HURRICANES OPEN 2008 WITH CINCINNATI

Miami (0-0) opens its regular season by hosting the Cincinnati Bearcats at Mark Light Field. Game times are 7 p.m., 7 p.m. and 1 p.m., Friday, Saturday and Sunday. All the games will be carried by the Student Voice of UM, WVUM (90.5 FM), which can also be picked up online at www.wvum.org. WQAM will carry the games on Friday and Saturday.

ABOUT THE MIAMI HURRICANES

Miami returns seven position starters and two of its weekend starters on the mound in 2008. Five players - juniors Yonder Alonso, Dennis Raben, Blake Tekotte, Jemile Weeks and sophomore Eric Erickson - have garnered pre-season All-American honors.

Erickson was a first team All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection as a freshman leading the UM pitching staff going 10-4 with a 2.50 ERA. He also was named a freshman All-American by *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*. Alonso led the team hitting .376 with an ACC-best 18 home runs and 74 RBI. He earned All-American honors as well as being named a second team All-ACC selection.

Miami is coming off a 37-24 campaign in 2007 which saw the Hurricanes advance to their NCAA record 35th consecutive NCAA regional. The Hurricanes return five of their top six hitters and 72 percent of its RBI production from 2007. UM will send Erickson, senior right-hander

Enrique Garcia (8-4, 3.82ERA) and freshman lefty Chris Hernandez to the mound this weekend.

Head coach Jim Morris is 11-3 in season openers at Miami.

ABOUT THE CINCINNATI BEARCATS

Cincinnati (0-0) travels to Mark Light Field for its regular season opener. The Bearcats return six position starters and 19 letterwinners in all from a 2007 squad that finished 28-28. Centerfielder Tony Campana and LHP Dan Osterbrock lead the Bearcats.

Campana is on the 2008 Wallace Watch List and a NCBWA Preseason All-American. He was a second-team all-BIG EAST and second-team ABCA All-Region honoree in 2007. He ranks second in school history in stolen bases after just one season with the Bearcats, when swiped 60 bags in 2007. Campana finished second nationally and set the school's single-season stolen bases record. He finished second on the team in both batting average (.329) and walks (33). The left-handed Osterbrock was a first-team all-BIG EAST and ABCA All-Region pitcher in 2007. One of the BIG EAST's top pitchers in 2007, Osterbrock tossed five complete games, held a 2.67 earned run average in finishing with a 9-1 mark.

HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS

2001, 1999 & 1994 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR



Entering his 15th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 35 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 10 of Morris' 14 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals, dating back to his first year at Miami in 1994. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 23 years, 14 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 642-245-3 (.723) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,146-489-4 (.696) Division I record in 26 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 30 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,277-530-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 14-plus years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

JIM MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 23rd consecutive NCAA regional bid as the Hurricanes took part in the 2007 NCAA Columbia (Mo.) Regional. He has led Miami to a Regional in each of his 14 seasons (1994-2007), winning all 14 appearances. The 13 consecutive Regional Championships was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami advanced to eight Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2007 Hurricanes to their 35th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five student-athletes from Morris' 2007 squad signed pro contracts. The 'Canes also finished third in the Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division, widely considered one of the toughest, if not the toughest collegiate baseball conference.

MORRIS IN HIS 31ST SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,146-489-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach, Morris has compiled a 1,277-530-4 (.706) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 14 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

* Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.

* The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 10 of 13 previous seasons. Led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.

* Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

* Sent 150 players to the Pro's, including Pat Burrell

(Phillies), Danny Graves (Indians), Alex Cora (Red Sox), Nomar Garciaparra (Dodgers) and Jason Varitek (Red Sox).

* Has served three stints with the U.S. National Team: Assistant Coach for 1987 Pan American Games (Silver), Head Coach for 1989 Presidential Cup (Silver) and Head Coach for 1990 Goodwill Games (Bronze).

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with rising star Ryan Jackson, considered of the best defensive shortstops in the country.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres. Before Hill was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Red Sox. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and now plays for the Dodgers.

HURRICANES IN THE POLLS

Miami has earned a No. 10 preseason ranking by *Baseball America*. The Hurricanes have also garnered a No. 2 ranking in the Rivals.com preseason top-25 poll. No. 12 preseason ranking from the National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association (NCBWA) preseason poll, No. 14 preseason ranking in the *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* 2008 Fabulous 40 Preseason NCAA Division I Poll and a No. 14 preseason ranking in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll. Perfect Game Crosschecker's preseason ranking of the nation's Top 100 college teams has the Hurricanes No. 4 in its poll.

WEEKS CHASING RECORD

Junior second baseman Jemile Weeks needs just four triples in 2008 to become the all-time leader at Miami. Weeks recorded an ACC-best six triples in 2007. He also ranks 20th all-time in career triples in the ACC.

UN SENIOR

Right-handed pitcher Enrique Garcia is the lone senior for the Hurricanes on the 2008 roster. Garcia was a 32nd round draft pick of the Chicago Cubs in the 2007 Major League Baseball draft, but decided to return for his senior season. This marks the first time under head coach Jim Morris, that he has opened the season at UM with one senior. The 2003 roster did not have one senior on it.

ALONSO, WEEKS NAMED TO GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD WATCH LIST

Juniors Yonder Alonso and Jemile Weeks were named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List released by USA Baseball. The release of the watch list marks USA Baseball's first step toward identifying the top player in college baseball. The initial list - the first ever of its kind for the Golden Spikes Award - features 75 of the nation's top collegiate talents, as nominated by baseball sports information directors across the country. The watch list will also be "rolling" to ensure that athletes who play themselves into consideration by USA Baseball for the Golden Spikes Award are not ignored. The Golden Spikes Award is sponsored by Major League Baseball, and 2008 marks the 31st installment of the award. Conferences boasting the most watch list nominations include the SEC with 15 names, the ACC and PAC 10 each have 10 members, and the Big 12 has eight (8) nominees.

On May 20, USA Baseball officials will cut the watch list of players to 50 names. The final list of 50 will then be sent to a voting body consisting of select professional baseball personnel, past USA Baseball National Team coaches, select members of the media, former USA Baseball sports information directors, and current USA Baseball staff - close to 150 voters in total. Additionally, for the first time ever, fan voting will be a part of the Golden Spikes Award in 2008. May 20 will also mark the day when college baseball fans from across the country will be able to vote for their favorite player for the Golden Spikes Award on www.usabaseball.com. As part of this May selection process all voters will be asked to choose five players from the list of 50 names. On June 3, USA Baseball will announce the five finalists, and voting will once again commence that same day.

FOUR HURRICANES NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Juniors Yonder Alonso, Dennis Raben, Blake Tekotte and Jemile Weeks were named preseason All-Americans by Baseball America. Miami led all teams with three first team selections in Alonso, Raben and Weeks while Tekotte was a third team preseason All-American. UM's four players on the three teams were the most by any school represented. Alonso is a first team selection as a designated hitter. He has already been named to the 2008 Preseason Watch List for the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award and was named a 2008 Louisville Slugger Preseason All-American by Collegiate Baseball. Alonso earned second team All-ACC honors, second team All-America honors from Baseball America and Louisville Slugger third-team All-America honors by Collegiate Baseball in 2007. Raben is one of three outfielders on the first team. He hit .280 with 61 hits in 60 games in 2007 for the Hurricanes. He had 26 extra-base hits, which included 13 doubles, a triple and 12 homers, which were the second-most on the team in 2007. He also drove in 48 runs and slugged .514. Tekotte is a third team selection. Tekotte hit .333 for Miami in 2007 and finished with the third-most hits (73) on the team including a team-high 19 doubles. He had 25 RBI and led UM with 15 stolen bases. Weeks is the second baseman on the first team. Weeks played in only 50 games for the Hurricanes due to injury, but hit .298

with 56 hits, 20 extra-base hits and 27 RBI. He had an ACC-best six triples and hit five home runs. He was named preseason All-American in 2007 and was on the 2007 Preseason Wallace Watch List. He was named second team All-ACC following his freshman season in 2006 and earned Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America honors.

ALONSO NAMED LOUISVILLE SLUGGER PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

University of Miami junior first baseman Yonder Alonso has been named to the 2008 Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America second team announced by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Alonso was named to the preseason watch list for the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award earlier this month. Alonso earned second team All-ACC honors, second team All-America honors from Baseball America and Louisville Slugger third-team All-America honors by Collegiate Baseball in 2007. He led the team hitting .376 with an ACC-best 18 home runs and 74 RBI. He had a good summer playing with the Brewster Whitecaps in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League and is rated as the fifth best college prospect in the 2008 Major League Baseball amateur draft by Baseball America.

ERICKSON EARNS PRESEASON NCBWA ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Sophomore left-handed pitcher Eric Erickson was named a preseason All-American by the National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association. Erickson was also named to the preseason watch list for the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award late. Erickson is coming off a good freshman campaign in 2007, when he was selected first team All-Atlantic Coast Conference after going 10-4 with a 2.50 ERA. He had 63 strikeouts in 90 innings pitched. Opponents hit .243 against him. He went 6-2 with a 1.93 ERA in ACC games. He also earned Freshman All-America honors from Baseball America and Louisville Slugger. He was selected preseason NCBWA third team as a starting pitcher. There are six ACC players on the three teams.

ALONSO NAMED PRESEASON RIVALS.COM BY ALL-AMERICAN

Junior first baseman Yonder Alonso was named a 2008 Rivals.com first team All-American. He led the team hitting .376 with an ACC-best 18 home runs and 74 RBI. He had a good summer playing with the Brewster Whitecaps in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League and is rated as the fifth best college prospect in the 2008 Major League Baseball amateur draft by Baseball America.

MEDIA INFORMATION

The 2008 University of Miami Baseball Media Guide is designed to assist members of the media in its coverage of the Hurricane baseball program. Additional information, including releases, and photographs may be obtained by contacting the Miami Sports Information Office at (305) 284-3244. Please take a moment to review the following policies and services that are intended to assist you in your coverage of Miami baseball this season.

Media Credentials

All requests for press, broadcast and photo credentials for Miami home baseball games should be directed to the UM Sports Media Relations Office by calling (305) 284-3244 or by fax (305) 284-2807. Requests should be made one week before the game.

As a general rule, working space is allocated on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper and wire-service writers covering for next-day publications; (2) radio and television personnel for broadcast origination; (3) official school student daily newspapers, one seat only; (4) newspaper and television photographers. Limited space is available for weekly representatives, nationally accredited internet news services and non-originating radio representatives on a game-by-game basis.

Media Will Call

Media passes that are not mailed or picked up, or are series passes, can be picked up at the pass gate along the third-base line at Mark Light Field 90 minutes before the first pitch. Proper identification is required for credentials.

Media Parking

Due to the current construction being done at Mark Light Field, the UM Sports Information Office asks that media members park in the parking garage on Ponce De Leon Boulevard, just beyond the right field fence. Parking is free in the garage during home games.

Player Interviews

All media requests for interviews with Miami baseball players should be directed to the UM Sports Media Relations Office, preferably 24 hours in advance. The best time for in-season interviews, either in person or on the phone, is prior to practice. Most Hurricane baseball practices begin at 2:30 p.m., players begin arriving at Mark Light Field at 1:30 p.m. and are available until the start of practice at 2:30 p.m. Practices are open to the media to film and photographers. The players are also available following practice via request (some time between 5:15 and 6 p.m.) for brief Q & A sessions. With advance notice, interviews with players can be arranged for other hours. Calling players at home or on cell phones without permission from the SID will not be tolerated. The players' dorms, training room and weight rooms are also off limits. Players are available on game days up until two and a half hours prior to the game. During the season, the Miami baseball team usually takes Mondays off and is not available for interviews.

Head Coach Jim Morris Interviews

All interviews with Head Coach Jim Morris should be arranged through the UM Sports Media Relations Office. The best time to interview Morris is late mornings and prior to practice at 2:30 p.m. Coach Morris is also available for brief Q & A sessions following practice.

Postgame Interviews

The Miami clubhouse is closed to the media. All postgame interviews will be conducted on the field after observing a brief cooling-off period.

Media Services

The Miami baseball pressbox is located over the third-base dugout. Phone lines for Miami and opponent media should be ordered through Bell South at 1-800-753-0115 at least 1-2 weeks in advance. A courtesy line will be provided in the pressbox for visiting SIDs. Wireless Internet will be available at Miami home games.

Hurricane Radio Network

In Miami, sports talk radio, WQAM (560 AM) will carry Hurricane baseball again this season. The broadcast team of Joe Zagacki, Josh Darrow and Brian "The Beast" London will call the action.

WVUM - UM Student Radio

Again this season the University of Miami's student station WVUM (90.5 FM) will broadcast every Hurricane baseball game. Alex Kushel, the stations sports director, and the WVUM broadcast team members will call all the action.

Spanish Broadcasting Network

WXXX (105.5 FM) OR WPIK (102.5 FM) will once again broadcast a selected number of Miami baseball games in Spanish in 2007. The broadcast team will consist of Joe Martinez, Roly Martin and Luis Hernandez.

The Jim Morris Show

Hurricanes Gameday with Jim Morris will air for its 10th season this spring. The show will air on Saturday mornings on Fox Sports Florida beginning in late March running through the end of the season. Produced by MZM Productions, Inc., the show will consist of in-depth analysis of UM baseball with Coach Morris as well as game highlights and player features. Miami has been picked to finish second in the Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division in the 2008 ACC Baseball Coaches Preseason Poll, released by the conference. Miami earned 59 points and recorded two first place votes. North Carolina is the favorite in the ACC Coastal Division after receiving 67 points. Virginia is picked third followed by Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Duke. Florida State is the favorite in the ACC Atlantic Division after receiving 66 points. Clemson is a close second with 61 points while NC State, Wake Forest, Boston College and Maryland round out the division. North Carolina also was the league's overall favorite, garnering seven votes from the league's coaches. Florida State and Miami each earned two votes, while Virginia nabbed one. Miami finished third in the Coastal Division last season with a 17-13 mark and earned the No. 5 seed in the 2007 ACC Tournament.
