Credentials

Requests for credentials to cover Miami home basketball games should be mailed or faxed on company letterhead to Angie Renninger, Associate Athletic Media Relations Director, Miami University, 230 Millett Hall, Oxford, OH 45056. Requests should be received at least one week prior to the game. If time permits, credentials will be mailed in advance; otherwise, they will be left at the will-call window in the main concourse at Millett Hall.

Spouses, dates, non-workers and children are not allowed in the media areas of Millett Hall.

Directions to Millett Hall

From the north and I-70: Take Hwy. 127 South to Hwy. 73 West. Stay on 73 West until it ends at Hwy. 27 (Patterson Avenue). Turn right and go one block to High Street. Turn left on High Street to Tallawanda Avenue. Turn right on Tallawanda to Sycamore Street, which dead-ends at Millett Hall. Turn left onto Sycamore, then right into the West Parking Lot for media parking.

From the south and I-275: Take Hwy. 27 North to Oxford. Stay on 27, which becomes Patterson Avenue. At first four-way stop, turn left onto High Street. Take High Street to Tallawanda Avenue. Turn right on Tallawanda to Sycamore Street, which dead-ends at Millett Hall. Turn left onto Sycamore, then right into the West Parking Lot for media parking.

Media Services

The media hospitality/interview room is located in the northeast corner of Millett Hall, on court level. Game programs, game notes and other pregame materials can be picked up in the media room. A meal will be served approximately one hour before the game. Halftime and final statistics, play-by-plays and notes will be distributed to all media.

Postgame Procedures

Please give any player requests to Angie Renninger before the end of the game. The Miami locker room is closed to the media.

Practice

Most Miami practices are open. Coles and players are available for interviews after practice. Please call Angie Renninger in the Athletic Media Relations office to make arrangements.

During the Week

Interviews with Miami players and head coach Charlie Coles should be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations Office. Please contact Angie Renninger at least 24 hours in advance when requesting an interview. Home phone numbers of players will not be made available, and interviews are not permitted the day of a game (except for postgame press conference interviews).

In the third year of its partnership with ISP Sports Marketing, the Miami ISP Sports Network continues to cover RedHawk Athletics, with its impressive group of affiliates blanketing most of Southwest Ohio and Southeast Indiana.

Miami Director of Broadcasting Steve Baker joins Joe Barry as they deliver the play-by-play accounts, commentary and sideline updates for the Miami ISP Sports Network. The crew's play-by-play was recognized by the Ohio Associated Press as second best in a large market in 1997.

Joining the Miami ISP Sports Network family of affiliates for men's basketball is Middletown's WPFB-FM 105.9. Hamilton's WMOH-AM 1450, Richmond's WFMG-FM 101.3 and Dayton's WONE-AM 980 continue their partnership with the Miami ISP Sports Network.

The Miami ISP Sports Network is anchored by Baker who returned to the microphone in 2001 as the "Voice of Miami Athletics" after a four-year absence. Baker served as Miami's play-by-play announcer for a decade from the mid-1980s to 1997.

Joining Baker at courtside and providing color commentary is former long-time assistant coach Joe Barry, a former Ohio University player and 21-year Miami assistant coach.

Tommy Leugers also is back for his 11th season as the Miami ISP Sports Network's on-site producer/engineer. Leugers is assistant program director at 1530 Homer, Cincinnati's FOX Sports Net radio affiliate.

Miami's men's basketball broadcasts include a 30-minute pregame show and a 30-minute postgame show. HawkTawk Presented by Brick Street, Charlie Coles' radio show, airs at 7 p.m. Thursdays during the regular season on WMOH-AM 1450, WPFB-FM 105.9 and WONE-AM 980. In addition to providing in-depth coverage of RedHawk men's basketball, the Miami ISP Sports Network covers Miami football, ice hockey and women's basketball.

The Miami ISP Sports Network increased its role on the internet five years ago by adding MSNi, an

internet radio station that provides 24-hour broadcasts of replayed football, basketball and ice hockey contests as well as live broadcasts for many RedHawk non-revenue sports, including baseball, softball, field hockey and women's soccer.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country. One of only 11 football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences, the MAC named Dr. Jon A. Steinbrecher as its eighth commissioner in the 63-year history of the league this past March. Steinbrecher came to the MAC after serving for six years as the commissioner of the Ohio Valley Conference.

The league has grown its commitment to championships by expanding to six its number of neutral site post season events – football (Detroit's Ford Field), volleyball (Toledo's SeaGate Centre), men's and women's basketball (Cleveland's Quicken Loans Arena), softball (Akron's Firestone Stadium) and most recently baseball (Chillicothe's VA Memorial Stadium).

The MAC tied a league record in 2008 with five schools participating in bowl games – Buffalo (International); Ball State (GMAC); Central Michigan (Motor City); Western Michigan (Texas); and Northern Illinois (Independence Bowl). The 2008 season also saw the first MAC football team ranked in the Top 25 since 2003. Ball State was ranked as high as 12th in the BCS Standings, 12th in the AP and 13th in the USA Today Poll. The Cardinals were ranked in all three polls for 10 straight weeks. MAC football teams won a league record four games versus opponents from the Big Ten. Toledo became the first MAC team to ever beat Michigan in Ann Arbor; Ball State won its first-ever game against a Big Ten foe when the Cardinals beat Indiana; Central Michigan also defeated Indiana; and Western Michigan beat Illinois in a game played at Ford Field.

In its partnership with ESPN, the MAC signed an eight-year rights agreement through the 2016-2017 academic year for football, as well as men's and women's basketball. The deal will be the most extensive in the 63-year history of the conference. The new deal calls for a minimum of 25 events annually to be produced and aired on an ESPN platform including the men's and women's basketball championships, a regular-season MAC presence on ESPN, the Marathon MAC Football Championship and a minimum of 11 regular-season football games.

Women's athletics shined for the MAC this past year. For the first time in the history of the conference the MAC sent three teams to the NCAA women's volleyball tournament (Miami, Ohio and Western Michigan). Western Michigan became only the third team to make it to the Sweet Sixteen (Ohio 2005 and Western Michigan 1983). In women's basketball MAC Tournament Champion Ball State upset perennial national power Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA tournament handing the Lady Vols their first ever loss in the opening round of the NCAA tournament. The victory was named "Pontiac

Game Changing Performance" of the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament, while first year head coach Kelly Packard was named Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year by the WBCA.

Akron continued its dominance of MAC men's soccer with its 11 regular-season championship to go along with its sixth MAC Tournament title – both league records. The Zips were ranked as high as No. 2 during the season and reached the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Northwestern, 1-0. Steve Zakuani, who helped guide the University of Akron men's soccer program to a record-setting campaign in 2008, was the first overall pick of the 2009 Major League Soccer Super Draft. Zakuani earned 2008 MAC Men's Soccer Player of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Hermann Trophy, which goes to the best men's soccer player in the country.

The conference now has national leadership positions on the following NCAA committees: Warde Manual, Buffalo (Academic Cabinet); Susan Lipnickey, Miami (Leadership Council and Infractions Appeals); Derrick Gragg, Eastern Michigan (Legislative Council); Dr. John Peters, Northern Illinois (Board of Directors); Tom Collins, Ball State (Amateurism Cabinet); Kelly Andrews, Toledo (Awards, benefits, Expenses & Financial Aid Cabinet); Stephannie Harvey-Vandenburg, Eastern Michigan (Recruiting & Athletic Personal Issues Cabinet); Brad Bates, Miami (Academic Performance); Eileen Jennings, Central Michigan (Infractions); Ted McKown, Kent State (International Students Records); Jim Klein, Toledo (Legislative Review & Interpretations); Karin Lee, Ball State (Minority Opportunities and Interest); Melody Reifel Werner, Eastern Michigan (Research); Catharine Marsszeczy, Kent State (Student-Athlete Advisory); Lee Merserve, Bowling Green (Walter Byers Scholarship).

Hockey); Mary Lu Gribshaw, Akron (Men's Soccer); Greg Christopher, Bowling Green (Women's Basketball); Anucha Brown-Sanders, Buffalo and Donyale Canada, MAC (Women's Basketball Issues); Curt Miller, Bowling Green (Women's Basketball Rules); Jerry Reighard, Central Michigan (Gymnastics); Matt Wolfert, Ball State (Women's Soccer); Dee Abrahamson, Northern Illinois (Women's Softball Rules); Derek van der Merwe, Central Michigan (Wrestling).

From two-time Super Bowl quarterback winning Ben Roethlisberger (Miami University), NFL Defensive MVP James Harrison (Kent State University), British Open winner Ben Curtis (Kent State University), World Series winning manager Bob Brenly (Ohio University) and Olympic bobsled team member Brock Kreitzburgh (University of Toledo), the Mid-American Conference continues to excel in producing leaders in the world of athletics.

History of the MAC

Based in Cleveland since July 1999 following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since moving to Northeast Ohio.

The Mid-American Conference was founded as a five-school league on February 24, 1946 in Columbus, Ohio with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members. The Mid-American Conference has 12 full-time schools and a 13th, Temple, for football only. Comprising the East Division is the University of Akron (joined in 1992), Bowling Green State University (1952), University at Buffalo (1998), Kent State University (1951), Miami University (1947), Ohio University (1946) and Temple University (2007). The West Division members are Ball State University (1973), Central Michigan University (1971), Eastern Michigan University (1971), Northern Illinois University (1975-86, 1997), University of Toledo (1950) and Western Michigan University (1947).

In 1946 men's basketball was the first competitive sport in the MAC, which now sponsors a total 23 sports. Women's sports were brought into the conference's structure in 1980.

For men, championships (11) are sponsored in football, basketball, baseball, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, golf and tennis.

For women, championships (12) are sponsored in basketball, softball, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis.

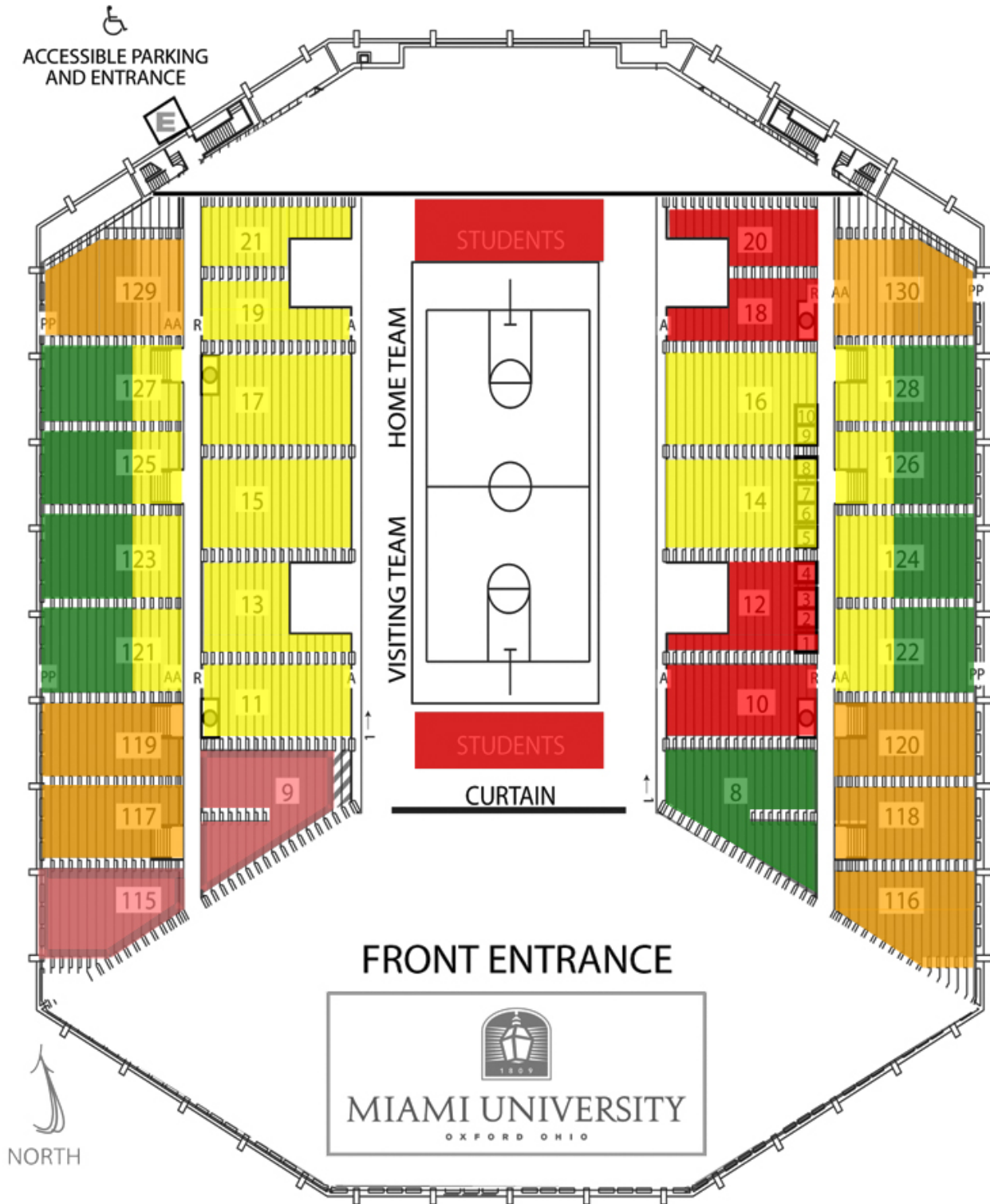
