Scouting Report

Two-year starter at Miami who finished his career as the program's second-ranked passer in career completions (541), passing yardage (7,029) and passing touchdowns (54) ... finished 2005 regular season ranked seventh nationally in touchdown passes (27) and ninth nationally in passing yardage (3,178) ... one of only two passers in Miami history to pass for 3,000 yards in a season multiple times in a career ... led Miami to 15 wins and a pair of Mid-American Conference East Division titles in his two seasons as a starter ... passed for at least 200 yards in 22 of his 24 career starts ... selected to compete in the 2006 Hula Bowl in Honolulu.

2005 Season

Started 10-of-11 games and played in all 11 games for the RedHawks ... led Miami to a 7-4 record and MAC East Division Co-Championship ... was honored as a finalist for the prestigious Draddy trophy, which goes annually to the nation's top scholar-athlete ... ranked among the nation's top 20 in total offense (18th/283.4 ypg), passing yardage (15th/288.9 ypg) and passing touchdowns (t-9th/27) ... led the MAC in passing ... passed for multiple touchdown passes in his last 10 games ... his 27 touchdown passes were a Miami record for an 11-game season ... topped 300 yards passing four times on the season and became the second quarterback in Miami history to record consecutive 3,000-yard passing seasons ... threw for a season-high 395 yards passing and three touchdowns in Sept. 10 game with Central Michigan ... completed 22-of-35 passes for 359 yards and three touchdowns in nationally-televised defeat of Cincinnati (Sept. 28), helping Miami regain the Victory Bell in NCAA I-A's fifth most-played rivalry ... completed a career-best 70 percent of his passes (28-of-40) for 379 yards and three touchdowns in win at Temple (Oct. 29) ... named MAC East Offensive Player of the Week for the third time in his career after throwing for 276 yards and a career-high four touchdowns against Buffalo's MAC-leading pass defense ... finished collegiate career by throwing for 297 yards and two TDs versus Ohio.

2004 Season

Started all 13 games for the RedHawks, passing for 200 or more yards 12 times ... finished the year ranked among the top 15 players nationally in total offense (13th/276.6 ypg) and among the top 25 players nationally in pass efficiency (25th/137.6) ... made starting debut with 214 yards passing and three TDs versus Indiana State (Aug. 28) ... enjoyed career day in losing effort at Cincinnati (Sept. 11), passing for 416 yards and four TDs and earning MAC East Offensive Player of the Week honors ... passed for 306 yards and two TDs, completing 69.4 percent of his passes, despite windy, wet conditions at Buffalo (Oct. 16), earning his second MAC East Offensive Player of the Week award ... threw for 349 yards and two TDs in Nov. 13 win at Western Michigan ... also had a season-long 36-yard rush versus the Broncos ... connected on 20-of-33 passes for 304 yards and three TDs in MAC Championship loss to Toledo (Dec. 2) ... became only the third Miami quarterback to see action in back-to-back bowl games with a Dec. 28 start at the Independence Bowl ... a First-Team CoSIDA Academic All-District IV selection ... just the second Miami quarterback all-time to pass for 3,000 yards in a season, joining Ben Roethlisberger ... passed for at least 200 yards in his last eight games.

Three-year starter for Miami, who made 33 career starts and started his last 25 career games... served as Miami's right guard ... first-team all-MAC pick in 2005 ... tough, physical player who finishes plays well ... possesses very strong hands and is still developing his foot quickness.

2005 Season

Started all 11 games at right guard for Miami ... named a first-team all-MAC selection, leading a cast of three all-MAC offensive linemen at Miami in 2005 ... third-year starter on a versatile offensive line that paved the way for a rushing attack that featured a 100-yard rusher in six games and included the nation's 23rd-ranked running back in yards per game ... also pass protected for the Mid-American Conference's top passing offense, featuring a 3,000-yard passer and two 1,000-yard receivers ... offensive line allowed just 12 quarterback sacks over the final nine games of the season or one sack every 29.5 pass attempts.
