MICHIGAN AT THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

1979

Junior **Kathy Karzen** went 3-3 at the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) national tournament hosted by the University of Iowa. Karzen lost in the consolation finals.

1981

Freshman **Marian Kremer** became the first and only Michigan women's tennis player to garner All-America honors as she fought her way to a fourth-place finish at the AIAW national tournament.

1982

Sophomore **Mary Mactaggart** was the third Wolverine to qualify for the NCAA Singles Championship, losing a tough match in the first round. Mactaggart was named the Big Ten Conference Sportswoman of the Year and earned recognition as a first-team All-Big Ten performer in singles, as well as second-team honors in doubles.

1983

Freshman **Stephanie Lightvoet** lost to Southern California's Kelly Henry (7-5, 6-3) in the second round of the NCAA Singles Championship hosted by the University of New Mexico. Lightvoet defeated Margaret Redfeard of Houston, 5-7, 6-0, 6-4, in the opening round.

1984

Senior **Mary Mactaggart** made her second appearance at the NCAA Singles Championship, reaching the round of 16 before losing to Stanford's Kate Gompert, 6-3, 6-0. Mactaggart defeated Oklahoma State's Mary Boudreaux, 6-4, 6-3, in the second round and Principia College's Courtney Allen, 6-3, 6-3, in the opening round.

1988

Senior **Tina Basle** qualified for the NCAA Singles Championship, losing in the round of 64 to Jessica Emmons of UCLA, 6-2, 6-2.

1990

Freshman **Christine Schmeidel** qualified for the NCAA Singles Championship but lost to California's Lisa Albano in the opening round, 6-1, 6-2.

1995

Sophomore **Sarah Cyganiak** advanced to the second round of the NCAA Singles Championship in Malibu, Calif., by defeating Louisiana State's Suzana Rodrigues, 3-6, 7-6 (3), 7-6 (3). She lost to California's Pam Nelson, 6-3, 6-1, in the round of 32.

1996

Michigan qualified for the first-ever NCAA Midwest Regional Championship hosted by the University of Illinois and went 1-1 as the sixth seed in the dual-match team competition. U-M lost in the semifinals to Big Ten Conference foe Northwestern (second seed), 5-0, after upsetting Indiana (third seed), 5-4, in the first round.

Michigan's doubles tandem of junior **Sarah Cyganiak** and sophomore **Sora Moon** (ranked No. 36 by the ITA) qualified for the first round of the NCAA Doubles Championship hosted by Florida State University in Tallahassee, Fla. Cyganiak and Moon lost a competitive three-set match to the Washington's duo of Katherine Costain and Kori Sosnowsky, 7-5, 6-7 (3), 7-5.

The Maize and Blue picked up its 17th doubles point of the season to take the lead into singles action. **Rika Tatsuno** made quick work at the No. 2 position with **Denise Muresan** picking up a win at No. 3 to give the Wolverines a 3-1 advantage. Sacramento State stayed alive with a win at No. 1 singles before **Tania Mahtani** clinched the win for U-M at No. 5 singles, sending the Wolverines to the second round.

Michigan was unable to carry the momentum over against the Irish, falling 4-1 to Notre Dame. Howard, in her final match as a Wolverine, provide the lone point for U-M in a 6-3, 6-3 decision at the No. 6 slot.

Senior Chisako Sugiyama became only the third Wolverine in program history to earn a berth in the NCAA Singles Championship twice in a career.

U-M hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament at the Varsity Tennis Center, sweeping both Illinois-Chicago and Ohio State to move on to the Round of 16.

In the first round against UIC, the Wolverines made quick work in doubles before securing victories by **Michelle Sulahian** at No. 6, **Tania Mahtani** at No. 4 and **Whitney Taney** at No. 2. Against Big Ten opponent Ohio State in the second round, U-M once again grabbed the doubles point to go along with singles wins by Sulahian (No. 6), Mahtani (No. 4) and **Denise Muresan's** clinching win at No. 1 to advance to the Sweet 16,

In the round of 16, U-M dropped a tough doubles point to No. 14 Tennessee and could not rally from the 1-0 deficit with the Volunteers winning at No. 6, No. 1 and No. 3 singles in a 4-0 victory.

Muresan earned a berth into the NCAA Singles Championships while Taney and **Rika Tatsuno** participated in the NCAA Doubles Championships.
