's USSSA Pride, 5-2. The Pride, who won the regular season in 2016 and took second place in the Cowles Cup championship series, feature three Wolverine alums on their roster -- Sierra Romero, Lauren Sweet and Jordan Taylor.

#### THE MICHIGAN SOFTBALL ACADEMY

- The 8th Michigan Softball Academy was held on Wednesday, May 3, 2017, and raised \$135,207 for Making Strides Against Breast Cancer and the American Cancer Society.

- Since 2007, the Michigan softball program has raised more than \$850,000 for Making Strides (seven walks, eight academies).

- The Academy is a one-night softball fantasy camp for men and women over the age of 21. Participants run through softball drills and scrimmages led by the Michigan coaches and players on Alumni Field.

- A record number of 400 participants took part in the 2016 Academy.

- 2017's honorary chair was Chrislan Manuel, wife of Michigan athletic director Warde Manuel.

- Past chairs include Laura Hoke, wife of former head football coach Brady Hoke; Sue Snyder, first lady of Michigan; Jan Brandon, wife of former U-M Athletic Director Dave Brandon, Kathleen Beilein, wife of men's basketball coach John Beilein; former Wolverine All-American pitcher Jordan Taylor and Sarah Harbaugh, wife of football coach Jim Harbaugh.
